Town rents space at airport

Highpoint Helicopters of 108 Mile Ranch, BC will be renting space at Princeton Airport following a decision made at the December 3rd regular meeting of Town Council.

Councillor Doug Pateman made the motion, seconded by Councillor Jason Earle, which will see the helicopter company rent one bay in Building 1 for \$159.40 per month and a small office in the Terminal

building for \$200.00 per month. They will occupy those spaces from April to October 2013 in an arrangement which could lead to a long-term rental.

There are three accessory buildings on the site of the Princeton Airport, one is rented to Princeton Ground Search and Rescue for storage, one is used as a hanger and the third is currently empty. The Highpoint Helicopters rental is for a bay in the five-bay empty building and office space in the Terminal.

"They would like to establish a permanent base for one helicopter during fire season, and possibly expanding to become year round," Interim CAO Helen Koning explained in her report to Council.

Storage rates in the Princeton area range around 6.00 to 6.92 per square foot per year.

"As the building has electricity but no water or sewer I recommend rental for this space at the lower rate," Koning added.

Highpoint Helicopters Ltd. is a small helicopter charter company with fixed bases currently in 108 Mile Ranch, BC and Grande Prairie, Alberta. The company owns three helicopters.

"We are in the process of exploring suitable locations to establish an additional base in the south central portion of BC and are considering Princeton," stated Daryl Anderson of the company in a letter to Town Council.

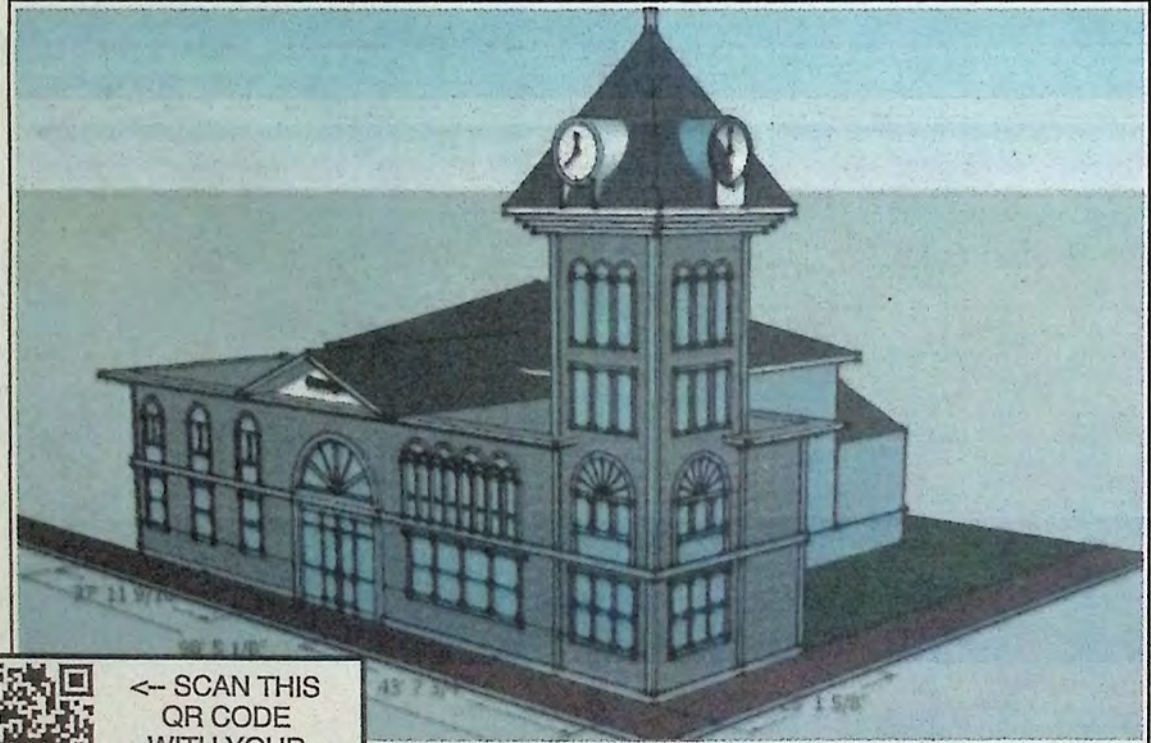
The third quarter financial statement of the Town of Princeton was released during the December 3rd regular meeting of Town Council.

As of September 30th the Town of Princeton had contributed a total of \$132,170.00 to local organizations with \$39,030.00 still in the municipal budget.

"This includes \$25,000.00 that will be payable to the Chamber of Commerce once the fee for service agreement is signed by the Chamber and \$10,000.00 of that has been allotted to Vermilion Trails for trail development," Deputy Treasurer Collector Shirley McMahon stated in her report to Council.

Music man returns!

Princeton welcomed the return of Harold Crane, former band teacher at Princeton Secondary School. He was guest of honour at the band concert held at Riverside Centre on December 3.

The reason for honoring Crane begins with current band teacher, Myrna Coates, seeking a vibraphone for her band. She went to a music supply store in Kelowna to ask if the shop owner knew of anyone who might want to sell a vibraphone. He did. He immediately contacted Joyce Crane, Harold's daughter, who had a vibraphone stored in her basement. Her father had bought it for her many years ago when she was in a band with him.

Joyce hesitated about selling it, but when she found out it was for Princeton, and told her father about

it, he told her to make up her mind. The result was the vibraphone was donated to Princeton's band.

At the concert, 96 year old Harold Crane led the band in O Canada to begin the concert.

Calling Crane Princeton's 'Music Man', Bob Cormack, who had been Principal of Princeton Secondary during the years when Crane taught music, gave a speech outlining Crane's success as a band teacher. Crane began teaching in 1961 and by 1965 led the Princeton band to a championship at a music festival in the Lower Mainland.

The mixed school and community bands completed the evening with a wide variety of music, some simple for the beginners and some complex involving the entire band, such as the rollicking finish with 'Rock Around the Clock'.

Flip Of The Coyne

I have been talking for a long time about the rising cost of food and now the Food Price Index, a report put out by the University of Guelph,

is warning about some drastic increases. Last year the report predicted that food costs would go up 2 percent, and they did. 2013 will see

Canadians paying even more for meat, dairy, eggs and bread.

The study is predicting that beef and pork could increase between 4.5

and 6.5 percent. Eggs could see an increase between 3.5 and 5 percent. Dairy is predicted to increase by 3 or 4 percent and the price of grain to increase between 1.4 and 2.7 percent. Most of the cost increases are due to the increasing costs of inputs. For example, the cost of increasing grain increases the cost of cattle feed, then the cost of beef goes up. Overall, the report is estimating a 3.5 percent increase at the grocery stores this year.

3.5% might not sound like a lot, but consider paying 3.5% more on all food stuffs you buy over the period of a year and it really starts adding up. Not only does it add up fast, but 3.5% is higher than inflation meaning even if you are lucky enough to get a pay increase this year, it won't be enough to cover inflation and the increased cost of groceries.

For some families, this is going to mean they may have to make some hard choices. If you are thinking it won't affect you, think again. When people have less disposable income, they spend less money. If they spend less money, local shops make less money. When they make less money they hire fewer people which means fewer jobs, maybe less prod-

uct on the shelves etc. This could have a major impact on the overall economy, not only locally but provincially and nationally.

I know some of you are thinking, "Come on Spencer, you are over-reacting. So what if eggs cost an extra 20 cents? It isn't going to mean the end of the world." Maybe it won't for you, but what about the family that has a mortgage that they are having a hard time paying. Now they have to make a choice to pay the mortgage or put food on the table.

They did nothing wrong. The banks gave these people the credit. Now add that one family to all the other families in the country that could be in the same boat. Still don't think that this is going to have a massive impact on the economy? We have been extremely lucky in Canada during the economic collapse, but housing prices are falling and the economy is slowing adding even more stresses to a system that is on the verge of buckling and we have the potential for a major economic issue.

Even the reports about the Food Index Report are warning that the continued on Page 21

The Princeton Landfill will be closed December 25th, 2012 and January 1st, 2013 for the holidays.

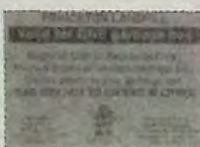

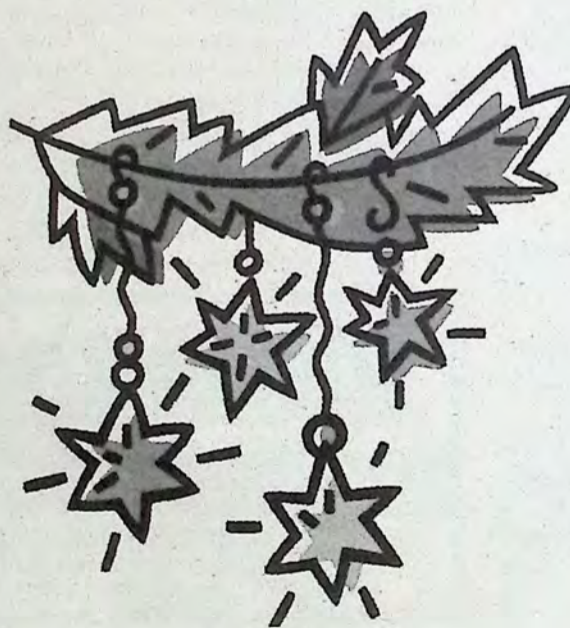

GRANTS IN AID

To support non-profit organizations and agencies that provide programs and services that serves, benefits and/or adds value to the community.

POLICY:

That Council allocates annually a finite sum of money through the Town of Princeton budget for Grants in Aid, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per individual application request. Applications for Grants in Aid are to be received no later than January 31st of each year in which the grant will be used.

Mayor and Council, as part of the annual Town of Princeton budget process, will review and assess Grant in Aid requests by April 1st of each year.

2013 DOG LICENSES

2013 Dog license fees can be paid at Town Hall at a cost of \$10.00 for spayed or neutered animals and \$30.00 for non-neutered or unspayed dogs.

Town of Princeton Bylaw No.782 regulates the licensing of dogs, and states that any dog over the age of eight weeks must wear a valid license for the current year. A fine of \$75.00 will be charged for an unlicensed dog.

Judge Trends Through Truth

somebody else for one's own misdeeds, known as finding a scapegoat. However, there are social situations in which a scapegoat is found, such as when the Nazis blamed the Jews for all sorts of unhappy social conditions. This was a form of laziness and lying, as well.

When I think about some major trends in our society, I like to apply the test of evil behaviour signals. One of these trends is based on the notion there are too many people on earth so conditions would be better if there were fewer people. There is actually a globalized group that thinks we should make efforts to depopulate the earth through various means. A lot has been written about the thinking of this rather secretive group, and conspiracy theorists point fingers at a variety of groups they feel are actually conducting experiments toward depopulation. I do not know of any real evidence to support that sort of activity, but I do know there are certain environmentalist groups who firmly believe there are too many people on earth.

They point to starvation in many areas on earth. They point to contamination of water, deforestation, over-grazing, spread of disease, and reduction in the standard of living.

Their idea deserves being put to the test. We should ask whether conditions were really that much better when there were fewer people. If we go back 150 years, when the population of earth was about half what it is today, and we look at ordinary living conditions, was it really better? Let's go back to the time of Charles Dickens, who wrote about the greed of the rich and the very poor conditions of the poor. The poor of England

had little to eat and little chance of improving their lot. I know from what my grandfather wrote about his childhood home, which he described as a hovel, although no worse than what his neighbours lived in. His father went to jail for snaring a rabbit on his lordships land, but the rabbit was needed to feed the family.

Were conditions better in North America after two-thirds of the native population died from European disease? The great cities fell to ruins, the fields went untended, the skilled workers were gone. There are places in the upper Amazon basin where an estimated 300,000 people lived and where very few live today. There are not enough people to tend the thousands of acres of productive fields that were irrigated by canals and ditches. Certainly, these native residents underwent severe depopulation, and conditions were far worse for them.

Starvation in many locales is the result of changing climate in some cases, but in most cases it is the result of unfair distribution of resources. People are moved from their land and into slums, because their land is sold to major corporations. The people who once made a living that fed their families have become displaced persons. War is another cause of starvation, even though the population is being reduced daily.

Contamination of water is not due to having too many people, it is due to laziness, whether by corporations too lazy to properly dispose of wastes, or individuals too lazy or ignorant to protect water sources. Deforestation occurs because people are too greedy or too ignorant to use forests wisely, and over-grazing is the result of people too greedy or too ignorant or too lazy to treat the land with respect.

Over-population may be the scapegoat for the lack of will, or laziness, of large groups of people who could fix the problems if they really put their minds to it, and put their resources into it. There are plenty of solutions to problems on earth, but if we are too lazy to utilize them, and just blame over-population, then the problems continue.

Now I will ask you, are there really too many people on earth, or is this a lie?

You judge: is evil afoot?

Twenty years ago I read a book titled *People of the Lie*, written by Dr. M. Scott Peck. He had been employed by the American government to determine the cause of truly evil behaviour. He concluded there were three signal behaviours that lead to evil. The first is laziness, the second is lying, and the third is offering up a scapegoat.

All of us know about laziness: it is the failure to take required action. A person relaxing on a beach is not truly lazy unless that person is supposed to be doing something somewhere else. True laziness occurs when a person fails to meet his or her obligations. In broader terms, it may consist of a callous disregard for the basic human obligation of caring for one another.

All of us know what lying is, and we believe it is the deliberate telling of something that is not true. Yes, that is lying, but lying takes other forms. If you do not tell the whole truth, that is a form of lying, too. Lying can also take the form of hypocrisy, the perpetuation of what most people believe is true, but which we ourselves do not believe to be true.

The third signal of evil is blaming

Bonny Roberts enjoys watercolour, acrylic, oil, ink and collage the most. She has been a member of the Federation of Canadian Artists for many years, has sold artwork worldwide and believes every canvas should create excitement for the viewer.

Myra Hammond has been painting for about 25 years and employs acrylics to capture the amazing Similkameen landscape. She also

Council awards analysis contract

The contract for structural analysis of the Princeton Courthouse building was awarded at the December 3rd regular meeting of Town Council.

In a motion made by Councillor Jason Earle, and seconded by Councillor Doug Pateman, David Nairne and Associates of North Vancouver will conduct a Structural Assessment of the building at 151 Vermilion Avenue valued at \$7,728.00.

A total of seven responses were received following a Request for Proposals with David Nairne & Associates being the lowest one received.

The second lowest amounted was \$9,366.00 and the highest came in at \$49,600.00.

An assessment of the mechanical, electrical and environmental systems was completed earlier this year. The second step is the structural assessment.

"If the results are favourable, the next step will be an architectural engagement to determine the suitability of the building for the purpose of a Town Hall," Interim CAO

Helen Koning stated in her report to Council.

The structural analysis will start "as quickly as we can sign a contract with them," Koning added.

Expect to hear more about this project well into 2013 as Princeton Town Council continues with a step-by-step plan for the future of the building.

Tips for Teaching Your Children About 9-1-1

BC Ambulance Service recommends that you speak with your children, in a calm, reassuring manner, about different kinds of emergency situations. Through some simple questions and role playing, you will build confidence in your children that they will be able to handle an emergency, if one should arise.

In this factsheet, there are tips to help you teach your children about emergencies and ways to practice calling 9-1-1. We've also included the kinds of questions an emergency medical dispatcher will ask.

It's a good idea to revisit this topic with your children every year. You can add depth and detail as they grow and mature.

What is 9-1-1?
 - 9-1-1 is a number to call for help

when someone is in danger or not safe.

- Always use 'nine-one-one' - never refer to the number as 'nine-eleven'

- In the uncertainty of an emergency, a child may look at a phone keypad for the number 11

- 9-1-1 is a safe number to call; children can trust the person who answers their 9-1-1 call.

- If you live in an area that does not have 9-1-1 service, be sure to help your children learn your local emergency number. Make sure it is clearly visible near your home phone.

- It's a good idea to point out ambulance, fire and police personnel to your children when you see them in your community.

- Example: 'There's an ambulance; paramedics work in that ambulance.'

If you call 9-1-1 because someone is very sick or hurt, they will come to help you.'

When should you call 9-1-1?

- You should call only when you need help from ambulance, fire fighters or police.

- Never call 9-1-1 as a joke or a game - making frivolous calls to 9-1-1 is a crime.

- If you are calling from home, it's better to call from a landline phone rather than a cell phone.

- Tell your children that they must be in a safe place before they call 9-1-1.

- If there is a fire in your home, go outside and call 9-1-1 or go to a neighbour's house.

What is an emergency?

- It's a good idea to help your children understand what an emergency is.

- Questions are a good way to convey this information.

- What would you do if a fire started in our home?

- What would you do if someone faints?

- Role playing is a great way to be sure your children understand the concept of an emergency.

What happens when you call 9-1-1?

- When you call 9-1-1, a dispatcher will ask you if you need police, fire or ambulance.

- The emergency medical dispatcher for ambulance will ask you what the emergency is and where you are.

- Be sure to tell the emergency medical dispatcher the address of your home (or where you are), your apartment number (if appropriate) and your phone number.

- While you are talking to the emergency medical dispatcher, another dispatcher is sending an ambulance and paramedics to your location to help with the emergency.

- It's important that children listen to the emergency medical dispatcher and follow his or her directions.

- The emergency medical dispatcher will continue to talk with you until the paramedics arrive.

- Do not hang up the phone until paramedics arrive.

Practice, Practice, Practice

- Role play with your children to build their confidence.

- Ask them when they should call 9-1-1.

- Ask them to point out emergency workers in your community.

Tips for Emergencies

- Keep a first aid kit at home and in your car.

- Keep a list of emergency phone numbers by your home phone.

- If you live in an area where you need to dial a number other than 9-1-1, be sure that number is clearly visible by your home phone.

- Make sure the address numbers on your home are well lit and visible from the street when it is dark.

Living Past 100

Take The Other Cold Medicines

Some people never seem to catch a cold.

Others seem to be fighting a cold all winter. The difference could well be the food they eat, or don't eat. Some foods protect against colds. Foods rich in Vitamin A and Vitamin C offer protection against the common cold.

Vitamin A is a fat-soluble vitamin that maintains the health of the outer surfaces of the body, such as the skin and mucous membranes that line the nose, mouth, eyes and genitals. The skin and mucous membranes are the most likely contact points for virus infections. If a virus can be stopped by the outer surfaces, the rest of the body remains healthy.

Vitamin A is also related to maintaining good bones, good tooth enamel, and good night vision. One of the indicators of a need for Vitamin A is a loss of night vision. Lack of Vitamin A shows up first in the eyes, which become dry and begin to disintegrate. There is an old saying that carrots are good for the eyes. This is true, as carrots (cooked) are an excellent source of Vitamin A. So are yams, winter squash, kale, sweet potatoes, sweet red peppers, romaine lettuce, spinach, broccoli, cantaloupes, prunes, butter and cheese.

Vitamin C is a natural anti-oxidant and fights virus infections. Vitamin C can be found in all raw fruits, but particularly in citrus fruits. There is even more Vitamin C in sweet peppers. The quickest way to increase Vitamin C is to take a supplement, especially in winter.

The third cold fighter is the blueberry. In Sweden, doctors recommend 'blueberry soup' when patients feel a cold or flu coming on. Pharmacists sell blueberry soup in Sweden. While you will not find blueberry soup in your local pharmacy, you can make it at home quickly and easily. Buy a bag of frozen blueberries, run a measuring cup full of berries through a blender until mashed, and drink the blueberry 'soup'. There is something in the blueberry that knocks cold germs over the head and speeds up healing time. Swedes expect two cups of blueberry soup to cure a cold in 24 hours.

So, eat more Vitamin A foods, get more Vitamin C, and if you feel a cold coming on, drink blueberry soup.

Aim for a winter free of colds.

Then as the game was winding down to the final few minutes and it appeared to be pretty much a done deal for all concerned, Princeton's Cole Weber popped a pass in the neutral zone to Kurtis Klinger who was racing along the boards past the player's boxes.

Klinger was deking his way to the net with Storm goalie Marcus Beesley in position and carefully watching the play.

Klinger crossed from Beesley's stick side and swooped across the front of the net and Beesley responded with a kick of his left leg which gave Klinger an opening to which he backhanded the puck up high and it flew into the top corner

for the goal.

Final score: Princeton 5, Kamloops 2. Shots on goal: Princeton 40, Kamloops 23. Penalties in minutes: Princeton 14 for 44-minutes, Kamloops 10 for 28-minutes.

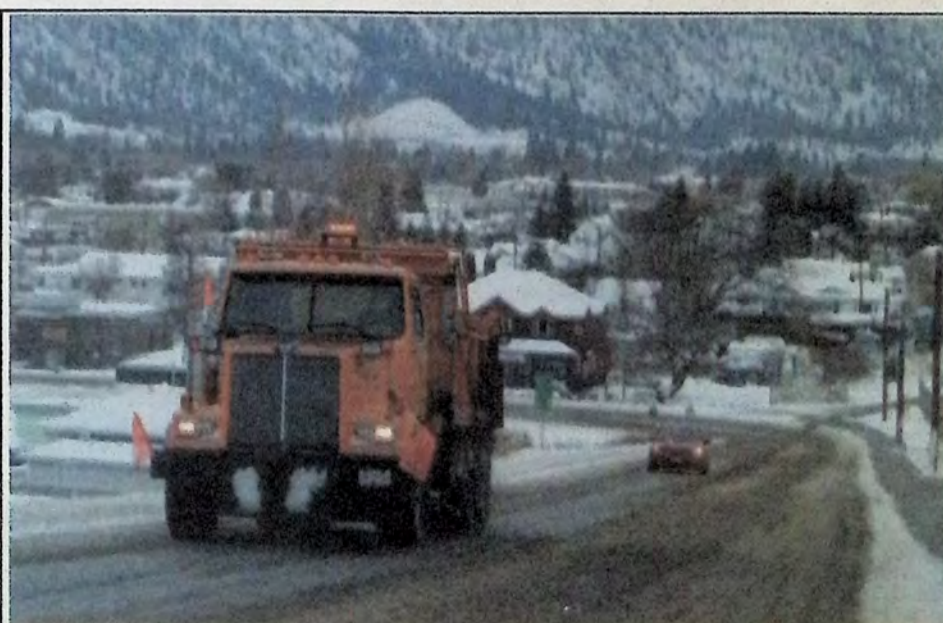

Eagles tame Posse

Princeton Posse hosted Sicamous Eagles December 8th in a battle of epic proportion.

The game was all you would expect from two division leading teams with everything flying from fists, helmets and pucks to Plexiglas and teddy bears.

The game was the annual 'Teddy Bear' event co-sponsored by Princeton Dairy Queen and Similkameen News Leader and although there wasn't a large crowd, the ratio of teddy bears to spectators was high.

With only 53-seconds off the clock in the first period, Princeton's Justin Moltzahn fired a shot on Eagle goalie Kris Joyce that bounced out to a flying Lane Erickson who popped the rebound under the goalie for the score. Josh Mack received an assist on the play and the fur started to fly.

Although Sicamous was leading 4-1 after two periods of play, Princeton was getting off more shots having out-shot the Eagles 22-19 to that point.

The final frame saw a lot of missed opportunities on both sides of the rink with just as many incredible saves by the two netminders.

Sicamous sealed the deal with a final goal at 11:09 (Jason Harder from Corbin Marcotte and Brayden Taekema).

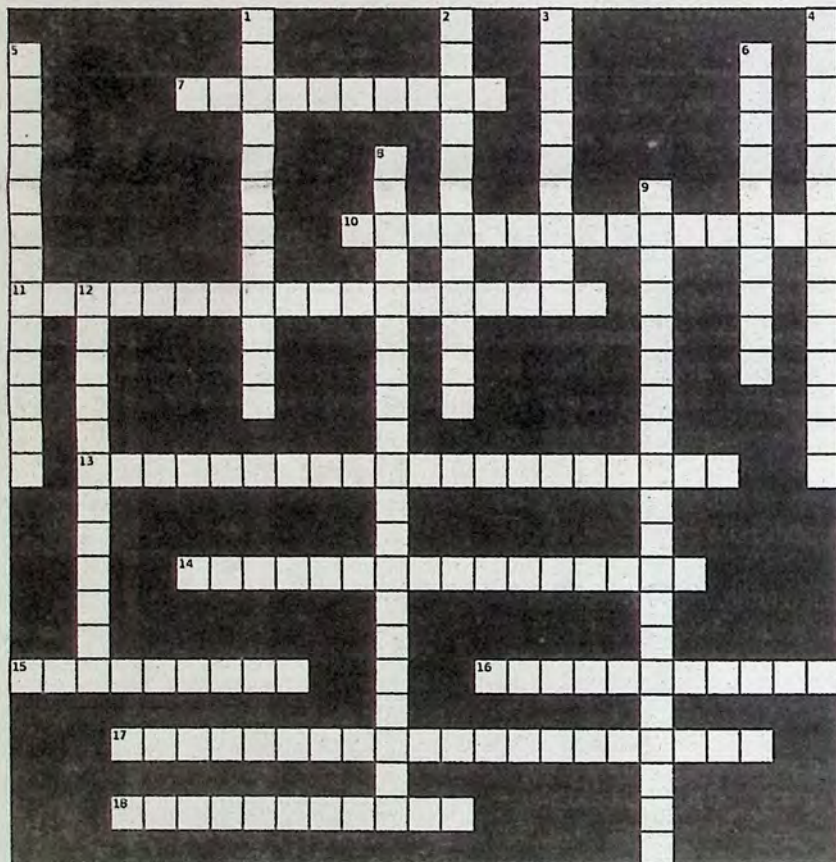

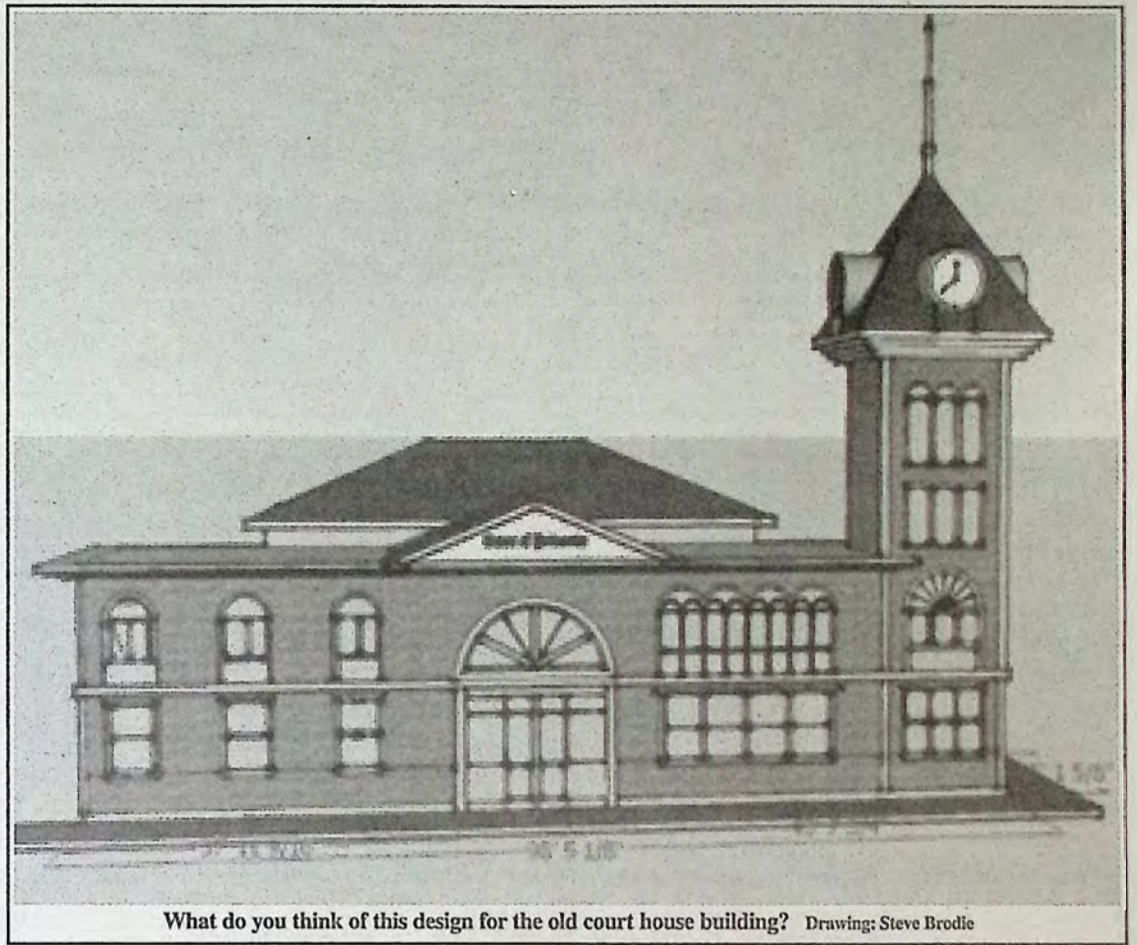

Local shares design ideas

Princeton's Steve Brodie has ideas. His design concept for the zigzag project, which was not chosen by the Town of Princeton, caught our attention from first glance. Now Brodie has come up with a plan to enhance the old courthouse building on Vermilion Avenue with a large 'front building' with a pleasing visual style that again has won

us over. "The old court house has been renovated so many times that it's intrinsic value as a historical monument has long gone," Brodie says about his unique twist on the project. "For example the exterior siding is seven-inch beveled siding circa 1966." Brodie adds, "The roof structure is a simple hip roof typical of the same era. There are obvious internal vapour barrier leaks which have undoubtedly compromised the interior walls (probably black mold) and degraded the structural integrity as well as the insulation." Brodie says the peeling paint on the exterior walls is caused by internal moisture problems. He says the rear staircase is too narrow and "an inadequate means of egress for Fire safety from the basement which make it a death trap." Brodie also suggests, "The lath and plaster used in early days is impregnated with asbestos and a considerable amount of the old paint would be lead based."

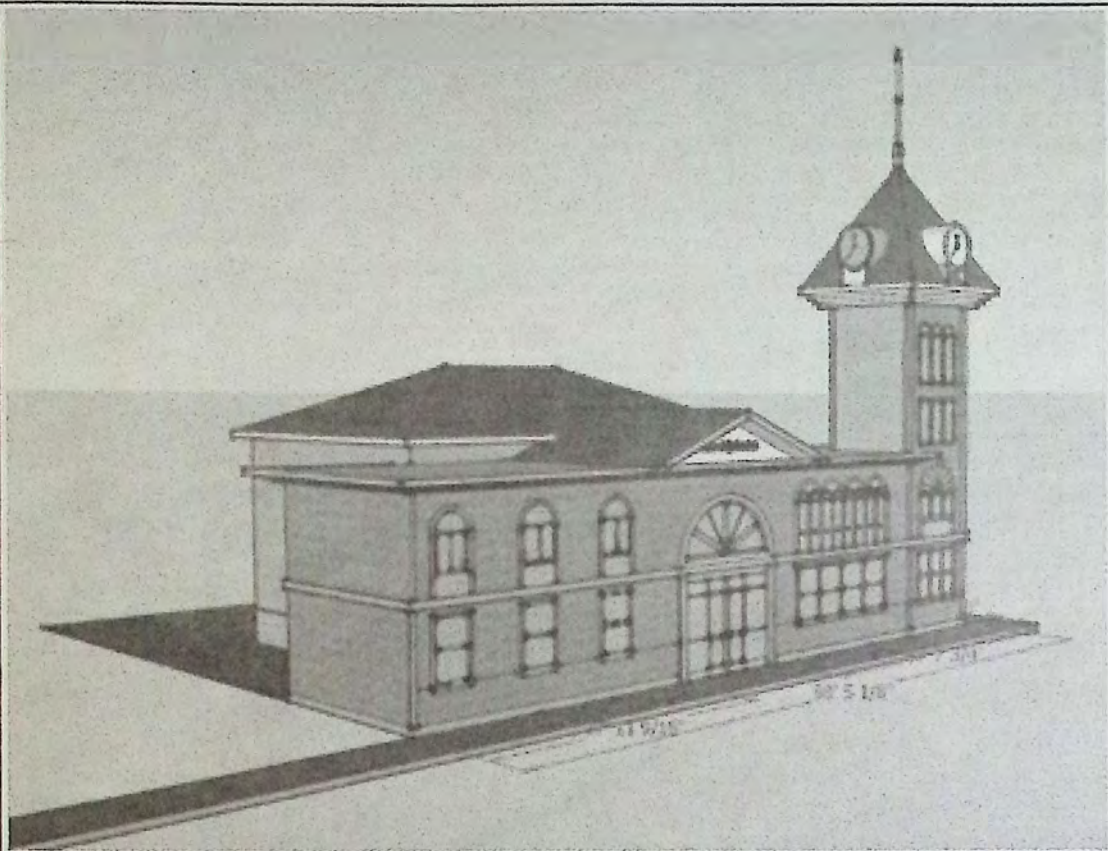
He does agree that using the site for a new Town Hall is appropriate. "My plan as drawn is wide enough but if the old structure was removed then additional width would be better. There would still be available parking space behind if the old structure was scrapped, and additional parking is available close by at the fire hall." We know that the Town of Princeton has only just awarded the contract for a structural assessment of the building on Vermilion Avenue, so it's too early to say whether or not it will be deemed safe enough for use as a municipal office building. However, it's not too early to share Brodie's design drawings to get you thinking about what that building could become. If you like the look of Brodie's design, don't tell us, tell your Town Council. They need to hear your thoughts. As for us here at the Similkameen News Leader, Brodie gets our vote because he's local.

MP speaks out

BC Southern Interior MP Alex Atamanenko is denouncing Conservatives that voted to defeat Bill C-398 meant to amend the patent act and save millions of lives in the developing world.

"This bill, introduced by NDP MP Hélène Laverdière, was supported by over 80 international NGOs, faith leaders, more than 250 Canadian civil society organizations and by 80% of Canadians," stated the BC MP.

"The Conservative government should be deeply ashamed for killing the hopes of so many."

Atamanenko says this defeat is a devastating blow to those that have driven the campaign over the last year, especially the Grandmothers Advocacy Network and the Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network.

"A previous version of this bill had passed through several stages in the House and was before the Senate when a federal election was called

and the bill died," noted Atamanenko.

"Yesterday's (November 28) defeat is even more poignant after having come so close in the past."

Bill C-398 would have had an enormous impact by simply removing the red tape surrounding Canada's 2004 Access to Medicines Regime, which permits generic companies to produce patent-protected drugs to send to developing countries, where their needs are still so great.

As Hélène Laverdière said, "It is the people in these countries that lost in yesterday's vote due to the Conservatives' stubborn refusal to accept this bill."

"That Canadians very much wanted to help save the lives of millions of people with the passage of C-398 was not a factor to Conservatives who contributed to the defeat of this bill," concluded Atamanenko.

"I would not want this on my conscience."

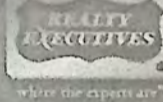
