## District reports on class sizes

As a requirement of four sections contained within the School Act and the recently amended Class Size Regulation, School District 58 (Nicola-Similkameen) Superintendent of Schools Bob Peacock issued an update on class size and composition at the December 16th regular meeting of the Board of Education in Princeton.

"I confirm that the organization of classes for schools within School District 58 is in compliance with the provisions of the School Act and is appropriate for student learning," Peacock stated.

In Kindergarten (including splits) the maximum number of students allowed in one class is 22. The district

average was 14 in 2008/09, far less than the provincial average of 17.7, and is projected at 18.3 in 2009/10 with full-time Kindergarten being considered for John Allison Elementary.

In Grades 1 to 3/4 the maximum number of students allowed in one class is 24. The district average in 2008/09 was 20.1 (provincial average: 20.6) and the projected average for 2009/10 is 20.9 in School District 58.

In Grades 4-7 (Vermilion Forks Elementary only) classes are not to exceed 30 students unless the teacher has been consulted with or unless in the opinion of the Superintendent and ..... continued on Page 3

## District superintendent releases report

Bob Peacock, Superintendent of Schools for District 58 (Nicola-Similkameen) released the following at the December 16th meeting of the Board of Education in Princeton:

The 2009-10 school year for School District 58 is one of dramatic change for the district staff. The Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Vice-Principal for Student Support Services, and the Principal of Aboriginal Education are all new to their positions. While this causes some concern it also allows for a fresh examination of issues and recommendations for changes.

The district is in the second year of its one-to-one laptop computer project. Computers are given to grade 7 students with the plan of continuing this practice through to grade 9. In support of the use of computers, teachers, upon the completion of an eight hour intense training program,

are also given a laptop computer. School-based administrators have further supported the use of technology with the purchase of products such as classroom projectors and Smart Boards.

The implementation of new programs is supported through the employment of itinerant teachers focussing on literacy, numeracy and technology. There is a concerted effort to coordinate their activities through the use of Google calendar. To ensure that everyone responsible for the implementation of professional development works together a district committee has been established and meets on a regular basis.

In accordance with the School Act the following is the Superintendent's Report on Student Achievement for School District #58 (Nicola-Similkameen).

**Improving areas of student achievement**

- The FSA grade 4 reading results have shown the greatest increase in the past few years. There is also awareness that the period of time in

which the FSA was administrated have changed.

- The FSA grade 4 reading results for Aboriginal students have shown a significant increase over previous results.

- The number of secondary students interested in trades programs has increased. Last year carpentry students were involved with the construction of a home.

- A renewed focus on the individual student including the development of student profiles across the District at the grade 1, 3, 6, 8 and 10 levels; the re-examination of present intervention and development of new strategies in relation to District profiles.

- The examination of the continuing and alternate programs to better support students.

- To improve writing skills laptop computers have been purchased for students with learning disabilities and all grade 7 and 8 students (Year 3 will include grade 9 students).

- Four Assessment for Learning workshops have been planned

throughout this school year. To develop a common language and knowledge around AFL these workshops will be attended by school-based administrators and classroom teachers.

- To help develop student and staff

resiliency the following programs have been implemented:

- Road to Goals - a role model program of speakers coming into the schools.

- High School Mentorship Program ..... continued on Page 2

## MANAGING YOUR \$\$\$

**YEAR-END PERSONAL TAX TIPS - PART 3**

As 2009 comes to close, there are a number of things you can do to help reduce your tax bill for the current year, and/or future years. Here are a few year-end tax tips to consider.


**Long-term fixed income investments:** If you're considering purchasing a long-term fixed income investment this month, keep in mind that even if the investment pays no interest in 2010, tax will be payable with your 2010 tax return on the interest that accrues to the first anniversary date (December 2010). Consider delaying the purchase to January 2010, and the related tax will be deferred one year.

**Registered education savings plans (RESP):** Contribute to an RESP before the end of the year to save for your child's education. With a contribution of \$2,500 per child, the federal government will contribute a Canada Education Savings Grant (CESG) of \$500. If you have prior non-contributory years, the annual CESG can be as much as \$1,000 (in respect of a \$5,000 contribution). If your child is 15 this year, and you have never contributed to an RESP on his or her behalf, keep in mind that 31 December 2009 is the last chance you have to make a contribution and earn the CESG for that child.


**Tax-free savings account:** If you haven't yet done so, make your tax-free savings account contribution for 2009, and make your 2010 contribution as early as you can in 2010. Income earned in this plan is completely tax free. You can also fund your spouse's/partner's contribution without attracting the attribution rules.

**Registered retirement savings plan (RRSP):** Consider making your contribution for 2010 as early as possible in 2010. You can choose to make the contribution to your own plan or a spousal plan. Contributions to a spousal plan can facilitate pension income splitting in future years.

Remember, to be deductible for 2009, your RRSP contribution must be made no later than 1 March 2010. However, it is preferable to make your RRSP contributions as early as possible to allow tax-sheltered investment income to start growing.

#### Small Businesses Give Back - All Year Long

#### British Columbia's small businesses and charitable giving

Despite the economic challenges that British Columbia's small- and medium-sized businesses have faced over the last year, their commitment to charitable giving remains resilient. Small business owners are among the most generous in the province with an overwhelming 96 percent of small businesses in BC giving back to their local communities by supporting, in some manner, charitable and community causes.

"Small businesses have and continue to face many struggles, yet despite this they find the resources and time to give back. They are fully entrenched in their communities and their generosity is really no surprise," said Brian Bonney, Director of Provincial Affairs BC.

Despite the weaker economy, 46

per cent of small business owners have maintained their level of contribution to charities, while 6 per cent of respondents indicating that they have increased their charitable support. According to the report, Giving back: British Columbia's small business owners and charitable giving, approximately three-quarters of small business owners provided cash donations, while almost half helped promote or advertise charitable and community causes. Other ways small businesses are supporting charitable and community causes include:

- In-kind donations of goods and services (60 per cent);
- Donating owner's personal time (44 per cent); and
- Allowing employees to volunteer during company time (22 per cent).

"Small businesses are the cornerstone of our economy and communities," added Bonney. "Their contribution to creating a stronger

province goes beyond simply providing employment opportunities and paying taxes, but is reflective of their status as residents of the communities in which they are located."

..... continued from Front Page Principal the organization of the class is appropriate for student learning. In 2008/09 the school had an average class size of 23.6 (provincial average: 25.8) with the projected figure for 2009/10 set at 23.9.

In Grades 7 to 12 there are a total of 36 classes with no special-needs students per class, 54 classes with 1 SNS, 74 classes with 2 SNS, an additional 74 classes with 3 SNS and 91 classes with 4 or more special-needs students per class.

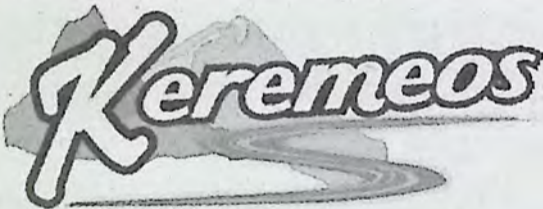

## Village Council meeting highlights

The Village of Keremeos has released the following Media Highlights from the December 7th regular meeting of Village Council:

- Council provided support for the request from the Okanagan-Similkameen Regional Hospital District for the Pentiction Regional Hospital Ambulatory Care Upgrade Project.
- Council also provided support for MP Alex Atamanenko's proposal to contact the Federal Transport Minister to explore the possibility of federal assistance for the services that Greyhound provides. Greyhound is proposing service cutbacks, and Mr. Atamanenko believes that with the Federal government assisting the aerospace, rail and rapid transit industries in various areas of the country, that long distance bus services should also be considered for assistance to ensure the continuation of this service for rural BC communities.
- Council received several pieces of correspondence regarding the impact material in the Pine Park playground. After considerable time and expense, the Village has replaced the pea gravel originally

- placed in the playground with engineered wood fibre material. A local resident had complained to Interior Health, the BC Ombudsman, and Communities for Kids, all of whom are now satisfied with the new impact material.
- Council received a letter from BC Assessment regarding the proposed closure of their Pentiction office. A letter from the Canadian Union of Public Employees raising concerns about the proposed closure was also received. Council agreed to send a letter supporting the retention of the Pentiction office in order to prevent service reductions to residents of the South Okanagan and Similkameen.
- Council appointed Councillor Gary Thielmann as the Village's representatives to the Okanagan Regional Library Board, with Councillor Ed Minshall being appointed as the alternate.
- Council confirmed several recommendations from the Committee of the Whole meeting that took place on November 30, 2009. Staff was asked to install 'Smoke Free Zone' signs around

- the two playgrounds and the Skateboard Park once signs are obtained.
- The December 21, 2009 Council meeting was cancelled, and staff was given the authority to destroy the old playground equipment from Memorial Park (metal slide and climbing apparatus) due to concerns about safety.
- Council passed a resolution to opt out of the Okanagan Bylaw Dispute Adjudication Process that is being set up amongst various local governments in the region. While a good program, the low numbers of tickets written that are subsequently disputed in the Village of Keremeos do not warrant the participation in the program at this time.
- Council supported staff's request to cancel the proposed purchase of a new plow for the Village's dump truck. Staff recommended that the current plow is adequate to allow staff to effectively clear snow during the 2009/2010 winter. Cancelling the plow purchase eliminates an unnecessary expense in the 2009 budget year.
- Council discussed the issue of transient campers in and around the Village during the active agricultural season, hearing from staff regarding various avenues to resolve the issue. A citizens committee has been formed with Village residents, orchardists, the RCMP and municipal representatives to discuss the issues and make recommendations on potential resolutions that will benefit both Village residents and the temporary workers.

# Princeton 1860 - 2010

## 150 Years of Similkameen History

In the fall of 1860 the town site of Princeton was laid out by Sgt McColl of the British Royal Engineers. 150 years further on in 2010, Princeton is set to take on a new lease of life as the Similco mine on Copper Mountain is set to

reopen. Over this long period of time people, places and events have continued to make the headlines in the year's in-between. A quick glance at the "Our Place in Time" section on the new 2010 anniversary calendar more than bears this out!

Today, ask anyone to write-down the interesting people from the past who had the most influence in helping the Community's development and you will get dozens of different answers.

Foremost, I suspect, John Fall

and/or Susan Allison would be included by most people, but in-truth the list could be endless and it would be wrong to name one person before another. Personally, I think that long-time Similkameen Star Editor Dave Taylor would be on my list, as would Bert Irwin, Rev John Goodfellow and former Mayor Gloria Stout, but the choices are purely mine and perhaps during the course of the 2010 150 celebrations the newspaper could run a survey canvassing the opinion of their readership on the subject.

Many of the early settlements have disappeared, their names left to the passing of time; Blackfoot, seven miles up-stream from Princeton on the Similkameen River being just one. An early edition of the British Colonist published in Victoria, talks of forty houses there, including miners' cabins on Blackfoot Flat. In 1861 men were certainly working their claims on the Similkameen at nearby Kruger's Bar.

The small community was soon forgotten when in 1865 gold was discovered on the Tulameen River at Granite Creek where a much larger township sprang-up which according to the records grew to the third largest settlement in the Province before becoming one more of the many ghost towns of Southern BC.

Significant events of the past 150 years are so numerous it is hard to choose between many of them. The arrival of the first railways in

Princeton, the Kettle Valley Railway in 1915, which had followed the Vancouver Victoria and Eastern's appearance in 1909, was very significant in the development of the area's natural resources. Whether it was the 1930 "Black Wednesday" at Blakeburn or the bunkhouse fire at Copper Mountain five years before, Princeton over the years has suffered its share of tragic events. The Town also has had more than its quota of celebratory occasions, 1965 was the first Racing Days, 1967 the first Fall Fair and 1988 the inaugural Princeton - Tonasket Pony Express ride.

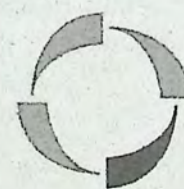
In 1978 the Town of Princeton was incorporated and previous to that in 1953 the First Village Commissioners had been elected whilst the opening of Princeton's first hospital in 1911, the Airport 1932, today's Post Office 1955 and Senior Citizen's Centre in 1989 were all past events to be remembered during the Town's rich past.

Over the course of 2009 and writing this series of articles on Princeton's 150 history one thing has become very evident to me and that is the history of the Town and surrounding area is second to none in the Province of British Columbia. Whether it is the people, places or events, there is so much to tell that today still remains untold about the Valley in which we live and the year 2010 will give us all a wonderful opportunity to learn more.

**What To Do With Leftover Turkey**

In most households, there is always turkey left over after Christmas dinner.  
Many cooks lament over what to do with the turkey. As turkey is so rich in nutrients, try to use every scrap of it, including the skeleton.  
The first thing you can do with leftover turkey is freeze it if you do not want to deal with more turkey on Boxing Day.

There are other things you can do with leftover turkey. You can make a turkey casserole by making use of leftover gravy (or a white sauce) and add leftover vegetables to the liquid and cut up turkey. Top with leftover mashed potatoes and bake until the liquid is bubbly.  
You can make Turkey a la King, which is turkey in white sauce with vegetables. Keep in mind that turkey loves onions, so add lots of onions if you like them.  
Do not mix turkey with tomatoes. Turkey loses its flavour with tomatoes, and it gets an off taste if you add garlic.  
Open face hot turkey sandwiches are a good way to use leftover turkey and gravy. Some people adore cold turkey sandwiches made with cranberry sauce. Turkey is enhanced by pears, so you might prefer pear sauce if you are not fond of cranberry sauce. Both are highly nutritious.  
The skeleton (called the "rack") makes a good soup. Simmer the bones in a large pot of water for an hour or more. Cool the mixture, then pick off the bits of meat clinging to the bones and add to the liquid. Discard the bones. Add chopped onion, parsley, a small amount of poultry seasoning, grated carrot, and barley or white beans. Cook until the barley or beans are soft. This may make more soup than you can eat at one meal, but you can freeze the soup in containers.  
Never let the thought of leftover turkey stop you from using the whole bird.  
Turkey is so good for you it should not be wasted. Enjoy it!

## Hillman receives honour, leads team to victory

Saturday, December 19th was a big game for Princeton Posse as they played host to Grand Forks Border Bruins.

Not only was the Posse tied for third place in the division going into the game, it would mark the final home game of 2009 as the team enters a Christmas break, and team captain Dan Hillman was honoured by the hockey organization for his incredible career as a Posse player.

Princeton pulled netminder Mitch Sheridan with 2.1-seconds in the period and nearly scored again with players crowding the Grand Forks net and swinging at rebounds.

The third period was owned by the Posse and 'Mr. Posse' Dan Hillman.

Hillman scored at 18:16 with assists going to Spencer Kristensen and Evan Stack and added an assist to a goal scored by Spencer Kristensen at 15:46, and then Hillman added an unassisted (short handed) goal at 12:51.

Final score: Princeton 5, Grand Forks 1. Shots on goal: Princeton 43, Grand Forks 11.

Princeton's next game is Saturday, January 2nd at home against Kamloops.

## It's Time To Talk Turkey - Gobble, Gobble!

'Tis the season for filling your home with the smells of home baked goodies, chestnuts roasting on an open fire, and the Christmas turkey roasting in the oven. It's also the season for making sure your turkey is cooked properly and is free from any illness-causing bacteria, such as Salmonella.

Interior Health recommends holidays chefs follow these simple food safety tips for preparing your holiday meals:

Store and thaw safely: Keep fresh turkey refrigerated no longer than three days before cooking. There are three ways to thaw frozen turkey in its wrapper:

- Under cold running water (one hour per pound);
- In a clean sink full of cold water,

changing the water every couple of hours;  
- In the fridge (five hours per pound).

Thawing poultry at room temperature will allow harmful bacteria to grow and is not recommended. Be sure to keep other items, especially those with dairy, mayonnaise or other moist, protein-rich foods chilled until served.

**Clean carefully:** Wash your hands, utensils and work surfaces well before prep work begins. Once the preparation work is done, clean surfaces in hot soapy water, rinse, then sanitize. Sanitizing can be done with a diluted bleach solution (30 ml of bleach per gallon of water) that is allowed to sit for two minutes. Wash your hands well

after cleaning the cutting board and before and after working with any new menu items.

**Avoid cross contamination:** Store meat away from food that is ready-to-eat, including fruit and vegetables (and be sure to wash these thoroughly before serving). Turkeys should be wrapped well and stored on the lowest shelf of your fridge or in the meat keeper to keep blood and juices from contaminating other food. Use a separate cutting board to prepare raw meat whenever possible.

**Cook well:** For turkey, set the oven at no lower than 350 °F (177 °C) and cook for about 20 minutes per pound. Use a good meat thermometer to measure the turkey's ..... continued on Page 14

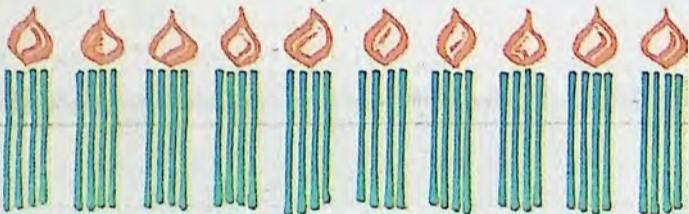

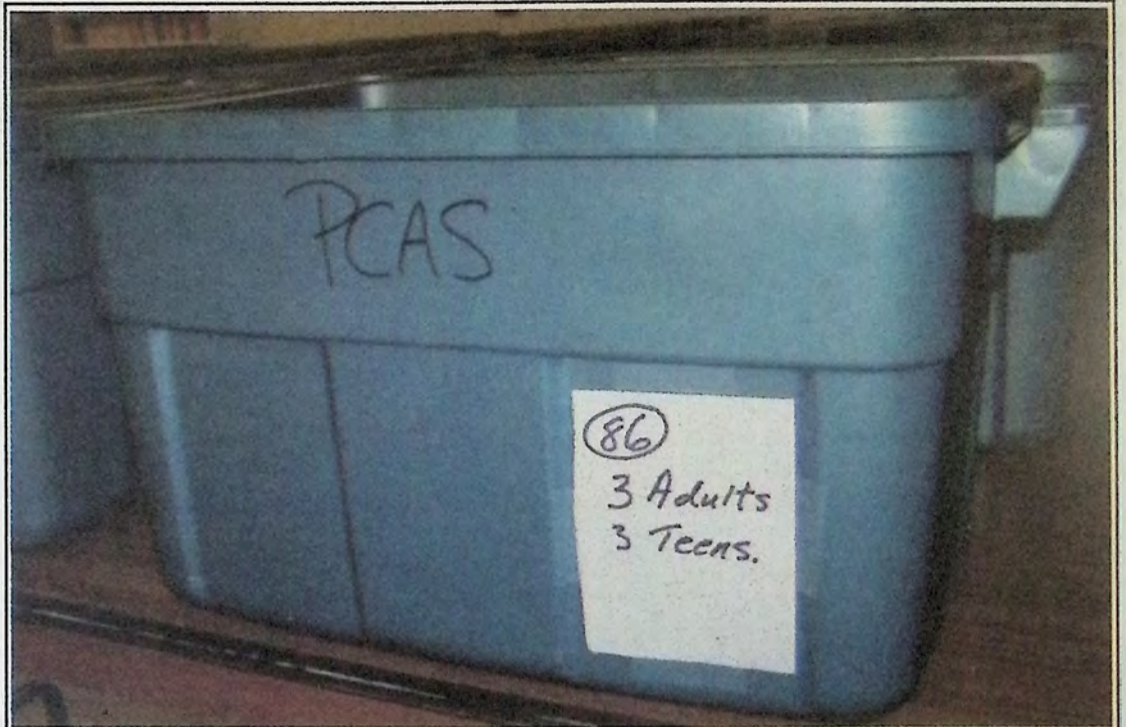

 internal temperature and ensure it's safe to eat - 165 °F (74°C) or 185 °F (85 °C) for a stuffed bird. Insert the thermometer into the thickest part of the breast or thigh. Cooked food should be kept at 140 °F (60 °C) while waiting to serve.  
**Refrigerate:** Chill food immediately after returning from the store and soon after dinner is complete. Perishable food should be left unrefrigerated for no longer than two hours after you remove it from the

oven. Refrigerate at 40°F (4 °C) or in a freezer at 0° F (-18 °C). Health Canada recommends two to three days for refrigerated leftovers or simply freezing them in order to keep them longer.

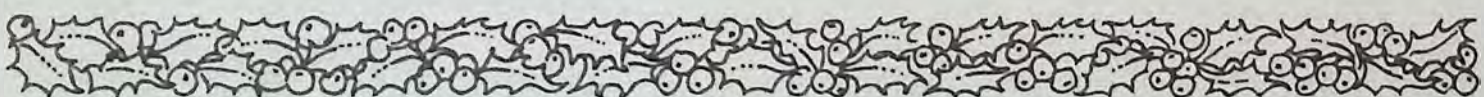

## Christmas 2009; A Time For Celebration

When I look back a year to Christmas last, I think of how much better off we are now. Last year, we faced the result of the meltdown on Wall Street. We foresaw a big recession looming on the horizon. The news about the economy was enough to scare the most dedicated optimist. Despite all of the bad news, Princeton people did come through for the Christmas Hamper Fund, as always.

This year, Christmas is more to the liking of optimists. I don't know if our world is a better place this year, but I do know we have achieved greater economic stability. We can look forward to better times.

Christmas is a time in my personal year when I look back to other Christmases in my life. Some blur into a happy, busy haze. Some stand out on their own, with special meaning just for me. Others, like the Christmas of 1980, are remembered due to a natural disaster. I should explain about Christmas 1980. It was one of those El Nino winters.

To begin with, we had no real snow until just the week before Christmas. I looked forward to a house full of young visitors and wondered what I could do to keep them busy on Boxing Day. I booked six sets of cross country skis at Manning Park. This outing was not to be. The rain started on Christmas Eve, continued all Christmas Day and went on into Boxing Day. All over southern B.C., floods covered roads and washed out bridges. My guests stayed extra days, waiting for the 'all clear' so they could return home.

I remember other Christmases when we grieved: my father passed away on Christmas Eve and my older brother died just before Christmas. Each year, I think of them and miss them.

I remember a Christmas when we waited for my brother to come home from World War II, but he was two months late. We kept his gifts waiting for him.

I remember another Christmas of waiting for our first great-grandchild, and she arrived on Boxing Day.

One of the Christmas memories that stands out in my list of Christmases was Christmas 1943. We lived in town, my grandfather, mother and me, while my dad lived on my grandfather's farm. My grandfather was ill. There were lots of things wrong that Christmas. My two brothers were fighting in Europe, my mother was very pregnant and overworked caring for my grandfather and me, and the whole world was at war. Three days before Christmas, my grandfather was running a fever and was very ill. The doctor came to the house and after examining my grandfather, turned to my mother and me. We were both sick, too. The doctor bundled all of us into his car and took us to the hospital.

There was no phone out on the farm, so when my father came to town on Christmas Eve, expecting a warm house filled with Christmas anticipation, what he found was a cold, empty house. The neighbour told him what had happened, which calmed his panic.

My special memory of that Christmas was how thrilled I was when we had a turkey dinner in the hospital served on a specially decorated tray.

The ladies of the Hospital Auxiliary had gone to a lot of effort to make sure every patient had a dinner tray decorated for the holiday. I recall a little red basket made of construction paper and filled with candy. I am sure those ladies would not have guessed that one little girl would cherish that memory 65 years later.

Then there was a Christmas two years ago when I was totally alone. My husband went to the hospital and my friends and children were spending Christmas elsewhere. I wondered, "Is this a forewarning of Christmases to come?"

There are Christmases that stand out because they were so unlike the treasured happy Christmas memories of times spent with children, friends, grandchildren, parents, and all the other family members. I do not recall any special gifts of any particular year. There is a lesson in that. Like everyone else, I go Christmas shopping and fuss over wrappings, decorate the tree, put on a feast, and make home as warm and welcoming as possible, but I don't remember any of those things when I think back to all of those happy Christmases. What I do recall is the happiness, the pure contentment, of celebrating Christmas with loved ones. It was not the gifts, the decorations nor the feasting I remember, it was being surrounded by happy people.

We always say Christmas is about giving. Maybe the greatest gift of Christmas is the love we give each other?
