

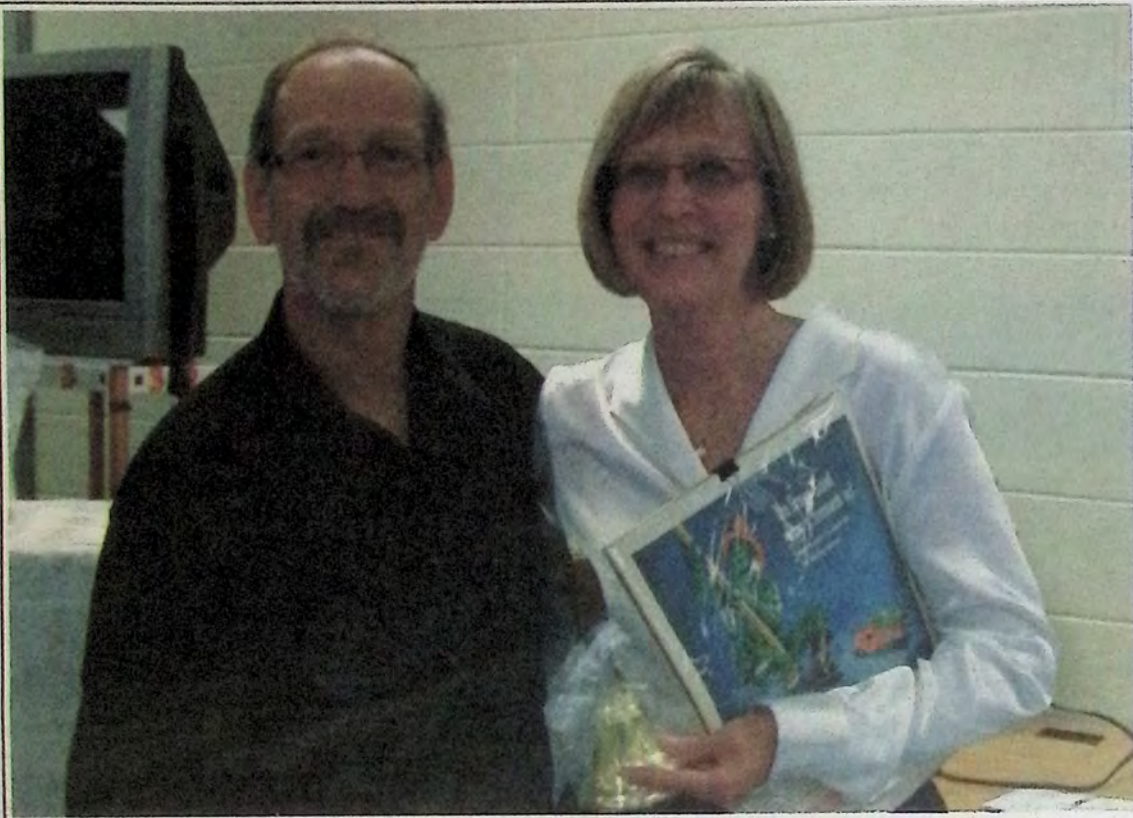

## Open fire ban now in effect

Effective at noon on Saturday, June 15, the current open burning ban was expanded throughout the entire Kamloops Fire Centre to include the Salmon Arm and Clearwater fire zones, in order to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect the public.

This prohibition will remain in place until October 1, 2013 in the Clearwater and Salmon Arm fire zones and until October 15, 2013 in the Kamloops, Vernon, Penticton, Merritt and Lillooet fire zones, or until the public is informed otherwise.

Specifically, this open fire prohibition applies to:

- \* the burning of any waste, slash or other materials
- \* the burning of stubble or grass
- \* the use of fireworks, sky lanterns or

burning barrels of any size or description

This prohibition does not ban campfires that are a half-metre high by a half-metre wide (or smaller) and does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes.

This prohibition covers all B.C. parks, Crown lands and private lands, but it does not apply within the boundaries of a local government that has forest fire prevention bylaws in place and is serviced by a fire department.

Before lighting any fire, residents should check with local civic authorities regarding any current prohibitions.

The Kamloops Fire Centre stretches from the northern border of Wells Gray Park to the U.S. border to the

south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Gold Bridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

## Board wants lease deal now

The lease agreement for Riverside Centre should have been renewed in December 2012. The lease deal was originally signed by Regional District (RDOS) and School District #58 (Nicola-Similkameen). The lease agreement outlines funding and responsibilities of each party for the operation of what was formerly a school and is now a community centre with one wing used for School District students.

At the June 12 Board of Education meeting, Board Chair Gordon

Comeau expressed his concern that there has been no movement toward having the lease agreement signed. The Board is concerned because their facility is being operated with no lease agreement.

The delay appears to be between RDOS and the Town of Princeton. Although the Town had no interest in the operation of Riverside Centre when local residents first proposed turning the closed school into a community centre, Town Council now desires a share in the manage-

ment of the facility. According to

the Board of Education, the Town would like to be the primary holder of the lease. What must be resolved between RDOS and the Town is the sharing levels of funding.

Comeau stated if there is no progress on the lease in the very near future, the Board of Education will call a meeting to resolve the situation.

Remember if you are looking for a special item ask us at the counter because we always have larger items in our storage. On that note we have lots of strollers available. So far this year we have had the

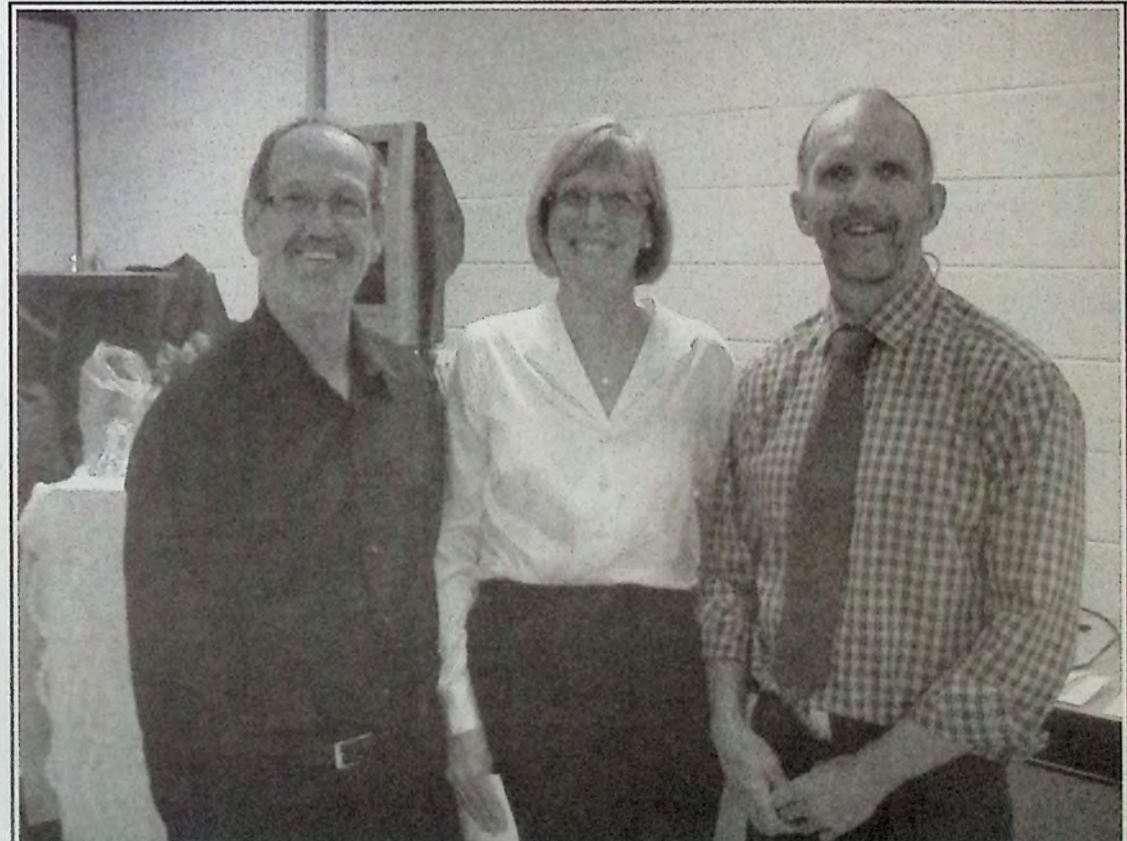
opportunity to be very generous with our gifts. This is an up-to-date list of what your patronage at the Thrift Shop has enabled us to give.

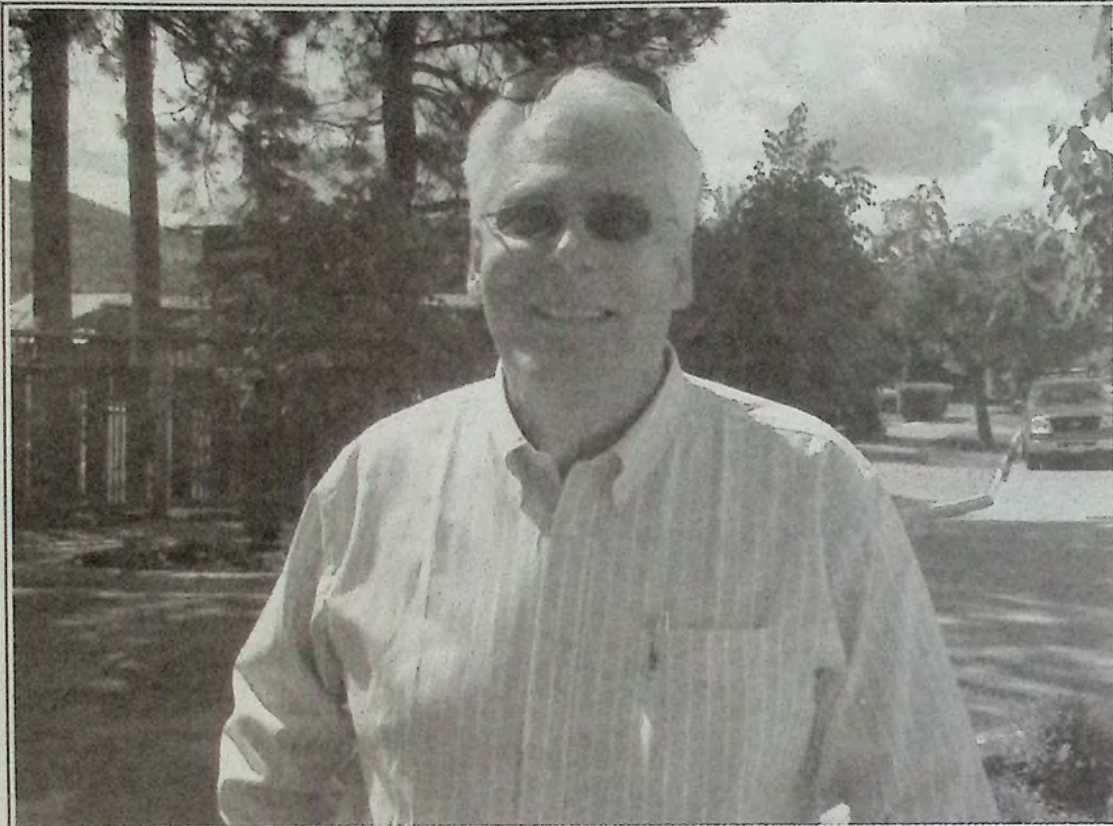

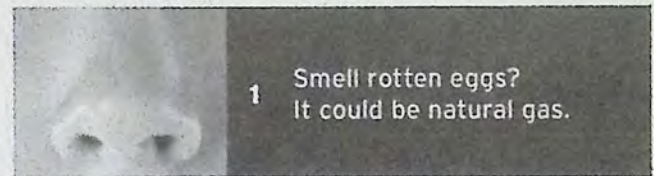

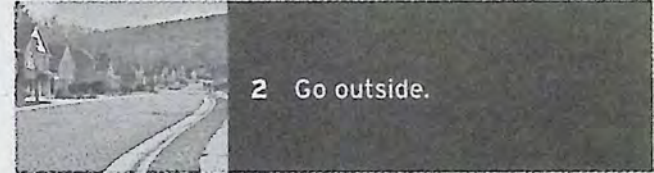

### Don't Drag Your Feet

The Town of Princeton created a Sidewalk Inspection and Maintenance Policy at the June 3rd regular meeting of Town Council.

It made front-page news in this paper so maybe you saw it.

The policy came into being simply because there wasn't one and risk assessment advisors spent part of a day dealing with the matter at a seminar held recently for the Public Works Department.

Since the Town lacks the manpower or financial resources to have someone out and about checking sidewalks within the town limits with a tape measure, the policy put in place falls under the category of complaint driven.

That makes sense, not just in the amount of money it'll save local taxpayers, but it also puts residents in the position of having a bit of say about improvements to sidewalks.

The interesting part of the policy is that there has to be some serious problems with a piece of sidewalk in order for repairs to take place.

For example, unless the complaint you plan to file at Town Hall is a Level 3 (a differential of more than an inch or 2.5cm) you may not see much done to the dip or shift in the sidewalk in front of your house or driveway.

A Level 3 location will be marked immediately by Public Works staff and slated for repair within a week, or so states Policy #012-2013.

That's not to say you shouldn't report any sidewalk damage, it just means that a Level 2 will end up on a list for reinspection in six months and a Level 1 will be virtually ignored.

We think Town Council has done a huge service to the community by putting this policy in place, we only think the three level system is flawed.

A Level 1 may be minor to the average resident but could be a trip hazard or a larger problem for residents who use walkers. Wheelchair residents will likely see the system as flawed as well.

At least there is a policy in place and it's now up to us to push for repairs by filing complaints at Town Hall instead of just bitching to whoever will listen.

## What Would You Tell A Grad?

Another Grade 12 class graduates this month, and everybody will want to give them advice, little of which they will heed. Knowing they are likely to forget most of the advice, I still wonder whether they have a real grasp of what it means to leave the protectiveness of secondary school.

This is the beginning of being responsible for one's life as an adult, but do the grads really understand that simple fact?

I remember graduation day, but I don't remember any of the speeches we heard that day. I remember the grad banquet, the certificate presentation, and the dance, but I have forgotten the speeches. I am sure they were full of good advice, but it did not sink in.

There were two teachers who gave advice long before grad, and I thought it was good advice, so I remembered it. One bit of advice was from Mrs. Edith Currie, who taught Physical Education. She said we girls should try to keep our weight what it was at age 18. I have tried, although I weigh 15 pounds more now. The other memorable advice was from a teacher named Ben Williams, who said if you really want to know what's going on in the world, follow the money. That has proven true time and again.

There was a whole lot of advice they would not have known how to give because times were differ-

ent then. They recommended getting a good education if you wanted a good job. That was pretty good advice for the time, but I have since learned it is better to learn a marketable skill first, because that will likely get you a job if a job is what you want. There were many jobs I would not have had except for the fact that I learned to type. It is a simple skill, but it opened doors for me that would have been closed if I had not learned touch typing!

Another piece of advice we did not receive was how to handle credit cards. There were no credit cards when I graduated from school, although a few big department stores were issuing plastic to be used only at their stores. Thankfully, I had a horror of being too much in debt, so I did not overdo the plastic. Fortunately, I was raised on a farm and had a good grasp of the concept of making things yourself and preserving cash. Today, using plastic can be a big trap for so many young people.

The other thing nobody advised us was to stay away from booze and drugs. We were told not to smoke marijuana and not to take heroin, but that was advice given more by Reader's Digest magazine than a thing learned at school. As for smoking and drinking alcohol, it seemed everybody did it and it was no big deal. I have seen more lives ruined by alcohol than by any other drug, but these days there are a whole lot of drugs being abused, and more ways to ruin one's life, although alcohol is still high on the list.

If I were giving advice to young people today, I would tell them to protect their main asset - health. I would tell them to protect not just their bodies, but their brains, and to stay away from any substance that alters their brains. I would add that part of protecting one's health is avoiding unsafe situations, because I have seen a few lives ruined, or ended, due to accidents

on the highway or on the job.

One of the best pieces of advice I received was from my father. He said, "Don't think you have to learn from just your own mistakes. You can learn from mistakes other people make." I have made my share of mistakes, but learning from other's mistakes kept me from making even more mistakes. I have passed that advice on to my own children. I hope it helped.

Both my parents taught me another valuable life skill, the skill of critical thinking. I was taught to ask questions, to try to find what was true, and even if everybody I knew believed a certain thing, if it did not make sense to me, I should question whether the belief was valid.

After all, there was a time when everybody believed the Earth was flat and the sun went under it at night.

I would not ever try to predict the future for any of our young people. When I graduated from school, nobody could have predicted half of the changes I have seen in the years since I graduated. Who would have predicted messages bouncing off satellites to provide us with television and telephone communication? Who would have predicted gasoline prices would skyrocket? (We thought 50 cents a gallon was expensive!) Who would have predicted the Soviet Union would collapse? Who would have predicted the AIDS pandemic? Who would have predicted nuclear contamination from power plants?

Who would have predicted landing on the moon? Who would have predicted computers? I could go on and on, but these are all reasons I would not venture to predict what these new grads will experience.

I think the best advice we can give any young people today is to be the best they can be and to achieve the best they can do. That has always been the best advice in any age.

It takes two good men to lay irrigation line (and a tractor and a four-wheeler). Sunday June 9th was all about farming in and around Keremeos. The other worker in this duo (who is also a co-owner of the property) was pulling the irrigation line along with his four-wheeler. Once the line is placed, it needs to be hooked up to the system and buried. The property being put into production is just north of Keremeos on Highway 3. The previous owner had the land planted to hay. Hay introduces all kinds of nutrients into soil so the first crop from this newly-planted orchard will require little fertilizer and will likely be a bumper crop. The new owners and their employees are working hard to change the hay land into orchard. Photo: Arlene Arlow





The farmer prepares his field by tilling the soil. Once tilled, the farmer plants his seeds and waits for the plants to grow. If Mother Nature is kind, he won't have to irrigate much. If Mother Nature is unkind, an over-abundance of rain will leach nutrients from the hay either before or after it is cut, which reduces the profit and reduces the feed content for domestic animals like cows and horses. Once the weather participates (the rains stop), the farmer cuts the hay (see photo). He has to be on the ball and bale the hay within a couple of days 'else the winds and heat draw precious nutrients out of the hay. And then the farmer hauls the hay out of the field. And stores the hay where it won't get wet (if it gets wet, it goes moldy and is toxic to animals). In the Southern Interior, the hay can be harvested as many as three times in a good year. In colder climates like Alberta, one crop of hay is all the farmer gets. The hay is hauled to cattle during the winter. And the cattle eat the hay. Those cows (they are actually called "steers") intended for auction are shipped to market in the late Spring. And the butcher works his magic to make steaks and roasts. And that's how ONE part of our daily meal makes its way to our plates. Note: Some steps have been left out so as not to detract from your reading pleasure. Photo: Arlene Arlow

### Man fined for breach

David C.E. Thomas, of Princeton, appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on June 13 to plead guilty to a charge of breach of a probation order. He had been placed on probation in July 2010 and one of the conditions was that he pay \$333 restitution. By the end of his probation, he had not done so. ### Big fine for no licence

out a driver's licence. He was stopped for speeding in November 2012 and could not produce a driver's licence. It had been suspended and he was originally charged with driving while prohibited but entered a guilty plea to a lesser charge. He was ordered to pay a \$750 fine plus \$112.50 in a victim fine surcharge.

### Man fined for driving

Justin Arnold Powell appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on June 13 to plead guilty to a charge of driving while prohibited, waived from Dawson Creek. Powell had been charged on April 16, 2013 in Dawson Creek. He was ordered to pay a \$500 fine plus \$75 in victim fine surcharge. He is prohibited from driving for an additional year.

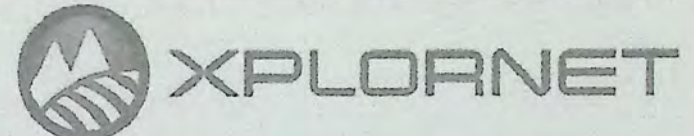

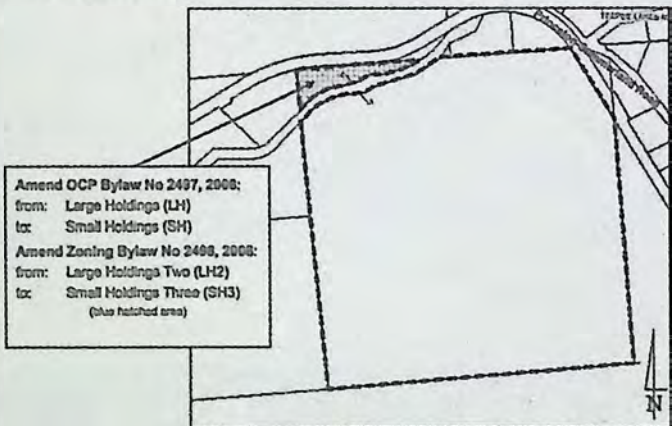

**Canadian Diet Is A Risk**

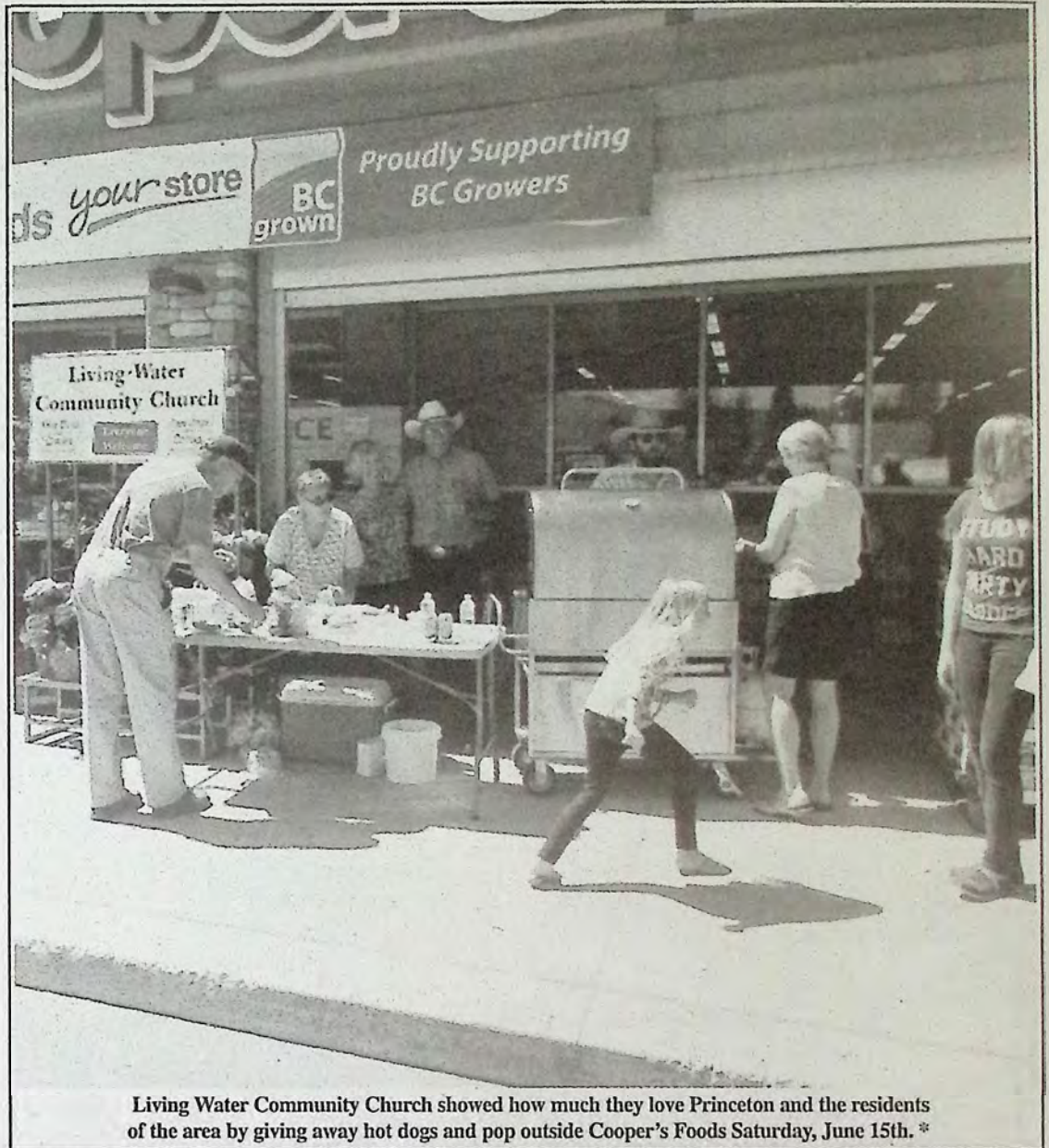

### Fire in Olalla June 9/10

From all accounts, the Keremeos Volunteer Fire Department performed heroically on Sunday June 9th, having fought an orchard fire earlier in the evening and then responding to a call out in Olalla at the Kilborn residence.

Bystanders exclaimed at how terrifying the fire was, with a lot of tall trees in the neighbourhood and sparks flying everywhere. The explosions from the propane tanks rocked the community, though everyone I spoke to described the Keremeos Firefighters as top-notch, making the onlookers feel that everything was well under control.

We are fortunate in the Similkameen to have such great volunteer Fire Departments, particularly since we live in such a dry area. As summer approaches, every tall dry grass field becomes fuel and stray campfire sparks or lit cigarette butts can ignite a hillside when a little wind comes up.

### Apex Logging

A number of concerned Apex residents have worked hard to develop awareness and understanding of the clear cuts currently taking place up at Apex Mountain Resort. They are working to try and change the log-

ging approach to an area directly within view of the Apex resort. This area, impacted by Mountain Pine beetle kill, has been targeted for removal but that decision has owners upset.

Because the cut blocks sit within the Gorman Brothers tenure area, a process was initiated by Gorman more than a year ago to notify the management at Apex of the pending cut. A change of Directors in the Apex Property Owners Association, and a change in who was slated to log the area, has caused a few communication breakdowns. Since the first communication with the resort by Gorman Brothers, the Provincial Government has awarded a part of the tenure area to Pentiction Indian Band's forestry company, Snpinktn.

In order to preserve the value of the logs, a clear cut approach is necessary for the PIB to recoup their costs. The longer the logs stand dead, the greater their drop in value, as the wood fibre degrades from millable wood to material for pulp. Fifty dollar logs turn into twenty dollar logs.

Dennis O'Gorman (no relation to Gorman Brothers) is a resident and Director of the Apex Property Owners Association. He moderated

a four hour meeting with representation from Apex property owners, forestry companies, Pentiction Indian Band and local elected officials. While the meeting did not halt the plans for logging, the leadership of Snpinktn were receptive to the Apex Property Owners concerns, and for attendees not familiar with logging practices, the Foresters were great at explaining why some approaches work within the forest and others do not.

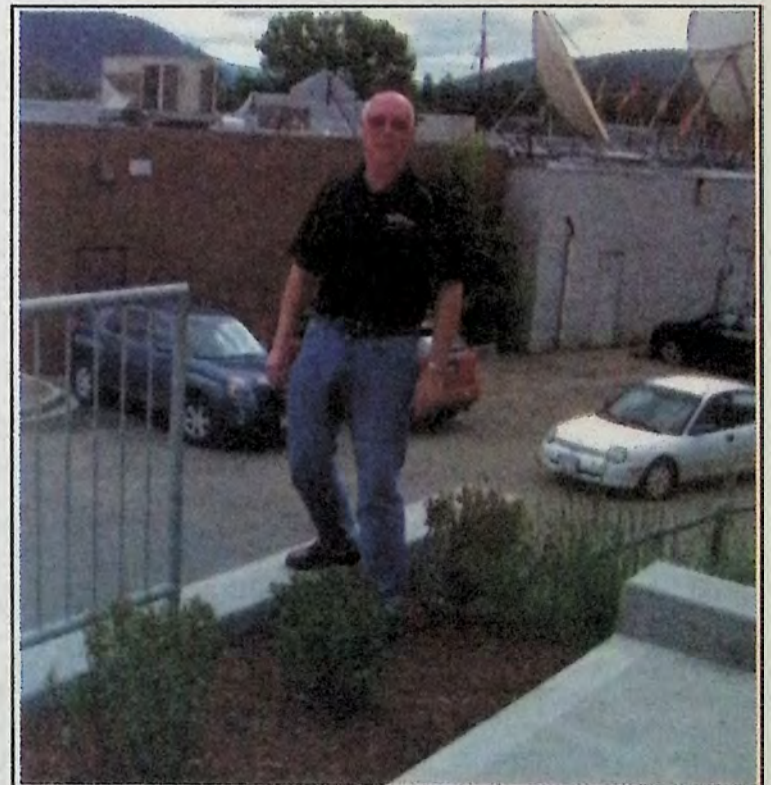
The difficulty, as a Forester from Gorman Brothers pointed out, is that the forests surrounding Apex are on Crown Land and slated for logging. Where they are impacted by Beetle kill, they offer a fire hazard if they remain unharvested and their value diminishes as they stand. There is also the potential for the beetle infestation to spread if the trees remain.

The manager for Snpinktn Forestry was willing to preserve certain areas for recreational values and identified strategies that the logging company would employ to do this. Leaving swaths of trees that were young, and not pine, to create the sense of "cover" was planned. Efforts were being made to naturalize the edge of the cutblocks by filigreeing them, and once the replanting is done, the

shock of the clear cut should be diminished.

Tom Siddon, Electoral Area Director for Area D, had some ideas about avenues to pursue to alter some of the coming cut blocks, but

the difficulty for the logging company is that their investment is already paid out and with stumpage fees already determined and a finite window of time for harvest, there is not a lot of room for negotiation.

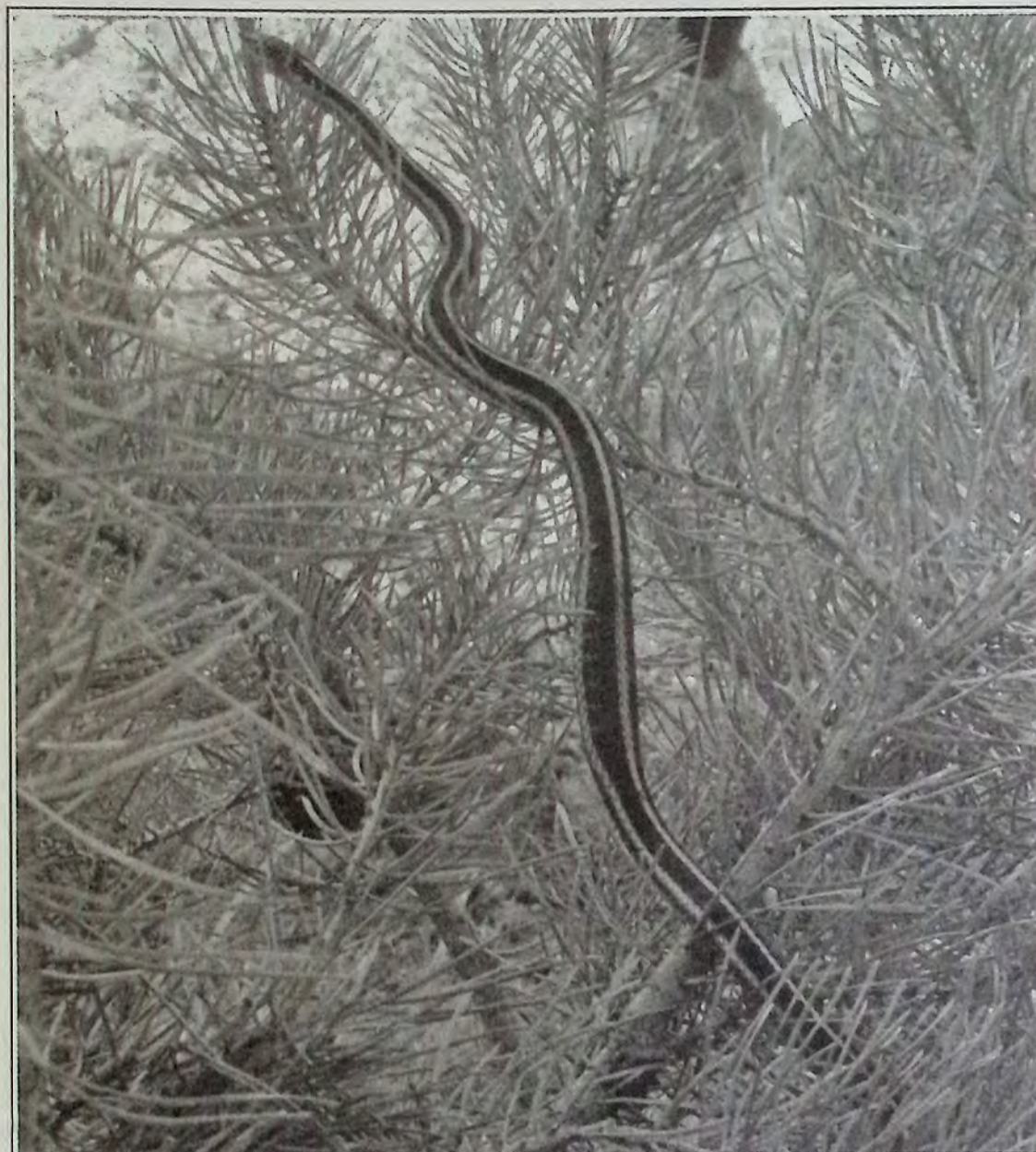

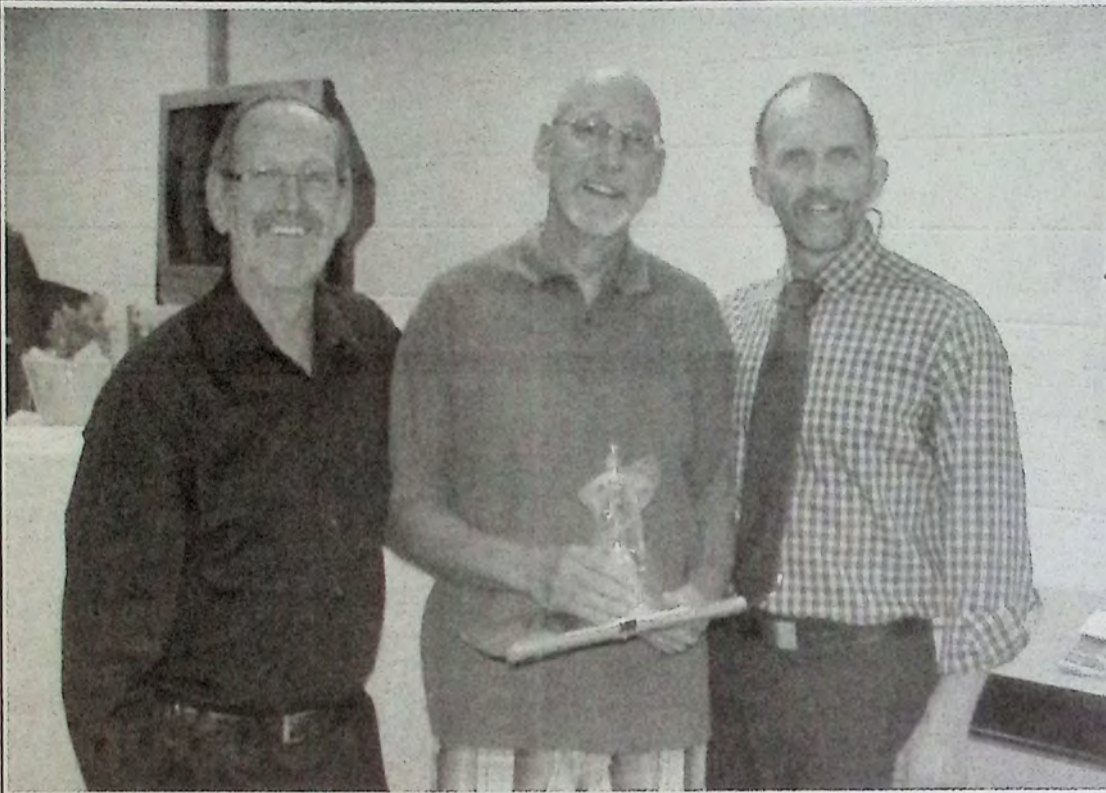

# Board approves new credit course

Sandi Blair, Principal of Princeton Secondary School, attended the June 12 Board of Education meeting to present a new course for approval of the Board. The course is called Learning Strategies.

Blair explained to the Board of trustees the difficulty some students have in attending sessions dealing with issues pertaining to their school experience. These sessions are individualized to address individual needs and may deal with learning problems or social problems that require counseling of some sort. In

order to attend these sessions, the students often have to give up a credit course leading to graduation. Without the credits, the students are placed in a position guaranteed to leave them behind their peers, so many refuse to attend the extra sessions.

What Blair proposed was that the Board approve Learning Strategies so students having difficulties can receive credit for the additional support they need. The Board approved the new course, allowing it to begin this September.

# Teachers conduct support audit

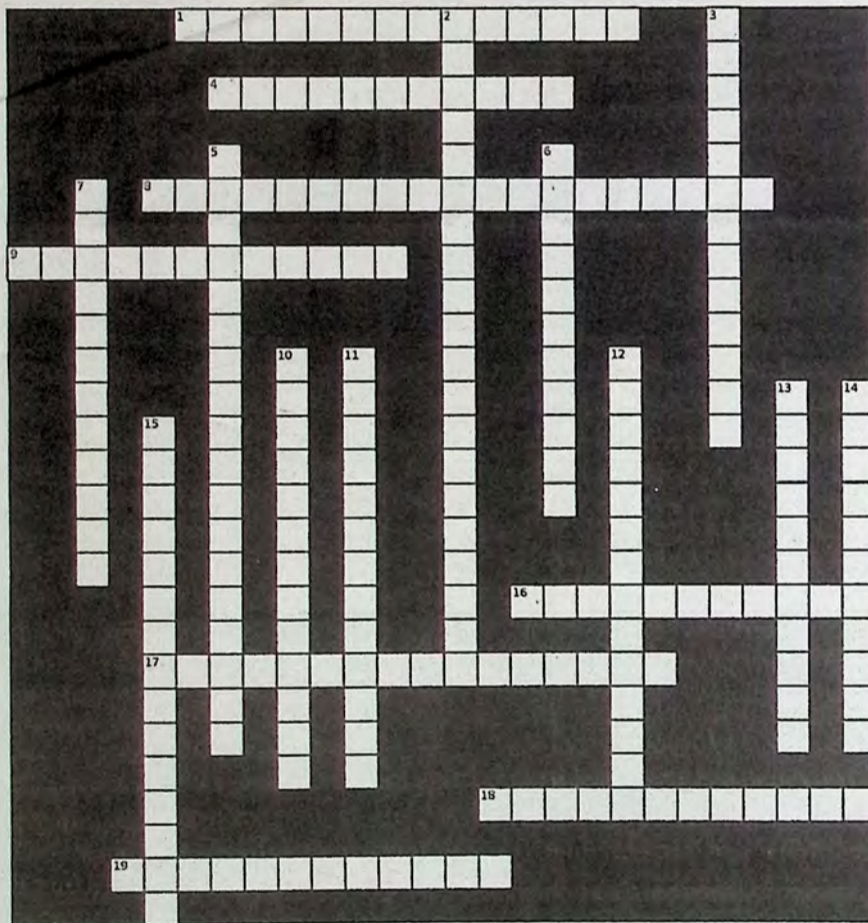
Jane Kempston attended the June 12 Board of Education meeting to provide trustees with the results of an audit of student support services. During the audit, files were reviewed of each student requiring assistance and support.

The audit group looked at the kind of assistance planned for each student and assessed whether the student had received the services in the plan.

Kempston told trustees it was a very useful exercise for teachers' understanding of students' needs. She said it had been both a successful four days and a humbling experience as the group discovered how good plans can be made but in some cases the plans are not necessarily recalled or implemented fully. It gave teachers renewed incentive to match the plan with the work done with the individual student.

duced teacher Raeleen Campana, who explained how some students need extra individual assistance. She then introduced several students who explained to the Board how they had learned better reading skills.

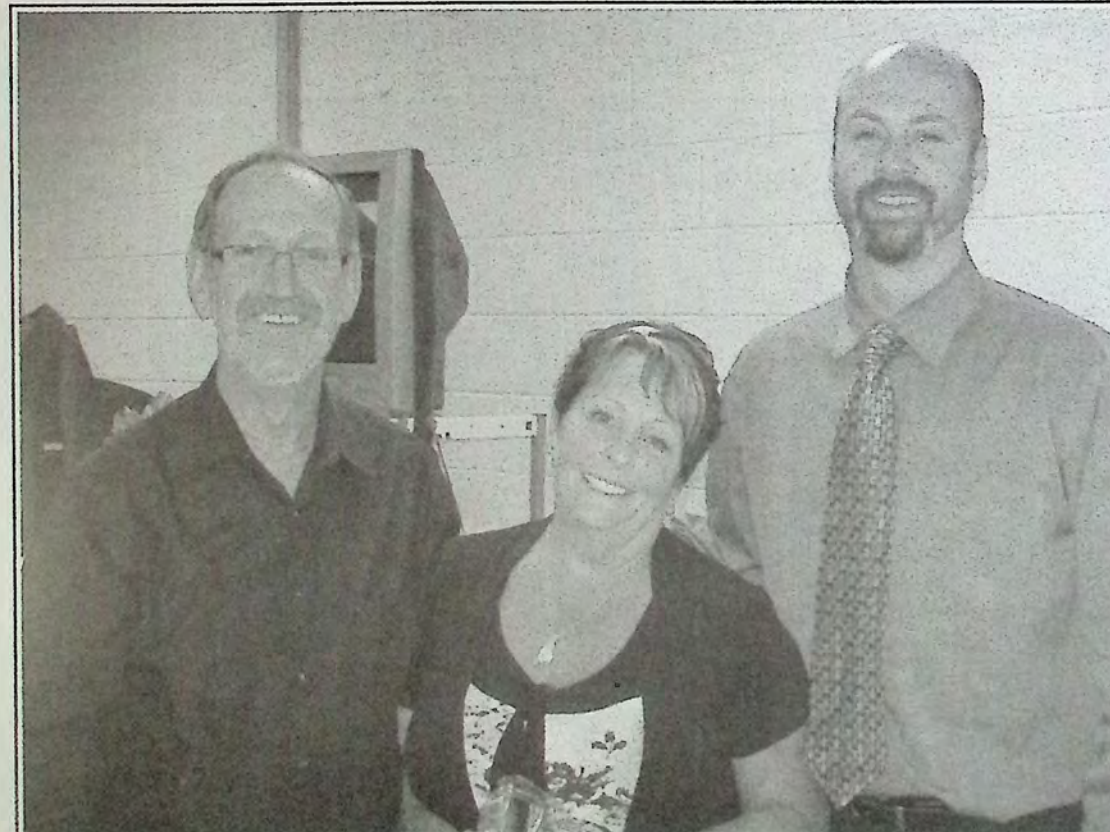
As each student presented his or her experience, their success was applauded.
