Princeton police need your assistance

Princeton RCMP report attending a motor vehicle accident on Bridge Street near the wooden bridge at 10:35 PM on Friday, September 7th.

RDOS releases 2012 survey results

The Regional District conducted a survey to measure the satisfaction of citizens in the eight electoral areas in June of this year and released the results of the survey September 12th.

"A Key Success Indicator for our organization is to improve the customer experience," stated Dan Ashton, Chair of the Regional District.

"We gather this information so the Board can make informed decisions about where to best apply our resources in the future to make the

biggest difference for our citizens."

The Regional District surveys citizens in its electoral areas every 2nd year.

A total of 400 residents were randomly selected to share their opinions and ideas about the Regional District as their local government with respect to Quality of Life, Service Satisfaction, Environment, Communications, Information Technology, and Fiscal Responsibility. The survey is accurate within +/- 4.9%, at the 95% confidence level.

Overall satisfaction ratings indicated 77% of our residents rate the quality of life in their community as excellent.

The actual breakdown in the Similkameen Valley was:

- Cawston 8.3 (out of 10), the same rating as in the 2010 Survey.
- Keremeos Rural/Hedley 7.0 down from 7.6.
- Princeton Rural 7.5 down from 8.1.

Overall, 71% rate the District as an excellent place to raise children, however, in the Similkameen all

ratings dropped from 2010 with Cawston residents giving their community a 7.9 rating, down from 8.9. Keremeos Rural/Hedley residents rated their community 5.0 (down from 6.0) and Princeton Rural residents had a 4.4 rating compared to 5.9 in 2010.

A total of 80% rate the Regional District as an excellent place to retire with Cawston rating 8.0, no change from 2010. Keremeos Rural/Hedley dipped slightly from 8.1 to 7.7 and Princeton Rural went up from 7.0 to 7.3. 63% agree the Regional District is doing a good job overall.

62% of citizens believe they get good value for taxes paid. When asked, 73% of RDOS citizens prefer that the district offer the same level of service at the same level of taxation while 7% would prefer that the district reduce the current level of service. Asked whether they might support a tax increase, 17% said they would support an increase for increased service.

Chair Dan Ashton said the survey results are an important part of the Regional District's Strategic Plan.

"The Regional District Board and staff will use this feedback to guide

the organization's decision-making and financial planning processes".

In the Similkameen, a total of 20 Area B (Cawston) residents participated in the survey representing 5% of the total number of respondents. In Area G (Keremeos Rural/Hedley) there were 45 participants (11%) and in Area H (Princeton Rural) a total of 40 (10%) were randomly chosen to fill out the Citizen's Survey.

As a next step in the Citizen Survey process, the Regional District will now review the statistical and narrative results and determine areas that need to be addressed.

This information is used in the Strategic Planning and Budgeting processes for the Board.

Huldra Silver - Treasure Mountain

Huldra Silver Inc. (TSX-V:HDA) (the "Company" or "Huldra") announced on September 13th geochemical results from the 2012 geotechnical and geochemical exploration program at its Treasure Mountain project.

The Company conducted an airborne survey, consisting of 310 line kilometres of 3-axis magnetic gradiometer and gamma spectrometer mapping of the entire 2,555 hectare Treasure Mountain property. Maps were received and interpreted by SJ Geophysics of Delta, BC.

The Company conducted a geochemical sampling program consisting of 1,127 samples focusing on four primary targets: the East Zone, the West soil grid, the NE Zone A soil grid, and the NE Zone B soil grid. The East Zone is an area between the current mine workings and the location of an outcrop that was trenched in 2011, 800 metres away. The original program consisted of 442 samples and was increased by 39 following receipt and review of the geotechnical data. The West soil grid, from which 381 samples were taken, was also added after receiving the initial geotechnical data and results are pending. The two NE Zone grids were added after the initial report was reviewed.

Ryan Sharp, President and Chief Executive Officer, states, "We are extremely pleased with these results as they help to further determine the exploration potential of the entire Treasure Mountain property." *Laboratory Procedures and Quality Assurance*

Soil samples were dried at 60°C and sieved to -80 mesh. A 15 gram sample was digested by Aqua Regia and finished by inductively coupled plasma (ICP) mass spectrometry technique. All laboratory work was performed by Acme Analytical Laboratories Ltd's at its facility in Vancouver, BC.

Technical information in this news release has been reviewed and approved by Jim Cuttle, P.Geo., a Qualified Person as defined in National Instrument 43-101. To The Editor,

Canada should immediately restore diplomatic relations with Iran.

I believe that none of Foreign Minister John Baird's remarks in this affair are honest, fair, reasonable, right or uttered in good faith.

Witness that when nations that promote policies our government dislikes get street demonstrations, protest and riots, even outright armed insurrection, these are depicted as justified and a clear sign that regime change there is required.

Here, such disturbances are called aberrant or due to anti-social

provocations - lately, even terrorism. When police abuse citizens' rights there are protracted inquiries, an exoneration of the police, then business as usual.

When Pakistan lets security slip in their nuclear weapons technology or in the case of the US retain a "first use" option for such weapons they retain Canada's good will.

When Iranian laboratories lately acquire only the capacity to supply that country's nuclear medicine needs, refused them by our sanctions, then they are depicted as an imminent threat to the world.

In 1979 Iranians stood up against the Shah's authoritarian regime

imposed when the US and Britain staged a coup that overthrew the democratically elected President Mossadegh in 1953. Dr. Mossadegh remains a figure of tremendous stature in the history of modern Iran. He strongly opposed British and, later, American influence in Iran.

Since 1979 the US has been ever ready to issue payback over that indecorous 'heave-ho'. Soon afterwards the US backed Saddam Hussein in a long, costly and bloody war with Iran.

Today the youthful Iranian population is straining under severe US led economic sanctions on account of its nuclear program.

Of course, Iran's chief sin is that it strives to be a leading regional power, which is unrepentantly opposed to US imperialist mastery in the Middle East.

The narrow Strait of Hormuz between United Arab Emirates and Iran is a critical choke point for Middle East oil. No surprise that Canada joins the clamor for war with Iran and again shows itself little more than a shill to its masters in Washington.

This Canada Iran affair is a disgraceful setback to the cause of peace.

The New Trend In Food Supply

The west coast of North America is always the centre for new trends. I was reminded of this at our local fair this year. I saw exhibits in home canning, home baking and vegetables by young women, and believe me, they know how to compete with the older group who have been exhibitors for many years.

This emphasizes a west coast trend of buying locally produced food and preserving it. This trend did not emerge as a result of this year's serious grain shortage, but rather, it emerged partly from the 2010 grain shortage and partly from a commitment to protecting our environment. Buying local produce, preserving local produce, protects the environment by reducing the impact of shipping and trucking food.

There is another excellent by-product of this trend: it encourages

Naturalists host hikes

The Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists hosted two field trips this August. The first one, led by Linda Neumann, was to Wolfe Lake.

A couple of folks brought their kayaks, while some members stayed to have a picnic lunch. It was a lovely day, as was the day of the walk around Charles and Bev Webber's sheep and hay farm.

Tip Anderson led the group around the back of the property, relating interesting history of his family and others who once lived in the area. Bev talked about her sheep and her duties around the place, and informed the group that the animals are used not only for wool, but as breeding stock as well.

No wildlife was seen on either

local food producers to stay in business, and to expand crops. This trend supports the small producers.

Our local fair is fundamentally about agriculture, and the Fair Board struggles each year to include more agricultural information despite the fact that people attend the fair to see some kind of show to be excited about. Making people aware of agriculture has been difficult. At this year's auction of locally produced fruit and vegetables, we gave away bumper stickers in some boxes. The bumper stickers say "If you eat, you are involved in agriculture."

As the world's grain shortage deepens, this is more true than most people believe. Grain shortages increase the cost of bread products, breakfast cereals and meat (most livestock is fed grain). The drought in the United States is not the only location where crops have been affected. The Ukraine expects the grain harvest to be 40 percent lower this fall. China is already rationing grain due to weather problems. India's monsoons did not arrive early enough to save some grain crops. Southern Russia's grain crops are expected to be half of normal. Canada is the only major grain producer with a good crop.

Our food supply looks good right now. Supermarket shelves are filled with good produce, but even though we see such excellent produce on the shelves, there is a hid-

den problem. Vegetable crops are threatened by having too few species available. Should a fungus, bacteria or virus attack these inbred market strains, crops will be lost, and there is little to replace them because we have allowed many strains of vegetables to die out or become very scarce.

For example, let me tell you a little story about my garden this summer. I planted scarlet runner beans along my garden fence, partly because the flowers are pretty. I was surprised when I was asked, "Can you eat the beans?"

Of course you can eat the beans - the scarlet runner makes an excellent green bean. The point of the story is that the majority of people only know of a few strains of various vegetables because most people these days know very little about gardening and less about different strains of vegetables.

The lack of genetic variety is even more pronounced in raising poultry. A specific specie of chicken has been bred to become an egg machine. Another is bred to become a fryer and another bred to become a roasting chicken. When a virus gets into the egg or fryer factories, the entire bird population is immediately at risk because the purebreds have little or no resistance. Cross-bred chickens are becoming rare. Some breeds of chickens that were common 60 years ago, such as the Light Sussex, are becoming rare. Fortunately, many people have begun raising some of these 'rare' breeds to prevent extinction.

Consumers have focused on buying the perfect tomato or apple to the extent that the producer is almost forced to grow only those strains of fruit in order to make a living.

The new trend of buying locally may help the small farmer survive, and may preserve our food supply as well. Whatever we can do to expand the world's food supply, the better our chances of survival worldwide. In Canada, there is still room to expand food production on a large scale, and even if you just grow a garden, you are expanding food production.

Remember the bumper sticker's message: if you eat, you are involved in agriculture. Even if you know nothing about food production, your stomach is involved, so maybe you need to learn more about agriculture.

For example, let me tell you a little story about my garden this summer. I planted scarlet runner beans along my garden fence, partly because the flowers are pretty. I was surprised when I was asked, "Can you eat the beans?"

Of course you can eat the beans - the scarlet runner makes an excellent green bean. The point of the story is that the majority of people only know of a few strains of various vegetables because most people these days know very little about gardening and less about different strains of vegetables.

The lack of genetic variety is even more pronounced in raising poultry. A specific specie of chicken has been bred to become an egg machine. Another is bred to become a fryer and another bred to become a roasting chicken. When a virus gets into the egg or fryer factories, the entire bird population is immediately at risk because the purebreds have little or no resistance. Cross-bred chickens are becoming rare. Some breeds of chickens that were common 60 years ago, such as the Light Sussex, are becoming rare. Fortunately, many people have begun raising some of these 'rare' breeds to prevent extinction.

Consumers have focused on buying the perfect tomato or apple to the extent that the producer is almost forced to grow only those strains of fruit in order to make a living.

The new trend of buying locally may help the small farmer survive, and may preserve our food supply as well. Whatever we can do to expand the world's food supply, the better our chances of survival worldwide. In Canada, there is still room to expand food production on a large scale, and even if you just grow a garden, you are expanding food production.

Remember the bumper sticker's message: if you eat, you are involved in agriculture. Even if you know nothing about food production, your stomach is involved, so maybe you need to learn more about agriculture.

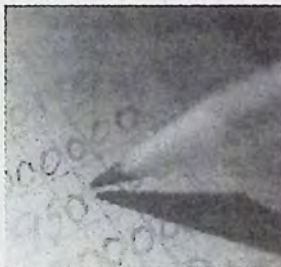

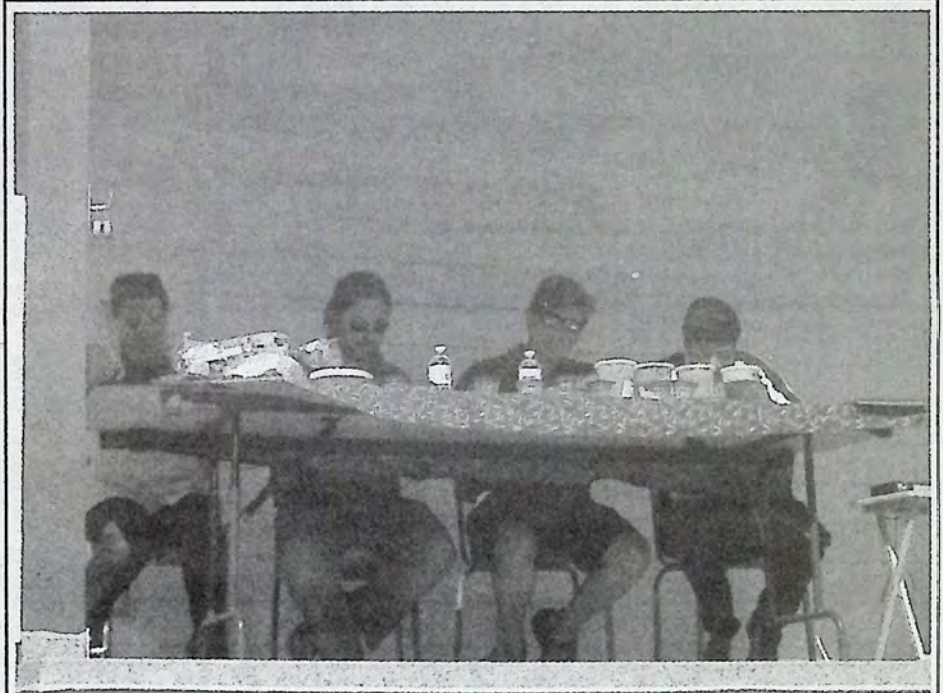

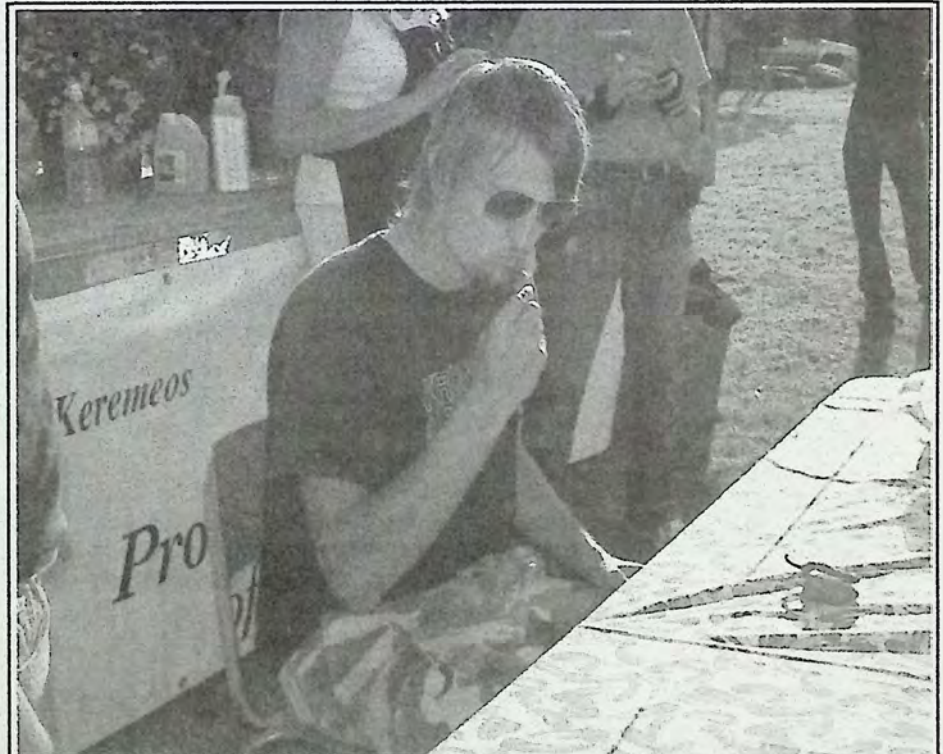

It's Time For Your Annual Check-Up

The diet consists of a lot of fruit and vegetables, little grain, and a moderate amount of fish and meat. These are simple meals but they are healthy meals.

If you want to live a healthy life well into old age, you need to eat well, and eating well means eating simple foods cooked well or eaten raw. Nuts and seeds, all vegetables and fruits, and a moderate amount of fish and meat seem to make people feel better and increases strength and immunity. The diet is used to improve performance in athletes, where strength and stamina are very important. Simple foods could do the same for you. Who would not want more strength and more energy as they grow older? Who would not want better health?

Potato and Roasted Red Pepper Frittata

(NC)—Serve up this skillet supper with a green or Caesar salad to complete your meal. It is also delicious with warm pasta sauce or stuffed into a crusty ciabatta bun for a take away lunch for the office the next day.

- 3 round red Ontario Potatoes (about 1 lb/500 g), scrubbed
- 2 tbsp (25 mL) extra virgin olive oil
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) Italian herb seasoning or Herbes de Provence
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) salt
- 1/4 tsp (1 mL) pepper
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) diced roasted red peppers
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) chopped fresh Italian parsley
- 6 eggs
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) shredded Asiago cheese

Dice potatoes into 1/2-inch (1 cm) cubes; set aside.

In large nonstick skillet heat oil over medium high heat. Add potatoes, onion, garlic, Italian seasoning, salt and pepper. Cook, stirring for about 5 minutes or until edges of vegetables are beginning to brown. Reduce heat to medium, cover and cook, stirring once for about 5 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Stir in roasted peppers and parsley.

In bowl, beat eggs and Asiago cheese. Pour over potato mixture, lifting and stirring eggs into mixture with spatula. Cook, for about 8 minutes or until bottom is light golden and top is set. Place a large plate over the skillet and invert frittata onto plate. Slide frittata back into skillet and cook for about 5 minutes or until bottom is golden. Makes 4 to 6 servings. 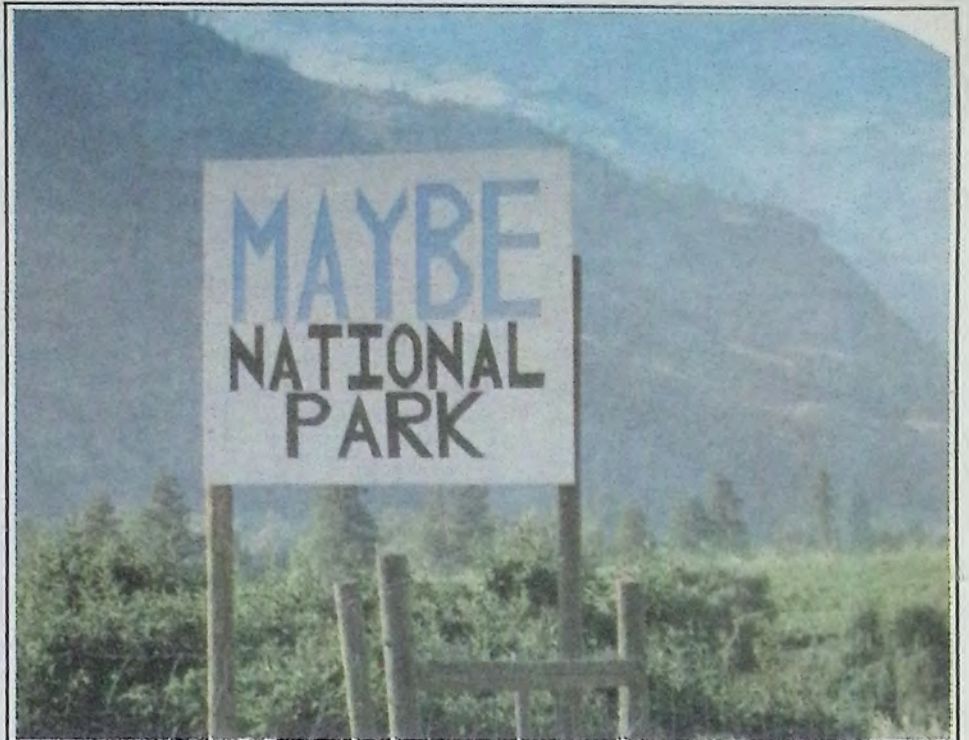

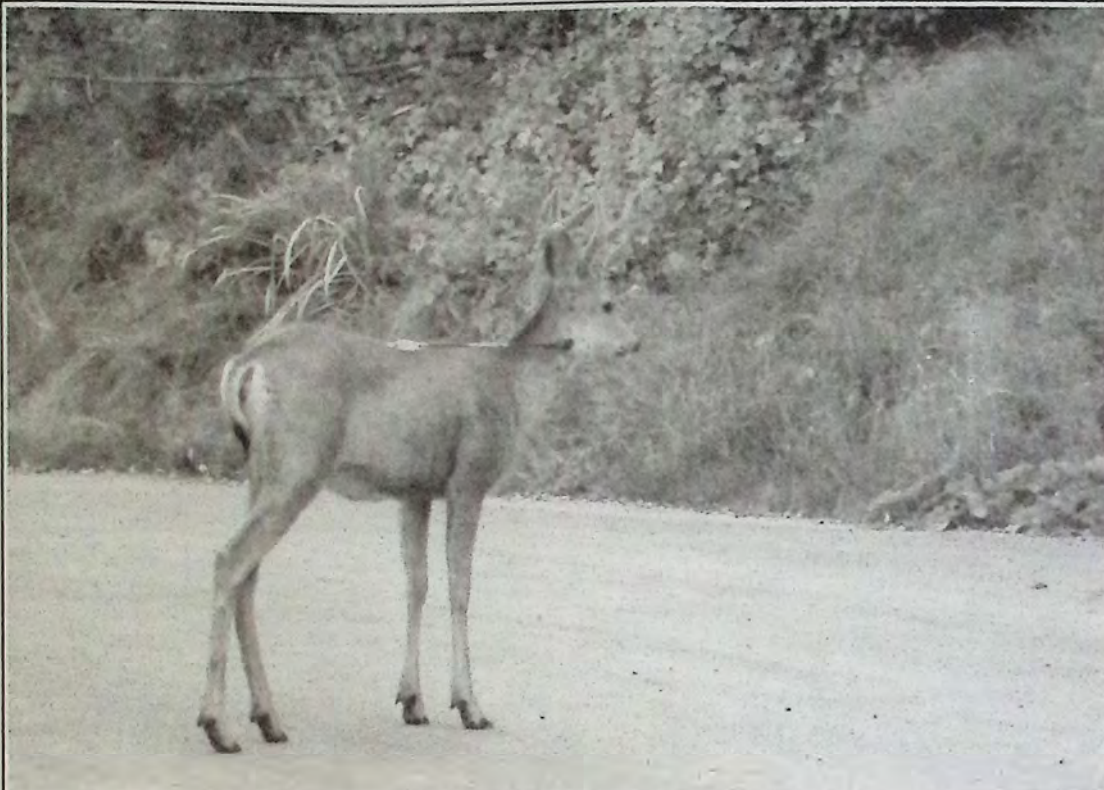

Having a previous record of 24 hour suspensions cost Anthony Richard Upton a little extra when he entered a guilty plea to an impaired driving charge.

He was apprehended on May 12, 2012, by police conducting a routine road check on Bridge Street. He failed the roadside check and went to the detachment office where he blew .210 and .190. In Provincial Court in Princeton on September 13, he was sentenced to pay a

\$1,200 fine plus victim fine surcharge, and is prohibited from driving for 12 months.

The judge warned Upton he would do jail time on the next impaired conviction.

Girl Trouble Ends In Fight

On March 3, 2012, friends of Jonathan Sullivan went to his house for the evening, which included alcohol consumption. During the evening, Sullivan left his residence with the girlfriend of James Apps.

Subsequently, Apps accused

Sullivan of sleeping with Apps' girlfriend. There was more than one incident of accusation, and while at his mother's house, Sullivan was again approached by an angry Apps and a fight ensued, during which Sullivan grabbed a knife to defend himself. Sullivan was later charged with assault with a weapon.

On September 13, in Provincial Court in Princeton, Sullivan entered a guilty plea to the charge and was ordered to pay a \$600 fine, and was placed on probation for 12 months.
