tocuses on air quality

It's called respirable particulate matter and it was the main focus at Princeton Air Quality Coalition's forum May 8th at Riverside Theatre.

Ralph Adams of BC Ministry of Environment explained to a crowd of 50 interested residents that air quality levels in Princeton have been monitored over a period starting 16-months ago.

In 2010 a plan was developed with the cooperation of BC's Ministry of Environment, the Town of Princeton and Princeton Co-Gen (the 'pellet plant') to measure for respirable particulate matter over a one-year period.

A parisol instrument (measuring device) was installed near the Princeton Fire Hall with filters being changed following the six day National Air Pollution Survey schedule.

Princeton Co-Gen paid for the analysis of the filters.

Adams pointed out that while the main objective of the exercise was the measure levels of PM2.5 within Princeton's residential core, there were no existing measurements in the air shed, "the measurements would be used to compare the air quality in Princeton to provincial objectives and other communities."

A total of 48 of a possible 61 filters (or 80%) were "correctly exposed and analyzed" in the time period, which began January 2011.

The data collected from the filters in Princeton were compared with measurements recorded in Merritt using the same instruments.

PM2.5 levels are significantly higher in Princeton than in Merritt or Kamloops," Adams explained.

Council approves court house analysis

A contract was awarded at the May 7th Town Council meeting for a facility analysis of the Princeton Court House building.

The motion made by Councillor Marilyn Harkness, and seconded by Councillor Frank Armitage, will see Associated Engineering (BC) Ltd. conduct mechanical, electrical and environmental facility assessment at a cost of \$9,949 plus HST.

The assessment is required as current systems in the municipally owned building are aging.

The Princeton Court House is now over 72 years old. The last major upgrade on the building was completed in 1998 when foundation work was conducted.

"Unfortunately a number of deficiencies have been identified due to age, deferred maintenance, changes in regulations, changes in facility use and comments from tenants," CAO Patrick Robins explains in his report to Town Council.

"This has necessitated the need to conduct a comprehensive facility analysis."

Robins says the analysis will determine if the electrical and mechanical systems within the building meet current and future needs and to ensure that the environmental conditions within the building do not pose any safety and health risks.

Chamber, Town enter into agreement

The Town of Princeton formalized an agreement with Princeton & District Chamber of Commerce at the May 7th meeting of Town Council.

The motion made by Councillor Frank Armitage, and seconded by Councillor Marilyn Harkness will see the Town of Princeton enter into a three-year Fee for Service Agreement with the Chamber for the provision of visitor information and town promotional services. The fee is set at \$25,000.00 per year.

There is currently no agreement in place although the Chamber has been providing these services for a number of decades.



Chamber representatives, Deputy Mayor Jason Earle and Robins reviewed a draft agreement April 16th and April 23rd.

Funding for the services has been based upon an annual Grant in Aid request from the Chamber of Commerce. The Fee for Service Agreement fixes the fee at \$25,000.00 per year over the next three years.

Council approves transit agreement

The Town of Princeton approved the BC Transit annual Operating Agreement between the Town and Princeton & District Community Services at the May 7th regular meeting of Town Council.

The motion made by Councillor Marilyn Harkness, seconded by Councillor Frank Armitage,

approves the operating agreement for the period from April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013.

The Town of Princeton and BC Transit share the cost of funding a public passenger transportation system, which is operated by Princeton & District Community Services. BC Transit's yearly operating

agreement and budget must be approved by both Town Council and by Princeton & District Community Services prior to its year-end.

"Costs and revenues are expected to be marginally less than last year," states Deputy Treasurer Shirley McMahon in her report to Council.

In 2011/12 the municipal share of costs was \$81,185.00, offset by budgeted revenues of \$34,000.00. The 2012/13 budgeted municipal share will total \$81,055.00, while revenue is expected to be \$34,340.00.



The number of working-age Canadians per senior is decreasing, placing additional pressure on the OAS program.



HOLIDAY GARBAGE PICKUP

When the week contains a statutory holiday your collection day will move to the next business day. For the week of MAY 21-25 garbage pickup will fall on the day after your regular pickup day. Monday pickup moves to Tuesday, Tuesday moves to Wednesday and so on. Please contact Town Hall (295-3135) if you are unsure how you are affected by this change.

WATER RESTRICTIONS

Water Restrictions will be in effect May 15, 2012.

By conserving today, we reduce the need for expanded facilities and costly upgrades to the water system.

What are the rules?

- Lawn sprinkling regulations are in effect from May 15 to September 30 every year.
- There are four stages of restrictions, each stage allowing less water use.
- Stage 1 comes into effect automatically on May 15 of every year unless more stringent water conservation measures are needed. Stages 2, 3 and 4 are implemented according to the severity of the water shortage. Each level requires increasingly larger reductions in water use.
- Residential, multi-family, commercial, Industrial, institutional and public properties are all required to follow the regulations.

Stage 1 Restrictions will be in effect May 15th.

- Even numbered civic addresses may water on Wednesdays, Friday and Sundays.
- Odd numbered civic addresses may water on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- No watering is permitted between Noon and 6:00 pm.
- · Watering is not permitted on Mondays.
- Washing of boats or motor vehicles with a hose is permitted only if using a hose with an automatic shut-off device.
- Public sector entities are restricted to three days per week at any time.

Bylaw Enforcement Officers will enforce all levels of the water restrictions bylaw. A person who contravenes the bylaw commits an offence under the Offence Act and is subject to a fine.

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

May 7, 2012

- Brent Ashby of KPMG presented the 2011 Financial Statements.
- Council approved a Fee for Service agreement with the Chamber of Commerce for the provision of the visitor information services and promotional services.
- Associated Engineering was awarded the contract for the provision of and electrical, mechanical and air quality assessment for the Court House.
- The 2012 Financial Plan and Tax Rate bylaws were adopted.. The Tax Rates Bylaw contains the tax rates for the Town of Princeton, the Okanagan Regional Library, the Regional Hospital District and the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen. Based upon an average single family residential property assessed at \$187,547 in 2011 and \$191,647 in 2012, the Municipal portion of the average residential property tax bill, would be \$506.63 in 2012, an increase of \$7.82 or 1.6 % above the average of \$498.81 in 2011. It should be noted that the annual tax bill that residents and businesses receive includes these tax rates plus tax rates from the provincial government for school and policing taxes; tax rates from the BC Assessment Authority; and tax rates from the Municipal Finance Authority. Although the municipality delivers each property owner a tax bill with all of these itemized taxes, the Town receives only the tax amounts for general municipal purposes; this is approximately 40% of the total tax bill. The remaining tax amounts are remitted to the appropriate agency.

Rattling The Sabres Threatens All

The Middle East, that place where nobody has been happy in the past 2,000 years, is currently the focus of a lot of sabre rattling. For our younger readers, this means a show of military strength meant to intimidate the other guys. In today's situation, the threat is nuclear war because Iran may be acquiring nuclear capability.

The United States has moved military deployments to positions that could strike Iran from several different directions. China has issued a warning that it will intervene if such action takes place, and Russia has indicated it would join the fray. India, a nuclear capable nation, would strike against Pakistan and call down the wrath of Russia and China. Europe, of course, would side with the United States. On and on it goes, one nation threatening another in a war not yet declared. This is major international brinksmanship over a territory where nobody knows who is going to raise the next alarm.

In the meantime, there are dire warnings from physicians who have worldwide organizations opposing any nuclear activity. They are already alarmed at the potential in Sendai, Japan, for a major nuclear incident unless Tepco, the owner of the Fukushima power plant that exploded a year ago, neutralizes its storehouse of spent fuel rods. This huge deposit of fuel rods needs to be buried the same way Chernobyl is buried, but Tepco shows no indication of doing anything about it in the near future.

Physicians against nuclear explosions say any 'small' nuclear war in the Middle East has the potential of the loss of life of a billion people, and not just in the Middle East. They did a study that showed such a war would alter the weather to the point where, in five years, crop failures would accumulate to the point at which people would begin dying of starvation in many places in the world. Ten years after this nuclear conflict, a billion people would have died of starvation.

In a starving world, the first to die are children. Such a conflict would wipe out children first, as children have the least resistance against starvation. The people who would die first are those who have the least resources. As food shortages increased, food prices would increase. Those who could not afford to buy food would die.

Food costs are escalating now due to the high cost of petroleum fuel. The higher price of food begins with the higher cost of producing food and then continues to escalate with the higher cost of transportation. As food scarcity increases, the food will go to the highest bidder in the market. Food is sold as a commodity in a market where the highest bidder wins. This would affect food prices worldwide.

As to radioactive contamination, which would create an increasingly high level of cancer and other health disorders, we are living with the results of nuclear contamination now. The effects of nuclear contamination do not show up for many years. Adults have the ability to resist the effects until old age. Children are affected first. Right now, radioactive contamination is suspected as the cause of hundreds of infant deaths in North America as a result of the Fukushima disaster. Adults may not show any signs for the next 20 years.

To add to what is known as 'background' contamination, there is the residue from Chernobyl and the 2,053 nuclear explosions since 1945, more than 1,000 of which took place in southwestern United States. Russia exploded more that 500 nuclear bombs in many locations in Russia, and Britain and France detonated nuclear bombs in the South Pacific region. There is scarcely any place on earth where radioactive fallout has not contaminated the environment to some extent.

This latest round of threats of warshould bring all of us ordinary people to our feet to shout against our governments. I cannot think of one ordinary citizen of any country who is ready to enter any sort of war, let alone a nuclear conflict. It is past the time when the ordinary people of the world united to tell the rich and the politically powerful that we simply want peace and prosperity. If all of the money spent on military capability were to be spent on keeping people fed, housed and healthy, would our world be a better place to live?

Now that we have the ability, through internet, to create a worldwide consensus and worldwide citizen action, what is stopping us from taking our own kind of action? George Elliott







Pro or No Park vote at the RDOS Many voters took the time to send e-mails and leave phone messages expressing their opinion about the park issue in our area. Thank you all for the time and consideration you put into your correspondence. My "in box" was equally divided by those of you who felt that we need this park and those of you who reject the park.

Arguments both for and against the park were equally heartfelt, with the overwhelming sentiment that people want the landscape protected. By this I mean that people who want a park believe that a National Park is the only way to save this part of the Similkameen from the pressures of development, which is encroaching from both the west and east, while those who oppose a park believe the only way to maintain this place the way it is to prevent any development at all, and not "open the gates" to tourism and the invasive footprint of more bodies entering these pristine lands. Both sides of this argument believe equally strongly that their method is the only way to save this endangered landscape and way of life.

I have been accused of "taking the easy way out" by not voting at the RDOS where the proposal was made that this local government ask the province to re-engage its talks around the National Park. In fact, by choosing NOT to vote on this question, I was acknowledging that this decision should NOT sit with me; I feel the decision to engage in discussions about this issue should be made by the

landowners and stakeholders directly involved. The Federal govemment, which holds the purse strings to decide the values of this land should be talking directly with the ranchers and First Nations who will be most affected by the decisions which unfold.

Whether the rest of us believe a park is a good or a bad thing is, in my mind, irrelevant until those most impacted have had a fair opportunity for a meaningful dialogue. This would mean that the studies that are ongoing and which have been completed should be available for public view, and informed decisions which consider the various impacts can be made by all of us. We will all win when a good deal for everybody is struckand that is not impossible. The guidelines and rules around what a National Park includes are decided by people, implemented by people and can be influenced by all of us. I have seen great National Parks which include hunting and gather-

ing and have prevented invasive development - Tombstone Park in the Yukon is a great example. The Trondak-Gwichin people, descendants of the First Nations who were displaced in the 1800's by the 40,000 people the Gold Rush brought to Dawson City, saw a new threat to their way of life in the nineties by a proposed pipeline which would have disrupted the caribou migration upon which they depended for their livelihoods.

In this case, by asking the Federal government to protect the lands in perpetuity by creating a park, the First Nations "saved" the land from the pressures which non-natives had been subjecting it to since their arrival in the 1800's. However, when they struck their deal with the Feds, the canny Trondak-Gwichin made sure to protect the values they held most dear, so hunting and gathering is entrenched in the "deal" so that one travelling through this park today will see Ford pick-ups in the middle of the tundra while a family spreads out on hands and knees picking alpine blueberries. This, to me, is an example to learn from: let us examine what we want to maintain, and be very careful to realize what we will give up if we don't work to manifest it.

There have been some very compelling arguments made about agricultural land and our ability to feed ourselves, and these points resonate very strongly for me in this time of increased awareness about the unhealthy food supply created by giant agri-business. We are incredibly lucky to have the access we do to healthy livestock and fruit and vegetables grown right here in the Similkameen,

Having grown up in the farming community of Chilliwack, I know what a threat DEVELOPMENT is to ALR lands. It happens. Thinking that farmland will remain that way forever is misguided: it only takes the right people with enough money to be interested in sticking up a subdivision and Voila! it happens. It would not surprise me if the future included residences continued on Page 23

Hugelbeet Heroes

On Thursday, May 3rd work began in earnest on the redirection of greens waste in Hedley to the construction of a working compost pile - a Hugelbeet - which will be constructed over the next month and monitored as a new way to deal with the volumes of yard waste which are currently either hauled to the dump, illegally dumped up Twenty Mile Creek, or burned in backyard barrels.

The best thing about a Hugelbeet is it is an immediate way to start building soil in an area which has been compromised by enormous piles of tailings, left over from the heydays of mining in Hedley.

The work crew included Doug Bratt as a driver picking up bags of leaves throughout town, and Shannon and Donna Gauvin using their muscles to load trailer after trailer of trees and branches up to the newly established yard waste sorting area.

Vickie Hansen worked to re-pile the waste which others had left before the Hugelbeet sorting area was really in production, since as organizers our biggest concern is that uninformed residents assume that the "old burn pile" is active again.

We were able to gather a great deal of the waste which was left out as the RDOS greens pick up was slated for Friday, May 4. Doug Bratt confirmed with the "Garbage man" that he only got two or so bags of leaves, so we can congratulate ourselves on diverting an enormous amount from the landfill - thus reducing greenhouse gases - and working towards a healthier future for the families living here in Hedley.

We do ask that those of you who ARE able-bodied shift the greens

waste yourself - or offer to help with hauling when there is a truck nearby; there were lots of people who did not cut their branches down to a manageable size, and left enormous piles for the very gracious and giving volunteers to deal with.

Though it is typical of human nature to take advantage of the kindness of others, this project is intended to build a new model of cooperation where people are actually accountable for their actions.

The Gardener's Way To Health

The fastest growing hobby is vegetable gardening, which is the hobby of growing one's own vegetables, whether in a regular garden or in containers. Gardening has two health benefits: outdoor exercise and good fresh vegetables and fruit. Both benefits can lead to a longer, healthier life.

Vegetables are easier to grow than most plants, and smart vegetable gardeners gain almost instant results. For example, if you plant spinach, you are eating spinach in six weeks. Radishes arrive even sooner, and planting onion sets yields green onions very soon after planting. If you were to plant these three in a container now, in six weeks you would have ingredients for your home grown salad.

Some fruits and vegetables do very well in borders. Rhubarb, strawberries, kohlrabi, cabbage, raspberries and potatoes can be grown quite well in borders. Home gardens can accommodate berry bushes such as currants, Pembina plums, mandarin apricots and Siberian cherries. These plants can do well in borders providing grass is kept well away from the root systems.

Some people like to grow vegetables in raised beds. Any vegetable does well in a raised bed, but raised beds require more hand weeding, as it is more difficult to hoe in a raised bed. Raised beds do not offer the opportunity to use a rototiller, so must be dug up by hand.

Vegetable gardening requires a lot of work. In addition to raking, weeding, watering and harvesting, the gardener is busy bending, kneeling, dragging a rake or hose, and walking. A gardener needs flexibility, and a flexible body

The biggest benefit to having a home garden is having the freshest vegetables available at a moment's notice during the summer months. Smart home gardeners do not use pesticides, so they feel more secure about what they are

If you have never grown a vegetable garden or planted strawberries or currants, there is plenty of help available in gardening books, magazines and by consulting sales people at a garden shop or talking to other gardeners in your neighbourhood.



Mozzarellissima Mushroom Burger

(NC)—Perfect for summer get-togethers, this succulent dish is far from the typical cheeseburger. Packed with flavourful mushrooms and delectable cheese, it will have your mouth watering at first sight. More recipes can be found at saputo.ca.

Prep time: 15 minutes / Cooking time: 20 minutes / Serves: 4 to 6

Ingredients:

- 7 oz (200 g) white mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 6 to 7 green onions, finely chopped
- olive oil, to taste
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) white wine salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
- 2 lbs (1 kg) ground beef
- 8 oz (250 g) Saputo Mozzarellissima cheese, cut in small cubes
- 1 head radicchio
- 4 to 6 hamburger buns

- 1. In a pan, sauté mushrooms and green onions in a drizzle of olive oil. Deglaze with white wine. Once the wine has evaporated, remove the vegetables from heat and let cool. Add salt to taste.
- 2. In a bowl, mix ground beef, cooked vegetables, the Mozzarellissima and a drizzle of olive oil. Season with salt and pep-
- 3. Shape the ground beef mixture into balls and flatten them to form hamburger patties.
- 4. Cut the radicchio in half and brush with olive oil. Sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Cook the radicchio on the barbecue for 2 to 3 minutes on each side, and the hamburgers for 5 to 6 minutes on each side, or according to your personal cooking preference.
- 6. Finely mince the grilled radicchio to garnish your hamburgers once they are cooked.

Tips: You can replace the white mushrooms with shitake or porcini mushrooms. You only need a small quantity of porcinis, as their flavour is fairly strong. You can also substitute the white wine with brandy.

Various observations were noted and will be used in a final report to the Town of Princeton.







... continued from Front Page than the provincial target of 8.

Princeton is not alone in the province as the only other communities with higher than the BC target are located in the North Okanagan, but do have similar characteristics to Princeton.

"Small communities, in narrow parts of the valley with similar sources of PM2.5."

Adams says three sources have been identified in Princeton - open burning, wood heating and the pellet plant however, "we cannot yet tell how much of the measured PM2.5 comes from each of these sources."

Other speakers at the event included Dr. Michael Brauer from the University of BC who made a detailed presentation related to the long term effects of living in an environment with particulate matter as well as Glenn Smith the President of Princeton Co-Gen Industries who spoke about his business which is currently adding more and new filters to the local pellet plant.

Man agrees to Peace Bond

To settle a dispute, Rene Cherot appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on May 10 to agree to a peace bond. For one year, Cherot will have no contact with Darcy Cherot or Dana Allison. He is subject to a weapons prohibition.

Crown stays charge

Carmeletta Holmes appeared for trial in Provincial Court on May 10 to answer to a charge of assault causing bodily harm. The trial did not go ahead due to the absence of the main witness, the complainant, who had been subpoenaed. Judge Shaw ordered a stay of proceedings in the case.

Judge orders \$2,000 fine

Roman Drzewieki, age 51, a Canadian now working in Peru, appeared in Provincial Court for a preliminary hearing on a charge of impaired driving causing bodily harm. On July 3, 2010, Drzewieki

made a left turn onto Bridge Street and very nearly hit Ruth Picketts, an 88 year old woman using a walker as she crossed the street. He came so near as to cause alarm and she lost her footing, falling and breaking a hip.

Drzewieki parked, then went to her, apologizing, saying he had not seen her. He remained while the police investigated. During the investigation, police noted a faint smell of alcohol on Drzewieki's breath, and his eyes appeared glassy.

He was given a breath test with the result of .10 and .12 readings. He was charged.

Instead of a preliminary hearing, Drzewieki entered a guilty plea to a lesser charge of driving without due care and attention. Judge Shaw ordered a \$2,000 fine, plus a \$300 victim fine surcharge, and a six month driving prohibition.



......continued from Page 6 crawling up the gorgeous untouched mountains on either side of the Similkameen. I don't like the idea, but it looks like it will happen if we don't take the time to prevent it.

I chose to live in the Similkameen because it DOES NOT look like the Okanagan. The few billboards dotting our landscape is a welcome rest to my eyes weary of neon, and our starry nights are unparalleled. I can find tasty blue grouse almost outside my doorstep and regularly sight mountain goats on the hills above Hedley. Many of the people I've met, both those who have lived here a long time and those who are newcomers, love THIS PLACE, filled with the saskatoon blooms and wild currants; soon it will be asparagus season, and when the freshet is over we'll eat trout for breakfast.

One of the most difficult considerations for me is that tendency we have as human beings to destroy almost everything around us and then look at our neighbours and decide that we want what they have. Alternatively, we decide they ought to do something that we didn't. That is the crux, to me, of this National Park argument. First Nations are well familiar with the tendency of non-natives looking at Reserve lands as a place to protect "Species At Risk."

The scenario goes something like this, and is equally applicable to the ranchers and hunters of the Similkameen too: You protect something by stewarding it, making trails through it, getting to know its secrets, making it better but not impacting it in a huge and destructive way. You may choose not to do much because you don't have the money to, or perhaps you don't have the desire to.

Then, your neighbours, who have either planted vineyards eradicating Burrowing Owl habitat or pulling up antelope brush to build houses, realize that their frogs, salamanders, and turtles are all disappearing and they look across the valley where some of those creatures remain. Now, since there are only a few creatures left, it's time to DO something.

Why is it, that the folks who have been practicing the values which preserved the place as it is, should not be allowed to decide their own fates, and if they chose, develop it, make money from it, and create the same future for themselves and their descendants that all those who wanted to make wineries on the slopes of the rest of the valley did?

Finding a balance in this delicate landscape is our challenge, made more difficult by the threat to family traditions and values of loving and living on the land. There are no easy answers in this difficult debate and I think there are merits to both sides of the argument. I believe that the reports should be made public, as they were paid for with taxpayer dollars. If anyone is to decide the fate of the area I believe those most impacted should be the place where the Feds start their conversations.




