# Stakeholders hear plans

## Forest Minister Mike de Jong tells new plans for timber

Forest Minister Mike de Jong met with 80 local people to explain the new forest policy and to answer questions about the impact the policy may have on local business and forest industry. The upper Similkameen and Tulameen areas depend heavily on the forest industry for survival, and the local stakeholders listened attentively to the information the Minister presented. MLA Dave Chutter and Cascades Forest District Manager attended with de Jong.

De Jong told the News Leader he wanted to give a first-hand appreciation for where the opportunities exist, and he wanted stakeholder feedback. Those attending said he listened well to their comments and answered questions in a straightforward manner.

Local people in the forest industry made quite a good impression on the Minister. He was heartened by the attitude of people working in the forest industry.

"They were confident they could compete successfully with anyone anywhere," the Minister commented.

De Jong wants to provide them with the right tools to make them successful.

Another attitude that impressed Mike de Jong was the attitude of cooperation between forest companies and First Nations in the Princeton area.

At the breakfast, Philippe Batini, Manager of Upper Similkameen Indian Band, welcomed the Minister to "Similkameen territory" and

spoke for a few minutes about the Band's interest in forestry and about the partnerships in which the Band is involved.

De Jong told the News Leader he likes the relationship between Upper Similkameen Indian Band, the Town of Princeton and the other stakeholders.

The government offers a whole range of opportunities for those ready to put people to work, and he sees those possibilities in the Princeton area.

Dave Chutter said the breakfast meeting was "a really informative session, very valuable".

"It is always good when the Minister comes to a small rural community, listens, and gives answers," Chutter said.

# School District sets budget

The painful process of cutting money from the School District budget is complete. A public information meeting held last Tuesday, and at the regular School Board meeting on Wednesday, trustees approved \$22,096,351 for 2003/04. This is a preliminary budget, not a final budget.

This amount sounds huge, but it represents budget adjustments of more than \$1 million. There were cuts as well as increases, and most of the increases are the result of increasing costs of class-

room instruction.

At the same time, the district managed to keep the teacher/pupil ration below the provincial average. This is primarily due to the fact that the district had a surplus at the beginning of the cutbacks.

The Bridge will stay where it is for the time being, although enrollment is down. The reason, according to Board Chair Gordon Comeau, is the high cost of renovating the building to make it wheelchair accessible and suitable for classroom space.

## What is a Family Fair?

White elephants, raffles, home baking, books, records, jewelry, refreshments, plants, games – a Family Fair is something for everyone on a springtime afternoon.

Princeton's Family Fair is a 52-year-old tradition. Originally begun by a Parent Teachers Association to raise money for playground equipment, it has evolved into a means of raising money for bursaries for local students graduating from Princeton Secondary School.

Children are major customers. Prices are kept low enough for children to spend small amounts and collect a lot of loot.

Adults of all ages donate to the Family Fair, and work with the organizers to set it up and work in the stalls.

A child may enter a "cake walk" and win a cake, but it is the adults who bake the cakes.

This year's Family Fair is on Thursday afternoon, April 24 at 1:00 P.M. at Princeton Secondary School. If you wish to donate an item (no clothing) and need somebody to pick it up, or you can volunteer some help, call Dayna at 295-7753 or Shelley at 295-6605. Donations should be at Princeton Secondary School by Wednesday, April 23.

Savings were made in staff travel budget, reduction in utilities costs through either refitting or not heating areas to be used as storage space. Every effort was made to maintain classroom quality.

Trustees are counting on some budget stability for the next couple of years.

Despite all of the cuts to the budgets for specific items, the overall budget is higher this year due to increases in the cost of teachers.

From the taxpayer perspective, the cuts to the budget will have no impact. Property tax payments, although supposedly for schools, are calculated by the provincial property assessment authority. The tax rate is set at a level which will render the amount of revenue required by the school district, the municipality, regional district and the health region, all of which demand a percentage of the total property tax bill.

This information will become public when all of these authorities have set their budgets. Tax notices are sent out in late May or early June. Assessment notices were sent out in January and when the tax rate is set, property owners can do their calculations for a tax estimate.

## School Board applauds report

Two students from Tulameen Elementary School, Morgan Reichert and Courtney Hassell, reported to trustees at the April 16 School Board meeting. Tulameen Elementary and Hedley Elementary students went to the Vancouver Aquarium and spent the night beside the beluga whale pool.

The students talked about all of the sea creatures they saw, and the ecosystems they explored. They provided some interesting details about some of the creatures.

The presentation was so well done the trustees and gallery applauded.



Researchers discovered many years ago that old people who spend time with young people live longer, healthier lives. Although seniors may have much in common with each other, what they have most in common is old age and its problems.

If you are a senior, you may have had the depressing experience of going to a gathering of seniors and heard nothing but who had surgery, who has cancer, who died, who is afraid of dying next, and so on. This is not likely to make you feel any better about yourself. Although seniors' groups are good support groups and provide companionship, entertainment and a sounding board for social problems, these groups often turn into gripe sessions about the woes of the world and the sorrows of old age.

they were young again. People in their seventies were isolated and saw movies and listened to music of their youth. The researchers found that blood pressure dropped, energy increased, and the old folks seemed to become younger. It is as if our cells remember how it felt to be young and if we stimulate them to remember, like watching movies from our past or listening to the music of our youth, we can feel young again. We can dance to music from our youth, if we are still able to dance, and we can do things we did in our youth, if we are able, and we can become younger physically. It is as if we "heal" old age from a cellular level.

Spending time with the young provides a new perspective. Being around the young for a whole day may make you weary, but a couple of hours with the young remind you there is much more to life than ailments and funeral costs.

If our cells can remember how to be young, then perhaps all of us should make a point of helping them remember!







### Will Bush push it?

The new national policy of the United States, as expressed last week on Larry King Live by Dan Rather from Baghdad, goes like this: "Anyone who has the will and the means to do us harm, we're going after them."

This statement was part of Rather's answer to King's question about whether the United States might move on to Syria.

The U.S. should not consider going into Syria until they clean up their mess in Iraq, and if they do not find weapons of mass destruction, they need to persuade the world they did the right thing before moving on.

As time goes on, historians write and movies are made, we will probably find out what the official story of history is going to be. In the meantime, all we have is television.





# Wild Women promote Hedley Days



Polly the Prospector, Hedley Hattie and Madame Tooloose are going to be in Hedley on May 4 to celebrate Stamp Mill Days – 99 years ago, the first stamp dropped to crush the ore from which millions of dollars in gold was extracted during the lifetime of the Hedley gold mines. See story.

The Wild Women of the West (Sue Alton, Peggy Terry and Margaret Skaar) welcome you to the revival of the traditional Stamp Mill Days on Sunday, May 4, as a "premier" of an annual event. This year marks 99 years since the dropping of the first stamp used to crush the gold-bearing ore mined in Hedley. From that day in 1904 to 1984, Stamp Mill Days was a special community day when Hedley townsfolk celebrated their heritage of gold.

Events on May 4 start when the firehall siren sounds the alert to come out and have fun. The first event is the Miner's breakfast at the OAP Hall with Brooker's K-Mountain Band playing old-time music.

After breakfast, you can see a parade of vintage cars, old tractors, horses, floats and so on. Artisans throughout the town will be showing their craftsmanship, and some people will be wearing period costumes. If you have antique items, there will be an antique appraiser available.

There will be a scavenger hunt, gold panning, weaving, blacksmith, and wood carving demonstrations at Hedley Museum, followed by a baron of beef lunch (refreshment garden), and wine tasting.

Grace Church will put on a play, and Hedley Heritage Museum will display hundreds of photos of the glory days of Hedley gold production

There will be contests and prizes all day.

Gold House Bed and Breakfast and Upper Similkameen Indian Band native archaeology office are hosting Open House for the day.

There will be pony rides for the children.


