### Potential exists for airpark development

Princeton's airport holds real potential to become a source of business expansion.

Bill Neale and Mike Heysie presented their 10 year feasibility study and recommendations to Princeton Airport Planning Committee on July 26. The study was to evaluate the business and development potential for Princeton's airport.

They found the runway to be in good condition, and suitable for day-light general aviation year round. They told the committee there are a number of grants available and the provincial government is looking for projects to invest in outside major centres.

Tourism packages and charters for tourists have real potential for the

future, as the Similkameen Valley has good tourist attractions.

There are weaknesses, particularly on the ground. The airport needs fuelling facilities, funding, and management. It could use businesses related to fuelling, food, aircraft maintenance, accommodation, and ground transportation to augment flight traffic.

Bill Neale saw real potential for airpark development in Princeton. An airpark consists of homes with automobile access on one side and aircraft access on the other.

Other potential development could be in aircraft storage, development for use by the Forest Service as an air tanker base, and fly-in golf tourism.

## Compliance Energy receives contract

BC Hydro announced July 27th the results of the 2006 Open Call for Power, awarding 38 contracts to independent power producers throughout the province. The new projects, once developed, will help to meet B.C.'s growing demand for electricity by adding more than 7,000 gigawatt hours per year to BC Hydro's system - enough power to meet the needs of over 700,000 homes.

The announcement was made by Richard Neufeld, Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources and BC Hydro President and CEO, Bob Elton.

"Secure, reliable electricity has been key to British Columbia's economic prosperity and our quality of life for generations. But, as our province continues to grow, the gap between electricity supply and demand is expected to increase," said Minister Neufeld.

"The contracts awarded will help to close that gap by bringing new supply online by 2010 and also help us achieve our goal of leading the world in sustainable environmental management."

The contracts include 29 hydro, three wind, two biomass, two waste heat and two coal/biomass projects.

Compliance Power Corporation received a contract for their Princeton Power Project, which falls under the BC Hydro category of Coal/Biomass and is listed at a Plant Capacity of 56 megawatts creating Total Energy of 421 gigawatt hours per year.

The other contracts went to power projects in 150 Mile House, Agassiz, Alice Arm, Blue River, Boston Bar (2 projects), Castlegar, Chetwynd, Chilliwack, Dawson Creek, Gibson, Gold River, Kamloops (2 projects), Kelowna, Lytton, Mackenzie, Mission (2 projects), Nelson, Port Alberni, Port Alice (2 projects), Port Hardy, Powell River, Prince Rupert, Revelstoke (2 projects), Savona, Sechelt (3 projects), Squamish, Tahsis (2 projects), Terrace, Tumbler Ridge and Woss.

The awards represent long term purchase agreements with an average term of 30 years. Ranging in size from under one megawatt to approximately 200 megawatts in capacity, the projects are located throughout the province and are expected to generate \$3.6 billion in private sector investment.

Of the successful bidders, 23 are already developing projects for BC Hydro resulting from previous calls, and three include First Nations as developers or partners.

"We are extremely pleased with the response to BC Hydro's Open Call," said Bob Elton.

"Purchases from independent power producers represent one of the ways that we are working to secure our long term electricity needs as outlined in the Integrated Electricity Plan filed with the BCUC in March of this year. The diversity of energy resources awarded today will help meet demand growth and clean energy target

while keeping B.C.'s electricity rates amongst the lowest in North America."

The 2006 Open Call Process was initiated in December 2005. Fifty-three separate projects bid into the process and were evaluated against

**Company expects more high-grade gold**

Leonard W. Saleken, President of Goldcliff Resource Corporation (GCN.TSXV), announced last week that exploration trenching has commenced on the Nordic Zone on the Company's 100% owned Panorama Ridge gold property near Hedley.

Several trenches have already been excavated at the York-Viking gold zone and samples have been shipped to the assay laboratory for analysis. Past trench sampling on the Nordic Zone has returned 70 metres containing 1.53 grams per tonne gold, including 2.04 grams per tonne gold over 45.50 metres, the highlight being 3.00 metres of 15.60 grams per tonne gold, which includes 26.50 grams gold over one metre.

The Nordic Zone gold mineralization has been encountered in three trenches (2005) and two drill holes (2003). The gold zone covers an area 30 metres NW-SE and 70 metres NE-SW. It is open to the north-east and to the south-east. All

three trenches were excavated and sampled along the NE-SW direction of the gold zone.

Trench ND56 is the upper trench and ND83/91 is the lower trench. All three trenches are located along the south-east, steeply dipping hillside, at the northern end of Panorama Ridge. The Nordic Zone is located 300 metres north-east of the York-Viking Zone.

The Nordic Zone gold mineralization has a close similarity to the gold mineralization encountered in the Nickel Plate's underground ore-body. The Nickel Plate ore-body was high in gold, arsenic, tellurium, bismuth, cobalt and nickel. The Nordic Zone is also high in these elements. The Nickel Plate ore body and the Nordic Zone have similar structural geology.

The 2006 trenching and drilling is anticipated to clarify both the continuity of gold mineralization and the structural setting.

The 2006 exploration program is financed in large part by the recent-

ly completed flow through share offering which resulted in gross proceeds of \$742,650.

Leonard W. Saleken, PGeo, is the qualified person as defined by National Instrument 43-101 who supervised the preparation and verification of the technical information in this release.

**RDOS explores Telus expansion call plan**

The Regional District Okanagan Similkameen Board has requested TELUS to initiate the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC's) local calling area expansion cost study for the RDOS.

This will establish a common local area (LCA) among multiple local governments that will enable residents of the Okanagan-Similkameen to make local calls to more locations than before.

The expansion will improve service and benefit residents with long distance savings. Economically, this will also support local businesses by opening up doors to more communication with neighbouring communities.

Costs incurred to undertake this study will be borne by Telus. The Board has also requested member municipalities to pass a resolution in support of this project.

The project was discussed at the regular meeting of RDOS last week.

Neale and Heysie pointed out the losses incurred for Princeton if the airport is lost. Medical evacuation by air would no longer be possible, Forest Service use would be lost, search and rescue would be lost, and disaster recovery potential would be gone, as well as loss of opportunity to expand business development.

Recommendations included establishing an airport society comprised of the mayor and Town Council, Chamber of Commerce and Upper Similkameen Indian Band, with a five person appointed board and an appointed airport manager. They recommended a study on the potential for a GPS approach which would allow larger

aircraft a safe landing, and a market study for commercial development of the airport.

The target markets would be general aviation related to tourism, fuel sales, aircraft management and storage, air taxi or charter service, adventure tourism linked to packages, car meets and rallies, film industry and government services (Forest, Health, SAR).

Long term plans should include business expansion at the airport, hangar and office space rentals, charter and executive air services, an airpark, and light industry.

Councillor Ray Jarvis chaired the meeting, and will take the study and recommendations to Council for consideration. Council will decide on the future of the local airport, which is owned by the Town.

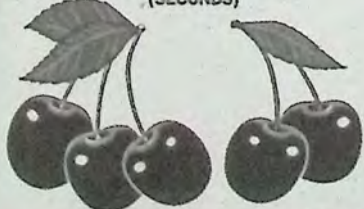

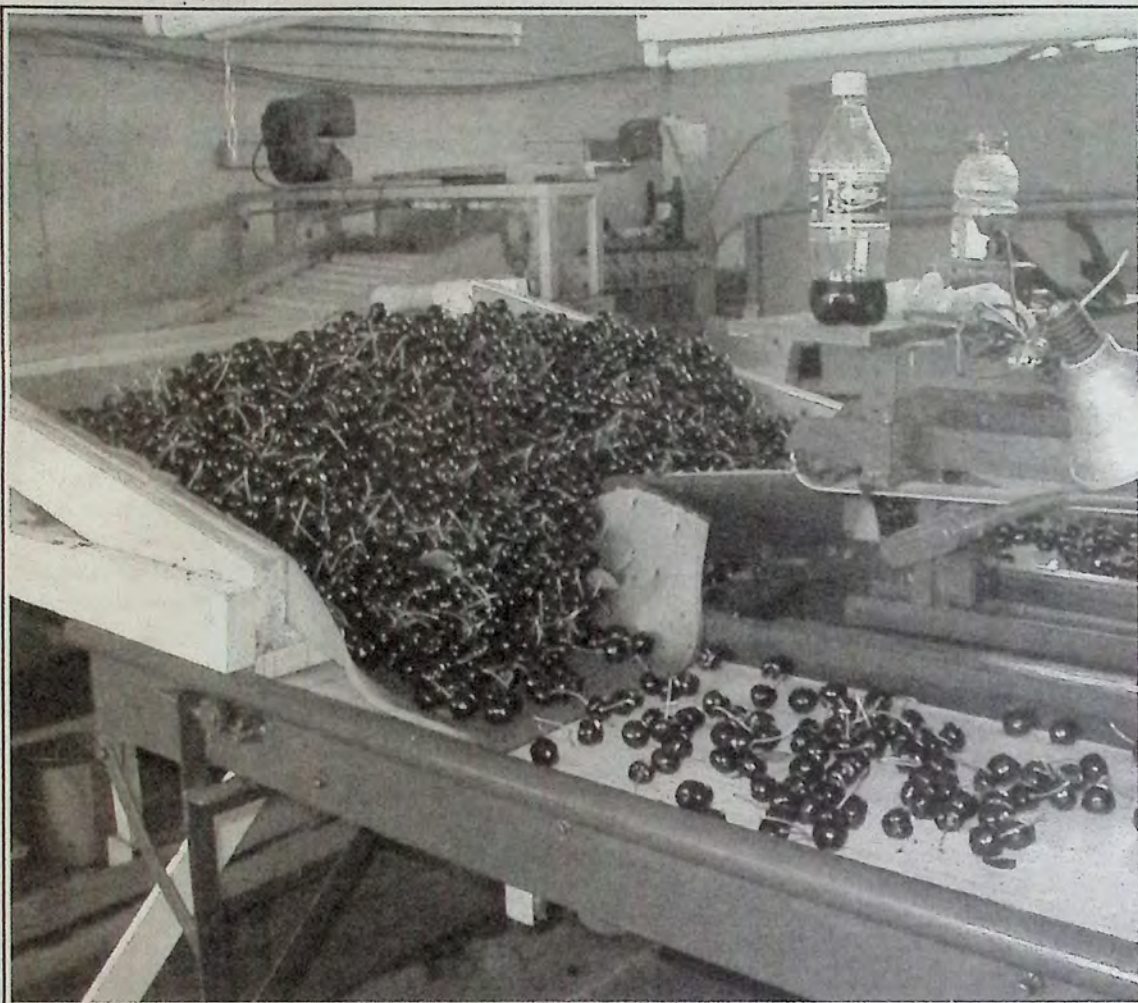

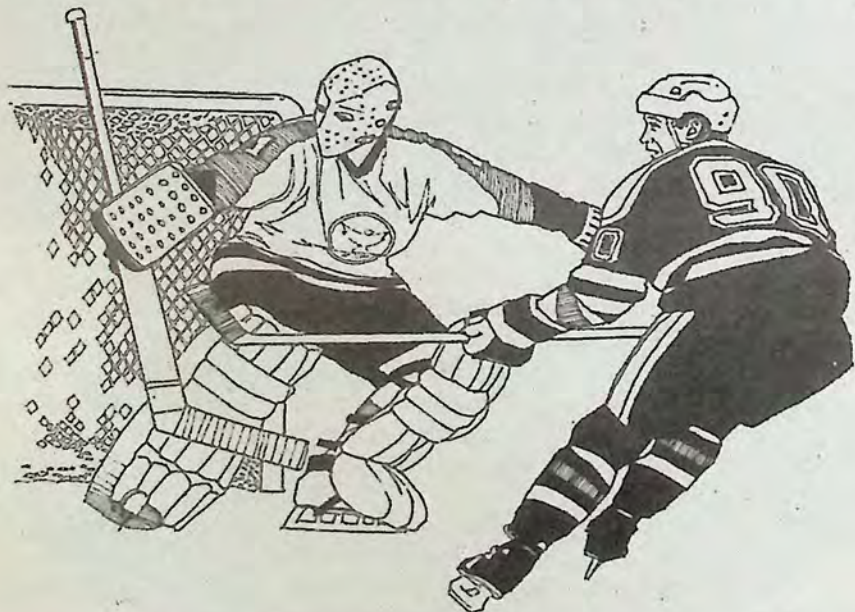

Some juice manufacturers are adding vitamin D to their juice. A cup of this fortified juice contains about 100 units per cupful. If you are over 50, you need at least 400 units per day. Those over 70 need 600 units. Milk is also a good source of vitamin D as well as protein, calcium and vitamin A.

Two of the top seeds and nuts that can be good for your heart are sunflower and sesame seeds and pistachio nuts. They all contain a healthy amount of phytosterols, which appear to lower cholesterol naturally. They do contain around 200 calories per ounce so don't overdose.

There are two types of sun's rays that damage the skin. UVB rays, which have a shorter wavelength, don't penetrate the skin deeply but can cause significant damage to the DNA, which can lead to skin cancer. The other type of ray is UVA, which penetrate more deeply into the skin and is one of the causes of premature aging of the skin (that weathered, leather look).

Your doctor and pharmacist should always be part of your healthcare team. Discuss your medications with them often. Don't stop medications without informing your doctor. Some drugs (like anti-seizure and anti-depressant drugs) need to be slowly reduced. Before you change anything, talk about it first.

**One man's struggle to overcome depression**

(NC)-They say university is supposed to be the best time of your life. The joy of parties, classes, and life-shaping events all take place during this four-year period. But for Michael it easily could have been the worst.

Experiencing nausea sitting in the lecture hall, constant dizziness at parties and large group situations, exhibiting no energy at varsity rugby practices and games, displaying a lack of desire to go out, and choosing to do nothing for days are all symptoms of the anxiety disorder that Michael experienced but kept to himself.

University was not the first time Michael had experienced these symptoms. Since the death of his grandfather in high school he had felt uncomfortable in his own skin, could not concentrate for long periods of time and had depleted energy levels. However, it was not until 2003 that Michael was diagnosed

with anxiety disorder, this, his third year of university. So why did it take so long?

There is a stigma about depression that continues to exist. Often, depression is known as a "woman's problem" and boys are taught "to take it like a man"; health problems are seen as signs of weakness. Michael fell into that same belief pattern and he refused to think that he could be depressed. "I was in denial. I convinced myself that I was happy, living away at a great school and with friends always around. I can't be depressed when there are other people in the world that have bigger problems." It was not until Michael's mother began noticing her son's deterioration through their weekly phone calls that she demanded he go to see a doctor.

It was only then that Michael was diagnosed with an anxiety disorder, caused by a chemical imbalance in

his brain. Since his first visit with the doctor Michael's life has changed. He is now on a treatment called Effexor XR, which helps him go through his day feeling balanced. By taking medication Michael found he could focus on his life. He achieved his best grades in his fourth year and has since graduated. Currently, Michael is carving out a career in the real estate industry.

Identifying that you need help may be difficult, but by being open and honest about how you're feeling, a doctor can help diagnose your symptoms, and help you work toward remission. Most doctors now believe that a combination of talk therapy and medications is the best way to treat these illnesses. You don't have to live with debilitating symptoms. **We Ask You: When is worry too much?**

(NC)-Everyone experiences anxiety at certain points in their lives. It's natural, for example, to fret about your finances while in the midst of buying or selling your home, or to feel stressed about an upcoming presentation at work. Such worries are healthy and useful reactions that spur us on to perform well and avoid unpleasant situations.

However, some Canadians find themselves plagued by overwhelming anxiety that goes beyond healthy limits. According to Dr. Richard Earle of the Canadian Institute of Stress, Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD) is a medical condition defined by excessive, unrealistic worry that lasts for six months or longer. "At least five per cent of people will experience an anxiety disorder in their lifetime," says Dr. Earle, "yet many don't seek help because they fear others will see their condition as a weakness."

It is simply not true that their condition is a weakness. In most cases, GAD is believed to be related to the levels of two naturally occurring brain chemicals, serotonin and norepinephrine. "The good news is there are treatments available that have been proven to help patients get back to full, happy lives," says Dr. Earle. "Dual-acting anti-depressants such as Effexor XR, act on

both brain chemicals and Effexor XR has been shown to be effective in treating GAD. In addition, talk therapy can help people re-frame their problems and see them from a different perspective."

How do you know if your worries are symptoms of GAD? Take the time to ask yourself these questions:

- Have you worried excessively or been anxious about several things over the past six months?
- Do you find it difficult to control these worries or do they interfere with your ability to focus on what you are doing?
- When you were anxious over the past six months, did you feel restless or on edge most of the time?
- Do you feel tense or irritable most

of the time?

- Do you often feel tired, weak or easily exhausted?
- Have you had difficulty concentrating or find your mind going blank?
- Have you had difficulty sleeping (difficulty falling asleep, waking in the middle of the night, early morning waking or sleeping excessively)?

If you answered yes to three or more of these questions, it's possible that you're experiencing an anxiety disorder. It's important to see your doctor and start on the path toward peace of mind. **Beat the heat with veggies**

Television is telling you to eat your veggies and fruit. This is a good time of year to do just that, and beat the heat as well.

We are supposed to eat five to ten servings of a combination of fruits and vegetables every day. For the cook's benefit, this is half a cup per serving, or around 250 millilitres. This is a lot of veggies and fruit!

How do you manage to put all of those things in front of the family? This is the time of year to figure it out.

First, don't cook much of anything during the hot weather. Breakfast can be a dry cereal, milk, and fruit. Berries are great to put on top of cereal, but so are sliced apricots, peaches or nectarine.

For a snack, try a smoothie of fruit mixed with milk and yogurt, or some carrot sticks with cheese dip.

Note: we are adding a lot of calcium with milk products.

For lunch, try cottage cheese with fruit, a vegetable salad or sliced raw vegetables, and a few slices of cold meat. You could make a salmon and spinach salad, or a tuna salad, or some coleslaw.

Watermelon makes a great snack on a hot summer afternoon, or try another smoothie.

For dinner, how about potato salad, green salad, jellied salad and cold meat, with fruit for dessert?

You may find you need to cook something for the prep work, such as potatoes and eggs, and meat. Do so early in the morning.

Finally, keep in mind that fruit juice counts as a serving of fruit.

If you follow the menu above, you have all the fruit and veggies you need for the day, and you're keeping cool as well.

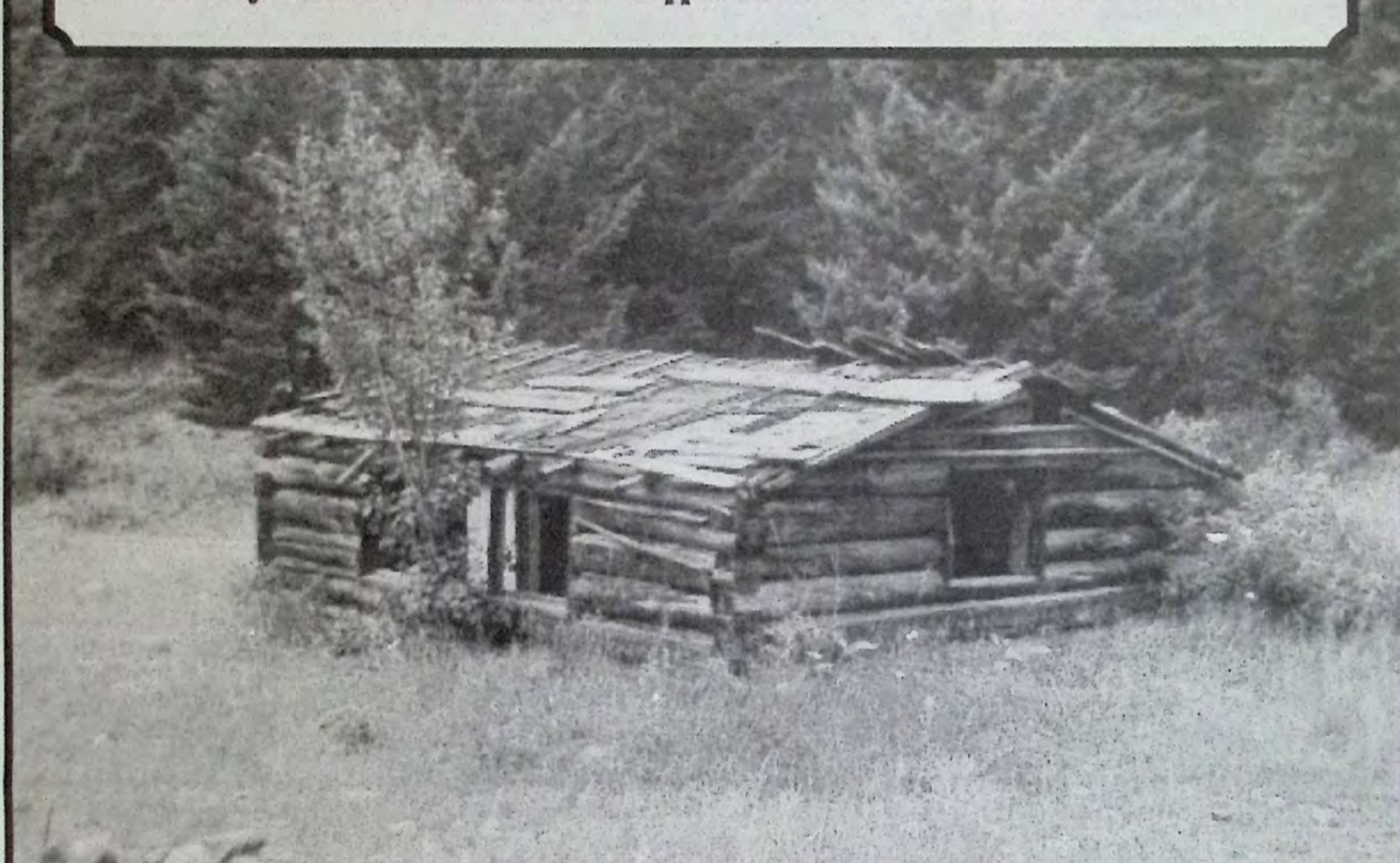

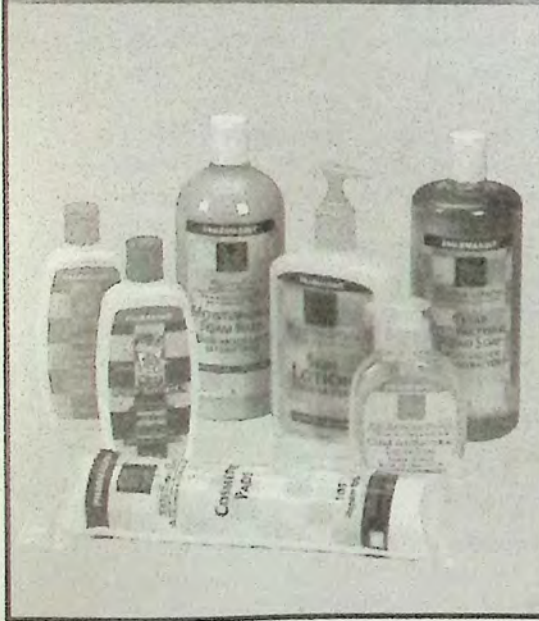
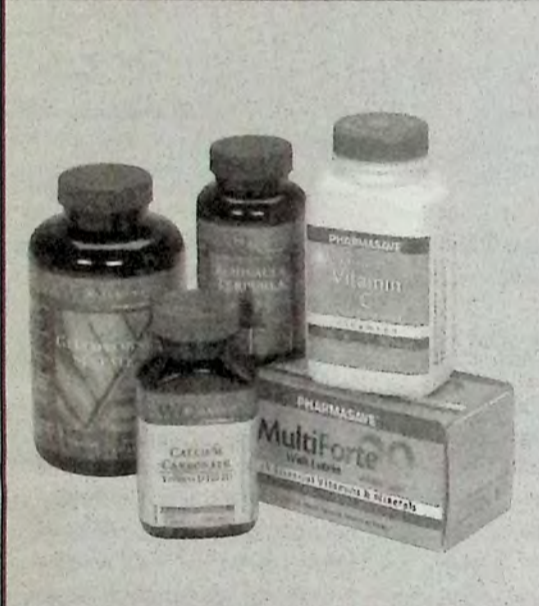

## Mosquito Control and the West Nile Virus

**W**ith the start of mosquito season, the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen is taking steps to prepare for and respond to concerns related to the West Nile Virus.

#### These Steps Include:

- Mapping potential mosquito development sites in areas of standing water.
- Working closely with the Interior Health Authority and the BC Centre for Disease Control.
- Providing information to the community on how to reduce the risk of mosquito bites
- Applying registered granular larvicides when West Nile Virus vector mosquitoes are present in identified development habitats.

#### Practice the Four D's

- **Drain** your property of standing water by emptying pets' water dishes daily, covering or overturning toys, equipment or containers that may collect rain water, and cleaning out eaves troughs.
- **Dusk/Dawn** is the time to take extra care as this is when mosquitoes are out most. Reduce outdoor activities during these times.
- **Dress** appropriately by wearing light-coloured clothes that are loose fitting, but tightly woven and cover-up with long sleeves and long pants when there are a lot of mosquitoes out.
- **Defend** against mosquito bites by using mosquito repellents such as DEET, Citronella candles or mosquito coils.

#### About West Nile Virus

West Nile Virus is a mosquito-borne illness that is spread when a mosquito bites an infected bird and then a person. The health risk to humans is low and there is no reported cases of West Nile Virus in BC at this time. However, it is still important to be informed about this illness and how you can limit your exposure.

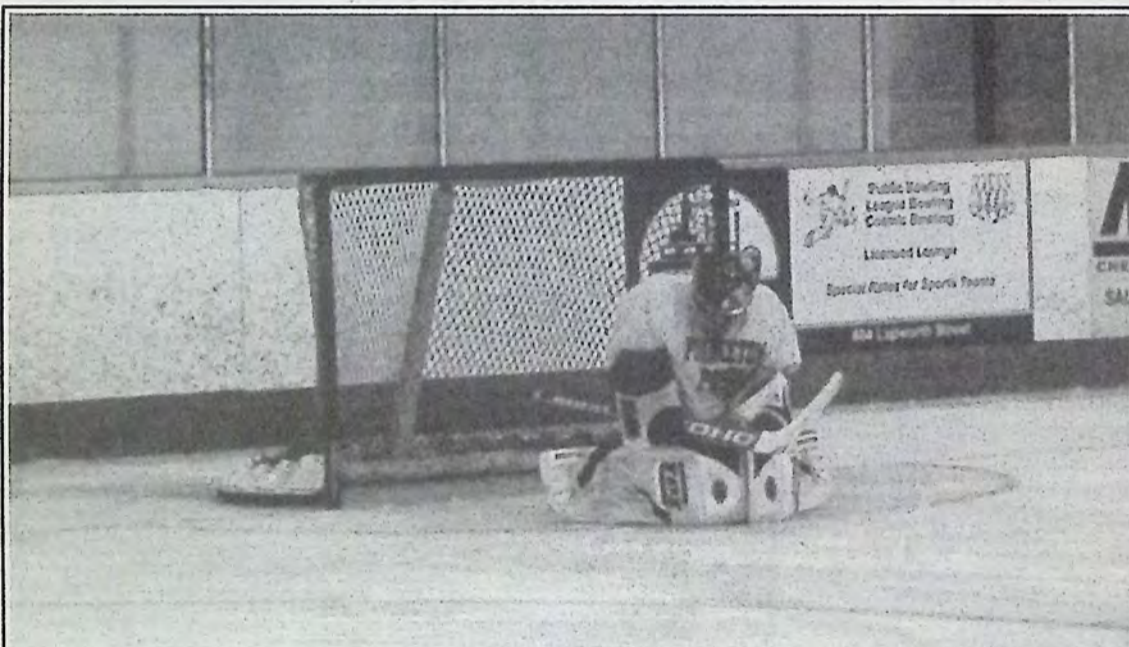

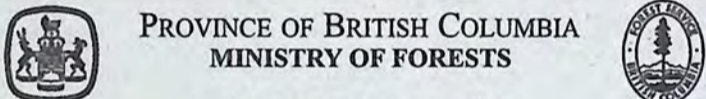

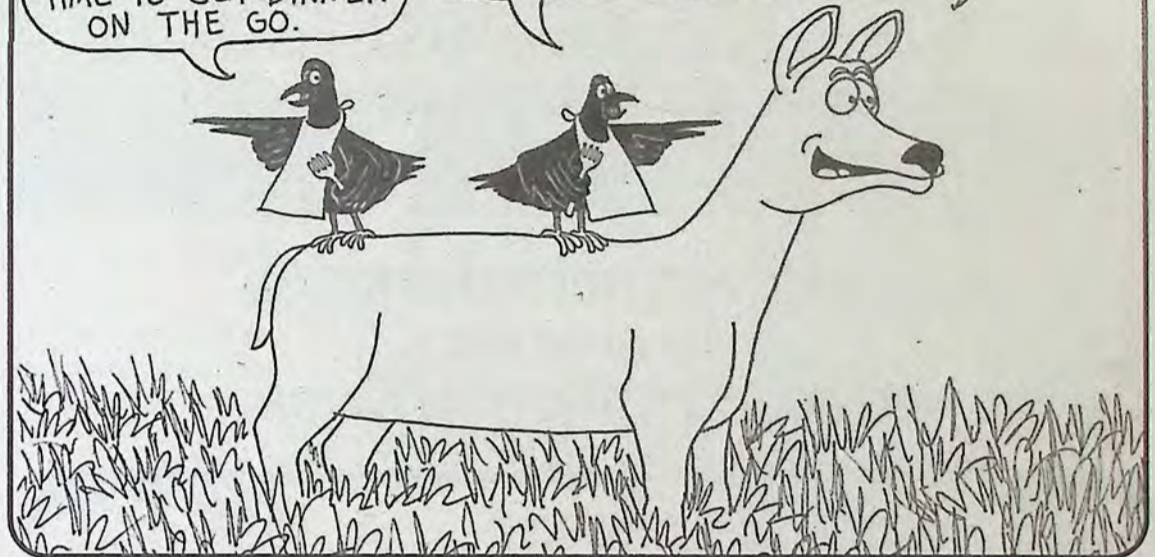

# Who should own water?

Canada has no laws about Canadian ownership of fresh water.

Most nations have laws that say water cannot be privately owned and distributed.

Water is so essential to life that battles for control of a water supply have taken place throughout the world, usually as a result of one group wanting to deny access to water, or profiting from control of water.

My sister told me about seeing a documentary on television about a battle in Argentina following the government selling all water rights to a corporation.

Every citizen had to pay the corporation for any water used. The government passed a law forbidding citizens to collect and use rain water! Finally, citizens rebelled and things changed.

Canada has more clean fresh water than most nations of the world. Some people would like to see it used as a commodity for sale in bulk.

How would you feel if you had to pay for every gallon of water you used?

Right now we just pay for the maintenance of the water system. Water could become as expensive to the householder as natural gas.

Recently, the Council of Canadians began a campaign to have Canada develop a national policy regarding ownership of fresh water.

Perhaps I should explain who the Council of Canadians is. This citizens lobby group is well known outside Canada as a group who gives a voice to the average citizen about basic rights and concerns. It is a non-profit group.

Why do we need a national water policy?

Let's suppose our municipal government decides it is too much trouble to replace water lines and sells water rights to a corporation. The corporation is then in charge of maintaining the pipeline system and will charge for the use of water.

Our municipal system is not for profit, but a business exists to make a profit. Guess what you

will pay for water when the business takes over. Another consideration of turning water supply over to private business is the quality of drinking water. Will the corporation cut corners on pipe quality if pipes must be replaced, and who will monitor the quality of water?

Right now, our municipality pays for routine water quality analysis. Will a private business do this?

Bulk water sales south of the border have been a hot issue for several years. So why do people worry about it?

Suppose turning water into a commodity leads to the Argentina experience? Who will have all the water they need and who will do without?

Those who can pay will have it. Those who can't, won't.

Would farmers have to pay? If they would, can you imagine what they would have to charge for the food they produce? Can you imagine the cost of electricity if power companies had to pay for the water flowing through the dams?

The natural gas and oil sands

extraction industries use a lot of water to get the gas or refine the sands. Can you imagine the cost of natural gas and gasoline if those industries must pay for the tons of water they use?

We could face becoming peasants in a feudal system run by the people who own the water.

Am I crazy? Not a chance. Privatization of water is a fact in many countries, and the corporations who control water, and profit by it, fight anybody interested in fighting privatization of water in other countries. Gee, folks, fighting privatization means these corporations can't expand in the future.

The Council of Canadians is asking that water be recognized as a public resource, ban the export of water, set national standards for drinking water, and develop a comprehensive water conservation plan.

If you are concerned, talk to Alex Atamanenko, your Member of Parliament, and tell him you want a national water policy NOW!

To the Editor:

Something has been stolen from Princeton. It's a small thing, and maybe few have noticed it - but it has been stolen.

I mean the rails-to-trails bike path that goes from Princeton to Penticton. For a while, this marvelous trail brought bikers from all over the world through Princeton and our area. The day has been when I've heard French, German, Dutch, Swedish, English, and goodness-knows-what languages on the trail. Lately however, the trickle of bikers that remains, has come down to use the road.

Why?

Because the trail is now virtually unusable by bicycles. It is so rutted and loosened that it is difficult, even dangerous in places, to ride on it. This is because it has become a free-way for dirt bikes, ATV's and even pickups. Last summer I was run off the trail by a pickup heading my way at fairly high speed, which gave no indication of slowing or leaving me any room. I saw another one a day or two ago.

When the trail was put in, the old railroad bridge not far from us was blocked by steel pylons put there to block vehicle passage. The pylons lasted a few weeks; then someone cut the locks on them, and removed them. Recently, large boulders have been placed at the entry to the bridge. These have already been towed out of the way.

The bike path, funded for, and paid for by bikers, has been stolen by individuals who have no respect for others, whose motto is "You can't

keep me off that trail." I guess we can't - but it's still theft.

Well, there is a solution:

Move bike traffic down onto the 'pavement' and let the motor vehicles have the old rail bed to mess up as much as they like.

Of course, you'd still have all the unlicensed motor bikes and ATV's that regularly use the paved road by the lakes - but think of the benefits:

a whole new tourist industry: spelunking in some of the larger potholes in the pavement, and maybe even a restaurant on the North Rim of a pothole near my place - think of dinner while you watch the sun setting over the Western rim and how quiet it would be with all the motor traffic up on the bike trail.

## Mayor speaks out against 'dirty power'

Conservation organizations Wildsight and Pembina Institute joined the Mayor of Princeton last Friday in expressing dismay at BC Hydro's long-term commitment to purchase power from two proposed coal-burning plants.

Compliance Energy's Princeton Power Project and Hillsborough Resources and AES Wapiti Energy's Wapiti Power Project will release pollutants into the air as well as increase BC's greenhouse gas emissions by as much as 1.7 million tonnes each year.

"Coal-fired power plants are major sources of a wide range of pollutants, such as particulate matter, sulphur dioxide and nitrogen oxides that cause smog and acid rain. They emit heavy metals, especially mercury, which is also a health concern," says Karen Campbell, the Pembina Institute's legal counsel.

"In Ontario, the government has estimated that air pollution from coal-fired power plants is responsible for the premature deaths of 668 people per year in the province."

"It is hard to believe that the government is committing BC to dirty coal that will cause massive increases in toxic pollution and make it even more difficult for the people of BC to address the climate crisis," said Casey Brennan, Wildsight program manager for energy and mining.

Conservationists are not alone in their concern. Princeton Mayor Randy McLean is also very worried about what Compliance Energy's plant will mean for the Similkameen Valley.

"It is disturbing that our provincial government is embracing a minimally updated nineteenth century technology that other provinces are phasing it out. How can we promote tourism and real estate investment under the cloud of a coal-burning plant? I am concerned for the future of our valley and the people who live here. Industry profit at the expense of everyone's environment is unacceptable."

"I am worried for my children's and grandchildren's health," said Princeton rancher Brad Hope.

"The air pollutants and toxic mercury emissions from dirty coal that will be released into our air shed will accumulate and impact the health of all living creatures in my community."

## Partnership flourishes

The Town of Princeton, Area 'H' of the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen and the Upper Similkameen Indian Band continue to make considerable progress with several initiatives under a renewed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). These initiatives will foster sustainable economic development and continue to protect the Upper Similkameen Indian Band's cultural history and improve relationships with local governments.

Since renewing their commitment to the MOU, the three partners have been diligently working on a Partnership Statement of Intent that will see the proponents form a community forest corporation known as the Vermilion Forks Forest Corporation. Equal partners in the corporation, the group has made an initial application to the Ministry of Forests for a Community Forest License that will be situated in the western portion of the Similkameen River watershed, between Manning Park and Hedley and within the Cascades Forest District.

Under the Partnership Statement of Intent, the partnership will increase local involvement in the management of the Princeton area forestlands that will assist in maintaining or enhancing the economic diversity and quality of life for residents, as well as ensuring that other natural resource uses and values are maintained in perpetuity.

Key objectives of the Vermilion Forks Forest Corporation include:

- To operate the Community Forest area in a manner which

achieves a reasonable and consistent profit from forestry operations.

- To provide employment opportunities for all parties' constituents.
- To ensure that residents of the area are directly involved in setting priorities for forestry management and expenditure of net profits generated from forestry operation.
- To ensure a sustained harvest level throughout the licence area and to potentially increase the annual allowable cut over time, through innovative forest practices.
- To provide for the highest return and best use of forestlands resources, using sound, environmentally responsible management practices.
- To enhance and promote the educational and research value of the forest resource.
- To maintain a long-range view for deriving benefits and managing the resource.
- To ensure that the management of the forest resource does not compromise the ability of other resource users to maintain or increase their use and benefit from the forested land base.
- To develop and maintain a working partnership model other local government and aboriginal government organizations may emulate.

The next step in the application process is an invitation by the Ministry of Forests to pursue the feasibility of the application. The partnership is confident that the provincial government will see the benefits of granting the Vermilion Forks Forest Corporation a license for this area.
