The 96 year old Crane conducted the band in O Canada, then stayed to hear a tribute to him by Bob Cormack, who was

According to his daughter, Joyce, Crane was thrilled with the experience, and talked about little else during the following week. He had a copy of Cormack's tribute speech, and read it several times. Harold Crane passed away a week after the band concert in Princeton, a week in which he was very happy.

## Princeton receives one of 27 Grants

Seniors in Princeton and throughout the province will benefit as 27 communities receive grants of up to \$20,000 to help create programs or tools that address the needs of their older residents.

"This year's grant recipients have recognized the importance of ensuring that communities and businesses meet the needs of residents of all ages," said Minister of State for Seniors Ralph Sultan.

"Successful projects focus on a wide range of supports to make life easier for older residents. Many of these programs are supporting seniors to remain socially active

and connected to their communities and are helping to reduce isolation, which is one of the top issues that I hear from seniors across B.C. when I meet with them."

The age-friendly planning and project grant program is a partnership between the government of B.C. and the Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM). Grants of up to \$20,000 are provided through UBCM to help establish, or continue, a variety of projects that support healthy, active seniors.

"As B.C.'s population continues to age, it is important that we look to ways to support the health of

seniors and ensure that our communities are age-friendly and accessible," said Cariboo-Chilcotin MLA Donna Barnett.

"It is great news for seniors here in the Cariboo, and across B.C., that local governments are engaging in projects and programs that support our oldest residents."

Applications for age-friendly planning and projects grants were reviewed by staff from UBCM and the Ministry of Health. They were scored on a variety of factors, including: goals, proposed activities, involvement of seniors and other key partners, budget, and innovation and sustainability.

"As local governments come to grips with aging populations, there is a need to rethink the range of services we provide and how they are delivered. This program is helping communities around the province to improve policies and services for seniors," said Mary Sjostrom, president of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities.

Since 2007, 117 B.C. communities have received funding to support age-friendly planning and projects. Examples include age-friendly assessments, ensuring services are

more accessible, supporting transportation and social connection to help prevent social isolation, and improving the community by increasing garden and green space.

In September 2012, government announced \$500,000 was available for the 2013 round of grants. Fourteen of the 27 successful applicants for 2013 have not received previous funding through the program.

"We are very pleased that this funding will enable us to work in partnership with the South Cariboo Community Planning Council to conduct an age-friendly assessment and will help us build on our ongoing work in creating livable communities for seniors with disabilities," said Mitch Campsall, mayor of the District of 100 Mile House.

The age-friendly grant program is only one aspect of Age-friendly BC, which focuses on providing communities with support, information and recognition to help meet the needs of an aging population. Local governments can achieve age-friendly recognition and officially become an Age-friendly BC community once they have completed four basic steps

that focus on community engagement, commitment, assessment and action.

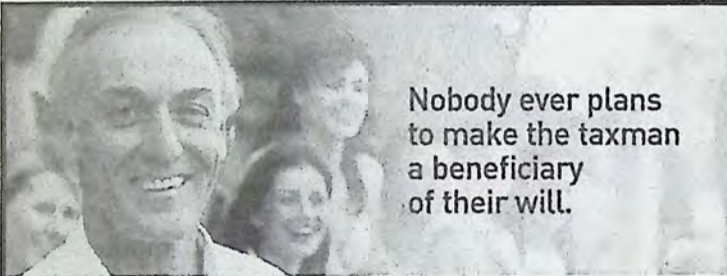

## Weyerhaeuser Timberlands celebrate milestone

On December 21, 2012, a very significant safety milestone was achieved in the forests around Princeton.

The entire Weyerhaeuser Princeton Timberlands organization – contractors and employees – celebrated going two years of working without a recordable injury.

"This is quite an achievement," says Rob Marshall, manager of Weyerhaeuser's Timberlands organization in Princeton.

"Weyerhaeuser has a vision of hav-

ing an injury-free workplace so everyone can go home safe and sound every day. Forestry work has many hazards, but they have shown it can be done safely. These are world-class results and very few forestry organizations can make this claim."

This safety accomplishment includes an average of 120 people working in the woods operation every day. They are involved in all aspects of forestry work: planning, timber cruising, road construction, road maintenance, harvesting, hauling, planting, scaling and surveying.

"I give a lot of credit to the Weyerhaeuser staff, the contractors and their employees for all working hard on all the little things that make up a safe working environment," said Marshall.

"Everyone should feel proud they work in an operation with this kind of safety record."

Marshall noted that on December 21, 2011, they had celebrated one year of working without an injury. "That was new territory for us," he commented.

"We had never gone a full year without someone getting hurt on the job. Now, we are two years without a recordable injury." (In general, a recordable injury is a work-related injury that requires medical atten-

tion from a health professional.)

Fred Dzida, Director of Canadian Timberlands for Weyerhaeuser, added his congratulations.

"Recognizing the challenging conditions we have all faced during the past few years, this is a huge accomplishment," says Dzida.

The Weyerhaeuser Timberlands organization is responsible for forestry operations on 424,000 hectares of forest in the Princeton and Okanagan Falls areas that support the Weyerhaeuser sawmill in Princeton.

## Building permits up in 2012

Building permits issued through the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen in 2012 suggest development in the regional district is slowly continuing to pick up following the economic downturn of 2009.

"Although it's not quite a return to 2008 when the Regional District enjoyed more than \$46 million in new development and additions, 2012 still brought considerable growth to the region," said Donna Butler, RDOS Development Services Manager.

Over the 12-month period, the

Regional District issued 439 building permits with a total value of almost \$39 million. That is up from \$37.9 million in 2011 when 410 permits were issued.

As in previous years, the majority of new residential building permits are for the RDOS's South Okanagan region, specifically that area south of Penticton, including Okanagan Falls/Kaleden, rural Oliver and rural Osoyoos.

Of the 88 new residential units granted building permits in 2012, 63 were in Electoral Areas A, C

and D. Building permits were granted for another 18 units in Electoral Area H, rural Princeton including Tulameen, Osprey Lake and Eastgate areas. All of these residential building permits were for single family units and totalled \$23,929,673.

Almost all of new non-residential development (commercial, industrial and institutional) was in Electoral Areas C and D (Kaleden-Okanagan Falls-Oliver) where 27 of 33 permits were issued. New non-residential development totalled \$5,519,745.

"The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen is still considered a premier location for both residential and commercial development," said RDOS Regional Board Chair Dan Ashton.

"Our amazing climate, beautiful scenery and friendly, hard-working folk make the Okanagan-Similkameen a great place to build a life."

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen provides a monthly summary of building permit activity as part of its commitment to its clients and improving the stakeholder experience. Monthly reports are available online at [www.rdos.bc.ca](http://www.rdos.bc.ca) under Building Permits Statistics.

## Is Media Violence A Key To Mass Killings?

There are peculiar links between drama and the killings in Aurora, Colorado and at Sandy Hook Elementary School.

In the first instance, at Aurora, a young man entered a movie theatre and shot several people who had attended a Batman movie. In the original Batman story, a mad killer enters a movie theatre in a place called Aurora and cuts loose with a gun and kills a number of people.

In the second instance, in a movie called Hunger Games, children are sacrificed annually. The children live in a place called Sandy Hook.

Isn't this just too much coincidence?

There are some conspiracy theories out on the net about this, but conspiracy theories aside, let's think about the impact of film media on young minds. Some people, like me, can watch a movie or television show and remain separate from what is going on. I see the film as an object I am viewing, and I remain emotionally separate from the action. Other people, particularly younger people, can enter into the movie emotionally, becoming part of it. In some cases, they become so much a part of the movie they 'experience' it not as a

movie, but as if it were a true, real time personal experience.

Imagine what happens when the emotionally involved viewer has an immature mind and perhaps a mental imbalance that may not even be a concern to others because there is no outward indication until something terrible happens. Imagine the impact of years of violent films and violent computer games on such a mind. That mind has been personally involved in a long series of violent experiences from his or her early years, in a violent reality that exists not in the real world but in the mind. Remember, each of us sees the world based on individual perception of the world, and if that individual perception is created by an artificial source such as a movie, the perception is nevertheless the truth to the person who perceives it.

We see this phenomenon all the time in children under age 10. They go to a movie and then begin to play the parts of movie characters in elaborate games made up to mimic the movie. What happens if the child's mind fails to develop past that stage? Exposed to television and computer games expressing continual violent episodes, how does the child mind process what it perceives? That is a question we need to ask and to study.

Although the two examples I used to begin this article took place in the United States, China has had a series of mass killings of children during the past year, with no explanation of why it is occurring. India has had rape problems on a scale horrifying to the public. If we had all of the news of the world instead of just the most interesting stuff from North America, we would probably discover such incidents are occurring all over the industrialized world, and I have to wonder

whether our ongoing diet of violent movies and television and computer games plays a part in what is happening.

As I look back in my memory of what we see on television, other than the news, I can see a trend toward increasing violence. During the 1960s and 1970s, most television violence was underplayed compared with today, and there were far fewer violent shows. Those that were popular came on after most children were sound asleep. The majority of popular after dinner television shows were about family life, many were comedies, and there were a lot of musical variety shows. Even the soaps had less violence than they do today. Violent movies were out of bounds for children. There were no computer games then.

Even the early computer games did not involve violence.

When we adults allow violence to enter the living room and computer fare, aren't we telling our children this sort of thing is acceptable?

If the kind of thing that happens in some television shows actually happens in real life, we call it domestic violence and children receive specialized counseling for victims of domestic violence. However, the child who has witnessed a violent action on television or in a movie is also a witness to violence and receives no counseling. What is the impact on that child if such things are witnessed daily and nobody seems to care?

We tend to pooh-poo people who suggest television is too violent, but are we going to have to witness more and more mass killings in schools and theatres before we start investigating the links between what children witness when they are children and what they do when they are older?

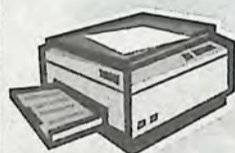

**Electoral Area 'G' Report**

2012: Best things and most contentious issues

The 5 best things that happened:  
1. The SVPS (Similkameen Valley Planning Society) received a \$500,000 grant from UBCM to undertake a watershed study of the Similkameen River.

A NUMBER ONE PRIORITY identified by area residents is protecting our Similkameen River; we need effective strategies to share this vital resource between industry, agriculture and residents; especially since the International Joint Commission will be renegotiating the Columbia River Treaty in 2014, and the British Columbia Government is in the process of the Modernization of the Water Act, which has not changed for over 100 years.

2. TOTA (Thompson Okanagan Tourism Association) recognized the Similkameen Valley as perfectly positioned to benefit from "Regional Tourism Planning".

This concept, promoted by the Canadian Tourism Foundation, encourages collaboration between businesses and communities, acknowledging that tourists come to "an area" rather than to a specific business or activity. The grant dollars awarded by this Federal agency are being matched by in-kind donations through TOTA who are using the Similkameen as a pilot project, to teach other communities in British Columbia how

to strengthen their tourism economies.

3. From May to October of 2012, many individuals contributed hundreds of hours to Hedley's "Hugelbeet".

This project was created in order to lessen the impact of dumping greens waste in the bush, to compost and build soil and to improve the animal habitat along the old tailings piles around Hedley. In early October an unattended campfire lit the grass field and Hugelbeet on fire. This fire proved the necessity of water and infrastructure for such a project to be viable, which was, ironically, one of the purposes for starting the project...to show the need for a stronger water supply near Hedley's old "ballpark" site.

4. Early in September 2012 about 80 residents concerned about the water supply in Olalla met with the RDOS in a "Town Hall" meeting.

After the meeting, a number of locals exchanged contact information and created a citizen's group called "Friends of Olalla". This group of individuals is working to improve their surroundings in Olalla collectively and with care. In addition, a number of other individuals agreed to sit on an Advisory Board for the Olalla Water System.

5. Similkameen Trails Society and Vermillion Forks Trails Society began to meet and develop some strategies for a shared vision of

recreational and historic trails throughout the Similkameen Valley.

These groups have realized that working together on a regional plan they will create a more comprehensive network than they can working alone. They have met with RDOS staff and begun to establish a plan to connect the Princeton area to the rest of the Similkameen and Okanagan.

The 5 most contentious things that happened:

1. Princeton General Hospital Emergency Room was cut back from a 24-hour service.

This, in a town dominated by heavy industry, and on a dangerous highway corridor, is unacceptable to most residents. Recent visits from the Health Minister and IHA indicate that the tides are turning in Princeton's favour. This is due in large part to the dedicated efforts of many Princeton and area residents and industry working together to find solutions.

2. The RDOS (Regional District Okanagan-Similkameen) operates transfer stations in Keremeos, Apex, and OK Falls, and a landfill at Campbell Mountain near Naramata.

In order to prolong the life of the Campbell mountain landfill, which delays the capital costs of finding and building a new site, staff at the RDOS are examining strategies to further reduce waste and encourage recycling. Tipping fee structures ..... continued on Page 7

..... continued from Page 6 are being compared to Summerland and Osoyoos with the aim of creating a more "level" playing field, which means there will be rate increases at the gate of Campbell Mountain Landfill so that it is no longer the cheapest (and therefore most frequently used) disposal site for commercial contractors.

3. A Boil Water Notice was issued in the summer of 2012 to residents of Olalla in order to safeguard human health.

This action was required by Interior Health and was due to the presence of "total coliforms" in a weekly water reading. The Olalla Well was treated with chlorine in order to further reduce hazards to human health and by Thanksgiving the Boil Water Advisory was lifted. A follow up "Town Hall Meeting" held in Keremeos November 3rd at the Elks Hall and a number of residents asked what they could do as individuals to safeguard the health of the well. A number of workshops are planned for the upcoming months for residents interested in the topic of protecting our water.

4. The National Park in the Similkameen was brought up at the

Regional District Board, after the Federal Government announced that it was dropping its initiative in the beginning of 2012.

The Regional District Board does not have any jurisdiction over a National Park. Residents are strongly divided on the issue, but most agree that the initial process the Federal government undertook was flawed. Most residents want the area to "stay the same" (protect it) but don't want anything to change (regulations).

5. An application for subdivision was made by a developer at Twin Lakes to the RDOS Board.

Local residents were frustrated that the Board would consider such an application because they believe that the aquifer has already been over-allocated. Regardless of the subdivision circumstance, the RDOS Board is MANDATED to consider applications for subdivision. The purpose of such a mandate is to allow for a fair assessment on a case-by-case basis. The RDOS Board has deferred the decision until measurements have been taken over a period of time in order to establish the actual, not projected, levels of the aquifer. The RDOS

Board is unable to place a moratorium on development as requested by residents, as it does not have the authority to do so.

The 5 best individuals and groups:

1. Walter Despot of Keremeos was bestowed the Queen's Jubilee awards for outstanding service to his fellow citizens.

who live in the BC Southern Interior region will be announced this February by Alex Atamanenko's office. We residents of the Similkameen Valley are lucky to live in the company of such giving individuals.

2. The Community Club in Hedley brought a street dance to the centre of town at the end of August and people are still raving about it.

The live music was performed by the group the Rocking Recliners, who were on their way to perform at a music festival in the Interior the next day. Thank you to the leadership of the Community Club for bringing this great act to town!

3. Ron Shonk of Olalla was awarded a Ministry of Justice Community Safety and Crime Prevention Award ..... continued on Page 21

# Northern hemisphere is colder

If your common sense told you our weather has been cooler the past few

years, you would be right. A phenomenon known as the Decadal Oscillation makes the North Pacific

Ocean much colder. This is the opposite of an El Nino, and lasts much longer. The previous recorded Decadal Oscillation began in 1941 and lasted to 1971.

Weather monitoring in Alaska reported last week that during the past 10 years, Alaska's average temperature had declined 2.4 degrees Fahrenheit, but in some areas, the average temperature had dropped 4.5 degrees Fahrenheit.

In the United States, AccuWeather keeps track of how many states are covered in snow on New Year's Day. This year broke a record established just three years ago, in 2010. Some places received a 10 cm. dump of snow where there had been no snow for Christmas in living memory.

Eastern Europe has been hit with extreme cold. People died of cold in Russia, Poland, Latvia, Ukraine, and the Czech Republic. Northern China suffered extreme cold.

In the state of Uttar Pradesh, India, 114 homeless people died as temperatures dropped to 4.8 degrees Celsius overnight. Cold sweeping down from the Himalayan mountains forced a temperature drop, but the weather had been cooler than normal for several days. In New Delhi, street people dressed in what we would call 'summer' clothing huddled around small fires built in metal cans.

Scientists are not jumping to any conclusions about global weather, but are clearly saying the north Pacific Ocean is bringing cooler temperatures, and they are unable to say how long this phenomenon will last.

## Living Past 100

### The Effects of Childhood

Increasing numbers of people are celebrating their 100th birthdays. If we look back to when they were born, we are looking back to the early years of the 1900s. They lived in a world in which there were no antibiotics and a lot less was known about nutrition and anatomy than today. What single thing gave these people bodies that would keep them going for 100 years?

First, let's not discount the importance of modern medicine in their later years as a feature of why they may have lived so long. Yes, modern medicine has undoubtedly helped them live longer, but what gave them the advantage in youth?

We cannot say it was the food they ate, although there were not the chemical toxins in their food that we have in ours today. In fact, people back then ate an awful lot of saturated fats, eating butter, cooking in lard, eating a lot of fat meats. Many ate a diet containing few vegetables and fruits for an entire winter, yet they remained healthy enough to live past 100 years.

There is one key difference between how they lived then and how we live now, and that difference involves the build-up of muscle tissue and the benefits of constant exercise that we now call work chores. Most Canadians lived in a rural environment in which they had no running water, so they carried it by the bucket into the house and heated it for dishwashing, laundry, cooking and bathing. They were awake early to feed animals, they walked behind horses to plow the soil, they harnessed or saddled horses for transportation, and they did nearly everything the hard way, developing and using muscle.

Children of those days walked or rode a horse to school, they carried wood or coal into the house as part of their daily chores, and older children chopped wood. Even children living in an urban environment had chores like mowing the lawn, which required muscle power, not electric or gas power. They shoveled snow in winter, created skating and curling rinks on ponds in winter and swam in ponds in summer. Children in those days were on the move constantly. They were not bored, because adults would find work for idle hands.

This key difference, all this physical activity, meant children rarely accumulated fat, they built strong muscles, and all that physical activity built strong immune systems. If we compare their childhoods with the lives of children today, we see the need to move today's children away from computers and into the outdoors to play physically demanding games, go hiking, walking, swimming, climbing, and keep their bodies moving as much as possible. Although no studies have clearly spelled out the difference in length of life between those who were physically active in childhood and those who are not active, just ordinary observation gives us food for thought.

## Posse blow off some steam

The Princeton Posse hosted Summerland Steam January 11th in another inter-division match.

The numbers tilted in the favour of the home team, which had 11 points on the visitors, but the numbers don't always tell the story.

Summerland had a shorter bench (15 players dressed to Princeton's 20) and came to the Similkameen with a 17-18-1-2 record (2-6-1-1 in their last ten games) while Princeton was sitting one point behind first place in the division with 23-11-0-2 (6-3-0-1 in their last ten games).

Regardless of the stats, the Steam came out fast and hard in the first period and did not let up throughout the entire game. The powerful hits were meant to wear the Posse down, but the home team was just a bit tougher.

The first period zipped by as if it never happened with no scoring and only two penalties. Although Princeton out shot Summerland 17-13 in the frame, both goalies had a work out.

The second period was a different story.

Princeton's Eric Kubis scored the first goal of the game on the power play at 14:19. Assists went to Brett Perrine and Jon Thompson.

Princeton's Lane Erickson scored the Posse's second goal at 7:20 with help from Kurtis Bond and Adrian Coulter.

The excitement of the period peaked at 3:26 when Summerland's Derek Grimm flipped a puck up high from the Steam end of the arena and it sailed into the webcast booth.

"I saw it coming right at us," Posse webcast play-by-play announcer George Elliott says.

"I said 'duck, everybody duck' and as I turned away I heard the puck clang off the metal bar that's basically in the centre of our booth and it reminded me of the sound of a shot hitting a goal post."

No one was injured and Elliott collected the puck from the floor of the webcast booth where it landed near his feet.

"The puck took quite a beating as a chunk was taken out of it after hitting the bar up here."

Grimm ended up earning a delay of game penalty and just as he was about to return to the game at 1:52 Princeton's Dakota Leppa scored on the power play. Jon Forrest and Colby Braaten each earned assists.

The third period saw Princeton continue to take control of the ice surface.

Lane Erickson took a pass from Eric Kubis at 9:03 and raced in on his own and flipped the puck up high and over the shoulder of Steam goalie Brett Huber. The puck hit the top of the net just past the crossbar and ricocheted into the bottom of the goal. Colby Braaten also earned an assist on the goal.

Princeton's Kaleb Boyle added a goal of his own at 3:48 which meant each of the 'Special K' line players (Kubis, Erickson and Boyle) had made it to the scoreboard in the game.

The Posse's Kurtis Bond tapped in a rebound from a shot made by Kraig Leochko for a goal at 2:52. Brett Perrine passed the puck to Leochko.

And just to round out the final moments of the game, Princeton's Devan Suidy grabbed a loose puck and raced in on his own and popped a backhand up high and into the top corner of the Summerland net for an unassisted goal at 1:45.

Final score: Princeton 7, Summerland 0. The win gave Posse goalie Jack Burgart his first KIJHL shut out. Shots on goal: Princeton 45, Summerland 29. Penalties in minutes: Summerland 8 for 35-minutes, Princeton 6 for 23-minutes.

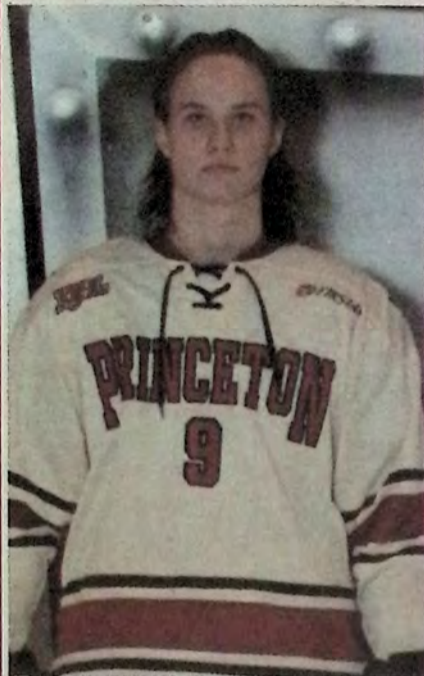

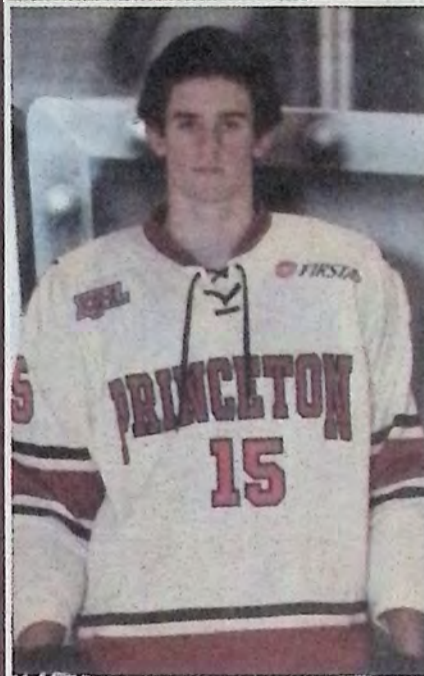

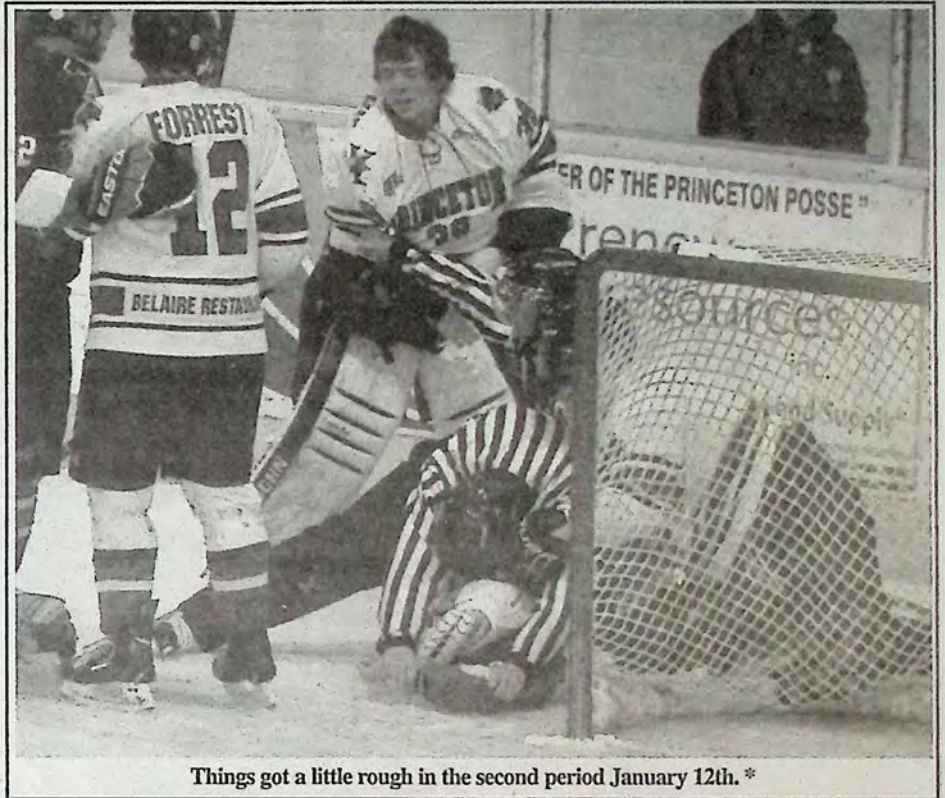

# Princeton Posse feel the heat

Hot off the heels of a 7-0 blow out against Summerland Steam January 11th, Princeton Posse hosted Chase Heat the following evening.

Once again the stats leaned in the direction of the home team with 27 more points, 15 more wins, 46 more goals scored and well, you get the picture.

In what could easily have been another lopsided victory, the visiting Chase team did put some heat into the game and put up quite a fight – in more ways than one.

Princeton got on the scoreboard first, but it took just about half a period to do so.

Kurtis Bond got the goal at 11:46 with assistance from Ben Reinbolt and Kyle Moore.

Princeton added another at 9:54 (Kaleb Boyle from Eric Kubis).

The period ended with another Princeton goal with 9.4-seconds left on the clock.

The Posse's Brett Perrine passed the puck from inside the blue line across the front of the goal crease to a waiting Ben Reinbolt. Reinbolt was positioned just outside the goal post on Heat goalie Jacob Mattes' stick side. The puck sailed past Mattes, who was far enough in the front of the crease to give Reinbolt a wide-open gap behind him to tip the puck into the net.

The second period was, well, a little more heated.

Chase scored their first goal of the

game at 11:08. McKenzie Gaudiero scored the short-handed goal with help from Mitchell Dolman.

Then at 9:32 best friends in different jerseys Kurtis Bond (Princeton) and McKenzie Gaudiero (Chase) dropped their gloves and went at it. The pair go back many years to their minor hockey playing days in Williams Lake and although Bond referred to the incident later that night on Twitter as "a tilt" both players finished the night off the ice.

A handful of seconds later, at 9:16, Princeton's Brett Perrine ducked and weaved his way into Chase territory and scored an unassisted power play goal to give the home team a 4-1 lead.

At 8:18 the Heat's Shelby Kostyshen drew Princeton's Devan Suidy into a scrap and both found themselves ejected from the game despite Kostyshen's attempts to convince the officials they didn't see the circumstances correctly.

Chase managed to capitalize on the disruptions, which appeared to actually throw the Posse game plan off kilter, and scored their second goal, another short-handed one, at 3:15 (Drew Wilde from Marc MacKenzie).

Then the wheels on the roller coaster ride fell off with 20.7-seconds left in the period.

Kaleb Carpenter of the Chase Heat

raced onto the Posse goal and somehow Princeton's goalie Phoenix Logan-Hill lost his stick in the action.

"I couldn't see exactly what happened but suddenly Phoenix's stick was flying to the corner to his right," says Posse internet play-by-play announcer George Elliott.

"Then players went in to defend their crease and protect their goalie."

Princeton's Adrian Coulter caught Carpenter behind the net and equipment plus fists started flying. Logan-Hill then jumped onto the

pile to add his assistance.

Once the players were pulled apart each received 5-minutes for fighting and game misconducts, with Logan-Hill collecting an extra five and a game for being the third man in the fight.

But it didn't end there.

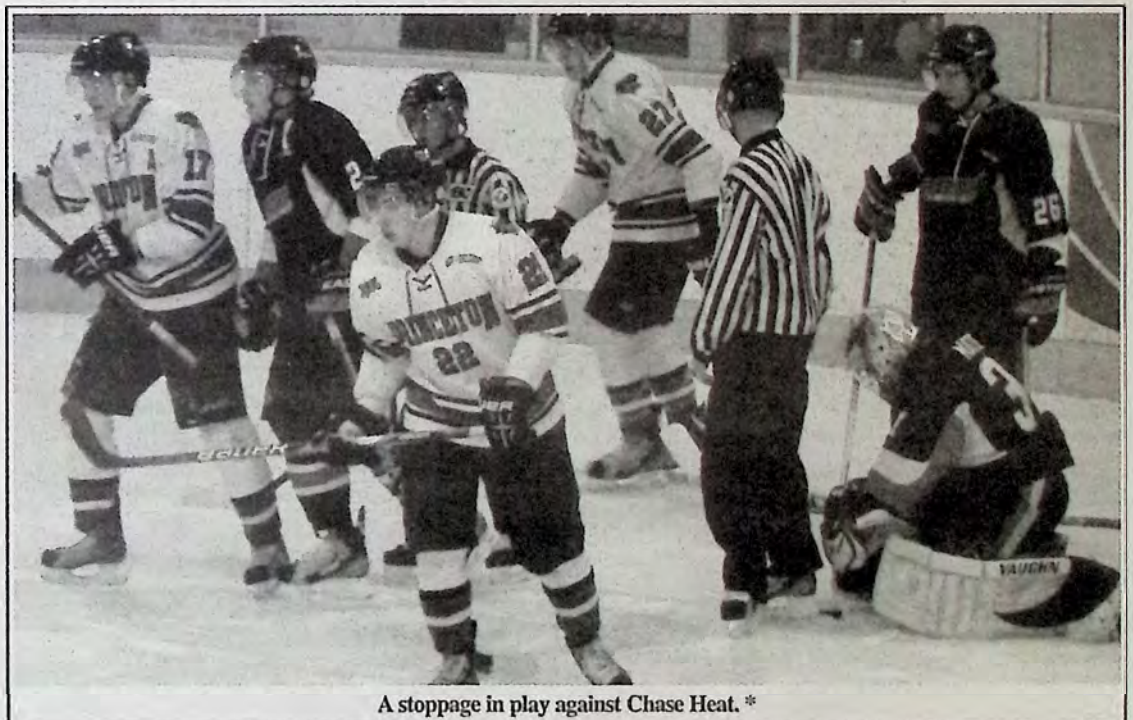
While skating away from the scene of the crime, Logan-Hill took on Chase's Robert Dawson who must have said something, as they were about to pass each other.

Once they were separated, Logan-Hill ended up with his third game misconduct. The behaviour was

completely out of character for the goalie who had only 2 PIM the previous season and prior to this game had none this season.

The last period was, in a word, boring in comparison to the first two-thirds of the game and not because there was only one penalty called. Both teams appeared tired and basically went through the motions to run the clock down to 00:00.

Final score: Princeton 4, Chase 2. Shots on goal: Princeton 33, Chase 26. Penalties in minutes: Princeton 13 for 89-minutes, Chase 11 for 55-minutes.

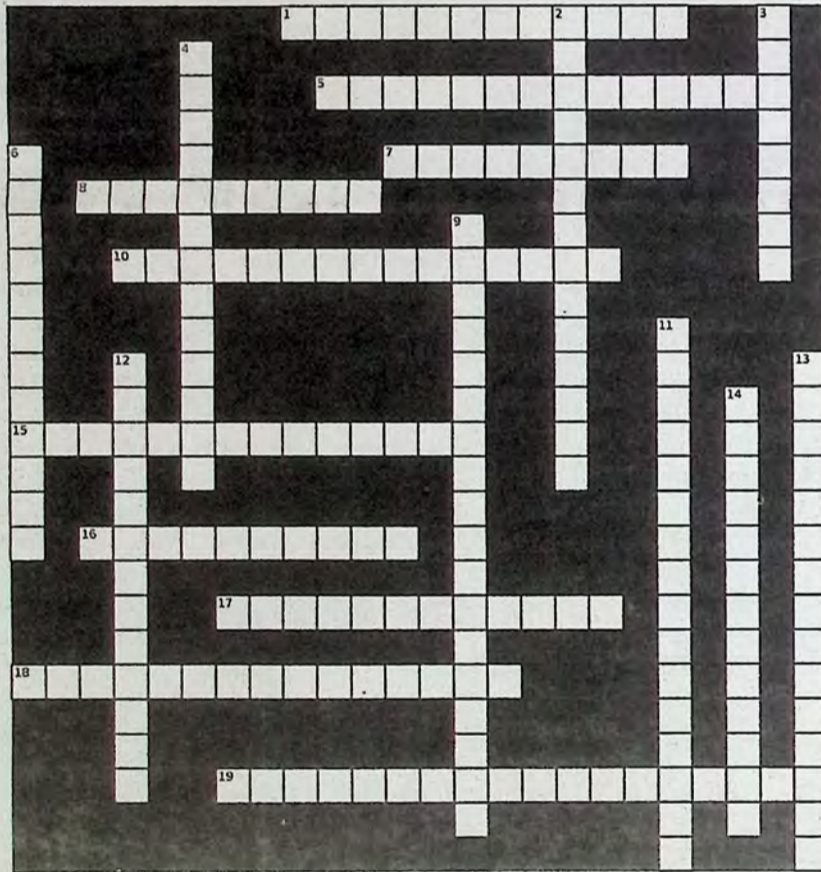
We also hope to install another piece of art in a town park for the enjoyment of all, extending our Art in Public Places program.

## Town launches bylaw review project

Last reviewed comprehensively in 1994, Princeton's Zoning Bylaw is now being updated into a user friendly Bylaw that incorporates best practices; addresses known issues; and better reflects the Town's Official Community Plan (OCP), which seeks to "[promote] healthy and active living for all ages."

Council has identified the review of the Zoning Bylaw as a priority for 2013. Funding has been included in the 2012/2013 budget to complete this review and Urban Systems Ltd. has been hired to lead this planning project. A Provincial grant from the Ministry of Health in the amount of \$20,000 will also assist the Town with incorporating age-friendly zoning land use regulations.

A leader in planning and consultation, Urban Systems has developed particular expertise in reviewing Zoning Bylaws. The consulting team has successfully led similar planning projects in communities throughout B.C. and western Canada, including developing new Zoning Bylaws for Lake Country, Merritt, Princeton, Keremeos, Oliver and Kamloops – to name a few.

The Zoning Bylaw is the primary regulatory tool for the implementation of the Town's OCP, as well as other policies, which impact the use and development of property.

Mayor Armitage is very pleased that we are moving forward with a new Zoning Bylaw and encourages the community to participate in the open house on January 28th, 2013.

*A Zoning Bylaw regulates the:*

- Use and density of development on residential, commercial, institutional and industrial lands, and in buildings
- Siting, size, and dimensions of buildings and uses

- The location of uses on land, and within buildings
- Parking and amenity space requirements

*The purpose of a Zoning Bylaw is to:*

- Implement the policies of the OCP
- Maintain order, efficiency and harmony of land uses
- Prevent overcrowding of land
- Protect the environment
- Protect property values

*The Zoning Bylaw Review Process:*

While there are numerous steps in this planning process, they can generally be summarized in 4 key phases:

## RDOS works on radio repeater

Electrical power to a commercially owned and operated communication tower that houses an emergency radio repeater used by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen and its member fire departments likely will not be restored until the late spring, the RDOS has learned.

"The message we have received from Fortis is that work to repair electrical lines on Mount Kobau may not begin for safety reasons until after the winter season," said Dale Kronebusch, the Regional District's Emergency Service Supervisor.

"Accordingly, we're taking additional steps to safeguard other power sources at the tower's site to provide continued and uninterrupted service for our emergency radio repeater. That includes contingency plans to increase our battery back-up capacity and ensure a back-up generator is available for the site generator that will now function as the primary power source for the

The Town of Princeton looks forward to your participation in the review of our community's Zoning Bylaw beginning with an evening Open House to be held at the Princeton and District Community Skills Centre (206 Vermilion Avenue) on January 28, 2013 from 7:00 to 9:00 PM (drop-in format).

The adoption of the new Zoning Bylaw should be completed before the end of summer 2013, pending Council's approval.

Kronebusch added a new alerting system is also being installed at the site that will provide direct warning to the Regional District immediately upon the primary generator's failure.

In mid-December 2012, heavy snowfall downed two power poles on Mount Kobau, where the communication tower is located. Auxiliary power, generated by fuel and batteries, operated until about four days later when reserves were exhausted. The emergency fire dispatch radio repeater, along with several other communication services, then went offline, a situation that was not reported to the Regional District until December 22.

"At no time were RDOS residents in danger of not having fire coverage," said Dale Kronebusch, the Regional District's Emergency Service Supervisor.

# RDOS budgets for radio service improvements

A fiscally responsible decision by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen last year to move emergency fire dispatch services to Kelowna from Penticton has resulted in the Regional District saving enough to cover the cost of replacing a 20-year-old emergency radio system described as "antiquated" and "in need of replacement."

The Regional District's 2013 operating budget includes \$1.6 million in funding to complete work recommended by a public safety communications consultant last November. The budget has received first reading and is currently undergoing a public consultation process. Final approval by the Regional Board is expected in March.

"What's important to note is the Regional District would be facing this upgrading cost whether we moved our emergency fire dispatch to Kelowna or not," explained RDOS Board Chair Dan Ashton.

"The Regional District is aware of the deteriorating condition of our emergency radio system and is taking prudent steps to correct the situation. That work began with our decision last year to move services to Kelowna from Penticton and

saving RDOS ratepayers almost \$1.8 million."

The effectiveness of regional emergency radio services was questioned in the aftermath of a power outage at a commercially owned transmission tower on Mount Kobau where the RDOS is a communications client. Regional fire departments were without their primary method of communication for about ten days as the site's operator worked to get the tower up and running again.

"At no time were RDOS residents in danger of not having fire coverage," said Dale Kronebusch, the Regional District's Emergency Service Supervisor.

"We build redundancies into the system to deal with such potentialities and in this case the dispatch centre in Kelowna was able to contact fire departments using telephone."

Funding included in the 2013 operating budget will provide for upgrading of communication equipment at fire departments serving the Regional District and an overhaul of the wireless system connecting the dispatch center to the member fire departments.

"Our intent is to learn from each situation and to make corrections where appropriate," said Kronebusch, explaining the additional steps the Regional District is taking to secure the communication tower.

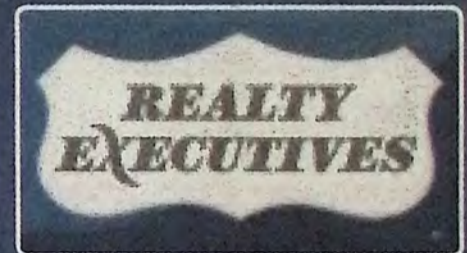
