Local Notary receives Life Membership

An Honourary Life Membership in the Society of Notaries Public of British Columbia is bestowed upon Notaries who have "exemplified the spirit of The Society's founding membership and who have distinguished themselves in the pursuit of improving and promoting the status of Notaries Public in our province."

The quarterly publication of the Society, The Scrivener, features a two-page spread congratulating Larry Stevens, Sr. on being named an Honourary Life Member of The Society.

The announcement was made at the BC Notaries' Fall Conference in Whistler to which Stevens replied, "I wish to thank The Society for bestowing this award upon me. It is a great honour."

Stevens was born in Vancouver and grew up in the East End and North Burnaby. He met his future wife Janice at Burnaby North High School and chose a career that saw

him in the banking field. In fact, Stevens spent eight years working for a chartered bank in various branches in BC.

In 1969 when he happened to mention his dissatisfaction with his work to his mentor and father-in-law, the late James L. Robinson Sr., a Notary Public for the District of Coquitlam and President of Brunette Agencies Ltd., a real estate and insurance agency.

As the story goes, Robinson suggested on that day that Stevens leave the bank and work for him and Robinson promised, "I'll give you a \$100.00 a month raise."

Stevens took the offer and became a conveyancer (one who prepares documents for the transfer of property) in Robinson's Notary office. This led to years at night school taking the Urban Land Economics course as he set out to achieve the goal of becoming a BC Notary Public.

One setback followed his application for membership in the Society of Notaries Public of BC when he was told there was no possibility of another Seal being placed in Coquitlam, where he

wanted to practise.

That changed in 1976 when Stevens' father-in-law, a Board member of the Society at the time, called to say the Board would assign a Seal to Port Coquitlam if he could be ready to sit for exams in four months.

It was the start of a career that saw Stevens practice in Port Coquitlam until he transferred his Seal to Princeton in 1994.

Lali says Hedley school should stay open

NDP MLA says Campbell Liberals Have Abandoned Rural B.C.

Yale-Lillooet MLA Harry Lali said the possible closure of the only school in the village of Hedley shows that the Campbell Liberal Government has abandoned rural communities.

"The attempt to close Hedley School proves, yet again, that the B.C. Liberals don't care about maintaining public services in rural B.C.," said Lali.

"While the Premier spends hundreds of millions of dollars in cost overruns on the Vancouver Convention Centre, he refuses to protect small-town community schools."

Lali has been lobbying School District No. 56 to keep Hedley School open. If the school is closed primary school students from Kindergarten to Grade 3 will be bussed over half an hour each way to attend classes in neighbouring

Keremeos.

"New Democrats are standing alongside the people of Hedley, standing up for students of rural B.C. and opposing this closure," said Lali.

"Rural students have a right to quality education in their community, and parents should not have to bus their small children over half an hour away from home to get a basic education."

"Since coming to power in 2001 Gordon Campbell and the B.C. Liberals have closed over 130 schools, mostly in rural B.C.," said Lali.

"The push to close the Hedley School is another example of the mean-spirited and uncaring agenda being imposed on a small, rural community by an uncaring Liberal premier and government."

Lali spoke at a public meeting in Keremeos January 9th. The district will make its final decision about the closure on January 25.

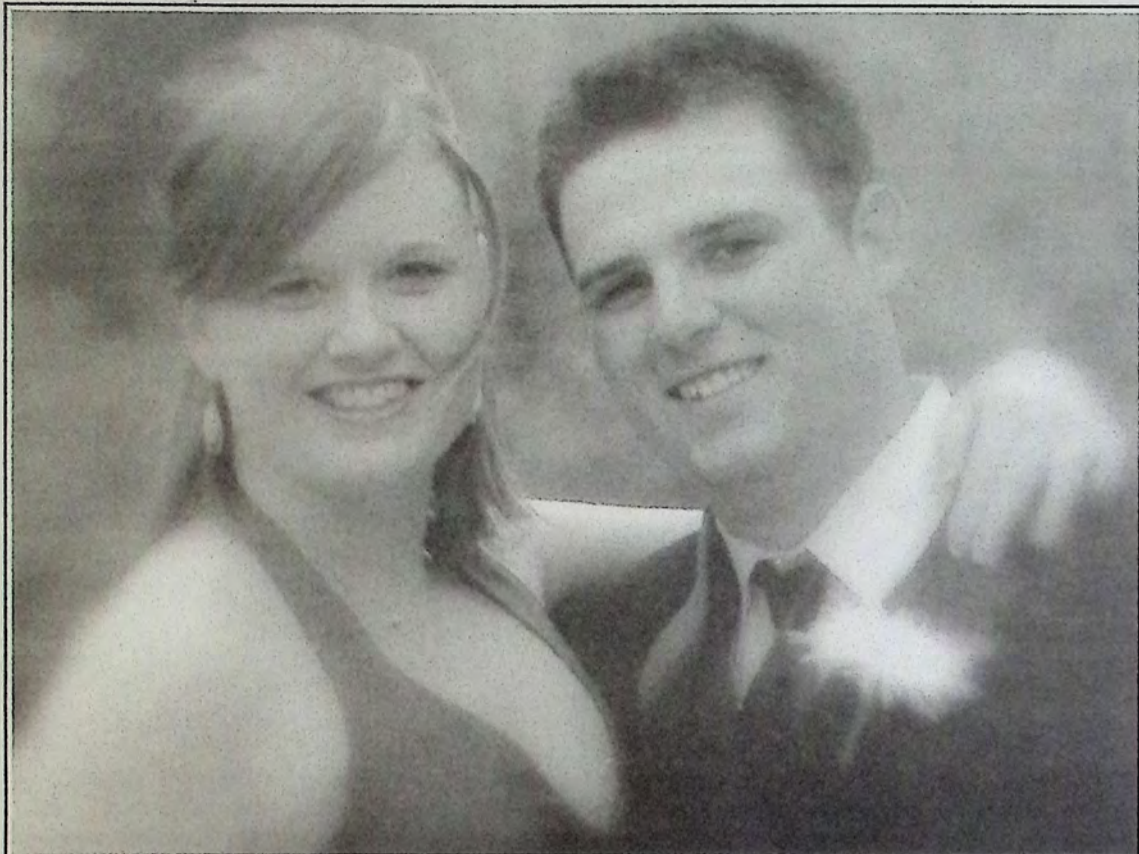

NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND WRITTEN PUBLIC HEARING PROCESS

THE APPLICATION

On December 19, 2007 FortisBC applied to the British Columbia Utilities Commission (Commission) for approval of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (the Application) for the Advanced Metering Infrastructure Project (AMI Project).

The AMI Project consists of replacing all FortisBC meters with remotely-read meters. The new meters are expected to enable innovative rate structures in support of the 2007 Energy Plan. The new meters are also expected to eliminate the use of estimates and increase the accuracy of customer bills.

The total cost of the AMI Project is estimated at \$31.3 million, and is scheduled to commence in 2008 and to be completed by the end of 2010.

INTERVENTIONS

Persons who expect to actively participate in the FortisBC proceeding should register as Intervenors with the Commission in writing, no later than **Friday, February 8, 2008**. Intervenors are requested to identify their interest in the Application. Intervenors will each receive a copy of the Application and all correspondence and filed documentation in accordance with the Commission's Document Filing Protocols.

Persons not expecting to actively participate, but who have an interest in the proceeding, should register as Interested Parties with the Commission, in writing, by the same date. Interested Parties will receive a copy of the Executive Summary in the Application and the Commission's Decision when issued.

All submissions and/or correspondence received from active participants or the general public relating to the Application will be placed on the public record and posted to the Commission's web site at www.bcuc.com.

The Commission Panel in a proceeding may award costs for participation, pursuant to the Participant Assistance/Cost Award Guidelines, under Section 118 of the Act. The Guidelines are available at www.bcuc.com/Guidelines.aspx. Participants intending to apply for participant assistance must file a budget by **Thursday, February 14, 2008**.

Goldcliff releases more good news

Leonard W. Saleken, Chairman of Goldcliff Resource Corporation (GCN.TSX-V), reports that the company has confirmed the bonanza gold grades by metallic assay at the company's 100%-owned Panorama Ridge property near Hedley.

The high-grade gold values have been re-assayed by metallic methods and confirm that the bonanza gold grades are not subject to a gold nugget effect. The metallic gold assaying has improved the gold grades in the Bonanza Trench to 17,368 gold ounces per short ton over 1.00 metre or 9,210 gold ounces per short ton over 2.50 metres.

The bonanza gold grades are a major discovery on the Panorama Ridge property.

The Bonanza Trench, which was excavated at the south-western portion of the York-Viking zone, has multi-ounce, high-grade gold results.

In the metallic gold assay procedure, the rock sample is two-stage crushed to minus 10 mesh and split to achieve a 250 gram pulp-assay-sub sample is pulverized to a fineness such that approximately 95% will pass through a minus 140 mesh screen.

The 250 gram pulp-assay-sub sample is then screened through a 140 mesh screen. The fraction that passes through the screen is called the undersize. The fraction that does not pass through the screen is called the oversize. The undersize fraction is then weighed and rolled to ensure homogeneity and two 30 gram sub-samples are taken from this fraction and fire assayed for gold.

The plus 140 mesh material (over-

size fraction) is assayed entirely. Each metallic assay requires three fire assay analyses to achieve a result. The resultant fire assay beads are digested with acid and after parting are analyzed on a Perkin-Elmer atomic absorption spectrophotometer using an air-acetylene flame to a detection limit of 0.03 grams per tonne.

The gold values are then calculated back to the original sample weight which provides a net gold value for the rock sample that is based on two minus 140 values and a single plus 140 mesh value. Results are collated by computer and are printed along with accompanying quality control data (repeats and standards).

Though not as rigorous as the metallic, the non-metallic (regular) gold assay procedure follows the same basic steps as the metallic procedure. However, unlike the metallic procedure, which does assay the plus 140 mesh material, the non-metallic procedure does not assay a sample's oversize fraction. Furthermore, the non-metallic procedure does not require three fire assay analyses to achieve a result as does the metallic procedure.

Samples are redone if the quality control standard is outside two standard deviations or if the blank is greater than 0.015 g/t.

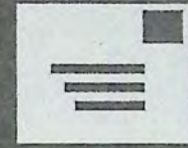
The metallic assay procedures are often used when multi ounce gold grades occur and when samples are suspected to contain coarser gold. As explained above, in addition to producing a coarse (oversize) and fine (undersize) fraction for analyses, the rigorousness of the metallic procedure assures accuracy. In the case of Bonanza Trench samples,

the procedures indicate that while some coarse gold is present it is not disproportionately represented in the overall sample composition. The fine (undersize) fraction contains the majority of the gold and accordingly, the samples are not subject to a gold nugget-effect.

In the Hedley gold camp, the gold mineralization that is associated continued on page 24

Youth are at a loss without financial education

(NC)—With 56.4 million credit cards in circulation and less than half paid off monthly, credit card debt is a growing problem in Canada. New research from the U.K. shows that young people are particularly at risk.

According to London-based Financial Services Authority, 29% of 16 to 24 year olds don't know how to prepare and manage a weekly budget. 67% of university students are in debt and students use credit cards as if they are cash machines with no risk.

Young people frequently don't understand the consequences of not paying off their monthly charges. This shouldn't be surprising, when you think how one quarter of Canadian adults do not have any

savings for the future, and more than half of adults in BC do not have a financial plan.

The question is, how to get them on track? Most experts agree that early education about financial life skills is the key.

Here in British Columbia there are a number of resources available to help get students started right. One award-winning course created by the B.C. Securities Commission has been made available to over 1,200 teachers in all 60 school districts since November 2004.

concepts such as budgeting, savings, investing, and investment fraud.

"This is definitely a unique and fun way for students to learn about finances," says Kathy Weninger, teacher and vice principal at Mount Boucherie Secondary School in Kelowna. "The fictional characters definitely provide an innovative way for students to experience a variety of financial situations they may encounter throughout their lives."

Judge finds no evidence

David Goulet, a Princeton resident, stood trial in Provincial Court in Princeton on January 10. He was charged with breaking and entering the Belaire Restaurant on April 19, 2006.

RCMP witnesses testified that they had found a broken window on the west side of the restaurant when they responded to an alarm. They found blood on the outside window trim and on the inside pane of the broken double-paned window. Spots of blood were found on a restaurant table and coffee mugs located below the window inside the restaurant.

Six blood samples were taken, but only one sample, taken from the outside trim, was analyzed. The blood belonged to Goulet.

The restaurant owner testified that seven bottles of liquor were missing from the restaurant after the break and enter. She had seen Goulet the next day with a towel wrapped around his hand.

One police officer stated that when Goulet was apprehended, he told the officer a friend of his had done the break and enter, and Goulet had tried to stop him.

Goulet said he had grabbed his friend's ankle as the man crawled

through the window, and his friend had kicked back at him, and Goulet's finger was cut. Goulet showed the officer the scar on his finger.

When Goulet took the stand, he testified that he and his friend had been walking down the alley behind the restaurant when Goulet heard the sound of breaking glass and found his friend had disappeared.

Goulet went to check and saw his friend crawling through the window. Goulet repeated what he had told the police officer.

Crown Counsel noted Goulet's

criminal record included previous break and enter incidents and said Goulet should not be believed.

Judge Klinger took time to review the evidence before giving judgement.

He stated that there was no evidence to show Goulet had ever been inside the restaurant. The judge said Crown Counsel had not proven guilt beyond a reasonable doubt, and dismissed the charges.

(Note: Goulet repeatedly named his friend, but that accusation cannot be printed. One police officer said he attempted to locate this individual but with no success.)

Public faced no show

Twenty local citizens, three reporters and two cameramen (CBC and CHBC) were at Princeton's Courthouse on January 10 in anticipation of the first appearance of Fred Netherton, who faces numerous charges of fraud.

The former local funeral director has been the subject of an extensive criminal investigation. In addition to 34 fraud charges, Netherton is charged with neglect-

ing to perform duties related to burial and two charges of interference with a dead body.

Netherton and his lawyer were represented by an agent, so there was no photo opportunities for the cameras, and the non-appearance was a disappointment for those wishing to see justice done right away.

Netherton's next court appearance is scheduled for February 14 in Provincial Court in Princeton.

Local man loses licence

Howard A. Parfitt appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton January 10 to plead guilty to an impaired driving charge. He had been reported to police on May 23, 2007, when he drove his Mercury Marquis into a gate near the Lordco building.

Police officers noted signs of

impairment when they investigated the complaint.

They found open liquor in Parfitt's vehicle. Parfitt failed the breath test.

Judge Klinger ordered Parfitt to pay a \$600 fine with a \$90 victim fine surcharge, and to serve a one year driving prohibition.

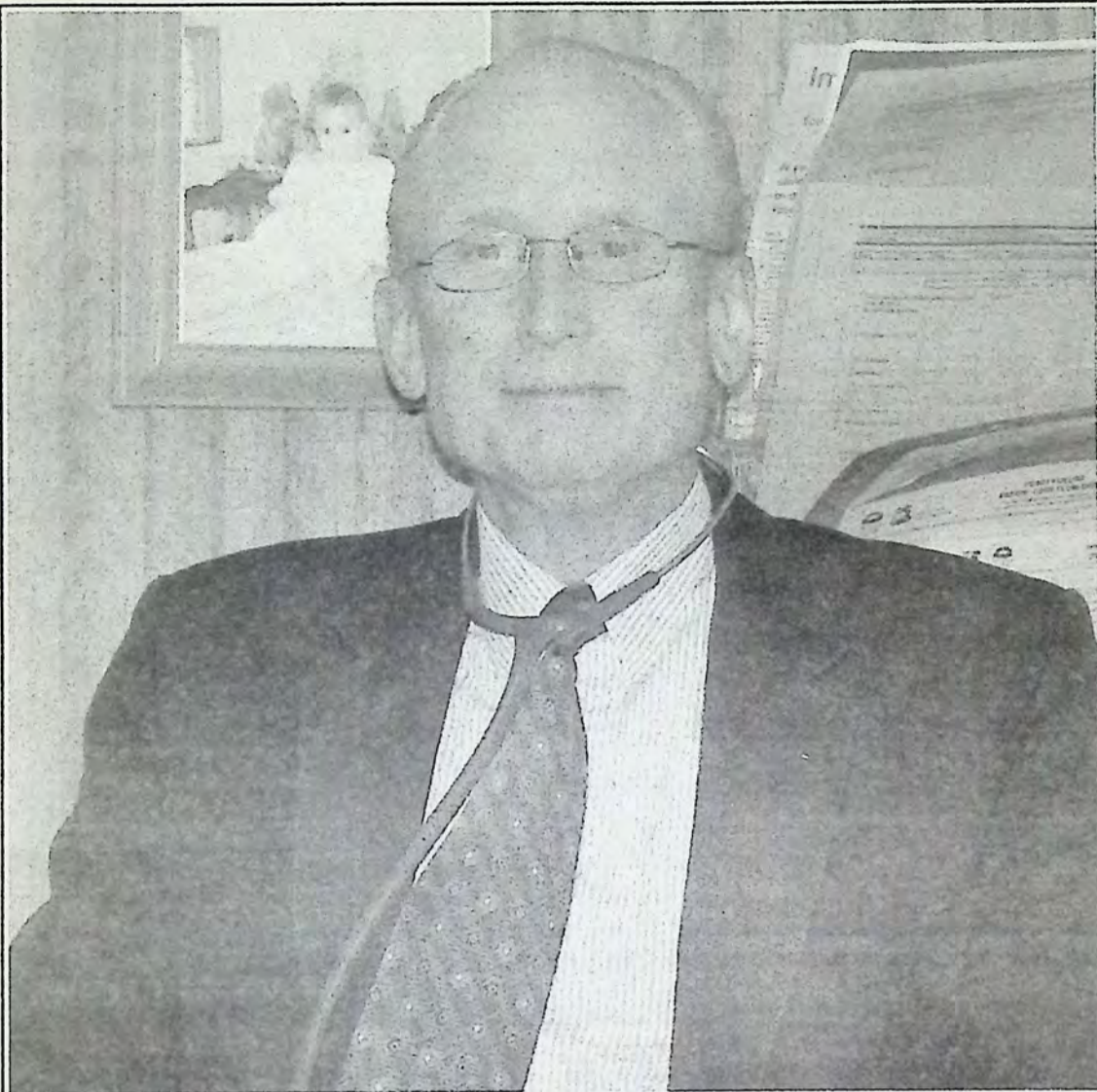

Rodeo Club makes switch back to BCRA

After six years hosting a Canadian Professional Rodeo Association sponsored event, Princeton Rodeo Club decided at their January 11th regular meeting to switch back to the amateur ranks of the British Columbia Rodeo Association.

The advantages to the change are many. The BCRA event is far cheaper to operate than the professional CPRA event and would also allow for local entries, which would mean some of the prize money presented, would stay locally.

The BCRA requires eight mandatory events: Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc, Bull Riding, Tie-Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Breakaway Roping, Ladies Barrel Racing and Team Roping. In addition, two junior events are required including Junior Steer Riding and Junior Barrel Racing. There are also a number of optional minor events that can be included during a BCRA-sanctioned rodeo. Another plus is that the minimum purse required is \$300.00 per event.

Rodeo Club member Bob Lind summed it up best when comparing the attraction of big name rodeo riders to lesser known riders at the Princeton Rodeo by saying, "People don't come here because there's a (professional) rodeo, they come because there's something going on."

Lind added that the only spectators who would notice a difference in talent would be those considered 'real rodeo fans' that follow the

sport and attend many rodeos in a season.

"I think with the BCRA our entries will go up and we'll still have a good rodeo," added Rodeo Club President Mike Theal.

Princeton Rodeo Club went from the BCRA to CPRA six years ago for what was originally a 5-year experiment with hopes of the event getting bigger and better each year. As it turns out, after half a dozen CPRA rodeos, the Club determined they aren't going to attract any more spectators than they have been over the years and switching back to the BCRA could cut loses.

"As long as we keep going and using our facility, we have to do something here," Lind stated.

Vice President Ken Crompton made the motion to go back to the BCRA. Local bull rider and Club member Brian Rutherford seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

President Mike Theal said the dates that have been used by Princeton Rodeo Club were avail-

able in the BCRA schedule. Following a discussion on dates, a motion was made by Club member George Elliott to stay with the dates making this years rodeo fall on Saturday and Sunday, May 10th and 11th. Jack Thomas seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

The financial statements show the CPRA event cost the Club more than it made. The income/expense sheet dated for the period of November 15, 2006 to November 19, 2007 shows Rodeo Club revenues totaling \$67,903.53 and expenses totaling \$75,635.00 leaving a loss of \$7,731.47 for the year. Looking at the actual events, the CPRA Rodeo lost \$9,546.93 (revenues of \$50,944.99 and expenses of \$60,491.92) while the Bull-A-Rama made \$162.83 (revenues of \$13,357.95 and expenses of \$13,195.12). The Club has a bank balance of close to \$11,000.

The next meeting of Princeton Rodeo Club is set for Friday, February 22nd.

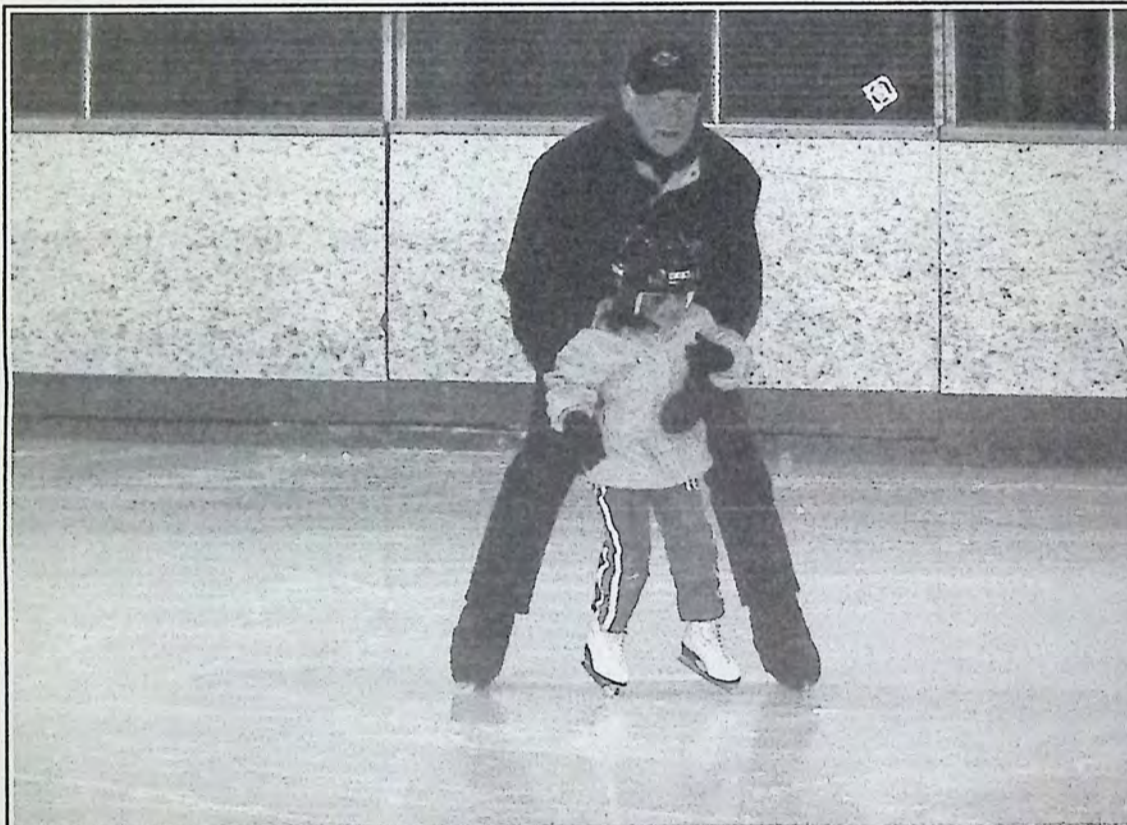

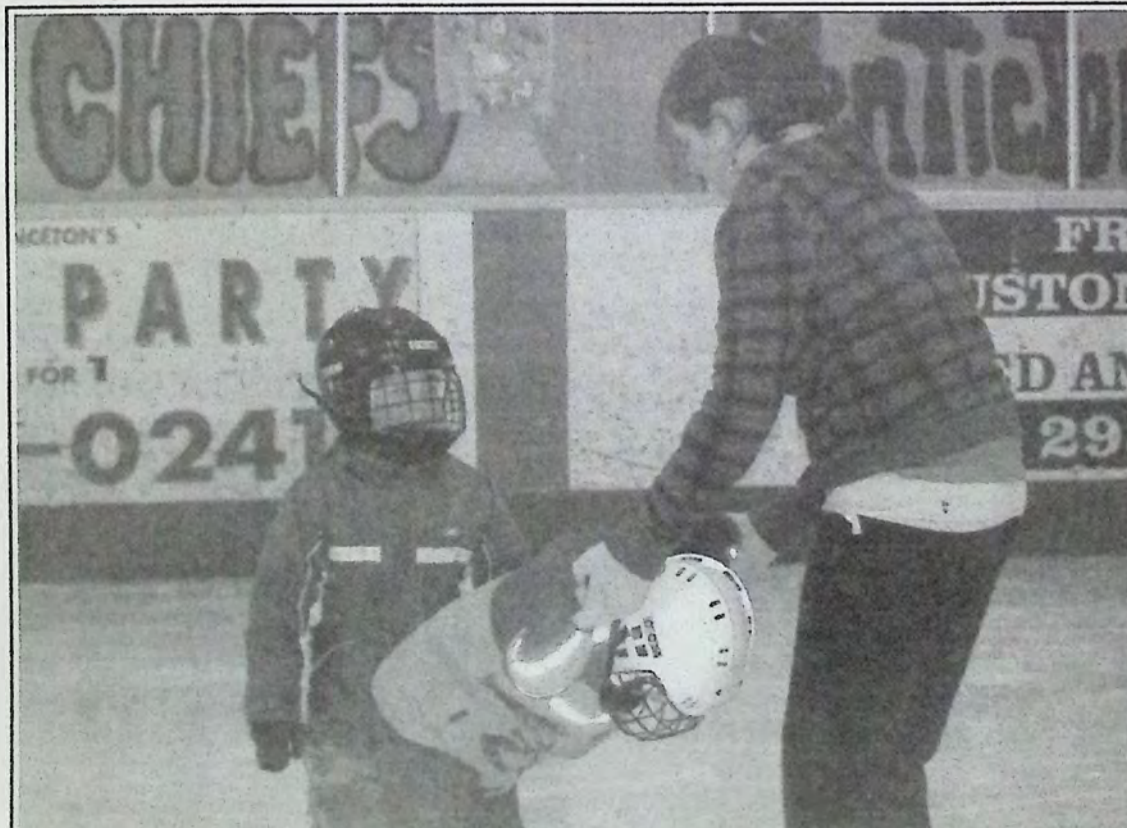

Princeton Skating Club action from last week. We dropped in to see some of the youngest members of the group go through their paces at Princeton Arena. *

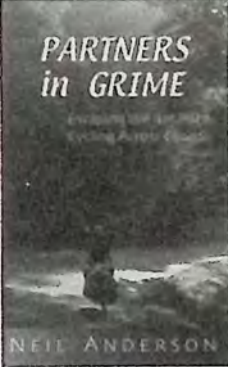

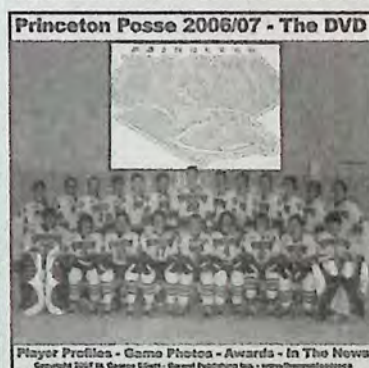

- 6 eggs
- 3/4 cup (175 mL) corn kernels, frozen or canned
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) diced onion
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) diced green or red pepper
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) tomato salsa
- 1/4 tsp (1 mL) each dried basil and oregano
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) butter
- 6 6-inch/15 cm flour or whole wheat tortillas
- 6 tbsp (90 mL) tomato salsa

Directions

Why I believe Iraq is sacred ground

The wars in Iraq are wrong, no matter what excuse we give for it. The previous government of Iraq was not good, either, in my opinion. To me, Iraq should be a land of peace, and a world heritage site. The land Iraq occupies is the cradle of civilization. To wreck it with war is to desecrate what should be sacred ground.

In 1957, Professor Ralph Solecki began excavating a cave in the Kurdish mountain country in northeastern Iraq. What he uncovered was an archaeological site showing people had used it from 100,000 years ago to 13,000 years ago.

It was one of the astonishing discoveries of the past century. Most astonishing was the fact that the deeper he dug, the evidence pointed to increasingly advanced civilization. Usually, the deeper an archaeologist digs, the more primitive the civilization. What happened in Iraq?

The archaeological evidence showed that between 27,000 B.C. and 11,000 B.C. there was a 16,000 year period in which there were no people in the cave. Then, about 11,000 B.C., man occupied the cave again.

This time at a more highly developed cultural level. From that time forward, civilization began in that ancient land.

What we know of that civilization comes from the writings about Sumer (Biblical Shin'ar), a cultured civilization thriving 6,000 years ago. While we see and hear a great deal about Egypt and the pyramids, we see and hear little about Sumer and its accomplishments, even though it pre-dates Egyptian civilization by at least 1,000 years.

The civilization in Sumer had an alphabet and wrote their own history, but they admit this was not the first step in civilization. Sumerian texts refer to writings from "before the Flood". Just how far back could civilization be traced if Iraq were not at war? What could we learn about these advanced people?

You might shrug and make the assumption that their civilization could not have been so advanced. You would be wrong. Sumer had schools. Sumer used petroleum

products. Sumer had agriculture in such a developed state that they produced wheat, oats, millet, rye and flax crops, they raised livestock, and they had orchards of apricots, figs, and cherries. They had mathematics and chemistry. They made bricks, and they had a printing press that made impressions on clay tablets. They made beautiful cloth.

They mined, smelted and worked metals. Sumer had medical practitioners who performed complex surgery. One inscription tells of a surgeon removing "a shadow on a man's eye" which reminds us of surgery to remove cataracts. Another inscription depicts a man being treated with some kind of radiation.

The architects and engineers of Sumer constructed great palaces, docks for ships, and ziggurats, which are stage pyramids something like the pyramids of Mexico. The wheel was used in Sumer and Sumerians built and sailed ships that navigated the deep sea. Sumer had laws, 38 encoded laws, describing right behaviour of Sumer's citizens. They were not allowed to oppress the poor nor to take advantage of widows and orphans. Part of the laws dealt with real estate, another part with inheritance, and of course, laws governed trade to keep people honest.

This is the history of Iraq, and in most ways, the history of our civilization, because the Old Testament of the Bible mirrors the later history of the Middle East. The Bible tells us about Shin'ar, and the cities of Nineveh and Akkad and Erech (Uruk). Abraham came to Israel from Erech or Ur, and he brought with him his wife, Sarah, which meant Princess.

Excavations at Uruk proved the

Sumerians were making fine pottery and using metals 6,000 years ago. In digging down to virgin soil, they found a statue of Enki, the god they believed created man. The strata dated back to 3,800 B.C.

There is a big problem with the civilization of Sumer: it was more advanced in many ways than the civilizations that followed. Why? How did that happen?

The Bible was written 2,000 years after the civilization of Sumer began writing laws, medicine, history and day to day records. In many places in the Old Testament, the words echo the words of Sumerian texts.

This is not odd when we consider where Abraham and Sarah came from. Although we tend to think of this couple as wanderers in the desert, they were undoubtedly educated and may have left written records which were later copied to become part of the Old Testament.

This ancient couple had travelled over a mountainous desert country to found a dynasty and a nation called Israel. The patriarch and matriarch of Israel were Sumerians.

Before Judaism, before Islam, before Hinduism or Buddhism, and before Christianity, there was Sumer.

Today, the civilization of Sumer is buried beneath the soil of Iraq. How much of it will be destroyed? Will we ever learn all there is to learn about that great civilization? So much of what we know, believe and possess began in the land we now call Iraq. It should be sacred ground. There should be a world law saying nobody may fight in Iraq.

We owe it to our own civilization to ensure our history is preserved.

with gold-ore deposits is typically fine grained (undersize). At Panorama Ridge, the fine grained and the coarse grained (oversize) gold is not visible. In order to have these bonanza gold grades, a gold-sulphide compound mineral must be related to the high-grade gold values. Goldcliff is researching the mineralogical possibilities to identify the mineral that is attributed to the high-grade gold values.

The Bonanza Trench, located at the south-western portion of the York-Viking zone, is a major gold discovery.

The high-grade gold discovery at Panorama Ridge is comparable to the high-grade gold mineralization mined underground at the Nickel Plate Mine. The high-grade gold beds occur within an overall mineralized sequence that is up to 200 metres in thickness. The lower grade gold portions of this sequence were successfully mined by Mascot Gold Mines open pit operation.

The geological setting at Panorama Ridge is similar to these previously successful settings. Goldcliff has been targeting the

bulk-tonnage potential of Panorama Ridge with success. The Bonanza Trench gold results confirm the high-grade potential of the property.

Will Hedley school stay open?

To The Editor;

I attended the January 9th meeting of the Okanagan Similkameen Board of Education on the issue of the future of Hedley Elementary School on behalf of CUPE 523, which represents school staff in the district.

Parents, staff and teachers as well as others in the community were very clear at that meeting that the Board needs to find creative ways to keep the school open.

We realize that contemplating a school closure is a most difficult process for the Board and one that is not taken lightly by any of the trustees.

The school is a critical part of this community in transition. And once we lose a school like Hedley, the chances of getting it back are slim

to none.

This is particularly important given that there will be economic development in the region and potentially increased demand for elementary education in the not-too-distant future.

Perhaps that is why the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen directors voted unanimously on January 10th to support efforts to preserve the school.

We know that schools in small towns and villages like Hedley encounter challenges serving the needs of children, but school closures threaten the viability of rural communities, themselves.

Since 2002, more than 130 schools have closed in British Columbia, striking at the heart of dozens of communities. A very

large number of schools have been shut down in rural districts.

For the students themselves, we are very concerned about the negative impacts of the long bus ride. In our presentation to the Board on January 9th, we presented clear research on the negative educational impact of long bus rides on students' learning experience and outcomes. We also offered a good deal of information on the benefits of small classrooms and schools.

The trustees face a tough decision, but the community that they serve is clear about what the right decision is. I strongly encourage parents and others to send a message to the Okanagan Similkameen trustees that Hedley should stay open and to make their voices heard at the January 23rd meeting where a decision is going to be made.

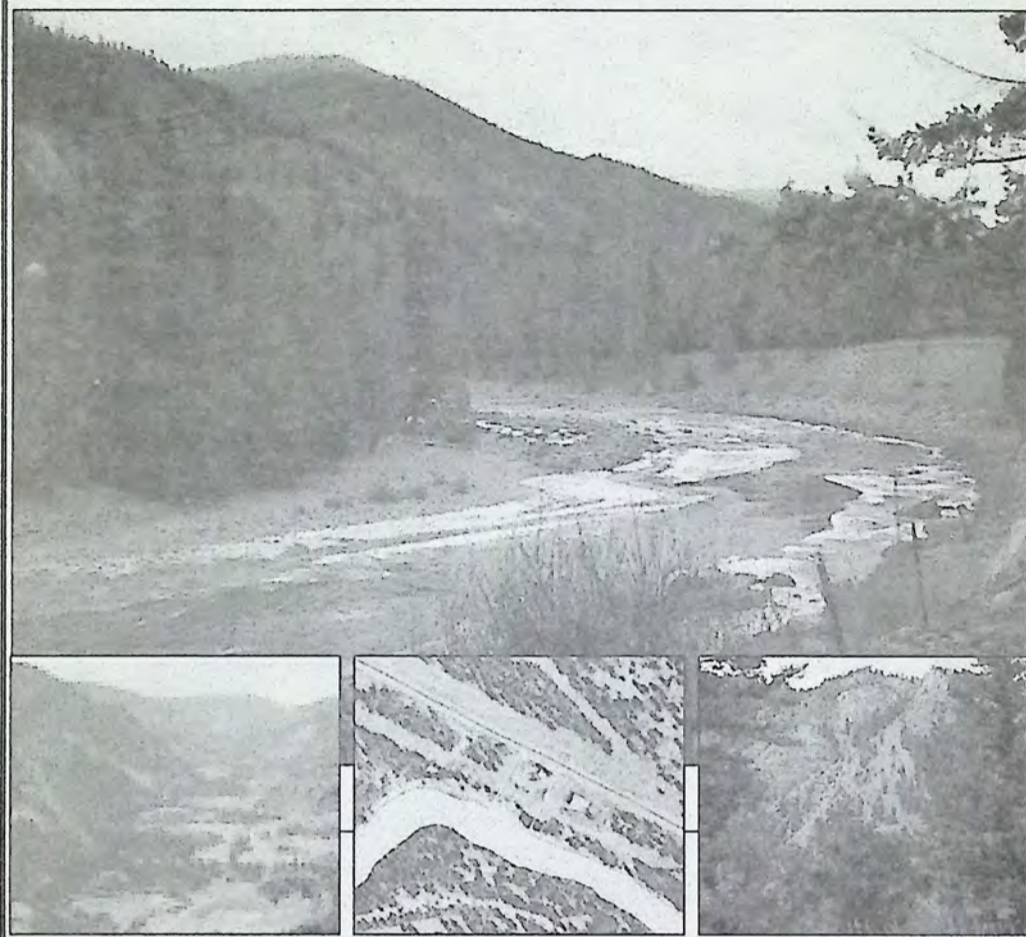
