## Similkameen Valley's pilot project reaches milestone

April 24, 2013, marked a major milestone for tourism in the Similkameen Valley. Over 40 stakeholders gathered in Princeton to celebrate the launch of the new destination brand and consumer website located at <http://similkameenvalley.com>. The branding project is a pilot project done in partnership between the Similkameen Valley Planning Society (SVPS) and the Thompson Okanagan Tourism Association (TOTA) demonstrating best practice in marketing communications. The Similkameen Valley is the first in the region to utilize the framework of the Thompson Okanagan

Regional Strategy, a first of its kind in B.C.

TOTA's community development specialist Simone Carlisle-Smith led a collaborative effort working with SVPS' Tourism Advisory Council (TAC) led by chair Joan McMurray. McMurray comments, "We value the expertise of the project team who understand who we are as visitor destination. This partnership allowed us to deliver a strong foundation for the Similkameen Valley to build our marketing message."

## Huldra Silver releases progress report

Huldra Silver Inc. ("Huldra" or the "Company") provided an update of the current underground drilling program and mining progress at the Treasure Mountain Mine between Princeton and Hope.

The Company announced April 22nd, Lead/Silver concentrates shipped to the smelter have already exceeded the March totals with an estimated 166 dry metric tonnes shipped during the month.

Since the underground drill program began in late March, 2013, a total of 919m over 10 holes have been completed. The total length of the drill program is expected to be 4,700m over 54 holes. Assays will be reported once they have been received from the laboratory and compiled.

Mining continues, with Stope 2

currently in production. To date, the Company has mined the stope over 65m in length, with a vertical height of 8.7m and a width of 1.7m. Stope 2 is the third stope to be mined from the uppermost level of the mine. The rehabilitation of the remaining historical raises on Levels 3 and 4 is nearing completion with sampling of these areas expected to be complete in early May, 2013.

As of April 22, 2013 approximately 166 dry metric tonnes of Silver/Lead concentrates and 130 dry metric tonnes of Silver/Zinc concentrates have been shipped to the smelter for payment during the month of April, 2013. The recent changes to the milling operations have significantly increased production with the ramp up expected to continue until early in the third

quarter.

The Company would also like to announce that it has made all required payments in connection with the acquisition of Huldra Properties Inc. (formerly Craigmont Holdings Ltd.) and the mortgages granted to secure payment of the purchase price have been discharged.

### About Treasure Mountain

Miners were attracted to this area in the early 1890's and Charles Connelly was credited with staking the first claim in 1894. The location was known locally by a number of names including Leadville, Summit City, Summit Camp and Summit City Camp but was never a city, camp or settlement.

Andy Jensen of Tulameen staked the Silver Chief claim in 1906 and optioned to W. B. Dornberg and associates of Spokane in 1910. Huldra Silver has had the property since 1980.

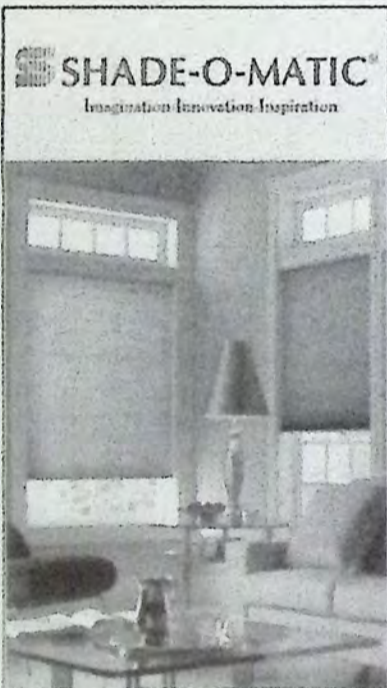

## PXA honours dedicated worker

Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA) met at the fairgrounds office on April 23 and the first order of business was to present Carol Ruoss with a plaque expressing gratitude for her 27 years of dedicated service to fairgrounds user groups and to PXA. Ruoss began as a member of Princeton Rodeo Club, then worked with the Agricultural Fair Association and Princeton Racing Days Association. She continued as Secretary-Treasurer of the PXA until health issues forced her retirement from all of the groups.

Work is underway at the fairgrounds to upgrade the electrical system. New energy efficient lighting has been installed in the Ag barn

and users of the barn are delighted with the improvement. Other lighting is being changed and improved in this ongoing project of Hayes Electric. The Ag barn has been well used during the winter months resulting in income from stall rentals.

Grgich Construction is working on necessary repairs and improvements to the grandstand as required by the structural engineer hired to assess the grandstand, and working with the fire marshall and building inspector.

In May, Jody Woodford begins repairs and renovations of the horse barns in preparation for the horse races scheduled for June 29 and 30.

Work on what is known as the 'heritage' building will begin as soon as the contractors can do the work. This area will have a concrete floor installed and electrical service.

Racing Days Association will be improving the horse parade paddock with a sand base and repaired fencing.

The Rodeo Club has scheduled a grounds work party in preparation for the Stan Thompson Memorial Team Roping May 10 and the rodeo on May 11 and 12. This is the first major event of the season at the fairgrounds. Jen Bernard and her crew will be preparing the concession, with Gerry St. Laurent making arrangements for the refreshment area. There is a lot of work to be done and anyone wishing to help out on Saturday will be most welcome. All of this preparation work is done by volunteers.

The next PXA meeting will be May 21, 7:00 PM at the fairgrounds. Meetings of the PXA and user groups will be held at the fairgrounds until November. Rodeo Club meetings are held in the Jim Lind building. Other meetings are held in the fairgrounds office under the grandstand.

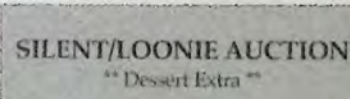

### WATER RESTRICTIONS

Water Restrictions will be in effect May 15, 2013.

By conserving today, we reduce the need for expanded facilities and costly upgrades to the water system.

- Even numbered civic addresses may water on Wednesdays, Friday and Sundays.
- Odd numbered civic addresses may water on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- No watering is permitted between Noon and 6:00 pm.
- Watering is not permitted on Mondays.
- Washing of boats or motor vehicles with a hose is permitted only if using a hose with an automatic shut-off device.
- Public sector entities are restricted to three days per week at any time.

Bylaw Enforcement Officers will enforce all levels of the water restrictions bylaw. A person who contravenes the bylaw commits an offence under the Offence Act and is subject to a fine.

## My Turn

### The \$206,117 Question

I don't know about you, but I actually feel bad for Town Council.

The zigzag project, or as I like to call it, the Never-ending Story, will probably be one of the things that will forever define the term being served by our local elected officials.

The project was to last only eight weeks and is currently in the ten-month range and although some have ignored barriers and used it, the zigzag is technically not open for public use. To be more specific, it is still considered a construction zone and anyone found on it is pretty much trespassing.

Why has it taken so long to complete?

Well, let's just say some hidden glitches and monkey wrenches were revealed as work progressed. For example, drainage became a huge issue.

I'm not an engineer, but I've seen enough places that were cleared and washouts occurred afterwards. When you look at the way the zigzag area was clear cut in the start of the project it seemed only logical that rain, which tends to flow downhill, would do a good job of eroding the bank the zigzag is built on. Why that wasn't identified as a potential issue before the project started is something I've heard a lot of discussion about.

The current hold up seems to stem from the stairway and landing at the bottom of the gazebo located at the top of the zigzag. According to Councillor Kim Maynard, who was kind enough to examine the site on our request last week, it looks like a design/engineering snag.

I never used the old zigzag much before it was destroyed by a pickup truck in June 2010 but I've paid more attention to it since the renovation project got underway.

Pardon me for saying so, but essentially that's all the zigzag is, a cosmetic renovation job. And with all renovations there is a great deal of enhancement involved and the new zigzag will be a wonderful improvement to what had previously existed.

However, with all renovations if the job isn't completed within a reasonable length of time (yes, timeline estimates are often just guesses) you have two options. You either fire the contractor, or you never hire him again for future work.

How do you think Town Council should handle this situation?

# Current Comment

## A Gardener's View Of Global Warming

I am a gardener. Many of my friends are involved in gardening and other agricultural activities involving growing plants. We notice weather and temperatures. During the past few years, we have noticed winters seem to be longer and springtime is colder.

Last Thanksgiving, I decided to start keeping a record in my daily diary. Using the Environment Canada website and the official records for Princeton, I recorded our daily maximums and minimums along with the record highs and record lows for Princeton. Granted, our local weather records go back only 77 winters, but I thought that might give me an idea of what is really going on.

The first day I wrote down the record high was October 11. The record high was 26.1 in 1945. The record low was -12.6 in 2009. I remember that Thanksgiving weekend in 2009. I had guests and I put them to work digging carrots.

Ordinarily, I dig carrots the third week of October, in nice weather, but that year was so cold we had to get those carrots out of the ground.

By October 14, the record lows were from a different year, 1968, with -7.2. The record high was 24.1 in 2004, and October 15 had a record high of 27.2 in 1991. As the days wore on, the record lows were in random years and the record highs were in random years, but none were in the last 13 years. For example, The record highs were around 20 degrees and occurred in 1974, 1940, 1942 and 1939. The record lows were around -10 degrees in 1981, 1949, and 1976. The same held true for October 26, when the record high was 19.4 in 1983, and the record low was -8.3 in 2002. The record high was 16.5 in 2003 on the following day.

At the beginning of November, the record lows were -12 and -13 in 2002, with record highs of 20 and 21 in 1975. The next couple of days showed record highs in 1975 and 1980, but both record lows were in 2003 for three days.

As the days wore on through November, I noticed a distinct trend: record low temperatures seemed to prevail for 1953 through 1955, which matches the global experience, as this cooling took place worldwide. On November 23, the record low was -29.5 in 1985, and on November 24, the record high was 13 degrees in 1959, but the record low was -26.6 in 2010. There was a week-long series of record lows after the 2010 record low, and all of those records

were in 1985. Then the record lows returned to 1955 and 1995, with some record highs in 1939 the second week of December.

Around Christmas Eve, the record lows were in 1983 and 1996, but the lows and highs were scattered after Christmas. The record high for New Year's Day was 7.8 in 1997 and the record low was -32.5 in 1979.

January 9 and 10 had record highs of 10 in 2007 and 23.4 in 2008, with record lows of -30 in 1973. For the next two days, the record lows were -32.7 in 1998. The record high on January 14 was 8.4 in 2011 with a record low of -30.6 in 1971. The following day, the record high was 6.9 but the record low was -30.5 in 2005. Until January 30 and 31, the record highs and lows were scattered through the years, but on those dates, the record lows were -35 and -36 in 1996, as cold as some of the records set in the 1950s cold years.

During February, the record highs and lows were scattered, with a couple of record highs set in 2011, but on February 25 and 26, record lows were set in 2011, and on February 27, the record low was -22, set in 2012.

During March, the record highs and lows were scattered with none of the records in the 2000s, but the record low on March 12 was -18 in 2009. Until March 20 and 21, the figures were scattered, but the record lows for the 20th and 21st were in 2002. The record lows continued to show 1954 and 1955 as having the record lows for March, but on April 1, the record low was -10.6 in 2008 and on April 10, the record low was -8.8 in 2010. On April 11, the record high was 24.4 in 2004, but on the following day, the record low was set in 2001.

One of the trends in the 2000s was record snowfall in April.

Having taken you through all of this, and considering Europe, Britain, Russia, the United States and India had a record-breaking cold winter just past, I noticed a distinct trend. There appear to be three colder years approximately every 30 years. During the early 1950s, the early 1980s and now during the 2000s, there appears to be a cooling trend lasting up to five years.

We gardeners and farmers look forward to the end of our current global cooling!

## Town will service road

An update on the road leading to the Chamber of Commerce building on Highway 3 was received at the April 15th regular meeting of Princeton Town Council.

"Earlier this year I recommended to Council that the Town not clear the snow from the road access into the Chamber office as it is a private road," stated Interim CAO Robert Wilson in his report to Council.

"Subsequent research and discus-

sion with the land surveyor reveals that the driveway is in fact a public road and not a private driveway," Wilson added.

Wilson says since it is now determined to be a public road, the Town will sweep it and plow it in the winter with the snow removal policy to be amended accordingly.

"It is a public road therefore it is our responsibility," Wilson told Council during the meeting.

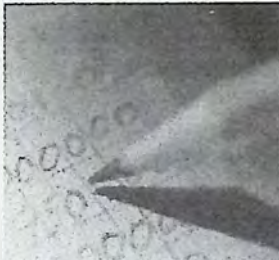

## NDP plan would benefit Lower Valley agriculture

NDP leader Adrian Dix has outlined the practical steps that the BC New Democrats would take to support BC farmers and promote local agriculture, including an annual \$8 million investment in agriculture support programs.

"The NDP's agriculture platform offers change for the better after more than a decade of stagnating support for BC farmers," said Sam Hancheroff.

"Our three point plan to Grow BC, Feed BC and Buy BC will provide the foundation for this critical industry to thrive."

Grow BC will provide replant program support for orchardists to switch to high-value crops and improve their competitiveness; Feed BC will increase local purchasing of BC grown food by hospitals and long term care facilities, and Buy BC will expand access to

marketing programs for BC grown products.

"In addition to the supports being offered to all growers, the NDP plan to review and update BC's patchwork of antiquated liquor laws will benefit BC wineries," said Hancheroff, who manages a vineyard.

**Saddles 'n' Spurs**  
 by Pastor George Donovan

It was my first night in the bunkhouse at the Triangle Ranch and four or five of the guys were playing poker. They invited me to join them. I had never played poker with real money before and was a little nervous but went ahead anyway wanting to fit in and get to know the guys. By the time the game was over I was up \$6.00. I felt really bad for the losers and never played again.

We were paid \$90 per month for 60 hours per week, which adds up to about 35 cents per hour plus board. However the ranch store at

Quilchena was open on Wednesday evenings and it was an event to go to the store and most of the cowhands went. There were candy bars, pop, saddles, bridles, groceries and socks, jeans and shirts and we didn't have to pay, they just took it out of our monthly paycheque. Most of the guys had very little left at payday.

I remember one guy, Bill, had a

chèque at the end of the month for \$4.00 so winning six bucks at poker could leave someone pretty short! There was no electricity in the bunkhouse and one night one of the older cowboys asked me to go to a building that stored fuels as well as coal oil and to fill the coil oil lamps.

I was glad to help and went and ..... continued on Page 21

**Living Past 100**  
**Friends And Love Make Longer Life**

Research shows a loving relationship contributes to a longer, healthier life. What happens to people after a loved spouse dies?

There is a period of grief and then loneliness. Grief and loneliness are bad for the immune system, and it is not unusual for one elderly partner to die within a couple of years of the death of a long loving relationship. Why is it that some people go through the loss and go on despite the grief?

People who live very long lives suffer through loss of friends, partners, and family members, yet they seem to be able to adjust. What makes the difference?

In the famous Georgia longevity study, the difference appears to be community involvement. All of the 100 year old people in the study were active socially. They belonged to groups who shared their interests, and they made friends with whom they went places and did things. Friends became their social support system.

Most of the people in the study lived alone, but did not stay alone all day. They went to community centers, senior centers, volunteer organizations, service clubs, church organizations and one elderly physician actually made house calls to other elderly people. These 100 year old people did not live in isolation, and they claimed that was one of the reasons they lived so long.

Every life must have meaning to the person who lives it. For the young mother, meaning is provided by the need of her children. For a man, meaning may come from the work he does. As people become older and retire, meaning may come from hobbies, or being present for family members and loved ones. For the very elderly, meaning appears to come from the social network.

The majority of the very elderly are women, most of them widows who have lost not only a husband but other family members and friends. Most live on a low income, which can be stressful, but most find they can manage to enjoy life as long as they are involved in the community. Their ability to enjoy life depends on their social network.

The ability to make friends and become part of a community appears to be an essential skill in the enjoyment of life and living a long, healthy life.

## Thai Fusion Shrimp and Orzo Salad

(NC)—This summer, soak up the sun and enjoy the outdoors. It's as simple as moving dinnertime to the backyard where you can dine al fresco with family and friends. With the perfect weather and the perfect meal, you can enjoy a hassle-free dinner that requires little cleanup.

The shrimp and orzo salad shown here highlights the many fresh flavours of the Mediterranean with an added kick thanks to the sweet and tangy sauce. It's a perfect light meal to enjoy by the barbecue and is sure to become a favourite.

Serves: 4 / Prep Time: 15 minutes / Marinating Time: 30 minutes / Cook Time: 10 minutes

- 1 lb (500g) jumbo or large shrimp (about 16), peeled and deveined
- 2/3 cup (150 mL) VH sweet Thai chili sauce
- Pam Grilling Spray
- 1-1/2 cups (375 mL) orzo shaped pasta
- 2 cups (500 mL) chopped tomatoes
- 2/3 cup (75 mL) crumbled feta cheese
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup (60 mL) chopped fresh parsley

- Place shrimp in large shallow dish. Pour 1/2 cup (125 mL) of Thai chili sauce over shrimp, turning so that all shrimp are well coated. Cover and marinate at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- Reserving sauce from dish, thread shrimp onto 4 skewers.
- Spray grill with Pam Grilling; heat to medium-high heat. Grill skewers, basting with reserved sauce during first 5 minutes only, until shrimp are opaque, approximately 10 minutes.
- Meanwhile, in a large pot of lightly salted boiling water, cook pasta for 10 minutes. Reserving 1/2 cup (125 mL) of cooking water, drain pasta. Transfer pasta to heated bowl. Immediately stir in tomatoes, feta cheese, pepper, remaining Thai chili sauce and 2 tbsp (25 mL) of parsley. Stir in reserved cooking water to moisten if necessary.
- Remove shrimp from skewers. Arrange on top of orzo. Sprinkle with remaining chopped fresh parsley.

Tips:  
This salad is delicious both warm or at room temperature, or even the next day. Try to buy large or jumbo shrimp for this recipe; if only large are available, cut the barbecuing time down to about 8 minutes.

# FACTOS - A Day On The Farm!



From left, Ravi Sandhu and Jas Uppal, Industrial Relations Officers, BC Employment Standards and Councillor Kim Maynard, Town of Princeton learned a lot about the Loose Bay Campground April 22nd near Oliver. Greg Norton (far right), farmer and director of the Loose Bay Campground Society gave visitors a candid history of the campground from its birth in 2001. The campground is the only one in the interior with the aim of offering accommodations for seasonal farm workers. A similar campground was attempted near Keremeos in 2009 and 2010 but closed due to public resistance. The Keremeos campground attracted transients who were unruly and indifferent. A lack of supervision resulted in clashes with local businesses and residents. Loose Bay, in contrast, has year-round caretakers who keep a lid on activities. The campground near Oliver can hold well over 300 campers from all stripes: the site has had farm workers who spent their last penny before they arrived and recreational campers with million-dollar motorhomes.



Greg and Chris Norton started small. The sheltered kitchen area for their workers near Oliver didn't have a concrete floor at first. That came in time. Many farmers offer up comparable amenities to their workers. Other farmers are hard-pressed to even provide a toilet. Visitors to their farm April 22nd included representatives from Employment Standards and the FACTOS-Farm And Community Team Okanagan Similkameen. Greg and Chris have employed seasonal farm workers since 1986 when they took over the family farm. Most vineyards, ironically, do not offer accommodations, camping, a place to eat or showers to their workers. - photos submitted



It doesn't take much to provide for farm workers. A warm shower is a huge comfort at the end of a hot work day in the orchard. FACTOS-Farm And Community Team Okanagan Similkameen spent April 22nd touring farms and vineyards near Oliver to get a better idea of what farmers offer to their seasonal workers. The activities formed "A Day On The Farm" and ended in an open forum where farmers could ask questions of government and agency reps like Pinder Dhaliwal, Vice-President of the BCFG and Steve Marino of WorkSafe BC. - photos submitted



Fancy-schmancy. Compared to sleeping in the elements, the rooms offered by Greg and Chris Norton near Oliver are the Taj Mahal of seasonal farm worker accommodations. Several years ago, Greg and Chris bought building materials from the dismantled Southwind Inn in Oliver and used the wood to build more rooms for their seasonal farm workers. Each year, the couple adds something: a new bunkhouse, a sitting room, a clothes line... They have no need to advertise for workers: they treat their workers like family and as such, they get the best of workers returning year after year.

# Candidates Tackle Health Care Questions

## SOHC Surveys Fraser-Nicola Candidates

Voters in rural British Columbia are very concerned about the state of health care in their communities. Support Our Health Care (SOHC), in conjunction with the BC Health Coalition, has prepared a list of six questions dealing with rural health care issues. On March 18, these questions were sent to the four candidates running in the Fraser-Nicola riding, asking them to respond by April 2nd. To date, SOHC has received submissions from Michael Beauclair of the BC Conservative Party and Jackie Tegart of the BC Liberal Party (both were published in the April 9th Similkameen News Leader). If submissions are received from Harry Lali (NDP)

and John Kidder (Green Party) their answers will appear in a future issue of this paper.

Here are the responses from John Kidder (Green Party):

1. *Over the past ten years, rural B.C. communities have experienced a gradual erosion of health services and reduced accessibility to timely health care. Acute doctor shortages, scheduled closures of emergency departments, increased waitlist times, cutbacks in community nursing services, and difficulties with transportation to specialized services in regional centres are indicative of a health care system unable to meet the needs of rural patients.*

*If you are elected to the legislature in the 2013 provincial elections, what will you and your party do to*

*reverse this trend and improve accessibility for rural residents?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** Communities cannot thrive without basic services. One of the Green Party's basic pledges is to reduce inequities in health care, by paying greater attention to the needs of rural communities. Provision of hospital health services to rural communities requires a shift in government's economic thinking. Health authorities now must focus on a narrow definition of economic "efficiency" to secure funding from the province, which puts all the emphasis on reducing the direct and overhead costs of service delivery. This leads inevitably to centralization and achievement of economies of scale without accounting for the other costs borne by the communities affected.

If elected to the Legislature, Greens, and John Kidder in particular, will strongly promote and argue for a broader approach to rural health care. Hospital acute care and emergency services must be available within an hour of almost any rural resident. Community clinics must be established and staffed with salaried employees to ensure reliable access to necessary care. Ambulances, paramedics and other first responder services must be properly funded and treated as a high priority, rather than simply as a way to reduce local health services by providing transport to care.

2. *In February 2012, Kim Carter, Provincial Ombudsperson, released Public Report No. 47, The Best of Care: Getting It Right for Seniors in British Columbia (Part 2). In her report she presents 143 Findings and makes 176 Recommendations for improving care for seniors in our province.*

*What steps would you and your party take to implement the recommendations in this report?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** BC Greens support and will follow the BC Ombudsperson's recommendations.

3. *Provincial health authorities seem to have lost the trust of the people they serve. What action will you and your party take to reestablish that trust, making our health authorities more accountable and more responsive to the needs of rural communities?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** Greens believe that local decisions will better address local needs and opportunities. First of all, BC Greens will establish Regional Health Trusts based on the demographic and geographic realities of British Columbia to replace Health Authorities. These Trusts will be more knowledgeable of and responsive to local issues than a

centralized Health Authority can be.

Well managed processes and communications are central to rebuilding trust. BC Greens will ensure that Health Trusts are properly mandated and facilitated to ensure that residents and community representatives are consulted and properly heard, and that healthcare policies and decision parameters are transparently and openly discussed before decisions are taken.

4. *The demand for rural doctors exceeds the supply. In competition with each other, rural communities have resorted to providing incentives such as subsidized housing, paid for by local governments, businesses, or private citizens. To be able to compete in the resulting "bidding war", rural communities are now in a position where incentives are a requirement.*

*What is your party's response to this situation?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** It is unconscionable to require small communities to bid against one another to bribe doctors to locate there. Over the long term, Greens believes that all doctors should be paid with salaries rather than through a fee-for-service model. This will "level the playing field" somewhat, and reduce the incentive for doctors to seek out only highly paid specialist practices in urban centres. In the near term, a Green government will establish 24-7 clinics in rural areas staffed by salaried doctors and nurse practitioners.

5. *Rural communities in British Columbia share similar health care concerns. However, each community's health care requirements vary according to the demographics of the community.*

*As a candidate in the provincial election, what do you consider to be the most important health care issues in your constituency? And how would you address them?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** In Fraser-Nicola, the most important health care issues are care for the ageing population, provision of hospital services, early childhood wellness, and healthcare for First Nations.

Support for elders requires access to doctors in communities, improved delivery of home health services, and enhanced emergency services for acute issues. While we must also enhance institutional facilities for the ageing, there is little doubt that more nurse-practitioners and other home health care services on the ground can reduce the need for intensive services and improve quality of life. The Green Party also supports the accreditation of nurse-practitioners to carry out a number of health functions now restricted to doctors, in order to encourage more at-home health

delivery.

Provision of hospital services is addressed above.

Early childhood wellness is a critical and under-recognized issue in Fraser-Nicola. Our children score among the very lowest on a number of educational indicators, many of which are related to basic health and nutrition. Children entering school with such disadvantages are unlikely ever to catch up, and as a result, school achievement in Fraser-Nicola is also at the lowest levels in the province. Greens believe that basic wellness is a fundamental requirement of any health care system, and will devote significant resources to early nutrition, child home healthcare, and to improved education and extension for wellness-related activities.

First Nations healthcare is an essential part of rural health. As part of the federal government's continuing vacating of responsibilities, billions of dollars of federal and provincial funding will be transferred to the newly created First Nations Health Authority ("FNHA"). The FNHA will manage and deliver First Nations Health Programs and carry out other health and wellness related functions.

While the bulk of the money and responsibility is coming from the federal government, the FNHA will collaborate with the BC Ministry of Health and BC Health Authorities to integrate programs and services, and to incorporate and promote First Nations knowledge and models of health and healing into health programs. The Green Party of BC will place a high priority on ensuring that this collaboration is positive and respectful.

6. *On March 14th, the provincial government passed the Seniors Advocate Act. Although this is a positive step for senior citizens in British Columbia, the advocate position is not established as an independent office of the legislature and cannot be the effective critical watchdog that it needs to be.*

*If you are elected to the legislature would you support an independent seniors advocacy position with real authority to act on behalf of seniors?*

**John Kidder (Green Party):** Greens support a seniors advocacy position as an effective critical watchdog, and will ensure that the Seniors advocate is independent and properly funded. The "real authority to act" of such an advocacy position will, however, be limited – criticism and reporting are the functions of an advocate – in our parliamentary system, the authority to act must always remain with the elected legislature and its ministries.

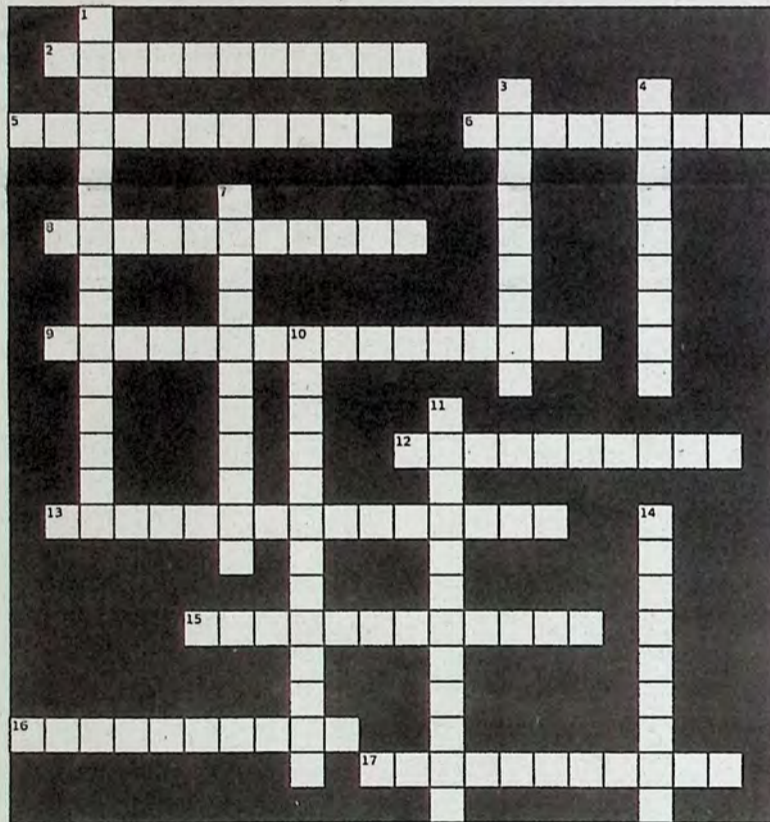



### Zigging and zagging on the zigzag

It is probably safe to say the zigzag project in downtown Princeton has become one of the strangest stories in recent history.

While many consider it a bad joke, it has been a project with unusual circumstances and setbacks that have frustrated residents and elected officials.

It all started during the noon hour of June 3, 2010 when an unattended pick up truck sailed down the rustic footpath destroying it.

Town Council received three concept options at their August 8, 2011 committee of the whole meeting from Bruce Carscadden Architects. A tender was issued in October 2011 but was cancelled two months later due to budget constraints.

Council decided to re-tender the

project for a spring 2012 construction start-up and applied to the Community Recreation Grant Program.

The tender was issued to Mierau Contractors Ltd. June 4, 2012 with a bid of \$206,117.00. A total of \$225,000.00 was budgeted with funding covered from PCRG, ICBC and Federal Gas Tax funding.

The project was to take a total of eight weeks, but drainage and various other monkey wrenches has brought the timeline to ten months since the contract was awarded and it is still not open to the public.

The latest hold up comes from a safety hazard located near the top of the path.

There has been no word on when that will be repaired.
