

Dawn Johnson will be head convenor again, and assist with registration of exhibits and displays in building #2. Laila Bird has expressed an interest in taking charge of the flower show.


Jen Bernard and her crew will operate the concession stand. This year, Fall Fair members are exploring a plan to host a Saturday night dinner

\$3,988.62 cheque? Well, if you received it in a letter in the mail from a company called KatzGroup (KatzGroup Canada Ltd.) of Mississauga, Ontario, the

smartest thing to do is throw it away. The company exists and can be found easily through an online search on the internet but the mail offer is phony, and the cheque is part of an elaborate scheme to get you to empty your personal bank account of close to \$4,000.

Recently a local resident came to the News Leader with a letter from the group, which stated, "This is to inform you that based on a previous survey by our affiliate Consumer survey specialist, you indicated to be interested in an additional income on a part-time bases (sic). You are hereby selected to participate in a paid Consumer Research Program in your area of residence as a MYSTERY SHOPPER."

It went on to explain, "As one of the Research Personnel selected

under this program, you will be a Consumer Service Evaluator of the selected merchant outlets and service providers. This research program is fully paid and could potentially become a permanent position for a selected few that is able to distinguish themselves in the course of this program. Your starting salary will be \$450 and will increase to \$500 per week after 3 months of working with us. This is a self-training program designed to equip you with the right tools necessary to carry out your assignments which will be completed in two different locations."

I was talking with friends the other day about how social media has changed our world and the subject of Town Council came up, more accurately the lack of presence Town Council has in the social media world. I know social media and the internet are not for everyone, but in an ever-growing connected world, if you or your business is not part of the social media scene you are going to be left behind.

Now just to be clear, Facebook is not the only social media platform for getting your message across. It is just the most popular with 800 million active users and an average of 400 million logging in daily.

Although I believe Town Council should be on Facebook, I think more importantly they should be on Twitter. Twitter is a social media platform but it is also known as a micro-blogging site which simply means you have a limited number of characters to get your message across.

I'll bet you didn't know that the cities of Kelowna and Penticton are on Twitter. They post important updates, job postings and other municipal information in their feeds. I don't expect everyone to run out and get a Twitter account, but it would be nice to see elected officials using these types of free services to get the word out, to not only locals but a possible audience of 300 million users.

The one social media platform that people seem to forget is a social media tool is YouTube. More and more I hear people saying "wouldn't it be great if council meetings were recorded and posted on YouTube?" I couldn't agree more.

It is not possible for everyone to make a council meeting, but if the

meetings were recorded and then posted to YouTube we could watch council meetings when we get home from work, away from town, or when it is more convenient. Sometimes when there is a meeting people just don't want to go, but then something is said or a decision is made and people want to know all the details.

By posting the meetings on YouTube, people could see what was actually heard verbatim and they could get the information straight from the source. It would be great for openness and transparency and great for public relations.

On the technical end, it really wouldn't take much for council meetings to be recorded and uploaded. They can even be added to the Town's website. All the hardware the Town would need can be picked up at The Source. For a few hundred dollars you can get a High Definition digital video camera and then you would only need a small mixing board (7 or 8 channels), some microphones and an extra patch cord to run from the mixer's output to the camera's external microphone's input.

Uploading it to YouTube takes a laptop or any computer that is up-todate and uploading is free. Since the Town's website is a Joomla site, there are numerous free extensions and plugins that will allow you to import YouTube videos or you could purchase a premium one that would give you extra customization. So for no more than \$500 dollars council could have every one of its meetings recorded, uploaded and accessible to everyone.

As a former councillor I would have jumped on the opportunity when I was on council to have our meetings recorded and accessible to



the public.

It would have allowed constituents to see not only what I as an elected representative did but it would have helped to educate the public as to what council really did. Who knows, Town Hall might already possess most of the hardware needed to get meetings online. Either way, all that is really needed is for council to make a decision.

- 2. The applicant must own a minimum of 50 per cent of the cattle required to fill the opportunity he/she is applying for.

Call 1-800-DEER-CULL

I've been sitting on the fence for so long about the deer issue in town that it finally hurt enough for me to hop off.

The other night I had a four-cheese pizza before going to bed.

It put my subconscious mind into such a coma that by the time I entered REM-state sleep I was having borderline hallucinations.

The one that snapped me out of my deep sleep had to do with a talking deer.

I was sitting on the yard swing at home minding my own business when this young buck casually strolled over to me and started a conversation.

He told me things I had never heard from a deer before but sounded oddly enough to be the typical opening line at any bar frequented by deer. He had lost both his parents to semis on the highway and a little sister to a coyote. You get the picture.

After being jolted awake by this nightmare, I went to get a glass of water but couldn't shake the talking deer from my mind.

It made me think a bit more about the deer issue in and around Princeton. While I haven't had a bad encounter (yet) in our yard, the talking deer dream I'll chalk up as being close enough to count as one.

What my experience, whether or not it was a dream, has taught me is that this is a very complex issue.

And to be honest with you, I don't blame Town Council for pussyfooting their way through this one. There really isn't a right answer if you ask me. I'm pretty sure each and every one of us has a deer story to share. I'm also sure the majority of them fall under the category of warm and fuzzy. However, those who have had terrifying encounters with local wildlife should not be ignored.

There are bylaws in place to deal with the feeding of deer. I seem to recall there's also a fine schedule as part of that bylaw. The problem with that bylaw is enforcement.

Again, in defence of Town Council, it's probably pretty tough to enforce that bylaw. Maybe an anonymous tip line direct to Town Hall should be installed so you can report your neighbour, providing, of course, you want to rat on your neighbour.

I agree that there is a need for a bit more education on living in a community with urban deer and I don't believe a cull is the right answer. A cull, as far as I'm concerned, is a temporary solution. There needs to be a long-term solution and once it's implemented it needs to be adhered to.

Town Council has almost three years to come up with a solution to a problem that has existed for many years already and is likely not going away any time soon. I say they have three years because if they can't come up with a workable solution in that time frame I think the only culling that will take place with be at the next municipal election.

A major think-tank group announced recently one more reason the global economy is fragile: natural disasters. While the European Union struggles to find a solution to man-made economic problems, this group of thinkers looked at what had happened to the global economy due to Mother Nature in the past two years. Their conclusion was this: the economy can cope for one week, then it begins to fail rapidly.

The think tank looked at a number of disasters and examined the cost of the disaster, not in human terms of damage and loss of life, but what the effects were on the global economy. Few of us think in those terms when we hear of a volcanic eruption or a flood or an earthquake, but think about this: the big volcanic eruption in Iceland a couple of years ago cost airlines over five billion dollars.

The big flood in Thailand last year slowed down delivery of computer

in the United States. No computers were sold for nearly two months. The company and shops in the United States had to suck up the loss of business due to a flood thousands of miles away.

The earthquake and subsequent tsunami that hit Japan last year had a severe effect on Japan's economy and on companies importing goods from Japan. All of the nations around the North Pacific will be paying the costs of the contamination from the spread of radioactive materials resulting from the explosions at the Dai-ichi nuclear power plant.

The volcanic eruption in southern Chile last year spread ash over ranches in Argentina and Uruguay that contaminated water, covered the grass, and was killing the livestock. The cattle and sheep had to be trucked out of the area, cleaned up and fed clean food and clean water.

The loss to sheep and cattle ranchers was huge. The contaminated land area was equal to the entire south Cariboo and Thompson-Okanagan ranchlands. The volcano from another country heavily impacted the economy of two countries for much longer than one week.

I recall problems we had in the first two years at the News Leader, before our TV guide was delivered by email. One time, it was a snowstorm in New York that prevented delivery of the package. Another time, it was a snowstorm between Princeton and Vancouver that slowed down delivery.

Going back even further, to Christmas 1980, flooding caused closure of half the highways in B.C., preventing people from returning home after Boxing Day. A bridge washed out in Manning Park, parts of highways north and east of Princeton were either washed out or under water. I had guests who could not return home because the bridge they relied on near their home town was closed for repairs to its foundation. These are little, local problems, nothing like the scale of big earthquakes and volcanic ash, but they have a cost.

The think-tank people stated most companies are not prepared to deal with major disruptions caused by natural disasters locally, let alone hundreds or thousands of kilometers away. Nevertheless, in a global economy in which so many companies rely on source materials manufactured elsewhere, or mined elsewhere, or built elsewhere, these companies need to start looking at what would happen if a major natural disaster hit them or their supply source. They might want to consider what would happen if a natural disaster interfered with transportation from the supply source or to the market.

This concern, along with the effects of global financial instability, should cause our politicians to take a second look at strengthening our own economy so it can withstand a major natural disaster. Nobody can assure Canadians they will not have a severe storm, because we have had such conditions. We cannot guarantee we will not have a major earthquake in our two earthquake zones, the BC coast and the St. Lawrence River basin. Nobody can guarantee one of our Yukon volcanoes will not spread ash all over the northern prairies and disrupt the polar flight routes. Not only does our civil defense and emergency service have to be prepared, our economy has to be prepared for a natural disaster. One of the ways we can avoid being too dependent on other nations for essentials is to make sure those essentials are produced close to home.

To make sure of that, we have to build up our own industries and our own local economies, to ensure that the people who produce goods we need stay in business in our own country.

On February 29th SESS will proudly participate in "Pink Shirt Day".



Info System Vital To BC Pharmacists

A number of Canadian provinces have had these types of systems since the mid-1990s. In 2010, approximately 32 per cent of community pharmacists in Canada used a DIS along with 51 per cent of all hospital emergency departments.

A report, commissioned by Canada Health Infoway and compiled by Deloitte, found that Canada's investments in drug information systems generated an estimated \$436 million in cost savings in 2010, an amount that is expected to rise to approximately \$1 billion per year as these systems become more widely used. The advantages of the DIS are

numerous; the number of adverse drug events is reduced; provide pharmacists and physicians with tools to combat medication abuse; and the dialogue between pharmacists and prescribers is improved.

"Pharmacists are seeing technology and their drug therapy expertise working in concert to transform the delivery of patient care," said Jody Shkrobot, president of the Canadian Pharmacists Association.

"By providing health care professionals with the information they need to support their clinical decisions, drug information systems are improving medication safety and effectiveness."

In B.C. all pharmacies, as well as 28 per cent of the province's doctors, are linked to PharmaNet. Stan Crowell, a practicing pharmacist for 43 years, says the day the program was introduced 15 years ago was a great day for health care in the province.

"I cannot picture people operating without it," Shkrobot continued. "With the number of potent medications we have now it would be dangerous to practice as a pharmacist without a system like PharmaNet. I would not practice in any province that did not have it. That's how strongly I feel."

That sentiment is echoed by Linda Hunt. "It is just such a great safeguard for all involved. It allows health care providers, whether they are emergency room doctors or community pharmacists, to get the information they need to do their jobs better, and that means better, safer care for patients."





Appropriate polarizing eyeware will filter out the bulk of that "horizontally polarized" light, allowing you to see a dumbeddown image of the road ahead. Taking this one step further, those fancy glasses you can wear to watch some movies do the same thing. The polarization in the right lens filters out the image that the left eye would see (and vice versa). 


"While we help our communities wherever we can, real, sustainable growth is more than writing a cheque," explains Brown.
