## Dr. Smith updates local health situation

Princeton's Dr. David Smith sat down with Similkameen News Leader last week and this interview was the result of that meeting:

**News Leader:** Hello again Dr. Smith and thanks for this interview.

**Dr. Smith:** You are very welcome.

**News Leader:** First of all could you give us an update with what's happening at the Hospital.

**Dr. Smith:** Well I think that it important to know that there is still FULL 24 hour cover over weekends, and it appears that we have got this cover till almost the end of next year (end of 2013). This has been a major step in the right direction. We certainly have the Mine and the Mill to thank for this, as they have donated certain funds for the weekend locum doctors, which has made all the difference in the world. We are very much indebted to both these organizations. They have in reality, saved a very difficult situation for us, and I hope that the public are aware of this very generous gift to the locum doctor fund. Interior Health had nothing to do with this.

**News Leader:** What about during the week?

**Dr. Smith:** The hospital remains closed after 12 midnight till 8 in the morning (Monday to Thursday night), but I wish to remind the patients that a very good 24 hour ambulance service is available and by phoning 911 you can be in Penticton within 90 minutes. I would also remind patients that the fact that the hospital is closed for 8

hours a night during the week, is not necessarily a bad thing in certain circumstances. Let me take the example of having had a stroke. The treatment of a stroke is to give the clot busting medication within a "golden period" of 5 hours. Now this medication may NOT be given until a CT examination (CAT scan) of the brain has been performed. The closest CT scanner is in Penticton. So obviously if you can get to Penticton AS SOON AS POSSIBLE after a stroke, it's very much to your advantage. It is in reality not to your advantage to come to Princeton first, if your golden period of 5 hours is running out of time. Get to a CT scanner as soon as you can (Penticton, Kamloops or Kelowna) because if you run out of your golden 5 hours then you will not be given the clot buster, which could make a massive difference to your recuperation after a stroke.

**News Leader:** What are the prospects in the future here?

**Dr. Smith:** Well quite frankly I think that they are looking particularly good. As you have already heard in the press, it appears that we have every chance of getting a young doctor to join us in about August next year (not confirmed yet, but most likely). If this happens then we have every chance of opening those hours during the week as well. Interior Health are also in the process of negotiating with another physician who looks particularly keen. There is a new deal going out that Interior Health intends to start soon, that will pay a certain "incentive bonus" to any new physician if

## Fair elects new board

Princeton Agricultural Fair members met November 27 to elect a new Board of Directors. Councillor Doug Pateman conducted the election, which saw Dan Kastor returned as President. No Vice-President was elected. Fran Murphy is the new Secretary, and Lisa Carleton is Treasurer. Directors elected for two years are Rose Flegel, Cheryl Ferguson, Sue Gereau and Shirley Freding.

Following the election, a regular meeting began, with a lot of discussion about renovating the 4-H section of the fairgrounds. The stalls and poultry area are in serious disrepair and members concluded the

entire area should be replaced. Possible grant sources were discussed and will be researched. A recommendation will be made to Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA).

Other discussion focused on electrical upgrades for the fair buildings and better lighting for the 4-H area of the grounds. Area H Director Brad Hope attended the meeting and advised there may be a source of funding for the electrical upgrades. He urged the Fair Board and PXA to work with Regional District staff to obtain funding. The Fair Board agreed to take the matter to the PXA Finance Committee.

President Dan Kastor stated there is some urgency about setting the date for the next fair, but there has been no commitment from Little Britches Rodeo Association to join with the fair. A deadline of January 1 was set to obtain a commitment.

This meeting was the last for 2012. The next meeting of Fair members is January 22, 2013, at the library conference room, where meetings are held during the winter months.

The Fair Association, along with all the other user groups at the Princeton Fairgrounds, is made up entirely of volunteers from the community and surrounding area. Each group works all year planning and organizing various cultural events to provide entertainment for locals as well as to attract attendance from former residents and tourists.

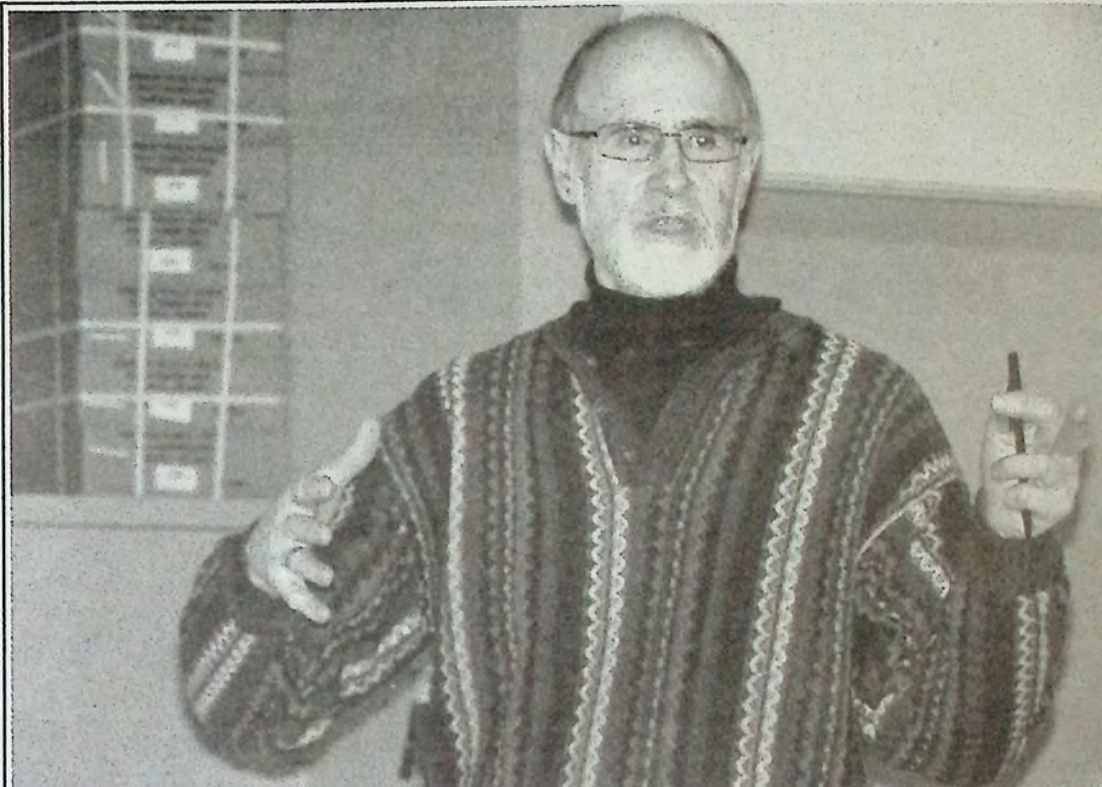

**Council of Canadians - Making Waves  
Sinking the Harper Agenda Conference - Part 1**

Late in October I had the privilege of attending the Council of Canadians (COC) AGM and Conference in Nanaimo.

It gave me the opportunity to meet and reconnect with Canadians from across the country, all of whom are deeply concerned about our future as a sovereign nation.

I have followed very closely as the COC, together with other social justice groups, continue to expose the flaws of the proposed so called "Free Trade" agreement with Europe (CETA). I can only marvel at the energy of Maude Barlow and others as they tirelessly call upon Canadians to take action.

It is not difficult for me to identify with the goals of this grass roots organization since I have always been, first and foremost, a Canadian nationalist. I firmly believe that values and needs of our own citizens must come first in the types of foreign investment we allow, the trade agreements we negotiate and in the international objectives we choose to support.

Canada used to have a fairly balanced approach when aligning corporate interests with the rights of workers and the need for effective

social programs. This balance started to shift to the corporate sector with Prime Minister Brian Mulroney in the 1980's and the signing of the Free Trade agreement with the US. Prior to this, successive federal governments, both Conservative and Liberal were able to focus to a greater degree, often under pressure from the NDP, on the strong social policies that were being demanded by the Canadian public. Medicare, Employment Insurance and pensions are examples of this courageous social commitment.

One of the highlights for me at the conference was attending a plenary panel entitled, "Uniting Against Austerity: Strengthening Solidarity in the Movement for Economic Justice", which examined the impact on pensions, social programs, trade unions, immigrants, deregulation, privatization and cuts to public service jobs as Harper and other governments around the world forge ahead with harsh austerity measures and deep corporate tax cuts. I was encouraged to hear of the growing resistance among the public to these measures.

Panelist Robert Chernomas,

Professor of Economics, University of Manitoba, equated such government actions with class warfare and mentioned how the super-rich in the world are evading taxes to the tune of \$21 Trillion dollars. He pointed out how Corporations in Canada are sitting on cash reserves of approximately \$525 Billion which, interestingly, is the same amount as our national debt.

Chernomas also discussed the 'high tax - high spend' policies of Nordic countries which can boast the lowest national debt, the most competitive economies, a highly trained labour force, the strongest unions and the highest per capita income in the world. His presentation reminded me of the film I have provided several screenings of throughout the riding entitled, "Poor No More". Throughout the film Canadian TV icon Mary Walsh, narrates comparisons between the quality of life in Canada, Ireland and Sweden. We saw how Sweden has free university tuition, 400+ days of maternity/paternity leave per child, strong health care, national child care and effective state-run care for seniors. We learned about the strong partnership that has been developed between labour, corporations and government which has made all this possible.

Clearly, political choices were made in that country for a strong social net for all its citizens rather than regressive tax breaks for the corporate sector and "slash and burn" austerity measures for everyone else.

In Part II of my column I will explore what other panelists had to say about the topic of austerity.

## Flip Of The Coyne

When the XL plant in Alberta was closed down due to E. coli contamination just about everyone I knew got gun shy around store-bought beef. I can't say I blame them. I know I have reduced the amount of beef that I buy from the grocery store. If that wasn't scary enough, a report on CTV News on November 28 showed that meat inspectors were instructed "to give extra scrutiny to carcasses shipped to Japan, but to ignore visible fecal and intestinal contamination on meat for Canadians."

When you hear about practices like this you really start to lose confidence in the system that we believe is in place to protect us. It's criminal when the government willfully encourages a two-tiered system and the domestic market is seen as being the lesser of the two tiers. If you buy Canadian beef, you should be buying the best quality and safest beef on the market. Unfortunately this is not the case. I understand why beef shipped to Japan needs to be scrutinized so closely after the discovery of BSE, but if you consider that the meat that we are sending to Japan is safer than the meat we are feeding to our families in Canada, you have to admit there is something wrong with that.

The government of British Columbia changed the rules in this

province to make it mandatory for every meat processing plant that sells to the public to have a federal meat inspector with the idea that it would make the system safer. As we are finding out, we may not be any safer, and in some cases we could be at more risk. If meat inspectors are being told to ignore things like fecal contamination on the meat going down the line, are we really safe? I very much doubt your neighbourhood butcher was going to allow something like that to poison his neighbours and customers.

We need a change. We need the government to take its role in food safety more seriously, and if they refuse to do so, then we need to allow our local butchers to do what they did for centuries before the government stepped in and put them out of business. Food production is a local business. Let locals look after their markets. We were safe before the government stepped in and put all our local processors out of business and allowed major companies to become the only game in town. These corporations that now control the meat processing in our country don't necessarily answer to you and me, the consumers. They answer to their shareholders, and if they don't meet profit expectations, then they will see their stocks suffer. Your local butch-

er has to worry about the bottom line too, but his bottom line depends on you coming back through the door. The butcher depends on you for his bottom line, and if you get sick, then his bottom line will be hurt.

We need to take back our food system. The food system is not some-

thing we can afford to allow to fail. We can do without many of our consumer products, but food isn't one of them. We need to defend our local producers. We need to support them by shopping locally and we should be demanding the ability for local butchers to do what they do: process

our meat. The government should get out of the way of farmers and ranchers and allow them to sell to their friends and neighbours again. The government needs to let local food systems do what they have been doing since the beginning of time: feed people.

## SOHC supports Canada Health Act

The founding principle of health care in Canada is equality. This principle gave us the Canada Health Act which provides for equal access to quality health care regardless of who you are, where you live, or how much money you make. Unfortunately, this principle is under attack at both the provincial and federal level. These attacks come in the form of budget cuts justified by the alarmist message that health care costs are unsustainable.

Sustainability rationale is a myth. As a percentage of Canada's Gross Domestic Product, health care spending has remained steady at between 4 and 5% since 1975 (see <http://medicare.ca/main/the-facts/9-sustainability-of-health-care>). The unsustainability myth is the result of governments portraying health care costs as a percentage of overall budget. What, in fact, has happened is that health care costs have remained level as support for other govern-

ment sectors has decreased, resulting in a perceived percentage increase in health care costs. This perception is the justification used by government to cut back on health care budgets and present privatization as a solution.

In solidarity with the BC Health Coalition, the Princeton Save Our Hospital Coalition opposes any erosion of the Canada Health Act's principles of universality, comprehensiveness, portability, accessibility, and public administration. We are against user fees, privatization, corporatization, and any other barriers to equal access to health care.

In 2004, federal and provincial first ministers signed a ten-year Canada Health Accord, identifying several

priorities for health care reform in Canada. As negotiations begin on a new Canada Health Accord, we need all provincial, territorial, and federal health ministers to support the principles of the Canada Health Act. The BC Health Coalition is asking all residents of our province to take direct action to protect our publicly funded health care system. By contacting your elected representatives and voicing your concerns you will send a strong message that equitable and sustainable health care service is not only possible, it is the right of all Canadians.

I have lived here for going on 27 years. I have seen and heard a lot of things said about the community and many of the residents. Sometimes it's not always good things, but when something bad happens, usually members of the community forget differences and just pitch in.

I've heard it described as being 'just the right thing to do' and for many, it is a good thing a lot of us feel that way.

It also shows others the true character of our community.

I got to see this first hand following an incident this past weekend. I volunteer for the Princeton Posse. One of the things I do is the internet play-by-play of home games on a webcast. A webcast it like a televised hockey game, only this is online and is a pay-per-view item. I'm in my 5th season as the 'webcaster' and have a handful of dedicated helpers who assist with everything from running the camera to keeping stats and sending messages during the game on Twitter.

The equipment we use, which is owned by the Posse, was vandalized with the most severe damage being a wrecked mixing board. The resulting 'lost' webcast was devastating for out-of-town Posse fans that tune in to watch the games.

I posted on Twitter and Facebook what had happened and before the game was over Posse family members, friends and fans started a fundraising campaign to replace the equipment.

A couple hundred dollars, plus an offer to supply all security equipment, was dropped off at my office the following morning with more coming in.

I'm sure there will be a large amount collected by the time you get around to reading this.

It surprises me a bit, and a bit of it I think doesn't surprise me at all because we are surrounded by people in our community who are willing to instantly set aside differences and pitch in because they believe it is the right thing to do.

And that is one of the reasons I really like this place I've called home for most of my life.

The next time you feel like saying something negative about the Princeton area, I hope you think about the ways this town joins together to do things.

And maybe, just maybe, it will be enough to turn you into one of those who pitch in, not for personal gain, but because it's what we do and it's what makes our town what it is.

## Vandals cost Princeton Posse \$\$\$

Princeton's Junior B Hockey Club, the Posse, suffered a lost over the weekend.

No, they didn't lose a game and they didn't lose a member of their team.

The Princeton Posse lost an opportunity.

The past five seasons the Princeton Posse has been part of a network of teams in the KIJHL and other sports teams in Western Canada that 'webcast' their games over the internet. The games are part of a pay-per-view program that makes money for both the league and the team.

Viewers spend an average of \$7.00 to view the game. A portion of that fee goes to the league, which is then distributed to teams at the end of the season.

The Princeton Posse webcasts have been the second most viewed in the league for the past two sea-

sons. On average there can be anywhere from 25 to 100 people watching the live webcasts at home anywhere in North America.

You do the math. That's a few dollars. Multiply that by 25 home games in the regular season and tack onto that playoff games and additional revenue from viewing archived games and you get the picture that this is not a few bucks we're talking about.

Some time after the November 16th game and November 30th the Princeton Posse webcast equipment was damaged. The damage was serious enough to prevent the team from putting last Friday night's game online, which lost the team (and KIJHL) some revenue.

The Posse pay a per game fee to webcast each game and the league fines teams a hefty amount for not providing a webcast. The Posse could be fined for all future games not provided online.

Fortunately a fundraising campaign started before last Friday

night's game ended and generous donations have been received.

But why did this happen?

I have my suspicions of what went on in the broadcast booth at Princeton Arena between Posse home games, but I have no proof, and it is not my style to point fingers without something to back me up.

What I do know is that there are issues related to safety and security at Princeton Arena, which affect all the users of the facility.

But what it really comes down to is sharing.

We all need to share the space and we need to respect what other users are doing with their portion of that space.

Wrecking webcast equipment is one thing. Those things can be replaced, but what happens if it gets more serious than that?

If you have any information regarding the circumstances revolving around the vandalism of the Princeton Posse webcast gear, I'd like to hear it.

To the Editor;

Congratulations to the Mayor and Council for following through on the late Mayor Thomas's plan to make snow removal of Bridge Street and Vermilion Avenue a priority after a significant accumulation of snow.



# Tourist strategy worth billions

A 10 year tourism strategy has been developed by the Thompson Okanagan Tourist Association for the entire region, which will include a strategy for marketing the Similkameen Valley. Tourism in the region is valued at an estimated \$1.7 billion.

During the past two years, the regional Tourist Association has worked to make business aware of the potential. Meetings with stakeholders have been involved in developing the strategy through a coordinated approach to strengthening the tourist industry. One of the key messages to every part of the region was to stop viewing competition as the business down the street, and start seeing it as the business in California or New Zealand. The goal of the Association is to put Thompson Okanagan region on the world stage as a 'must visit' destination.

Similkameen Valley Planning Society has worked on marketing the entire valley. One of the key findings at the tourism meetings was a lack of identity for the Similkameen Valley. A Similkameen Valley website is being developed which will contain numerous images of the valley.

One of the common goals of every part of the region is to create jobs and development that respects and sustains our environment and our culture. For those who may doubt our culture, an overview of what goes on in the region is much like what goes on in the Similkameen Valley. Ours is a region of forests, mountains, rivers, lakes, ranches, vineyards and wineries, sawmills, mines, orchards, ski hills and ski trails, and First Nations Reserves and businesses. The sheer diversity

of the region lends itself to a real marketing opportunity.

The focus on summer tourism is still in place, but there seems to be a lack of tourists in the colder months, a problem the Association will address. Snowmobile tours and ice fishing are winter time activities which may benefit from more and better marketing.

**Is Your Christmas Tree A Fire Hazard?**

(NC)— It's the Christmas holiday season, our most treasured time of the year. It's a time of celebration, joy and sharing time with family and friends. Unfortunately, this important time can also be one marked by tragedy if precautions are not taken against accidental fire. According to the Canadian Safety Council, every year about 400 Canadians lose their lives in an accidental household fire. In fact, it's during the holiday season that the number of deaths caused by accidental household fires is at its highest.

Patrice De Luca, vice president of marketing and business development for Reliance Protectron Security Services, says the major culprit for this significant increase is

the famed Christmas tree.

"You need to take every possible precaution to minimize the risks of fire, especially if you choose a natural tree," he added.

"Fire is one of the greatest threats to your family and home. People do not realize the emotional toll a fire can take, even if there is no loss of life."

Here are safety tips to consider from Protectron's free "Saving Lives Program":

- If possible, consider an artificial tree. They are much safer and cleaner.
- Leave the tree outside until you're

ready to decorate.

- The tree stand should hold at least 1 gallon of water. It's crucial to check the water level every day.
- Detectors for smoke and carbon monoxide should be installed at strategic locations – your kitchen, stairwell, bedroom hallways and other high-traffic household areas. ### Ingredients

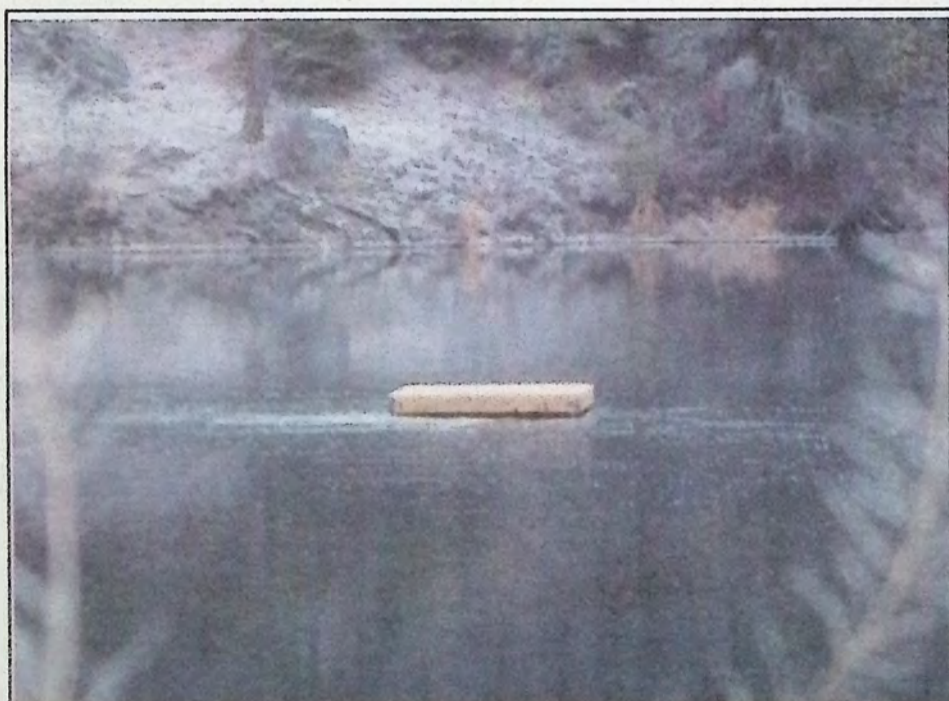

**Huldra Silver**

Huldra Silver Inc. ("Huldra" or the "Company") November 23rd released details of its upcoming underground diamond drill program and planned surface drill program for the summer of 2013. The Company also announced it had achieved a major milestone in shipping the first concentrates from its mill in Merritt, BC.

The underground drill program is designed to systematically test for mineralisation from Level 1 to 20 metres below Level 2 at the Treasure Mountain Mine, ultimately leading to the generation of a National Instrument 43-101 compliant resource estimate for this area.

The program will be comprised of 61 holes, for a total program of 4,400 metres of HQ diamond drill core. The drilling will be conducted from two diamond drill platforms, specifically constructed to allow for optimal drilling of the targeted mineralisation from the footwall of the vein.

A video displaying the planned drill program can be viewed at the company website. An initial interpretation has identified two mineralised structures on Level 2.

The underground drill program follows up on mineralisation identified by the Company's 2011 surface diamond drilling program and encompasses areas adjacent to Holes TM11-26, TM11-9 and TM11-36 which produced the results indicated

below. The complete list of results from the 2011 program are available on the Company's website at [www.huldrasilver.com](http://www.huldrasilver.com).

• 7,013 grams per tonne Ag, 21.82% Pb, 19.63% Zn and 4.9% Mn over 1.2 metres true width in hole TM11-26 that intersected the vein structure approximately 10 metres above the Level 2 drift.

• 592.92 grams per tonne Ag, 4.28% Pb, 2.47% Zn and 5.80% Mn over 2.2 metres true width in hole TM11-9 that intersected the vein structure below the Level 1 drift, approximately 80 metres east of the Level 2 drift.

• 1,565 grams per tonne Ag, 13.47% Pb, 9.92% Zn and 4.76% Mn over 0.8 metres true width in hole TM11-36 that intersected the vein structure approximately 15 metres below the Level 2 drift.

The program also builds on the results from 256 chip samples collected along vein exposures on Level 2.

Highlights from that chip sampling program are presented in a table on the company website.

\* All samples were delivered by truck to ACME Analytical Laboratories facility in Vancouver, BC where the sample was crushed, split and pulverised to -200 mesh. A 0.5g portion of the pulp was digested in hot aqua regia and analyzed for 31 elements by ICP MS method. Ag overlimits were analyzed by fire

assay with gravimetric finish, and for Pb and Zn by four digestion and ICP ES finish.

The underground drilling targets are also coincident with a geophysical anomaly identified during a magnetic susceptibility survey conducted over the Treasure Mountain property.

The Company also provided details of its upcoming surface diamond drill program on the Treasure Mountain property. An 8,000 metre surface program is anticipated in the summer of 2013, with the drilling spread across four separate targets. The drilling is designed to test targets identified through geochemical soil sampling and airborne geophysics. The targets to be tested during this program are the:

(i) MB Zone, a geochemical and geophysical anomaly approximately 800 metres north of the existing mine workings where, in 2010, a grab sample was taken and assayed 0.81 g/t Au, 9221 g/t Ag (296.4 oz/t Ag), 1.02% Cu, 1.14% Pb, 1.03% Zn from a composite sample of reddish oxide material. (see August 25, 2010 press release);

(ii) Camp Zone, a geochemical and geophysical anomaly identified east of the camp and approximately 500 metres south of the existing mine workings,

(iii) Jensen Anomaly, a geophysical anomaly near the historic Jensen ..... continued on Page 22

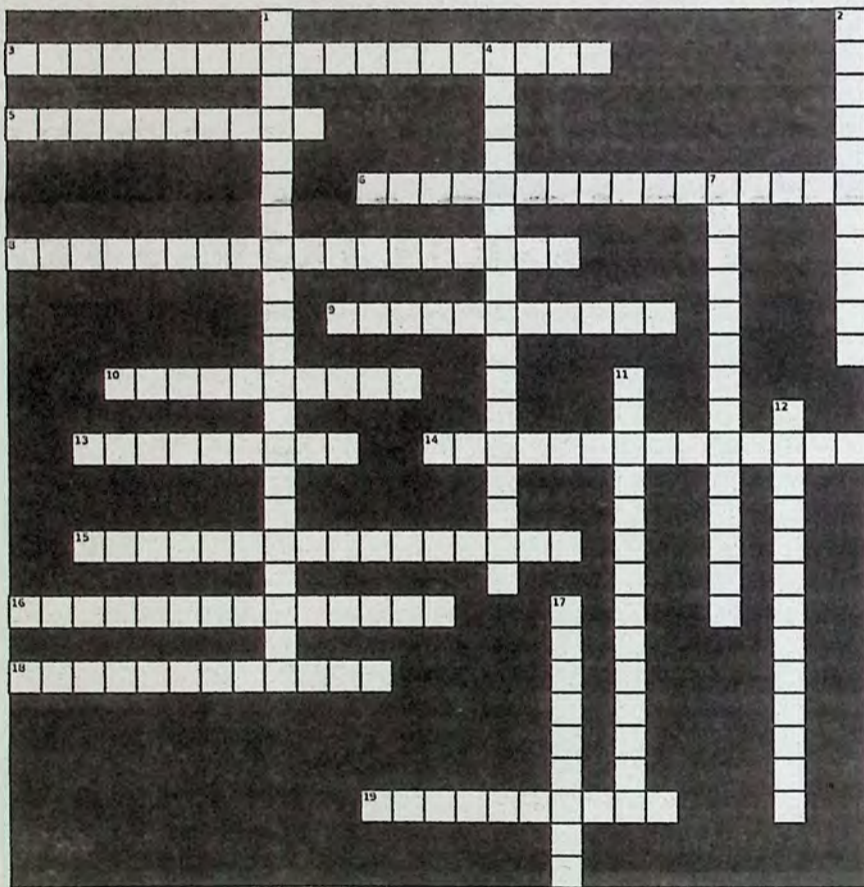

he stays for a minimum period of 3 years. This deal has been used in Saskatchewan very successfully for many years now, so this is great news for us in rural BC.

**News Leader:** There was talk about a single Clinic opening up in town with all the doctors working out of one Clinic. Is this true?

**Dr. Smith:** Your information is pretty hot! Yes we have been discussing these options with Interior Health, as well as with ALL the doctors in this town, and I think that we are in agreement that all the doctors (and related medical workers such as the dietician, nurse practitioner) working out of one Clinic would in the long run, benefit everyone. It is easier to attract doctors to a single clinic with lots of medical personnel than to a solo doctor clinic. So the answer is yes, we are looking at this option in a serious light. For this to be successful then I think that we are going to need the blessing of Interior Health in a big way. It is my understanding that they are basically in favor of it, so who knows what we can achieve.

sources.

- Use only CSA-listed lights, and no more than three strands linked together.
- Use miniature lights—which have cool-burning bulbs.

**Dr. Smith:** I am increasingly optimistic that we are going to find a workable solution. If you look around us at places like Clearwater, Ashcroft, Nakusp, and now recently Enderby which has been reduced from 5 physicians to one, then my feeling is that we are not really that badly off, and especially with some bright prospects looming for our town.

**News Leader:** Any last thoughts?

**Dr. Smith:** There has been a lot of work done by many organizations in this town in their attempts to get physicians here. I think that they all deserve tremendous credit for what they have done and achieved so far. What they have, in essence done, is to put Princeton in the limelight and on the map, and I think that the crowning glory was getting the Minister of Health to sit around the table with us and to discuss our problems. That was a great coup. My personal feeling is that we are going to go from strength to strength, and I feel that it will not be too long into the new year when we can get our Hospital back to 24/7. We are certainly all hoping for that.

**Mining Update**

At the Treasure Mountain Mine, the Company is currently on track to meet its stated 2012 objective of mining its permitted 60,000 tonnes of mill feed from the underground workings in addition to the previously removed 10,000 tonne bulk sample.
