**Forest personnel stay in town**

Following a meeting with Rod de Boice, Manager of Merritt Forest District, Princeton Town Council members reported good news. Their lobbying with the Minister of Forests paid off in preserving Forest Service jobs in Princeton.

In the series of cutbacks and closures in the Forest Service, Princeton's Forestry Field Office was slated for closure, with the personnel moving to Merritt. As the majority of timber harvested in Merritt Forest District is south of Princeton, and most certainly south of Merritt, Princeton's Town Council raised strong objections. During preceding years, they had seen Princeton's Forest Service personnel whittled away, with increasing numbers of personnel driving from Merritt to do jobs they could have done more efficiently from the Princeton office.

The four Princeton office jobs will remain in Princeton.

**Race times change for chuckwagons**

Following a phone call from the chuckwagon racers, previously published race times have been changed. The group who do the races informed Fall Fair they would be bringing chariots as well as chuckwagons and the times will be changed as follows: Saturday - races are at 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and Sunday - 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

**Town spends half million**

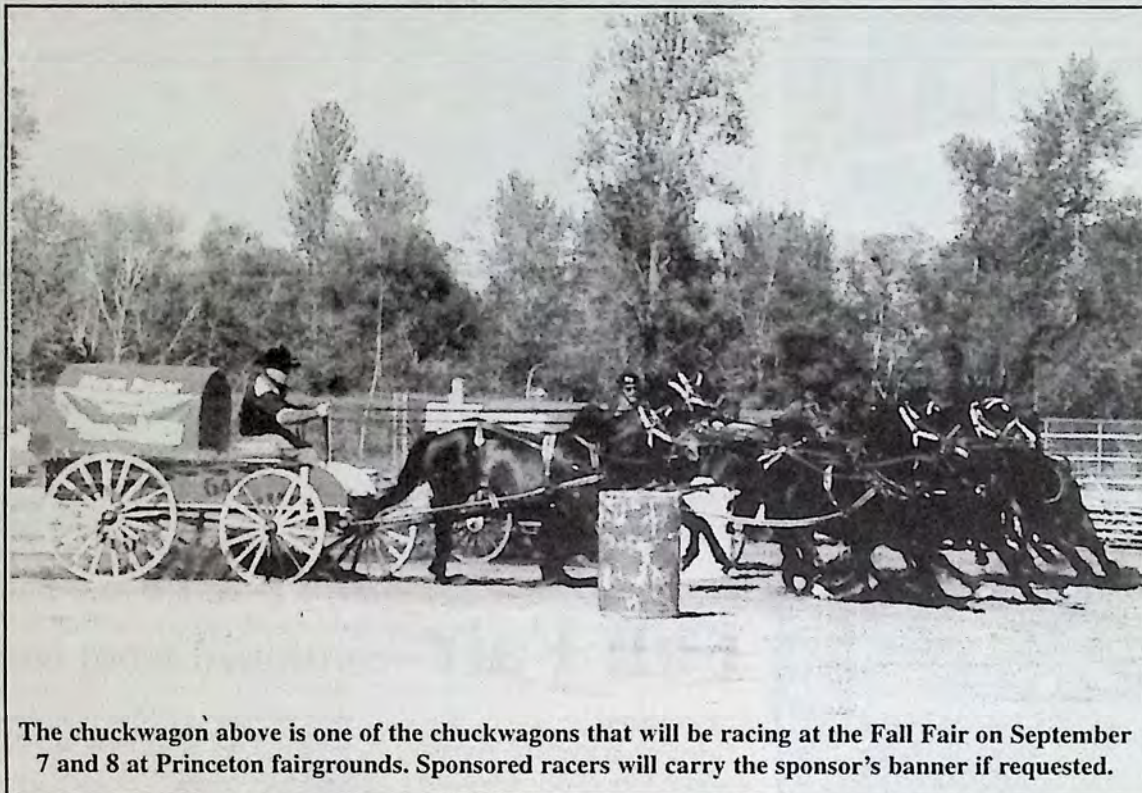
**- Tax transfers go to agencies**

The Town of Princeton spending for the month of July hit the near half million dollars mark due to transferring collected taxes to other agencies, such as the hospital district and Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen.

At the August 19 regular meeting, Town Council approved expenditures of \$482,216.22 for July. When the high figure was questioned, Administrator Cornie Froese explained that a large portion of it was in tax transfers.

Of the property taxes collected by the Town of Princeton, a large percentage does not stay in Princeton. Town Hall is a collection agency for Regional District, hospital area, and school district property taxes as well as taxes for the municipality.

Froese stated the expenditures for August will be high because the next transfer of taxes is to the school district.

**Sponsors claim chuckwagons**

Sponsors for the chuckwagon races are stepping forward and have claimed a chuckwagon. Although there are for more chuckwagons needing sponsors, Tophy Hanna reported to the August 22 Fall Fair meeting the sponsors are coming in. Princeton Light and Power, Reichert Sales and Service, A & W, and one anonymous individual, have bought full sponsorships, and Princeton Pharmasave is purchas-

ing a co-sponsorship. Hanna and Ross Chaston are canvassing for additional sponsorships.

Two sponsors have come forward to help pay the costs of the climbing wall featured at the fair this year. Santo's Pizza and A & W are the sponsors, and one more is needed for the climbing wall.

Climbing wall prices were established after discussion with the company as to going rates.

Climbers can do one climb for \$3.00 or two climbs for \$5.00. A minimum age of 16 was considered, but the company will be consulted again.

A & W have contributed a great deal to the Tuff Truck competitions as well as their other sponsorships. Princeton Hotel is providing the trophies for the Tuff Truck competition and the demolition derby.

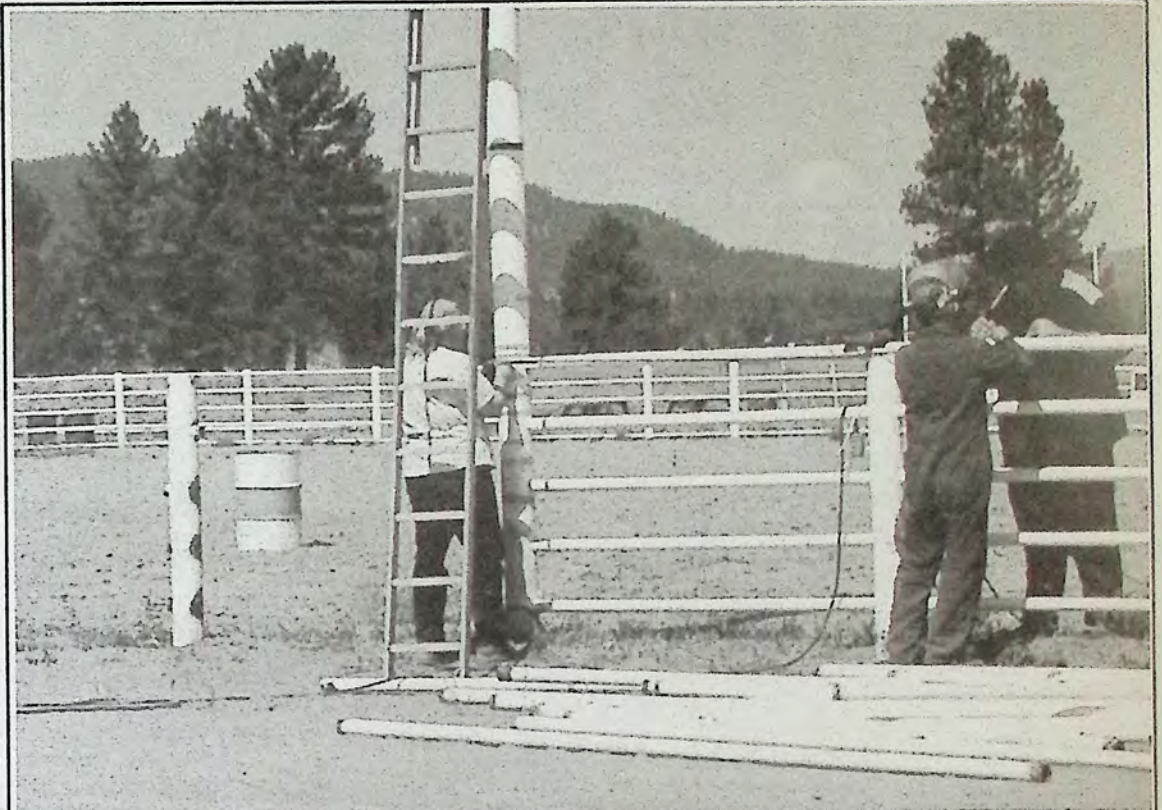

### Logger sports

As logger sports were so popular last year, they have been contracted again and will be done in front of the grandstand this year for the comfort of older folks. Sponsors for this event are needed, as the Karl Bishoff logger sport show costs \$1,800 for the weekend.

### Refreshment garden

Princeton Lions Club have agreed to operate the refreshment garden, and will return 20 percent of the profit to the Fall Fair Association. The Fall Fair Executive accepted the Lions Club offer.

### Sweepstakes change

The chuckwagon sweepstakes was changed to a 50/50 draw. Keith Olsen said he had received some advise on risk reduction, and had opted for the 50/50 draw.

### Security

Security for the fair will be in place from Thursday, September 5, through Sunday, September 8.

Ross Chaston presented the proposal and it was accepted at \$580 for the four days.

### Vendors

Chaston reported he had 23 vendors signed up as of August 22. This is an excellent number, and many are repeats from previous years.

### Water quality

Town Hall was consulted regarding drinking water at the fairgrounds, as some people had expressed concern. There had been a temporary problem, Town staff said, during the switch from Swan Lake water to the new well, but present tests show the water is safe to drink. Pete Ruoss advised part of the problem was "standing" water in the pipes, and Town crew has instructed Princeton Exhibition Association to leave a particular tap running at a low volume. Ruoss pointed to where the tap is located and asked everyone to make sure it is not shut off.

### Junior Fair

Vermilion District Girl Guides have graciously consented to help Virginia Brock with Junior Fair. This section of the fair is unique to Princeton's Fall Fair, and is a lot of work as local youngsters participate enthusiastically. The help is greatly appreciated.

### Inflatable playground

Tophy Hanna reported the fire hall crews had donated \$500 toward the cost of bringing in the inflatable playground, and he urged everyone to attend Sunday's car wash to help raise more funds. The inflatable playground consists of large, air-filled plastic play areas, such as slides, bounce rooms, ball-filled pool, and so on.

### Derby and Tuff Truck

The Fall Fair has contracted a sound system and halogen lights for the derby and Tuff Truck events.

# Carver donates dragon for Memorial Park

Earl Martin recently moved into the Keremeos area, and has given his fellow citizens something to admire and entertain them. His tall carving of a dragon on a castle tower sits at Memorial Park. The dragon hovers over the sidewalk, gazing at the street below.

Martin carved the art from the trunk of an old fir tree that grew in the desert area of the south Cariboo. This is a special wood, and Martin brought out the various colours to advantage. He began with a chainsaw, then used a grinder and Dremel, and a torch to add black highlights. In the photo at right, Martin is covering the carving with linseed oil to protect it and bring out the colours.

This work of art has to be seen from several angles to fully appreciate it. The carving will remain in place until somebody buys it. Martin is asking \$25,000, and expects to get it. He makes his living doing this, and knows the market. In the meantime, he brings it public for the enjoyment of others, and when it is sold, he will donate a percentage of the sale value to a good cause for the community. Martin will demonstrate his techniques at the pepper festival.

Earl Martin is 36 years old, and is a friendly, happy person, approaching life from an artist's perspective, and perhaps seeing things from a different vision of what life is about, but he has a strong feeling for community.

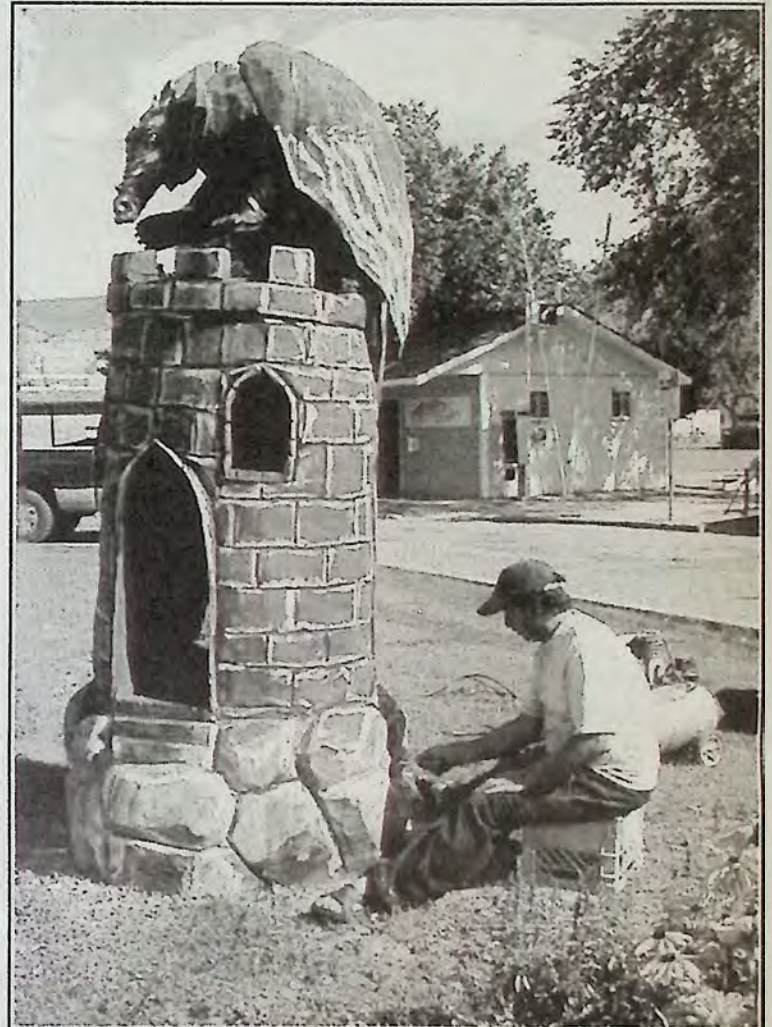

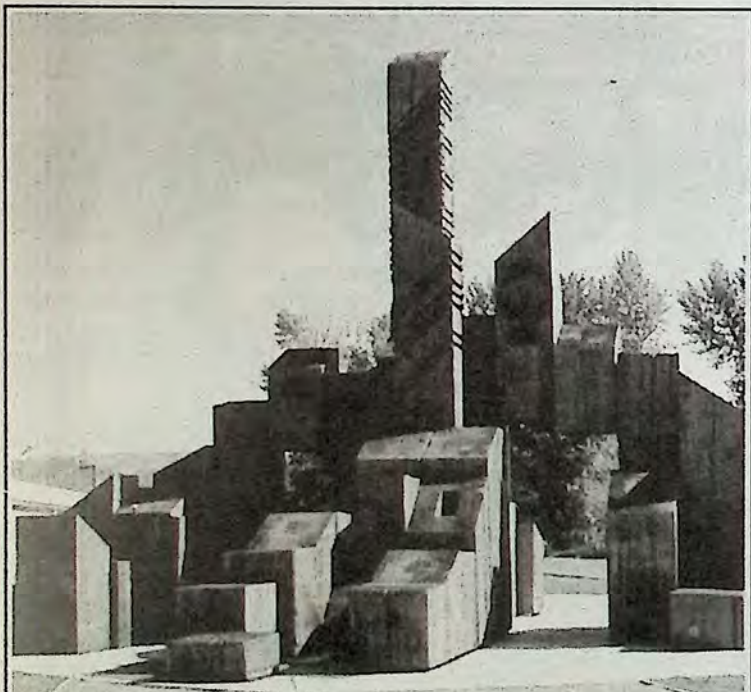
The power unit became separated from the trailer during the crash and the Kenworth came to rest approximately 11.5 metres down the embankment.

# Set boundaries and expectations

Alice S. Honig, author of *Love & Learn*, a book on parenting, once wrote: "Children need a consistent, positive approach to become emotionally mature. Be clear about what behaviours are acceptable and what behaviours are unacceptable."

The more a child has clear, consistent boundaries and high expectations, the more likely he or she will grow up healthy.

While it is normal for teenagers to take more responsibility for themselves as they grow, the problem is that not enough young people have clear boundaries in the first place. Positive peer influence is one boundary that can help youth make good decisions for themselves. While 82 percent of sixth graders report their best friends model responsible behaviour, only 49 percent of Grade 12 students do.

Why are boundaries important? Sometimes a life without limits - eating, sleeping, playing and working wherever we want - sounds appealing. Most of us realize, however, that this type of life would be chaotic. No one would know what to expect, no one would seem to care (except about themselves), and we would probably end up feeling frustrated most of the time.

Boundaries are important to our children because they give clear messages about what is expected. Every day young people face many options and choices. Without boundaries to guide them, they may feel unsure and confused, and make unhealthy decisions. With boundaries, they have the supports that help them choose wisely and grow up healthy.

Young people are more likely to grow up healthy when families, neighbours, schools and friends have clear rules and consequences, and monitor young people's whereabouts. To make setting boundaries easier, we should make them positive. Say what you expect along with what you do not want. Strive for concise standards.

Have each boundary be five words or less. Adjust boundaries as the young person grows and becomes older. Set and follow boundaries yourself. Be a role model. Admit when you fail. Tell your children why you chose the boundaries you have. Be calm when your child acts out in highly emotional ways. Negotiate new boundaries as the child grows older. Respect growing privacy needs while still showing interest in a teenager's activities and friends.

Do notice and comment when a child does something well. Be specific. Do give a child your full attention, be affectionate, and calmly state how your child violated a boundary. Do respond as

quickly as you notice a violation. Do respond consistently. Do be firm about discipline and suggest better behaviour. Do be consistent by setting the same standards for boys as for girls.

Do not only notice a child when he or she violates a standard. Do not use threats. Do not use physical punishment. Do not attack or ridicule a child. Do not manipulate a child with shame, humiliation, or guilt. Do not use labels, such as "You're lazy" or "You're such a slob." Do not notice the violated rule sometimes and not others.

Remember the four C's when setting boundaries and expectations with young people. 1. Clear - everyone should know what to expect. 2. Concise - the shorter the explanation, the better. 3. Creative - kids respond better when boundaries are clever and creative. 4. Consistent - standards are more likely to be honoured when you consistently uphold them.

Do not forget when setting boundaries and talking about expectations with a child that this should be done together. This is your chance to discuss what is appropriate and what is not. Use examples from observations you have made in the community. Remember to adjust boundaries if you need to.

## Back to school tips for parents

The BC Ministry of Education has developed a list of tips for parent to make the transition from summer holidays to school days as smooth as possible for families.

- \* Confirm what time school starts on the first day. If your child is going to a new school, be sure to bring the required information or identification with you on registration days.
- \* Determine a safe route to and from school. Make a travel plan with your child, and discuss traffic safety and how to safely interact with strangers.
- \* Enlist your child's help. Encourage them to help with school-related chores like making lunches and planning after-school activities. Being involved can help children feel more confident about going back to school.
- \* Plan ahead by checking to see if your child's school distributes a calendar. Make a note of when professional development days and holidays are scheduled and when report cards are issued.
- \* Develop a routine. Set a regular schedule, decide when the best time will be for doing homework with your child and plan time for play.
- \* Develop a homework strategy. Set a regular time and location for homework, give lots of praise, and make sure your role as "coach" is understood. Consult with your child's teacher(s) if necessary.
- \* Talk to the teacher to develop a positive parent-teacher relationship. You can get valuable insight into your child's progress through

informal chats with school staff. \* be involved by contacting your local school board or the Parent Advisory Council at your child's school for volunteer opportunities. \* Make school a shared experience. Talk to your child frequently about school, try to understand

their issues and discuss problems openly. \* Be patient and remember it takes everyone time to adjust to a new routine when the freedom of summer is over. Just think - winter break will be here before you know it!

# Are you the Aggressive Personality type?

If you paid a professional counselor to give you advice, one of the first things the counsellor would try to determine is your personality type. A widely accepted way of determining personality is the American DSMIV, a book counselors use to determine which of the 16 personality types influences you most. The are descriptions such as "Conscientious", "Aggressive", "Devoted" and so on.

In coming weeks, the News Leader will describe these for you, and you can decide for yourself which of these categories fits your personality type.

Last week, we described the Conscientious personality type. This week, we will look at the **Aggressive Personality**.

Both Conscientious and Aggressive share the description of "hard-working" but their motivations are quite different. The aggressive type works to stay on top, to lead and have others follow. This type wants power and authority, and is comfortable working in a hierarchy as long as there is going to be room at the top eventually. In this climb to the top, the aggressive person will show responsibility.

Aggressive types are strong, forceful personalities. They want to win, and they will not back away from a fight or a competition.

Discipline and rules of order are the hallmark of aggressive types. They are goal-directed, practical and do what it takes to get the job done. They are good in the military, where they can be brave in dangerous situations, and stick to their objective come hell or high water. This makes them good in emergency services, too.

People engaged in highly competitive physical sports must have a strong aggressive component in their personality styles.

All of this is the plus side of the aggressive personality type. There are some drawbacks that put real strain on this individual and on their relationships with others. The most prominent of these drawbacks is their need to dominate others in order to feel they have personal power. They will fit into a pyramid structured organization very well and eagerly work their way to the top, but they do not do as well in a group which functions as a circle in which the contributions of everyone are essential. They make good team players when they can be captain.

In relationships, they can be the Rock of Gibraltar for anyone depending on them, but they have to be king of the rock. Furthermore, they must feel the people around them are loyal to them. They count on this loyalty to support them, and can be dreadfully disappointed when they discover disloyalty (even if it is in the form of disagreeing with them!).

Relationships are important to aggressive types, and the climb to the top is important. These people will sacrifice a relationship that is

detrimental to the climb, but they will handsomely reward those who are loyal and helpful in advancing that climb. To them, the goal always takes priority.

Aggressive people suffer a lot of stress as they climb to the top, but it is nothing like the stress they suffer if they feel they are losing, or have lost. If they are in a position in which power is denied to them, or they experience defeat, or serious competition, they feel extreme stress. They will try to organize to give a strong power base, they will scheme how to defeat their opponent, and they will fight back, sometimes to extremes. They will not stop fighting until they win or die. This can be a serious drawback under some circumstances. There are times when it makes sense to stop fighting and switch,

or give up on a lost cause. The aggressive type has a real problem seeing there is no disgrace in backing away from a situation in which winning is impossible. They feel that if they give in, they will be humiliated.

Aggressive types are very strong on controlling others and situations. They know how to seize power, manipulate situations to gain and keep power (which means gaining control over everyone else).

Note: aggressive types are not necessarily going to use physical aggression - this depends on character - but they are the most likely to use aggression when they feel nothing else works. Most of the time, they scheme, set up strategies, work, and engage in crafty manipulations to get what they want.

Aggressive types are often admired for their success, especially in sports. Never believe the stress of competition is bad for the aggressive type. On the contrary, they love to compete, to battle, and to win. It is when they see themselves losing that they experience the bad kind of stress, and for them, it is really bad! Aggressive types have excellent self-control, but when they feel they are losing the battle, they are likely to lose their self-control and let anger take over. When this becomes extreme, the person is said to have a disorder which is marked by physical force to control others, threats, humiliating and demeaning others, and lying to hurt others. ## Living past 100

### Man's best friend: the ripe tomato

Although most men do not want to talk about it, prostate disease is a great fear of most men, and is much more common than most people would believe. Prostate cancer is common but men do not talk about it. One of the reasons it is not a big subject for publicity (unlike breast cancer, for example) is because prostate problems impair a man's sexual performance, and no man wants to admit he is no longer able to function sexually. It is a shame there is so little talk about prostate problems, because a lot of it could be avoided.

Tomatoes are one of the foods that protect the prostate gland. Ripe tomatoes have an abundance of red pigment called lycopene. It neutralizes the free radicals that cause cancer, and for some reason, lycopene concentrates in the prostate gland. Harvard University did a study on men who eat tomatoes versus men who did not. Men who eat 10 servings a week of tomatoes (raw, cooked or sauce) and found they cut their risk of developing prostate cancer in half! Maybe you think 10 servings a week is a lot, but one serving equalled half a cup of tomato sauce in the Harvard study, and that is not so much.

At this time of year, tomatoes are plentiful and inexpensive, especially if you buy them in bulk. You can turn them into ketchup, sauce, can them whole, freeze them whole, and eat them raw. You can put them in stir-fry and salads. The most important thing is to eat the skins, where the lycopene is concentrated.

The benefits to men extend beyond protection for the prostate. Lycopene is good for everyone. Researchers have learned lycopene protects from lung cancer, colon and rectal cancer, stomach cancer and the effects of aging. There was one study done a few years ago that indicated eating plenty of tomatoes helped old people stay active and strong. You do not have to be male to benefit from tomatoes.

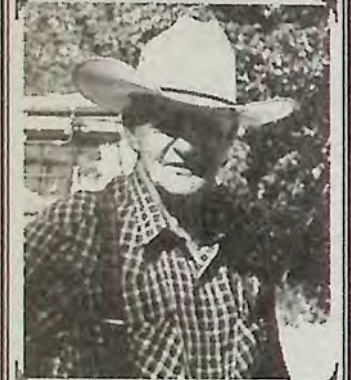

### The real race for leadership starts now

On August 21, Prime Minister Jean Chrétien announced he will retire in February 2004. This gives a clear signal to all of the parties, and political hopefuls, to start their campaigns now.

In the meantime, our Prime Minister will attempt to complete some of the priority issues forming the planks in the platform on which he was elected. Among these issues, he listed child poverty, probably the first Prime Minister to do so.

Jean Chrétien has spent 40 years in politics, most of these on the sidelines and/or in the shadow of Pierre Trudeau. To give him full credit, he was often the unsung author of actions for which Trudeau received credit. Further, during his time as Prime Minister, Chrétien made it clear to Quebec there is a high price to pay for leaving Canada, and Quebec will leave with less land and less power. This clarity of terms was badly needed in the uproar over separatism.

Chrétien's term of office as Prime Minister is marked by both practicality and passion. We never had a moment's doubt that Chrétien was passionately a Canadian, nor that he saw Canada in practical terms. His habit of talking out of one side of his mouth, and his strong French-Canadian accent, did not stop Canadians from liking and appreciating this plain-spoken Prime Minister. If anything, we liked his bluntness – it was reassuring, especially after Mulroney.

Time will prove Chrétien's government was strong and solid. There were mistakes made, of course, but none of the antagonism that grew toward Trudeau and Mulroney has been demonstrated nationally against Chrétien.

We hope the candidates for leadership take a good look at the positive qualities Chrétien brought to the Liberal Party and to Canadian politics and the House of Commons. We like those qualities, and would vote for more.

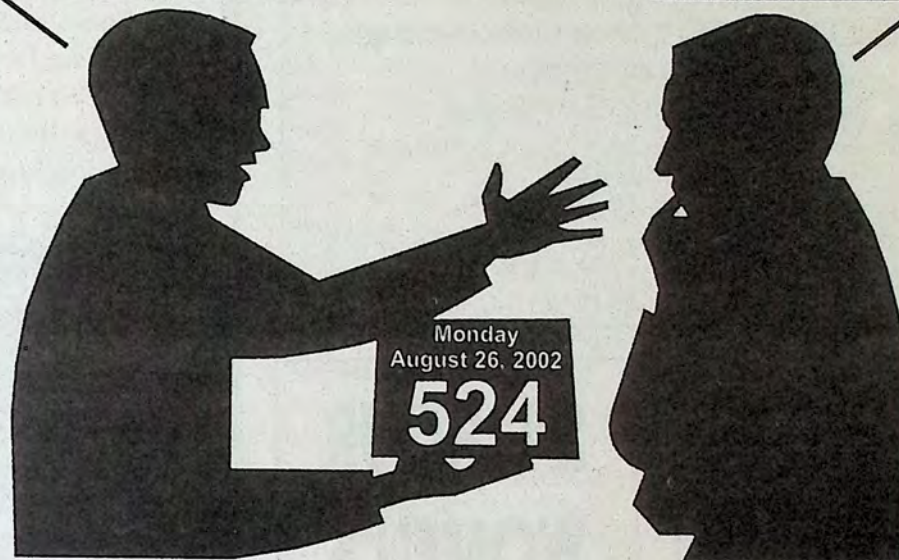

### Ferry tendering goes wrong direction

Dear Editor,

Buying Canadian is no longer government policy – at least not in British Columbia. The BC provincial cabinet directed the BC Ferry Corporation to initiate, for the first time in its 43-year history, a completely open international tendering process for all ferry refits and new vessel procurement. This policy shift appears more driven by ideology than common sense, as BC's main competitors remain protected and supported by their respective governments.

Considerable controversy surrounds this radical change in public procurement policy, and the future of the BC shipyard industry hangs in the balance. If BC shipyards do not receive a significant portion of BC Ferries vessel refit and replacement work over the next five years it is doubtful a single major shipyard will survive – a substantial de-industrialization of the BC economy.

Why would the provincial government choose to forfeit a significant tool of industrial development and throw out its ability to use a major crown corporation to support local well-paying jobs?

The story is replete with ironies.

First, Victoria and Ottawa are moving in opposite policy directions. The decision of the BC government to internationally tender major ferry procurement is based on simplistic bottom line economics – search the world for ferry bargains. This approach fails to recognize the spin-off benefits to the BC economy of local procurement. Assuming \$175 million is spent in BC on ferry refits and a small new vessel over the next five years, benefits include 1,500 person years of employment, a \$78 million increase in household income, a

\$101 million increase in provincial GDP and a \$32 million return to government revenues.

Meanwhile, in the spring of 2001, the federal government announced a completely new, different national policy framework to help revive and grow the Canadian shipbuilding industry, in recognition of the unfair international competition it faces. Under its new policy, the federal government stated, "the Canadian shipbuilding and marine industry is recognized by the government as an important contributor to national and regional economies. In addition, a viable and competitive domestic ship maintenance and repair capability is important to Canadian government operational needs." In short, the federal government has rightly re-committed to a *buy Canadian* procurement policy.

One would think in a province such as BC, with 25 percent of the national shipbuilding workforce, the provincial government would adopt a policy complimentary to that of the federal government. Think again.

But this story is more bizarre still.

The obvious foreign challenge to BC shipyards comes from US shipyards on the Pacific and Gulf Coasts.

The US shipyards have a number of significant advantages. US shipyards have a transportation cost advantage over other international competitors, as they are within close coastal sailing distance from BC waters. Second, under the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), US shipyards are exempt from the 25 percent tariff collected by Canada on imported vessels.

Third, for some time now, US shipyards have been busy with a cranked-up US naval and coast guard defense

procurement program. These military contracts are effectively a subsidy that has helped modernize US shipyards. US shipyards benefit from a host of other government subsidies and low-interest loan programs.

The icing on the cake is the US government protects US shipyards from competition with Canadian and other foreign yards. The *Jones Act* imposes a variety of limits on foreign participation in the US domestic marine industry. Under these laws, carriage of cargo or passengers between points in the US is restricted to US-built vessels operated by US citizens. The US successfully negotiated an exemption for the *Jones Act* under NAFTA.

Thus, at the very time BC has lost thousands of jobs due to US softwood lumber duties, the BC government is preparing to grant US shipyards access to BC Ferry contracts without receiving any reciprocal access for BC shipyards to the US market. Talk about being a sucker for punishment.

Under these circumstances, there will be no fair chance for BC shipyards to bid competitively. A reasonable tendering process would make allowances for the subsidies other governments extend to BC's international competitors. It would recognize the added costs BC shipyards face to comply with domestic laws and regulations regarding employment standards, safety, environmental and health regulations and compulsory contributions to Workers Compensation, Canada Pension and Employment Insurance programs. It would take into account the net benefits to BC.

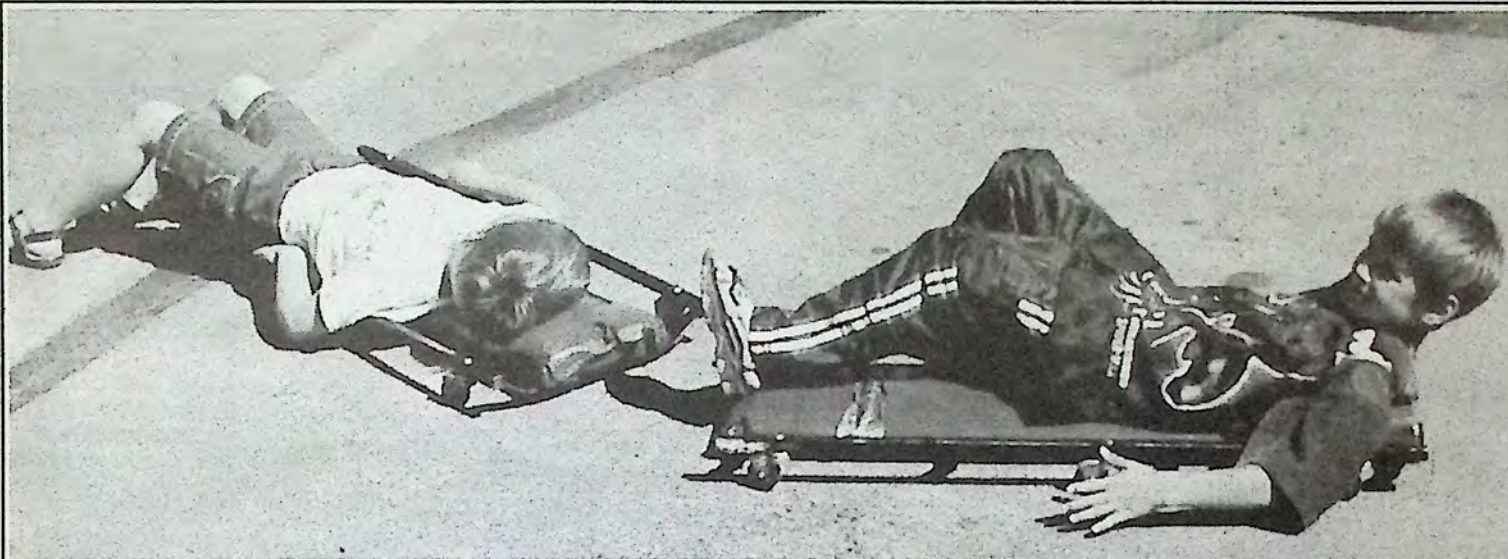
