Fair plans move ahead

There will be many vendors at this year's Princeton Agricultural Fair on August 24 & 25. One inquiry has come from as far away as Alberta. Country fairs give home based businesses an opportunity to show off their wares and provide fair visitors a chance to see some unique items. Some vendors will be selling food items such as popcorn, cotton candy and pop.

This year, the fair includes the Little Britches Rodeo semi-finals. There may also be jackpot barrel racing and team roping on the Friday evening before the fair. This is in the planning stage and will depend on how many wish to par-

tipate. The Fun Zone for youngsters this year is valued at approximately \$5,000 and includes laser tag, bouncy inflatables, a crafts corner for drop-in fun courtesy of Shirley's Arts and Crafts, and the children's favourite entertainer Mat Duffus. The children's Fun Zone is free for children thanks to the sponsorship of local businesses and the Town of Princeton.

Arts Council plans attacks

You might suddenly discover quilts strung on clotheslines in Veterans Square, or chalk art on a parking lot, or a group of artists sketching on a downtown corner. Then you will know you are experiencing an Art Attack.

There is a lot more than Art Attacks in Arts Council plans. Listen for music downtown at the gazebo in Veterans Square, a prelude to the Traditional Music Festival in mid-

August. The festival will begin with dancing in the street on the Friday evening. There are 120 performers expected this year, one of them from as far away as Samarkand, Uzbekistan. Look for a troupe of Morris dancers from Seattle. An acoustic stage will be set up at the library and an open stage at Golden Hills.

Summer is the time for hikes for Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists. There will be no meetings for this group until September.

Summer hikes are part of the program for Central Station. The chalet

at Nickelplate is open, and visitors may hike up the old donkey trail or drive up to the meadow and walk to the chalet. Brochures are available in Hedley or check at Colonial Inn for transportation or directions.

Princeton Museum features a toy show all summer and a raffle of an elaborate doll house filled with furniture.

The autumn plans begin with a "pie" dance at Riverside Centre. This is a benefit dance to raise money for the kitchen at Riverside Centre. Anyone wishing to help can contact Judy Short. Look for more information closer to September 21.

In October, the first of the concert series begins. If you love the music of The Beatles, you will not want to

miss this concert! The Fab Forever band is a tribute band performing Beatles' songs, but they add to the music with Beatles era costumes and props. The Arts Council has seen this group in action in Vancouver and booked them immediately.

On June 25th at the Princeton Posse Annual General Meeting, Dean Johnston stepped in as the new President with an entirely new board, dedicated to establishing the Posse as a cornerstone in the community.

The Board of Directors aren't the only fresh faces with the Posse. Bill Rotheisler, who was part of Team Pacific that won a bronze medal at the 2011 U17 World hockey Championship, is the new General Manager and Head Coach of the Princeton Posse.

Rotheisler spent last season coaching the Comox Valley Glacier Kings of the VIJHL.

Prior to his season with the VIJHL, Rotheisler spent five seasons between Pursuit of Excellence Hockey Academy and the Okanagan Hockey Academy.

During his three seasons with the Okanagan Hockey Academy and School, Rotheisler was an integral part of the management and operations as program director, coordinator, and writer for the International Development Tournament.

Rotheisler is the youngest coach to attend the biennial NCCP High Performance 2 seminar – the highest level coaching certification program in the country and has also attended as a presenter.

With the short amount of time that Rotheisler and his coaching staff had, they built a strong team that had their first playoff sweep in the franchise's history, won the North Island Division and competed at the Cyclone Taylor Cup. They changed the culture of the dressing room and built a team that the com-

munity bonded with.

"I am humbled and honoured that I will be a part of the Princeton Posse family: An organization that has always turned heads with our passionate fans and strong community bond. The first game that I ever coached in the KIJHL, on an interim basis, was in the Princeton & District Arena as a member of the Summerland Sting. I remember thinking to myself that this would be a great place to coach and call home one day."

Rotheisler is looking forward to working with the new Board of Directors and the community to continue to build the passion and excitement that Princeton has for their Posse.

Should Truth Be Told?

By now, you are well aware that your emails and wireless telephone conversations are being monitored. The sites you explore on your computer may be monitored. Spies monitor Facebook, too. In fact, there is a huge complex in Colorado in which trillions of electronic communications per minute are monitored. This has been going on since 9/11 under the guise of security. It is all part of the Patriot Act which introduced the average American citizen to Homeland Security. Spies must watch American citizens (and others) in case somebody is planning a terrorist act.

If you object to your lack of personal privacy, go back to snail mail.

The man who revealed this information to the Washington Post fled the USA in fear of being apprehended and thrown in jail. Like Assange and his WikiLeaks, Ed Snowden told American citizens, and the rest of the world, what the American government

did not want known. Telling the truth is really unpopular at times.

These whistleblowers fear for their personal safety not because of the truth they told, but because they defied authority. It is amazing how feudal our society is even in the 21st century. Those who have some kind of authority are not to be questioned nor exposed for wrongdoing. How dare a peasant expose a President? How dare a mere employee of the government question what the government is doing?

In the United States, every citizen is supposed to be a guardian of the constitution. Every citizen in a democracy is supposed to take responsibility to ensure democratic principles and the law of the land are not violated. Then, when a citizen with a conscience comes forward and tells what is going on, that citizen should be rewarded, no prosecuted.

However, those brave enough to have defied authority are the first to be persecuted, whether they tell the truth or merely question authority.

The key to understanding this strange turn of events is one factor: power. Those with power want to keep it, and if it means spying on everybody, then so be it. When authority is defied or questioned, power is at stake.

Remember Occupy Wall Street? Those who were involved in the protest were not doing anything illegal, not in a democracy.

They were expressing a truth, that there is a very unfair distribution of wealth, but their protest upset people in authority and a lot

of extra policemen were called in to keep an eye on the protesters. In a number of American cities, police attacked Occupy marchers, not because the marchers were doing anything to the police, but because the police represented the authorities being questioned. It is not called a police 'force' for nothing. Police are the 'force' of the authority, the force that ensures the power of the authority.

In a democratic society, law is supposed to be the authority. If you break the law, then you are to be apprehended and dealt with in a public courtroom. Even the people in power are not supposed to be above the law and should be apprehended when they break the law. The rule of law is one of the fundamental principles of democracy. Whenever that principle is not adhered to, our democracy is in danger. That is why whistleblowers tell us the truth and then run for their lives.

There are a lot of truths authorities would prefer not to have to deal with, because power does corrupt so many people who get power. We can just look at the Canadian senators who lied about their expenses, or the rich (wealth is power) Canadians who evade taxes the rest of us must pay or suffer the consequences.

In many ways, our society is better than the society that spawned the Inquisition. In case you have forgotten, what the Inquisition was, it was the persecution of anyone who defied or questioned the authority of the Holy Roman Church.

Although this happened 400 years ago, the same sort of thing goes on today. We have seen it in Syria, in Turkey recently, and in the United States. Even if you might be telling the truth, if it upsets the appercart of those in power, you had better be prepared to run for your life.

More than the behaviour of those in power, what upsets me most are the ordinary people who think it is wrong to question some sort of authority, whether it be scientific authority, a health authority, or the behaviour of a Prime Minister. In my view, power is to be respected only if it is fair and honestly exercised. To ensure we live in a just society, we must do a lot of critical thinking and dare to question the validity of what those in power have done.

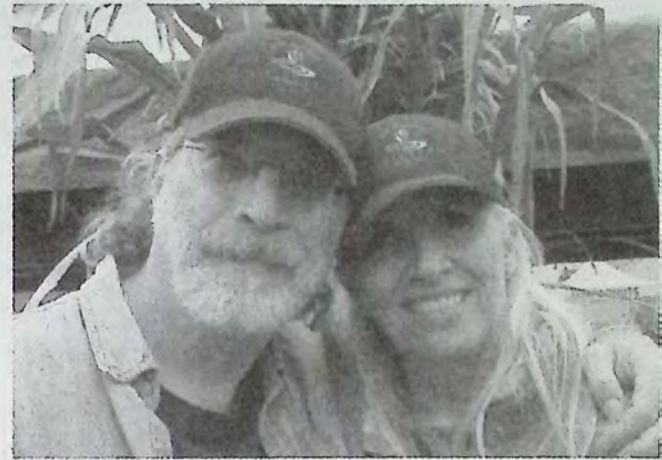

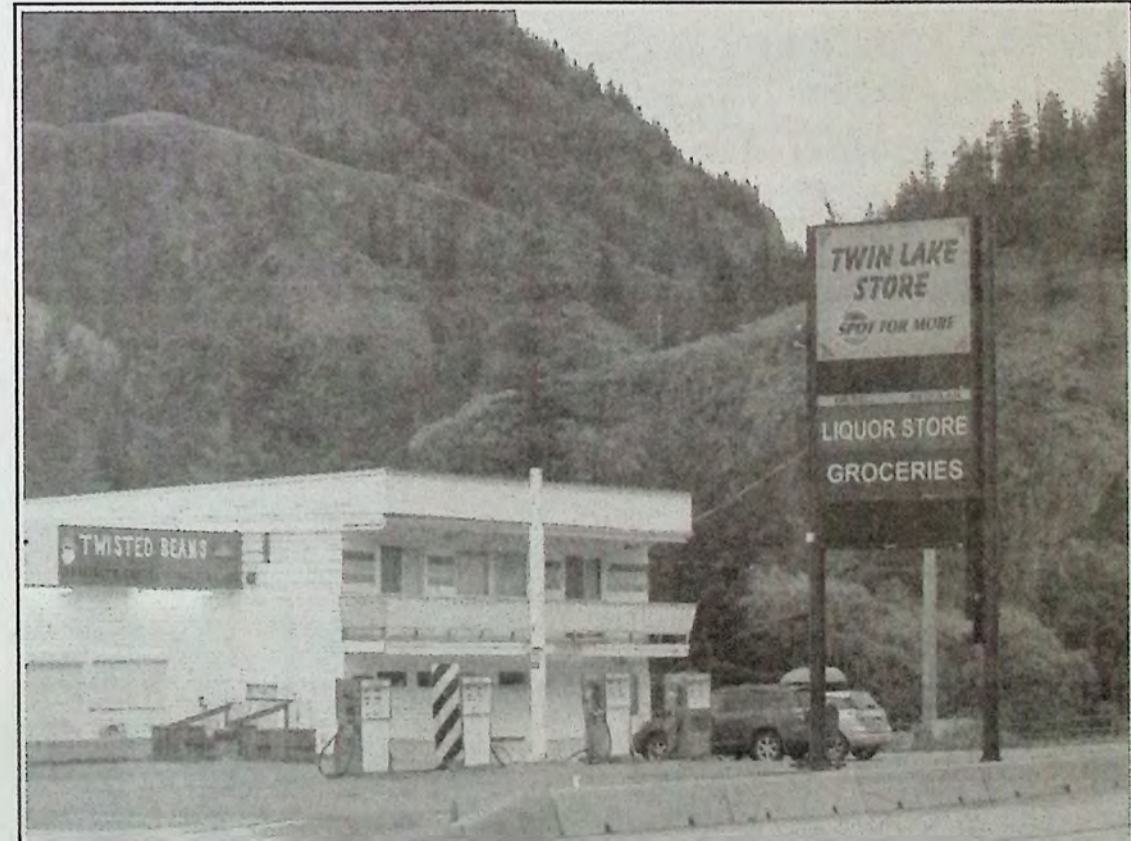

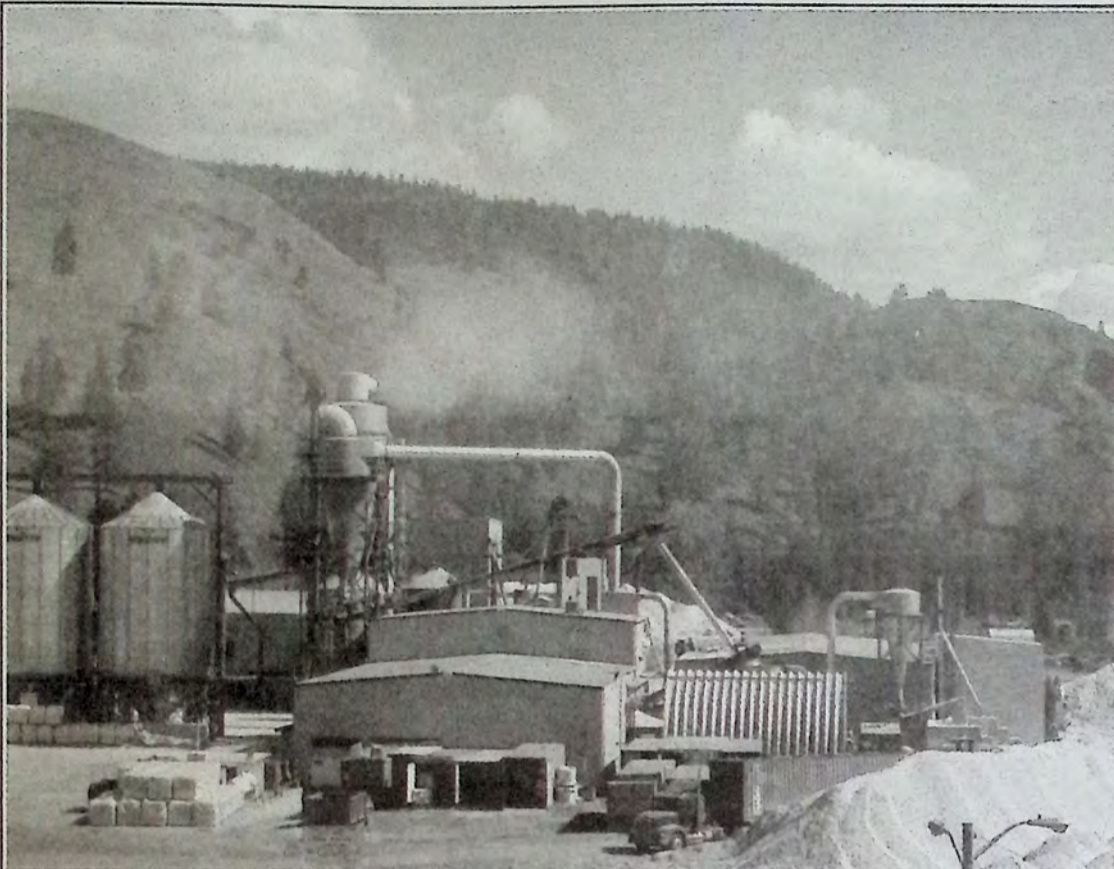

Earlier on in April, I had the pleasure of visiting Princeton Co-Generation along with RDOS Director, Brad Hope. I would like to thank Glenn Smith and others at the plant for making this interesting and informative visit possible.

Princeton Co-Generation, which was founded in 1994, owns and operates a 100,000 ton wood pellet mill and is the fourth largest employer in the town. It produces a much sought after carbon neutral green energy product.

The pellet mill supports thirty five (35) full time equivalent jobs (many at entry level) at the pellet plant, and supports a further seventy (70) full time equivalent jobs which transport feed stock – saw dust and shavings from BC interior saw mills to the pellet plant, and deliver finished goods – fuel pellets and animal bedding products throughout Canada, the West Coast of the USA, and to Vancouver port for export to Europe and Asia. The pellet mill contributes in excess of \$8 million per year to the local economy.

The pellet plant exports roughly 60% of its product, the majority of which is being utilized in Europe to offset emissions from coal fired power plants. South Korea is also emerging as a key market for 2013 and beyond.

The current owners purchased the pellet plant in 2006 for a consideration of \$5 million. They have subsequently invested a further \$4.5 million in plant upgrades to increase the pellet plant capacity from 60,000 to 100,000 tons per year, despite significant economic challenges for the pellet industry during the last 3 years, recent and partial

closure of BC interior saw mills, and the loss of export pricing advantage against the US\$.

BC provincial policies supporting climate change policy, renewable energy, and good use of forestry assets remain the key attraction for the ownership group, which would like to continue and expand operations at Princeton if possible.

There were however a number of economic challenges which arose in 2012, namely significant unplanned mandated expenditure on pellet plant upgrades and electrical equipment, as a consequence of provincial saw mill incidents. Despite these economic challenges, the owners of Princeton Co-Generation

remain very pro-active and have managed to meet the additional unplanned expenditures.

It is my hope that both the federal and provincial governments will be able to assist Princeton Co-Generation to continue its existing operation and potentially grow to meet an ever growing demand for its green energy products.

Princeton Co-Generation has been a trusted and pro-active business and employer in the area for 18 years and is at the forefront of addressing a wide variety of community issues, climate change, and environmental issues, and continues to support and make financial contributions to local groups with strong community ties.

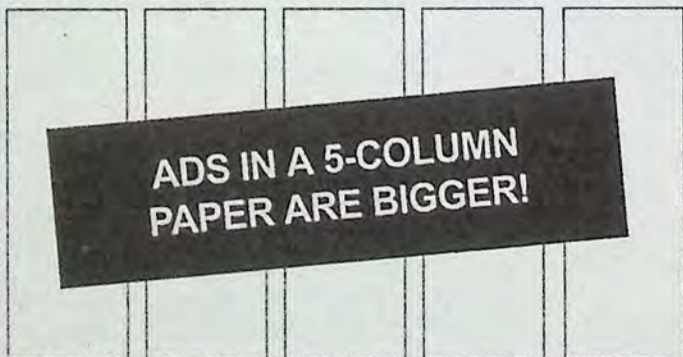

Living Past 100

You Can't Have Too Many Berries

This is the season for berries: strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, gooseberries, red currants, black currants, cranberries and all of the wild berries, from saskatoons to Oregon grape berries to huckleberries, elderberries and buckthorn berries. Unless you are allergic, all of them are good for you. All berries help reduce cholesterol.

All berries contain properties that fight virus infections. All of them are good as tonics for the circulatory system and the heart. All berries act as cleansing agents which are effective stimulants for the kidneys and bladder. Raspberries, blueberries and wild cranberries help defeat herpes simplex virus, which causes sties and cold sores.

Blackberries contain properties that correct bowel disorders. Blueberry leaves contain myrillin which reduces blood sugar the same way insulin does. A tea made from one teaspoon of dried blueberry leaves can act much the same as insulin. Cranberries are great for improving kidney function. All currants have strong antiseptic properties and can be used in the treatment of Candida yeast infection, some forms of cancer, whooping cough, multiple sclerosis and some skin diseases. Black currants are one of the richest sources of gamma linoleum acid (GLA), which makes them a good treatment for migraine, PMS, stronger immune system and considerably less blood cholesterol. (In days long past, black currant tarts were a favourite!)

Elderberries are free for the picking in September, when the clusters of berries have turned blue-black. Always cook elderberries and then juice them. Elderberry juice is expensive in shops, but you can make your own. This juice reduces inflammation, is a good treatment for burns, and is good for soothing a cough.

Buckthorn berries are similar to hawthorn berries, and have similar properties. These berries are found in the wild and are characterized by the long thorns on the branches. The berries should be cooked and then juiced. The juice is excellent for the heart and circulatory system.

Gooseberries are good for women, as this food helps the strength and health of the uterus. Raspberry leaves are great as tea for pregnant women to ensure an easy birth. In olden days, women swore that drinking one cup of raspberry leaf tea guaranteed and almost painless birth.

This summer, do not hesitate to buy or pick plenty of berries. The can be turned into jelly, jam, juice, canned fruit or frozen fruit. Be sure to eat berries year round if possible.

A lot of interest has come from within the community when word got out that the club was losing members and a number of residents put their names forward.

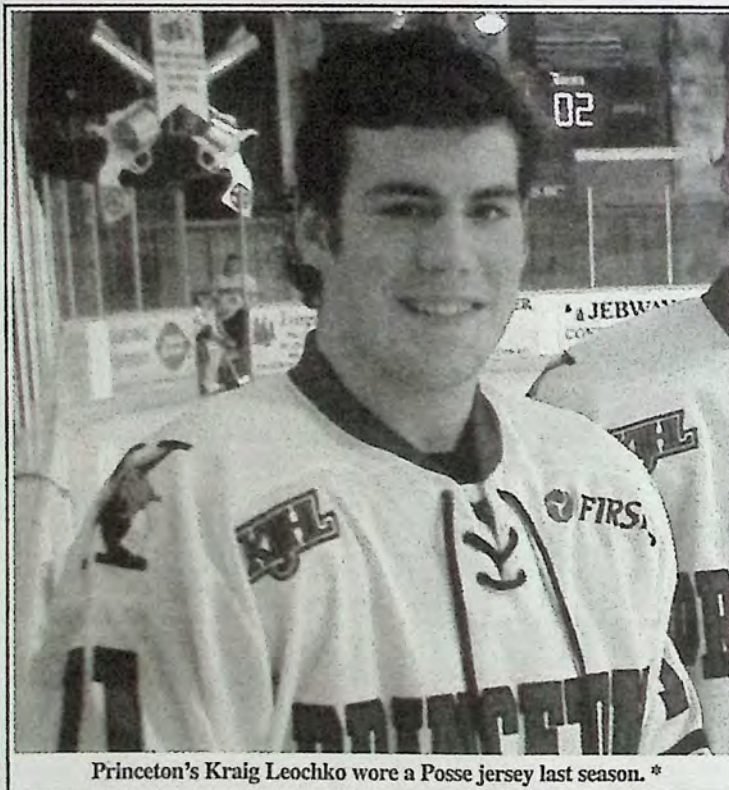
The 2013/14 Princeton Posse Board of Directors contains a total of 18 Directors.

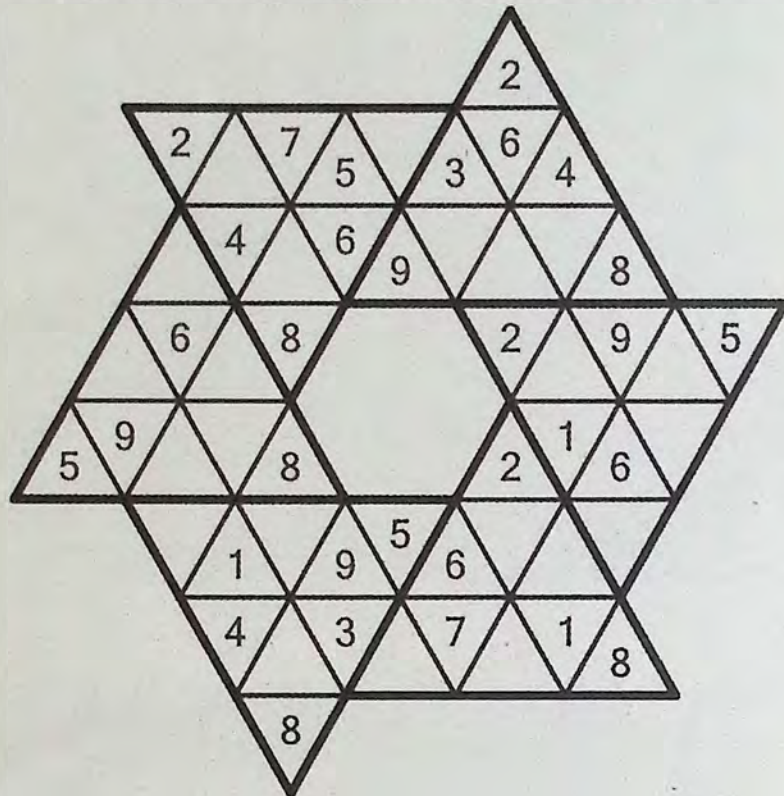

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

Mozzarellissima and Apple Stuffed Pork Chops

(NC)—Packed with juicy flavour, this cheesy recipe is perfect for summertime grilling. The balsamic reduction adds a refined touch, and can serve as an excellent garnish for a variety of dishes such as salads, meats, fish, fruit salad or even ice cream. More great recipes can be found online at www.saputoalacarte.ca.

Servings: 4 to 6 / Preparation: 20 minutes / Cooking: 10 to 15 minutes

Ingredients:

Balsamic Reduction:

- 2 cups (500 mL) balsamic vinegar
- 6 tsp (30 mL) honey

Stuffing:

- 12 oz (340 g) Mozzarellissima cheese, grated
- 3 green or red apples, grated
- juice of half an orange
- 2 to 3 green onions, finely chopped
- 2 to 3 sprigs fresh thyme, stems removed
- olive oil, to taste
- salt and pepper, to taste
- 6 pork chops, butterfly cut

Directions:

1. Soak toothpicks in water for ten minutes, to prevent them from burning when cooking the pork.
2. In a small saucepan on medium-high heat, reduce the balsamic vinegar and honey for 15 minutes, until it is a syrupy texture and the liquid has reduced to approximately 1/2 cup. Set aside.
3. In a bowl, combine cheese, apples, orange juice, onions and thyme. Add a drizzle of olive oil and a pinch of salt and mix well.
4. Season the pork chops with salt and pepper to taste. Place 2 to 3 tbsp (30 to 45 mL) of stuffing on each pork chop and close with toothpicks.
5. Cook on grill over medium heat for 5 to 7 minutes on each side. Serve with a skewer of mixed grilled vegetables drizzled with balsamic reduction.

Tip: The balsamic reduction can easily be prepared ahead of time and kept in the fridge for up to a week. It will harden when chilled, but a few seconds in the microwave will restore its original texture.

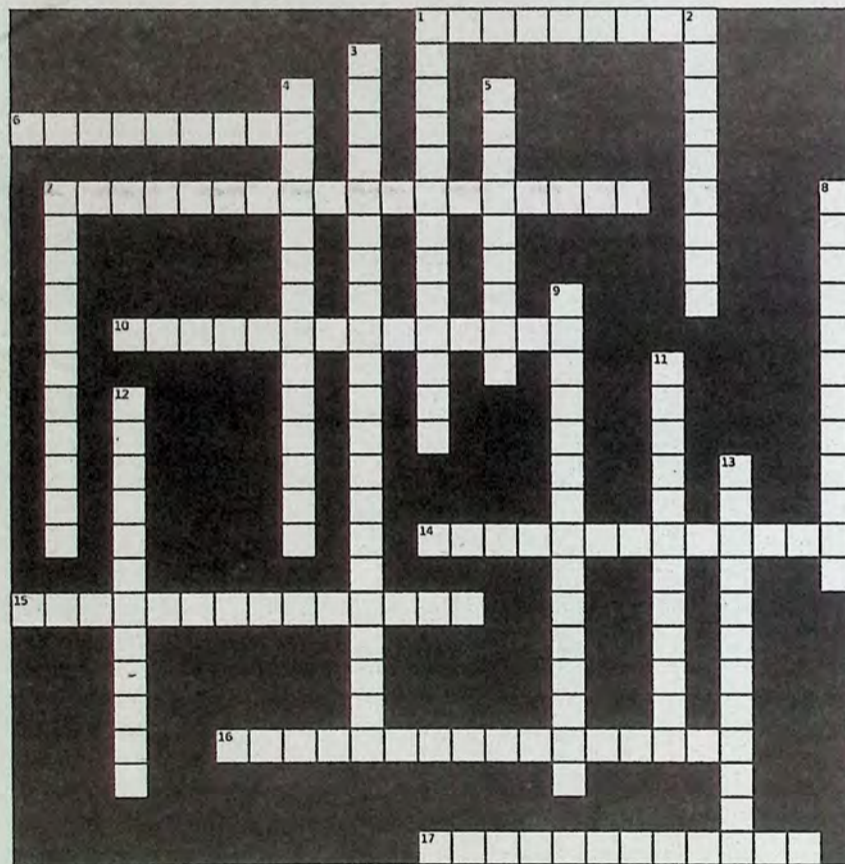
