

Princeton women's group vote for subsidized assisted living in B.C.

Princeton Business and Professional Women met April 25 for their annual general meeting. One of the topics of concern was how the club's delegate to provincial conference should vote on a resolution to be addressed at the conference.


The resolution calls for the support of the conference to lobby B.C.'s Minister of Health and Ministry Responsible for Seniors to "subsidize the cost of supportive and assisted living options for seniors on low income so that they are able to enjoy maximum independence and a reasonable quality of life in their communities." Background material demonstrated that a high percentage of aging Canadians (42 per cent are women) on low income are unable to live alone but do not need intermediate or extended care, and a high level of utilization of acute care beds by people who cannot go home and live alone, and many of those who live alone do so in high risk.

Princeton women related the resolution to Vermilion Court, a facility that meets the need without excessive cost, and voted in favour of this form of subsidized housing.

A slate of officers for 2000/01 was elected. Sandra Gould, Dawn Johnson, Floralee Stewart, and Dorothy Cobb were returned to office. They will be installed at the May 23 meeting.

A review of the financial situation led to a decision not to hold the Spring Fling Flea Market in the future.

The bursary committee had received no applications, but will meet in two weeks and perhaps there will be applications by then.

Why name a site Bankeir?

On the edge of the Kettle Valley Railroad abandoned right of way

(now the Trans Canada Trail), right across from the store, there is a sign saying 'Bankeir'. The resident asked the government worker in Victoria to define the boundaries of their area, and was told the boundaries are not clearly defined. The Bankeir resident then asked whether their area should be called a village or a hamlet, and was told it should be called a 'community.'


