Stakeholders hear plans

Forest Minister Mike de Jong tells new plans for timber

Forest Minister Mike de Jong met with 80 local people to explain the new forest policy and to answer questions about the impact the policy may have on local business and forest industry. The upper Similkameen and Tulameen areas depend heavily on the forest industry for survival, and the local stakeholders listened attentively to the information the Minister presented. MLA Dave Chutter and Cascades Forest District Manager attended with de Jong.

De Jong told the News Leader he wanted to give a first-hand appreciation for where the opportunities exist, and he wanted stakeholder feedback. Those attending said he listened well to their comments and answered questions in a straightforward manner.

Local people in the forest industry made quite a good impression on the Minister. He was heartened by the attitude of people working in the forest industry.

"They were confident they could compete successfully with anyone anywhere, " the Minister commented.

De Jong wants to provide them with the right tools to make them successful.

Another attitude that impressed Mike de Jong was the attitude of cooperation between forest companies and First Nations in the Princeton area.

At the breakfast, Philipe Batini, Manager of Upper Similkameen Indian Band, welcomed the Minister to "Similkameen territory" and

School District sets budget

The painful process of cutting money from the School District budget is complete. A public information meeting held last Tuesday, and at the regular School Board meeting on Wednesday, trustees approved \$22,096,351 for 2003/04. This is a preliminary budget, not a final budget.

This amount sounds huge, but it represents budget adjustments of more than \$1 million. There were cuts as well as increases, and most of the increases are the result of increasing costs of classroom instruction.

At the same time, the district managed keep to teacher/pupil ration below the provincial average. This is primarily due to the fact that the district had a surplus at the beginning of the cutbacks.

The Bridge will stay where it is for the time being, although enrollment is down. The reason, according to Board Chair Gordon Comeau, is the high cost of renovating the building to make it wheelchair accessible and suitable for classroom space.

Savings were made in staff travel budget, reduction in utilities costs through either refitting or not heating areas to be used as storage space. Every effort was made to maintain classroom quality.

Trustees are counting on some budget stability for the next couple of years.

Despite all of the cuts to the budgets for specific items, the overall budget is higher this year due to increases in the cost of teachers.

From the taxpayer perspective, the cuts to the budget will have no impact. Property tax payments, although supposedly for schools, are calculated by the provincial property assessment authority. The tax rate is set at a level which will render the amount of revenue required by the school district, the munici pality, regional district and the health region, all of which demand a percentage of the total property tax bill.

This information will become public when all of these authorities have set their budgets. Tax notices are sent out in late May or early June. Assessment notices were sent out in January and when the tax rate is set, property owners can do their calculations for a tax estimate.

Board Chair visits valley libraries



Stay young by remembering youth

Researchers discovered many years ago that old people who spend time with young people live longer, healthier lives. Although seniors may have much in common with each other, what they have most in common is old age and its problems.

If you are a senior, you may have had the depressing experience of going to a gathering of seniors and heard nothing but who had surgery, who has cancer, who died, who is afraid of dying next, and so on. This is not likely to make you feel any better about yourself. Although seniors' groups are good support groups and provide companionship, entertainment and a sounding board for social problems, these groups often turn into gripe sessions about the woes of the world and the sorrows of old age.

Spending time with the young provides a new perspective. Being around the young for a whole day may make you weary, but a couple of hours with the young remind you there is much more to life than ailments and funeral costs.

Medical researchers studied the effects on old folks of living as if they were young again. People in their seventies were isolated and saw movies and listened to music of their youth. The researchers found that blood pressure dropped, energy increased, and the old folks seemed to become younger. It is as if our cells remember how it felt to be young and if we stimulate them to remember, like watching movies from our past or listening to the music of our youth, we can feel young again. We can dance to music from our youth, if we are still able to dance, and we can do things we did in our youth, if we are able, and we can become younger physically. It is as if we "heal" old age from a cellular level.

If our cells can remember how to be young, then perhaps all of us should make a point of helping them remember!

Will Bush push it?

The new national policy of the United States, as expressed last week on Larry King Live by Dan Rather from Baghdad, goes like this: "Anyone who has the will and the means to do us harm, we're going after them."

This statement was part of Rather's answer to King's question about whether the United States might move on to Syria.

Canada has neither the will nor the means to harm the United States, even though we do have the power to hurt Americans' feelings by not joining nor approving their war efforts. We do have the right to make up our own minds and express our own views, as do all Americans, but we saw something alarmingly like the Nixon era when Americans protesting the war were fired on by police using rubber bullets. In another one of those unfortunate "friendly fire" incidents, the bullets intended for the protesters struck longshoremen trying to mind their own business on the docks. Apparently, Americans still have free speech but they must speak quietly and not in public places (at least, not in some public places!).

The contradictions in this war are enough to confuse most people. The Americans planned well for victory, but not so well for the aftermath. They could have used Canada's trained peacekeepers to follow them into cities to prevent looting. Food and water could have been dropped from the air. Medicine and hospital needs could have been carried in armoured vehicles. After all, people who have been totally dominated by a dictator are going to do as they please when the dictator is no longer in power, or do nothing.

The U.S. should not consider going into Syria until they clean up their mess in Iraq, and if they do not find weapons of mass destruction, they need to persuade the world they did the right thing before moving on.

As time goes on, historians write and movies are made, we will probably find out what the official story of history is going to be. In the meantime, all we have is television.


