Will Town control trail?

The Town of Princeton is one step closer to taking control over the 4-kilometre section of the Trans-Canada Trail that runs through the community.

A motion made by Councillor Marilyn Harkness and seconded by Councillor Doug Pateman at the May 6th Town Council meeting approves, in principle, that the Town assumes the responsibility of the TCT within Town boundaries.

The section within the Town of the 117-kilometres trail from Brookmere to Osprey Lake was built and maintained by the Vermilion Trails Society "but the

society no longer has the ability nor funding to carry on," states Interim CAO Bob Wilson in his report to Council.

"Additionally there appears to be some conflict between motorized users of the trail and non-motorized users."

Town Council passed a motion December 11, 2011 designating the 'within Town Limits' portion of the trail as non-motorized.

The main goal is to have a "stable caretaker" for the portion of the Trail that runs through Princeton, which would assist with various grant-funding opportunities.

Council ends courthouse project

A Building Condition Assessment conducted by David Nairne & Associates Ltd. of North Vancouver was released at the May 6th regular meeting of Town Council. The 23-page document focuses entirely on the Court House building at 151 Vermilion Avenue.

The Town acquired the building on February 28, 2003 for \$112,000.00.

"The building is a 'purpose-built' two-storey wood frame courthouse constructed in 1929/30 containing a total rentable area of 6,619 square feet," explains Interim CAO Bob Wilson in his report to Council.

"It is currently partially occupied a few days a month for Provincial Court purposes." The annual operating costs of the building average around \$12,220,00.

Council had proposed to locate the Town Office in the building but chose to carry out an assessment of the condition of the building before making a decision.

"The assessment has now been completed and it states the former Court House building is in fair overall condition," Wilson says.

"The building is in need of building envelope repairs, structural, mechanical and electrical upgrading as well as environmental remediation."

The cost estimate is \$791,000.00.

"And there likely will be additional costs once the recommended

architectural assessment is carried out and with the cost of furnishing the building for the Town Hall, the overall cost will-likely be in the million dollar range," Wilson adds.

"In my view, I don't see the economical value in spending that amount of money on a building that is nearly 85 years old."

A motion made by Councillor

Marilyn Harkness and seconded by Councillor Jason Earle will see the Town cease all future capital expenditures on the building and look at possibly putting it up for sale.

Council amends community plan bylaw

The bylaw officially identified as the Town of Princeton Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 870, 2013 but commonly known as the Boundary Extension Bylaw was the subject of a public hearing prior to the May 6th regular meeting of Town Council.

As there were no petitions or dele-

gations present to speak to the bylaw amendment, it received third reading during the regular meeting.

More specifically, properties in East Princeton (48 lots in total) that were once in the Regional District that became part of the Town with the boundary extension were put in the Low Density Residential land use category.

In addition, properties in the Airport Road (20 lots) and Jacobsen Road (10 lots) areas that were affected by the boundary extension were put in the Country Residential land use category.

A further 28 lots in the East Princeton Industrial Area were put into the Industrial land use category.




Personally I am of the opinion that the Senate has a role to play in our democracy, just not in its current state. I think that if there was ever a time for reform in the Senate, this is that time.

Is Dawn A Conspiracy Theorist?

In a recent letter to the editor, I was labeled a conspiracy theorist. This was due to a column about what Lord Monckton is saying about global warming. I was disappointed in the criticism because the author of the letter did not refute what Monckton was saying, but attacked his character. Yes, Lord Monckton is an eccentric, but is he using the wrong facts?

Rather than quote another journalist, I am going to tell you why I believe the global warming is not realistic. Current global warming concerns are based on a theory that human activity is causing the mean temperature of Earth to rise. Keep in mind a theory is just an idea, or guess, that helps us navigate our way to proving the truth or disproving the theory.

Along with blaming human activity for the rise in Earth's mean temperature, there are two factors that come into the global warming scenario: 1) Earth's burgeoning population of 6.5 billion is part of the problem, and 2) humans are putting too much carbon into the atmosphere.

Earth's population, according to scientists, remained at around 500 million for thousands of years, but in the past two centuries has climbed steadily. Geneticists, judging by the human gene pool, believe there was a serious decline in human population 70,000 years ago, so there may have been a much higher population before the decline. Nobody knows.

The carbon theory comes from a discovery that 55 million years ago the Earth's mean temperature rose 6 to 11 degrees Celsius. During that period, large amounts of carbon were deposited in the oceans (oceans absorb carbon).

Nobody knows why carbon increased 55 million years ago, but no scientist will say human activity caused it because there is no evidence there were any humans at that time.

In a time closer to present, 20,000 years ago, there was a glacial maximum, known as the Ice Age, and nobody knows why it occurred. That ice age was followed later by 1,300 years of glaciation between 12,000 to 11,000 years ago. This glaciation period began abruptly, and ended just as abruptly, in just decades. The favored theory is that volcanic activity filled the atmosphere with dust and gases and caused Earth's surface to cool for 1,300 years.

Between 9,000 and 5,000 years ago was a period paleoclimatologists call the Holocene Maximum, also known as the Holocene Megathermal or the Climatic Optimum. During this period, there were no glaciers in the Rockies, the mean temperature in the Canadian Arctic was 4 degrees Celsius higher than present, and in Siberia was up to 9 degrees Celsius higher. There was substantially less Arctic ice than at present.

Scientists say this warm period coincided with the maximum 24 degree tilt of Earth toward the sun.

From 5,000 to 2,000 years ago, there was a cooling period, then a gradually rising mean temperature. Between 950 and 1100 AD, there was another warm period during which temperatures were the same as present and on some occasions warmer than now, but overall just slightly below present.

The Little Ice Age began in the 16th century and continued through the 19th century. Earth's mean temperature was lower than today during that period. Glaciers and Arctic ice increased in size. Temperatures in the 20th century gradually rose until 2004, when scientists measured the increase as 4/10ths of one degree Celsius. The rate of increase in mean temperature has slowed since 2004, and this past winter set record lows throughout Europe, Russia, India and China.

I do not believe you must be a genius in order to see there is little correlation between human population and human activity in causing global warming in the past. The fact that there were great carbon deposits 55 million years ago is hardly related to human activity. So why did so many governments jump on the population/carbon reason for the slight mean temperature rise during the past 50 years?

I asked myself that question, and came up with an answer: carbon tax. The carbon tax nets \$400 million a year in British Columbia alone.

Knowing the facts I listed about climate change on Earth, and questioning whether human activity is the real cause of present changes, does that make me a conspiracy theorist?

RDOS supports Agur Lake project

A society that provides barrier-free access to a wilderness camping experience has received a \$35,440 community grant from the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen to help maintain an administrative site.

The Agur Lake Camp Society operates a wilderness camp for families with special-needs members about 20 km west of Summerland. Its three cabins are equipped with ramps, lifts and additional maneuvering space and 1,500 metres of wheelchair-accessible trails wander through the 21-hectare property's wetland and forest environment.

The society's plans for future development include more cabins, an RV park, pavilion and playground.

"The society has wanted to create

a physical administrative presence since March 2012," said ALCS president Carla Ohmenzetter.

"We feel this is the best way for prospective donors, clients and the general public to visit with us, view progress and evaluate the benefits of participation."

Members of the RDOS Regional Board agreed, approving the community grant as part of the 2013 operating budget in March.

In its grant application, the society reported there is up to 150 families in the South Okanagan-Similkameen region — and up to 52,000 provincially — that could benefit from a visit to the camp. Many of those are already on a waiting list.

The Regional District has budgeted for up to \$182,740 in community grants in aid for 2013. The funding is consistent with the Regional District's commitment to building and sustaining an environmentally, fiscally and socially responsible community.





The Importance of Beans for Elders

Beans are very important as a regular part of the daily diet for anyone, but especially needed for older people. Dried beans and lentils, not green beans, have many essential elements for older people, beginning with cholesterol control. Beans are one of the best foods for controlling cholesterol, as they are packed with soluble fibre, a substance which prevents cholesterol from reaching your blood stream where it can clog your arteries. When you eat beans, it does not matter if they are canned, frozen or made directly from the dried bean.

Dried beans contain a lot of calcium, another essential for aging bones. Most older people are short of calcium. Eating beans is easier on the digestive system than taking calcium supplements. Because beans contain a lot of fibre, they are actually good for your digestive system.

Eating beans is excellent for blood sugar control. Beans are rich in complex carbohydrates, so they digest slowly, gradually releasing the carbohydrates that become sugar in the blood. This is important for diabetics, and should be one of the regular foods for anyone with any form of diabetic condition.

There is a lot of evidence to show that in cultures where beans are eaten almost daily, there is a low incidence of breast cancer and prostate cancer.

Beans contain a lot of protein and almost no fat, which makes beans an ideal substitute for meat dishes, and far healthier than eating a lot of meat for pro-

Many people worry about the gassy effects of eating beans. Here are a couple of tricks to stop the gas. First, if you are using dried beans, always bring the beans to a boil and drain off the liquid before continuing to make your bean dish. If you are using canned beans, drain off the liquid and rinse the beans before you proceed with your recipe. Add a pinch of summer savory or a teaspoon of dried ginger, two spices that stop the gassing.

Try to avoid kidney beans unless you can digest them well. Many people cannot. There are many ways to serve beans - chili con carne, bean salads, baked beans, bean soup. Garbanzo beans (chick peas) are made into hummus, a nice spread for crackers. Garbanzo beans are ground into flour and used to coat samosas, but bean flour can also be mixed with other flours to give a calcium boost to baked goods.

There are many different kinds of beans and you may discover you prefer some to others, but it is worth your time to try many different bean dishes, and combinations of beans. Soybeans are put into many different dishes and are made into tofu, but if you have not tried soy products, be cautious, as many people do not tolerate soybeans well. Each person develops a sense of which beans suit them best.





BC Has More Ways to Vote

All voters can:

Vote in any district electoral office from now until 4 p.m. (Pacific time) on General Voting Day, Tuesday, May 14, 2013.

Vote by Mail You can ask for a Vote by Mall package from your district electoral office or through the Elections BC website at elections.bc.ca.

Vote at advance voting Voters can attend any advance voting location in the province from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (local time), Wednesday, May 8 through Saturday, May 11. All advance voting locations are wheelchair accessible.

Vote on General Voting Day Voters can attend any general voting location in the province from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (Pacific time), Tuesday, May 14, 2013.

- Choose only one candidate.
- Mark your ballot with an X or V.

Who Can Vote?

You can vote if you are:

- 18 years of age or older, or will be 18 on General Voting Day (May 14, 2013)
- a Canadian citizen, and
 a resident of British Columbia for the past six months

You can Register When You Vote

If you aren't already registered, you can register when you vote. You will need identification that proves both your identity and current residential address.

Under the Election Act, voters must prove their identity and residential address in order to receive a ballot or register to vote in conjunction with voting in a provincial general election or by-election. Voters may present identification, or use a process known as vouching. Some acceptable types of Identification and Information on the vouching process are found below.

A single document issued by the Government of BC or Canada that contains the voter's name, photograph and residential address, such as a BC driver's licence, BC Identification Card (BCID), or BC Services Card.

A Certificate of Indian Status as issued by the Government of Canada.

Two documents that together show the voter's name and residential address. Both documents must show the voter's name. At least one of the documents must also contain the voter's residential address.

Please note: Digital or electronic documents (e.g. e-bills) are acceptable. Hand-written information on a document, photocopies or electronic scans/photos of a paper document are not acceptable.

The following are examples of the document types authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer for the purposes of voter identification (the list of documents is illustrative, not exhaustive). Other specific documents (not listed below) may be authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer. For questions about the acceptability of a specific document, please contact Elections BC.

Government-issue identity document

Examples: healthcare card, birth certificate, Social Insurance Card, passport, citizenship document/ certificate, Old Age Security Identification Card, Canadian Forces identification, Firearm Acquisition Certificate, firearm Possession and Acquisition Licence, Veterans Affairs Canada Health Care Identification Card Correctional Service Canada Offender Identification Card.

Other government-issue document

Examples: property tax assessment, income tax assessment notice, government cheque, government cheque stub, statement of employment insurance benefits paid, Canada Child Tax Benefit Statement, statement of Canada Pension Plan benefits, statement of Old Age Security.

School/college/university-issue document

Examples: admissions letter, report card, transcript, residence acceptance/confirmation, tuition/fees statement, student card.

Other documents examples

- Provincial Where to Vote card
- Bank/credit card or statement
- Residential lease/mortgage statement
- Insurance statement
- Public transportation pass
- Utility bill
- Membership card
- Hospital bracelet/document
- Prescription medication container
- Attestation of residence
- · Personal cheque (printed by bank)

Voters without identification can be vouched for by a voter in their electoral district who has identification, or a direct family member or someone who has legal authority to make personal care decisions for the voter.

First Responders

Hayes Creek Volunteer Fire Department

Hayes Creek Fire Rescue is a small, uncertified fire hall serving the Osprey, Chain, Link lakes area of approx 350 households, most of which are seasonal.

They have a pumper truck, a pumper 2,000 gallon tanker and a medical first responder truck and 20 volunteers.

The medical portion of the department was started by resident retired Vancouver Battalion Chief Don Moyes to serve Hayes Creek members at fire calls in case of injury and collapse and it quickly expanded to serve all residents in the fire district and now has six oxygen therapy units, two heart defribulators, three aid trauma kits and a rescue boggan on tires and skis to access victims in remote areas and back country rescue in this large district.

The medical first responders are trained to Responder Level One and are recertified with a two day course every three years.

If a party calls 911 in Hayes Creek district for an ambulance, Kelowna dispatch sends out an ambulance and Hayes Creek first responder unit to the address at the same time.

Depending on travel distance from one of our members or the hall Hayes Creek is on scene with the patient in 3 to 12 minutes and an ambulance from Princeton or Summerland is on scene between 45 minutes to one hour.

The emergency could be an MVA, heart attack, stroke, shortness of breath, collapse, trauma, fractures, etc. and first responder protocol and forms are standard province-wide and involve the questions: "Am I safe?", "Are there hazards like live wires?", "Assault?... Crime scene... Self harm?... Suicide?... Preservation of evidence?" and are quickly done by first responders in scene assessment and then move on to introduction and asking permission to treat patient(s)....(all patients have a right to refuse treatment if conscious).

If permission is granted, move on to appropriate treatment by one first responder while a second records all patient data on a form to be passed on to ambulance crew and to stay with patient in primary medical care and includes name, address, medical card number, chief complaint, method of injury, medical history, patient medications, and vital signs...(oxygen percentage in blood, pulse, respiration, blood pressure, pain level, other injuries found, etc.).

Patient vitals are taken and recorded every ten minutes and when the higher trained ambulance crew arrives, they can see at a glance all this relevant information and see if the patient is going downhill or improving while the patient /first responder exchange protocol is being done.

The ambulance crew carries on with a higher level of patient care and first responders assist with spine board, chair cot, bed cot or whatever the ambulance crew asks of them and then they assist with loading patient and caring for personal affects. The ambulance crew, unlike our all volunteer, are a paid on call department so instead of sending 5 or 6 as we do they could send just 2 persons on a call and contact BCAS dispatch in Kamloops and 911 dispatch in Kelowna who dispatch these calls to smaller departments....and have Princeton only dispatched when no ambulance is available for Princeton city limit calls.

The average time from time of 911 call to patient reaching the nearest hospital in Penticton is about 4.5 hours with a stop in Princeton to stabilize patient and a 120 kilometre trip from there to Penticton.

So much for the "magic hour" of time of 911 call to meaningful medical intervention of a functioning ER and OR and diagnostics....but the first responder does provide primary medical care in just minutes and is a life saver in many heart attack or stroke or extreme trauma situations.

First Medical Responder is now carried on in the Osprey Lake area by trained folks who, like you reading this article, felt abandoned by their provincial government in closing Princeton Hospital, and felt a need to do what they could for themselves - and went beyond their

previous experiences and jobs and comfort level, got the training and are now the "pointy end" of primary medical care in their community with the satisfaction and pride of getting the job done and giving back to their community.

There are senior folks in this com-

munity who had there homes for sale as they felt they needed to leave the area, and this first responder service has given them some sense of comfort and knowledge that positive help is close at hand and the "magic hour" is again in place.







The idea of removing the upper legislative house would remove any sort of checks and balances within our current system. Unless we are to change the entire way we elect the House of Commons, the need for checks and balances are needed. We don't seem to be moving away from the idea of majority governments in this country anytime soon and although the centre right is in power today, the next election could see a centre left majority. Although to partisans the idea of majority govemments are pleasing, they segregate a large percentage of the population. In the current case we have a majority government with less than 40% of the popular vote. That means about 60% of voters did not vote for the government. If the Senate was elected and represented the people, it would have a mandate to keep the House of Commons in check no matter what the percent of the popular vote the government holds.




