## Copper Mountain issues update

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation ("CMMC" or the "Company") announced September 17 that operations at the Copper Mountain Mine located near Princeton have continued to improve since operations started.

Copper production guidance for the last quarter of 2012 is 20 million pounds of copper, an increase over prior quarters as a result of improvements to the mill operation. Total copper production for 2012 is forecast to be approximately 60 million

pounds of copper. The forecast for the balance of the year from September through December is to operate at an average 35,000 tpd with an average head grade of 0.35% copper.

The mine plan has been under review by the mine engineering team to optimize the mining sequence to maximize copper production. This optimization is progressing well for completion by year end. The short term portion of the plan has been completed and mining in Pit 2 has been accelerated to be developed in parallel with Pit 3. Mine production is continuing at the planned rate of about 160,000 tpd.

Improved blasting techniques, finer crushing, improved ore blend-

ing and modified operation procedures, coupled with the more favorable operating time have allowed the mill to operate at its 35,000 tpd design level. The average throughput for the last five days of August was 37,210 tpd.

Following the planned mill maintenance shutdown at the start of

August; whereby the recently received newly designed grates were installed in the SAG mill, and electrical modification to the ball mill motor were made, as well as repairs to the tailings line, the Company has experienced above design operating performance from the mill. Mill operating time aver-

aged 97% for the period following the grate change out providing confidence that the excessive down time during the ramp up period has been overcome.

Mill operating time was negatively impacted during the last two months of the second quarter and ..... continued on Page 2

## Arts Council celebrates great year

The year extending from 2011 to 2012 proved to be a great year for Princeton Community Arts Council. The budget for the year exceeded \$70,000 and the Princeton Arts Council earned the title 'regional champion' for the great strides made in developing arts and cultural events in the community.

Outgoing President Del Hall gave a year end report at the September 19 annual general meeting, noting excellent partnerships formed during the past years with Upper Similkameen and Lower Similkameen Indian Bands, and stated plans are underway with the Bands to host the 2013 Spirit Festival. Another excellent partnership has developed between Princeton's Recreation and Culture

Department and the Arts Council. Nadine McEwen sits in on nearly every Arts Council meeting.

The Sunflower Art Gallery has been a success, although sales were lower recently. Many visitors dropped in to view the work of local artists during the summer. The gallery is currently open from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM Wednesday through Saturday.

Summer concerts at Veterans Square were another success story. Princeton Community Band played on Monday evenings, expanding its repertoire of dance music, and will play at a benefit at the United Church in late October. Local bands played at the Square on Saturday afternoons.

Other successes included the Spirit

Festival, concerts including the Ian Tyson concert last fall, a water colour class, and a theatre production called 'Glorious'. The theatre group is now rehearsing for another production scheduled for November.

The Museum Society is among the 286 members of the Arts Council, and Robin Lowe reported an excellent summer with three camps for ..... continued on Page 22

## Fairgrounds users make wishes

The three main groups who put on events at the fairgrounds - Rodeo Club, Racing Days Association and Fair Association - are forming 'wish' lists to present to Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA), management body for the fairgrounds. The wish lists consist of improvements the groups would like to see done for 2013. The PXA budget will be based on the priorities set at the October meeting, when all of the wishes have been presented.

The September 18 PXA meeting began with President Paul Bedard

expressing how pleased he is with the way so many people turned out to help for each event during the past few months. Prior to each event, work parties have been a mix of people from all of the user groups as well as PXA members and other volunteers.

Five major events have taken place at the fairgrounds this year: Princeton Rodeo, two horse racing events, Little Britches Rodeo and the fair. One more event is scheduled, the community Halloween party on Saturday, October 27.

During the following week, the fairgrounds will be shut down, except for the horse barn area.

There was discussion about the grandstand project, and the need to find a qualified person to develop the specifications for the project before asking for bids. Completed projects include repairs to a number of locations, a new roof on the 'saloon' building, completion of the fencing project, painting of some buildings, repairs to barns, and the removal of pine trees that had created hazardous conditions during wind storms. Racing Days Association President Karrie Crucil asked for, and received, permission to organize a group of volunteers to rebuild the 4-H animal pen area.

Fair Association President Dan Kastor commented on the excellent report the fair received this year from a provincial fair judge, who said it was one of the best fairs she had judged this year. Unfortunately, attendance at the fair was down this year, likely due to having it on Labour Day weekend.

Rodeo Club President Ken Crompton had a lot to say about the condition of the fairgrounds facility, saying the Town must take a greater role in assuring enough money to keep the grounds in top condition to attract additional events. Karrie Crucil agreed, saying she knew of one group who were interested in putting on a major event in Princeton but went elsewhere due to poor conditions on the fairgrounds. PXA would have made a big rental profit had this group chosen to hold their event in Princeton.

The next PXA meeting will be held at the fairgrounds on Tuesday, October 16, at 7:00 PM. At that time, everything on the wish lists will be prioritized so that the budget can be set for 2013.

Saturday afternoon while enjoying a lovely summer day on our lawn, my 93-year old mother experienced an unfortunate choking accident. Princeton Ambulance responded quickly, provided oxygen, rushed Mom to Emergency and followed up. Dr. Van Der Merwe, on call from Merritt, with an excellent team of local nurses, saved Mom's life in emergency that day. She would not likely have

survived the trip by ambulance to Penticton as the oxygen was not reaching her lungs prior to their professional intervention. Thank you Princeton General Hospital nurses for your excellent follow-up care.

A recent CBC Daybreak program discussing the shortage of rural BC doctors, mentioned an Alberta program where first and second year medical students, as part of their general training, worked under the

supervision of rural doctors so even a small community with a population of 639 would have medical service. Why can't the thousands of Canadian medical students studying abroad at universities in Great Britain, Ireland, New Zealand, Australia, etc., because they can't get into Canadian universities, be part of this program in British Columbia?

I realize rural BC does not have the voting power of larger centres, but we contribute our mineral and forestry revenues and taxes. Our mayor, Town Council, local industries Copper Mountain Mining, Weyerhaeuser and our citizens have worked hard to attend meetings, sign petitions, write letters, get TV coverage, apply for funding, etc.

We have done our job. Premier Christy Clark, Minister of Health Margaret MacDermid, Dr. D.M.S. Hammell; President of the College of physicians and Surgeons of BC, MLA Harry Lali, Interior Health Authority, Alex Atamanenko M.P., we pay your salaries, transportation and expense accounts to attend your meetings. Where is the coordination, action and decision making? Where are you? We need 24/7 ER.

## Will Rural Life Grow Now?

I would like to see a return to the smaller mixed farm that cannot be wiped out so easily as the cash crop farm that depends on one crop or one strain of livestock. I grew up on a small farm which fed our family despite weather and disease disasters that seem to hit every farmer at some point. Because we did not depend on just one crop or one strain of livestock, we managed to keep the farm going despite setbacks.

Our farm was developed by my grandfather, beginning about 1902. We continued to develop it during the 1940s and 1950s, and it was sold when my father became too old to do the work. However, it was the kind of farm which was commonplace in Canada for more than 200 years. We had pigs, chickens and cows. The excess milk from the cows fed both the pigs and the chickens. We had apple trees, which fed us, the pigs and the cows. We grew potatoes and carrots by the ton, and like so many local farmers, we grew grain as well as hay. We grew and stored our own vegetables, as well as selling much of what we produced. We averaged about 1,000 chickens at any given time, and sold both chickens and eggs.

We did not rely on pesticides, and we did not use chemical fertilizers (5 percent toxic substances are permitted in chemical fertilizers). We did not use herbicides like Round-up.

Everything we produced was dependent on something else, but it all worked together very well. The manure produced the food for the livestock and they produced the manure that produced the food.

The operation was efficient by natural standards. However, an accountant would have said it was an inefficient operation, because accountants work only with dollar figures.

An accountant would not have given a dollar value to the manure

we used, nor to the windfall apples we fed to our livestock. The quality of the soil would not have had a dollar value. How an operation is measured is dependent on what is chosen as the measuring tool. Today's farms are all about dollars received and dollars spent, and labour expended.

I admit we worked really hard when the season demanded it. I sweated in the hay field like any farm kid, putting up the hay for the winter. I did my share of labour in the potato field and in the garden. People admire my big garden in town, but to me it is small. We measured our garden in acreage. I did my share of picking rocks, hoeing weeds, shoveling manure, and cleaning barns, chicken houses, root cellars and pigpens. It was a physically demanding life.

On the other side of the ledger, I ate really well. Strawberries and cream were routine, as my mother had a huge strawberry patch and sold some of the finest strawberries you could ask for. We had a big raspberry patch, too. I always had milk to drink, and fresh butter on my bread and in my lunchbox cookies.

We always had apples for sauce and pies. My mother slaved over a hot stove all summer preserving food for the winter, and between the canning and the root cellar, and what we picked fresh, we had a wonderful diet.

This was once the typical life of farm dwellers - not a lot of cash, but the security of knowing you always had food on the table, a luxury by today's standards where so many children are raised in poverty and so many families depend on food banks.

I suspect the financial advisor is giving young people very good advice. Maybe it is time for us to go back to being more self-sufficient in food, and maybe it is time for better support for the small farm.

There is a growing concern over the effects of the grain shortage on our agricultural economy. Some hog producers in Manitoba and Ontario are saying they will go out of business due to being unable to feed their hogs with the price of grain so high. Bacon and ham may go to \$10 a pound (\$22.50 a kilo) in the near future as hog producers in the United States face the same situation.

A financial advisor in Toronto recently advised people to buy farmland or some kind of arable land and start producing their own food. He says farmers will be among the rich as the world population grows and demand for food increases.

None of this surprises me. My grandson, a city dweller in Ontario, has real concerns about being stuck in the city unable to produce his own food. My granddaughter and her husband want a bigger place with better soil so they can produce more of their own food.

China is buying huge tracts of farmland in Africa, preparing for the future.

The ability to produce food is likely to be critical in the not too distant future. Although there is nothing we can do about the drought, we can do something to prepare for the future of food scarcity.

## Trails group worked hard

Councillor Jason Earle gave a Vermilion Trails progress report at the September 17 Town Council meeting.

He commended Vermilion Trails for the work the group has done this summer.

He noted the Steve King 100 km. relay was a success and the group hopes it will be bigger next year. The caboose is nearly completely restored, and a lot of work has been done on rest areas along the TransCanada Trail.

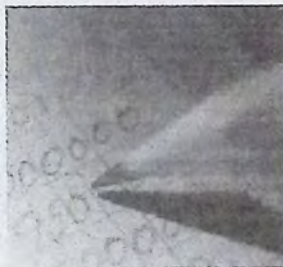

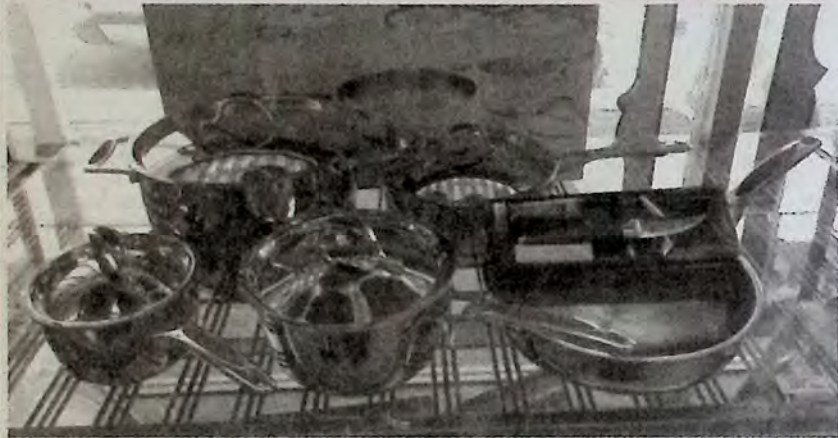

### Living Past 100

#### Find Your Lost Youth

As we age, we tend to worry more and stress more. These mental states influence health and when we hit 50 years of age, many of us suffer the consequences of our stress and worries. We wonder where the energy and optimism of youth went. We wish we could find it again.

Although nothing can fix some of the ails of aging, there is a surprising way to recapture the feeling of being young, and that feeling improves health.

A study done more than 20 years ago in New England proved our health can be improved by reliving our youth. In an experiment at a care facility for the elderly, every current television show was replaced by old television shows. The only music on the radio was from the young years of the residents. Old magazines and newspapers replaced up-to-date issues.

After two weeks of being immersed in their own pasts, the residents of the care facility were tested for things like blood pressure, optimism, signs of depression or stress, and a number of physical indicators of general health, such as the amount of activity during the day, how well the residents slept and for how long, and how much food they ate.

The residents showed lower blood pressure, more activity, better mood, better sleep and improved appetite.

Unfortunately, the experiment could not be extended indefinitely, but the short period of time did prove to be a re-youthing to some extent.

The experiment was an effort to discover if our body cells share our memories. The theory behind the experiment was that our body cells do remember, and can remember how it felt to be young. As cells were replaced through age, each new cell inherited the memories of the dying cells, or so the theory went.

There is a simple experiment you can do: listen to the music of your late teens and twenties. There is something about music that can take us back to our youth, but there is also the possibility that music, because sound penetrates cells, can bring a change not only in how we feel at the emotional level, but how old we are at the cellular level.

Try it. If the golden oldies make you feel good, then keep on playing those old tunes!

## Chicken and Andouille Sausage Gumbo

(NC)—Introduce your family to this classic Louisiana favourite. Bursting with Cajun flavours and full of protein, this chicken and sausage gumbo is easy to make and sure to please the family.

### Ingredients

- 1 lb (500 g) boneless skinless chicken thighs
- 1/8 tsp (0.5 mL) freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tsp (5 mL) salt
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) olive oil
- 1 pkg (500 g) New PC Andouille Sausage
- 3 cups (750 mL) diced sweet red pepper
- 2 cups (500 mL) diced onions
- 1-1/2 cups (375 mL) diced celery
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) minced garlic
- 2 tbsp (25 mL) Creole seasoning
- 1 can (796 mL) diced Tomatoes
- 3 cups (750 mL) chicken Broth
- 1 pouch (283 g) whole Grain Brown Rice
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) chopped Italian parsley

### Directions

- Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C).
  - Sprinkle chicken with pepper and 1/4 tsp (1 mL) of the salt. In large ovenproof frying pan, heat 1 tbsp (15 mL) of the oil over medium-high heat. Add chicken and sausage to pan; cook for 8 minutes, turning once, or until browned. Transfer pan to centre of oven; bake for 15 minutes. Remove pan from oven. Set aside to cool.
  - In large saucepan, heat remaining 2 tbsp (25 mL) oil over medium-high heat; cook pepper, onion and celery for 12 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir in garlic and Creole seasoning; cook for 3 to 5 minutes more or until vegetables are tender and slightly coloured. Stir in tomatoes and juices and chicken broth. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to simmer. Remove chicken and sausage from frying pan; stir drippings from frying pan into vegetable mixture. Simmer for 15 minutes.
  - Meanwhile, quarter chicken thighs and slice sausages 1/2-inch (1 cm) thick; set aside. Place rice pouch on a paper towel, seam side up. Pouch is self-venting; do not puncture, tear or cut. Microwave on HIGH for 3 minutes.
  - Stir chicken, sausage, rice and remaining 3/4 tsp (4 mL) salt into vegetable mixture. Simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in parsley and serve. Prep time: 20 minutes / Cook time: 65 minutes / Makes 10 servings

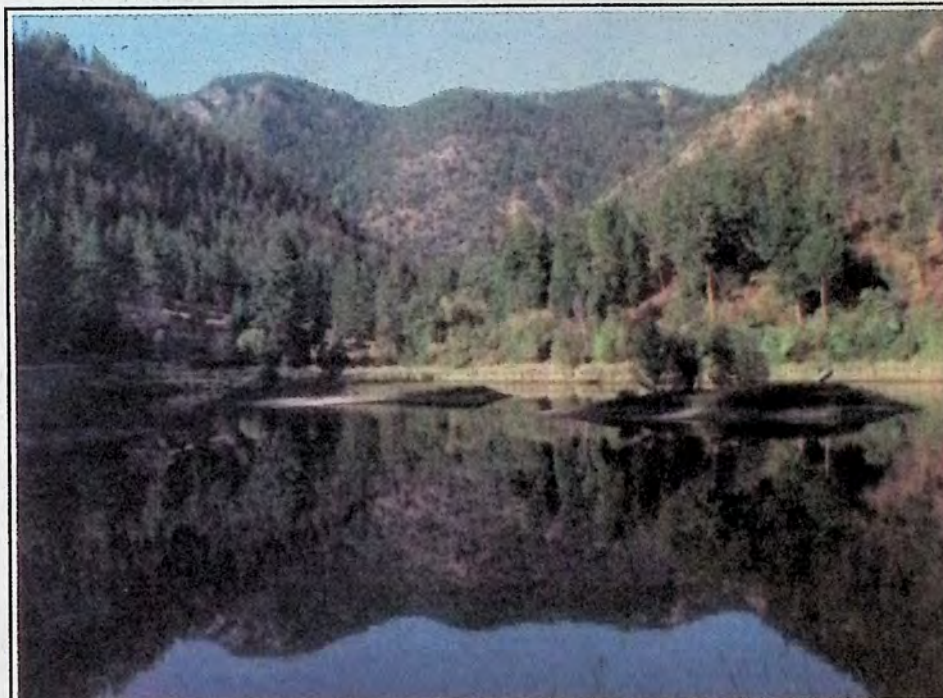
# Around The Similkameen!



You are looking at "Round-up Ready Corn" growing along Highway 3 east of Keremeos. It looks innocuous enough. Critics of Monsanto - the giant worldwide conglomerate that has a patent on all Round-up Ready crops - counter that instead of reducing herbicide use, these types of crops increase herbicide use because the entire crop needs to be sprayed with Round-up in order for the plant's characteristics to be harnessed. Farmers who accidentally grow Round-up Ready crops (the plants reseed themselves via wind and birds) are held accountable in court. Monsanto has a history of suing and putting farmers under if they are found to have even a handful of patented plants or seeds on their farm without signing the required Monsanto contract. Organic Food production in Canada does not permit genetically-modified crops nor does it allow manure to be used from livestock that are fed genetically-modified plant matter. 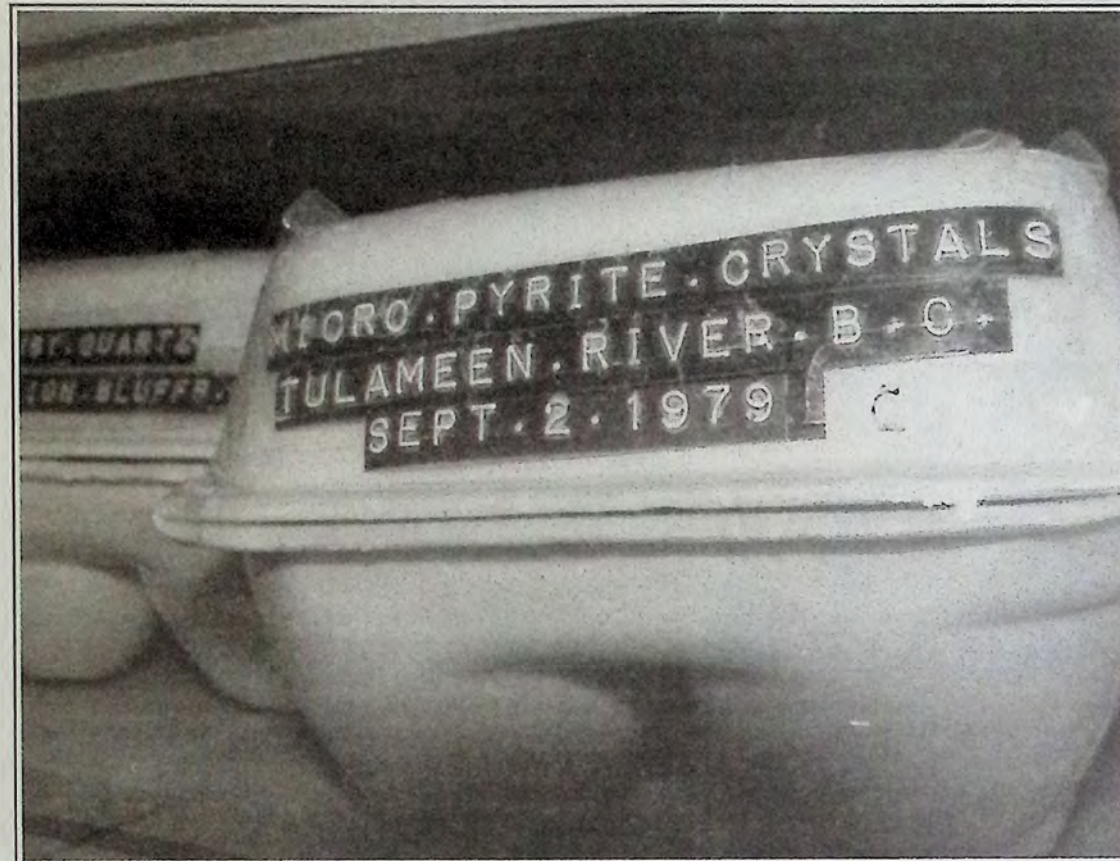

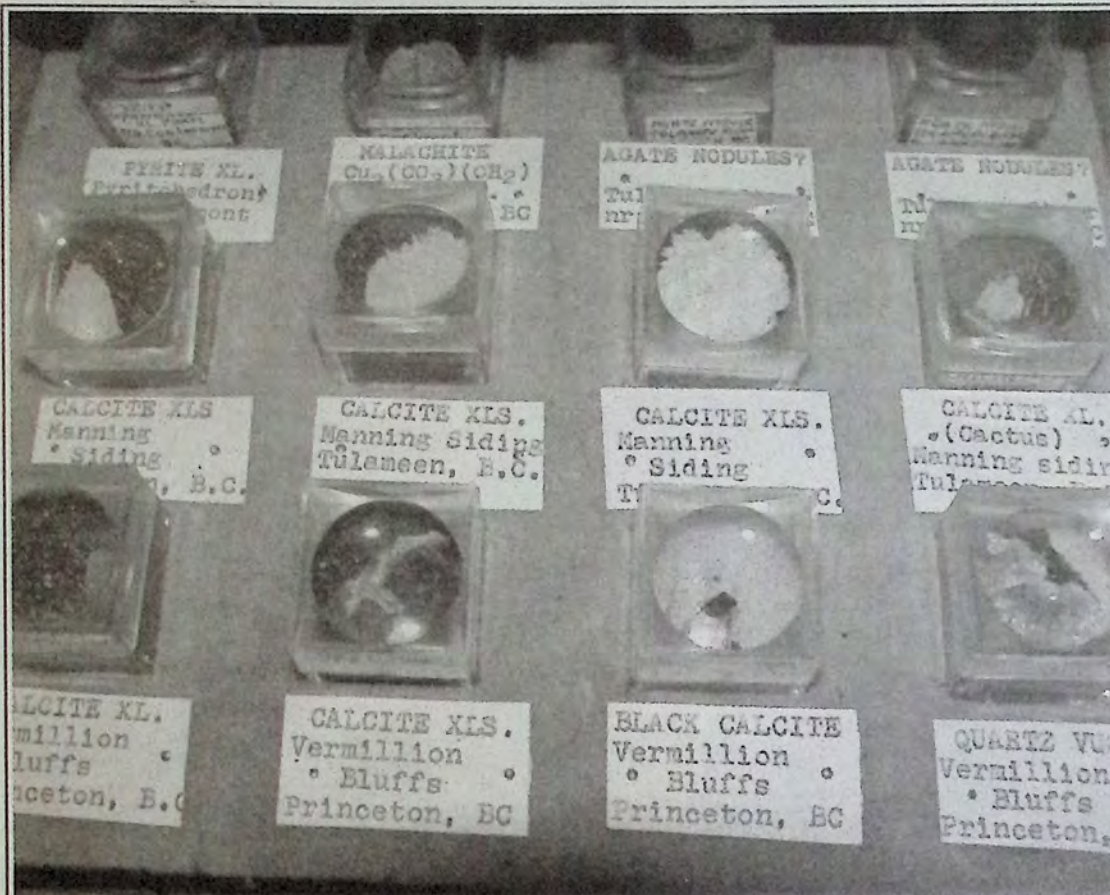

Although Princeton Museum is now closed for the season (open only by appointment) there is still a lot of activity going on inside the building. The 'off season' allows volunteers to go through the many artifacts and collections housed in storage in the basement for identification and cataloguing. The Museum catalogues all items to create an inventory listing of each and every item on display and in storage. Cataloguing also allows items moved from storage to a display be put away exactly where it came from when displays are removed and replaced with different items from storage. Volunteer Terry Malanchuk has taken on the task of cataloguing the hundreds of thousands of rock, mineral and fossil pieces in the Joe Pollard Collection along with other samples that are housed in the basement. Mineral samples pictured above are from the Pollard Collection and were very carefully identified and other documentation, such as where the sample came from, date of sample recovery, etc. were recorded by the collector. Not all rock and mineral samples were labeled in such detail, so Malanchuk will spend most of the off season working on sorting through the samples and identifying them. Malanchuk estimates the job just on the rock and mineral collection will take well over a year to complete based on the volunteer hours he'll be able to provide. \*

As our busy summer season has come to a close, The Princeton Museum is proud to have achieved many successes with expanded hours, increased public programming, and overall visibility in the community.

In January of this year, the Museum executive board and museum members enjoyed a full day of strategic planning facilitated by our towns past CAO, Patrick Robins. From that session the board was able to identify a list of priorities that became the driving force for the

Museum operations in 2012.

Working in our archives was identified as a top priority, to move towards digitization, expansion and rotation of exhibits, and increased accessibility for researchers. This project has been ongoing, and the progress has been remarkable.

Second on our list of projected outcomes was building partnerships with local groups, clubs and supporting local events. In April we installed our first temporary exhibit to celebrate the 2nd annual Spirit Festival Pow Wow. The exhibit was beautiful, with examples of hand made regalia generously loaned by

Oly Bent, Pow Wow Arena Director, and Tiinesha Begaye, award winning Aboriginal Vocalist.

Our other temporary exhibit was "Canada takes Flight" in celebration of the 5th annual Princeton International Air Show. With items on loan from the Canadian Museum of Flight, and delivered by pilot Bill Findlay, we were able to build an exhibit that explored the history of flight in Canada, as well as right here in Princeton.

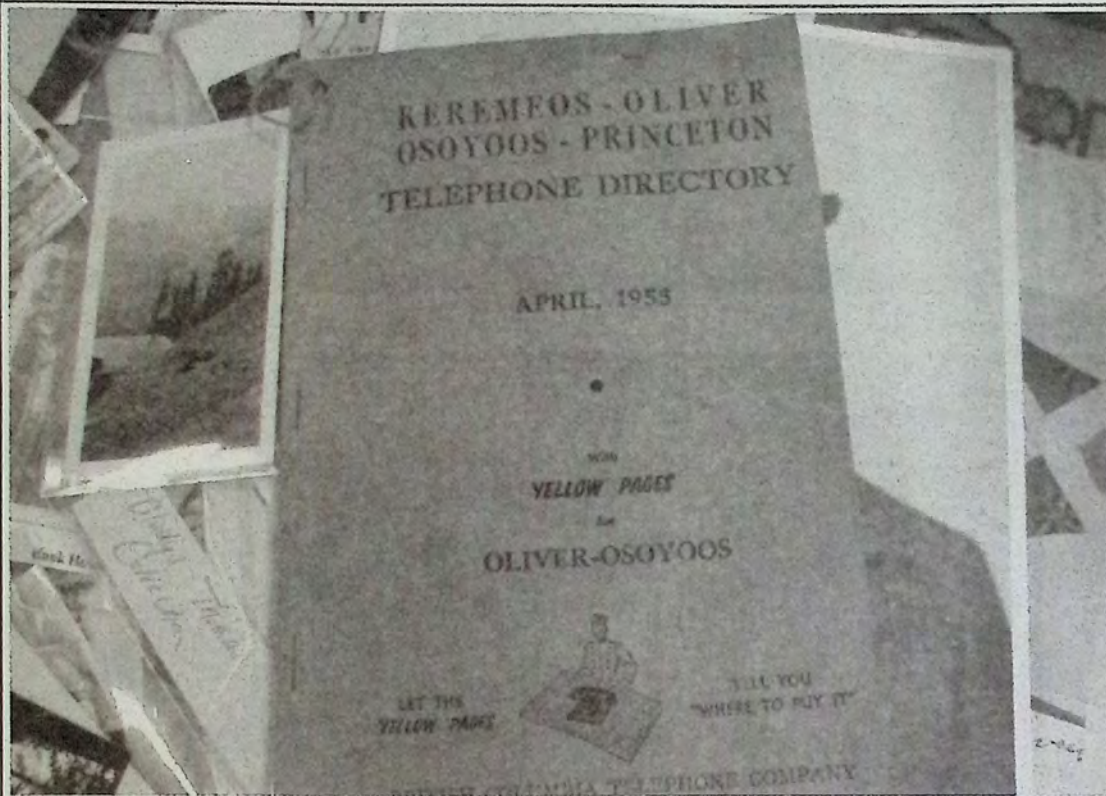

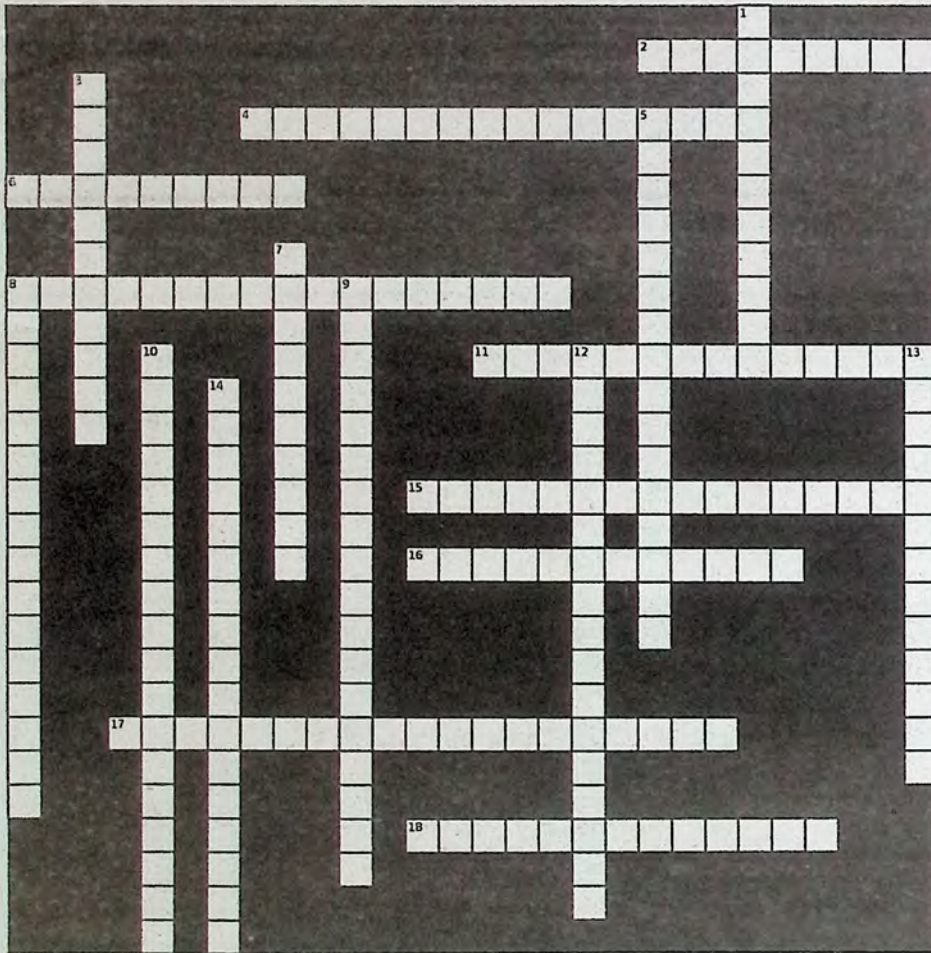
