The Coalmont to Princeton "Run from the Law" has been received really well by local runners. In addition to the mayor (see photo), local runners include David Bell from Princeton Secondary School, Barry Clark (Vermilion Forks Elementary School Principal), Rose Dunsmore, Lance Bishop (coming back to Princeton just for this race), Jim Hardin, Carol Esselink, David Badger (a local favourite for the winner's circle), Kimberley Cameron, Carla Mumby, Don and Jane Johnson, Dr. Dan Dodds, educators Steve LePoi-devin and Bill Lawrence.

Leslie Hassell of Tulameen has entered. It is her first race. Another Tulameen resident, Neil McDiarmid, will be out for the reward.

Penticton has shown a keen interest in this event, with \$3200 in "reward" money. Jim Hardin expects approximately 50 runners to participate.

Run from the Law starts at 9:00 a.m. in Coalmont and ends when the last runner reaches Cenotaph Park in downtown Princeton. Runners will have a brief rest then go to the arena, where the "reward" money will be given to the winners.

## Keremeos Council, Chamber plan trails

One of the projects announced by Keremeos District Chamber of Commerce was a 'walking trail' that would start at the Red Bridge and end at Kobau Park in Cawston, a daunting task to be sure, as many individual land owners would need to be contacted and co-operation would be paramount to the success of a trail.

After failing to obtain permission from land owners for use of the dike, Keremeos District Chamber of Commerce wrote to the Minister of Highways for permission to develop a portion of the old railway right of way (linear property). At about the same time, Village Council requested permission for use of this property within Village boundaries.

The Village of Keremeos received a go-ahead quickly, but Chamber did not. Bill Coates, Area Manager for the Minister of Highways, says the Village property was relatively easy to deal with as it could be handled by local government and there was no "use of land conflict." Permission was granted. However, this is different from a permit. If needed, the Highways Department could rescind written approval but could not rescind a permit. The Village portion of the land is highly unlikely to be rescinded, therefore development could proceed.

Chamber's request was turned over to the Planning and Properties Department of Highways in Kamloops because it was dealing with land owners and is more complicated. A decision has not been made because this is a widespread provincial issue. Currently, if a request is received by Highways for a landowners to

## Highways Minister Harry Lali meets with Similkameen Valley Councils

Similkameen - MLA Harry Lali, Minister of Transportation and Highways, met with Princeton Town Council on Saturday morning and had lunch with Keremeos Village Council on Saturday afternoon. The major subject Lali dealt with was improvements to local highways, to a total of approximately \$6 million in maintenance and improvement projects.

Most of the funding for B.C. highways is once again going to areas outside the Lower Mainland, Lali said. The Hope Princeton projects are 10.8 km. of resurfacing between Hope Slide and Manning Park boundary and 10.9 km. in the park from Muledeer Campground to Placer Creek.

In the Keremeos area, a half a kilometre from the junction of highways 3 and 3A will be done, along with 2.1 km. of resurfacing of the two-lane section of

Highway 3 west of Keremeos.

In the Cawston area, five kilometres of road shoulders will be upgraded and repaved.

In the Princeton area, rock stabilization, steel meshing in places, and resurfacing of 28 km. from Summers Creek to Borgeson Creek will be done on Highway 5A. In addition, the design and alignment of a new bridge on Highway 3 in Princeton will continue in preparation to the replacement of the 52 year old bridge next year.

In response to concerns expressed about highways in the south Okanagan, Lali said there are priority locations that will be dealt with this year, but other priorities, especially on the TransCanada Highway, must be done this year. He stated that the Vancouver Island Highway project is nearly complete, freeing his ministry to attend to highway priorities in the

Interior.

Lali brought news to Princeton about the government allocating \$120,735 for improvements to Princeton General Hospital. Underground fuel tanks will be removed and a review of asbestos content in the facility will be done. Continued on Page 3.....

Dean Stinson, Princeton's representative on Okanagan Similkameen Health Region Board of Directors, asked Lali if he was aware of the deficit position of the region and the continual underfunding for the area. Lali said he is aware of the situation, and Stinson went on to remind Lali of the increasing number of people over age 65 and the additional problem in Princeton of staff burnout if more casual nurses are not found soon. Lali mentioned issues coming out of Merritt as well, but did not mention probable

solutions to local problems.

In the educational budget capital funding, Lali noted that School District #58 will receive approximately \$17 million, but most of that will go to renovations and

improvements to Merritt schools. In Princeton, capital funding will go to install automatic fire sprinkler systems in John Allison and Vermilion Forks Elementary Schools.

Continued from front..... develop the railroad property, a verbal approval is usually given for landscaping and maintenance. Any building or permanent development is not allowed.

Coates says this is a give and take situation. When private property borders the right of way, it is within everyone's interest for the owner to maintain it. These railroad properties can be an eyesore and a fire hazard. The Department of Highways has no budget to do this themselves and so it is of great assistance if property owners undertake its maintenance.

This becomes a problem when the individual does not first seek permission and/or there is a conflict of use, as in the case of Chamber's walking trail.

Obtaining permission from the landowners' for use of the dike as a walking trail to Kobau Park may be an obstacle impossible to overcome.

## Police Report for Keremeos

April 3 to April 9

On April 3, police responded to a break, enter and theft at a business on Highway 3 near Keremeos. On April 5, police responded to a report of a disturbance on 4th Street in Keremeos. Following initial investigation, police escorted a person to the psychiatric unit of Penticton Regional Hospital.

Cattle hit in accident

At 2:00 p.m. April 5, approximately 20 km west of Keremeos, an eastbound driver fell asleep at the wheel and drove off the road, striking a fence and several head of cattle. Four head had to be destroyed. The driver was not injured. Approximately \$1500 damage was done to the vehicle.

On the morning of April 7, a 15 year old Keremeos youth was arrested for breaching release conditions subject to a previously reported incident of his being in possession of weapons dangerous to the public peace. The youth was subsequently remanded into custody pending a court appearance.

On April 8, police investigated a \$20 theft from a parked vehicle in Keremeos. The thief had reached in through an open window to unlock the door.

Youth reported intoxicated

That evening, police attended on a report of an intoxicated youth. The 12 year old youth had fallen over a steep bank and was transported by ambulance for medical attention for minor injuries. Shortly after, police responded to a report of an assault.

On April 9, a 27 year old Keremeos resident was arrested for threatening to assault a number of persons in the area as a result of an incident occurring earlier that evening. Police are investigating.



# Trewella tells Auxiliary of a nursing career in the far north

The Hospital Auxiliary had a delightful speaker at the April 5 meeting. Jean Trewella, a retired Public Health Nurse from Princeton, practiced her nursing

career from the mid 1950s to the early 1960s in the far north at Moose Factory, Frobisher Bay and other northern locations. Travelling by canoe, dogsled and

Otter, Norseman and Beaver aircraft, Jean was able to do minor dental surgery, blood testing, x-rays and maternity (with the help of native midwives). A doctor flew in once a month. There was no hospital or doctor and the Public Health Nurse assumed complete responsibility for the wellness of the First Nations and Inuit people.

An Inuit interpreter helped when visiting First Nations or Inuit families.

Clocks were useless, time meant nothing, work and fatigue were the timepieces.

Tuberculosis was rampant in one area until they discovered the cause. A patient had been shipped out to the sanatorium in Hamilton leaving family behind for many months. This patient chewed gum and would save the used gum until he had a big ball of it, then mail it to his family where everyone in the village had a piece of T.B. gum: problem solved.

Frobisher Bay had 650 native people, 700 non-native men and only four non-native women. Recreation took place at the RCMP Sergeants Mess where records played and four women had sore feet from dancing continuously.

Jean did her dispensing at the Anglican Mission but did stay at times at the Catholic Mission, but not allowed her breakfast or lunch in the Sisters' presence, so she ate alone, and had dinner with the Catholic Brothers, who enjoyed her company. Jean is Protestant and speaks English, but did converse in French.

Jean Trewella stayed in the north three extra years to train future nurses. The government was looking for nurse-practitioners and midwives to take the load off doctors.

Work in the north required courage, patience and an attitude of understanding yourself, the people involved and your profession.

Jean was a graduate of Montreal General Hospital and McGill University, a well-educated, intelligent woman and an accomplished musician who had a fantastic nursing career. Jean told of her love for the north and its most hospitable, sociable, kind people - the First Nations and Inuit people.

It was a great speech and members enjoyed it. At the same meeting, Doris Meston won \$50 guessing 474 jellybeans in a bottle. Plans were made for the May 12 fashion show and tea.

## YOUR VIEW

### A spectator's view of how our government works

Dear Editor:

On March 28, the day after the provincial budget was brought in, I attended a session of the provincial legislature in Victoria. It was not a happy experience.

The session started off with a question period. This provides the Opposition with an opportunity to pose critical and often embarrassing questions to the government. Liberal leader Gordon Campbell started off with a series of critical remarks about the school strike. The NDP benches sat quietly. When Premier Dosanjh arose and started to reply, bedlam broke out. The Liberal Opposition immediately started raucous shouting, banging their desks and hurling insults across the floor.

From the gallery where I sat, I couldn't hear a word of the Premier's reply. This display went on for half an hour. Every question by the Liberals was listened to without interruption from government members, every reply by ministers was drowned out by the Liberals.

The Premier, in his throne speech, had appealed to all members of the legislature to conduct themselves with decorum, to avoid political posturing and to use the question period to pose serious questions on issues of concern to the public, and promised serious replies from the government. Apparently this appeal was rejected by the Liberal caucus which decided to carry on as in previous sessions. It seems to me that the right of

the Opposition to ask questions in our legislature imposes a responsibility to also listen to the replies. Otherwise, it just becomes a political charade.

A class of students was sitting in the visitor's gallery the day I was there. I couldn't help wondering what they thought of this spectacle in our legislature.

Now, to the budget: it was a good news budget for health care. Health spending was increased by \$549 million. According to budget figures this included:

- \* \$42 million for additional beds and home care services that provided for the opening of 194 new continuing care beds

- \* An additional \$24.8 million for a program to hire up to 600 nurses and an additional \$5 million to hire new licensed practical nurses

- \* A \$33 million increase for provincial critical services such as cancer treatment, cardiac care and transplants, and renal dialysis

- \* The Medical Services Plan was increased by \$156 million which, among other things, provided for additional physician services at the B.C. Cancer Agency as well as increased compensation for doctors, which will hopefully avoid repetition of the 20 days of doctor strikes last year which had disrupted services and increased waiting lists.

- \* The Pharmacare budget was increased by \$111 million to meet increased usage and the

high costs of new and expensive drugs

- \* \$183 million for compensation increases for health care workers in regional programs.

It was also noted in the budget that federal funding for health care, originally set at 50 per cent, has been reduced today to 15 per cent.

"Our commitment to universal health care in B.C. is resolute," said Finance Minister Paul Ramsey. "We cannot..... must not and will not accept American-style, for-profit health care."

# Pacific Water heads our way by relay for a weekend of fun

Similkameen - RELAY 2000 comes ever closer to the Similkameen Valley with the launching of the B.C. part of the relay on April 7 in Victoria. Water was drawn from the city's Inner Harbour during two full days of celebration.

This is the second "leg" of the journey to Ottawa. The first leg began on February 19 when water was drawn from the Arctic Ocean at Tuktoyaktuk, NWT. That part of the relay has been moving for almost two months.

The relay out of Victoria will weave its way through 66 B.C. communities between April 7 and May 5, with over 100 celebrations, as RELAY 2000 heads east.

On April 21, Tulameen Community Club is putting on a special Easter celebration and the Easter Bunny will be there at Tulameen Community Hall to greet the relay. The fun starts at 10:30 a.m. and shortly after 11 o'clock the TransCanada Trail RELAY 2000 will arrive and stay for about half an hour.

Organizer Gina Hall invites all the children and adults from Tulameen and Coalmont to attend for lunch. There will be hot dogs, donuts, pop and coffee on sale as a fundraiser for Tulameen Community Club.

Princeton is planning the largest celebration in the Interior. On Good Friday, after the Easter fun at Tulameen, the relay will follow the trail to Princeton where, at 5:30 p.m., the relay will arrive downtown. The relay will be greeted in a welcoming ceremony followed by entertainment, a "teaser" by singer Bobbi Smith.

On Saturday morning, a pancake breakfast downtown is expected to include a visit from outlaw Bill Miner.

While the relay continues with Brenda Crimmon riding from

Princeton arena along the KVR, the fun continues in town all day with a family bicycle ride, a Walk across Canada, and an evening concert with Canadian country and western teen sensation, Bobbi Smith, of Vancouver.

The folks at Osprey Lake are thrilled that Paula Pateman, a local dogsledder, will be bringing the water into Osprey Lake with her dog team on Saturday afternoon at approximately 3:00 to Three Lakes General Store. People will form a line waving flags and cheering. There will be a bonfire for everyone to enjoy. Hot chocolate will be served free from the caboose built by Osprey area Ratepayers and Osprey Snowwheelers. Ceremonies will take place at 3:30 p.m. At 4:00 p.m., everyone is invited to Take a Hike to an Oasis in the Middle of Nowhere. People will pass under

an arch with flags flying and go down the trail toward Link Lake then back to Three Lakes Store where an RCMP officer in red serge will hand a scroll to each person taking the walk. The scrolls will recognize them as participants in RELAY 2000. There will be a pot luck supper in the evening, along with musical entertainment.

The following morning breakfast will be served at Three Lakes Cafe, then the water carriers will pass through the arch on their way to Summerland.

On Sunday morning the Run from the Law half-marathon starts at Coalmont with a peace officer shouting "Halt" as the signal for runners to leap into action. The run follows the road into Princeton, where runners will rest, then receive their "rewards."

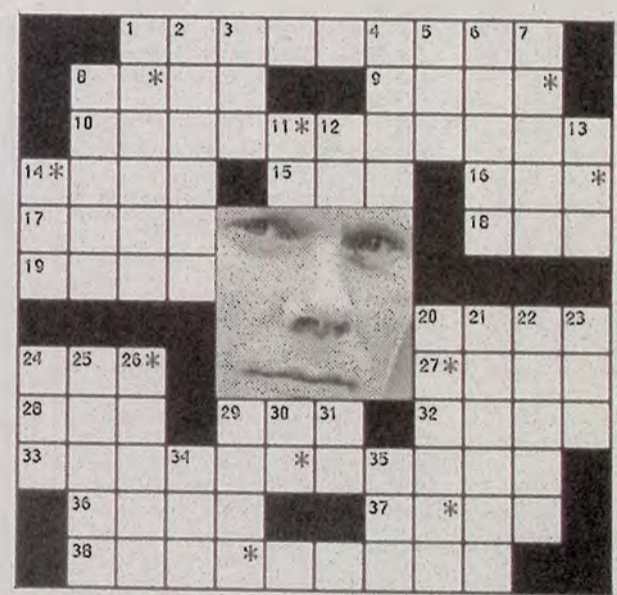

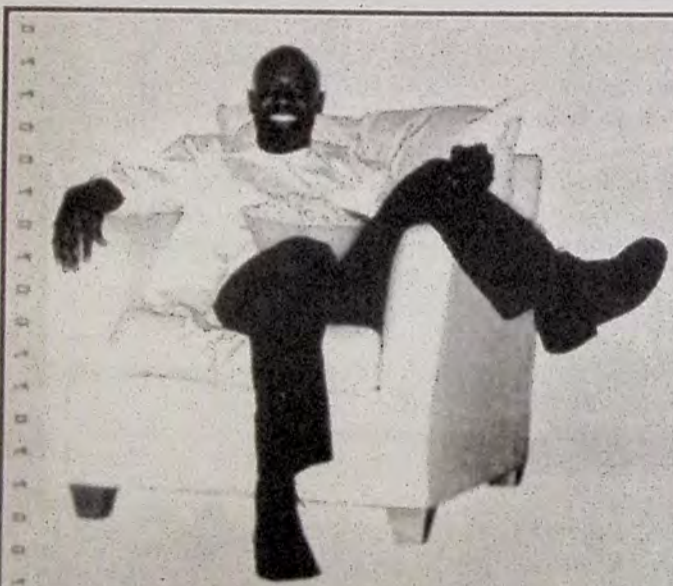

# Shooting sports: Criminal deadlines

Is the recent rash of misleading advertising by the Federal Government intended to create panic and intimidate folks into thinking they have to rush out and register themselves and their guns? The 'spin doctors' continue in their efforts to dupe the public into believing that Bill C-68 registration will improve safety!

One should be aware of the 'criminal deadlines' imposed by the Federal Government. Failure to comply with this faulty law makes one a criminal by legislation.

Current Bill C-68 requirements:  
 \* January 1st, 2001 - all firearms owners must have a firearms Possession Only License or a Possession and Acquisition Licence (or you become a criminal!)

\* January 1st, 2003 - all firearms must be registered

If your FAC (Firearms Acquisition Certificate) is valid past January 1st, 2001 it is valid until the expiry date on it (and you are licensed). If your FAC expires before January 1st, 2001 and you have bought a firearm between December 1st, 1998 and January 1st, 2001 you must get a Possession Only LICENSE or a Possession and Acquisition LICENSE before your FAC expires. Your local Rod and Gun Club has additional information.

Before 'the federal liberals come to their senses' we may see another billion dollar boondoggle. Failure to accept the responsibility of creating good laws for the people has necessitated challenges at the Supreme Court by most of the Canadian provinces and Territories. Now does this 'appeal' get reviewed from a legal perspective or from a common sense perspective? As an alterna-

tive, parliament (our elected reps) could change the law! The importance of your vote in the upcoming election is of vital importance to the millions of responsible Canadian gun owners.

Take a step back in time and have a good look at yourself in the mirror. Outdoors folk traditionally enjoy hunting and fishing. Many that don't, wish they could. Remember when we had pure water - the oceans, rivers, and streams were not polluted. Remember the changes recommended by people like yourself to protect our fish and wildlife for everyone to share and enjoy. Well it's time to review your activities and see if you are doing today whatever it needs to intelligently preserve, protect, and pro-

mote the well being of our resources.

There are several ways you can help. First, renew your membership in your local Rod and Gun Club. Here you can source and exchange information on areas of specific interest, all the while learning of, and supporting, the interests of your fellow sportsmen. Here you will become aware of the annual meeting of the B. C. Wildlife Federation, this year being held at Prince George in mid April. ## Let's fight this cancer plague

In the past two weeks, I lost two old friends to cancer, Bill Kelly and Jean Prystupa. Whether you knew them or not, you share the loss, because they were great community people before their illnesses.

They were certainly not the first friends I lost to cancer. I lost family members to cancer - my mother, three aunts, two uncles and two cousins. My experience is no different from that of everyone I know. Everybody's family and friends have been affected by a cancer death.

If we talk about people who are alive and have, or have had, cancer, again we are talking about everybody's family and friends.

We have a damnable cancer plague on our hands! If all of these people had caught cancer at the same time, we would know we have a plague, but we tend to ignore the plague because people are diagnosed with cancer in relatively small numbers at a time.

When I was a child, people caught poliomyelitis every summer, and half of those people died. In my vast extended family, only two caught polio, and only one died. The number who died of polio was one-tenth the number who die of

cancer, and we called polio an epidemic. Back then, every medical researcher was frantically looking for either a cure or a vaccine. Jonas Salk found a vaccine and today the world is almost free of polio.

Three forms of cancer are caused by viruses, and there is now research underway to develop vaccines to prevent these cancers. We will wait years to see if these work, but the research looks promising.

What about the rest of the cancer viruses? When will we see a virus isolated and a vaccine developed?

We have tried to fight cancer by blasting the victim with radiation or shooting the victim full of chemicals, or cutting out body parts, and we have wondered whether trying to cure it was worse than the disease.

I compared cancer to polio because a virus is involved, and we have the medical expertise to discover and fight viruses, far beyond what we had a half-century ago when Salk developed his vaccine.

April is Cancer Month. Millions of Canadians will buy daffodils, donate to the Canadian Cancer Society. If you make a donation, please ask that the money go to cancer vaccine research.

## Anna's Garden

### Why not decorate an Easter tree?

Easter has become such an exciting time at Don and Anna's Greenhouses over the last few years. "Nana's Maze Garden" as granddaughter Annalisa calls it comes alive with Don and Anna's very own Easter Bunny hiding children's names in the garden. Once the children find their name they always receive some goodies.

Another tradition over the past years has been the decorating of "Anna's Easter Tree", also known as the Corkscrew Hazelnut tree, or Harry Lauder's Walkingstick, and in Latin the Corylus avellana 'Contorta'. They have been decorating this tree in Holland for many years. This tree looks best at Easter before all the branches produce their twisted leaves. Harry Lauder's Walkingstick was discovered about 1863 at Frocester, Gloucestershire, England in a hedgerow, grows about nine feet tall, and is quite attractive with it's twisted and curled stems, and catkins hanging down. Add a few lights and Bunnies and you have a gorgeous Easter Tree.

According to "Michael A. Dirr", a writer of the 'Manual of Landscape Plants' (a book I quite often use, in fact at the Nursery here it's called our "Bible" for

plants), he claims he's never seen fruit on this tree. I'm not sure if we live in the right location or what, but mine faithfully has been producing fruit right along. I believe it must be because we live in God's Country here in Similkameen Country.

The Corylus avellana 'Contorta' almost always is grafted on its species and the understock suckers can result in a bit of a pruning nightmare if not kept up yearly. I find as the tree grows I prune quite a bit from the bottom of the tree yearly, and thin out some of the branches as need be. I had a customer once say to me, "Anna I don't mean to criticize but I believe this tree is drying out, or you have an aphid problem". I assured her that my Corkscrew Hazelnut was just fine, that it is not the most attractive tree once the leaves come out, because they always look wilted. The beauty of the Easter Tree is definitely from the time the leaves fall off in October until just after Easter.

When we were children growing up one of my memories of Easter Holidays was planting spanish onions and potatoes. Dad used to always have rows plowed ahead of time, and then gave each of us

children a measured stick, and a bucket of seed potatoes. It was always a race to see who could get to the end of the row first. It's a good thing we were given that measuring stick or I'm sure by the end of the row the potatoes would have been further apart then the beginning of the row. Oh there was also the rule of having the cut portion of the potato down, facing the soil or we were told the plant might grow upside down. As children we believed everything our parents said.

I hope you all have something special planned for Easter. If not join us at Don and Anna's for a game of Spring Bunny Golf, or how about Rabbit Ring Toss, or just a free picture of yourself with Don and Anna's very own Easter Bunny. Remember Easter is a great time to relive your childhood and what ever age you might be, just try acting like a child on Easter. You never know you might have fun.

### Some foods fight aging

Everybody knows about fruit and vegetables being good for your health, but few people understand that fruit and vegetables fight the aging process. Fruit and vegetables contain more than the vitamins you might take to replace them. Fruit and vegetables contain enzymes and fiber, and something called phytoenes which boost the immune system.

A diet rich in fruit and vegetables and low fat dairy products can lower blood pressure and prevent strokes!

Fruit and vegetables protect the bowel from cancer, keep skin healthy, prevent heart disease and provide calcium.

You may think all of this sounds dull, but vegetables are not dull stuff if they are handled right. There is nothing wrong with vegetable juice as a beverage.

The top recommended vegetables are as follows: spinach, broccoli, acorn squash, chick peas (black-eyed peas) and potato. Add tomato, Swiss chard, sweet potato, and bok choy for the best possible list of vegetables.

Put cantaloupe at the top of the list of fruits, followed by Italian prune plums and apricots. Apples are just excellent for your heart, and papaya is great for your digestive system.

All berries are good for you, but you could put strawberries at the top of the list as they are high in

vitamin C. Very often, people forget to include berries as part of the fruit group, yet they are highly concentrated in food value. Berries have one other good thing going for you - you can grow them in your home garden. Strawberries, raspberries, currants (especially black currants), grapes, and blackberries can be grown in most gardens in very little space. Some of the bush-type plums are worth cultivating in the home garden.

In the Similkameen Valley, we have wild berries that are excellent for health, but are better made into jellies and jams. Elderberries cleanse the blood, Oregon grape and hawthorn protect the heart. Saskatoons are good for fiber. Stay away from chokecherries, as they are not good for your bones due to a high copper content.


When it comes to vegetables and fruit, think "five a day." Five servings of different vegetables and five servings of different fruits. You could start the morning with half a cup of strawberries on cereal, eat an apple, have a slice of cantaloupe, eat a few grapes, and snack on a couple of pieces of dried papaya or prunes, and you have five. The quantities do not have to be more than one-quarter cup, but you need them every day.

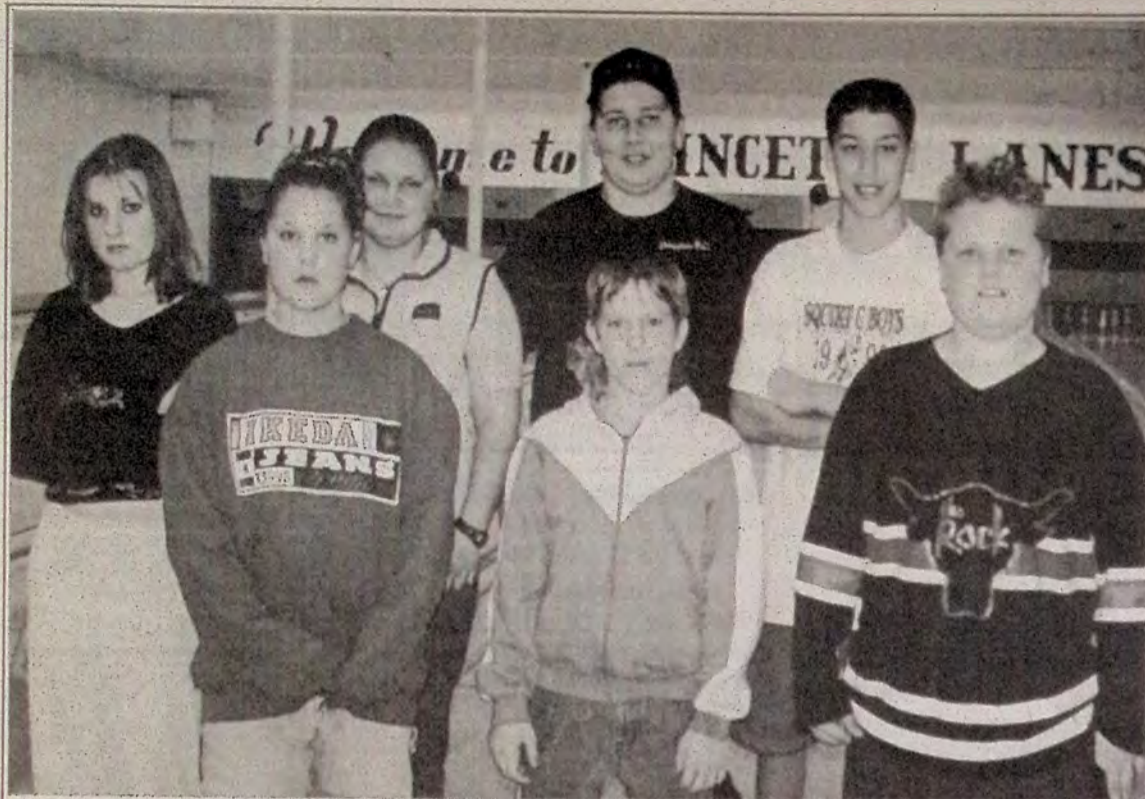

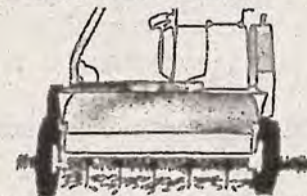

## Boilers and shakers: our active planet

The Pacific Rim has been remarkably active during the past two weeks. A volcano, Mt. Usu, on the north island of Japan erupted twice, beginning on March 31 and the following day.

In Mexico, the volcano Popocatepetl erupted on April 3 in two blasts.

In British Columbia, a flurry of magnitude 3 earthquakes on March 27 and 28 followed a magnitude 4 quake on March 25 at Gold River. Magnitude 3 quakes were felt on those days at Tofino (4 quakes) and Pt. Hardy (one quake). Quakes under magnitude 3 continued along the coast on March 30 and 31, then a magnitude 3.7 quake hit Pt. Hardy on April 1.

Between April 6 and April 11, a flurry of quakes under magnitude 3 hit Sandspit, B.C. (total 14), a magnitude 1 in Gold River, and the same in Whistler. Stewart had a 2.9 quake on April 10, and Abbotsford had a 2.7 quake the same day.

On April 10, a moderately strong quake, magnitude 4.9, struck Tokyo, Japan.

There have been many predictions of disaster for May 5, due to a major planetary alignment clustering the moon, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn and the Sun all in one sector of the sky, and in adverse angle to Uranus. This alignment is no worse than one that took place in October, 1980. However, many people have been seriously frightened by the predictions.

Planetary alignments are believed by some researchers to trigger some quakes and volcanic eruptions, and in fact, the alignments of planets has begun already. Are we seeing the effects?

## PXA meets Stockbreeders

Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA) met on April 11 to discuss a number of issues connected with preparing for this year's busy season.

The two groups who approached the PXA last month, one regarding using the facility to train horses from the coast and another to expand use of the Ag Building, did not return to the PXA with further information, so those items are tabled until those groups respond to the PXA.

An issue arose with the Stockbreeders Association and use of the cattle weigh scales and corrals at the Ag Building. Members

received a copy of a letter from Linda Allison outlining the history of the scales and discussion about the corrals.

Members agreed there would be no problem making the corrals larger, but calibrating the scales every year might be a different matter. Calibration cost the PXA over \$300 the last time it was done. Michelle Kuntzmann pointed out that the scales raised only \$250 last year, hardly enough to cover the cost of the annual calibration.

Members agreed to meet with Stockbreeders on May 9 at 6:30 p.m. at the fair grounds to go over the issues and discuss what could be done with the corrals.

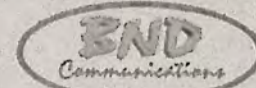
