## Prepare for nasty flu

Canadians are being warned about a nasty strain of flu called A Fujian. It is spreading rapidly and is in B.C., the prairies and Ontario, and is widespread in Texas and Colorado. It is highly contagious.

It is important to be cautious with children and people over age 65, according to Health Canada. This A Fujian strain has killed children in Great Britain and Colorado.

Those who received a flu shot this year should be protected to some extent against this strain of flu. Protection will not prevent an ill-

ness but the illness will not be as severe.

Symptoms of the flu begin with a headache, chills and cough, and are rapidly followed by fever, loss of appetite, muscle aches and fatigue, sneezing, and throat irritation. In children, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea may occur.

Interior Health Region has reports of this A type flu among some residents. If you are sick, stay home. Restrict visits to health care facilities and residential care homes for the elderly.

## RCMP arrest Penticton man on car theft charges

On November 23, an off-duty member of Princeton RCMP noticed a suspicious vehicle in the vicinity of Mohawk service station on Highway 3. Checks were conducted and RCMP learned the vehicle was stolen and the driver was wanted by police. Prior to the on-duty members arriving, the driver had departed the area but was located less than a kilometre away in a parking lot. RCMP arrested a 20 year old Penticton man.

A subsequent search of the vehicle located other stolen items which were later linked to thefts in Penticton.

The following day, Princeton RCMP were alerted to a vehicle in the ditch 26 km. east of Princeton on Highway 3.

Nobody was present at that location. RCMP learned the vehicle had been stolen from Penticton.

While in custody, the accused man had made several comments to police about being involved in a crash east of Princeton the night before his arrest. Police believe the two thefts might be linked and are working with Penticton RCMP in an ongoing investigation.

The arrested man appeared in Penticton Court November 24 to face charges of possession of stolen property worth more than \$5,000 and to deal with an outstanding warrant out of Kelowna for a similar charge. He has been remanded in custody until December 8, 2003.

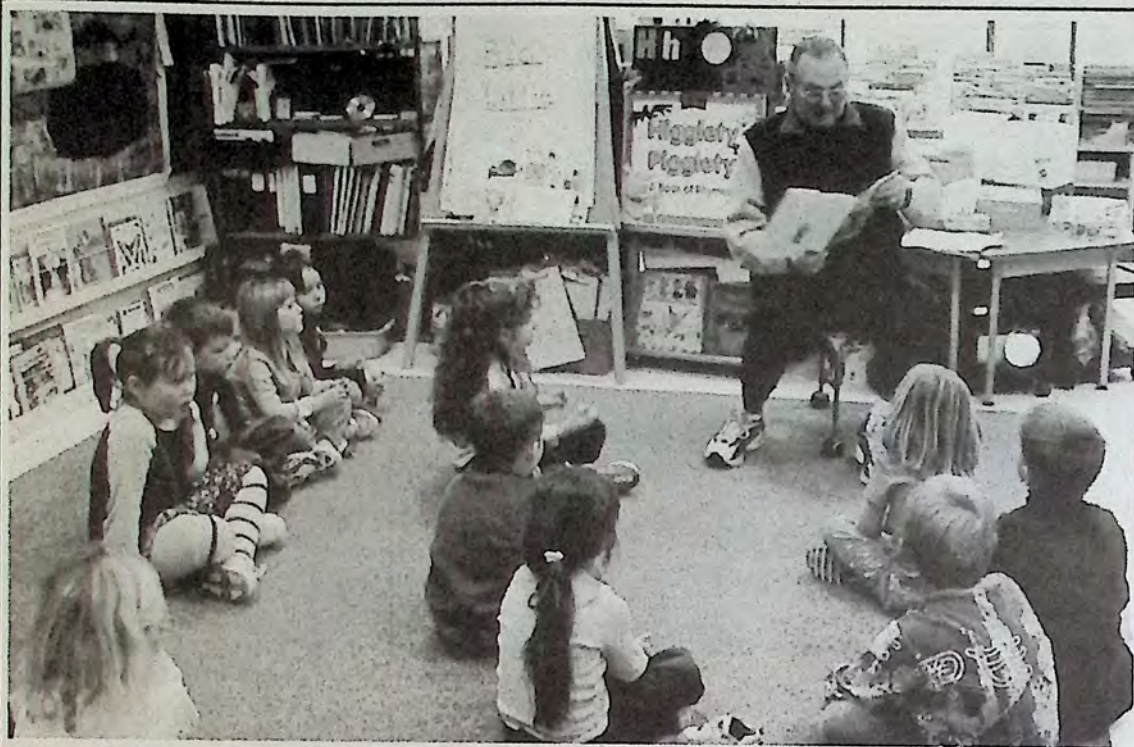

## Chutter backs keeping BC Hydro

Yale-Lillooet MLA Dave Chutter backed legislation preventing the sale of BC Hydro. Bill 85, the Heritage Act, will ensure BC Hydro's generation, storage, transmission and distribution assets cannot be sold.

"Ownership of BC Hydro will continue to remain with the public and electricity rates will remain among the lowest in North America," said Chutter, speaking in favour of the Act. "Along with the fact that BC Hydro will not be sold and rates will remain low, we are also committed to a secure and reliable supply of energy, more private sector opportunities and environmental responsibility, which includes no nuclear generation in B.C."

Chutter says demand for electricity is increasing and new sources must

be found in a way that keeps rates low and competitive for British Columbians.

"It is obvious that the cost of generating new power will be higher than generating old power, no matter who produces it, but the higher cost of this new power will be balanced with the lower-cost heritage power to result in rates as low as possible," Chutter said.

The province is looking to independent power producers to meet future energy demands. Chutter said this approach has already presented opportunities in Yale-Lillooet.

"Three approved green energy, independent power projects are in the planning stage in my riding. These projects were selected because they offer the lowest-cost

energy while minimizing the impact to the environment," Chutter said. "Two of the projects are located near Hope, and both are to be built by Princeton Energy (not PLP). Berkey Creek is a 1.5 megawatt facility and Hunter Creek is a 2.4 megawatt facility. The third project is located near Boston Bar and is referred to as Spuzzum Creek, a 29 megawatt project. These new power generation projects will continue to ensure that future power requirements are met and that generation is as environmentally friendly as possible."

**FINANCIAL FOCUS****Stocks Or Bonds - How To Choose?**

A mother and a granddaughter inherit money from a wealthy uncle. Both wisely seek advice. One buys mostly stocks, the other, mostly bonds. If you met the two of them on the street, how would you know who chose which?

Younger people should consider investing more in stocks because of their potential for greater returns over time. It may not be practical for older investors to wait 15-20 years to see what their investments will produce and so, they may be wiser to invest a larger portion of their portfolio in bonds.

Let's look at some of the differences. A company's operation can be financed by the selling of stock (equity) that is owned by shareholders. Or a company can finance its operation by issuing bonds (going into debt). For bonds, creditors receive interest payments from the company for the loan.

If the value of the company increases, so does the value of its stock. But if the company under performs, stock values fall. A bond is an "IOU" which says that you get your money back, plus interest. When you cash in the bond at the agreed maturity date regardless of how well the issuing company performs. If the company runs into financial trouble, bondholders are paid off in full before stockholders get anything.

Long term, stocks are less volatile and often outperform bonds while bonds are less volatile in the short term. A company's earnings, not the market, have a greater affect on a good stock. And due to their potential growth, stocks generally keep pace with inflation erodes the value of bonds.

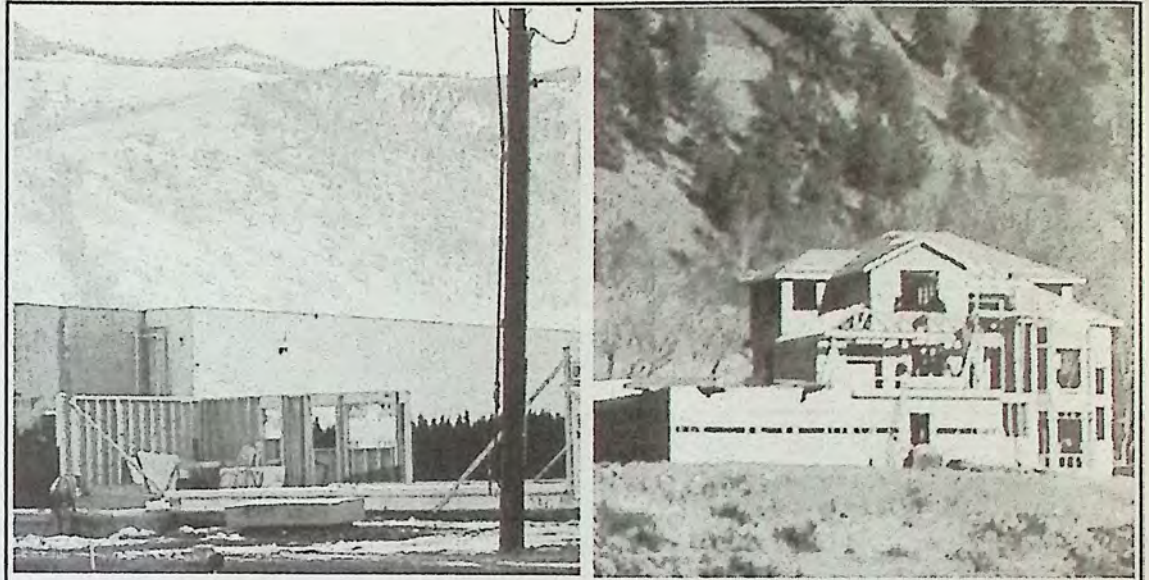

**LSIB applies for forest licence**

Lower Similkameen Indian Band is trying to acquire a community forest licence. The Band has been in meetings with the Ministry of Forests and is continuing meetings. What the Band wants is a percentage of the total Annual Allowable Cut. They would like it on forest lands adjacent to reserve lands. Although no specific area has been pin-pointed, they would like it in the Ashnola watershed. The Band is looking at a sustainable harvest over 100 years. The wood would be used to supply value added enterprises

in the Keremeos area. At this time, timber harvested in the area goes north to an Okanagan based sawmill, providing no benefit to the local community.

Ron Mitchell, Band manager, told the News Leader the Band wants to be a partner in both the decision making and in reaping the benefits of using local natural resources. The benefits would be shared with the community.

In addition to wanting to see some kind of return to Keremeos area from timber harvested in their area, the Band

has real concerns about forest management. Elders in the Band have expressed concern about loss of medicinal plants they use, and about erosion from clear cutting.

There is no guarantee of any deal in the near future, but one of the obligations of government is to consult the Band about use of local resources.

The timber harvest issue is not new for Lower Similkameen Indian Band nor for elected representatives in Regional District and on Village Council. The timber harvest at this time benefits a community far distance from the timber lands near Keremeos. Benefits lost to the Keremeos area include jobs, business activity and residential development and taxes. This has been a sore spot for all South Similkameen residents for many years.

# Good curling takes warming up

Once again, the rinks are alive with the cracking of stones. Yes, it is curling season once again.

Curling is a popular sport whose historical roots date back to sixteenth century Scotland. It has thrived in northern climates such as Canada, where rocks and cold weather are plentiful. The sport is appealing to many people because it is a team game which can be played by all ages, sizes and genders. Curling does require a significant amount of balance and flexibility. Therefore, care should be taken when preparing for the season.

The most significant injuries in curling revolve around falling on the ice and sprains or strains. One answer is to warm up your body prior to curling, similar to warming the car in the morning. Rather than driving to the rink, plan ahead and walk. Walking, even in cooler temperatures, allows your body to warm up and stretches muscles through the body. The increase in metabolic activity in the muscle during walking results in heat generation and an increased muscle temperature. Furthermore, movement enhances joint and muscle flexibility.

Stretching should only be completed after the body has had sufficient time to warm up. The goal for a warm-up activity is achieving a light sweat. More often than not, people will complete stretches without doing a sufficient warm-up activity. It is my opinion that failing to warm up significantly increases the chance of injury while stretching. In fact, my advice is to not stretch prior to activity if you have not warmed up your body.

Another factor to consider is using proper form to stretch a specific soft tissue. Isolating the major muscle groups used in curling is very important. Commonly used muscles and joints of the shoulder, spine, hip, knee and ankle should be included in a stretching routine. Good stretching habits will increase your comfort during the game, reduce injury and extend the age you are able to curl.

Here is a good routine to follow prior to a game:

- \* warm up prior to the game (walk, run, stationary bike, treadmill)
- \* stretch the major muscle groups prior to the match and only after a proper warm-up. Contact your health care provider for appropriate stretches.
- \* stretching tips: isolate, relax, increase tension (mild/moderate) and hold until the muscle releases. You should not feel pain! Never bounce during a stretch. If you feel pain, reduce the tension, you are exerting too

much strain. Stretch both left and right sides.

\* practice your delivery prior to the game

\* stretch again after the match

\* if you have an existing problem or complaint, have it assessed and treated properly by a knowledgeable health professional. Chiropractic is a great

## Living Past 100

### Keep your eyes healthy

Approximately 80 percent of the information we receive in our brains comes through our eyes. We read, watch television, drive, check the weather, go shopping, and recognize our friends by seeing. We want to see as well as possible for as long as possible.

Maintaining healthy eyes begins with seeing your optometrist. This health professional will be the first to identify serious deterioration of the eyes, such as cataracts. Many eye conditions can be corrected through surgery, including drooping eyelids in older years (this causes blockage of vision and could damage eyes if the eyelashes turn inward). These surgeries are safe and effective.

The second way we can maintain healthy eyes is to eat properly. In older people, this means a good vitamin supplement containing free-form amino acids, at least 50 mg. of zinc and 200 mcg. of selenium.

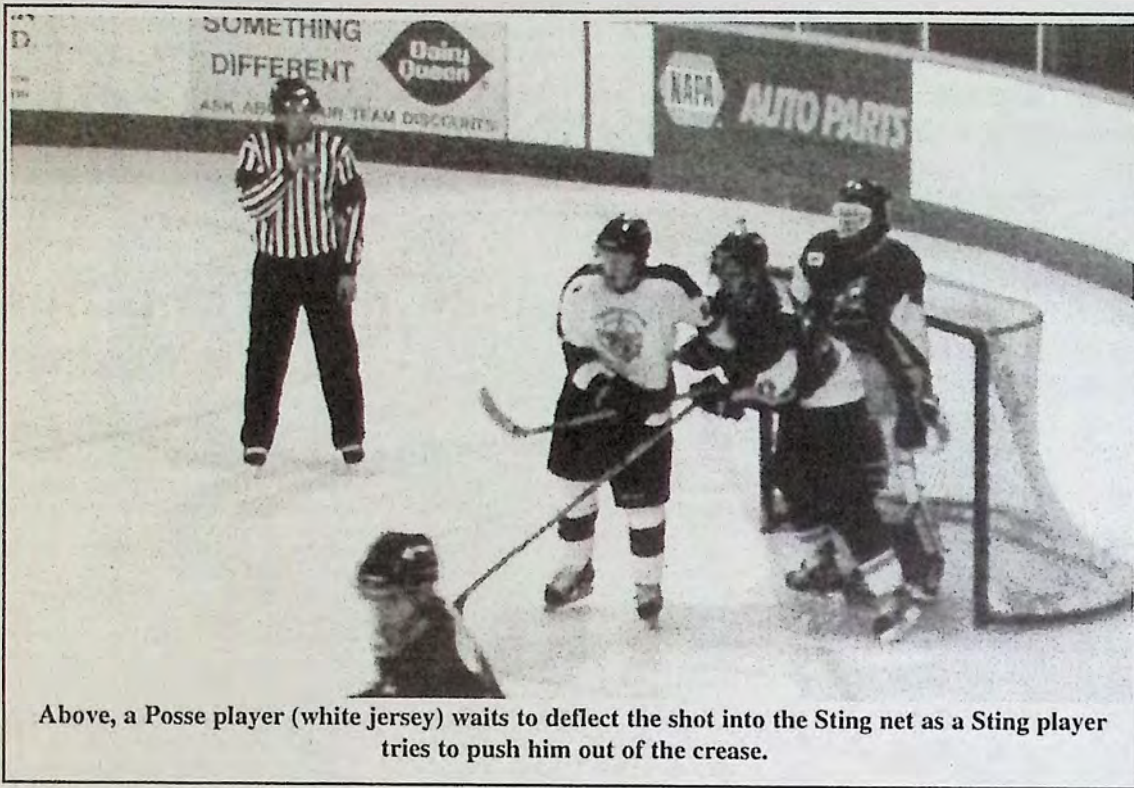
Foods containing high levels of carotene are required. Carotene converts to Vitamin A in the body and Vitamin A protects the eyes. Everyone should have one serving of one of the following high-carotene vegetables daily: broccoli, carrots, cantaloupe, golden squash, oranges, tomatoes, pumpkin, red peppers.

To avoid eye damage, avoid marijuana, sulfa drugs aspirin, diuretics, tetracycline, anticoagulants, streptomycin and corticosteroids. If you must use the prescription drugs, back up your diet with more Vitamin A, Vitamin C and Vitamin E. Protecting the eyes from sun damage is important, too, as well as protecting your eyes from injury. Wear safety glasses whenever you work with things like saws, lathes, or any machine likely to throw off particles. If you have any stinging, mucous build-up or soreness of your eyes, see a doctor immediately. Eye discomfort could indicate an infection which could seriously damage your eyes.

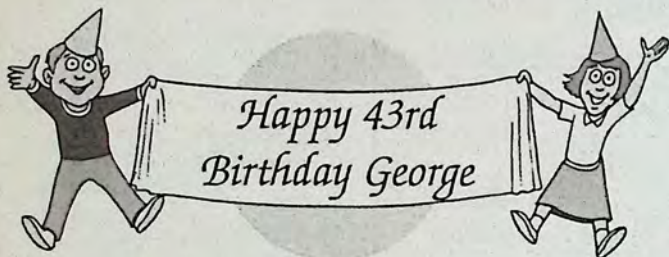

### Let's demand respect for Canadian citizens

There has been a great deal in the news about the Arar case. This was the case in which a Canadian citizen born in Syria was deported from the United States to a jail in Jordan, then shipped from the Jordanian jail to a Syrian jail. This Canadian spent nine months in foreign jails due to the action of American government officials.

The Americans suspected Arar was a terrorist. We have no idea what information was given to U.S. officials nor what part the Canadian government officials played in this activity. There are claims that several countries gave information about Arar's activities, which led the U.S. officials to the conclusion he was a terrorist.

What is really strange is that, if they suspected him of terrorism, why did they not hold him in jail? They could have told the Canadian government what they suspected and had him deported to Canada to face Canadian law enforcement. Why ship him to Jordan? The Jordanians did not want him and shipped him off to Syria, where he was born.

This action should ring a lot of alarm bells in Canadian citizens, especially those of us who live so close to the international border. Many Canadians report negative experiences at the border these days, and we need to consider the Arar case as an example of what could happen to a Canadian citizen in the United States if the authorities decide the visiting Canadian may belong to a "suspect" organization. Under the PATRIOT executive order, membership in the Green Party or a church charitable organization is considered "suspect".

It is clear that being a Canadian citizen will not guarantee any safety from American authorities who may decide to deport a Canadian to anywhere. What is equally clear is the Canadian government will do little to ensure the safe return of a Canadian citizen arrested in the United States. The Canadian government will not even ensure the citizen is deported back to Canada, which is another fact for which we Canadian citizens should demand an explanation.

Regardless of what information the American authorities had about Arar, if they did not want him around, his Canadian citizenship should have been respected, and Canadian authorities should have raised holy hell when it was not. This case is not just about Mr. Arar, it is about respecting Canadian citizenship. Our government seems very slack about demanding that respect and protecting Canadian citizens.

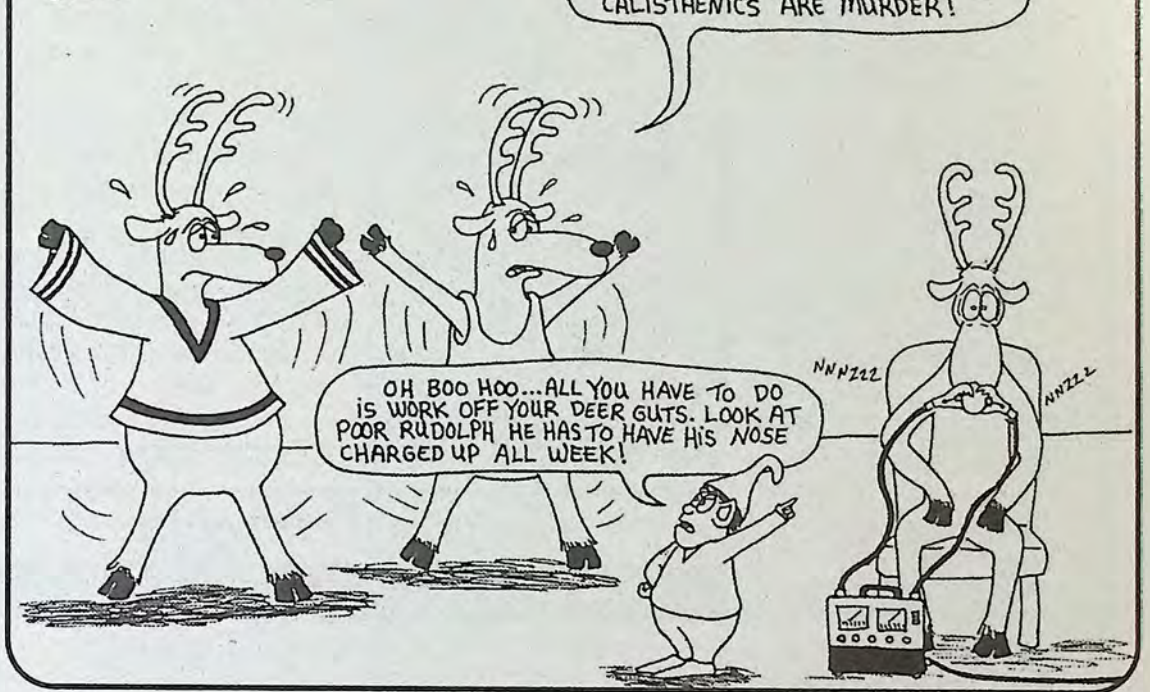

### They ignore seniors at peril to their party

The B.C. Liberals would be well advised to not ignore the "Grey Power" that has been demonstrated in public protests by the seniors in this province. The Council of Senior Citizens Organization (COSCO) hosted the largest seniors' conference ever held in the history of B.C. dealing with issues related to health, housing and income. The cities of Vancouver, Burnaby, Port Coquitlam and Richmond issued civic proclamations declaring October 1, 2003, as the International Day of the Elder Person and they congratulated COSCO for organizing such an important conference. The provincial government did not publicly recognize the event, which is another indication of a dislike for seniors.

The delegates from all over the province demanded the resignation of Katherine Whittred, Minister of State for Seniors, claiming she has failed the seniors in B.C. The feeling was that the Liberal government is barbaric in how it treats the seniors and disabled but it is also economically incompetent with running the province. There was a sincere undertaking established to go back to their respective communi-

ties to mobilize even greater opposition to the unfair treatment and the actions proving harmful for seniors. They could be instrumental in unseating or breaking the back of the Liberal government in the next provincial election.

The conference was held in Richmond, chaired by Vice President Art Kube. Interestingly, the keynote address given by the Director of Research, SPARC, was entitled "Seniors - Assets or Liabilities". Family assets are being used to determine income levels, so when they are sold off and RRSP's are used to supplement the Old Age Pension, seniors become victims of government cost controls. Deregulation and privatizing BC Hydro can increase our electrical costs by 30 percent. It has been said: "For every millionaire that privatization makes there could be a million that privatization breaks." What will this trend lead to for everyone?

Those over 65 in B.C. number 551,800, of which 56 percent are female, needing some sort of support. There are 60,000 aged over 85, with 40,220 being female and in need of various levels of care. Continued next page .....



# We need more political originality

If there is one thing politicians have in common these days, it is a profound lack of originality.

Somebody somewhere has a bright idea of how to make our economy work better, and launches a speaking tour to expound the idea. These presentations are expensive for those attending, but are done with great fanfare and lots of good power-point lectures and glossy documents. The individual presenting the new idea will reap benefits as a "consultant".

The next thing that happens is change in government policy by some nation's government sold on the idea. Before you can say "Cast your ballot", political parties all over the world are touting this new idea.

"Privatization" is one of those ideas. The attraction of privatization is that politicians no longer have to be responsible for the services offered by government. I remember one such deal 35 years ago. The federal government decided it should not own buildings. I forget what bright idea inspired them to sell off federal buildings, but they did it. In Penticton, they sold the building occupied by

Employment and Immigration. It sold at a bargain price, was renovated by the new owner, then leased back to Employment and Immigration at twice what it cost the government before the sale.

The problem with these bright notions is that they sound good but nobody seems to investigate the consequences.

One of my favourite examples is "free trade" with the United States. We conclude from free trade policy and agreements that we will trade freely with our neighbours to the south. The consequence of the agreement to trade freely is that we must now pay extremely high tariffs to sell lumber to them. Basically, Canada's forest industry companies and the various governments pay the U.S. government a bribe so we can sell our forest products. The average American now pays a lot more for a two-by-four than if trade were really "free".

Then there is the Goods and Services Tax (GST). This emerged from a so-called "flat" tax which citizens would pay for doing business, and this would cover all of the costs of government. Gee, that sounds like a great idea! What was intended by the "flat" tax was the eradication of all other taxes, but in our case, we are suddenly paying more taxes than we ever paid.

Another bright idea was saving our environment. Government was lobbied extensively by those who had lofty ideals about preserving the quality of our air, water and soil.

Originally, everyone liked this idea. However, when the policy was implemented, we discovered the hidden agenda of the policy was to make so many conservation areas none of us could make a living. A prize example of the latest lunacy is the efforts of environmentalist groups to prevent the sale of even bug or fire-killed trees. They offer no suggestions as to why dead trees cannot be a resource of benefit to people who have few forests.

There have been some bright ideas that worked quite well while they lasted. Social Credit was one of these ideas, and it was carefully thought out in the beginning. However, it did not really meet the criteria established by most politicians. The first criteria is that everybody must be under the control of a select few. The second criteria is that the people who pay for the election campaign must make money from government policies. Because of its egalitarian ideals, Social Credit was invaded by those who twisted it into a right-wing party which met the criteria of control and money for and by the few.

The lack of originality in politics is not the problem of a few nations. This is a world-wide problem stemming from a desire to maintain some kind of status quo by and for those who gain from status quo. The fact that those who have no power are forced to pay for those in power is not considered unfair, but just part of the status quo.

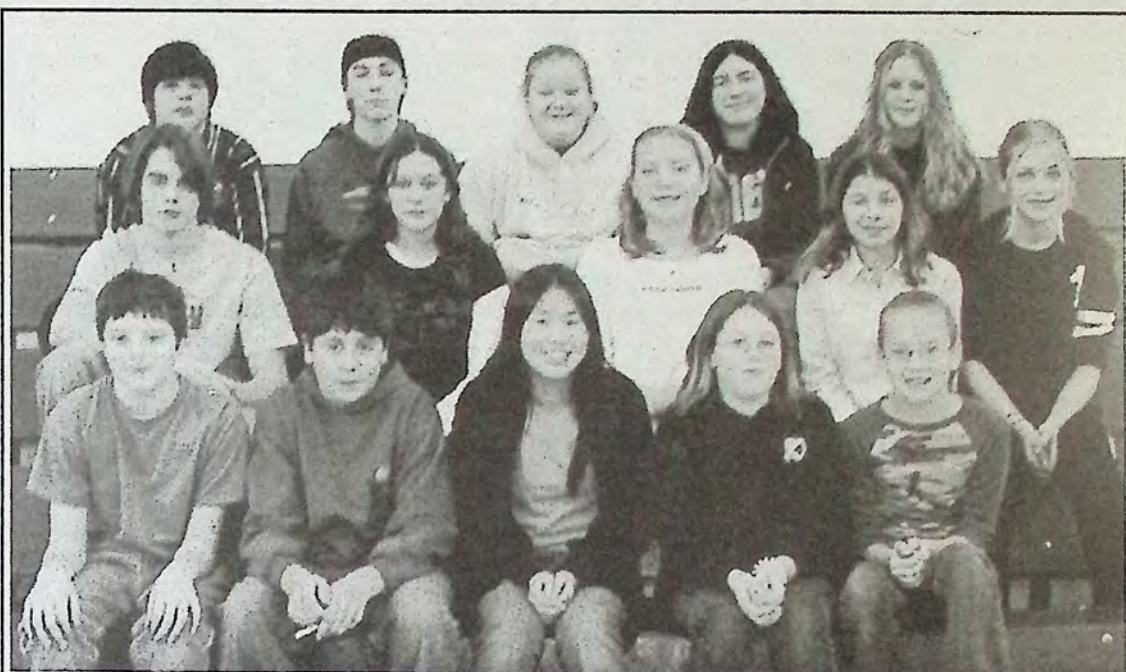

# How to rescue and save a raptor

The heavy snowfall, strong winds and fluctuating temperatures have not only affected humans, but also various wildlife. Within two days, reports came in about injured Northern Pygmy Owl unable to fly and a day later, a Great Horned Owl, also unable to fly due to a broken wing.

Their rescuers contacted Sherri Klein at the South Okanagan Rehab Centre for Owls (SORCO), located in Oliver. Ms. Klein and her husband, Gary, founded the Centre in 1987 and since have dedicated their time to the treatment and release of all birds of prey found sick or injured in the Southern Interior. Both owls were transported from Princeton to the facility and at last report were doing fairly well.

SORCO serves a huge region extending from Hope to Merritt to Kamloops and the Alberta border. Although the name SORCO only mentions owls, raptors such as hawks, falcons, eagles and vultures are also treated.

The causes of injury to raptors are many - crashing into high

power lines, hitting windows, being hit by cars. The latter is often the cause of winter injuries as the birds focus on the plowed roads, as mice and voles run across at night. Young birds may fall out of the nest before they are able to fly.

The firestorms this summer also took their toll. How many birds actually died in the fires will never be known, but after the fires were brought under control, a steady stream of immature Redtail, Cooper's and Sharp-shinned hawks were brought to the Centre.

Ms. Klein feels that the adult birds probably managed to get away, leaving their young behind. These young birds might have been able to escape from the fires but were unable to feed themselves, as they had not developed adequate skills in hunting. As these birds were terribly emaciated, the administration of electrolytes, stress reducers, high protein paste mixes and small meals of fresh mouse flesh was not successful and most died.

What should you do when you

find an injured owl or other raptor?

Wear gloves and handle it with care, protect your eyes, place the bird in a box or cage. Placing a branch in the bottom so it does not slide around will give the bird a natural feeling perch than sitting on a flat surface. Close the box, cover it and leave it in a quiet place away from curious dogs, cats and children.

Do not give it any food or water. Try to move the bird to SORCO as soon as possible so expert treatment can begin.

Ms. Klein stresses the "no food" warning, in some cases birds have been given cooked pork chops, or fish is given to birds that do not eat fish. Even raw hamburger is not encouraged. If you can trap a mouse, it can be given dead, not alive, as mice can bite the already injured bird.

B.C. has 15 of the 16 owl species found in Canada. Fifteen hawk and falcon species have been treated at SORCO. Some, such as the Burrowing and Flammulated Owls are endangered. All are worthy of saving.

## Waiting for the Giant?

We have had several calls about when Great Valleys (Giant FM) will be back on the air.

The broadcasting equipment burned in the Okanagan Mountain Park fire is very technical and must be custom built for Giant FM. There have been delays in the building of the equipment.

When Giant FM receives the equipment, it must then be installed and tested.

Giant FM has been operating in cooperation with CBC in the Okanagan, but the signal is not powerful enough to reach the Similkameen Valley.

The new equipment will solve that problem and Giant FM hopes to be on the air in the Similkameen on December 15.

The staff at Giant FM feels

regrets the delay, but appreciates hearing about all of the listeners in the Similkameen who want them on the air again.
