What will you do in the Fall Fair?

The annual Fall Fair is just a month away, and although it offers free rides on the monster truck, lawnmower races, mini chuckwagon races, the Apaloosa Band and "Elvis", there is another side to the fair that involves everybody. This is the side of the fair in which people enter their products, from flowers, to home canning, vegetables, poultry, woodworking and needlework.

Guidebooks, called exhibitor's booklets, are available at Pharmasave and the Tourist Information Centre.

Home canning

Preserving food for winter is a skill becoming more popular not only for the savings and the pleasure of being able to open a jar when the notion strikes, but because you know exactly what went into the jar. Jelly, jam, preserves, pickles, relish - there is a category for nearly everything you can think of. If it is not listed in the exhibitor's booklet, you can still enter it under "other". Remember: each jar must be a standard canning jar with a snap sealer lid and clean continued on Page 3

The Official Community Plan

The plan begins with an overview of the community. The population served decreased slightly in 2001, and gained slightly by 2006.

We are aging

The biggest change was in the age of the townspeople. There was a 25 percent decline in children aged 0 to 14, and a 17 percent drop in youth aged 15 to 24. The biggest decline was a 40 percent drop in the number of people aged 25 to 44. An 18 percent increase occurred in the number of people aged 45 to 64, and a huge gain, 38 percent, in those over age 64.

Mine to reopen in '10

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (CMMC or the Company) announced July 28th results of a positive independent Feasibility Study Report (Feasibility Study) on the Company's 100% owned Copper Mountain project located near Princeton.

The Feasibility Study was prepared by Hatch Ltd. (Hatch), together with other consultants, and describes the scope, design features and economic viability of bringing back into production a conventional open pit mine with a 35,000 tonnes per day mill. The mine, a former producer, is designed to produce approximately 100 million pounds of copper per year in a copper concentrate with gold and silver credits. The capital cost is estimated at \$402 million

(excluding a \$35.4 million contingency allocation) with production scheduled to commence at the end of 2010. The project would create 274 permanent jobs over an initial 15 year mine life.

The Feasibility Study considered a Base Case that used the London Metal Exchange (LME) forward pricing as of June 18, 2008 for the first three years and then a long term copper price of US\$1.80 for the balance of the mine life. Gold and silver long term pricing used was US\$675/oz and US\$12/oz respectively. All amounts are in Canadian funds unless otherwise stated.

John O'Rourke, Chief Executive
Officer of Copper Mountain stated:

"This positive Feasibility Study is a material step forward for the Company in the restart of this past copper and precious metals producer. The Feasibility Study describes the development and operations plan that successfully combines long-term commercial viability with responsible environmental stewardship. The production start at the end of 2010 meets our initial target and equipment deliveries have been arranged to match this schedule. We are pleased with the Feasibility Study results and are particularly encouraged by the 2008 exploration drill results which are expected to further improve the mine plan. The company plans to continue an aggressive drilling program to increase the grade and tonnage within the Super Pit while continuing to test the Titan 24 geophysical targets for new discoveries."

Mineral Resource and Mineral Reserve

The Copper Mountain copper-gold-silver porphyry deposits contain a Measured and Indicated Mineral Resource of 260.2 million tons averaging 0.357% Cu containing 1.8 billion pounds copper. The Feasibility Study is based on this resource which was prepared by Giroux Consultants Limited and includes drill data up to December 20, 2007. The NI 43-101 compliant Mineral Resource estimate used data from approximately 450,000 meters of drilling in more than 5,000 drill holes. The Company employs a system of quality control for drill results which includes the use of blanks, certified reference material (standards) and check assaying. Core is logged on site and split with a diamond saw. Samples are shipped to Pioneer Laboratories for geochemical analysis of copper with all values of greater than 1,000 ppm copper being re-analyzed by assay methods for copper, gold and silver. The drilling program is being supervised by Peter Holbek, M.Sc., P.Geo., a qualified person as defined by National Policy

Instrument 43-101.

Capital Cost

The capital cost is estimated at \$437.4 million, including a \$35.4 million contingency, in June 2008 Canadian dollars with no allowance for price escalation or fluctuations in currency exchange rates and has been estimated with an intended level of accuracy of +/- 15%. All cost estimates and other financial projections referenced in this Press Release are subject to important qualifications, assumptions and exclusions, all of which are detailed in the Feasibility Study. Therefore, in order to fully understand the estimates and projections set out above, the Feasibility Study should be read in its entirety.

Production

The open pit mine design is based on processing 35,000 tonnes per day of mill feed and producing a copper concentrate containing gold and silver. The initial five year average grade of mill feed is 0.39% Cu (0.43% Cu Equivalent) resulting in an average annual production of 96 million pounds copper for the same period. The lower grade material (below 0.25% Cu) will be stockpiled for processing towards the end of the mine life. The average waste to ore ratio for the life of mine is 1.8:1. Metallurgical testing indicates a recovery of 89.2 percent for copper, 65 percent for gold, and 49 percent for silver. Metallurgical test results were comparable to the operating results reported from prior operations.

The resource model that formed the basis for the Feasibility Study is based on drill data up to December 20, 2007. The 2008 drill data will be applied to the resource model and mine plan as available with the objective of maximizing the copper production in the first five years.

Operating Costs

The Life of Mine (LOM) mine operating cost is estimated at \$7.31 per tonne of ore milled.

Operating costs have been calculated based on June 2008 dollars and the labour costs used are in the upper quartile of wages paid at B.C. mines. Operating costs are estimated at US \$1.28/lb Cu (net of gold and silver credits) in years 1 to 5, US \$1.13/lb Cu (net of gold and silver credits) in years 6 to 10, and US \$1.27/lb Cu average (net of gold and silver credits) for the life of mine.

Economics:

Economic modeling results are based on commodity prices in U.S. dollars with all other values in Canadian dollars. The long-term US/Canadian exchange rate used in the Feasibility Study was 0.95. The Base Case metal prices used are those from the June 18, 2008 London Metal Exchange forward prices to 2013 (2011 US \$3.18/lb Cu, 2012 US \$3.06/lb Cu, 2013-US\$2.94/lb Cu) and US \$1.80 per pound copper for the balance of the fifteen year mine life.

Feasibility Study

Recommendations:

In the Feasibility Study Report Hatch advises CMMC that in Hatch's opinion, the Project is technically feasible and the Feasibility Study provides sufficient basis for CMMC to refer the Project to its Board of Directors to make a decision respecting the further development and construction of the Project. Infill drilling is recommended within the ultimate pit to upgrade inferred resources that are currently scheduled as waste as per NI 43-101 regulations. The NI 43-101 Technical Report for the Copper Mountain Feasibility Study Report will be filed on SEDAR with 45 days of the date of this news release.

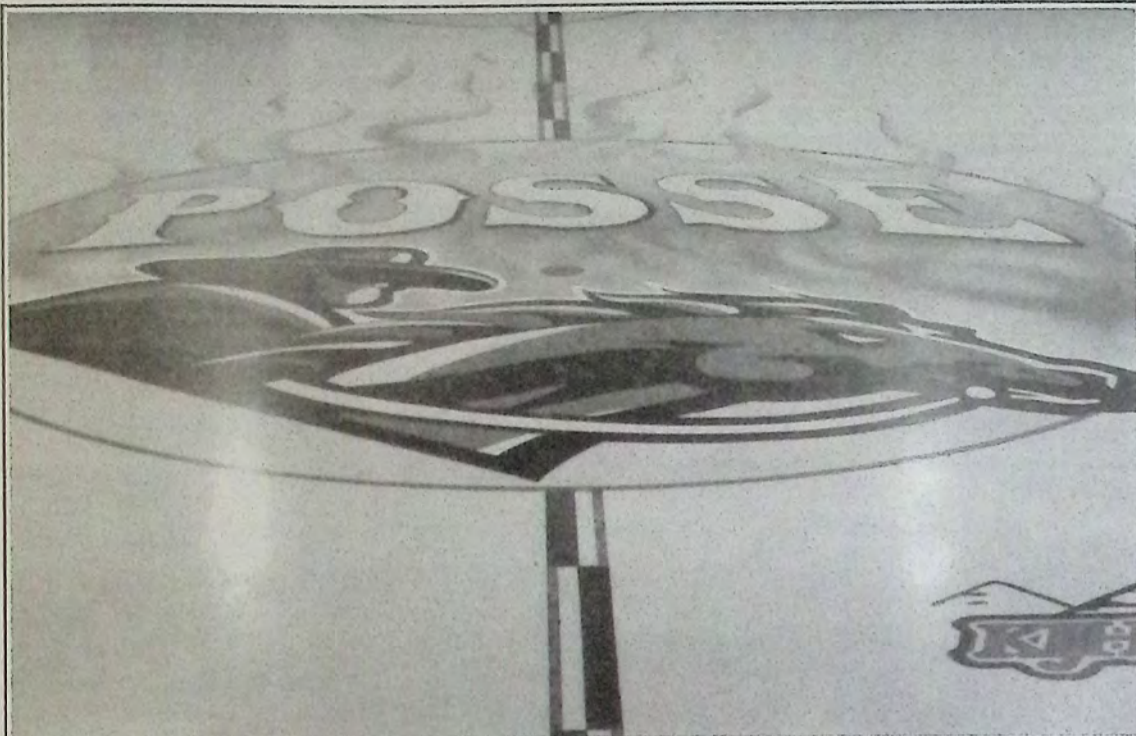
CMMC is a BC resource company, that on June 29, 2008, celebrated its first anniversary as a public company.

Ministry says water levels are low

Weather across British Columbia over the past six weeks has been variable. For the northern two-thirds of the province, periodic storms brought rain, but total precipitation was slightly below normal.

The far northeast received above normal rainfall, but across most of the Southern Interior, the south coast and Vancouver Island, amounts were negligible to slight.

Temperatures across the southern Interior have been generally above normal, with infrequent cloud cover and well above normal hours of sunshine. The drier, warmer weather of the last few weeks has resulted in below normal river levels throughout much of the southern third of the province.

A change in the prolonged dry weather occurred this week. A frontal system moved onto the British Columbia south coast and central coast, resulting in moderated temperatures and widespread light rainfall across Vancouver Island, the south and mid coasts, and across portions of the central Interior.

Most rivers in the southern Interior are below their median water levels for this date, but have stabilized with the moderated temperatures. The majority of rivers with water level gauges are at low levels seen on average once in five to ten years. Most rivers on Vancouver Island and the south coast appear to be near or above their normal water level for the end of July.

Current river levels:

- The Granby and Kettle rivers (Westbridge, Midway, Grand Forks) are at five to ten year low flows.
- Camp Creek (Summerland), Salmon (Salmon Valley), Nicola and Coldwater rivers (Merritt) are a five to ten year low flows.
- The Tulameen and Similkameen rivers (Hedley, Princeton) are near five year low flows.
- Penfold Creek and the Horsefly

River are near five year low flows. - The Bulkley River (Smithers) is near a five year low flow.

Weather forecasts indicate a sustained frontal system for the next few days, with periods of at least light rain across the south and mid coast and the southern Interior. Forecasts suggest warm and dry weather will return by early August. River levels across the southern Interior are currently below normal, but not yet at levels of concern. Cooler temperatures and rainfall this week will be very beneficial, depending on the amount of rain received in individ-

Vegetables

Gardening is a wonderful form of outdoor exercise, and many people grow vegetables. You do not have to be a rural resident to show what our area can produce! There are categories for all kinds of vegetables, and there are some good gardeners in our area. Some people from Tulameen have shown they can grow great gardens even at that elevation. Some people grow herbs such as sage, dill, garlic, etc. and there is a category for those exhibits, too. Vegetables have rules for exhibiting, and you can find the rules in the exhibitor's booklet. It tells you how many to enter, and whether they should be trimmed.

Flowers

Growing flowers in your garden is a joy, but winning a prize for the best flowers is an achievement. Any flowers can be entered, as well as flower arrangements and potted

plants and hanging baskets. The exhibitor's booklet tells how to enter and what number of blooms to enter.

Woodworking
If you work with wood, you will find a category for your most recent project. Some people carve wood, others make furniture or decorative items, and others may make wooden toys. All of these categories are included at the Fall Fair.

Needlework
Many people knit, crochet, or embroider, and there is always a good display of projects from local talent. Each item must never have been entered in the fair before.

Bunchgrass Quilters will be showing their newest quilts again in a special display, but other quilters can enter for judging.

If you hook or braid rugs, there is a category for those, too. Recycled fabric items have a special category. Check the booklet for further information.



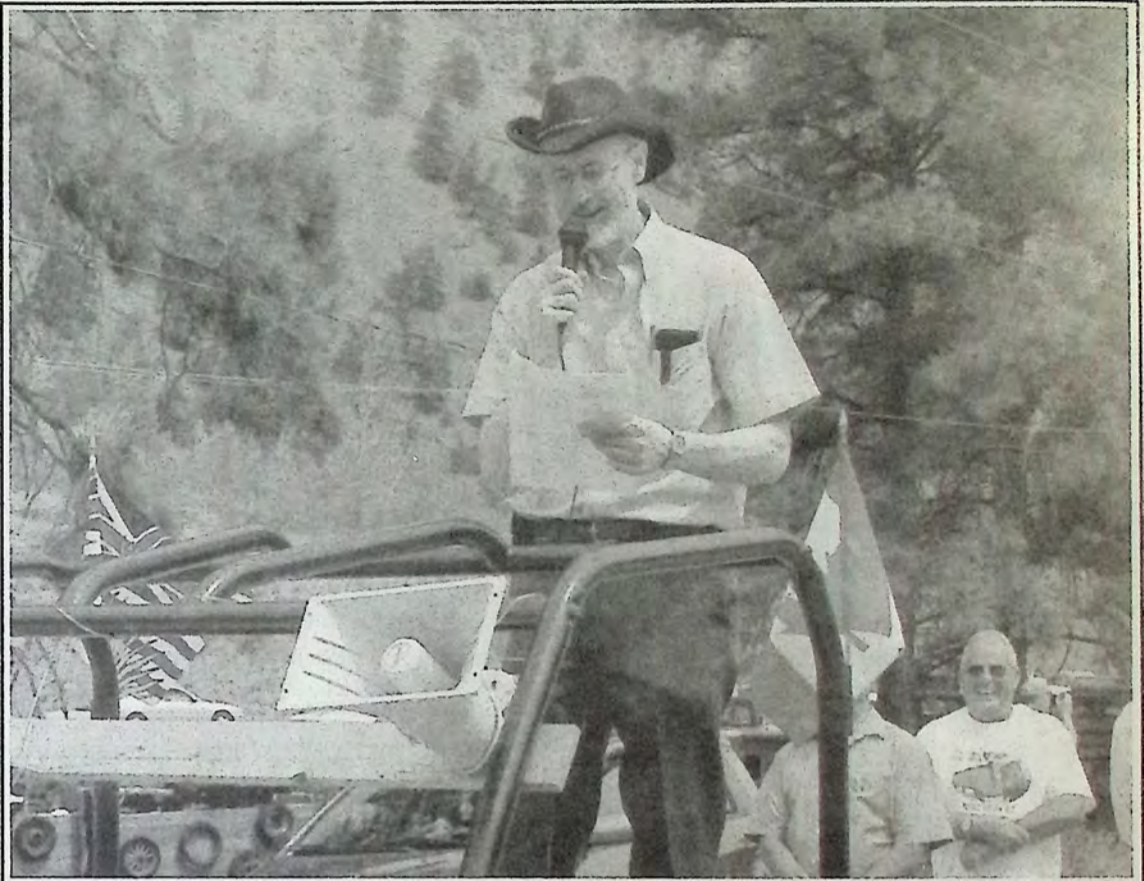

Sizzle plans heat up!

The 7th annual celebration of all things hot and spicy - best known as Similkameen Sizzle - is set to take place on Saturday, September 20th in Keremeos Memorial Park.

The day begins with a pancake breakfast, runs all day with numerous activities planned and will wrap up with a dinner and dance at Victory Hall.

Live entertainment in Memorial Park during the day will be provided by the Cruzeros of Kelowna. "We're very excited to have them as part of our annual pepper festival this year," says Sizzle Committee Chairman Carroll MacLean.

"The band is very popular and has a huge following throughout the Okanagan and Similkameen Valleys which will benefit our event in a big way."

Popular Sizzle events returning for this year include the Chili Cook Off and the Celebrity Chefs program.

"Yale-Lillooet MLA Harry Lali stopped me during the Princeton Rotary Parade on Canada Day weekend to discuss the Celebrity Chef program," says Sizzle committee member George Elliott.

"Lali wanted me to make sure he was included in the program as he had such a good time cooking up a traditional dish two years ago."

The Celebrity Chef program features three different 'chefs' who demonstrate on-site an easy to pre-

pare meal that fits into the theme of the pepper festival.

There's also been a continued focus on childrens activities during the day in Memorial Park with everything from a pepper toss to games and activities with peppers included as part of the theme.

Similkameen Sizzle will also include another installment of the popular Sear Factor pepper eating contest.

"This year we're going to do it a little differently than in the past," explains Elliott.

"The jalapeno pepper will likely be the main focus, but we are redesigning the stunts associated with the contest to make it a little more fun for the contestants as well as the spectators."

Elliott, who has been a volunteer member of the Sizzle Committee from it's first year, has the unusual distinction, along with his wife Brenda, of being the only couple to get married at the pepperfest.

"It was in 2004 and somehow I had mentioned at a Sizzle meeting Brenda and I were going to get married later that year and Judi Egli, who was chairing the committee at the time suggested we do it at Sizzle. It happened pretty fast and I'm afraid to say it was the only time Sizzle got rained out and had to be moved indoors. We've never forgotten the kindness of the committee and the people of the Keremeos area for making our

wedding day a special - and unusual - event."

This year's Sizzle Committee has some new faces on it, and the group has been working hard to make the 7th annual celebration a special event.

One of the business oriented concepts in this year's Sizzle is more opportunities for corporate sponsorship with a comprehensive package in place for different levels of sponsorship.

Vicki Morgan, along with other Sizzle Committee members, devised the plan to assist in covering costs associated with hosting the annual event with hopes of eventually receiving long-term commitments from various sponsors.

Survey finds Canadians are dedicated to being green

(NC)—Some Canadians are willing to go to extraordinary lengths in their commitment to environmental-friendliness.

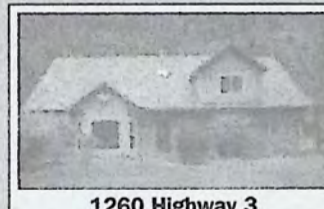

James Dunsmuir 1851-1920

INSIGHTS INTO BC'S HISTORY

Son of Robert Dunsmuir, James was born in Fort Vancouver on July 8th, 1851. A British Columbia industrialist and politician he was heir to the family's coal fortune.

The family dominated the Province's economy in the late nineteenth century and were a leading force in opposing organized labour.

When in 1889 his father died, followed by the death in 1900 of James' brother, Alexander, in San Francisco, James had total control of the Dunsmuir Empire. He had wealth and power beyond imagining.

On March 1st, 1900, the British Empire received news that had been long awaited - British troops under General Buller had broken the four month long siege of Ladysmith in the South Africa Boer War. Dunsmuir was laying out a new townsite at Oyster Bay and to commemorate the event Dunsmuir decided that his new mining town on Vancouver Island should be called Ladysmith.

In a further burst of patriotic pride, Dunsmuir named all Ladysmith's streets after British Boer War generals - Buller, Kitchener, Baden-Powell, Methuen, Symonds and others. In 1901 most of the buildings in Wellington were dismantled and brought twenty miles South to

the new townsite. The effect of this exodus on Wellington was devastating, in 1898 it had a population of 5,000, by 1901 it was 100.

Dunsmuir entered Provincial politics in 1898, winning a seat in the Provincial Legislature and became Premier in 1900. His government attempted to resist popular pressure to curtail Asian labour and immigration, not for humanitarian reasons but to ensure a cheap labour pool for business. It also promoted railway construction and accomplished a redistribution of seats to better represent population distribution in the Province.

It was in 1905, while James Dunsmuir was Premier, that the Canadian Pacific Railway lobbied the Provincial Government for land to build a new rail line into South Eastern BC and the Crowsnest Pass area. Dunsmuir agreed to CPR's proposals under the proviso that they also bought the money stricken Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway from the Dunsmuir family. Canadian Pacific agreed to the terms and the railway and the previously large land grants made to the Dunsmuir family were turned over to the CPR. James Dunsmuir managed his family's coal business from 1876 until 1910, increasing profits ten-fold and resisting efforts to unionize.

Following the sale in 1905 of the E&N Railway, in 1910 he sold his collieries to William McKenzie and Duncan Mann for \$10 million who in turn reorganized the company as Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir) Ltd.

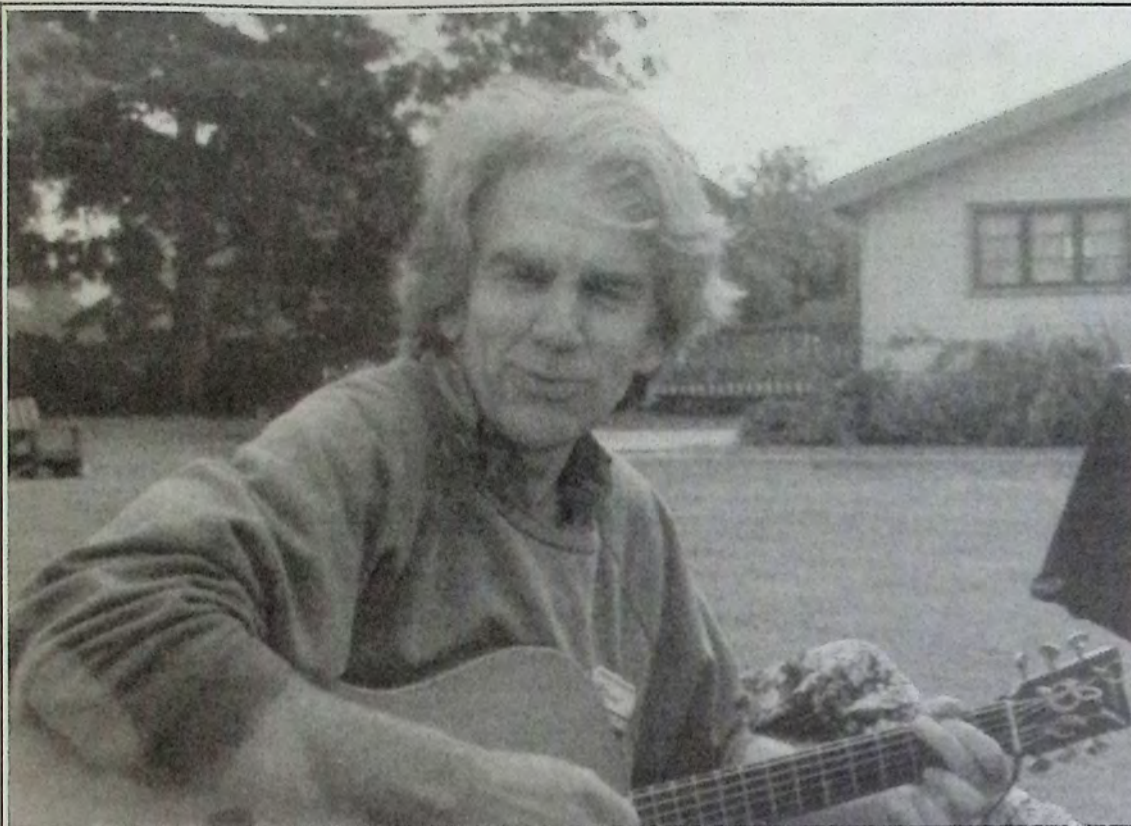
James Dunsmuir disliked politics and resigned as Premier. In 1906 he became the Province's Lieutenant Governor, but retired in 1909 and lived out his last ten years in the baronial home he had built, on former Coast Salish burial grounds, at Hatley Castle near Victoria. He and his wife, Laura Miller Dunsmuir, had eight daughters. Dunsmuir died on June 6, 1920, so ending the direct strong influence that the Dunsmuir family had held on the Province for many years.

Any of you who have sailed or taken the ferry along the Inside Passage down on the coast will enjoy the songs of Brian Robertson at the festival. Brian grew up in Powell River at a time when more people had boats than cars.

He remembers when the only way to get down to Vancouver was on the Union steamship. He has a song about one of these ships - The Gulf Stream - that now lies on the ocean floor as an artificial reef for scuba divers.

Brian has worked as a fisherman and has songs about his experiences on board fishing boats. He is also a committed environmentalist who puts his passion for Mother Earth into song.

Moving from fishing boats to tall

ships we have a group called The Cutters who sing about life on the clipper ships of the 1800's. The Cutters is a family band from Seattle. They have been making music together for many years and each year add new music and new instruments to their repertoire. At their performance you will hear guitar, banjo, mandolin, bass, fiddle and even bagpipes.

One of their specialties is songs of the sea and they are mainstays of Seattle's nautical music scene. Phillip and Theresa Morgan have been organizing the songs of the sea extravaganza at Seattle's Folklife Festival for many years. They also organize concerts at Seattle's Maritime Centre.

Goldcliff continues with exploration

George W. Sanders, President of Goldcliff Resource Corporation (GCN.TSXV) announced last week that the 2008 exploration activities are well underway on Goldcliff's Panorama Ridge and Tulameen projects. After completing the initial phase in the summer and fall of 2007, the 10,000 metre drilling program at the Company's 100% owned Panorama Ridge gold property near Hedley, has resumed. At present, twenty one holes have been completed from three drill locations on the Nordic zone. Additionally, the area around the Bonanza Trench has been extensively stripped and detailed sampling is in progress. On the

Tulameen platinum-gold-copper project, located near Princeton, the reconnaissance prospecting, mapping and stream silt sampling program is underway.

Prior to the 2007 winter recess, 32 drill holes were completed on Panorama Ridge's York-Viking area. The gold assay results from the 2007 drilling program were consistent with the previous year's results, and they enhanced the known size and economic potential of the zone. To the northeast, 22 holes were of a step-out nature and yielded strong confirmation that the York-Viking zone extends in that direction. These holes were particularly significant as they were the closest to trench SP164. With values of 31.5 metres of 1.01 grams gold per tonne, trench SP164, which is located part way between the York-Viking and Nordic zones, indicates that the gold mineralization between these two zones is much closer in proximity than previously thought. The remaining holes were of a fill-in nature and confirmed the strong continuity, grade and multiple horizons of the York-Viking gold mineralization.

The 2008 drilling will initially focus on the Nordic zone. While demonstrating slightly higher grades than the York-Viking zone,

the Nordic has not been as well developed by drilling. The zone is open to both the southwest, towards the York-Viking area, and the northeast. Additionally, several more trenches are currently being excavated to fill in the gap between trench SP164 and the main Nordic body of gold mineralization.

Over at the Bonanza Trench the area has been widened, stripped and extensively sampled. An area of about 40 metres in the down slope direction by 10 metres across slope has been cleared to bedrock. This sampling is centered on the original three metre Bonanza Trench (Y161). The 2007 Bonanza Trench returned gold values of 596.00 grams/tonne (17.368 ounces per ton) over 1.00 metre. With the current 2008 program, several parallel and perpendicular channels have been cut in the down slope and an apparent strike direction of the gold mineralization that has been discovered. The sampling is intended to follow the Bonanza gold horizon. This detailed sampling work is required to help determine the orientation of the multi-ounce high-grade before drilling. The Bonanza gold horizon appears to be up-section to the current York-Viking gold mineralization that has been encountered in continued on Page 24

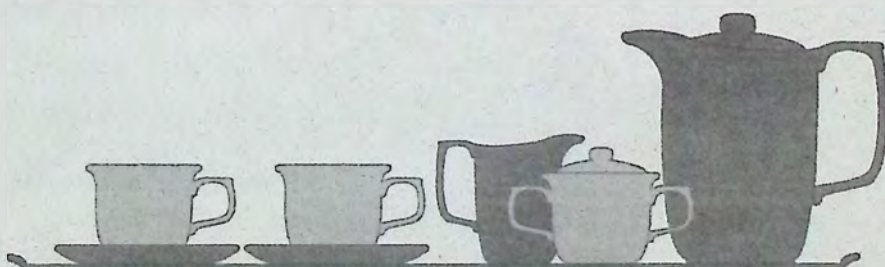

Strip Loin

WITH GARLIC GRILLED ASPARAGUS

(NC)—Mouths will water when you bring a platter of these well-seasoned steaks and asparagus to the table.

- 3/4 cup (175 mL) Diana Marinade, Steak Spice flavour, divided
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) Lea & Perrins Worcestershire Sauce
- 4 thick strip loin steaks, about 2 lb (1 kg)
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) butter
- 6 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 lb (500 g) asparagus spears, blanched
- Lemon wedges

1. Stir Diana Marinade with Lea & Perrins Worcestershire Sauce. Pour 2/3 cup (150 mL) of the marinade mixture over the steaks; marinate for 30 minutes, turning once. Health-it up Twist: To reduce the fat, omit garlic butter mixture and brush grilling steaks and asparagus with Diana Marinade Garlic & Herb flavour instead. Tip: For perfectly blanched asparagus, cook in boiling salted water for 2 to 3 minutes, drain and quickly rinse under cold running water until cool.

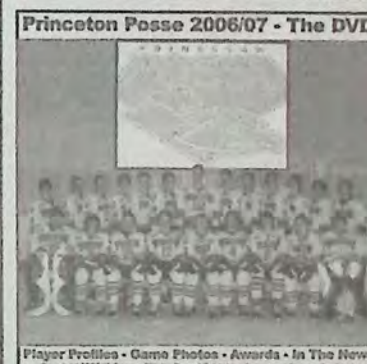

The re-election game

Oddly enough, I've had more than one Town Council hopeful come into my office over the past week asking my advice on how to best tackle local issues going into the upcoming Municipal Election.

While I'm somewhat confused as to why my advice has any value in this situation, I have decided to publish my top two tips on how NOT to get re-elected in the November 2011 Municipal Election. Once the mine shuts down, and it will one day (historically it's been closed longer than open) it won't cripple the community. Election Newbies Note: Leaving the IP alone until Year 14 of the mine's life, which would be 2024, would be a bad idea. Very bad, actually.

And there you have it, my top two tips on how NOT to get re-elected in 2011. Remember, let's have a clean fight with no hitting below the belt and let the games begin!

And now a word from Petrobank

Dear Editor;

In several recent letters published in this newspaper, some community members have raised concerns about our proposed coalbed gas (CBG) evaluation project. Certainly, many of these are legitimate issues that we have tried to address in our ads and our earlier open house, and we will keep them in mind when we return to the community for future meetings about CBG.

New concerns have been raised and I think it is important to provide our position.

As previously announced, we have voluntarily chosen to defer our proposed drilling schedule. The Oil and Gas Commission (OGC) has not directed us in any way. At this point, we have not even presented the OGC with our drilling application as we must wait until after appropriate community consultation is completed to Petrobank's satisfaction and a proposed drilling schedule is set. I would recommend contacting the OGC (www.ogc.gov.bc.ca) if anyone has questions about the commission's role as regulator or the status of Petrobank's application.

We are confident with our ability to operate an environmentally considerate program with no impact on the watershed and the water aquifers. We are equally confident in the ability of the OGC to regulate our operations and hold us accountable to British Columbia's world-class standards

for resource exploration.

Petrobank is serious about having a public discussion about CBG and we have regularly answered questions directly posed to us in personal conversations, correspondence, advertising and news releases. We are not content to only have a one way conversation on the issues and that is why we are committing, once again, to hosting a town hall-style event that will allow people an opportunity to voice their concerns. This will happen before we present an application to the OGC.

But, a public meeting must include all voices from government, the regulator, industry and environmental groups - not just Petrobank. A so-called 'public debate' between two opposing groups is not a valuable way to expose all the information people need to make informed decisions. As we get closer to a revised proposed drilling schedule, which we have not determined, we will ensure this meeting occurs at a convenient time for most people and with ample warning. We appreciate the offer to coordinate a meeting with the SOS group and will do so by contacting them in the future. We appreciate that this group extended the invitation and is allowing us to select the date - something we will do soon.

Petrobank is very proud of our track record in communities throughout Western Canada. We are a very active company operat-

ing a diversity of projects including the development of a low-environmental impact oil sands production technology in northern Alberta. We intend to operate any future programs within the Princeton area with as much care and attention as we give our other projects. This is one of the reasons we want to continue a dialogue around our proposed CBG evaluation program.

Our intent in Princeton has always been to be open and available to discuss our proposals, clarify the facts and acknowledge the concerns of the community. This will include smaller meetings with special interest groups (like SOS), Town Council, the RDOS, and local government representatives. As I've said, we will also return to the community to participate in a larger public event with many groups represented. In the meantime, I will continue to be available to answer any questions community members may have.

Current Comment:

It's time for a different view

The signs about coal bed methane appear throughout the Similkameen Valley. The signs are about opposition to ongoing development and about protecting our water. I am not going to comment on these things, because so much has been said already. Even Town Council has voiced objections and will tell the Premier of our fair province. What I want to do is look at a bigger picture.

If I were on the Board of Directors of Petrobank, I believe I would be dismayed at the millions of dollars spent to date on exploration and public information. An awful lot of shareholders' cash has been funneled into what appears to be wasted effort.

Petrobank began its public information series some five years ago. I remember going to their first open house at the arena mezzanine. Hardly anybody showed any interest at that point, and Petrobank, judging from the lack of public interest, was probably right in believing the company could proceed without opposition. Let's face it: the public started to show real concern only during the past year. If I had been on the Petrobank Board of Directors, I would have been lulled into complacency over the way things were going, and would have voted in favour of further exploration, knowing full well it would cost a lot of money. I would have been looking at the end game and the potential for future resources and profits. After all, that's what Petrobank does: it identifies resources, considers the cost of extraction of those resources against the potential for profits. The company has an obligation to its investors to return a percentage on the shares.

Some people think corporations backed by shareholders are somehow evil, but none of us complain when we receive a percentage on our RRSPs or our mutual funds.

We fail to connect our personal investments with shares invested in all kinds of companies. Our investments are important to resource companies because it takes millions of dollars to extract resources. Consider Copper Mountain Mining Corporation, and how much it must spend on exploration and development before the first ounce of copper is sold. I have often said mining starts with pouring money into a hole in the ground, and it is shareholders' money that digs the hole and extracts the mineral.

Back to Petrobank: if I were a Director, I would question whether coal bed methane gas (CBM) was worth the money wasted in exploration. Now that so many communities are complaining about CBM, what is the point of trying to find more? Perhaps Petrobank should look at natural gas, including CBM, as a diminishing resource, and look for something to replace it. Perhaps all of us should view gas that way and start saving for new hot water tanks and furnaces.

The public does not want gas exploration and must be prepared to live with a decline in that commodity. As a Petrobank Director, I would have to remind everyone Petrobank is not simply a gas company, it is an energy company. I would advocate looking at other sources of energy, primarily solar, wind and water, to replace gas with electricity. Petrobank could probably do better investing in wind farms and hydro generators than spending more on exploration opposed by the public.

How many shareholders want to buy into electrical energy? What kind of government hurdles will the company have to jump to go a new direction? Can the company afford it, or will it go belly-up and

cause the shareholders to lose their investment? How many people would lose their jobs? All of these questions would have to be answered.

There are environmental pressures these days on companies which exploit gas and petroleum resources. Global warming, smog, water pollution: none of us want these. We point a finger at companies like Petrobank. What we are not prepared for is replacing gas and petroleum with alternative sources of energy. The only safe and sane alternative appears to be electricity. I cannot afford to convert my gas furnace to electric at this time, and even if all of us decided to do that, there is probably not enough electricity at this time.

We, the public, will have to make sacrifices at some point to convert to alternatives. It is easy to sit back and say we don't want certain kinds of development. Those who oppose anything always make the loudest noise: where are the people lobbying the government to develop more solar, wind and water energy? Where are the people who can see the need for change and are prepared to campaign for it? We, the public, are on a roller coaster ride heading for a crash if we do not start preparing for a future without gas and petroleum.

In some ways we are like the people who oppose cattle ranching because they say it harms the environment, but these same people still want their hamburgers and steaks, and their leather sofas and leather sandals.

We need a new view. We need to be able to see the circle linking environment, industry and consumer to each other, and understand where we can make a comfortable fit for everyone.

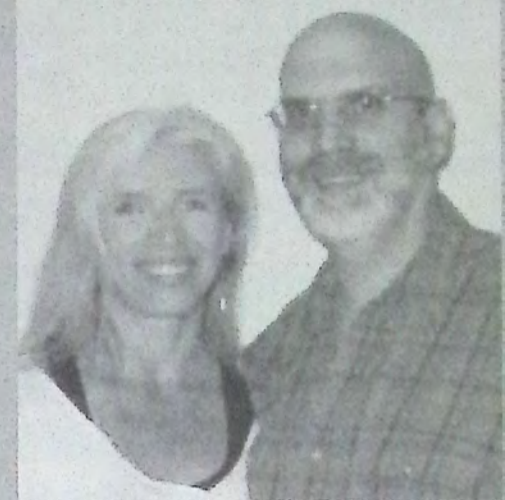

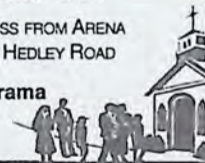

 the drilling.

The Panorama Ridge property contains a large surface area of gold mineralization related to silica-iron alteration (skarn) in sedimentary rocks from the Hedley Formation of the Triassic Nicola Group. The gold mineralization is related to the skarn alteration and occurs over an area of approximately two square kilometres. Contained in the alteration area from northeast to southwest are the Nordic, York-Viking and Tower gold zones. These zones are separate entities occurring over a distance of approximately 1,000 metres. The trenching and drilling have narrowed the gap between the zones.

In the Princeton area this spring, Goldcliff acquired a 45,245 hectare land position by staking in the Tulameen platinum district. The Tulameen district is an important

historical placer platinum-gold producer, and the B.C. MinFile records indicate several lode occurrences of platinum with grades ranging from 2.5 g/t to 16.0 g/t Pt. The lode showings are associated with intrusive ultra-mafic and mafic rocks of the Tulameen Complex. 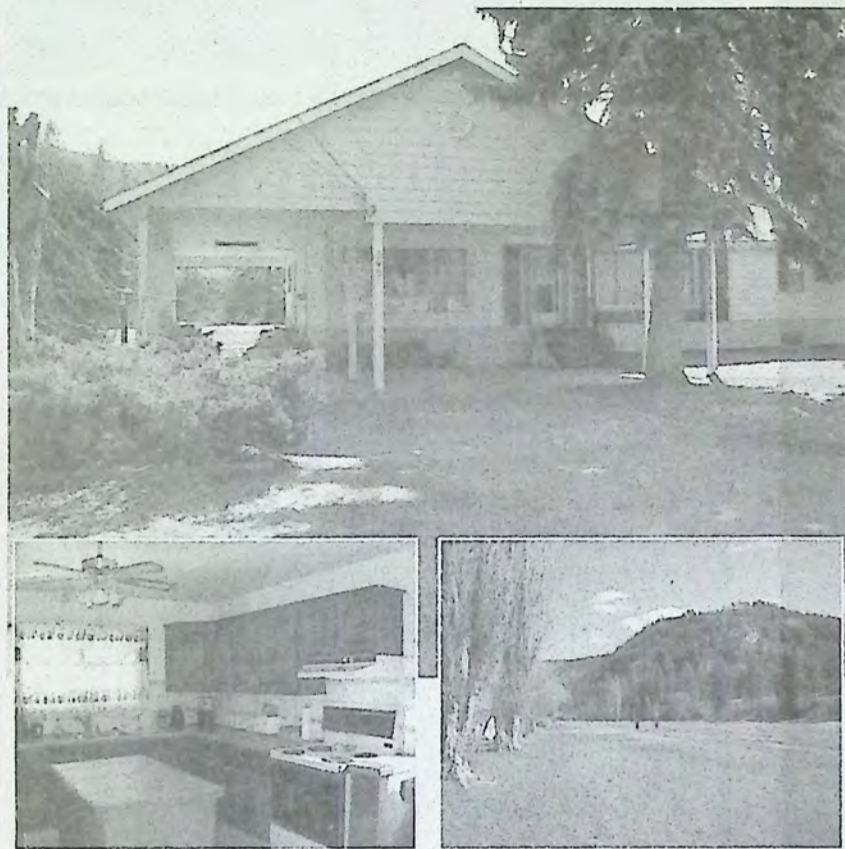

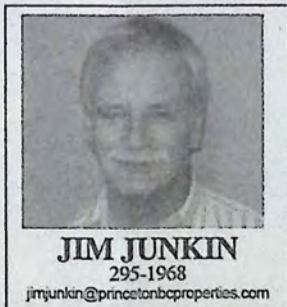
