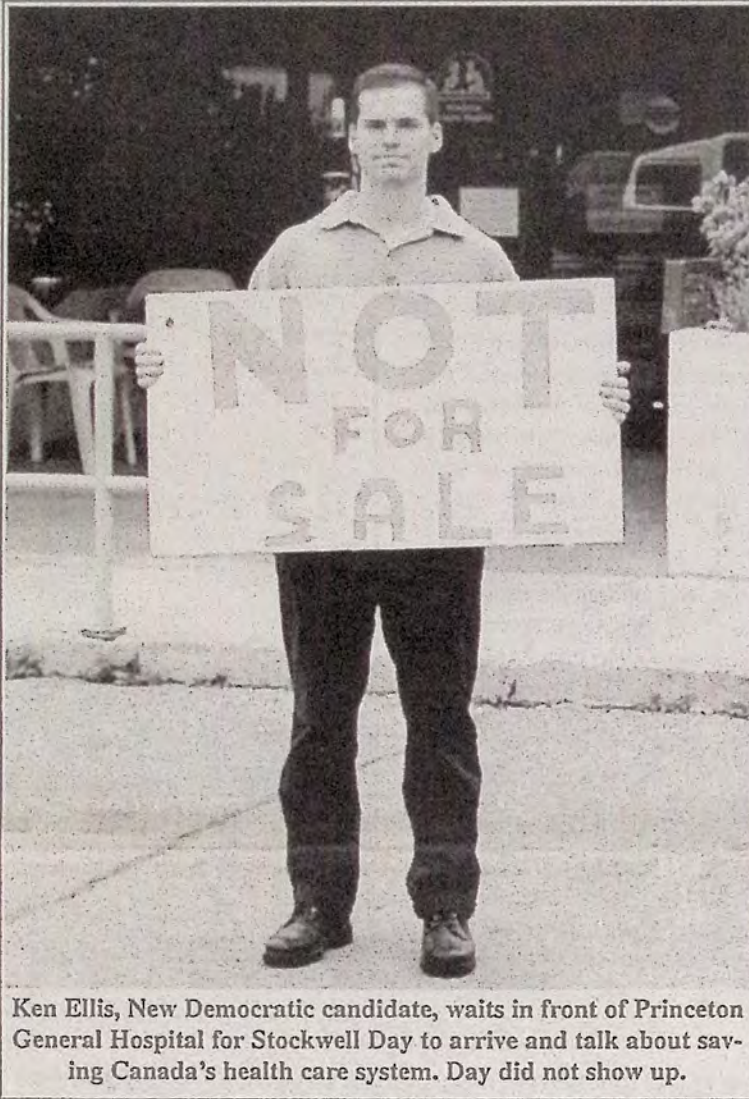

### Fall Fair is jam-packed

Year 2000 is a banner year for the Fall Fair! It begins with a celebration of the 140th anniversary of the naming of Princeton as a settlement area, but it celebrates the start of a new century for Princeton and the 35th anniversary of the founding of the Fall Fair. For Vermilion District Girl Guides, it is a celebration of the ninetieth anniversary of the founding of Girl Guides, and they will be serving cake at their tent. ## Day talks about gun control, GST

At a breakfast at Billy's Restaurant in Princeton on Saturday morning, September 2, Stockwell Day answered numerous questions from his audience of 25 early risers. They had an opportunity to see and hear the Alliance Party leader, and to ask questions. It was a friendly gathering and an attentive audience.

Day told the group he would "scrap" gun control legislation as it is the wrong way to approach illegal use of firearms, and is extremely costly to implement. He noted that the majority of people who own firearms have Firearms Acquisition Certificates, and criminals do not bother to register their guns. The Alliance Party would advocate safe use of firearms and responsible use of firearms.

Day was asked his opinion of the Goods and Services Tax, and what his party would do about it in the future. He said he does not like it, but it could not be elimi-

nated "overnight." He would opt for reducing it. He said the plans regarding the GST would be in an Alliance Party policy booklet scheduled to be available to the public next month.

Giving Day an opportunity to actually eat is breakfast, local Alliance Party members asked party supporters to show their support by purchasing memberships in the party and by making donations to the campaign.

Day was scheduled to do some mainstreeting in Princeton, then travel to Merritt to join in the Merritt rodeo parade at 11:00 a.m. The previous day he had campaigned in Penticton and Keremeos.

From Merritt he was slated to do campaigning in Summerland during the afternoon, tour the S.S. Sicamous in Penticton, then meet in Penticton with Sandbridge Residence Association. He would continue his campaigning in Summerland, Peachland and Penticton on Monday.

### — Ellis challenges Day to talk health care in Princeton

Health care in Canada is an issue in the September 11 by-election and a number of candidates oppose Stockwell Day's "Alberta" solution to health care. Ken Ellis, a New Democrat from Merritt, says he will not stand by and watch small hospitals sold the way they are being put up for sale in Alberta. He challenged Day to talk health care in Princeton at the hospital, but Day did not show up. Joan Russow opposes Day's approach to health care and the "Americanization" of Canada's medicare system. Jack Peach, running on the Canadian Action Party ticket, has made it clear that he and his party will not condone dismantling of medicare in Canada. Jim Strauss, a herbalist from Penticton, is running as an independent, and has sent out flyers saying he would advocate cheaper cures and save health costs.

Out of the total number of candidates, half are independents (no official party backing) and are short of funds for major advertising.

Both Russow and Ellis have visited Princeton to do some mainstreeting, and Day has been here twice, once on the invitation to speak to Rotarians, and the second time on Saturday morning to talk to people at a breakfast at Billy's Restaurant.

At a debate in Summerland the evening before Day's breakfast in Princeton, Ellis challenged Day to meet him at Princeton General Hospital to discuss what the Alliance Party would do to save the health care system. Ellis arrived at PGH at 8:00 a.m. and waited for Day, but Day did not show. Ellis made good use of his time, talking to nursing staff and a local businessman until 9:30 a.m., when Ellis left. He was to appear in the Merritt rodeo parade on Saturday morning. An all-candidates forum is scheduled in Merritt Saturday evening.

### Quake hits area south of Princeton

A tremor measuring 1.1 on the Richter scale registered at the seismological centre in Victoria on August 27. The quake epicenter was 56 km. South-Southwest of Princeton, in the Manning Park area. It was not felt on the surface, and was 20 km. deep.

### Conservation Officer says "Hunt safely"

Conservation Officer Al Lay reminds all hunters to read the regulations carefully, and to have a safe hunting season.

Bow hunting started on September 1, and the regular hunting season starts this weekend. Lay warns people going into the outdoors to be aware of hunters, wear bright clothing so as not to be mistaken for a deer, and to report all infractions to him (295-6343) or to the RCMP as soon as possible.

# Ellis would wake up Ottawa

Ken Ellis says the Member of Parliament's job is "to see that people in Ottawa understand the problems of the people in the riding." He says those who are elected seem to lose sight of local issues when they go to Ottawa, and says the people in Ottawa from eastern Canada do not pay much attention to ridings in the west.

Ellis hopes to be the next Member of Parliament to represent Okanagan-Coquihalla in the House of Commons. He visited the News Leader on Friday to talk about some of the issues and answered questions.

"What is your view of the natural resource base of our riding?" the News Leader asked.

Ellis did not hesitate to say he believes in development of natural resources in a sustainable way, and believes the resource industries give people an adequate standard of living. He recognizes the value of keeping our environment attractive to tourists, as tourism is a major industry, but his main concern is sustainable resource industries, along with job training strategies if these industries shut down.

The News Leader editor's pet peeve is the GST (Gouge and Shaft Tax). Ellis stated, "The GST is a horribly regressive tax."

He is opposed to it and feels Ottawa should "get rid of it."

When it comes to native land

claims, Ellis does not quibble about the necessity for settlement.

"The Supreme Court has ruled that we must settle these claims," he stated, "The claims must be resolved in a manner satisfactory to all those involved."

Furthermore, Ellis sees claims settlement as providing economic benefits for both sides.

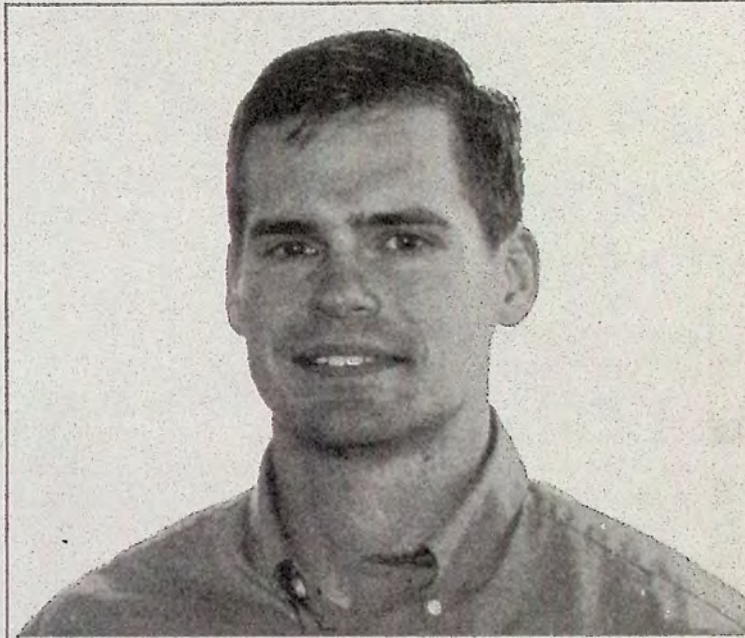
He admitted Okanagan-Coquihalla has seen more than its share of blockages and incidents related to land claims. If elected to the House of Commons, he would return to the riding if such a situation warranted

his presence, but would remain in Ottawa if that was the best place to help resolve the situation.

Ellis planned to challenge Stockwell Day on the privatization of hospitals, and said he would be coming through Princeton with Svend Robinson on September 5 to discuss the hospital situation.

Ellis looked forward to a debate with Day on health care issues.

"Just because we live in the Interior of BC does not mean we are unaware of the huge impact federal cutbacks have had on BC health care."

## Museum's new wing showcases Similkameen fossils and rocks

The new Joe Pollard Wing is complete, and welcoming a steady stream of visitors, including paleontologists, who are impressed with the collection on display. The fossils, on their own, would be worth a visit to the collection, but the minerals expand the attractions of the new wing. Items which are visible are just a small part of the collection. More fossils and minerals are in drawers and cabinets. The full museum collection is still not on display! More items are stored in the basement, waiting to be catalogued.

For a further attraction, local arrowheads (points) and scrapers are mounted and on display, given by local residents who donated their private collections to the museum.

Museum volunteers have done an excellent job of labeling the displays, making the exhibits much more interesting and a valuable source of information about the area. Joe Pollard's collection included samples from many other areas, and it is a good way to compare what has been discovered in the Similkameen Valley

with discoveries in other areas of the world.

For a closer look at the minerals and fossils, the museum has a microscope available.

Invitations are being sent for the official opening of the new wing, scheduled for October 21. The Joe Pollard Wing was constructed through a grant from the provincial government, the Town of Princeton and private donations. Display cases were purchased with a grant from the Vancouver Foundation. A burglar alarm has been installed.

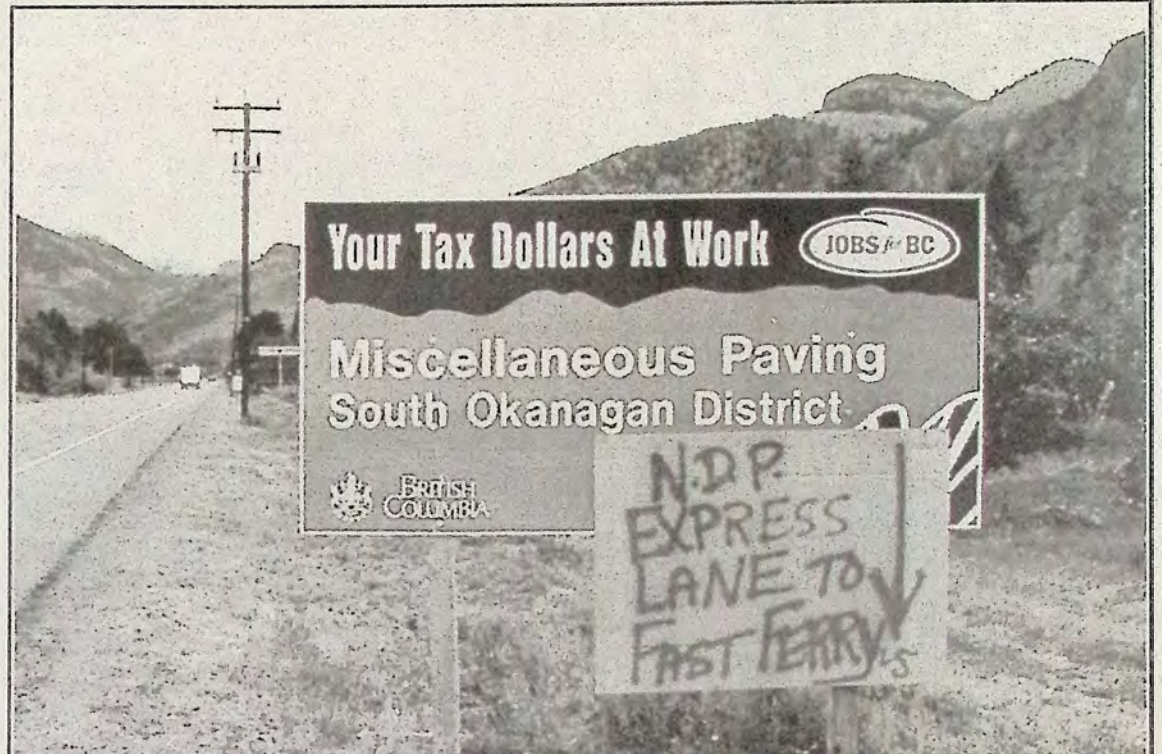

## Russow challenges Day at forum

Stockwell Day visited Keremeos on Friday afternoon, and the Elks Hall was full of voters wanting to see and hear the Alliance Party candidate. Most were impressed with his manner and his ready answers to all of the questions they asked. One older lady described him as "charismatic." His successful visit to Keremeos was hardly a preparation for the evening to come.

At the Summerland all-candidates meeting on Friday evening, all eight of the candidates seeking to be elected as Member of Parliament for Okanagan-Coquihalla were present. Over 300 people attended, and many were unable to find a seat in the high school auditorium.

Joan Russow openly challenged Day on a number of issues, as did many of the audience, and Russow said Day later complained to media that the audience was filled with "plants" who asked the questions.

Russow challenged Day strongly on the fact that he had been in the riding so few days, while other candidates had been campaigning for most of the pre-election period. She

mentioned his many trips to other places in Canada during that time, and commented on issues raised locally that had not been addressed by Day.

People asked Russow about her involvement in the WTO "riots" in Seattle, but she explained she had been there to promote public trust international treaties, and was not part of any riots.

Russow said Day's use of the term "race-based laws" was an Americanism used to justify "extinguishment" of native rights, and she pressured Day on his part in the passage of Alberta Bill 11, saying it is the first step toward privatization of the health care system in Canada.

Russow was not the only candidate

to challenge Day on health care and all other candidates were adamant in support of maintaining Canada's system with improvements.

Many of the questions Day faced from the audience referred to his religious background, and particularly his stand on abortion and sexual orientation.

Ken Ellis, New Democratic candidate, challenged Day to meet him at Princeton General Hospital the following morning, to talk about what could be done to save Canada's health care system, and to talk about small hospitals.

Day spoke in Princeton on Saturday morning to a small gathering at a breakfast meeting.

## Man dies in crash

Arthur Richard Sutcliffe died Saturday, September 2, as a result of an automobile accident 35 km east of Princeton on Highway 3. The 66 year old Creston man was one of four passengers in a Ford Windstar that

went off the left side of the road on a gentle curve shortly after 3:00 p.m. When the vehicle hit the ditch, it flipped over completely, crashing the back end of the van. Alcohol was not a factor in this crash.

Princeton RCMP, BC Ambulance and Princeton Highway Rescue attended. The three other passengers, all from Creston, sustained minor injuries. They were taken to Princeton General Hospital where they were held overnight for observation.

Princeton RCMP have taken charge of the investigation of the fatal crash.

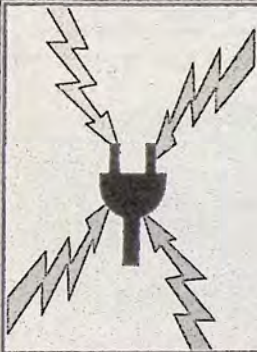

## The Search for Spirituality

# Individuation is the first step

The topic last week was the different levels of awareness, beginning with the "herd" mentality. People have needs, and the need to belong is a strong need, right above the basic needs for food, shelter and reproduction. The need to belong creates a desire to be in a herd, or group. The search for spirituality begins with leaving the herd and thinking for yourself.

The search for spirituality, for some people, means exploring spiritualism (ghosts, communication with spirits, spirit guides, etc.) or discovering native rituals of one sort or another, or becoming interested in strange cults. What these people are doing is exchanging one "herd" for another. That is not progress.

When a person no longer needs a group in order to find an identity, that person enters a process called individuation. Teachers of spiritual growth say individuation is critical to spiritual development. Psychologists say individuation is essential to a mature character.

If individuation proceeds well, the person no longer needs the approval of a group, nor membership in a group. The person is independent in thought, interests, attitudes and appearance.

Dr. M. Scott Peck, a well-respected American psychiatrist, wrote *The Road Less Travelled*. His book is about the search for indi-

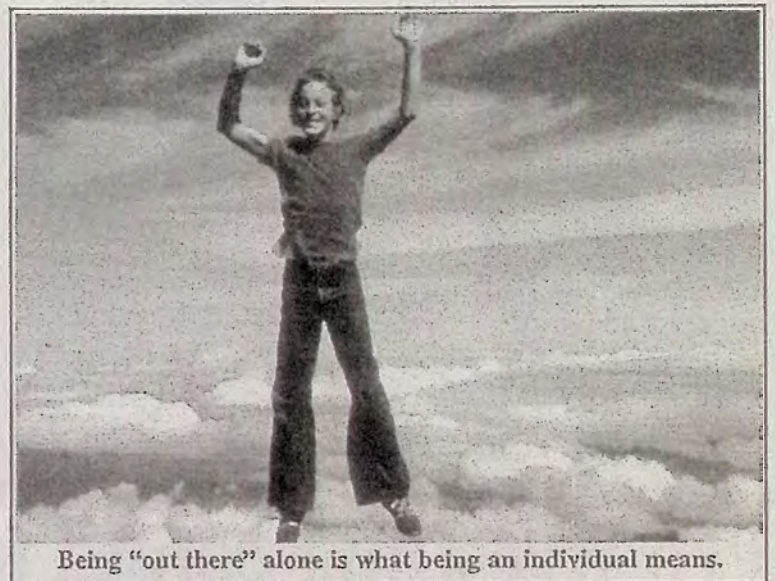
vidual identity, the formation of principles and personal effectiveness. Stephen Covey, author of *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*, talks about ways to become an effective, productive individual. In both these books, the reader is given techniques and truths, but the main menu is "choice." Choices create the individuated person.

People in the herd mentality do not want the responsibility of making choices. They feel safe and comfortable in joining a herd and doing what the herd does. They do not have to make any choices except, "Which herd shall I join?"

The formation of individual character is a necessary step toward

not only a mature character, but toward real spirituality. Through the ages, those people pursuing a spiritual life have isolated themselves from the mainstream for long periods of time: monks (hermits), nuns (solitary retreat), medicine men (journeys alone into the wilderness), and sometimes, a long term alone in prison, which might not begin as a spiritual journey but ends as one.

To develop as an individual, one must give up any group that describes how one ought to think, or in any other way limits the freedom to be an individual. The experience of being out there alone stimulates individuation, but often, a lot of preparation time must pass before a person is ready to be "out there alone."



Being "out there" alone is what being an individual means.

## LIVING PAST 100

### Questions for boomers

What are you going to do with the next 40 years of your life?

Ask that question of yourself if you are a baby boomer in your forties. Most of the "boomer" generation are now in what they see as "middle age", which was once those years between age 35 and 55. Today, people age 55 appear to be entering middle age, not preparing for old age. People age 65 and 70 are often more like middle-aged people than their parents would have been.

On the average, which is how we have to plan our lifetimes, boomers are expected to live to well past the 80-plus life expectancy of today. In fact, if boomers look around at 80 year olds today, the boomers will soon recognize their own probability of living to that age and beyond. Improved nutrition, better awareness of the need to be alert, to stay involved in life, and better medicine have combined to keep the boomers young than any previous "middle-aged group." Boomers are "lookin' good" for a long lifespan.

Unfortunately, there is another group, in their 80's, who would have done things differently if they had imagined they would live so long.

"I never thought I'd live to this age!" is a frequent remark of the over-80 crowd (yes, there is now a crowd of them!)

So, what are boomers going to do for the next 40 years?

The question is not "How are you going to spend your old age?" but how are you going to spend your long middle age?

There are many options. One of the ways of looking at the options is to think about what has been achieved during the past 40 years of life. For a very few people, having children is not an option they want. They have already achieved their goals in raising children. At one time, early retirement was the big goal in life, but how many years of retirement would appeal to most people? For others, having a small business is the answer, keeping them busy, productive and in the mainstream. Others have opted for a career change, along with more education.

The major consideration is this: unless accident or incurable illness strikes, boomers are going to live longer than any previous generation. They must find answers to how they will enjoy those years.

## Naturalists welcome well-known local author

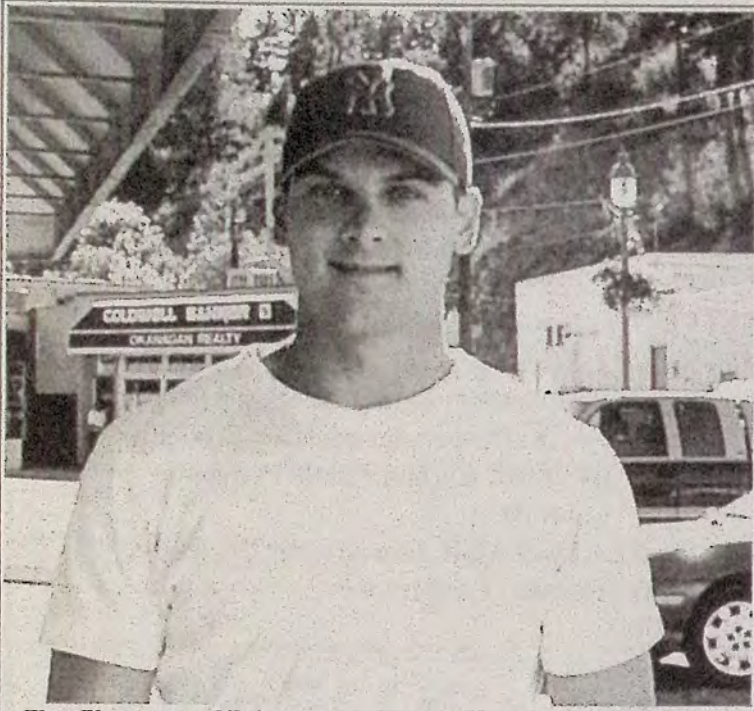

# Big River Camp in Labrador

Bob Skinner had a dream. He also liked to catch Atlantic salmon. Bob lived in Newfoundland where he taught school. He was a math teacher and eventually became a principal. After early retirement, he decided to use his Cessna float plane to explore the Labrador coast. One of his many trips, he discovered Big River. Gaining rights to have the territory around the river become solely his for recreational purposes, he decided to build. He used native materials: spruce, fir, stone, even sphagnum and reindeer moss. They brought in a gas powered portable sawmill and cut 2" x 6", 2" x 4", and other beams and boards.

As I write this, I can see in my mind's eye the rough-cut beams in my bedroom ceiling at the camp. They are often not perfectly cut, have bark still clinging and average about 15 foot long. That is the height these spruce and fir grow. If taller, the roots, which can only grow down a few feet because of permafrost, would not hold the tree upright.

The walls, of peeled logs, are chinked with sphagnum moss. I can see holes and when the mosquitoes started coming through at night, I stuffed paper, old socks, etc. into them. Then I would light some mosquito coils. I remember reading on the box "avoid prolonged inhalation of fumes." Well, in camp, we had them going day and night for 11 days! Too late to wonder now about that warning.

Back to the overall description of Big River Camp. It is an add-on affair. Starting with a rectangular building of 40 x 50 feet, rooms branch off. It is easy to tell the additions - instead of chinking with moss, they were chiked with expanding styrofoam from aerosol cans. The whole complex is capable of sleeping 12 anglers, five guides and a cook.

Heating is done with a 45 gallon drum with cast iron stove doors and a cast iron collar for the pipe, screwed and bolted onto the barrel. These stoves work well for about five hours, even when stoked with three foot long firewood. The first one to get up to go to the bathroom throws some more wood on. The clanking of the door at night is like a clock, especially when there are many older men in camp. It is definitely a camp sound!

Tucked onto the back of the building is the guides' schack. This comfy little five-bed room is where I liked to hang out after a day's fishing. I wish I had had a tape recorder for some of the stories (yarns as they say there). Fly rods, vests, jackets, cameras, PJs, socks, mittens, hats and everything else needed by the men are hanging from nails. Some ingenious shelves were devised to hold books, cans of tobacco for homemade smokes, clocks, flashlights, etc.

Each guide had his own portion of

the available wall space - his private area in the community (or commune).

The water system operated by means of polypropylene pipes, hose clamps and the ubiquitous 45 gallon drum. A gasoline-powered

pump brought Big River water to camp through about 500 feet of pipe. Three drums outside my bedroom window were the reservoir. The water, so clean we drank right out of the river, gravity fed down to the bathrooms and kitchen. Some of the clamped joints leaked and dripping water sounds joined the clanking stove door sounds at night. A red squirrel and pine martin scapered around the roof in the dar, adding their noise to camp nights.

Mention of camp conveniences should be made so you don't think I was living in a throwback to the

18th century. There were five freezers, three refrigerators, a heavy duty washer, hot and cold water, a radio phone (very popular as all messages could be heard by everyone). This reminded me of my grandparents' country phone with one difference - the radio phone didn't fade as listeners "tuned in." The old party line used to weaken as more people "clicked on."

A propane stove and water heater gave the cook an excellent set-up. Some of the baked goods Kim made could rival those from the finest bakeries in Vancouver. Especially good were her partridge berry, blueberry and apple pies. Of course, I am a pie man, and they were especially tasty after a day of outdoor exercise.

Appliances were run by a diesel-powered generator. The most interesting appliance was the ice-making machine. I used a lot of ice, as we had very hot weather. I thought it the best appliance in camp. Ice drinks were sure welcome!

Suffice it to say it was a very interesting, comfortable camp. Beds were soft, there was electric lighting in all rooms, which went out after a few preliminary blinks at 10:30 p.m. Then flashlights rules the night.

Screened windows allowed fresh air to circulate through camp.

Isolation was what Bob Skinner was trying to find - isolation and fish. He certainly found both, and he brought in some 20th century amenities to reduce the shock of stepping off into the wilderness for city-born anglers.

## New law deals with dangerous dogs

If you own a dog considered dangerous to the public, an animal control officer may enter your property and seize the dog. Under the new law, in effect August 30, an animal control officer or police can apply for a warrant to enter private property and seize a dangerous dog. The law confirms that animal control officers can apply for a Provincial Court order for the destruction of a dangerous dog. A court hearing would then decide whether the dog should be destroyed.

The definition of a dangerous dog is a dog that has killed or seriously injured a person, or is likely to do so. A dog that has killed or injured a domestic animal can also be defined as a dangerous dog.

Most dog owners recognize their responsibilities. If their dog is aggressive, they take care so other people or animals are not hurt.

The new dangerous dog law is aimed at dog owners who refuse to take the necessary preventive measures, even when faced with evidence that their dog has killed

or is likely to kill or cause serious injury.

Dog attacks can have tragic consequences, especially for young children. The new law strikes a balance between respecting the rights of dog owners and making sure dangerous dogs do not pose a threat.

The Women's Institute started the fair, and this fair has been a showcase in which local people could take pride in the skills and achievements of rural people, including all of the villages and Princeton in the term "rural." The products of the people are on display, with ribbons for those judged best. Those products range from livestock to needlework to wine and cheese to "you name it", and we take pride in what we produce in this valley.

In celebrating the new century and the new millennium, we are recognizing how well-established our community is. Many families, such as the Allison and the Brewers, have lived here for more than a century. Roots go very deep in the valley, and feeling proud of what we have achieved in the past century is not arrogant pride, but the satisfaction of having survived everything the world threw at us, while making progress every step of the way.

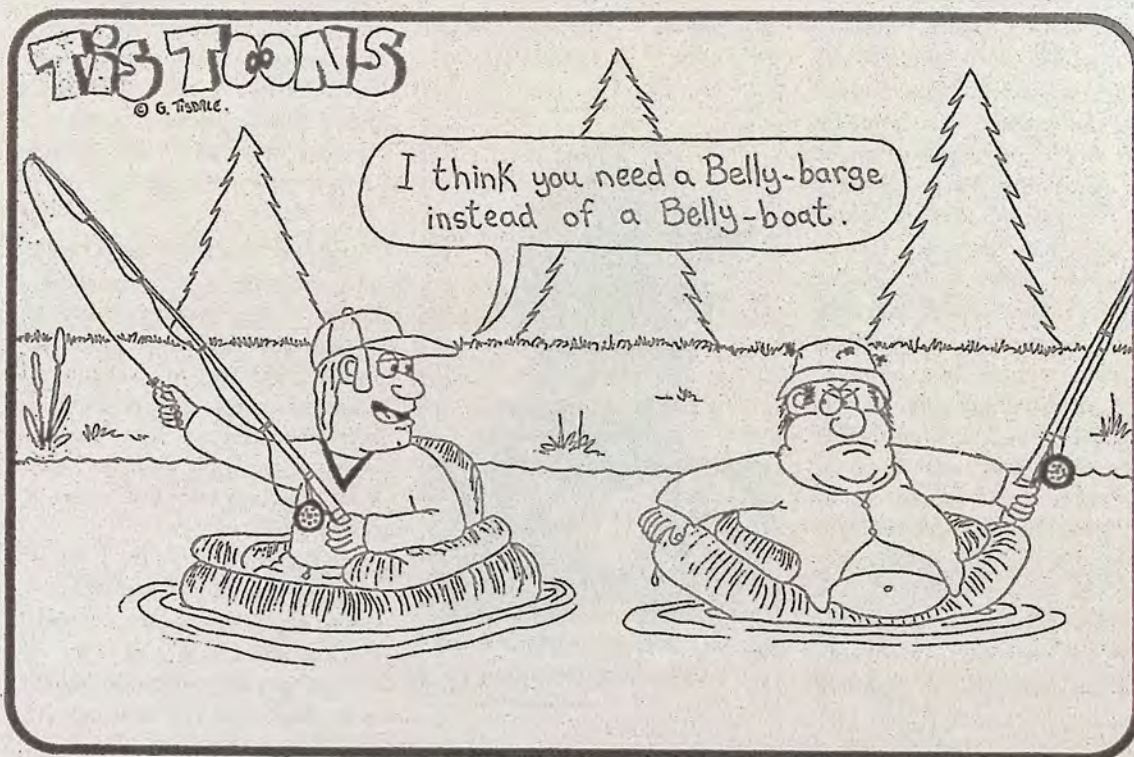

With nearly 30 years experience as a prison chaplain and rehabilitation worker, I have studied the roots and causes of fluctuations in the crime rate for some time. Moreover, within my Archdiocese, we have clergy who have worked with criminals both in prisons and in rehabilitation programs outside the prison system.

Both I and several of my clergy have worked with street people and marginal criminal elements in assessment and rehabilitation for many years. Together, we have been studying and assessing the social and economic policies advocated by the Reform/Alliance Party (policies far removed from the traditional position Canadians) and the one consistent conclusion we are led to is this: Alliance Party ultra right wing extremist social and economic policy must inevitably force a radical increase in the crime rates in Canada. The

policy, based heavily in Calvinist sectarian religious doctrine rather than careful, detailed analysis of its processes and end effects, will disenfranchise ever greater segments of society and radically broaden the gap between rich and poor in Canada. Despite ideas about crime spawned by ultra right wing harshness and coldness and sectarian religious doctrines, these factors are the primary dynamics behind increases in crime in any society.

I have parishes in both Canada and America and I am sorrowfully aware of how many Americans have no hope of ever having medical insurance, how many senior citizens must carry as many as five separate medical policies to have barely adequate coverage. Our Medicare system is Canada's greatest moral achievement. The fact that Canadians have been willing to share the burden of medical care with and for each other is a crowning act of true morality.... the moral-

ity Jesus Christ taught us, the morality the great religious teachers of all religions taught.

The Alliance, while using the name "Christian" at every turn, de sires to undermine and eventually destroy our Medicare system. Privatization, such as Americans suffer, will simply reclassify you and your loved ones, should you become ill, from a sick person into a "health care consumer" and entry on the profit side of the ledger of a "for profit only" private hospital.

Moreover, Stockwell Day has expressed his desire to undermine the federal structure that holds our nation together and fragment the country into autonomous sub-states that can be absorbed piecemeal into the United States. I see Stockwell Day as an unsafe religious demagogue ..... I must oppose him.

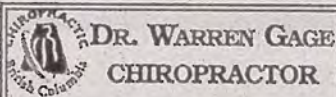

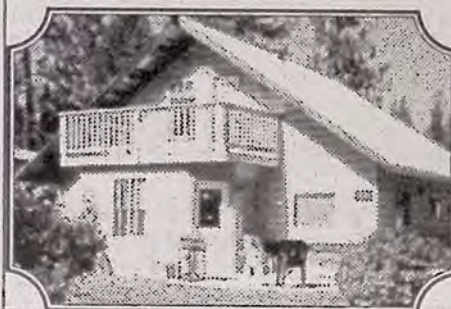

Princeton - A 10-day workshop coming to the Skills Centre in October is designed to inspire people so they can deal with change. A daily topic helps them evaluate their life experience and see how they can use what they know and what they are learning.

"They get a clear focus as to where they're going to take their career next," says Tanya Swaren, who developed *Survival Skills for the 21st Century*.

Swaren started her consulting firm in Summerland, and now has an office in Penticton and in Langley, where Elaine Lane manages the workshops. The work-

shops are contracted through HRDC and are free of charge to people who are unemployed and eligible to work in Canada. If a group of 10 or more wants to take the workshop, the cost is \$1200 per person.

The workshop is designed to help people deal effectively with change and move forward. More than 1600 have graduated from the course (receiving certificates) and there have been no negative responses. People feel energized by the daily workshop topics and the sharing of information.
