New face seeks top job

Former MLA Steve Orcherton announced September 1 he will seek leadership of the BC New Democratic Party.

A New Democrat for two decades, Orcherton said he entered the race because he opposes those who would take the party to what he calls the "Mushy Middle".

"We've seen people preaching moderation and mushy middle-of-the road politics within the NDP for too long, and now more than ever. That's a wrong-headed approach," Orcherton stated.

Orcherton said he is clearly focused on meeting the needs of ordinary working people in British Columbia and on helping all British Columbians realize their hopes and dreams. He is opposed to and will fight the Liberals' plans to privatize public services such as health care, hydro and rail.

Orcherton says the fight must take place within the NDP itself.

"I'm standing up to say the NDP needs to go back to its roots and must provide a home to those who believe enough is enough," Orcherton said.

## PXA argues over planning

Princeton Exhibition Association met on September 9 to discuss ongoing business. The first issue arose out of the report from the barn user group. This group was to have formed a committee consisting of users, two Directors and one member of the Association's Executive.

A Barn Committee was designated. The members are Cathy Pusell, George Elliott, Jeanette Miller, Doug Grigg and Jody Woodford.

Cathy Pusell reported the barn users had two meetings and read some recommendations they agreed on. These recommendations included an "honesty" box for donations from casual users, and a guest book in which casual users were to write the number of their Horse Council membership to prove they are insured.

These recommendations are to be worked on and presented for acceptance at the October 14 meeting, and a baseline policy established by December.

Elliott gave the Rodeo Club report, advising the Rodeo Club had made a profit on their catering of a dinner for the ATV Jamboree, but may make changes regarding the refreshment garden next year. A sponsor appreciation night is planned for October in conjunction with the West of the Rockies rodeo clubs' fall meeting.

Projects for the new contingent of Katimavik participants were suggested and members agreed on replacement of sidewalks in

front of buildings and construction of new picnic tables.

Removal of old outhouses was recommended, with the joking comment from one member that perhaps they should be left as "heritage" buildings.

Strong controversy broke out at the motion by two members to remove the trees behind the concession area. The argument made by the two was that the trees are a safety issue due to blowing pine needles and cones, and the roots are in the septic field. In addition, these trees are a nuisance, especially when the Fall Fair is trying to plan a layout for vendors and exhibitors.

The vote on the motion was in favour but the motion was tabled due to the strong objections of some members. These members felt the trees provide shade for people using the grounds.

The matter will be given further consideration and will be brought to the next meeting.

John Bey described a potential location for a shower building. He proposed putting it near the

## Budget stays on track

The provincial government budget remains on track toward a balance for this fiscal year and a modest surplus in 2004/05. Despite recent significant economic pressures, which were not anticipated, Finance Minister Gary Collins stated confidence in maintaining the budget as planned.

Collins said, "Global realities like a further slowing of the North American economy, the rapid rise of the Canadian dollar, and the economic impact of SARS and BSE (mad cow disease) have presented real challenges since the budget was tabled in February. Governments on both sides of the border have seen their financial pictures negatively impacted as a result."

B.C.'s worst forest fire season has further affected the province's economic outlook. Current estimates suggest total fire-related costs may go as high as \$545 million, although the final amount will not be known for some time.

Ministries continue to manage individual budget pressures and, with the exception of fire costs, are expected to come in on budget.

# New pastor dives into action

Pastor Mike Stoltz and his wife, Peggy, moved to Princeton in July from Maple Ridge. They love Princeton, and The Country Chapel. The couple has three children from former marriages.

Born in Calgary, Mike Stoltz moved to Montreal as a baby, then to Prince George as a youth. He calls Prince George his hometown. He was a sawmill worker long before he became a pastor.

Pastor Stoltz had a passion for music and played guitar, so it was devastating for him to become so ill with rheumatoid arthritis that he could no longer play. He mentioned this to a friend, who invited him to a prayer meeting. At that meeting, Pastor Stoltz experienced a miracle. The group prayed for him and he felt his sore joints become hot, and suddenly he was healed. He checked with his doctor, who agreed Mike Stoltz' rheumatoid arthritis had gone into total remission. That was 20 years ago, and it is still in "remission".

The healing marked his conver-

sion to Christianity. Years later, he moved to Maple Ridge, still a sawmill worker, and he began to study at home through courses available from a Bible college. He achieved his Bachelor of Arts in Theology. During these years, he met and married Peggy.

Pastor Stoltz took his skills into street ministry in Vancouver, and to Oakalla prison, where he gave the final service before the prison closed forever.

Mike Stoltz is an ordinary guy with extraordinary faith. He believes the Christian faith is about relationships and not

about "religion". He believes in helping people by giving them the kind of help they need first, whether it is merely a meal or a friend.

In Princeton, he wants to establish a "can do" mentality in the community to counteract the negativity of all those people who say things cannot be done in Princeton.

Pastor Stoltz has settled into his new ministry, and cannot believe how busy he has become. It is a good thing he has the energy of his convictions, because Princeton has embraced him wholeheartedly.

old jockey shack. Some members suggested destroying the shack, but others felt this was not a good idea as it may be used again some day. Members agreed the location is good and will be more accessible for the barn user group as well as for other user groups.

Members discussed a proposal by the Lions Club to build a structure 30 feet wide by 90 feet long for storage and repairs of items donated for auction. There is a motion on the books from two years ago to allow the Lions Club to construct a building on the PXA grounds.

John Bey suggested constructing it in the area behind the Fall Fair exhibits buildings, leaving a laneway behind those buildings. Everyone felt this was an acceptable location. However, nobody from the horseshoe pitch group was at the meeting, and that location may involve moving the horseshoe pits. The matter must be referred to Town Council, as the grounds are Town property.

The annual general meeting is set for November 18, and the policy issues brought up last month on recommendations from Town Council will be addressed at that meeting.

**Low water levels endanger Kokanee and salmon spawning**

The South Okanagan and Similkameen streams and rivers are experiencing low flows. Okanagan Nation Alliance states, in this week's Watershed News, "Historically low water flows in key B.C. watersheds are poised to destroy critical salmon recovery plans."

The Oceola Fish and Game Club is actually considering buying water to pump into Middle Vernon Creek to maintain flows for spawning and incubation of Kokanee as spawning time draws nearer.

An independent report by the Pacific Fisheries Resource Conservation Council concludes that "unprecedented water demand for industrial, agricultural and domestic purposes in B.C. watersheds has led to historically low water flows and, as a result, intense stress on salmon and their ability to reproduce."

More rain in the near future would help, of course, but rainfall levels in September are traditionally low to nil. The drought this year has contributed to the situation, but low water levels through-

out the area are not new. During the past three years, the upper Similkameen Valley has seen below normal levels of snow, and the resulting low water flows in late summer and autumn. While areas such as the Okanagan may blame high demand for agricultural and domestic use, neither the population levels or the agricultural activity in the Similkameen watershed justify pointing a finger at every valley. Water use in the Similkameen has not increased - the snowpack has decreased.

At the same time, the Similkameen River is a key component of salmon spawning as the Similkameen is counted on to keep the Okanagan River water higher and colder.

Another aspect of this troubling situation is the finger pointed at the lack of federal and provincial legislation and regulation of water demand levels. Global warming may play a part in the problem, but lack of conservation and over-allocation of water permits have been identified in the report as the major cause of low water flows.

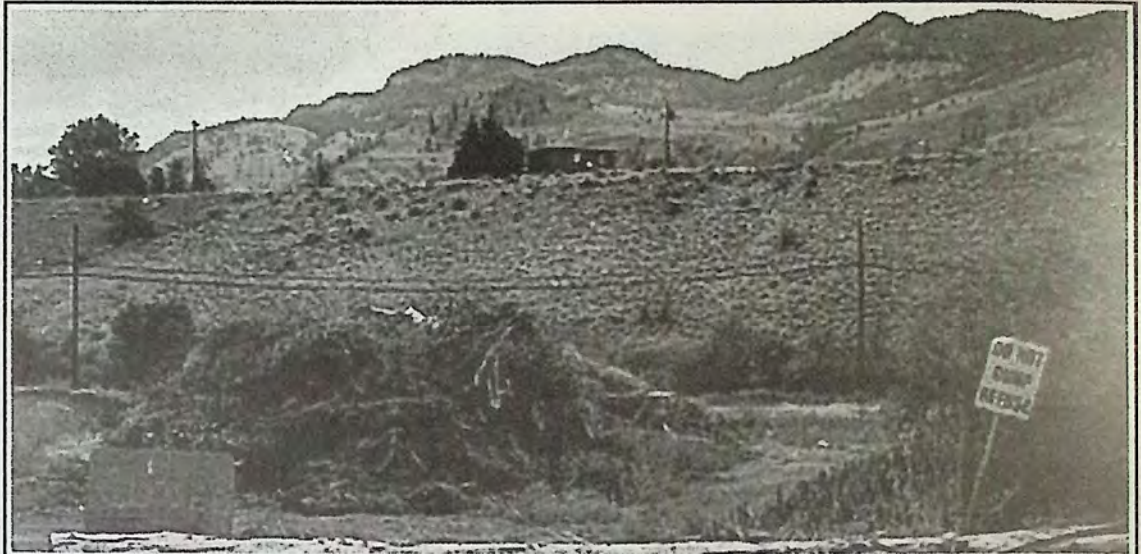

**Council grants one last chance**

Keremeos residents will once again be able to dump their lawn and garden waste at the Village burn pile.

A motion made at the September 2nd meeting of Village Council by Councillor Terry Zeller, and seconded by Councillor Steve Hecoeks, allowed for the site to re-open.

The burn pile, located near the sewage treatment plant, was first opened a few years ago.

The intent of the site was to

provide Keremeos residents with a place to dump their grass clippings and garden prunings only.

It was closed in June following the appearance of refuse that should have been taken to the landfill site.

This re-opening is only on a temporary basis, and if the site is abused again, it will be closed permanently.

Village CAO Bob LaFleur says the burn pile program has proven to be very beneficial to the com-

munity.

It has kept all lawn and garden waste from being tossed over hillsides, and the recycling some of it has kept parts of Keremeos green.

Grass clippings collected from the pile are composted, then mixed with sand, dirt, wood chips and sewage sludge to create a material that is then spread on parkland in the area.

The tree prunings are burned on a regular basis.

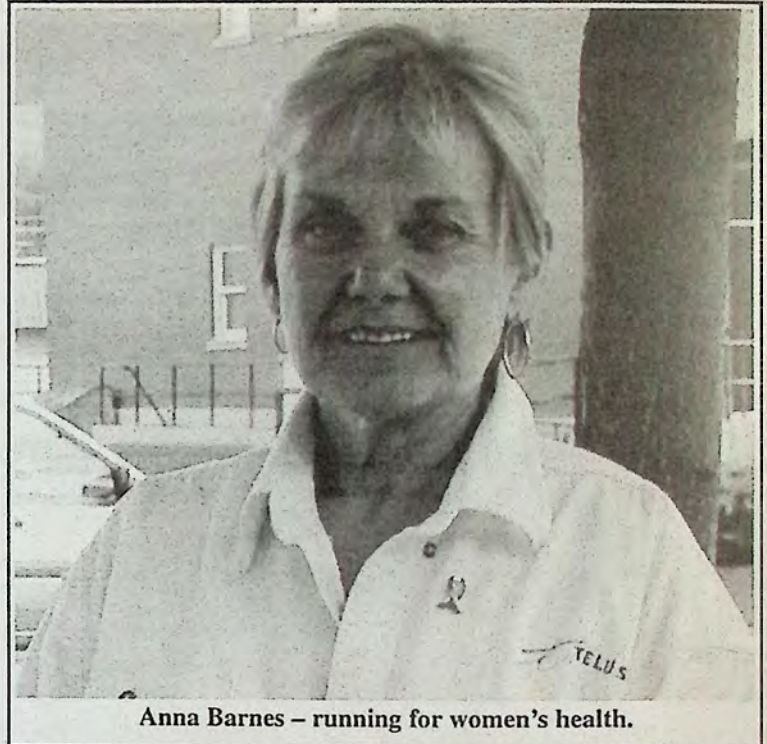

### Pears - good for brains, bones and fighting bad fat

Cholesterol - we hear about it all the time and we hear how bad it is for us. With that in mind, stock up on pears. Pears have a special kind of fibre that sweeps cholesterol out of your digestive tract.

Most people do not know all of the good things you can make when you preserve pears. Most people will think of canned pears for dessert, but think about pear sauce and pear butter, just as you would make apple sauce or apple butter. Pears help build bones. They contain boron, a mineral important for the absorption of calcium into the bones. Boron serves another purpose - it increases brain power. People deficient in boron think slowly, have slower than normal reflexes and are not as mentally alert as normal. Eating pears helps you think better.

Pears are best fresh, and best when you eat the skin. If you are making pear sauce or pear butter, cook with the skin on to save the valuable fibre.

Did you ever eat pork or turkey with pear sauce? It's great! And for a real fibre boost, try putting chopped pear into your bran muffins or mix it with your oatmeal.

Now is the time to stock up on pears, as the season is at its peak.

- Parents are now part of newly-created school planning councils that ensure students' needs are identified and clear goals are set for improvement.
- Parents' rights to volunteer at their children's school are now guaranteed in legislation.
- New satisfaction surveys allow parents to provide input and feedback regarding the school system.

## Providing More Choices

- Starting in September, new open school boundaries will provide students and parents the freedom to choose any school in the province, provided space is available.
- The new graduation program will allow more courses to count toward graduation—including more innovative, locally-developed courses.

## Improving Student Achievement

- For the first time ever, class size limits for Kindergarten to Grade 3, and district-wide class size averages for Grades 4 through 12, have been enshrined in legislation.
- New graduation requirements will help to increase student achievement and prepare students for life after high school.
- The new teacher supervision program is training principals to support teachers better.

## Increasing Accountability

- Education is now an essential service while teachers continue to have the right to engage in free collective bargaining.
- New legislation will allow parents to file written complaints about a teacher's conduct directly with the college of teachers, and the college will report annually on teacher competence.
- New accountability agreements and district reviews are helping districts to develop plans to improve student achievement.

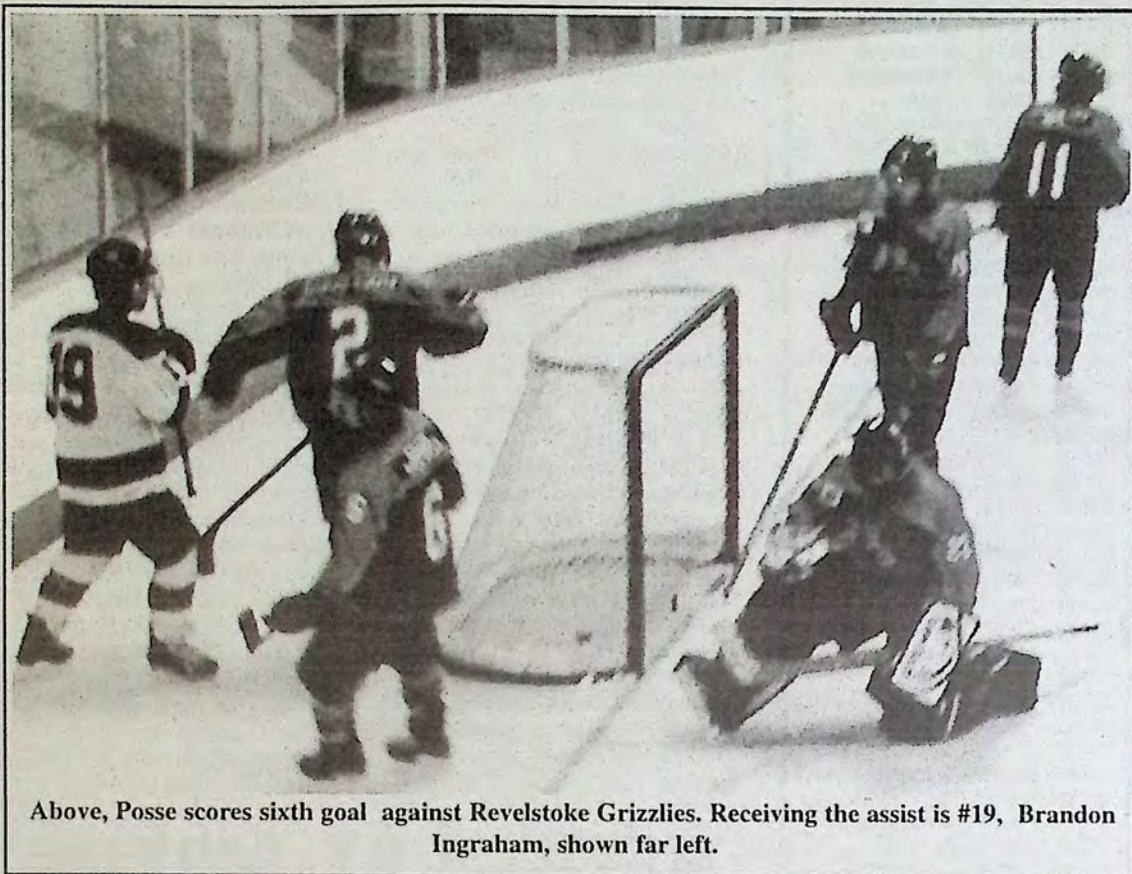

### Trees are not the issue – we like trees

After our editorials and articles about cutting down trees, it seems we have a reputation now of disliking trees. Actually, we like trees, even close to home, but not too close. The issue is not trees – the issue is safety.

On the Saturday of Fall Fair weekend,, people were concerned about the amount of fly ash coming from a big forest fire approximately thirty kilometres south of Princeton. Can you imagine the amount of fly ash coming from a fire one or two kilometres from your home? How many burning embers would land on your home if the fire came even closer?

Now, come out of the forest and back to individual trees, especially pine trees in your yard. Look at the trees from a new perspective. If you look at these trees from the perspective of keeping your home safe, what do you think of those big trees only three metres from a house? What do you think of those trees actually overhanging the roof?

Aside from what the roots of those trees may be doing to the foundation, water and sewer lines, or even gas lines, think about hot ash landing on the tree on a hot afternoon when you can smell the pine resin in the air. How much ash will fall before the tree catches fire?

We asked a retired forestry employee, who has seen a lot of forest fires, what chance some areas of Princeton would have if a forest fire swept down along Tulameen River. Could the local fire department stop the fire? His answer was "no". Some homes further away from the forest might be saved, if they had plenty of green space around them.

Remember the houses in Kelowna's fire that did not burn despite the burning forest around them? They had green space all around the houses, and no trees near the houses.

People want to have beautiful trees to provide shade in hot weather. We can appreciate that desire. At the same time, if we consider the risks, would buying an awning make more sense? Think about it.

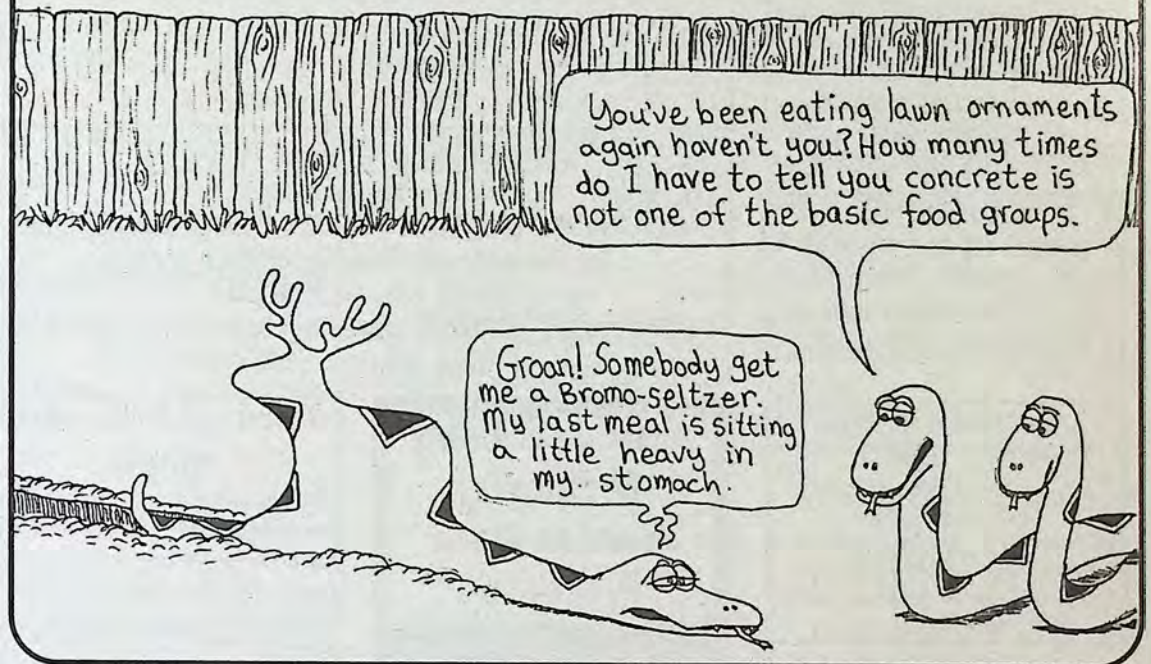

rural living in general.

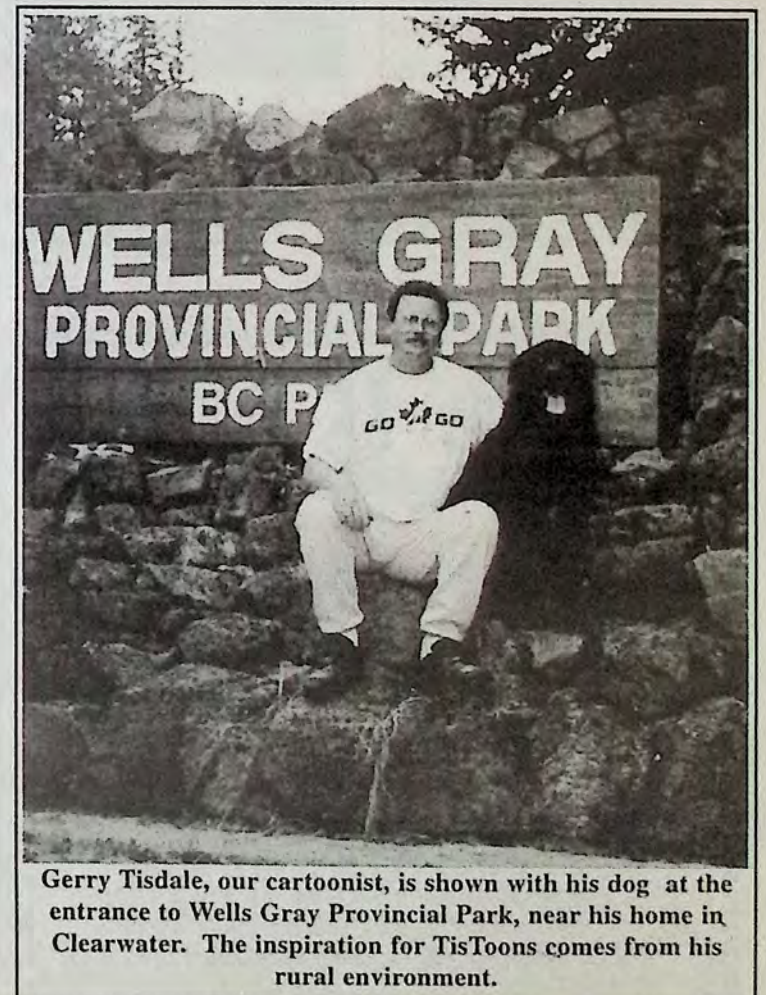
"I like to use the animals and give them a human perspective on life," Gerry says.

# Council needs to know its bylaws

I had a visitor who knows more about Town of Princeton bylaws than Council does. This gentleman pointed to my story on Council having no plans for protecting us from a forest fire, and then waved Town of Princeton By-law #523 at me.

publishing what Councillor Lorne Esselink said, gave people the impression there was nothing that could be done about fire hazards on property. Our friend knew different, because in his neighbourhood, such properties had been cleaned up.

By-law #523 is called "Princeton Property Maintenance By-law". What it states is that no person shall cause or permit water, rubbish, or noxious, offensive or unwholesome matter to collect or accumulate around their premises.

"Every owner and occupier of real property, or his agent, shall remove from the property any accumulation of filth, discarded materials or rubbish of any kind," the bylaw states.

In fact, the owner is expected to clear property of weeds, brush, trees, wild grass or any other "untended" growths.

There is a penalty for not doing so, and this penalty includes a clause be which the Town of Princeton may clean it up and charge the owner. If the owner does not pay, the amount can be added to the annual municipal portion of property taxes.

Therefore, those people who

have dumped rubbish, including leaves and cut grass, over the embankment, could be required to remove it or have it removed by the Town and charged to the owner's taxes.

Within the bylaw there is no clause to identify trees considered to be a safety risk or fire risk. One can only hope common sense of the owner would prevail, but this is often not the case. For example, if you look at Town Hall, Three trees are right against the building in a position to damage the foundation, sewer lines, water lines and even the roof and eaves. In another location on Town property, an aging Ponderosa pine stands near the museum/library building, waiting for the day it falls onto the Pollard Wing of the museum or the Pentecostal Tabernacle.

People are silly about trees. Anyone would think they are scarce and can never be replaced! Around my place, my big problem is keeping them pruned and stopping them from springing up in unwanted places, like the middle of my lawn or against my greenhouse. I have an apple tree I would like to give away. Anybody need a tree?

**Types of Mutual Funds - Part 2**

In the last "Investment Insights" article, "Types of Mutual Funds Part 1," we described six types of mutual funds - Money Market, Fixed Income, Equity, Dividend, Balanced and Index Funds. The remaining two types are 100% RRSP Eligible Foreign and Labour Sponsored Investment Funds.

100% RRSP-Eligible Foreign Funds are also referred to as "clone" funds, and use derivatives to mirror the performance of an underlying foreign fund. Through the use of forward contracts, they remain 100% Canadian content within an RRSP.

Labour-Sponsored Investment Funds (LSIFs) typically invest in small, private firms that are not yet listed on the public markets. They also offer other benefits, such as tax credits, and the opportunity to increase foreign content holdings within a self-directed RRSP, but are considered to be relatively high-risk investments and are subject to minimum holding periods.

## Museum Society hears proposal for archive sharing

Professional Archivist Brian Wilson was guest speaker at the regular meeting of Princeton Museum and Archives Society on September 10. Diane Huey introduced him, explaining he had a proposal to make.

Wilson described himself as a contractor who works with museum archives. He is currently working with Penticton's museum.

He has 50,000 photographs on file pertaining to the South Okanagan and Similkameen. He asked for help to access Princeton's archives for a project he is doing with a committee assembling a history of the old Fairview townsite and the mines.

Wilson said he has received a request for help from a group in South Dakota looking for information and photos on the VV&E (Great Northern) railroad. The group is compiling a history of James Hill, the man who built the railroad (along with other rail lines).

After describing these projects, Wilson asked museum members to share their archives. He would give Princeton Museum full credit

and to the owners of the photos. He described how he takes a photograph of the old photos and keeps detailed records of everything pertaining to each photo.

Museum Society members did not make a decision on Wilson's request or offer to help with Princeton's archives. Eric Jacobson said there would have to be a policy on the matter. Wilson offered to send the Museum Society policies from other museums to assist in developing a local policy.

### Second history book is in works

Diane Huey assured Princeton Museum Society members she is still working on Book 2 of the family history of the upper Similkameen Valley. This book will not be printed until the committee has the money to pay for it. She is looking at publishers who will do it for half the price charged by the publishers of the first family history book.

Huey says she anticipates the new book will be published in 2005.

## Floralee Stewart sends more news from China

Floralee Stewart is working in China, and sends us impressions of her experience. She assures the News Leader she is enjoying her work and the people she meets. She works as a teacher of English employed by an oil company in Dongying, which is south of Beijing and inland, west of the Pacific Ocean.

There are three men to every woman, Floralee tells us. The women tend to stay out of the social life, like going to pubs or dancing.

She travelled to Macau where she noted the Portuguese architecture which makes Macau so different from Dongying where Floralee lives.

On a tour of the oil company hospital, Floralee discovered it functions with the same type of laboratory equipment used in Princeton General, where she worked as a lab technician. However, the Dongying hospital has been doing kidney, heart and lung transplants.

Employers in Dongying must provide housing for their employees, so people live near where they work. The hospital employees live on the hospital grounds. Nearly everyone lives in an apartment. Floralee has seen no private homes in the area where she lives.

The regular school year has begun, and Floralee taught ten classes of 15 year olds. One day no students showed up because of the heavy rain that left six centimeters of water on the school grounds.

In her leisure time, Floralee walks around town, reads, surfs the net, and listens to CBC radio. She is 15 hours ahead of us, so she hears our evening news in the morning. She heard all about the fire in Kelowna.

The area where she lives is very flat, and is not agricultural due to salinity of the soil. She lives in a large city, and one night went to a TV tower and saw the lights of the city spread out below and around her, just as we can do on the prairies.

At this point, Floralee is not expressing any homesickness for Princeton.
