

Break Causes accident

On July 11th at approximately 10:00 AM a fully loaded logging truck was turning north onto Bridge Street from Highway 3 when the suspension broke.

"This caused the trailer to swing wide going up onto the sidewalk," states Princeton RCMP Cpl. Mike Gallagher.

The trailer collided with a tree,

light post, pickup truck and semi before coming to a stop."

There were no injuries, however there was an extensive amount of property damage.

RCMP say a Commercial Vehicle Safety and Enforcement Officer attended the scene to examine the semi truck and trailer. The incident continues to be under investigation.

CMMC provides Q2 operational update

The Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) (the "Company" or "Copper Mountain") announced July 11th production results for the second quarter of 2013 from the Copper Mountain mine located in southern British Columbia.

Mill improvements were achieved during the quarter, in spite of the mill transformer loss time incident in mid May. The mine exited the quarter on a positive note with June's mill availability of 92.3% and copper production of 6.1 million pounds for the month. The mine produced 15.7 million pounds of copper, 5,600 ounces of gold, and 71,000 ounces of silver during the three months of operations ended June 30, 2013.

For the second quarter ended June 30, 2013 the mine shipped 28,200 wmt of concentrate containing approximately 14.7 million pounds of copper, 5,500 ounces of gold, and 66,000 ounces of silver generating an estimated \$53.3 million in gross

revenue

Mill throughput improved slightly over the first quarter of 2013, averaging 31,275 tpod. Further improvements with high energy blasting and contract crushing ahead of the SAG mill are expected to be reflected in the third quarter.

The mill processed a total 2.5 million tonnes of ore at an average grade of 0.33 % copper during the quarter as compared to 2.2 for the three months ended March 2013. Mill recoveries for the second quarter were 87.3% as compared to 82.7% for the first quarter of 2013.

Mining activities continued from the Pit 2 and Pit 3 areas on plan and

averaged approximately 171,000 tonnes per day mined. During the quarter a total of 15.6 million tonnes of material was mined, including 4.4 million tonnes of ore and 10.4 million tonnes of waste. The projected life of mine strip ratio is 2 to 1 but higher in the early years.

About Copper Mountain Mining Corporation

Copper Mountain's flagship asset is the 75% owned Copper Mountain mine located in southern British Columbia near the town of Princeton. The Company has a strategic alliance with Mitsubishi Materials Corporation who owns the remaining 25%. The Copper

Mountain mine commenced production in the summer of 2011, and has continued to improve its operations during the year; and attained design capacity in the summer of 2012.

The 18,000 acre site has a resource of approximately 5 billion pounds of copper and remains open laterally and at depth. The mine has significant exploration potential that will need to be explored over the next few years to fully appreciate the properties full development potential.







The Princeton team has grown quickly the last few years generat-


ing a lot of enthusiasm and excitement around the pool.

Paramedic training program comes to rural BC

Aspiring paramedics in British Columbia's rural communities will get the training they need thanks to \$250,000 in new annual government funding for a new Primary Care Paramedic program, Advanced Education Minister Amrik Virk announced July 11th.

"Our Skills and Training Plan aims to ensure that British Columbians have the right mix of skills, in the right places, at the right time," said Virk.

"This new \$250,000 demonstrates that we're actively addressing student demand for paramedic programs in rural B.C. and are focused on meeting the labour demands of all sectors for these essential skills."

The new program, due to start in February 2014, will be delivered by the Justice Institute of British

Columbia (JIBC). It will provide training for a total of 30 students, organized as two intakes of 15 students in two rural communities each year. It will help to meet current student demand for paramedic training and address the growing demand for paramedics in public and private organizations in rural areas such as the BC Ambulance Service and the oil and gas industries.

The initial communities to benefit from the training will be Prince George and Cranbrook.

"This new rural paramedic training program will help ensure that we are meeting the growing demand for services while supporting the health of families in rural areas of the province," said Minister of Health Terry Lake.

"We welcome this announce-

ment," said Dr. Michel Tarko, president of the Justice Institute of British Columbia.

"Ongoing funding gives JIBC, in partnership with BC Ambulance Service, the ability to plan further ahead to meet the needs of rural and remote communities and to ensure that residents are aware of opportunities to pursue paramedic training without leaving their communities."

The Ministry of Advanced Education currently funds training for 200 Primary Care Paramedic student spaces each year, mainly in urban areas, with rural training programs being run on a one-time basis as required. The commitment to annual funding for the new rural program will allow JIBC to plan and develop programming to meet the needs of industry and open up training to a wider catchment area.

"Better-trained paramedics means higher quality emergency medical care for patients and communities throughout British Columbia," said Michael MacDougall, president, BC Emergency Health Services.

"Providing training closer to home supports our targeted recruitment efforts underway in many rural and remote areas of the province and helps many paramedics reach their career goals."

Can Music Make You Smarter?

What is music? It is sound, of course, but more than that, it is sound organized into patterns. We could say the same of speaking, which is sound organized into patterns, but music is something more. Music inspires emotion and triggers memory. So does speech, but not to the same extent. Music seems to touch the deepest sensation of personal involvement with what is heard. We can forget a stirring speech or, after a long time, forget the words of an argument, but when we hear a particular piece of music, it will bring back not only a feeling, but a memory of where we were when the music first touched us, who we were with, and what we were doing. Music has a power of

When I hear Roy Orbison's rendition of "Pretty Woman", I remember a sunny afternoon in July in Ontario in 1964. I recall the people I was with, what we were doing, even what I was wearing. My experience is not unique. All of us have had this kind of experience with music.

Neurological science has been studying what goes on in the human brain when music is heard. We tend to think of music as coming to us all in one piece, like when we eat a piece of pie, but what goes on in our brains is much more complex. What goes into our ears is vibration. What our brain does with that vibration is amazing. The vibrations are individual bits of sound, but the brain organizes the sound, discovers patterns in the sound, then touches an emotional trigger. This happens in a split second.

The more complex the music is, the more emotion is felt, and the more pleasure, excitement or fear we feel from that music. This reaction is due to the involvement of more than one area of the brain.

The lower vibrations, such as in a bass drum, go to the old part of the brain. Imagine sitting and listening to nothing but a drum beat, which is low vibration sound. A simple pattern can start our feet tapping or make us want to dance. Add a melody to the drum beat, and another part of the brain responds, and we may want to hum along or sing. Add some higher vibration sound, such as in cymbals and bells, or high tones, and a further part of the brain is involved. Weave the sounds of an entire band or orchestra into the melody, and suddenly there is a lot of brain activity from four parts of the brain.

What I have just described is the listening part. All of this can happen if you are just sitting in a chair and listening to a CD. If you go to a live concert, another part of the brain becomes involved - you are not only hearing the music, you are seeing it and your ear is picking up more subtle vibrations not generally heard on a CD. If the orchestra is really big and the acoustics are really good, you can feel the vibrations on your skin.

If you are dancing to the music, or singing it, your physical body is interpreting the sounds and turning them into rhythmic action (organized action), involving much more of the brain.

If you are a member of the orchestra, you will be hearing, seeing complex notes on a sheet of paper, watching the conductor, and taking action, that is, using your body to play an instrument. This is a highly complex involvement of the brain

The addition of physical movement - playing an instrument, singing and/or dancing - involves a great deal of the brain, but heightens the pleasure of the music. It would seem the brain enjoys this complex activity and the result for us is the sense of pleasure.

Unless a person is deaf, music is pleasurable.

The brain is comprised of one hundred billion cells called neurons. These neurons do not work only as individual cells, they are connected to other cells and those connections between the cells are what enable us to enjoy the complex nature of music on its own. At the same time, other connections are triggered, such as the connections to forming memories, creating emotions and stimulating the

motor nerves in the muscles. In a study done in Maine about 20 years ago, scientists discovered that elderly patients exposed for two weeks to music popular in their youth began to become younger at the body cell level. They were more alert, blood pressure went down, and they became more physically active, as if every cell in their bodies had a memory of youth and the music led the way to a rejuvenation of the cells.

Can music make you smarter? Studies have been done that show there might be an improvement in learning or an improvement in brain function, but the studies are not conclusive. However, considering the number of brain cells involved in musical experience, there is no doubt music stimulates many areas of the brain, which has the potential to improve brain function.

In less industrialized societies, making music, dancing and singing are almost everyday events, and even the youngest children learn songs and dances even if they are too young to learn to play an instrument. If music involves so many areas of the brain, and is so much a part of who we are, then I suspect all of us should be teaching our children to sing, dance and play music, just because it is good brain exercise.


These days, when music is so readily available through electronic means, how often do people join together in song? What about dancing? What about learning to play a musical instrument? Are we losing one of the great pleasures in life by merely listening instead of being fully involved?

One of the things I like about living in Princeton is the number of people who give their time and talent to put on concerts. Live music involves more of the brain than canned music. I see more people becoming involved in making music. We used to have community singing groups, but most choir singing goes on in schools and churches these days, except for the Christmas songfest. Fewer people go dancing these days than when I was young.

The Traditional Music Festival is coming in August. This year, make a point of attending just for the purpose of give your brain some exercise and remembering the pleasure you will get from a brain exercising to music.



Recent comments by Minister Bill Bennett in the provincial media about the future of the Columbia River Treaty have raised serious red-flags for the Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA). Amongst other things, Minister Bennett suggested the Treaty should continue into the future, essentially in the same form it has been to date, stating that "the treaty has been a huge success."

The Columbia River Treaty has had devastating effects on Aboriginal Title and Rights, including throughout the Arrow Lakes area which is vitally important to the ONA. These include flooding of traditional lands and village sites, massive interference with cultural heritage resources and severe impacts on hunting,

fishing and gathering rights. The Treaty was signed and ratified in 1963 with no First Nations engagement, involvement, or consent.

"The Treaty has disrupted our way of life in ways that very few other things have. When the Province came to us last year to discuss potential renewal of the Treaty we made it clear how serious any decisions about the Treaty are and that the highest levels of engagement with us must occur," said Grand Chief Stewart Phillip of the Okanagan Nation Alliance.

"While we have been trying to follow a general path for discussions with the Province and Canada, the statements of Minister Bennett, as well as indications we are getting from others, suggest that the Crown is moving to minimize our involvement and concerns and push ahead with its own status quo agenda," he

Some years ago Minister Bennett clearly understood some of the depths and complexities of the Treaty. As he stated in 2003, "So 2,300 people were displaced and 60,000 hectares of high-value valley bottom land were flooded. Numerous First Nations archeological and burial sites were submerged or buried."

That reality has not changed.

"The Crown should not have comfort that they are going to be able to push ahead with their agenda for the future of the Treaty without substantially addressing in concrete ways the relationship between First Nations and the Treaty," said Grand Chief Phillip.

"I encourage Minister Bennett to recognize that the future course of the Treaty - whether termination, renewal, or amendment - must be set with us," he added.

The ONA was formed in 1981 as the inaugural First Nations government in the Okanagan which represents the 8 member communities; Okanagan Indian Band, Upper Nicola Band, Westbank First Nation, Penticton Indian Band, Osoyoos Indian Band, Lower Similkameen Indian Band, Upper Similkameen Indian Band and the Colville Confederated Tribes on issues of common concern. Each community is represented by their Chief or Chair through the ONA Chiefs Executive Council (CEC).



TV Ads Give Us A Pain

Advertising on television can have powerful effects, partially because they are repeated time and again from channel to channel. Advertisers know repetition has an effect. Repeated often enough, the message becomes part of the brain.

Watching a TV commercial requires critical thinking, which is why some parents will allow their children to watch only PBS kids' shows. They do not want their children programmed to eat certain cereals and drink certain soft drinks or demand certain foods which may not be good for them. Parents know their children are not likely to be critical of what they see and hear on television commercials.

We adults are in danger, too, of being programmed to want certain things because we see them in television commercials. Advertisements are deliberately formulated to make us want that new car, the new fridge or furniture, the latest CD or DVD, or any number of things we may not need. What happens when people are bombarded daily with a desire to have these things but cannot afford them?

Some people are lured into debts they cannot afford. The new computer gismo may be obsolete by the time it is paid for. The new furniture may be shabby before it is paid for. The new car may need repairs before it is paid for. What happens to people's emotions when debts pile up?

We know the result is often frustration and depression. These can be avoided by using critical thinking. We need to be mentally and emotionally healthy to live a good long life. We cannot base our mental, emotional and physical health on stress brought on because we are too poor to buy the new things, or because we bought them on credit. Basing one's happiness on 'things' never works. Happiness comes from good relationships and having a good relationship with one's own self is the key relationship to nurture.

Perhaps the most distressing advertisement is one from the government. It tells us that most of us will spend the last 10 years of our lives in illness. This is supposed to encourage us to eat properly and exercise frequently, but this advertisement could have quite the opposite effect because it is so negative. It is also very authoritative, making us believe that whatever illnesses we suffer in our elder years are our own fault. We need to be critical of this advertising as we would with any other advertising. If you develop cancer in your later years, is it your fault? If you develop arthritis, will it be your own fault? If you are diagnosed with Alzheimer's, did you bring it on yourself? Of course you didn't but you would still be ill.

Part of growing old is having health problems. Part of preparing for old age is eating right and keeping physically active, but research into aging has shown us that the top indicator of a long, healthy life is the right attitude, a positive attitude toward life.





HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinous - must contain every number not more than once.



PUBLIC NOTICE

RECALL AND INITIATIVE ACT

This notice is published pursuant to section 4 of the *Recall and Initiative Act*.

Approval in principle has been granted on an application for an initiative petition. The petition will be issued to proponent Dana Larsen on Monday, September 9, 2013 and signature sheets must be submitted to the Chief Electoral Officer by Monday, December 9, 2013.

The Title of the Initiative is:

An initiative to amend the Police Act.

Summary of Initiative:

The initiative draft Bill entitled, "Sensible Policing Act" proposes to amend the Police Act to no longer use provincial police resources on the enforcement of current laws in relation to simple possession and use of cannabis by adults. The draft law would prohibit the use of provincial police resources for this purpose, would require police to report in detail to the Minister of Justice any actual use of resources for this purpose. and why it was necessary, and require the Minister to publish that report. The Bill also proposes that the province would call upon the Federal Government to repeal the federal prohibition on cannabis, or give British Columbia an exemption, such that British Columbia is able to tax and regulate cannabis similar to the regulation of alcohol and tobacco. As well it proposes that British Columbia shall establish a Provincial Commission to study the means and requirements necessary for the province to establish a legal and regulated model for the production and use of cannabis by adults. Last, the Bill would make non-lawful possession and use of cannabis by minors an offence similar to possession and use of alcohol.

Opponent Registration:

Individuals or organizations who intend to incur expenses as opponents must apply for registration with the Chief Electoral Officer by Monday, August 12, 2013. Registration applications for opponents are available from Elections BC.

Initiative Advertising:

Individuals or organizations who sponsor initiative advertising, other than the proponent and registered opponents, must register with the Chief Electoral Officer before they conduct or publish initiative advertising. Registration applications are available from Elections BC.

Who May Sign the Petition:

Registered voters as of Monday, September 9, 2013 may sign the initiative petition. Individuals may only sign the petition once, and must sign the petition sheet for the electoral district in which they are registered at the time of signing. Signed petitions are available for public inspection.



Garlic Chicken with Veggie Stir Fry

(NC) – This recipe is quite versatile as you can spice-it-up with extra chili sauce or make it a little more exotic by adding curry spices to the noodle dish. The world is your oyster. The chicken's garlic seasonings lend themselves well to whatever part of the culinary world you'd like to visit – in under an hour.

Preparation time: 10 minutes / Cooking time: 50 minutes / Ingredients (Serves 4)

- 4 chicken breasts
- 1 Tbsp canola oil
- 1 x pack Maggi So Juicy Garlic
- 12 button mushrooms, sliced
- 1 small head of broccoli, cut into florets
- 1 small onion, sliced thinly
- 1 carrot, sliced thinly
- 450g package of egg noodles
- 1 Tbsp sesame oil (optional)
- 1 lime, juiced
- 2 green onions, finely sliced
- 2 tsp sesame seeds (optional)

Method

- Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C) or 320°F (160°C) for convection oven and cook the chicken according to the pack instructions.
- Put a large pot of water on the stove for the egg noodles and allow it to come to a rolling boil.
- About 15 minutes before the end of the chicken cooking time, heat the canola oil in a large frying pan or wok and stir fry the mushrooms until golden. Add the broccoli, onion, and carrot, and continue to cook for about 5 minutes, over high heat.
- Cook the egg noodles according to the pack instructions. Once cooked through, drain and set aside.
- Remove the chicken from the oven, leave to cool for a minute then cut the bag open and gently tip the contents into a dish. Transfer the chicken breasts to a board and slice diagonally. Pour garlic juices from the dish over the vegetables.
- Add the cooked noodles to the pan with the vegetables and toss to combine. Season with the sesame oil (if using)
 and lime juice. Serve the stir fry with the sliced chicken, scattered with green onion and sesame seeds (if using).





The Festival begins on the evening of Friday, August 16th with the opening ceremony followed by a country dance on Veterans' Way beside the Legion. The dance will feature a live band with fiddle, guitar and concertina. Everyone is welcome. There will be a caller to teach the dances so no experience is necessary and people don't even need to bring a partner. On Saturday and Sunday there will be music from 10:00 AM until 6:00

PM right in town.

The Blues is music created originally among the African-American communities of the Deep South at the end of the 19th century. It grew out of spirituals, work songs, field hollers, shouts and chants. During the early years of the 20th century

many African-Americans took to the road and became professional Blues musicians playing in bars and speakeasies. It is from these musicians that the Blues most people are familiar with comes. Big Bill Broonzy, Robert Johnson and Tampa Red are some of the legendary names whose music is still played today. The Festival is fortunate to have four Blues musicians who will get together onstage and share their music in The Blues Workshop.

The session will be hosted by Princeton's Jason Gasparetto who will act as "tour guide" while he and the other musicians in the workshop go on a trip through the Blues. Joining him onstage will be Henk Piket from New Westminster, Oroville Murphy – born and raised in Kentucky – and Barry Hall from Nanaimo.

Barry Hall will also be appearing in the "Five Banjoes" workshop. Barry has been involved in traditional music since he was a child. Inspired by Pete Seeger, he learned to play the banjo at a young age and at the age of fifteen put out the Folkways LP, "The Virtuoso Five-string Banjo", an album that is still revered among banjo players. Barry is still a virtuoso banjo player. He has also embraced the blues, which he sings and plays on guitar. Barry plays guitar as though it were an extension of his body. This weekend you will hear Barry sing folk blues and banjo instrumentals.

These are just some of the performers appearing at this year's Princeton Traditional Music Festival and the best thing about it is it's free!

The reason it's free is because it's run entirely by volunteers and the performers are donating their talents. To make the festival a success the organizers will need lots of volunteers.





Partnership Forms Between SOHC and UBC

UBC and Princeton residents team up to review care for chronically ill Teambuilding grant brings residents and researchers together

A partnership between UBC faculty and residents of Princeton might just be what the doctor ordered for that small, rural community.

Members of the Princeton Support Our Health Care Coalition (SOHC) will work with researchers from UBC's Okanagan campus to gain knowledge about how to improve care for people in Princeton who live with life-limiting chronic ill-

Princeton has struggled through its own health care crisis in the pasttoo few physicians, an aging population, and a hospital threatened by emergency room closures. Currently, the hospital emergency department is closed four nights each week and acute and specialist care services have been reduced, often resulting in people driving to Penticton or Kelowna for medical

UBC Assoc. Prof. Barb Pesut, Canada Research Chair in Health, Ethics, and Diversity, says the burden of having to travel for health care may mean that people choose not to attend a medical appointment, delay treatment, or re-locate away from their home community.

"The challenges facing rural communities such as Princeton are enormous. The solutions are going to be found in building strategic partnerships that support community

capacity," says Pesut.

"Princeton is fortunate to have so many concerned and active citizens."

Pesut notes that three significant issues have created the "perfect storm" within Princeton's health care system: an aging population with multiple chronic illness conditions, its rural location, and a province-wide physician shortage.

The SOHC is a grassroots group of citizens concerned about the state of healthcare in their community. Ed Staples, Regional District Area H Alternate Director and Vice-President of the SOHC, describes the care of those with chronic illness as a "mosaic approach" that can often leave people without enough support.

"People suffering from chronic illness are cared for on a variety of levels and by a variety of people, including family physicians, community volunteers, family members, and community service organizations," he says.

"This mosaic approach to care raises several questions: Are chronically ill residents receiving the care they need and deserve? Are they aware of all the services that are available to them?"

More concerning, he notes, is when one part of the mosaic is not available, such as a family member, there may not be anybody to fill in that gap. And what are the costs-financial, emotional, and physicalshouldered by these individuals?

A local committee, made up of residents and SOHC members, will work with UBC researchers while they try to answer questions surrounding available services for the chronically ill. Pesut describes the work as an exchange of knowledge. Princeton residents will help UBC researchers better understand the healthcare issues in their community. In exchange, the committee hopes to benefit from the expertise of UBC's researchers.

"It really is a good example of a teambuilding partnership and knowledge exchange," she says.

"We teach them, they teach us, and in the end we will be able to identify projects that might help the entire community of Princeton."

The first step is to complete a survey of available resources, complete a literature review of current rural health care models and resources designed to support people with life-limiting chronic illness, and determine relevant and accessible baseline data to track outcomes.

"It's possible that there are chronically ill members of our community who are not receiving the care they need, either because it's not readily available or they cannot afford to pay for it," says Staples.

The problem is that we don't have

a complete picture of the possible problem. That's why we need accurate information and research to find out what's going on in our community."

With Pesut's help, the SOHC applied for and received a \$5,000 teambuilding grant from the Rural Health Services Research Network of BC. By next June, Pesut is hoping they will have identified some priority research questions and received some targeted resources to begin to answer those questions.

"The Princeton area is certainly overdue for some good news on the health care front," says Staples.

"And this collaboration is an important part of our efforts to build a program that can support muchneeded health care improvements."




