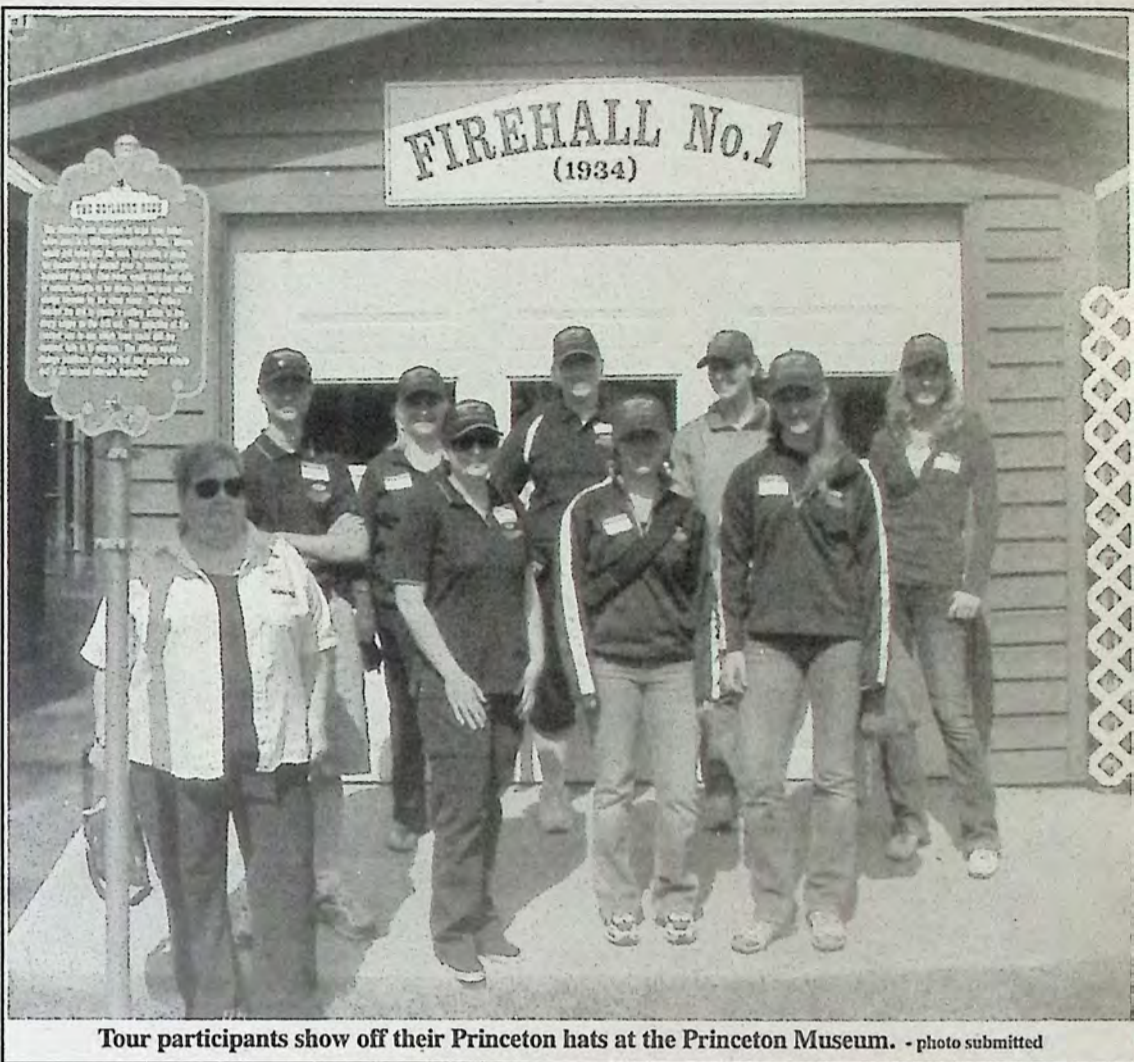

## MP speaks out about Bill C-51

Alex Atamanenko, M.P., BC Southern Interior spoke May 30th in Ottawa about Bill C-51. "The Conservatives Bill C-51 has caused quite an uproar within my riding," said Atamanenko.

"C-51 (An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts) will affect people who use, produce and sell Natural Health Products (NHPs). Producers and consumers of NHPs have expressed a number of serious concerns about this bill that must be addressed before it becomes law," stated the MP.

"My office has received numerous letters and e-mails from concerned constituents about the governments proposed changes to the Food and Drug Act, specifically Natural Health Products."

He further stated that, "NHPs are a fundamental component for many who rely on them for disease prevention and treatment and one that must be preserved. It is imperative that the distinction of natural health products be upheld during the assessment of this bill," said Atamanenko.

"The bottom line is that all of us who use NHPs must continue to

have access to those products that are important to our health and lifestyle. It is not only vital to the consumer but also to our local economy and our rural communities. It could effectively mean that people could lose jobs and businesses could shut down leaving many to suffer the consequences," stated the MP who himself is a consumer of natural health products.

Under the current flawed licensing regulations there is approximately 60 to 70% of single ingredient NHPs failing licensing approval, yet they have been sold in Canada for years. It is predicted that 80 to 90% of multi-ingredient NHPs will soon face the same flawed system with the result that these products will become illegal in Canada.

"We must continue to apply pressure on those who will be addressing this bill at the Standing Committee on Health. It is important that they get the message," concluded Atamanenko.

## Spirit Square honours local veterans

The Town of Princeton will revitalize its commercial district with the development of its own Town Square in Cenotaph Park, Small Business and Revenue Minister Rick Thorpe said Saturday, June 7th, announcing a \$200,000 contribution from the Province's BC Spirit Squares program.

"The upgraded plaza will give Princeton residents and visitors an excellent venue to celebrate this city's past, present and future, while at the same time honouring both the Cenotaph and our veterans," said Thorpe.

"It is also the perfect location for the community to commemorate BC150, the 150th anniversary of the founding of the crown colony of British Columbia."

The Town Square is centrally

located in the downtown core, adjacent to Town Hall, the Royal Canadian Legion, post office, and shopping district and is easily accessible by roads and sidewalks. The venue includes a green space with lawn, trees, picnic tables and the Cenotaph. The funding will provide for improved landscaping and lighting, improved pedestrian safety, washrooms, covered seating and a performance space.

"The town square has historical significance for the residents of Princeton and has served as a gathering place since the community was established," said Mayor Randy McLean.

"The Cenotaph, a prominent feature within the square, will be honoured, respected and enhanced with this initiative. Statistics tell us

that you can judge a community's well-being by its town square. A town square is a long-standing tradition in Canadian communities and the provincial government's recognition of their significance is greatly appreciated. We are excited about BC's 150th anniversary this year and we look forward to celebrating Princeton's 150 anniversary in 2010."

The \$20-million BC Spirit Squares program is helping to create or improve outdoor public meeting/celebration spaces around the province, providing up to a maximum provincial contribution of \$500,000. 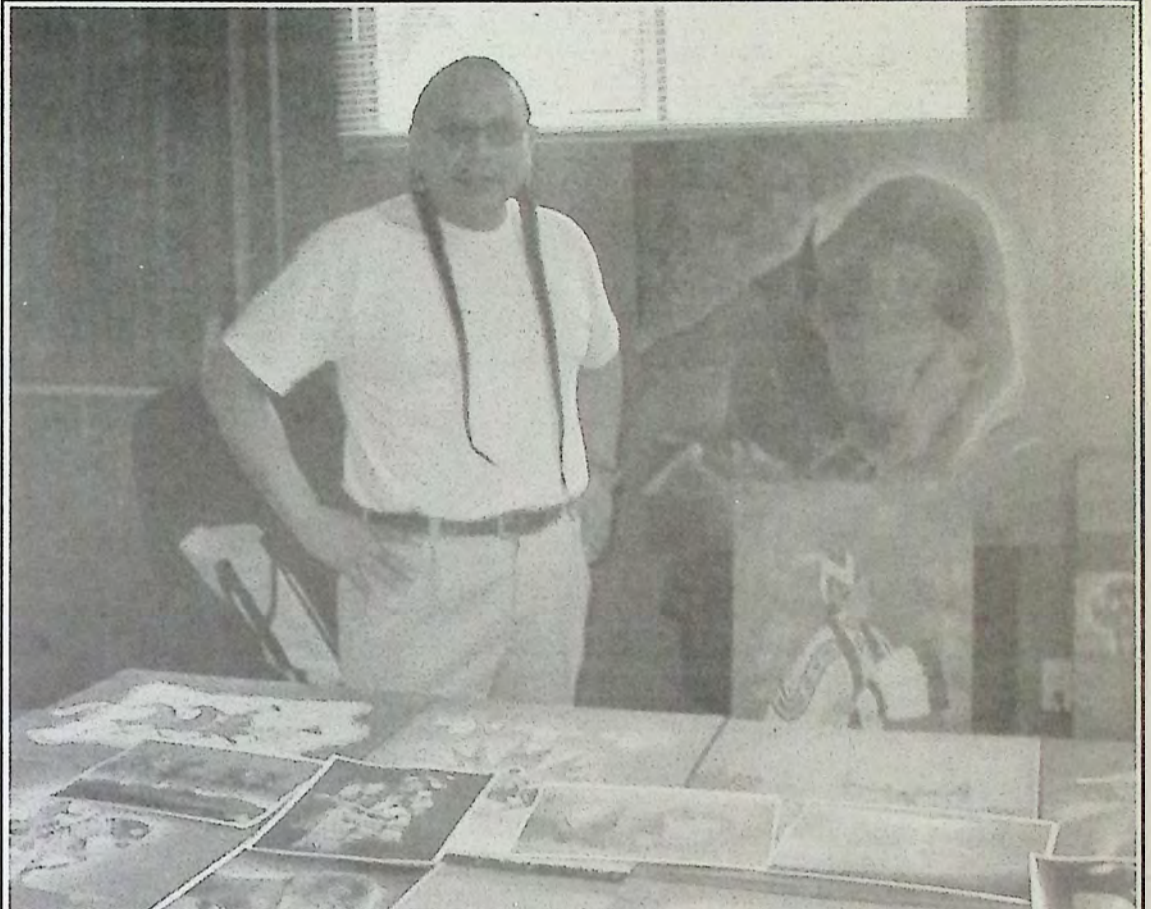

Grade 12 students receive a bursary for their achievement and added recognition for those students on the Honour Roll.

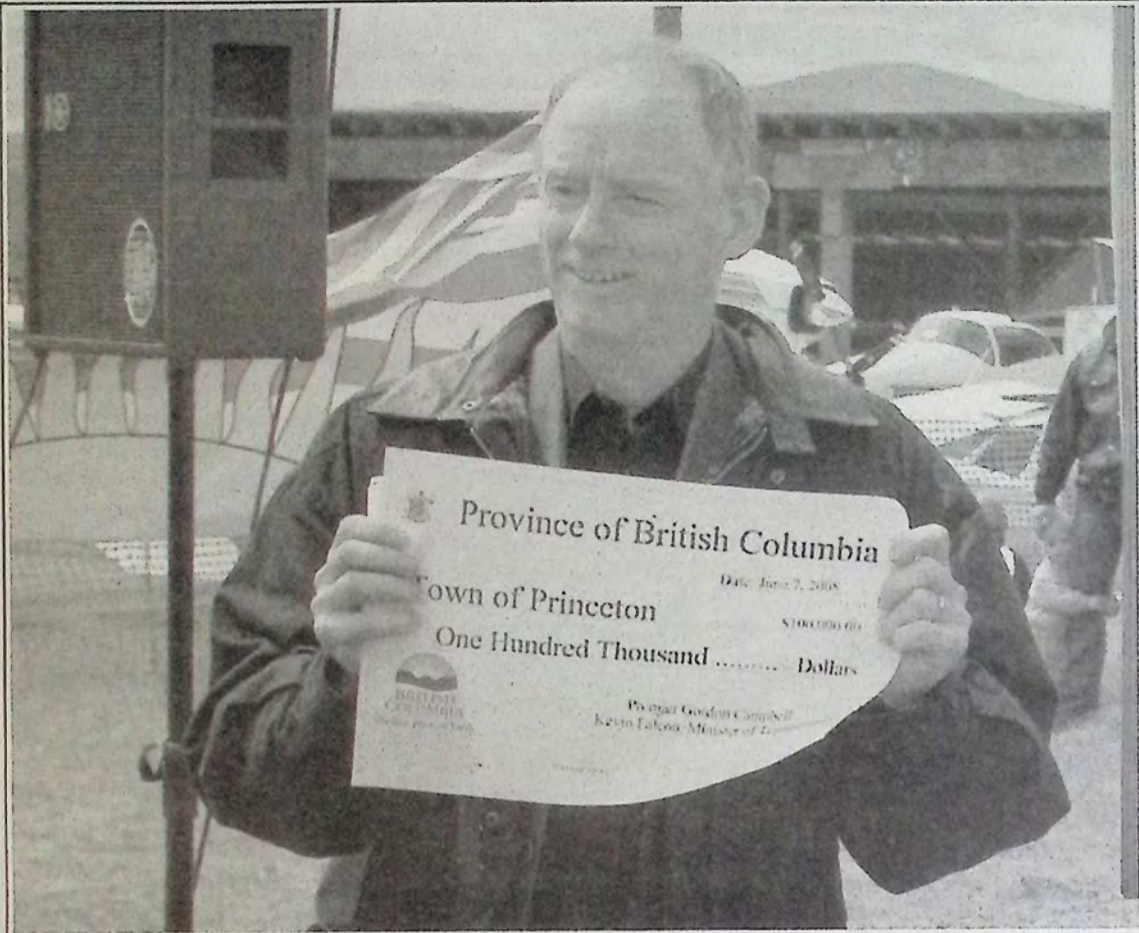

# Airport receives provincial \$\$\$

Provincial funding of up to \$100,000 towards a fuel facility will improve operational service at the Princeton Airport, announced Small Business and Revenue Minister Rick Thorpe on behalf of Transportation Minister Kevin Falcon in a short ceremony during Airport Appreciation Day June 7th.

"Our government is committed to investing in local airports to help create new economic opportunities, and ensure more reliable air services," said Thorpe.

"This project will provide the Princeton Airport with the necessary infrastructure to begin playing a significant economic development role in the area."

Prior to this funding agreement, lack of a fuel facility meant that aircraft flying in to the Princeton Airport had to carry enough fuel to fly out again. By enabling refuelling, the new fuel facility will expand the options available to aviation flying into or out of the Princeton Airport.

"With our strong economy, airport traffic is continuing to grow in British Columbia," said Falcon.

"We are taking appropriate measures to handle that growth, as well as enhance services. This project provides a building block for future development and economic activity for the town and the surrounding region."

The project is undertaken in partnership with the Town of Princeton, which owns and operates the airport. The total project is budgeted for \$295,000, with work expected to

begin immediately and be completed this summer.

"This upgrade to the regional airport fulfills a major component of our economic diversification strategy," said Princeton Mayor Randy McLean.

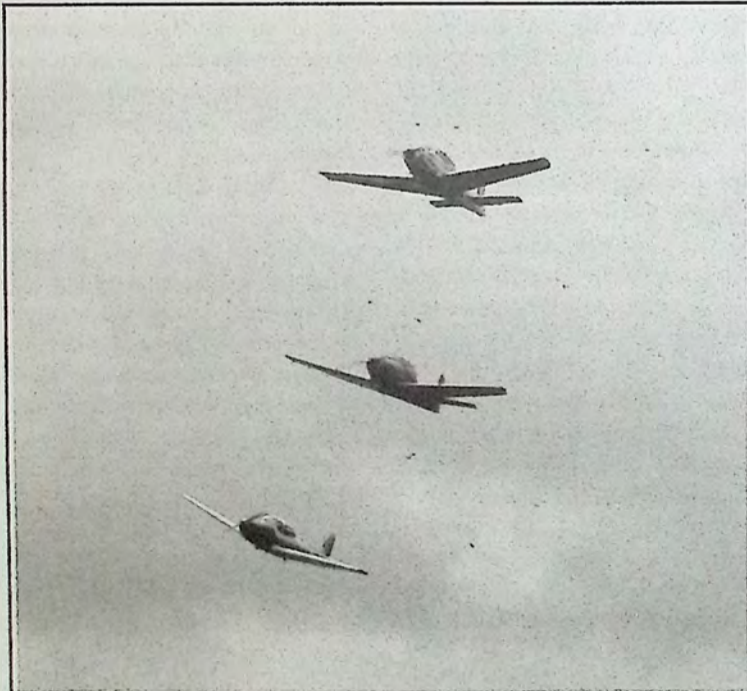
"A fuel facility has been our number one priority and our consultants have consistently told us that a fuel system would ensure that the airport reaches its full potential and becomes an economic catalyst for our region."

The importance of this project was highlighted in letters of support received from the British Columbia Aviation Council, Canadian Helicopters Limited and the avia-

tion programs under the Provincial Emergency Program, the Ministry of Forests and Range and the British Columbia Ambulance Service. In the event of an emergency in this region, it is particularly important to have a new and convenient source of fuel available for aircraft that are providing emergency service.

The funding is provided through the ministry's Transportation Partnerships Program (TPP) which helps communities and regions realize economic growth, boost tourism and create new jobs through contributions to BC's airports and ports. The ministry is reserving \$27-million over the next three years for this program.

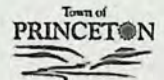

If you aren't lucky enough to have a fashionista in your lineage, the next best thing is thrift stores. ### Why olive oil is a health food

Everybody hears about how good for you extra virgin olive oil is. Here's why: "extra virgin" refers to olive oil means the oil has not been processed by heat or solvents, and has low acid. This makes it the best unsaturated oil (a monosaturate) you can buy, but it is more expensive than other oils. It is worth paying extra in this case, especially for salad dressings. You can buy polyunsaturates, like corn oil, but they have a down side - they seem to promote tumour development. Olive oil has the opposite effect. In countries where olive oil is used, the cancer rate is much lower, particularly for breast cancer. Studies done in four European countries showed areas where olive oil is THE oil of choice, breast cancer incidence was lower by as much as 50 percent.

Olive oil can help relieve the symptoms associated with heartburn and indigestion. Two tablespoons full of pure virgin olive oil mixed with the white of one raw egg, taken several times a day, will do the trick. For severe burns, the same mixture can be applied as an effective burn treatment.

Although this sounds like an expensive cleanser, you can use olive oil to get auto grease off your hands.

Olive oil is good for the skin, and is used in many home remedies, including one for tightening up loose facial skin. This recipe is easy - beat together two egg yolks and 12 cup olive oil. Brush mixture onto area of concern, then after 10 minutes, add beaten egg whites and leave half an hour before washing off the mixture.

Our main use of olive oil is as a salad dressing, particularly on green salads. If you like to make your own salad dressing, start with 2/3 cup of olive oil, 1/4 cup of lemon juice, and mix in 1/2 teaspoon of paprika, one clove of finely chopped garlic, a little bit of rosemary and thyme, and if you like a real Italian flavour, add oregano and Parmesan cheese. Shake well, let it sit at room temperature for an hour before serving. Shake well before pouring onto the salad.

Italian cooks like to mix a small amount of olive oil into pasta as soon as the pasta is drained. This keeps the pasta from forming sticky clumps, and adds flavour. Another favourite Mediterranean idea is serving a dish of olive oil spiced with herbs and garlic to replace butter. Bread is dipped in the mixture, and it tastes very good. No cholesterol in this butter substitute.

Olive oil should be stored in a dark cupboard at room temperature, as it solidifies when kept in the refrigerator.

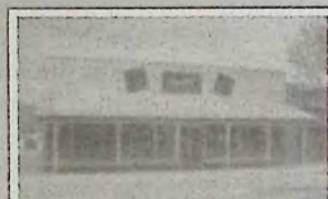

### Lines Of Credit And Interest Deductibility - Part 3

The CRA agreed with the taxpayer's views on the percentage of interest deductible for each month. The CRA's position is that where borrowed money and other money are commingled (for example, in a bank account), the taxpayer can choose the uses of the borrowed money from all of the uses of the money.

In other words, if the taxpayer can demonstrate that the aggregate eligible expenditures (i. e. those incurred for the purpose of earning income from a business or from property) from a commingled account exceed the amount of borrowed money deposited to that account, the CRA will generally agree that the taxpayer has satisfied the test of tracing borrowed funds to an eligible purpose.

In the Agency's view, a similar approach, as in the above example, would apply to borrowings on lines of credit and similar financial instruments, as long as the borrowed funds continued to be put to an eligible use.

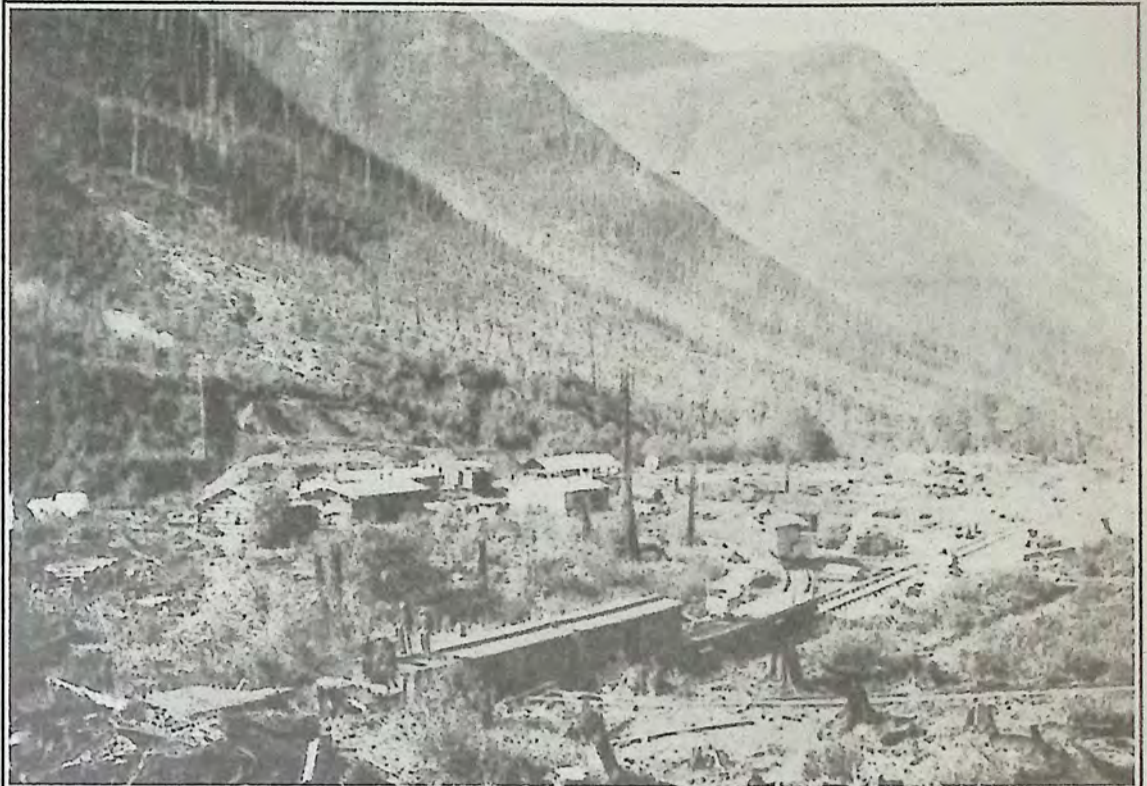
The CRA's position means that, where a line of credit is used for both business and non-business (or, more technically, eligible and non-eligible) purposes, the percentage of interest paid on that line of credit each month which may be deducted for tax purposes will be equal to the proportion that the funds used for eligible purposes is of the outstanding balance. Given the proliferation of lines of credit as a financing source, that will come as welcome news to a substantial number of Canadian taxpayers.

## The Legend of the Fernie Curse

INSIGHTS INTO BC'S HISTORY

by Nick Mills, Princeton Museum & Archives

The first Indian Agent in the Kootenay's, Michael Phillipps, discovered the Crowsnest Pass and many of the adjacent coalfields. Formerly a Hudson's Bay Company employee, Phillipps knew every trail in that area of the province having blazed many of them himself.

When seeking funding which would have allowed him to establish a trail over the Crowsnest Pass, Phillipps was opposed by the district gold commissioner, William Fernie, who believed the Indians when they told him there was no such a pass.

However, the Kootenay Indians had originally migrated across the Rockies when their enemies, the Blackfoot, acquired firearms. It is thought that they knew of the pass,

but made no mention or use of it in order to mislead the plains Indians whom they feared might follow them to this area.

The town of Fernie was established in 1897 with the creation of the Crow's Nest Coal Company, of which William Fernie was one of the Founding Board of Directors. By 1908 the town's population had grown to six thousand and there were six mines in operation close by.

Around 1920 the Boundary copper smelters closed down and the whole area declined and the situation was not helped when in 1926 US railroads stopped using Fernie coal.

According to legend, William Fernie, after whom the town had been named, brought down a curse

upon the Community.

It was delivered by the mother of an Indian maiden whom William Fernie had promised to marry, but failed to do so. To the local people the curse seemed to be a plausible explanation for the continuing disasters that seemed to hit the town. In 1902 a large mine explosion rocked the town of Fernie and two years later four blocks in the business section were burnt to the ground, but the worst disaster happened in 1908 when a fire wiped out most of the community. Between the years of 1902 and 1967, two hundred and sixty four men died in a score of accidents in Fernie's mines.

The curse was finally lifted at a special Indian Ceremony in 1964.

**Need For Retirement Income Is Key To Guaranteed Minimum Withdrawal Benefit Plans**

It's not surprising that many people planning for retirement are concerned about whether they'll have enough income to get them through the remainder of their lives.

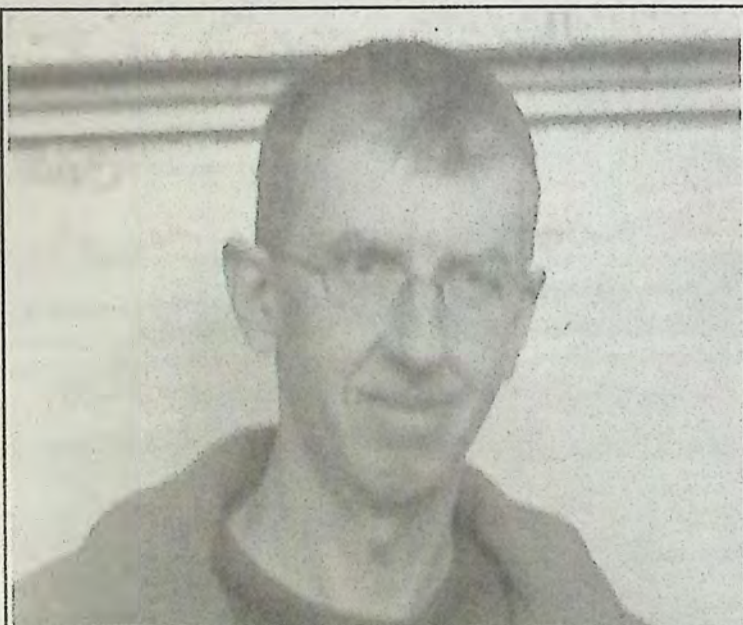

- 1 tsp (5 mL) each lime zest and minced ginger
- pinch ground allspice
- 4 lb (2 kg) parboiled pork back ribs

1. Stir Heinz Chili Sauce with Heinz Tomato Ketchup, pineapple, HP Sauce and brown sugar. Bring to a boil in a saucepan set over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in the green onion, rum, lime zest, ginger and allspice until well combined. Cool slightly.

2. Preheat the grill to medium-high. Toss ribs with half of the sauce mixture; grill, turning and basting often with remaining sauce, for 10 to 15 minutes or until glossy and well marked. Makes 8 servings.

Health-it-Up Twist: For a leaner variation, use this tasty glaze on grilled chicken breasts or pork tenderloin instead of ribs. Tip: For perfectly boiled ribs, cut each rack into 2-bone portions. Place a large pot with 1 sliced lime and enough equal parts of each water and chicken broth to cover ribs. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer, covered, for 45 minutes. Discard lime slices. Cool ribs in cooking broth for 1 hour. Drain well. Grill as directed or wrap tightly and reserve for up to 24 hours in the refrigerator.

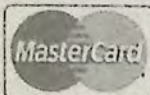

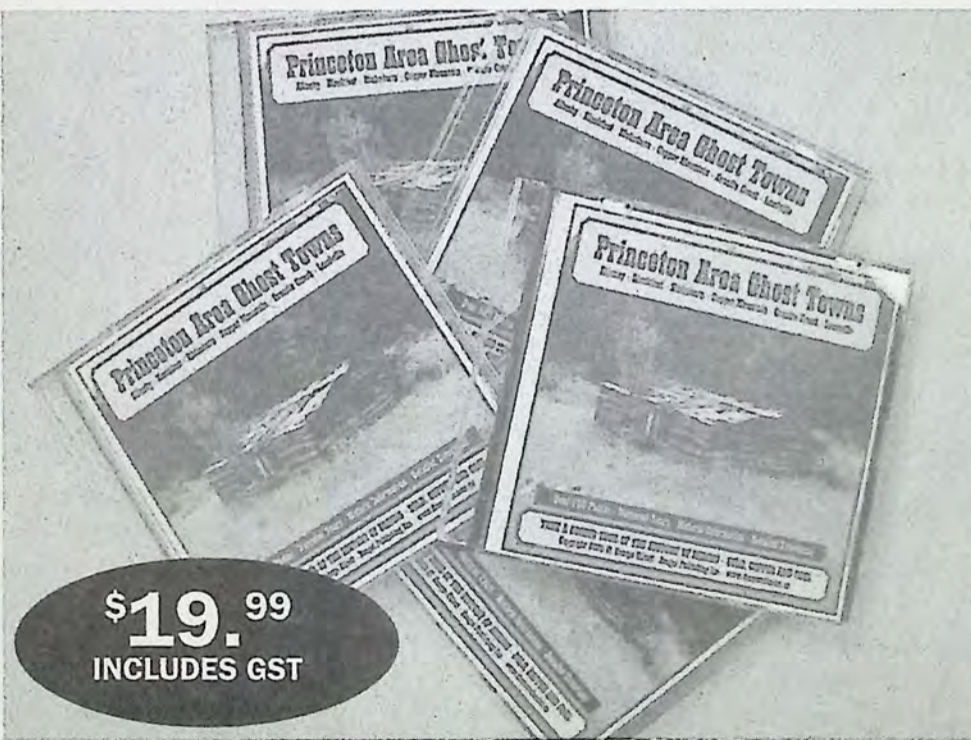

# A message from Petrobank

I've just recently learned that on the evening of May 28, at a public event about coalbed gas (CBG), a chair meant for me was conspicuously empty.

During our last open house in Princeton, we heard legitimate and reasonable questions about water, land use and project specifics. CBG in BC is different and so is Petrobank's approach to this project. We hope our track record speaks for itself and that you accept our commitments.

# Let's praise good fathers

This Sunday is Father's Day. It seems nobody makes as big a fuss over Father's Day as over Mother's Day. It seems Father's Day is more easily forgotten than Mother's Day.

This bothers me, perhaps because I was blessed with a good father, even though I did not realize what a good father he was until I was a parent myself.

My father, like all good fathers, put his children first. I remember him in his old age and what I remember most was his gnarled hands, the result of all those years of operating some kind of equipment. In his early years, those hands had chopped down trees, mined coal and opals, pulled the ropes and cables on ships, paddled dugout canoes along the coast of Vancouver Island.

Those hands had moved levers to change gears on mining machines. Those hands had clutched the reins of our teams of workhorses, had held the horse-drawn plow, had carried irrigation pipes, dug with a spade or iron bar, had driven the tractor, and had saddled or harnessed countless horses.

His hands had carried buckets of water, grain, eggs, milk and whatever fit into a bucket. Those hands had wielded hammers, sledgehammers, saws of all kinds, wrenches of all kinds, and augers, sharpening stones, pitch forks and paint brushes.

Those hands had tucked us into bed, held us as he walked the floor with us when we were sick, lifted us to heights we could not climb on our own, rescued us from all sorts of danger, and occasionally, swatted us on our behinds.

Those gnarled hands had planted fields of crops, had chopped heads of chickens, had held the rifle to hunt for food or slaughter our own animals on the farm, fished for food, and milked cows. Those hands had fed us, kept us safe, ensured our survival.

Those hands had written his memories of life in a covered wagon, and he wrote a book of poetry. Those hands helped clean up campgrounds and other projects of the Fish and Game Club.

My father's gnarled old hands told the story of his life. It was a life of hard work. From the time he was 25 years old until he was 76 years old, he had a child to support at home.

Granted, he had two wives and six children. He worked at a job from the time he was 15 years old until he was 73. He worked at anything he could do and any job he could be hired on. He worked in fields, on horseback, in mines, on ships, in a foundry, in the forest, at a sawmill, building the Hope-Princeton Highway and telephone lines, in a power plant and in our local brewery. He worked as a painter and as a carpenter, as a farmer and as a steam engineer.

He worked through two world wars and the Great Depression, through the flood of 1948 which devastated our farm, and through the avian flu that devastated our farm income.

We never went hungry, nor without anything we really needed. We may not have had a lot of money, but he provided well for us. That was the bottom line of what he did, but he did more.

He taught us the value of working hard and planning ahead. He taught us many of his skills, too. I am a gardener because he showed me how to do it. I know the rudiments of carpentry and painting houses because he taught me those skills. I know how to use a lot of tools because he showed me how.

He taught us how to swim, to play ball, to ride a horse, and drive a tractor.

My father taught his children to be honest, to be good citizens, to

care about community, which included caring about politicians who represented us. He loved to sing, and taught us many old songs.

He had a great sense of humour, and taught us to laugh at a lot of things. He loved hockey, and we learned to listen to Hockey Night in Canada on our battery operated radio. He loved to read, and he wanted us to be good readers. He loved sports, and encouraged us to join sports teams and to do any sport.

He loved to debate, had strong opinions about everything, and expected us to think for ourselves and stand up for our own point of view.

Most of all, he taught us to be responsible for our own lives, to take hold and do what needed to be done.

This is what good fathers do.

I did not always agree with my father, and often argued with him, but I respected him and I appreciated how hard he worked to make sure we had what we needed.

Good fathers deserve to be recognized and appreciated every day, but especially on Father's Day. Good fathers make their children strong by being there, teaching them to tough it out when the going gets rough, and to be people worth honouring.

My father died a long time ago, and I miss him, but there are times when I hear his words advising me or laughing with or at me. He is part of who I am, and I honour his memory.

Good fathers are all around us, and while they are still with us, they need to be loved and shown that the work they have done and the efforts they have made are appreciated. Their labours are truly of love, of devotion to their families. They are pillars of our society. They deserve to be honoured.

# Ministry issues snowpack and water supply update

After an unseasonably cold April and cool temperatures in early May, snowmelt accelerated over the Victoria Day weekend.

Five days of above normal temperatures beginning May 16th triggered rapid snowmelt and produced rapidly rising water levels in rivers throughout British Columbia.

High water levels and flooding occurred on many rivers and streams, particularly in the south and central Interior, in the Mt. Currie-Pemberton area. May's normal-to-above-normal temperatures and light rains have kept river levels high.

#### Synopsis:

Following two weeks of melt, all basin snow water indices have now declined. Snow water indices in a number of river basins are near normal for June 1 (South Thompson, Columbia, Kootenay, South Coast).

Other basins remain above normal (Upper Fraser, North Thompson, Peace, Vancouver Island) while some are below normal (Nechako, Mid-Fraser, Okanagan, Similkameen, Skeena/Nass). All areas have experienced substantial snowmelt, runoff and reduced snowpacks from their peak levels of three weeks ago.

#### Current Snowpack:

Present snow conditions are highly variable. In general, low elevation snow has melted, and mid-elevation snow is either largely depleted or entirely melted. Substantial high-elevation snow remains, and will continue to melt through June and into July. In some basins (Okanagan, Similkameen, Nicola, Mid-Fraser) high elevation

snow is all that remains.

In others (Upper Fraser, Lower Fraser, Peace, West Kootenay, and Vancouver Island) significant mid- and high-elevation snow remains.

High river levels and flooding occurred during late May, principally in the south and central Interior, but also in Mt. Currie-Pemberton area, the Fraser River at Prince George and elsewhere. For Prince George, the flooding this spring was their third flooding in the past 12 months.

The Fraser River through the Lower Mainland reached a peak on May 26th, with a discharge near 10,200 cubic metres per second at Hope, and a water level of 5.75 metres at Mission. Since then, the Fraser has been receding slowly. Given the current snow conditions, there is little likelihood it will rise enough to surpass the late May peak.

The Skeena, Nass and Bulkley rivers have also receded substantially from their late May peaks, and are unlikely to threaten those peaks again this spring.

The Thompson River at Kamloops is expected to peak this week. Weather forecasts from now until mid-June are favourable with respect to flood risk. Periods of only light and/or scattered rain are expected throughout the Interior. Major rivers (Fraser, Skeena, Nass, etc.) should continue to recede dur-

ing next week and into mid-June.

#### Water Supply Outlook:

The spring 2008 snow conditions provide a favourable outlook for summer water supply conditions for most of the province, for community water supply, instream flows, groundwater and aquifers. Near normal or slightly above normal volumes are expected in major rivers as the snow melts from now to July.

The Peace River basin, along with rivers on Vancouver Island and other coastal areas, will likely experience above normal spring and summer volumes.

The forecast for the Okanagan and Similkameen continues to be for below normal spring and summer runoff (85 to 90 percent). These arid basins could experience water supply challenges this year, particularly if late spring and summer

weather becomes hot and dry.

Environment Minister Barry Penner released Living Water Smart: A Plan for Water Sustainability on June 3rd. The Plan highlights the need for new water conservation measures to ensure adequate supplies of fresh water for British Columbia's future. 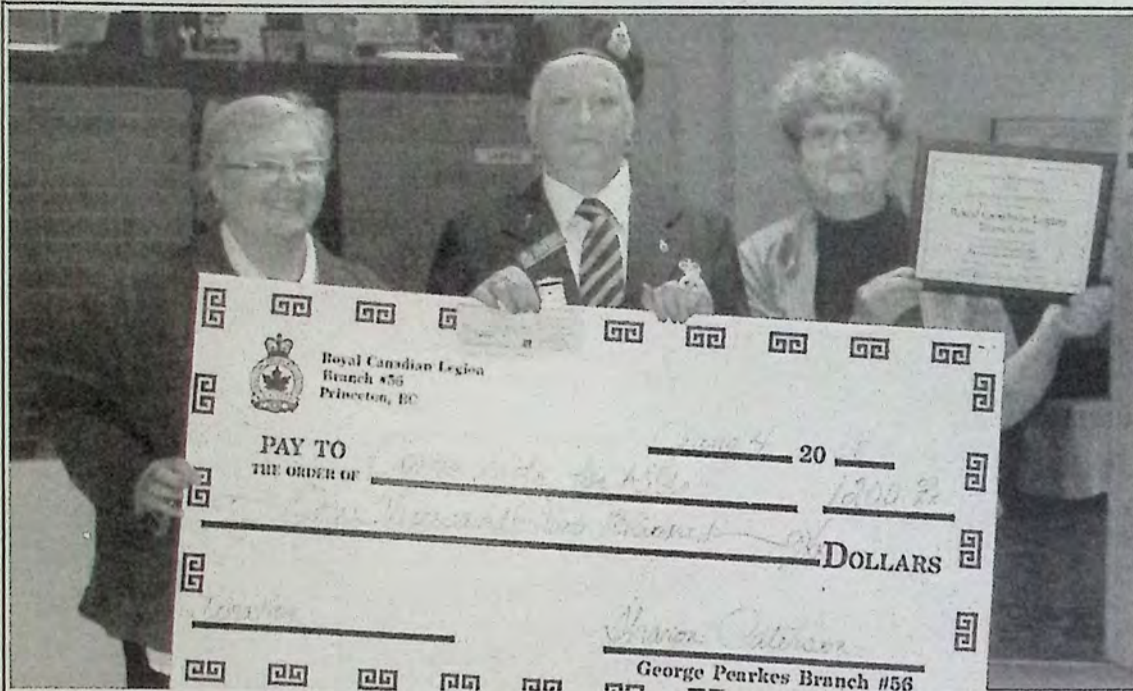

**NAFTA - A Blow To Canadian Sovereignty**

The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into effect January 1st 1994. The main argument supporting NAFTA during its creation was the foreseen increase in trade that it would bring. Ten years after its implementation, research has shown that trade has increased dramatically among the three nations. During the first ten years of its existence total trade between the United States and Canada increased by 110.1%, yet total trade between the United States and non-NAFTA partners increased 123.8% in the same period. Therefore, it can be argued that trade did not necessarily increase because of NAFTA.

On NAFTA's 10th anniversary (2004), researchers based in all three countries assessed the agreement's consequences and found them to be overwhelmingly negative. Despite some continued support for NAFTA, polls in Canada show that citizens see their own country as the loser in NAFTA, and see the United States as the winner. The impact of NAFTA on most of the people in all three countries has been devastating. The agreement has destroyed more skilled jobs than it has created and has depressed wages on all levels. Socially, it has worsened poverty and inequality, and eroded social programs. Moreover, many of the jobs created during the NAFTA period have been part-time, insecure jobs with fewer benefits, particularly for women.

The experience of Canadian farmers demonstrates that more trade does not necessarily translate into more prosperity. According to the National Farmers Union, even though since 1988 agriculture exports have almost tripled, farmers net income (adjusted for inflation) has fallen by 24%. Furthermore, during that same period, farm debt has doubled, and 16% of Canadian farms have been lost.

Before NAFTA, in British Columbia we had in-season tariffs that meant that

our fruit and vegetable producers could grow and sell their crops without fear that cheap subsidized American produce would flood the markets. As an example, before NAFTA we had approximately 2,000 onion producers while now we have only a handful.

Two other issues which greatly hinder Canada's sovereignty are NAFTA's Chapter 11 and the proportional sharing and commodity clauses. Chapter 11 allows private companies to sue governments whose policies and regulations are alleged to hurt their opportunities to do business here.

The Canadian Government tried to ban the import of a gasoline additive, Methylcyclopentadienyl Manganese Tricarbonyl (MMT) in Canada. Ethyl Corporation sued and we wound up paying them \$13 Million of tax payers money for damages. Today, there are a number of other pending corporate law suits that have the potential of further draining our government coffers.

It is ironic that although Canada exports over 60% of its oil to the US, Atlantic Canada's, Quebec's and Ontario's needs are met by importing 45% from Algeria, Saudi Arabia and Iraq and 37% from Norway and Britain. Canada could be self-sufficient in oil and gas, however, our export rules under NAFTA ensure that we continue to provide a cheap flow of fuel to the South. If we want to cut back on exports, the agreement states that proportionally we have to cut back our domestic consumption.

Of the three NAFTA countries, Canada is the only one that does not have a National Energy Policy. Before free trade, Canada had a National Energy Board that ensured that we had a 25 year supply of non-renewable energy prior to exporting our oil and gas. Now, we do not even have a 90 day energy reserve and yet, we continue to supply the U.S. with cheap energy. I do not believe it is an understatement to say that free trade has changed

our way of life. In the 1990s the federal government, bowing to pressure under NAFTA to become competitive, made drastic changes to EI eligibility, introduced sever cutbacks to health care and social programs and repealed the Canada Assistance Plan. Since 1980, the medium salary in B.C. has fallen by 11.3%. Clearly something is not right. Major corporations and multinationals are making huge profits while, for the majority of Canadians, life has become more difficult. It is up to all of us to get our country back on track.
