Who's running in the upcoming elections?

Mayor Randy McLean and Area H Director Gerri Logan have declared they will be candidates for the upcoming civic elections in November. At the September 2 Town Council meeting, the News Leader polled Councillors to see who else will seek re-election.

Councillor Ray Jarvis will run again, and so will Councillor Jim Manion. Councillor Maria Sadegur is still undecided.

Councillor Pam Jones will not seek re-election, but stated she admires the work ethic of the present Town Council and considers it an honour to work with them.

Rural Princeton resident Brad

Hope announced this week his intention to challenge Gerri Logan for the Area H Director's seat.

Rumours circulating around town point to at least five other people running for Town Council with the majority of those apparently looking to challenge Randy McLean for the Mayor's seat.

Current Trustees on the Nicola-Similkameen School District Board of Education have not indicated their intentions.

Nominations for Town Council and School Board will be accepted at Town Hall from 9:00 AM September 30th to 4:00 PM October 10th.

Posse exhibition hockey season begins!

The 2008/09 Valley First Princeton Posse hit the ice September 5th wearing their 'away' uniforms in their first Exhibition Game.

The local team hosted Summerland Sting at Princeton Arena and had no less than three local boys in the line-up (Clint Cook, Nick Yee and Colton Williams) along with one relative of a local family (Billy Marshall) and four veterans from last year's team (Dylan Becker, Wade Masch, Brooks Christensen and Spencer Brooks).

For an exhibition game, it was a lot like putting on last winter's clothes to see if they still fit. Some of the team did, some of the team still needs to work out some bugs but overall it was a great game to start the new season with.

The hockey club itself has a new General Manager/President (Stan Turner) along with a solid Board of

Directors (Rob Hicks, Linda Hodgson, Ted Coyne, Lorna Coyne, Steven Yee, Dean Johnston, Kirk McConnell, Randy McLean and Jim Manion).

The club has also done a great job of recruiting new volunteers to assist in putting each home game together with the goal of giving fans an 'experience' rather than just a few hours of hockey.

As for the game itself, Princeton's Nick Yee took the first penalty of the night, a 2-minuter for hooking at 4:32 and Summerland scored the first goal at 7:52.

The Posse replied at 15:06 on the power play. Jason Alessio got the marker with assists going to Nolan O'Brien and Leeland Malkinson.

Summerland finished the period adding another goal with 54.9-seconds in the frame but it was waved off as there was a goalie interference penalty on the play.

The second period saw a much stronger Summerland Sting attack the Posse zone with zest and power. They added two more goals to take the lead 3-1.

The third period saw the Posse shift gears and ramp it up a bit and they started to click after

Summerland's fourth goal of the game.

Princeton got their second goal at 7:44 from Dustin Heitman, with an assist from Nick Cecconi.

Summerland bounced one back less than a minute later.

It pushed Princeton into high gear and with 5:04 left in the game Billy

Marshall scored a goal for the home team with an assist going to Andy Milne.

With the score 5-3 for Summerland, the Posse was not finished and with just over 2-minutes left in the game Thierry Martine bagged one for Princeton. He was assisted by Leeland Malkinson and

Princeton's Colton Williams.

The next home exhibition game is Wednesday, September 10 against Kamloops with the Regular Season Home Opener set for Saturday, September 13th against Fernie.

Town likes photo idea

Ed Muckle, owner of Image Emporium, presented an interesting idea to Town Council at the September 2 meeting. He explained a concept of using Princeton's wealth of historical photos to enhance downtown as a tourist attraction.

Muckle told Council the enlarged old photos on his building have brought a lot of attention from tourists. He suggested having business owners put up the same size

photos on every building in town.

To attract people into the shops rather than leave them on the sidewalk just looking at the photos, Muckle proposed creating a map of Princeton with small images around the map to create a self-guided tour.

These maps would be free to tourists. In addition, a set of historic collector cards could be created telling about each location where the photo on the card is dis-

played. These can be given away by the business owner or sold as a postcard.

Muckle proposed very large historic highway signs at every entrance to Princeton, saying Welcome to Princeton, "150 Years of Living History."

Muckle asked for Town Council's opinion before taking the plan to the Chamber of Commerce and local merchants. Town Council likes the concept.

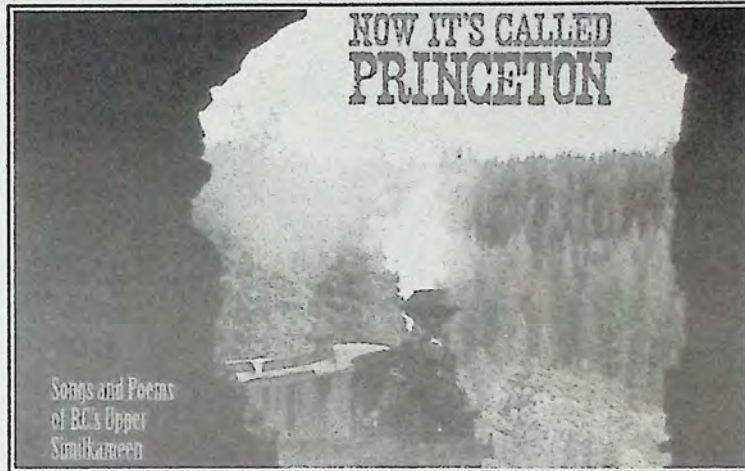

Mills reviews CD by local artists



"Now It's Called Princeton" by
Nick Mills

I first met Jon Bartlett and Rika Ruebsaat in November 2004 when they turned up at a membership meeting of the Museum Society. It soon became clear to all those present that these two Vancouver residents, with a Princeton bolt hole in Lynnwood Mobile Home Park, would be a great asset to the Society.

For many years, Jon and Rika had been committed to the traditional music of British Columbia and had struggled to keep it alive against present day 'canned' music. Soon they were encamped in the damp and dusty bowels of the Museum/Library Building searching old copies of the Princeton Star and

many other documents relating to the history of the Similkameen Valley.

Princeton Archives proved to be a cornucopia of information for them. Between regular broadcasts on CBC Radio, where the 'dusty' archives were to gain a certain notoriety, traveling from home in Vancouver - where Rika was still employed as a school teacher, regular performances throughout BC and beyond, all the time they were collecting and sifting words and songs from the Upper Similkameen.

During 2007, Jon and Rika made the move to Princeton permanent and soon established themselves within the community. One of their early brainchildren here was the for-

mation of the Princeton Traditional Music Society. August 2008 saw the fruition of their labours with the first Princeton Traditional Music Festival and the launch of their CD "Now It's Called Princeton."

With a total of twenty-seven tracks, a lot of the material originates from their hours spent underground in the Archives, but others have contributed greatly to this very enjoyable and entertaining CD. Besides material from former local hard rock miner John Henry ("Splitting The Core" and "Flying Up The Nickel Plate Road") and Paddy Graber ("The Copper Mountain Raise" and "The Hope Slide"), almost half of the songs on the CD are from the Phil Thomas Collection.

"The Blakeburn Song" appears in the Similkameen Star of January 1931, where one cannot help a wry smile when listening to "A Plea For Single Men," written by Martha Muggins in 1931 (as the booklet that accompanies the CD states: 'probably a pseudonym!'). Humour is also evident in "That Towel" taken from a Princeton Star of June 1908.

The booklet also makes very clear that almost all the tracks on the CD are to the tune of another song. British Columbia was settled by people from all over who did not share any one particular music culture so the popular songs of the day tended to be nostalgic about home and this is the material that BC's early songwriters made their songs from.

The title song, "Now It's Called Princeton," is somewhat different in its origin! In the summer of 2007 songwriter Zeke Hoskin traveled from Seattle to Princeton. Coming to the Museum, he spoke with me for several hours. The result of the conversation was the song!

For lovers of traditional music, those interested in the early history of the Similkameen Valley, or for sheer entertainment value, this CD is a must! What's my own particular favourite? Hard question to answer, but Jon's recitation, from an early 1990's edition of the Princeton Star, of "Wanted, A Railroad" takes some beating!

Because of grant funding for the production costs, all proceeds of the CD are being shared as fundraisers for the Princeton Museum and Archives Society and the Princeton Traditional Music Society. Copies of the CD (including a booklet containing many historic photographs) are now available for \$20.00 from Princeton Museum or from PTMS members.

On Friday, August 29th, at approximately 5:00 PM, a van traveling east on 7th Street in Keremeos collided with a horse and rider trying to cross the street. The rider fell off the horse to the pavement and sustained serious non-life threatening injuries. He was transported by ambulance to Penticton Regional Hospital and had subsequent surgery for fractures. The driver of the van was not injured, the van sustained front end passenger side damage. The driver did not hold a driver's licence and was issued a violation ticket for the offence. Witnesses stated the horse and rider were at fault for trying to cut across traffic when it was unsafe. The horse involved had minor injuries and required stitches, local Keremeos residents are taking care of the horse until the rider, a 54-year old Keremeos resident, is released from hospital. - submitted by Keremeos RCMP

Firefighters kept busy during long weekend

Once again the community's generous donations to the Keremeos Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD) have helped the department to successfully assist the public at a recent incident.

Last year, with donations from local residents, clubs, societies and businesses, the KVFD bought rope rescue equipment and received training in its use.

Since purchasing the rope rescue equipment, the KVFD have used it in several embankment rescues including the most recent incident on Saturday, August 30th.

At approximately 11:30 AM, the KVFD was called to rescue an injured ATV operator on Crater Mountain Road. The ATV rider had lost control and rolled her machine off the road and 30 feet down a steep and boulder-strewn embankment, sustaining serious injuries in the process.

Using the rope rescue equipment, and with the assistance of members of the public, the firefighters were able to bring the casualty up the

embankment to an ambulance in a prompt and controlled manner.

The long weekend was busy for our local volunteer firefighters. The previous day, Friday, August 29th, at approximately 5:00 PM, firefighters attended a horse and rider versus mini van motor vehicle incident in front of the fire hall.

On Sunday, August 31st, at approximately 4:30 PM, KVFD pagers went off for a grass fire west of Keremeos near Standing Rock.

The fire, which at times rose 20 feet in the air, was spreading towards residences and occupants were on alert and ready to leave if evacuation was necessary.

Four KVFD trucks, with 17 firefighters, attended the scene as well as six initial attack forestry firefighters, a water truck and a helicopter.

Due to safety concerns including smoke and the potential spread of fire across the highway, traffic was stopped on the highway at a safe distance away from the fire for over two hours as the local fire-

fighters and forestry firefighters fought the blaze.

Back at the KVFD fire hall, a Kaleden firefighter crew with their truck was on stand by in case they were needed at the grass fire or if there was another incident within the Keremeos fire district.

The fire burnt approximately twenty acres of grassland but was extinguished with no damage to property.

"The residents of the property threatened by the grass fire had done a very good job of providing a large defensible space around their home," said Keremeos Fire Chief Jordy Bosscha.

"There was thirty to forty feet of green grass around the house. If it hadn't of been for that our firefighters would not have been near the house because it would have been unsafe. It was also fortunate that the residents had many sprinklers and several lengths of garden hose which were used to help keep the area surrounding the house wet."

To help protect property from potential wildfires, it is recommended that residents clean roof gutters of pine needles. If dry grass surrounds their home, then residents are advised to water the grass frequently and remove all combustible materials. Ideally residents should aim to have a defensible space of at least thirty feet surrounding their property. - submitted

EDO reports on tourism and business park

Michael McLaughlin, Economic Development Officer for the Similkameen Valley, reported to Town Council on September 2 to

outline progress on tourism development this year. He reported substantial savings on budget figures. Four brochures were produced this

year. These were placed in Visitor Information Centres around the region as well as being placed in the museum and other locations.

Princeton hosted a one day community tour for 13 people from surrounding Information Centres and destination marketing organizations. Cowboy Coffee and Castle Resort provided free refreshments and Mascot Mine provided free transportation.

An advertisement in the News Leader's historically themed visitor guide with a full page editorial included was a good investment, and will be repeated in the October guide. This item proved to be very popular with tourists.

A photographer and journalist from The Province newspaper toured Princeton Museum. McLaughlin told Council it is difficult to get travel journalists to come here. He expects the new bridge and river park will draw them when these are completed.

Advertising in the Thompson-

Okanagan Tourism Association Travel Guide is in production, and Princeton will be featured again at the Abbotsford Consumer Show. Website updating has not taken place to date but money is budgeted for it.

Business Park

McLaughlin told Council he has consulted Venture Kamloops about preparing a marketing strategy to attract investors to Princeton's business park. The strategy will consist of three parts: determining appropriate investor attraction information and how it should be presented; creating a marketing strategy focused on the message and the targets; and determining how to reach the investors.

When this strategy is complete, there will be further reports to Town Council, and a civic website will be updated to reflect the strategy.

Health facts: Q&A on Fabry disease

Q: What is Fabry disease?

A: Fabry disease is an inherited, progressive disease that occurs worldwide among all ethnic groups. The disease may lead to a shortened life span due to decreased kidney and heart functions. It occurs in about 1 in 40,000 males.

Fabry disease is an inherited lipid storage disease. It is triggered by an inherited defective gene located on the X chromosome, thus hampering the production of an important enzyme. Without the enzyme, Fabry disease interferes with the body's ability to break down lipids, causes damage to cells and organs, and results severe pain, decreased ability to sweat, hearing loss, red-purple skin lesions, stroke, as well as bowel, kidney, heart problems and shortened life span.

Q: What are the signs and symptoms?

A: Fabry disease symptoms range from sudden, severe pain attacks to numbness or burning in hands and feet, impaired ability to sweat or adjust to temperature changes,

Fall Skin Forecast: Season change brings on dry, itchy, red skin

(NC)—As we head into the changing season, many Canadians may begin experiencing dry, itchy, and red skin. With yo-yoing temperatures common this year, recent statistics show that hot and cold extremes are a major trigger of the dry, itchy, red skin often associated with eczema. And, these symptom flare-ups are bound to get even worse as we turn on our heaters to deal with the upcoming colder, dryer air. Here are some basic tips to manage symptoms this fall and winter.

1. Know the triggers: There are a number of internal and external triggers that cause eczema symptoms to flare-up. Common ones to avoid are:

- Environmental allergens like dust and pet dander

hearing loss or ringing in the ears and heart and kidney damage. The disease gets progressively worse with age.

Fabry Disease is easily misdiagnosed as conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, irritable bowel syndrome, inflammatory bowel disease, growing pains in children, for example, and other types of nerve damage.

Q: What is the treatment?

A: Treatment of Fabry disease had traditionally involved symptom and pain management, cardiac intervention and dialysis. In the last eight years, specific enzyme therapies have been developed, allowing for the replacement of the missing enzyme.

In fact, the Canadian Fabry Disease Initiative has recently been established to examine the progress of all Fabry Disease patients in Canada on enzyme replacement therapy. All patients in Canada with Fabry disease are eligible for enrollment in this study, which consists of the collection of clinical findings to learn more about the

nature of this highly variable disease. Fabry patients who meet the criteria for treatment will be provided enzyme replacement therapy.

Q: Why are there so many cases of Fabry disease found in Nova Scotia?

A: Nova Scotia has a great number of patients with Fabry Disease because of what's called a founder effect. There was an individual who moved here 16 generations ago, and it's her descendants who have stayed in Nova Scotia that have this condition. The funding of enzyme replacement therapy in Nova Scotia means that patients are now seeing their symptoms, including bouts of fever and sensitivity to heat and cold, arrested or receding.

PURPOSE OF REPEAL AND RE-ENACTMENT PROCESS AND BYLAWS:

The intent behind the repeal and re-enactment of all Official Community Plan Bylaws, Zoning Bylaws and Rural Land Use Bylaws enacted within the Regional District is in order to make the bylaws more accessible to the general public by facilitating ease of use and to ensure that the policies, guidelines, and regulations contained in the bylaws have been validly enacted and are enforceable.

The process of making the bylaws more accessible to the general public has involved the consolidation of "general regulations" under a single section of the zoning bylaws; the standardization of the general layout applied to the bylaws; the updating of references to Provincial ministries and agencies (many of which have been renamed or reconstituted); the standardization of the layout of the provisions relating to each individual zone; the standardization of how site specific amendments are introduced; the creation of a uniform list of zones (without altering the list of permitted uses in each zone); and, where appropriate, the standardization and update of definitions found in each of the zoning bylaws. Other minor updating and modernizing revisions to the bylaws are so extensive that they cannot all be listed in this notice. The public is encouraged to view or obtain copies of the bylaws at the address or web site set out below.

The Official Community Plan, Zoning and Rural Land Use Bylaws currently enacted by the Regional District contain provisions that may be or are invalid on the basis that they have no legal authority or were enacted with a procedural defect in the final adoption process. In particular, the Regional District has determined that a number of amendments bylaws to the current Official Community Plan, Zoning and Rural Land Use Bylaws, while having been the subject of sufficient public hearing processes, were deficient in the final process (i. e., the amendment bylaws did not receive necessary provincial approvals). The process of ensuring that the policies, guidelines, and regulations contained in the bylaws have been validly enacted and are enforceable has involved the Regional District reviewing the bylaws and deleting provisions having no legal authority and ensuring that the procedure followed by the Regional District in the adoption of the revised bylaws is correct.

Due to legislative changes enacted in 2001, the Rural Land Use Bylaws currently found in Electoral Area 'F' (Okanagan Lake West/West Bench) and Electoral Area 'H' (Princeton Rural) cannot be carried forward and will be replaced with consistent Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws.

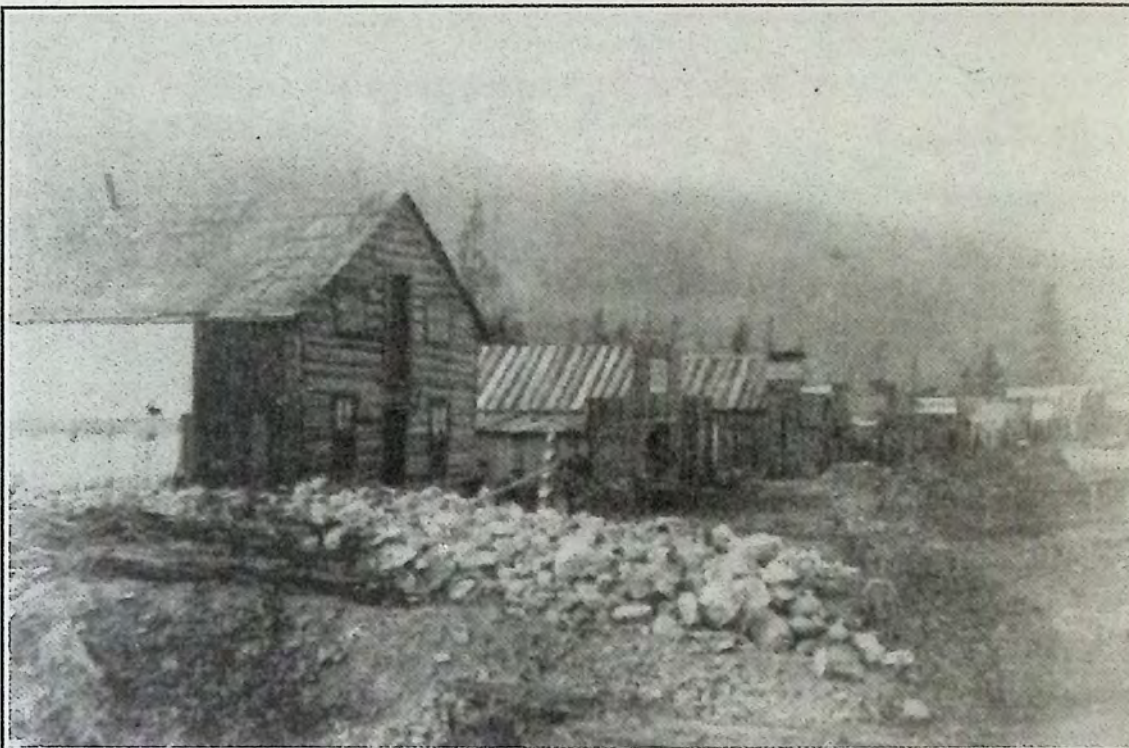

A Story About Donald INSIGHTS INTO BC'S HISTORY

There are many ghost towns scattered throughout British Columbia, but a particular story recently caught the eye, it is one that had its ending only 51 years ago.

Donald, BC is located on Highway 1, 28-kilometres from Golden. In its heyday Donald was a divisional point on the Canadian Pacific Railway, but in 1897 when the CPR abandoned it in favour of Revelstoke, Donald disappeared into obscurity and is now a small sawmilling community.

In its glory years, Donald was home to several memorable characters. For example, Reverend Henry Irwin who was the local Anglican priest during the railway construction. Affectionately called 'Father Pat,' he was well known throughout many BC mining camps of the time, especially those in the Rossland area. And then there was pioneer newspaperman John Houston, who would later become the first mayor of Nelson and who started his first newspaper in 1888 in Donald.

Others, less law abiding but still colourful people, called Donald home including card sharks 'One-Armed Roxy' and John Houts, also known as 'Keno Jack.' Madam Florence Mackenzie, who was also known as 'Mother' Mackenzie, saved 'Keno Jack's' life by administering first aid after he had been shot by CPR Inspector Jack Selkirk who had caught him 'springing a cold deck' during a game of poker.

Despite the roguish nature of some of these local characters, it would be one of Donald's leading citizens,

Rufus Kimpton, who would commit its most notorious crime.

When the CPR announced the move to Revelstoke in 1897, it offered to move, free of charge, any buildings to anywhere along its line. Rufus Kimpton, knowing that Donald would soon be a ghost town moved with his family to Windermere. His wife missed the church in Donald so much so that her husband went back and got it for her!

However, the building had already been promised to Revelstoke and when a group from the town arrived in Donald ready to move the church, they found that it had mysteriously disappeared. When they learned that the church had been taken to Windermere they wrote letters demanding its return.

Windermere didn't respond to the correspondence and they too had

been the victims of theft. While the church had been on route to it's new home, someone at Golden had stolen the bell from it. Windermere had no better luck getting its bell back than Revelstoke had getting the church back.

Therefore, at Windermere there was St. Peter's, the 'Stolen Church' and at Golden there was St. Paul's, the church with the 'Stolen Bell.'


Resentment over the bell simmered between Windermere and Golden for more than half a century until one night in 1957 a group from Windermere sneaked into Golden and stole the bell back. They even went as far as to hold a parade in honour of their achievement. However, the church officials at Windermere didn't believe that two wrongs made it right and the bell was returned soon to Golden.

Sausage and Sweet Potato Frittata

- 2 small sweet potatoes (3/4 lb/375 g total), well scrubbed
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) vegetable oil
- 2 turkey sausages, casings removed
- 3/4 cup (175 mL) Ocean Spray Craisins Sweetened Dried Cranberries
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) chopped onion
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) each salt, pepper and crumbled dried sage leaves
- 3 cups (750 mL) baby spinach leaves
- 4 each whole eggs and egg whites
- 1 1/3 cups (325 mL) 1% milk
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) Dijon mustard
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) shredded Gruyère or white Cheddar cheese

Pierce each sweet potato several times with a fork; microwave on Medium-High for 4 minutes or until just fork tender. Cool completely. Cut the sweet potatoes into 1/2-inch (1 cm) cubes; reserve.

Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Heat the oil in a 12-inch (30 cm) oven-proof skillet set over medium heat. Crumble in the sausage meat; add the Craisins, onion, salt, pepper and sage. Cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes or until sausage is browned and onion is golden. Stir in the sweet potato and spinach; cook, stirring often, for 3 minutes or until the spinach is wilted. Spread evenly into a 12-inch (35 cm) baking dish.

Meanwhile, whisk the eggs and egg whites with the milk and mustard. Pour evenly over the vegetable mixture. Sprinkle evenly with cheese. Bake for 30 minutes or until set. Makes 8 servings.

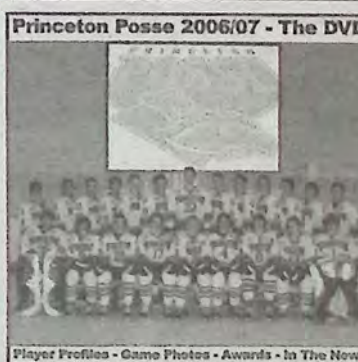

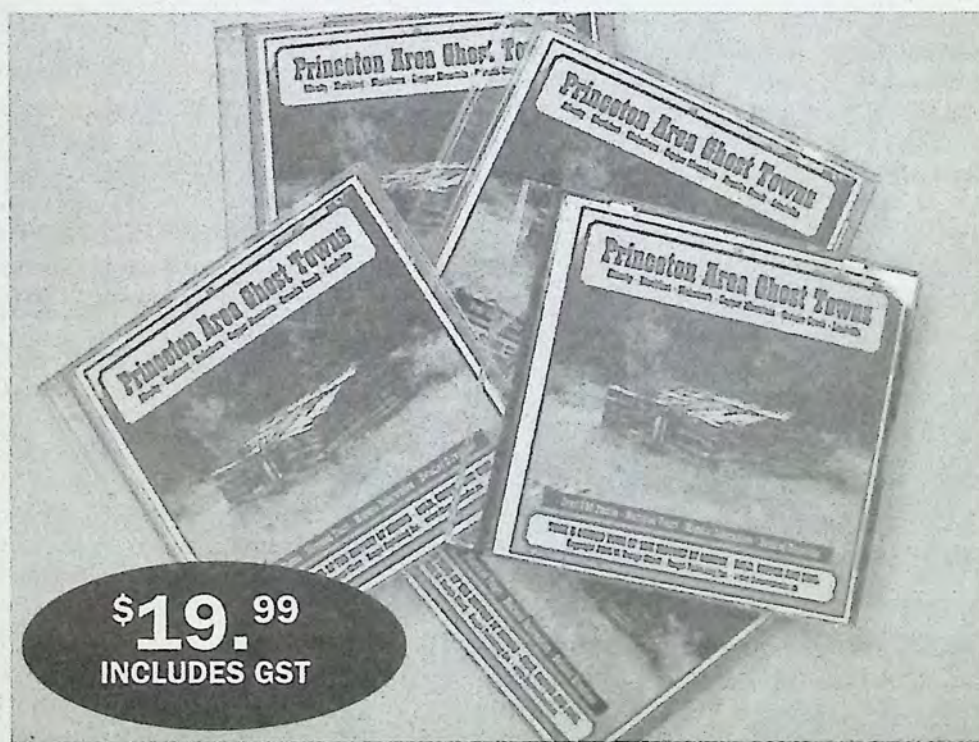

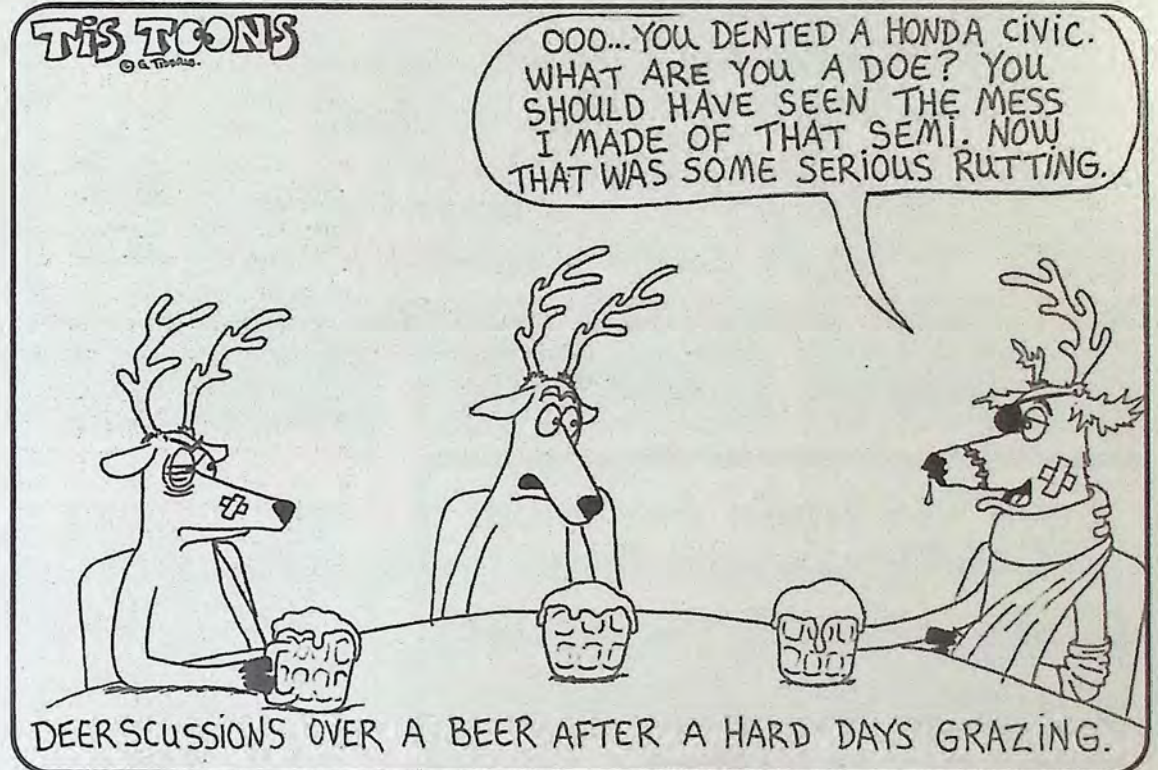

To The Editor:

Do you feel safe and secure in your home?

Well, your fellow citizens who live in manufactured home parks do not!

These parks have become targets for developers over the last ten years. I personally know how this feels. I was a resident of one of four parks bought out by one developer in Coquitlam. This is the reason I fight for residents in BC and will keep on fighting until we are safe and secure when we move into a manufactured home park.

If you live in a manufactured home park, you could be next. What can you do to protect yourself as well as help other residents?

Campaign to the BC provincial government for more protection and better compensation if and when your park is sold for redevelopment. Campaign to your local government for their support to make sure you receive adequate compensation for the loss of your home and not just the buildings. The assessed value of your home is based only on the building and not the decks, outbuildings, lawns, trees, etc.

And let's say that your unit can be moved, where are you going to move it to? If it's older than five years, most manufactured home parks will not take it. If you can move your home, the truck transporters who would be moving it, most of them are under contract to the manufactured home builders and you will be fit into a slot whenever and if ever they are

available.

At what cost? Thousands of dollars! More than the 12 months rent the provincial government says you will receive.

Princeton has a Relocation Assistance Policy. That is great! But, from personal experience, developers will come up with various methods to make you sell your home or move out and leave it for little or no money. You will be scared into selling and/or leaving. You need your town to step in at this point to protect you.

Now, if you are a senior or a low income family, where will you go? Seniors cannot get a mortgage at their age. Low income families cannot afford the high cost of mortgages.

Affordable housing? What's that? Very few municipalities have enough affordable housing to accommodate all their needs.

Manufactured home parks are an ideal source of affordable housing. Why not lobby your town council to come up with incentives for manufactured home park owners to keep their parks as

The best investment: Education

Students went back to school last week. Some who should have gone back to school did not. I feel sorry for those students.

Prior to school opening, I heard young people, in their teens, complaining about going back to school. They did not want to go. They did not like school.

I sympathize with those young people who do not like school. I did not like school for most of the years I attended. It was awful to have to sit for hours in those uncomfortable desks. I hated being still that long. I hated being indoors when the weather was reasonably good outside. I was not impressed with most of the teachers I had (and some of them would be fired by today's standards!). There were a number of teachers who did not like me when I was a teenager, which did not make school that appealing. There were some other students who did not like me.

Still, I did really well in school, although I was really glad when it was over.

It is important to parents to convince their children it does not matter whether they like going to school. It does not matter whether the teachers or other students like them. It does not matter whether or not they are popular or whether they have top marks. None of that means anything in the long run. The important thing about going to school is getting the grades and graduating. It is graduation that opens the doors to doing what you would really like to do.

How do you convince your children that going to school is more important than being liked or being the best?

One of the best arguments I have ever heard as a reason to go to school is that education is the best thing you can buy. If you buy a car, the minute you drive it off the lot it is worth less than what you paid

for it, but there is no depreciation in education. Education does not lose value during inflation, nor during an economic downturn. Nobody can steal an education from you. Your education never goes out of fashion. Even if your job becomes obsolete, you still have your education that will open doors to new opportunities. There is nothing you can buy that has as high a value as an asset than your basic education.

We try to tell our children from personal experience, but that seldom works. They know the world is not the same for them as it was for you. If you can show them an education makes good sense for their world, you may make some progress.

The best tool I ever saw for showing youngsters how important it is to have an education is a life line. This is a simple technique. Draw a long line on a piece of paper and mark 0 at the left end and 85 at the right end.

This is a life span, and 85 is the average life span for most of today's teens (they will probably live longer). Now, mark the line in 10 year intervals to show the decades of life.

That done, put your teen's age in at the appropriate place. Ask your teen to fill in the rest, showing where he or she will be in five years, 10 years, 20 years, and so on. Make them aware they are

going to have to WORK for probably 50 years, and they might as well work at a job that will support them and provide what their family may need.

When I was working with young people looking for jobs, and not highly motivated, I found this life line was very useful. Youngsters tend to see life in the short term. They are more concerned about today, tomorrow and the next day, rather than with this year, next year and 10 years from now. A life line helps to give them greater perspective.

Another technique I used, along with this life line, was to ask them to write down everything they had learned between 0 and their present age. They need to start with such simple things as sitting up, walking, talking, using a toilet, brushing their teeth, and on and on.

Then ask them if they could learn that much in the next 10 or 15 years. Most of the time, the answer is "yes".

Most youngsters who are turned off from school are turned off because their parents and sometimes their teachers have low expectations for them. I have found that young people need to know that their parents and teachers expect them to do well and live a productive life. This is the magic ingredient in helping kids succeed: expect them to do well.

RDOS sets glass pick up schedule

Rural residents in the South Okanagan and Similkameen Valleys will receive their second container glass pick up for 2008 starting September 8th.

Residents who receive curbside garbage and recycling in Okanagan Falls, Twin Lakes, Oliver, Osoyoos, Keremeos, Cawston, Hedley or the surrounding rural areas can place out an unlimited amount of clean container glass for pick up.

Container glass should be placed out in reusable plastic, metal or wood open top boxes or containers on your regular refuse collection day by 7:00 AM.

Please remember:

- place out only clean container glass.
- place out both clear and coloured container glass (unless you live in the City of Penticton which only accepts non-coloured clear container glass).
- window, mirror or automotive glass will not be picked up.
- use a sturdy reusable container made of plastic, metal or wood.
- do not use cardboard boxes as they have a tendency to break and blow away after use.

Landfills can accept container glass free for recycling during hours

of operation. Contact the RDOS or your municipality for information on landfill hours in your community.

plant that was to be sited in our community. In fact it was our strong opposition, along with many others from around the province, that caused the government to re-examine its position and place a ten year moratorium on all coal fired power generation in the province. The coalbed methane issue now being pushed forward in the community appears even more critical. Living as close as we do to large urban areas we can continue to expect more problem industries unacceptable to the lower mainland. Medical waste disposal and industrial dry cleaning operations were both turned down by the town and yet the dry cleaning operation ended up in Area H, eventually incurring serious legal problems related to the handling of toxic wastes.

I am however very positive about the potential reopening of the mine, believing that there is no better place for a new mine than on an existing mine site, and, of course, of 274 high paying jobs will certainly benefit the entire community. While

I support and encourage new industry I believe that we can and must manage our area intelligently and sustainably, protecting and preserving our most valuable resources, clear air, clean water and the environment that makes up this wonderful rural lifestyle we so much enjoy.

I am participating in this election because I believe that it is a responsibility of the Regional Director to become aware of both potentially beneficial and troublesome industries and to work with the entire constituency to assess the associated risks and rewards so that informed decisions are reached. The sheer extent of Area H dictates that these and all other important decisions should not be made in a vacuum by one individual but rather through a strong, diverse and transparent APC board that meets and reports on a regular basis. I believe as well that voters should be given a choice for any elected position. I therefore respectfully offer my name as a candidate.
