The Princeton Accessibility Awareness Committee is pleased to report the results of our past year's activities. The goals of our committee are to raise awareness regarding accessibility issues and to move our community, Princeton, towards becoming an inclusive, accessible place for everyone. Are we there yet? No, but we are moving in the right direction!

Accessibility is an important issue. There are many reasons to make our community and society more accessible. We have an aging population, people are living longer, live independently longer, and our elderly are more active and demand more of life.

Our physically challenged are living more active lives and have reached and are reaching for horizons previously thought impossi-



We were pleased to be involved in several accessibility improvement projects in Princeton. Thank you to 2010 Legacy Measuring Up Initiative for providing us with a grant of \$15,000. The Measuring Up and Inclusion Grant has allowed us to fund several specific initiatives to improve accessibility and the quality of life for many people in Princeton.

We were able to provide partial or full funding to the following organizations: the Princeton Tourist Information building, \$234 for washroom grab bars; the Princeton Skills Centre, \$128 for washroom grab bars; Princeton Community Services, \$2,700 for an automatic door opener, Mary Anne Apartments, \$3,000 for an automatic door opener; Vermilion Court, \$610 for accessibility improvements; Princeton Family Place, \$65 for washroom grab bars; the Royal Canadian Legion, \$2,000 to help fund the construction of an accessible washroom; Riverside Centre, \$2,000 to help fund the construction of an accessible washroom; the Senior Citizens' Hall, \$2,435 for washroom renovations;

and the Senior Citizens' Hall, \$1,100 to help fund the purchase of automatic door openers.

Also, we offered Ron Harkness and Peoples' Pharmacy a grant to install an automatic door opener. Very generously, Harkness provided most of the funds for this improvement. We are appreciative that School District #58 acted on our request for a change in the designated parking area at Princeton Secondary. And we want to acknowledge Princeton Hospital for the construction of the accessible washrooms near their lobby area. Thank you to everyone for helping make Princeton more accessible.

Accessibility is not a one year project and there are many issues and concerns we are currently pursuing or will pursue in the future. One concern is the condition of our sidewalks and the sidewalk to street transitions. We were hopeful that following the walk-about with

Town Council members in May of 2007, and the subsequent report to Town Council, that some positive action would have occurred. Unfortunately, not much has changed; our sidewalks and transition areas remain hazardous to pedestrians.

In July 2008, we presented Town Hall with a detailed assessment of sidewalk conditions on Bridge Street. In the past two weeks, we have completed a detailed assessment of Vermilion Avenue and all the streets that intersect with Bridge Street and Vermilion Avenue. We believe that all the hazards need to be fixed, but recognize that there are always constraints such as funds and available workers.

Therefore, at the request of Town Hall, we identified Bridge Street from Veteran's Boulevard to Angela Avenue; and Vermilion Avenue from Bridge Street to Second Street as our first priority, not necessarily

based on the degree of hazard, but rather the higher number of people that walk in these areas. Town Council is now in possession of this

The pedestrian crossing at Highway 3 and Burton Avenue is an issue we have been pursuing since January 2008. We have written two letters to the Operations Manager for the Ministry of Transportation for our region expressing our concern that pedestrians face an undue risk at this crossing.

Response time was very slow, but on August 12, 2008, we were informed that the Ministry of Transportation did not see the need to install a traffic light at Highway 3 and Burton due to low vehicular traffic. We believe, that regardless of the volume of vehicular traffic, the nature of this highway crossing makes it hazardous. We believe that continued on Page 9

Area H has contributed \$2,000 to


the PXA for expenses.

Posse add internet, lose home opener

The Valley First Princeton Posse hosted their home opener of the 2008/09 KIJHL Season September 13th against Fernie Ghostriders.

Despite the many other activities taking place around town over the weekend, which included the BC Professional Bull Riders Finals, Princeton Rotary Club annual Taste of Ales and a R/C Jet Rally, Princeton Arena was filled with hockey fans anxious to get a look at their new team.

Princeton opened the scoring at 9:19 with a goal by Dylen McKinlay off a pass from Spencer Brooks.

The Ghostriders tied the game with a power play goal with 2:05 left in the frame.

Fernie added two more goals in the second period to take the lead but the home team did not give up. In fact, Princeton continued to put pressure on the Ghostriders and added their second goal of the game on the power play only a minute into the third period.

Evan Weaver got the goal with assists going to Leeland Malkinson and Brody Brewster.

Fernie replied 13-seconds later and added three more goals before Princeton managed to score another of their own with 1:26 left in the game.

Nick Cecconi scored the marker with assistance from Nolan O'Brien and Jared Hidber. Although Fernie won the game with a scoré of 7 to 3, the stats sheet tells a slightly different story.

Princeton had pelted the Fernie net with 41 shots compared to 32 by the Ghostriders, and Fernie took 22-minutes of penalties compared to Princeton's 10-minutes.

There were no fights, and both teams played a solid, action-filled game.

The game also marked the first time Princeton had broadcast playby-play from Princeton Arena on the internet.

Posse Assistant Coach Kevin Robillard gets the credit for setting the system up which will be used at every home game this season.

Former Princeton Broadcaster George Elliott will be the 'internet voice' of the Posse.

"In my radio career than spanned just over 22-years, I had never done a play-by-play before so I was pretty excited when the team approached me to see if I was interested in giving it a try," says Elliott who is the Owner/Publisher of the Similkameen News Leader.





News from Village Council

The Village of Keremeos has released 'media highlights' from the September 8, 2008 Regular Council Meeting of Council.

- Council heard from Mary Ellen Heidt, General Manager of Community Futures Development Corporation of Okanagan Similkameen (CFDCOS) who provided an overview of their 2007-2008 annual Several issues were highlighted by Heidt including the fact that Jeff Rowe, who was also in attendance, serves on the Board of Directors and is also a member of Community Futures' loans advisory committee. She noted that CFDCOS was started with a \$1.5 million grant which has been invested and has grown to \$4.5

Community Futures is a higher risk lender than are banks and other lending institutions, and out of \$1.4 million granted to 30 businesses in 2007, \$73,200 of that was infused into the Keremeos area to 5 start-up businesses. 14% of all loans in the last 5 years have been allocated to Keremeos area start-up businesses.

Heidt noted that CFDCOS is focusing on three major initiatives, those being affordable housing, transportation and regional economic development. She cited the example of the Town of Oliver recently identifying some land within their jurisdiction, and partnering with CFDCOS to look at different models of affordable housing complexes.

- Council heard from Wanda and Ed Chipeur, property owners of a 9 acre parcel of land within the Village that is also subject to the Agricultural Land Commission rules as it lies within the land reserve. The Chipeurs had requested support from Council in July 2008 for the subdivision of their land within the reserve, but Council had denied their request.

They approached Council on September 8, 2008 to restate their request and provide additional information, asking Council to reconsider its earlier decision. Council agreed to consider the September 8, 2008 request at its meeting of September 22, 2008.

- Council received a letter from the BC Egg Marketing Board that raised concerns about a resolution being considered at the upcoming Union of BC Municipalities convention in Penticton.

The resolution urges the provincial government to enact a ban on conventional egg farming due to apparent poor conditions for the animals. The BC Egg Marketing Board's letter requests that Council give its full consideration to the resolution going forward to UBCM.

- Council appointed an additional

staff member of SOS Security Services Ltd. as a Bylaw Enforcement Officer for the Village. An additional appointed officer provides more flexibility for the Village in enforcing its bylaws.

- Council 'passed a resolution to endorse the Village's participation in the Measuring Up Initiative, a 2010 Legacies Now initiative. Measuring Up is a program which, typically through the services of a volunteer committee, assesses the amenities within a municipality that provide accessibility to persons with disabilities, and makes recommendations to the municipality for improvements

 Council gave three readings to a bylaw amending the Village's Mobile Business License Bylaw to amend the list of participating municipalities to remove the District of Sicamous and add the District of Westside.

The mobile business licensing scheme allows those business operators who may do business in one or more municipality within the participating area to purchase a separate license in their 'home' municipality that allows them to do business in all the other participating municipalities. This eliminates the need to purchase separate business licenses in each jurisdiction that requires one.





This is a good time to purchase tomatoes in bulk from the producers, as the price of field tomatoes declines at this time of year. You can preserve enough for the winter months at an economical cost. Tomatoes can be preserved whole, diced, made into spaghetti sauce or catsup. As the best red colouring is found in the tomato skin, leave the skin on the tomato when you preserve it. Tomatoes can be dried very easily, and freeze well, so even if you do not want to can them, you can still find a way to keep them for





BC OYEARS

The Great Fire of Vancouver Insights into BC's history

June 13th, 1856, was a Sunday. A small crew of Canadian Pacific railway men was keeping their eyes on a small clearing fire they had set the day before. It was in an area between today's Hastings and Granville streets and they were clearing the ground of stumps and other forest debris near the new roundhouse.

The wind that day was strong enough to take the coal hulk Robert Kerr anchored off Deadman's Island and push her, dragging her anchor, down to Hastings sawmill at the foot of Dunlevy Street. Here, she was later to act as a refuge for people who had jumped into the inlet to escape the fury of the fire.

The reason the original clearing fire got away was a freakish squall and a sudden blast of wind from the West; it was strong enough to blow big trees over.

The wind blew flames and burning debris into the sprawling tinder-dry collection of homely wooden buildings that was the two month old City of Vancouver.

Someone who saw the ominous black clouds of rising smoke began furiously ringing the bells of St James Church at Powell and Westminster Road, today's Main Street, but it was already too late.

For many it was the first warning of the fire. Soon there were the alarmed shouts of men running ahead of the flames to escape and trying to warn others, but the fire overtook them, leaping from treetop to treetop in the heavily forested area south of Hastings.

It descended with a roar on to the defenseless Vancouver. A fire-fighting steam pump purchased by the City would not arrive until August of that year. Fire-fighters had only axes, shovels and buckets.

Dozens of lives were claimed by the fire and the only structures not destroyed were a stone building in the West End, the Hastings Mill Store and a few structures along the bank of False Creek.

An estimated \$1.3 million was lost in destroyed property, but within four days new buildings began to appear. Shortly after the fire, \$6,900 was raised for firefighting equipment and a fire hall and water tank were constructed.

Vancouver's lone constable, one John Stewart, was joined by Jackson Abray, V.W. Hayward and John McLaren when Mayor McClean appointed them special constables to assist in the aftermath of the fire, thereby creating the first police force for the City.

Fires in the new towns of the late 1800's were not uncommon, but what made Vancouver's unique was its speed. A City of about 1,000 wooden buildings was destroyed in less than 45 minutes, some say as little as 20. Details vary in the accounts of eyewitnesses, but all agree it happened with stunning suddenness. "Vancouver didn't burn", said one eyewitness, "It exploded!"

...... continued from Front Page pedestrian safety should be the determining factor. The crossing is also inaccessible. The traffic island for the activation button is not accessible to pedestrians during our snowy months, is always difficult to access for our less able, and is never accessible for people using a scooter or wheelchair. Highway 3 cuts a four lane swath through our community and the pedestrian activated light at Burton Avenue is our only marked crossing; and it is not unreasonable that pedestrians, including our less able, need to cross the highway. We have letters of support from the Town of Princeton and the RCMP; but were informed these letters were irrelevant. We have invited Kevin Falcon, our Transportation Minister, to visit Princeton and investigate the situation. We will continue to pursue this matter.

Our Committee will continue to work on improving accessibility in Princeton. Beyond working to

ensure the projects we have already started come to fruition, our committee has several projects to work on during the coming year. We have started an assessment of designated handicapped parking spaces and plan to make a report, with recommendations, to Town Council in the coming year. We are going to work on developing a booklet identifying accessible stores, restaurants, accommodations, and attractions in Princeton.

We will continue our work with the Town of Princeton to identify physical hazards in an effort to help make our streets safer for everybody, including our seniors and those who have difficulty walking.

Improving accessibility is a long term project. We appreciate the support and encouragement we have



(NC)-Unsure what to do with leftover cooked chicken breasts? Try this for a great quick and easy dinner sandwich.

- 8 slices Country Harvest +Plus 100% Whole Wheat & Fibre Bread
- 6 oz. (175 g) boneless, skinless, cooked chicken, finely chopped





Mayor sends a progress report

To The Editor;

Here is a progress report on what your Town Council has been doing.

As you may be aware council put out tenders for our town square project and they came in considerably over our budget. We cancelled that tender and have proceeded with the municipality taking over as general contractor and local tradesmen being asked to help bring the project in at our level of funding.

Dave Woodruff, a so-called 'retired' electrical contractor with extensive experience on major projects in the lower mainland has agreed to oversee the project. We have received estimates from local contractors that reassure us that we can bring the project in on budget with very little alteration from the originally engineered concept.

Lyle Thomas from municipal staff has been assigned to the project and will coordinate what time our town crew will be able to commit. Lyle describes how the project will be divided into two phases with the north side of Vermilion Avenue as Phase 1, which is already underway and which we hope will be completed before winter. That will

leave the cenotaph area available for Remembrance Day with work beginning in the spring, council is confident we can complete the entire project prior to the busy summer.

We removed one tree in order to reconstruct the street, all the rest will stay. In the neighbourhood of six new trees will be added in the new concept.

-We are still waiting for clearance on our water project. Brenda Gould, local archeologist with USIB has been very helpful in moving things along, however, we continue to have government bureaucratic difficulties and this is quite frustrating when we are as anxious as the construction firm to proceed. We are intent on accomplishing as much as possible prior to freeze up.

We have been granted the ability to access the entire grant for the airport fuel system, which will enable us to construct a terminal building. That building will incorporate an office, washrooms, shower and an area for pilots to make arrangements for overnight motel accommodations if they so desire. A courtesy car, kindly donated by "Airport Dave" Woodruff is

already on hand for pilots who need access to downtown. We are currently seeking prices for the buildings' foundation which we will be beginning without delay.

Together with Councillor Manion, I met with Copper Mountain Mining President Jim O'Rourke, who continues to be cautiously optimistic about the reopening of the mine. The permitting of the property continues to fall into place and the feasibility study was very positive which left the remaining issue of financing as the prime concern.

Jim was happy to relay that financing discussions are progressing and there is a good possibility that within the next month much more will be understood. He also met with our Administrator Patrick Robins, to begin to explore the availability of property for a housing development and rental accommodation within the community. Jim would no doubt say that there is still a long way to go but to me things seem to be progressing very well.

The aquatic centre design estimate has been completed by the consultants and is now in front of the municipality and Regional District financial departments in order to project the tax increase for residents and businesses so that everyone can make an informed decision when a referendum is put forward sometime in the new year.

Finally, I wish to thank those people who relayed get well thoughts following my attempt to fly off our cabin loft, it really was a comfort in the face of my carelessness.

All indications are pointing towards Princeton becoming the new home of the BC Professional Bull Riders Finals for at least the next five years.





The intent behind the repeal and re-enactment of all Official Community Plan Bylaws, Zoning Bylaws and Rural Land Use Bylaws enacted within the Regional District is in order to make the bylaws more accessible to the general public by facilitating ease of use and to ensure that the policies, guidelines, and regulations contained in the bylaws have been validly enacted and are enforceable.

The process of making the bylaws more accessible to the general public has involved the The process of making the bylaws more accessible to the general public has involved the consolidation of "general regulations" under a single section of the zoning bylaws; the standardization of the general layout applied to the bylaws; the updating of references to Provincial ministries and agencies (many of which have been renamed or reconstituted); the standardization of the layout of the provisions relating to each individual zone; the standardization of how site specific amendments are Introduced; the creation of a uniform list of zones (without altering the list of permitted uses in each zone); and, where appropriate, the standardization and update of definitions found in each of the zoning bylaws. 
