## Remains found in fire are mystery

A fire in the early evening of April 16 at the residence of Willi Rosch 12 km southwest of Princeton destroyed the home, but no positive identification has been made of the remains found at the fire site. Coroner Larry Catlin would not confirm these were the remains of Rosch, who has not been located. The remains have been sent to the Forensic Unit in Penticton for positive identification and it is believed the identity will be confirmed April 22 or 23, 2002. The cause of the fire is unknown but not believed to be suspicious.

## Woman escapes death

On Saturday, April 20, at noon, a 62 year old Vancouver woman narrowly escaped drowning when her car left Highway 3 east of Princeton. Her car crossed the opposite lane, became airborne, and landed upside down in the Similkameen River where it was totally submerged. RCMP Cst. Chris Newel says the fact that she was wearing her seatbelt likely prevented serious injury. She remained conscious and was able to free herself through a window. She was assisted to shore by a passing motorist. She was taken to Princeton General Hospital where she was examined and released.

## New industry, more jobs result from partnership

Upper Similkameen Indian Band (USIB) and Princeton Forest Products Ltd. (PFP) are developing an 85 acre industrial site on Highway 3 west of Princeton. The industry will involve several different processing operations. The partners in the development worked with Land and Water BC (Crown Lands) in a successful co-operative fashion to secure District Lot 983 (DL983) for economic development.

The Band and PFP, in association with BC Ministries for Forest and Environment agreed to protect portions of the lot from any adverse development in order to ensure the integrity of winter range for deer and other ungulates.

The partnership between the Band and PFP was formed several years ago, which led to being awarded Non-Replaceable Forest Licence A61106. This licence Continued on page 2 ..

## Princeton Chamber protests Cascades plan

Local Chamber of Commerce members are protesting the exclusion of motorized vehicles in Manning Park and Cascade Recreational Management Plan. Members say the plan is incorrect and will cause economic hardship in the Princeton area.

Otto Coers, President of Princeton & District Chamber of Commerce, has sent a detailed letter to John Meeson, Environmental Stewardship Division of the Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection in Penticton outlining the Chamber's objections.

The report obtained by the Chamber says Cascade Recreational Area is a "roadless area". The Chamber letter points out it

is far from roadless and further, the report contradicts itself by saying "the Whipsaw-Tulameen Road passes through the northeast corner of the recreation area providing access for horse riders and snowmobile users who use the Granite Mountain area".

The Chamber letter states the Whipsaw-Tulameen Road goes from Coalmont to Whipsaw Creek on the Hope-Princeton Highway and passes through the proposed Cascade Recreational Area in at least three different places, and leading from this road are many other roads accessing mining claims, trappers cabins and so on. ## Nicola-Similkameen wants more timber

Can we cut more timber in Merritt Forest District?

Nicola-Similkameen Innovative Forestry Society (NSIFS) says it is possible and has applied for 430,000 cubic metres above the current Annual Allowable Cut (AAC). Rob Marshall, Forestlands Manager at Weyerhaeuser Princeton Division, on behalf of the Society, presented the information at a public meeting in Princeton on April 16.

NSIFS is composed of the major licensees, seven Indian Bands from the Merritt area, and Upper Similkameen Indian Band, along with representation by Merritt Forest District. This amalgamation of interests in local control over forest issues has become a model for other areas.

The innovation developed by NSIFS is a new tool, a map used for assessing environmental, recreational, cultural and forest resources within Merritt Forest District. In addition to this mapping tool, named Predictive Ecosystem Mapping (PEM) employees of NSIFS have gone into the field to gather data on how fast trees grow, what impacts on timber growth, and how to enhance timberlands for other use, such as wildlife habitat enhancement, berry-picking (important to the Bands) and employment potential (economic assets to communities).

NSIFS has discovered trees grow 20 percent faster than originally believed and the additional harvest would be sustainable.

The application goes to the Regional Manager in Kamloops.

Marshall says there is a potential for 200 new jobs if the application is approved.

He added the proposal meets the current government's "New Era" goal to revitalize the forest industry.

Following Marshall's excellent presentation, he called for questions from the floor.

The first question was: in view of the current softwood lumber tariff situation, what makes NSIFS feel there will be a market for additional timber?

This question brought chuckles, and Marshall said they were confident "We're going to be here a long time."

Another NSIFS member replied, "I guess you could say we're eternal optimists."

John Henry, a local citizen not involved in the forest industry, was concerned about "bald" spots in the forest that show up on satellite images. Marshall said the satellite does not show the young forests growing in the "bald" spots.

## Get ready for Western Week

Princeton Rodeo Club President Stan Thompson has had a couple of really interesting weeks. A silversmith from Montana wants to give him free buckles as prizes for lucky spectators at the Princeton Canadian Pro Rodeo May 11 and 12. A saddlemaker from southern California is coming to set up a booth and so is a western artist. Others have inquired about booths. However, Princeton and District 4-H has the concession exclusively.

Thompson has been talking with business people who want to decorate their shops for Western Week. Thompson is encouraging all the local businesses to decorate their windows in a western theme. Many

Phillipe Batini, Manager of Upper Similkameen Indian Band, said he had the same concerns about cutting more trees, but the information persuaded him it was possible. Some Indian Bands had concerns about overgrowth in some areas.

Rich Hodson, a Ministry of Forests employee, reminded Henry the Timber Supply Review is conducted every five years, and if the harvest does not appear sustainable, there will be cutbacks in the harvest.

Dennis Cook, a logging contractor, asked if there is enough milling capacity to process the additional harvest. He was assured there is more than enough, and the bulk of it will be processed in Princeton.

Cook said the extra did not really benefit Princeton.

One of the issues Cook addressed was the deal forced, by politics, Continued on Page 2 .....

admitted later he was not opposed to increasing the harvest.

There was a great deal said, as always at these timber harvest meetings, about the politics governing the fact that 60 per cent of the timber is south of Princeton and 60 per cent of the milling capacity and forestry jobs are in Merritt.

Cook had further concerns about the new Forest Act planned by government which would put timber up for auction.

"The new Forest Act says the forest doesn't go with the community anymore," Cook stated.

Marshall agreed the auction might result in a cutback of some of the timber allocations, but it remained to be seen what government would do.

Batini remarked on the efforts of NSIFS, "That's why we're here - to bring something to the Similkameen. Communities should keep on saying they're not happy."

The land will be used as a new industrial site for different wood manufacturing for several different facilities. PFP will relocate and expand its house log production facility. The Band and PFP have formed a joint venture company, Blackmine Wood Fibre INC, to expand into a log sort yard, processing and manufacturing of smallwood, and wood by-product business.

The Band and PFP received assistance from many people and agencies in launching this new enterprise: Lands and Water BC INC, Ministry of Transportation and Highways, Ministry of Forests, Agricultural Land Commission, MLA Dave Chutter, RDQS and Area H Director Gerri Logan, Princeton Town Council and Weyerhaeuser Princeton Division.

there has been horse and motorized vehicles on these roads for the past 60 years, and roads are shown on a map dating back to 1906.

The letter goes on to specify the Whipsaw Road as a major 4-wheel drive road used by many groups from the lower mainland and U.S.A., making it a major source of recreational resource income for Princeton area economy.

"These types of recreation bring a lot more prosperity to the Princeton District than recreational users hiking, biking or horseback riding from Manning Park," the Chamber letter tells the Ministry.

Coers goes on to criticize the fact that the plan is based on the Manning Park side of the Cascade area which is not easily accessible from Manning Park, but very easily accessed from the Princeton side.

Another criticism is based on the report's statement that the plan reflects discussions with many groups and individuals. Coers points out the only meeting held in Princeton was in regard to relocation of grizzly bears and was met with strong resistance. The letter notes the lack of any other consultation with Princeton area residents and business people.

The letter states very clearly that Chamber wants to see a management plan that includes motorized

vehicles and respects long-established uses of the area: "we would like to point out that use by motorized vehicles (e.g. snowmobiles, ATVs, bikes, trucks, etc.) is a major contribution to the economy of our area and has been for many years.

Our town and surrounding areas are dependent on Tourism, and we have identified motorized vehicle users as being the largest tourism group in our area."

The letter is copied to MLA Dave Chutter and the Minister responsible.

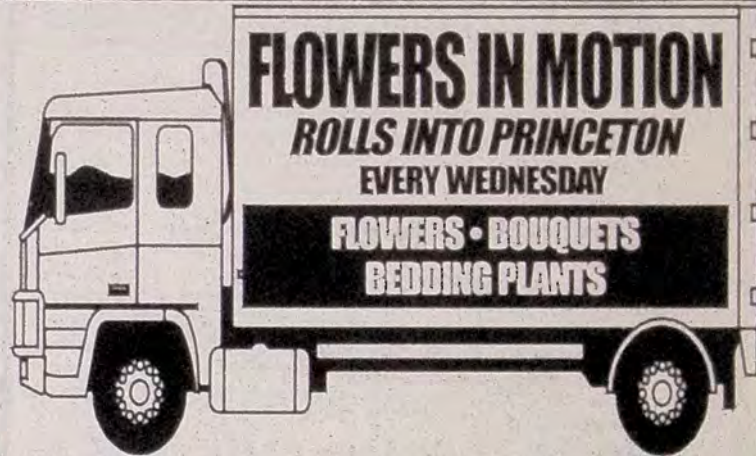

## Health Fair was a job well done

From the friendly greeting at the door by Joan Bush (and her bowl of candy) to the final pit stop for coffee and goodies served by the Royal Purple, the Health Fair was well organized. Victory Hall was crowded with exhibit booths on April 16, and there were a lot of people eager to talk about some aspect of health.

Many of the displays were aimed primarily at seniors. These displays included special appliances to help

the disabled to get around, or the alcohol and drug abuse counselling services available for seniors.

At the same time, many of the booths catered to any age, such as the ambulance service and public health booths.

Anyone who has an elderly dependent relative, or an elderly relative trying hard to be independent, could find a lot of interesting information at this fair.

## LSIB and Katimavik build canoes

Alex Terbasket, Herman Edwards and Alfred Snow, along with Katimavik volunteers, are building canoes from cottonwood logs. For Jerome Claveau from St. Clair, Quebec, and Leanne Laracey from St. Andrews, N.B., this is an experience they will long remember.

The cottonwood trees were felled in February, and thanks to the generosity of T.L. Timber of Cawston, the logs were hauled from the old Pier-John property to Similkameen Flats, where the Lower Similkameen Indian Band has a big barn.

The logs were trimmed of bark,

shaped, and dug out. One of the logs is 20 feet long and the other is 19.5 feet long. Both will be big canoes. There is a smaller log which is being shaped into a small canoe "for the babies".

Alex Terbasket is the project supervisor, but Alfred Snow and Herman Edwards are the curvers. They learned how to make canoes last year, when the Band brought in a man who taught others how to make the canoes.

Edwards says the project is "important to the youth, to our people and our culture".

The Katimavik volunteers have learned how to use the tools and to build the canoe, and at the same time, they are learning about the Similkameen Band's cultural roots. They say they are enjoying the experience. Claveau says he is thinking of trying to make a canoe when he goes back to Quebec. He is considering making it from maple or oak.

Edwards says the volunteers are "a real great help". He notes it is a good experience for everyone involved because it is history in the making.

"Nobody's done this in years," he

## Here's a health care horror story!

All of us know the health care system is in trouble, and the people who suffer most are the most seriously ill patients. A Princeton resident, who wishes to remain anonymous, told the News Leader a real-life horror story.

In July, 2001, he underwent surgery to have a pacemaker attached to his heart. He became infected at the site of his intravenous needle, and spent 21 days in hospital fighting infection. In September, it was discovered his pacemaker was not properly connected, and he went back into hospital to have the second pacemaker inserted. This pacemaker became infected at the site of the battery, and he was put on antibiotics.

In March, the site of the infection burst open and pus poured from it. He went back to the specialist in Kamloops. The specialist wanted to replace it immediately. He consulted with a specialist surgeon, who told him the site might not be cured as the

wires leading to the heart were probably infected.

There used to be three surgeons in B.C. who could do this delicate surgery but there is now only one, and this surgeon tried immediately to find operating room time at either Vancouver General or St. Paul's in Vancouver.

In the meantime, the wound was held together with a couple of stitches so the pacemaker would not fall out!

The wound continued to weep pus and dressings were changed five times a day as this Princeton man waited at home. He consumed enor-

mous quantities of antibiotics which made him feel tired and ill.

During the wait, the surgeon was trying to negotiate with other surgeons to have them give up time in the operating room so the pacemaker could be removed. He required two hours for the surgery.

This week, 40 days after his pacemaker site broke open from infection, this Princeton resident will have the pacemaker surgically removed. When he is free of infection, a new pacemaker will be attached to his heart. Nobody knows when the new round of surgery can be done.





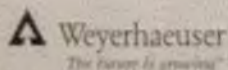

**Area H and Town can  
expect tipping fees in July**

Princeton and Area H will be handling garbage in a new way after July 1, according to Regional Director Gerri Logan. We will be allowed two bags per household per week, and we will have stickers to put on them to show we are entitled to place garbage in the Princeton landfill.

The idea is to issue 104 stickers to every resident of Area H and Princeton. This entitles residents to dispose of garbage at the landfill under current taxation formula. If you need more than 104 stickers per year, you pay for the extras out of pocket. Anyone who does not have a sticker will pay a "tipping" fee.

Anyone who has never recycled before should learn how to do it now. A person will be hired to educate the public before the new system begins. There will be no charge for recycled items taken to the landfill, and it really makes sense to recycle if you have to pay extra if you need to dispose of more than two bags of garbage per week.

Anyone who does not live in Area H or Princeton will not receive a stick-

er. These people will have to buy stickers if they want to dispose of garbage in the local landfill.

### Canadian deaths were a big mistake

The Canadians killed by so-called "friendly" fire were just a big mistake on the part of American military personnel fighting in Afghanistan. That is the official line. For the families and comrades of those who lost their lives, defining this action as a "mistake" is hardly consoling.

Prime Minister Jean Chrétien and President George Bush, along with any other politician who could get into the act, sent condolences to the families. At the same time these politicians commended Canadian soldiers for their sacrifice in fighting for our rights and freedoms.

We could easily understand the commendations if, while our soldiers were killed, they had actually been fighting for our rights and freedoms. Instead, they were doing some training exercises.

We could understand the commendations if it had been Taliban forces who had killed our soldiers. Instead, it was our friends, our American allies, who attacked and killed our soldiers in a "mistake".

It was nice to learn there will be a full-scale investigation to explain how it was that our soldiers were killed by troops who supposedly have the most sophisticated military equipment in the world, and who the American media say can pinpoint a target within a few feet and never miss their objective (unfortunately, in this case). It was nice to be told somebody will find out why an American pilot thought Canadians were the enemy.

What would have been better than all this sympathy and promises of investigation would have been an apology from either President Bush or the officer in charge of the operation. A big mistake was made and that mistake killed American allies who are, to all intents and purposes, helping the U.S. military, and a profound apology should have been the first statement any politician made.

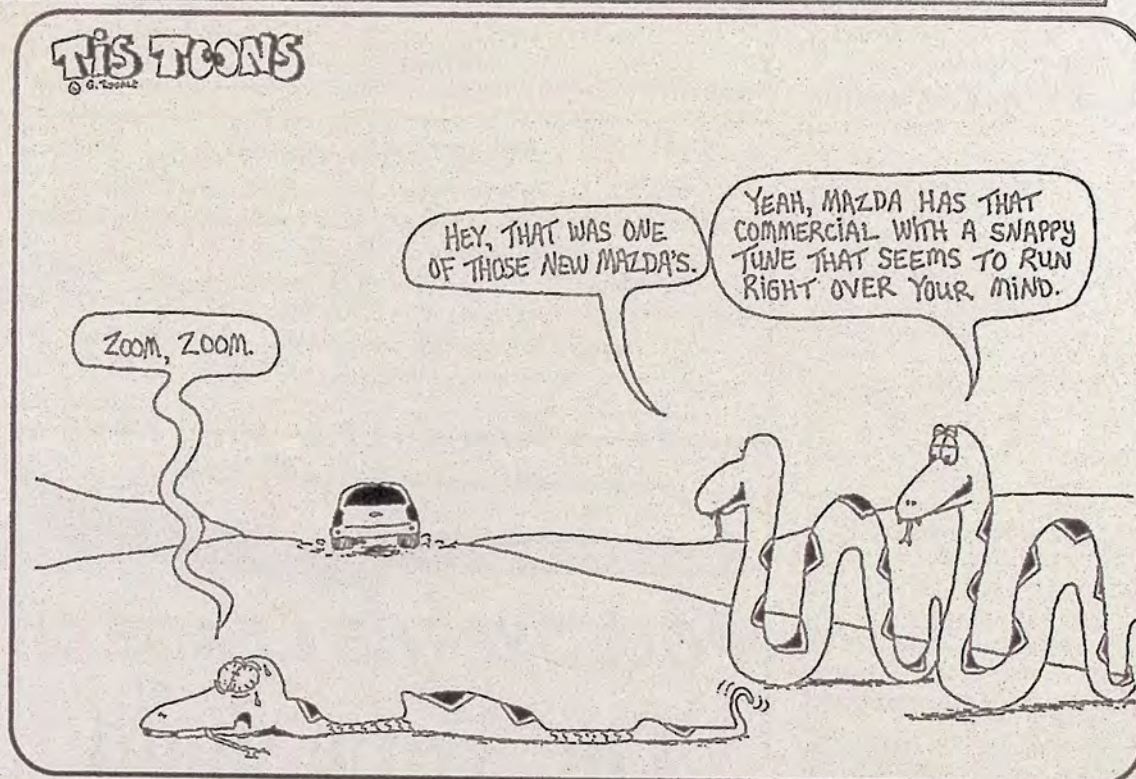

the distinct needs of persons with disabilities.

Many people with disabilities have a desire to work and have skills they can bring to the workplace. We are creating a range of specialized services that will allow persons with disabilities to take advantage of employment opportunities as they are able, including job training and placement, technical equipment, physical accommodation and follow-up workplace support. Persons with disabilities who are more limited in their ability to work will receive on-going assistance.

Allegations that tens of thousands of people with disabilities will have no access to food, shelter or medical care as a result of these changes are irresponsible and unfounded. For people with a disability, higher income assistance rates will continue. It is also false that use of guide dogs will not be considered as qualifying the individual for disability assistance. These claims amount to fear mongering and are a disservice to the disability community.

The new disabilities act also recognizes that persons with disabilities face unique challenges in daily living and barriers to employment. The act sets out criteria for eligibility for those age 18 and over, such as a mental or physical impairment that significantly restricts a person's ability to perform daily living activities. This will specifically address those individuals with episodic illnesses, such as a mental health disorder. By focusing on functional limitations rather than medical costs, we are also bringing the definition of disability more in line with human rights case law.

In the definition, a person's designation as disabled is not permanent because some disabilities can be potentially changed or even eliminated over time with treat-

ment or through new medical technology. However, if the person's condition remains the same, they will continue to maintain their designation. People with disabilities are also exempt from time limits on assistance, from the two-year independence test, from liens against their homes, and from other requirements that may apply only to clients without disabilities.

The ultimate goal of the new legislation is greater independence for people with disabilities, including security of income, enhanced well-being and participation in the community. Sincerely, Murray Coell, Minister of Human Resources.

# The high cost of violence against women

As April 22 to April 28, 2002 is the eighth annual Prevention of Violence Against Women Week in Canada, it seems like an appropriate time to respond to Sergeant Dosko's request for local input into the subject of safety in the home and community.

Since 1997, I have coordinated the Cindy Parolin Safe HOMes Program in Princeton. This program serves women in abusive relationships within a 50 km. radius of Princeton and serves an approximate population of 6,200. In the past five years, the program has provided crisis intervention, support services and safe shelter for 454 women and 346 children who have experienced violence in their own homes. The program has an average monthly intake of 10 women, seven children and three shelter days.

The standard for any society's level of health can be measured by the status of women's lives within that society. In Canada, the rate of violence against women is comparatively high to other countries. According to Statistics Canada's recent publication *Juristat*, from 1999-2000 "(6,359 women and dependent children were admitted to 448 shelters for abused women across Canada".

Women cannot participate freely or equally within any community when they are restricted out of fear due to abuses perpetrated in their own homes, or in the workplace, or in public spaces or within institutional systems.

Children who witness their mothers being abused and assaulted in the home learn that violence is a "normal" part of family dynamics. The children will often repeat this pattern in their own relationships. The cycle of abuse increases in ever-widening spirals.

Children who witness abuse are prone to experiencing depression, anxiety, fear and mistrust. This can impede their academic progress. They may be prone to angry, aggressive behaviours that can escalate to vandalism, theft and damaging property.

Domestic abuse is committed primarily by men against women. Women may use violence and abuse but it does not compare to the systematic subjection of violence that women experience from men. In his recent book, "The Beast Within: Why Men are Violent", Simon Fraser University criminologist Dr. Neil Boyd states, "In every country and in every age, men have committed 90 percent of all violent crimes."

Statistical data in Canada and the USA tell us men commit about 90 percent of abuses.

Domestic violence afflicts families regardless of income, social status, age, ethnicity and cultural background. Exacerbating influences include socio-economic stresses such as unemployment and a changing unstable economic base. It may include alcoholism and drug addiction. These influences are not the cause of violence, nor are they an excuse. All of the research in this field during the past 15 years tells us men use violence to get what they want when they want it. It is about control and combination through fear and intimidation. Women are at greatest risk when they attempt to make changes in the relationship, have their own needs met, and/or when they separate or divorce.

The economic impact of domestic violence is staggering. In Canada, the cost is in the billions of dollars annually and growing.

Social and geographic isolation is a primary factor in domestic violence. Geographic isolation is a feature of the Princeton area. Breaking the isolation is a constant challenge and requires the understanding and participation of the whole community. In this respect Princeton excels. In fact, we are leaders in our innovative and creative responses to addressing the issue of violence against women.

Currently, the safe homes program is a model for other communities. It started in 1986 when the Business and Professional Women's Club of Princeton identified the need for crisis intervention services for women. Cindy Parolin emerged as a strong leader who not only assisted in writing the grant application in 1995 that eventually established the first safe homes program, but she was the first coordinator, hired

that same year. Seven months into her job, Parolin had secured four safe homes with trained volunteer operators. In March, 1996, Paroling officially launched what she named as The Princeton Safe Homes Project. When Cindy Parolin lost her life to a cougar attack on August 16, 1996, not only did our community mourn her loss, but through international media outlets that carried her story, it seemed the world shared Princeton's loss and sorrow. In February 1998 the Star of Courage was posthumously awarded to Cindy Parolin.

It was not until March of 1997 that the second coordinator was hired to revive the safe homes program. This second program was named in honour of Cindy Parolin.

Today, the Cindy Parolin Safe Homes Program of Princeton provides women with 24 hour crisis intervention, private safe shelter for up to five days and nights, referrals to community resources, legal information regarding court processes and legal rights, transportation, emotional support, accompaniment, access to information and educational resources, and access to an affiliated network of interactive services that are local, regional and provincial.

In my role as the present coordinator, what I have found is one of the most effective tools in the prevention of violence against women is to coordinate community resources with the judicial system, primarily the RCMP. Protective territorial methods of operation simply contribute to the isolation and eventual failure of interventions. Opening channels of communication between law enforcement agencies, resources and services locally, regionally and provincially helps to solve the challenges faced by rural communities.

The integrated approach to service delivery means that, as a community, we make the statement that we not only abhor this violence, but we are taking a pro-active approach to ending it. When women realize they are not to blame for the violence, and when they realize the entire community is behind resolving the problem, then their sense of blame, guilt, shame and isolation can be overcome.

The more we understand, collectively, about domestic violence and its deep roots into the psychosocial aspects of the belief systems we carry inside, the more we are able to break out of its control. We will be more able to create a safe community based on a healthy model of human relations. When a woman is in danger in her own home and the community tolerates it, then no one is safe, especially the children.

Major contributors will have their names placed on a plaque to be attached to the fountain when it is erected.

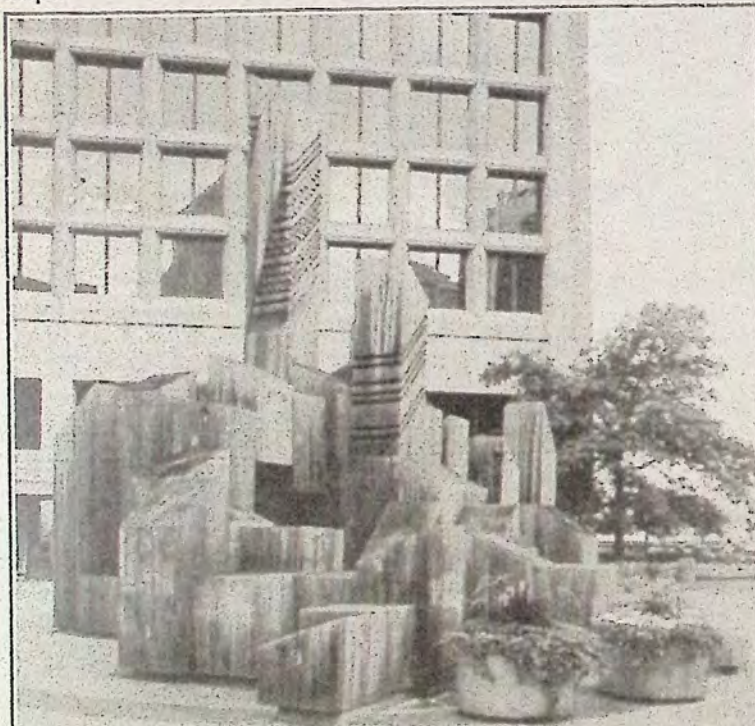

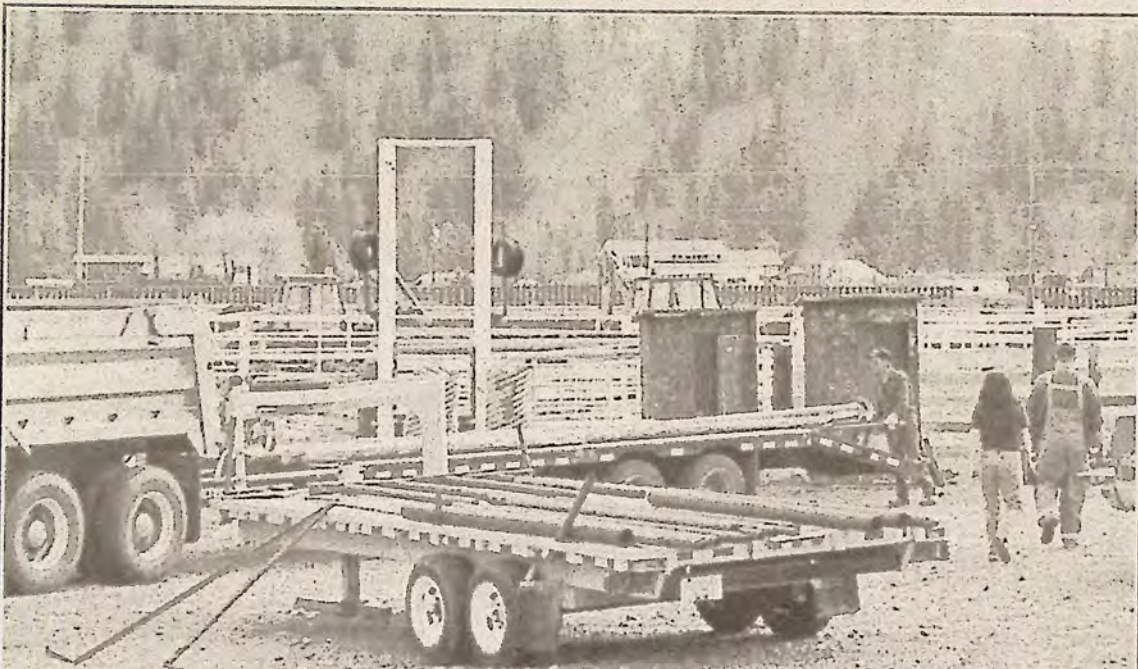

## Chutter promotes mining in B.C.

MLA Dave Chutter was enthusiastic about the prospects for revitalizing the mining industry in B.C. Mining industry representatives met with Ministers and MLAs in Victoria on Mining Day, April 16.

"After a decade where mines closed and exploration fell to unacceptable low levels, the BC Government is committed to revitalizing the mining industry," Chutter said. "In the last 10 years two mines closed for every one that opened. This trend must be reversed if we are to take advan-

tage of an industry that has generated billions of dollars in tax revenue to the government."

Chutter noted mining pays the highest average wage of any industry and generates one billion dollars in tax revenue every year.

"Had this industry received the attention it deserved from the previous government, we would have had billions more in revenues that could have been used for health care and education."

On April 15, the Ministry of

Water, Land and Air Protection made amendments eliminating duplication and streamlining regulations of mine sites. Chutter said the government is committed to reducing red tape and providing greater access to Crown land as well as establishing equality for operating mines in the coal and mineral sectors. Other government initiatives are introduction of 20 percent flow-through share tax credit for new mineral exploration, elimination of the provincial sales tax on production machinery and equipment, reduction of B.C.'s corporate tax rate to 13.5 percent, and reduction of corporate capital tax by 50 percent with a promise to eliminate it by September 1, 2002.

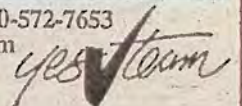
