RDOS approves LSIB plan

The final partner is in place for the development of a water plan for the Similkameen valley.

The Regional Board of the RDOS (Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen) voted August 1st to approve a work plan delivered by the Lower Similkameen Indian Band to provide consultative services and share unique cultural and

ecological data for the Similkameen River Watershed Plan.

The Board was following advice from steering committee members of the Similkameen Valley Planning Society, who unanimously recommended the Regional District approve the work plan and up to \$43,755 in fees.

Ministry bans campfires, open burning

Effective at noon on Thursday, August 1, all campfires were prohibited across the Kamloops Fire Centre.

This step was taken to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect public safety. The fire danger rating is currently "high" throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre, with scattered pockets of "extreme".

Princeton and the Similkameen Valley are within the Kamloops Fire Centre with the Upper Similkameen

in the Merritt Fire Zone and the Lower Similkameen in the Penticton Fire Zone.

With the current trend of warm and dry weather, wildfires in the region have displayed very aggressive behaviour and required additional fire suppression resources. Human-caused wildfires can divert critical resources and crews from responding to naturally occurring wildfires.

Open burning is prohibited throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre. This

prohibition applies to open fires of any size, fires with a burn registration number, industrial burning, fireworks, tiki torches, sky lanterns and burning barrels.

The prohibition does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to a portable campfire apparatus with a CSA or ULC rating that uses briquettes, liquid or gaseous fuel, as long as the height of the flame is less than 15 centimetres.

The open burning prohibition covers all BC Parks, Crown and private lands, but does not apply within the boundaries of local governments that have forest fire prevention bylaws and are serviced by a fire department.

You are advised to check with local governments for any other restrictions before lighting a fire.

Thunderstorms passed through the region only hours after the Campfire Ban went into effect which, according to Michaela Swan, Kamloops Fire Centre Communications Officer, started additional fires.

"Although the Kamloops Fire Centre did receive some precipitation, it was not enough to reduce the risk of wildfires. The majority of the

rain received will be dried from the forest by the afternoon. The campfire ban will remain in effect until significant and widespread precipitation is received across the region."

Anyone found in violation of an open fire ban, including campfires, may be issued a ticket for up to \$345. Anyone who causes a wildfire through arson or recklessness may be fined up to \$1 million, spend up

to three years in prison and be held accountable for associated firefighting costs.

This prohibition will remain in place until the public is notified that it has been rescinded.

RDOS plans Coalmont Community Centre

The RDOS (Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen) decided at their August 1st regular meeting to make an application to the Province to lease Crown Land with the intention of eventually constructing a community centre in Coalmont.

In other news, the Regional District's current auditor, White Kennedy Chartered Accountants, will continue to provide services through 2015 after the agency was selected from among three companies interested in providing auditing services.

The Board adopted an Emergency

Services Amendment Bylaw which allows fire services to legally respond outside their established service areas. The Amendment will also allow for fires to be reported and or investigated by a Duty Officer rather than the Fire Chief.

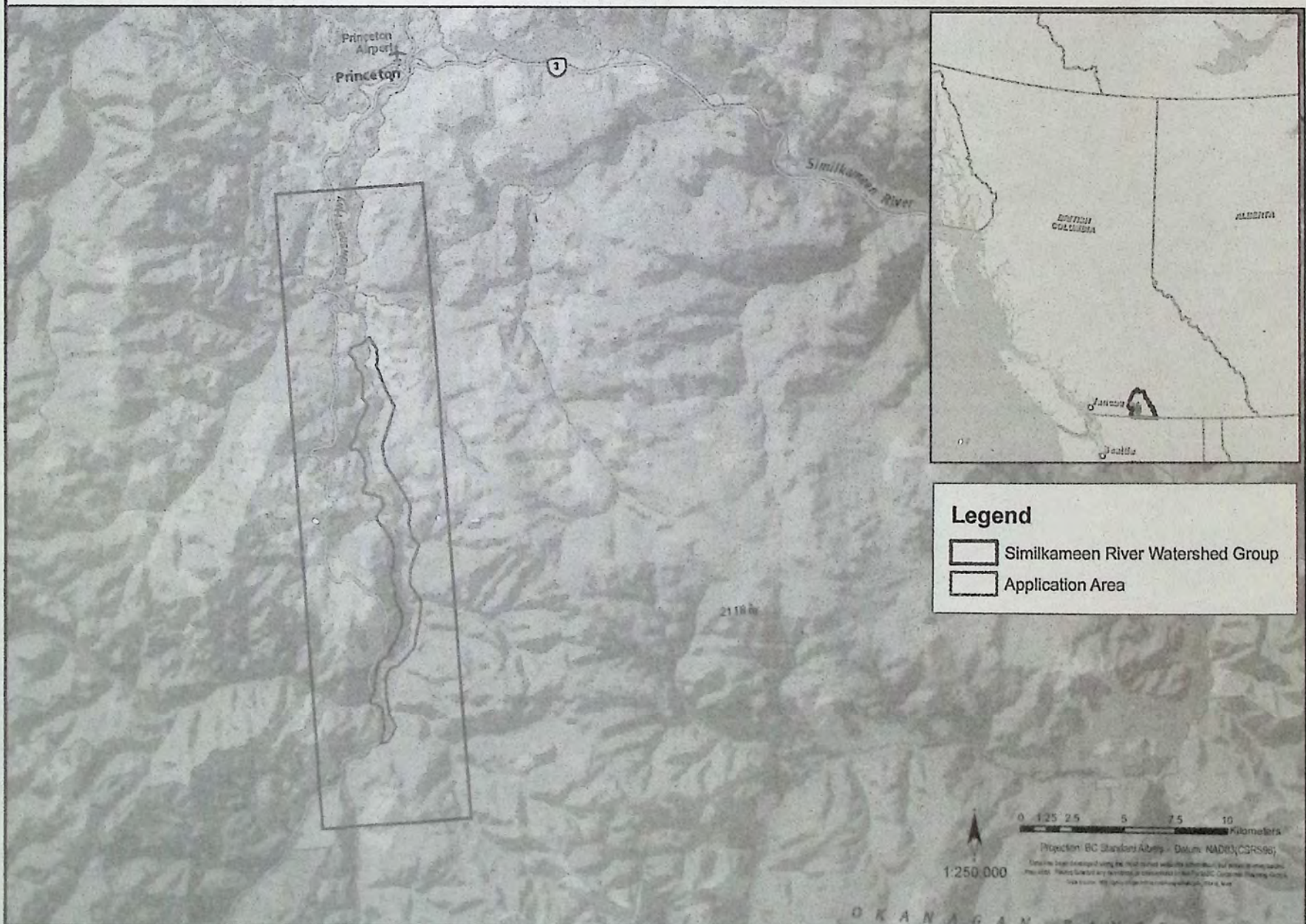

Flip Of The Coyne

There have been a few news stories that have really got me thinking about the justice system. I understand that the courts are not perfect and that judges are just people, but you really have to wonder what our system has come to when you see the myriad of stories that have been flooding the news lately.

The first story that got my attention was about a woman driver who ran over a person on a bicycle when she lost her attention for a moment. The woman got off because there was no criminal intent in her actions, yet she did take a person's life, and no matter if it was in malice or not, she was operating the vehicle that killed the victim. The next story was about a rancher who was protecting her livestock from a neighbour's dog that was attacking her cattle. The rancher shot the dog. She was then charged and found guilty of killing or injuring an animal under the Criminal Code. The Crown has called for a jail sentence for the rancher but the judge has indicated that he won't impose a jail sentence.

The last story that got my attention was of a sex offender who was released even though he is a high risk to reoffend. First off, how does a sex offender get released from jail if he is high risk or has a history of repeating his offence?

From these three examples what got me the most is that in one case, a person who killed another person while behind the wheel of a car gets no conviction while the rancher who shot a dog attacking her cattle has to face the possibility of a jail

sentence. Then in the last story, a high risk to reoffend sex offender, who has spent time in jail for not only sex offenses but breach of parole and threatening the life of a corrections officer, gets to walk the streets of the Okanagan again. Our system is dysfunctional at best.

Not that we should be looking south for solutions to our justice system, but sometimes you have to look at what they are doing and ask why we can't do that. For instance, that Ariel Castro who kidnapped, raped and tortured three women in Cleveland just got life plus one thousand years in jail for his heinous crimes. What would have happened here in Canada? Life minus time served times two with parole in five years. He would serve three years and be back in his community. No way. We should be watching how they sentence these guys in the US, because they are onto something. Life isn't long enough for some offences, so add another thousand years. This will ensure that the sicko won't get out of jail now or ever. I think we should be a little more realistic than one thousand years, but you get the idea. You kill someone in cold blood, meaning you planned it and carried it out, you never see the light of day again. You rape someone or kidnap them, same thing. No more of this fourteen years for murder and you are out in five on good behaviour.

Go to court sometime. You will see people who the judge knows because they are there so regularly. I have talked to law enforcement

personnel serving and retired who see high risk offenders re-offend time and time again, yet they get out on parole or time served. Why is it that we can let murders, rapists and others of that sort walk our streets freely, yet someone who is defending her livestock could see a heavier punishment than someone who ran another person over because they weren't paying attention or fell asleep at the wheel? None of it makes any sense to me.

Slipping From High To Extreme

The amount of rain that fell in the Similkameen Valley was barely a drop in the bucket according to BC Wildfire officials.

Regardless of how wet you got running from across the parking lot to your vehicle in downtown Princeton and how much water flowed down the streets it just wasn't enough.

But to many, that will be all they need to see in order to spark up a backyard campfire or set off some fireworks even with a campfire/open-burning ban in place.

I credit the constant bombardment of messages in various forms from the government teaching us to be careful with fire as helping to educate us. Especially when it's been hot and dry.

The problem is that many either don't see those messages, or just don't care.

The average number of BC wildfires in the past decade is 1,922 per year costing an annual average of \$160.9-million to bring under control.

The saddest fact is that over the past ten years an average of 40.4% of them were human-caused. In 2012, 43.1% were human-caused and 68.1% in 2011.

I'm a firm believer in teaching lessons in a way that gets your attention. One of the best ways to do that is through your wallet. Stiff fines and other penalties that take away some of the things we take for granted provide a great incentive to smarten up.

A fine example is drunk driving. It's far too risky to get caught and lose your licence on top of a hefty fine so you don't hear as much about it because partiers are getting smart. They keep their celebrations off the road, often opting for a house party with designated drivers in place.

The forest fire situation is a bit different although big fines have been in place in recent years. In fact, if you violate the campfire/open-burning ban you may be issued a fine up to \$345. If you ended up causing a wildfire you could be fined up to a million dollars and spend three years in jail. The key words are 'may' and 'could.'

The difference between drunk driving and wildfires is I don't remember hearing about too many appearances in Princeton Court due to campfire/open burning ban violations.

I think there needs to be more enforcement as there is with drunk driving. The CounterAttack program pretty much gets that message across. All we need now is a program of some kind that will amp up the education of being careful with fires and burning in the Summer.

The right program will in effect, spread the word...um, like wildfire.

A Telus cell tower in Hedley - Yes or No?

Some people in Hedley are opposed to a cell tower for two reasons:

1. Health risks
2. A cell mast will block the view of the Mascot Mine from the Hedley Heritage Museum

Both of these reasons are based on fear, not fact. The facts are:

1. The World Health Organization, The American Cancer Society, The Canadian Cancer Society, and Health Canada have all published fact sheets stating that there are NO health risks and NO cancer risks

from the low-level radio frequencies generated by cell phone towers.

2. The cell tower will NOT block the view from the Hedley Heritage Museum.

The cell phone tower will NOT inconvenience tourists and visitors to the Museum.

On the other hand, the majority of people in Hedley support a cell tower for various reasons:

1. Emergencies
A cell phone can mean the difference between life and death in emergencies or accidents when an injured or sick person is away from their house and their house tele-

phone. Having this security is important to elderly residents, people living alone, people with health problems, people who enjoy walking, hiking or biking, and even for people who enjoy being outside in their gardens. A sudden accident, fall, or health crisis can prevent the victim from reaching a landline telephone to call for help. Carrying a cell phone in a pocket can save a life.

2. Car Accidents
The same is true for car accidents. Being able to call for help after an accident can save precious minutes and can save lives.

3. Back-up
Landline telephone service can be disrupted. A falling tree, a forest fire, or a highway crash can interrupt telephone service. Having cellular phone service means having a back-up communications system for Hedley's fire department and first responders.

4. Convenience or necessity
A total of 74% of Canadians have a cell phone. Cell phones have come to be a necessity for many

Who Are The Stakeholders?

We hear the word "stakeholder" every so often, and I have become very concerned about any group called stakeholders. Let me give you some personal history about my experiences with stakeholders groups.

The first time I ever heard the term was in the 1980s. There was a stakeholders' meeting and I attended as a reporter. The meeting was about preserving the old trails through the Hozomeen Range of mountains west of Princeton. The plan was to enhance the trails for public use and to protect them from damage. The historic trails included the Brigade Trail and Blackeye's Trail. There were only two Princeton area people at the meeting. The Ministry of Forests was represented, so was Parks and so was Environment, as well as people from the Fraser Valley and Okanagan Valley who were interested in trails. I had no suspicions about the stated goal of the meeting. What I did not know was that the real goal, as carried out by the provincial government, was to extend the boundaries of Manning Park northward.

By the time the general public heard about the expansion, it was a done deal. The stakeholders had had meetings in which no reporters were present, and therefore the public did not know. Many members of the public objected, but it was too late.

The next time there was a stakeholders meeting to which I was invited, I went with a more alert, more questioning attitude. This second stakeholders meeting was about preserving "wild" rivers, and the Similkameen River was the topic. The Environment Ministry was represented, along with a few other people. Despite the fact that the Similkameen River is dammed near Oroville, and despite the fact this river is part of the Columbia Treaty, the plan was to declare the Similkameen River a wild river. To keep it "wild" and preserve its integrity, a number of regulations would go into effect, including one that would disallow any industrial,

commercial, agricultural or residential occupancy within 350 meters of the high water mark on both sides of the river. This would put an end to Eastgate, Princeton, part of Keremeos, along with hundreds of hectares of both residential and agricultural land along both sides of the river. My report on this plan raised a lot of objections and the wild river stakeholders went to other rivers.

The park expansion plan of 1994 created a huge reaction. Logging in the Princeton area would have been history if that plan had gone through. Some stakeholders group calling themselves Cascadia Something or Other had stakeholders from Washington and B.C. who decided there should be a Class A park extending along the south side of the Similkameen River to join a similar park plan in Washington State. The promotional materials on this plan were called Nature Has No Borders. This park was to provide a wildlife corridor so our wildlife could move freely from Washington to B.C. I had never heard of wildlife being restrained from doing so in the first place. The goal appeared to be to keep all but a select few humans out of the area, along with their cattle which traditionally use the rangeland, and the loggers. Protests became extreme over that one, and a logging truck invasion of Victoria drove the point home. That plan was dropped.

Probably the best, most honest, stakeholders meetings was held in Tulameen a few years ago. That meeting involved introduction of grizzly bears into the mountains around Tulameen. The most honest part of that meeting was that everyone in the Tulameen area was invited, and all of them were regarded as stakeholders, as they should have been, as all have a stake in the forests, rivers, lakes, recreation and agriculture of the area. The grizzly bear plan was never implemented.

The word 'stakeholder' is supposed to mean anyone having a stake in the outcome of any decisions made. In today's use of the word, it appears to mean some group with an idea to do something. This group finds sympathetic other people, and then this group of 'stakeholders' goes about making plans which may or may not affect all of us, but which will certainly affect all of us.

A recent example of a stakeholders group was the group presenting a plan called 'A Biodiversity Conservation Strategy for the South Okanagan-Similkameen. This group promoted the plan under the title Keeping Nature in Our Future. The plan they came up with was presented to Regional District and then to municipal councils and to the public. The public presentation

in Princeton was during the dinner hours and only four people showed up. This plan is still in the works, and outlines in great detail how land should be used and which areas should be conserved.

Another stakeholders group has been formed to deal with the future of health care in the Princeton area. I have not been able to find out much about what goes on at these stakeholder meetings, as they lack transparency.

My main objection to stakeholder groups is that they tend to act in secrecy, with little input from the public, then present a full-blown plan which they expect some branch of government to implement. The meeting in Tulameen regarding the grizzly bears was the kind of stakeholders meeting which offered total transparency. The subject of the meeting was advertised and the conduct of the meeting invited plenty of feedback. Those proposing the plan stated in their advertising 'here is what we want to do' and invited everyone to come and provide feedback.

My second objection to stakeholders groups is that too often they have government minions directing part of the action. You and I are paying the salaries of people who may not be working in our best interests as they put together these 'stakeholders' groups. Ultimately, you and I and every taxpayer is going to pay for the decision one way or another. Those taxes we pay are our stake in whatever plan is made, and we have a right to know well in advance what the plan is and how we will be affected before it goes to any government group for implementation. The selection of 10 or 12 people from the general public does not constitute a fair representation of all of the stakeholders. Furthermore, limiting input to the few who are selected is undemocratic. Finally, it is my opinion that any plan being initiated by those who are being paid my tax dollar is a case of the tail wagging the dog. I do not want to pay somebody to come up with any plan that could adversely affect my future.

In my view, from past experience, I have detected an attitude of superiority from members of these stakeholders groups, a kind of elitism that says "we know more about what ought to be done than any ordinary citizen". That is the kind of thinking that leads to a lot of undemocratic decisions.

Shark Finning - A Disgusting Practice

Recently I had a chance to see the documentary *Sharkwater* and watched how sharks are caught, their fins are cut off and they are thrown back into the water. This practice is repulsive, immoral and is largely driven by an underground market controlled by organized crime that exploits threatened and endangered species to maximize profits.

To combat this barbaric practice, Bill C-380, An Act to Amend the Fish Inspection Act and the Fisheries Act was introduced by my colleague, Fin Donnelly, MP for Burnaby-Coquitlam on December 11, 2011.

Some elected members have suggested that Bill C-380 (<http://openparliament.ca/bills/41-1/C-380/>) is unnecessary because Canada already has enough laws and that Canada bans the trade of shark products from species protected under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Flora and Fauna (CITES) or the Species at Risk Act.

According to the Canadian branch of Humane Society International, this is false. Both CITES and SARA only protect three species of shark: basking sharks, whale sharks and great white sharks. In other words, out of 141 threatened or near-threatened shark species only 3 are protected by Canadian federal laws.

Another myth we hear is that Canada bans or restricts the trade, possession or sale of shark products that present human health or safety concerns. This is also false. Shark fins, which continue to be legally imported into Canada contain high concentrations of a potent neurotoxin, BMAA, which scientists have linked to neurodegenerative dis-

eases in humans such as Alzheimer's and Lou Gehrig's disease. This is not unlike, for example, the link between phenylbutazone in horse meat and aplastic anemia in children.

The third myth states that working through regional fisheries management organizations to ensure strong global management and enforcement practices is the most effective way to prevent unsustainable shark fishing practices such as finning. This is also false. As long as there is a demand for shark fins, there will be local industry pressure on governments not to prohibit the practice. This demand will also perpetuate the poaching of sharks in the waters of countries that already prohibit finning.

Canada has already been identified, for example, by CSIS as a destination country for poached shark fins from Australia, even though some Australian states have some of the world's strongest shark finning laws. Eliminating the demand removes incentive for fishermen to continue finning and poaching sharks.

We had a chance in the House of Commons to take a major step to end this disgusting practice. However, during the vote on March 27, 2013, Bill C-30 was defeated 143 to 138, denying this bill being sent to Committee. As a result, this bill regrettably died in Second Reading.

It is my hope that C-380 was able to generate enough support across this country so that one day soon, we will have the necessary legislation to put an end to shark finning.

I would like to thank Fin Donnelly for all his efforts to bring this issue forward.

Watermelon: More Than Summer Fun

People in Canada tend to think of watermelon as one of those summer fruits we take on a picnic or serve at a large gathering. This is faulty thinking. While watermelons are fun, they are also topnotch healthy food and should be eaten frequently.

Among fruits, watermelon is one of the least contaminated by pesticides even if not listed as organic. More important, watermelons are an excellent source of valuable vitamins and minerals even though they are low calorie and zero fat.

Watermelons are an excellent source of Vitamin C, beta carotene, Vitamin B1 and Vitamin B6. B6 is essential in creating the enzymatic action that converts food to energy, so is a great dessert food. Watermelons also contain lycopene, a plant substance that protects against several types of cancer.

The mineral content of watermelons includes potassium and magnesium. Potassium protects both the heart and brain, as well as flushing excess calcium out of the kidneys, preventing kidney stones. Magnesium protects against sleep disorders by calming the nervous system, and also prevents muscle cramps.

Many people hesitate to buy watermelon because the melon is so big and they feel the fruit will not last after it is cut open. The fact is a watermelon can survive perfectly well for about a week in the refrigerator even after it has been cut open providing it is covered to prevent drying.

The sweetest part of a watermelon is the red part, but do not toss aside the white part. The white part just under the skin is loaded with nutrients that keep you healthy. In some locations, housewives pickle the white part. Others remove the skin and use the white as an ingredient in a fruit slushie.

Some people have a problem with properly slicing a watermelon. Here's how to do it neatly. Using a long knife, cut the melon end to end, then cut each half end to end. Now that it is quartered, cut across the width of the melon, first cutting off the ends. Then create neat slices across the width, making each slice no more than 2 cm. thick. This method makes the slices neat and easier to handle and eat.

The next time you see a watermelon, give it a smile, pick it up, cuddle it, and take it home to eat it. It is not only fun food, it is really healthy!

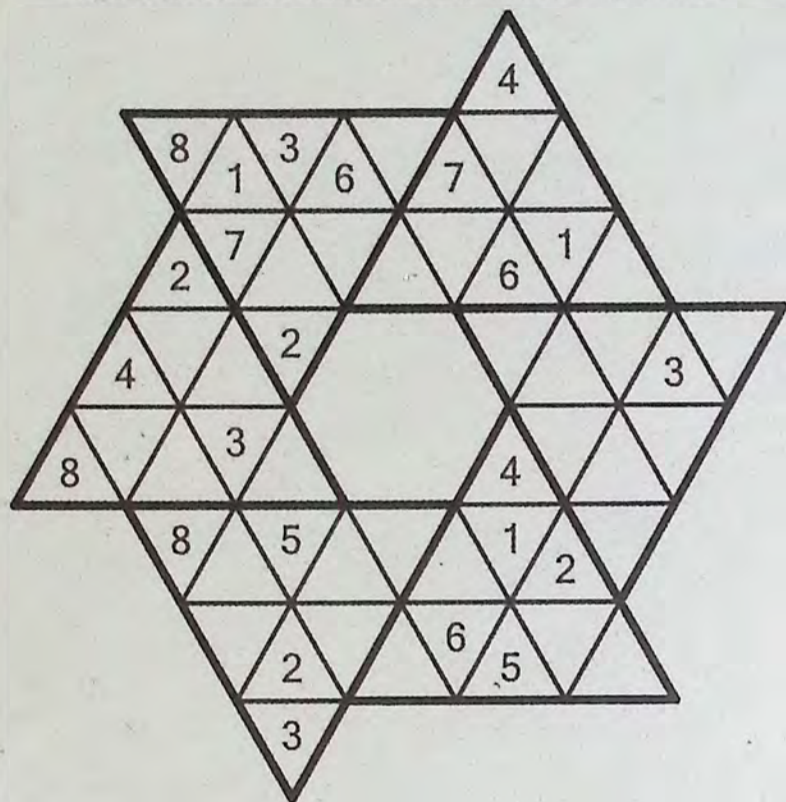

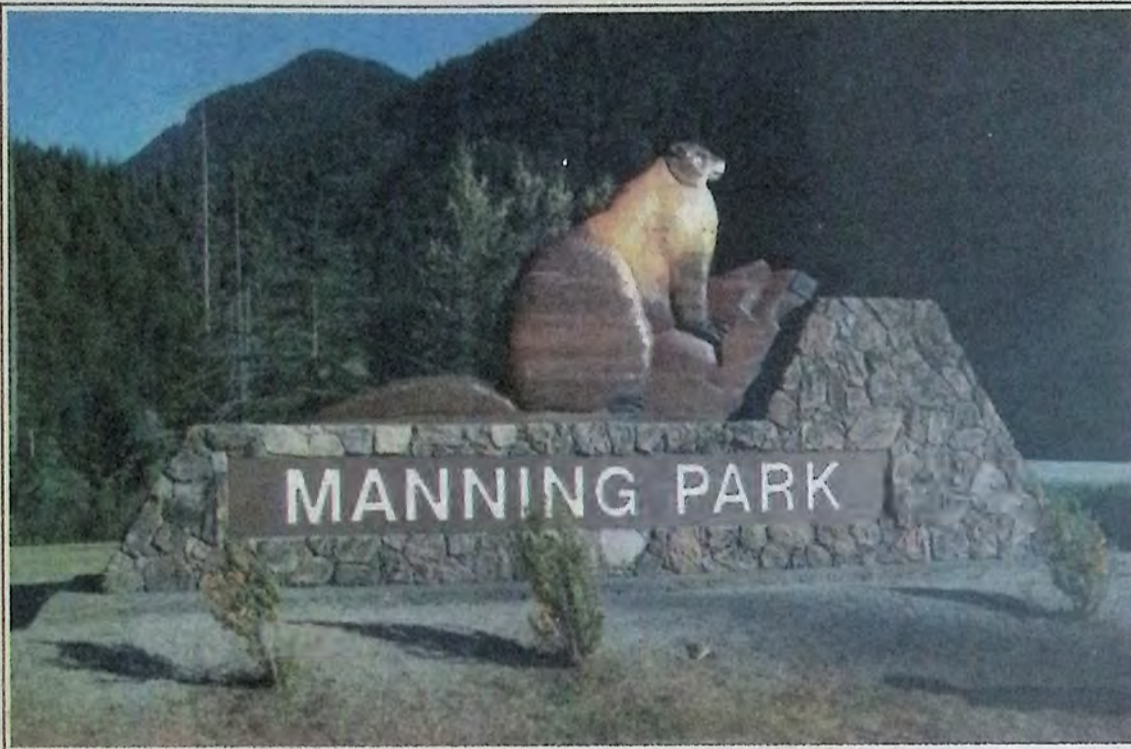

Rotini Salad with Zucchini, Shrimp & Scallops

(NC)—Add this recipe to your Mediterranean collection:

Prep Time: 15 minutes / Cook Time: 20 minutes

Ingredients

- 1 box Barilla rotini
- 4 tablespoons (50 ml) extra virgin olive oil
- 1/2 pound (227 grams) mussels, steamed
- 1 clove garlic
- 3 zucchini sliced in half moons
- To taste black pepper
- 1/2 pound (227 grams) scallops, diced
- 1/2 pound (227 grams) shrimp, halved lengthwise
- 4 tablespoons (50 ml) lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon (20 leaves) parsley, chopped
- To taste salt

Preparation

Bring a large pot of water to a boil, season the water with salt and cook pasta 1 minute less than the required cooking time. Drain and toss with 1 tablespoon olive oil and place on sheet tray to cool down. In a small pot, steam the mussels until they are opened, remove from shell and discard. Set aside. Meanwhile, in a skillet, sauté garlic in 1 tablespoon olive oil until lightly yellow in color. Add zucchini and sauté for 4 minutes, then season with salt and pepper to taste. In a separate skillet, sauté shrimp and scallops in 1 tablespoon olive oil until lightly golden in colour. Season and set aside to cool down. Once everything has cooled, combine all the seafood with the pasta and zucchini. Toss to combine and add the remaining olive oil, lemon juice and parsley.

country dance on Veterans' Way beside the Legion. The dance will feature a live band with fiddle, guitar and concertina. Everyone is welcome.

There will be a caller to teach the dances so no experience is necessary and people don't even need to bring a partner. On Saturday and Sunday there will be music from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM right in

town.

Among the many performers new to the Festival this year is a dance team from Seattle called Sound & Fury Morris and Sword. The group has been dancing around Seattle and the rest of the west coast of North America since the waning days of last century (1999 to be specific).

Morris is a type of traditional dance from England dating back hundred of years whose origins are lost in the mists of time. Historically Morris is danced only by men, but nowadays men and women often dance together.

Morris is a street performance tradition, typically seen outside local

pubs. When the dancing is over the dancers retire to the pub to enjoy the finest ales and ciders on tap! Morris Dance is a community-based activity. It is not a stage-oriented performance but a street performance tradition, with dancers showing up, often outside a pub, to dance close to their audience.

After the dancers complete their show, they will retire to the pub, where their grateful, adoring audience shows their appreciation for the performance with gifts of drink.

Another new group this year is Hard Row from Armstrong. The duo consists of Kim and Kaila Sinclair, a father and daughter duo who have been performing together

for almost twenty years. With their melodic sound, they sing traditional ballads of love, loss and lament. Kaila's soaring voice and Kim's unique guitar styling weave around and through the music they love. With reflection and a sense of humour Hard Row connects their music with the relevance of history and the world today.

These are just two of the many new groups appearing at this year's Festival, and the best thing about it is it's free!

The reason it's free is because it's run entirely by volunteers and the performers are donating their talents. To make the festival a success the organizers will need lots of volunteers.

Several Hedley residents have reported that family members (medical and technical personnel), whose

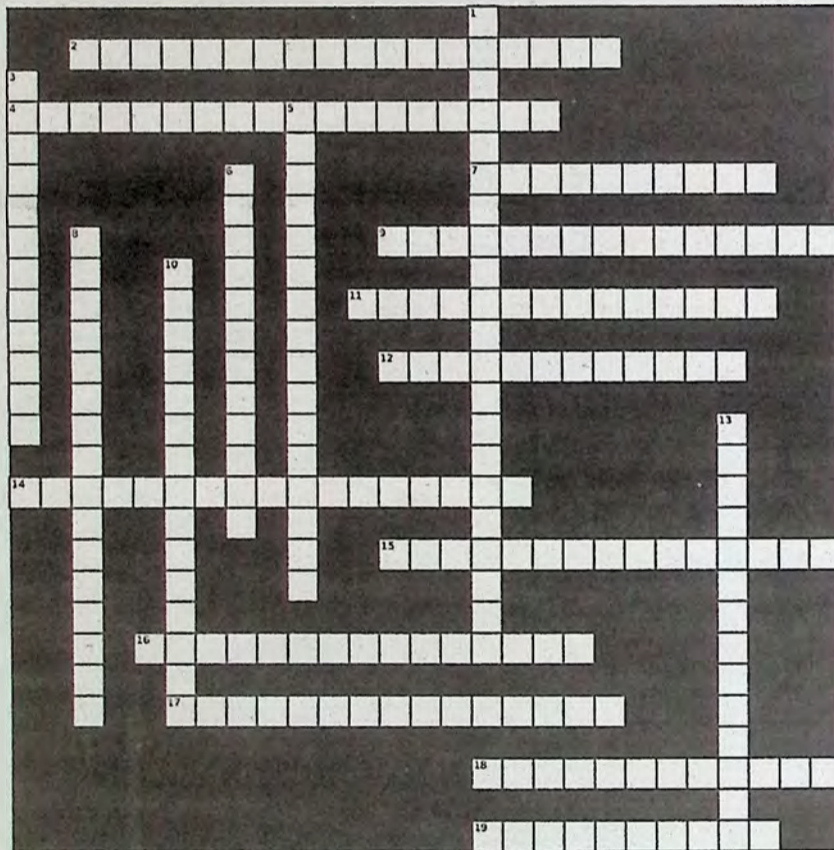
work requires that they be on call at all times cannot visit Hedley because they cannot receive cell phone calls here.

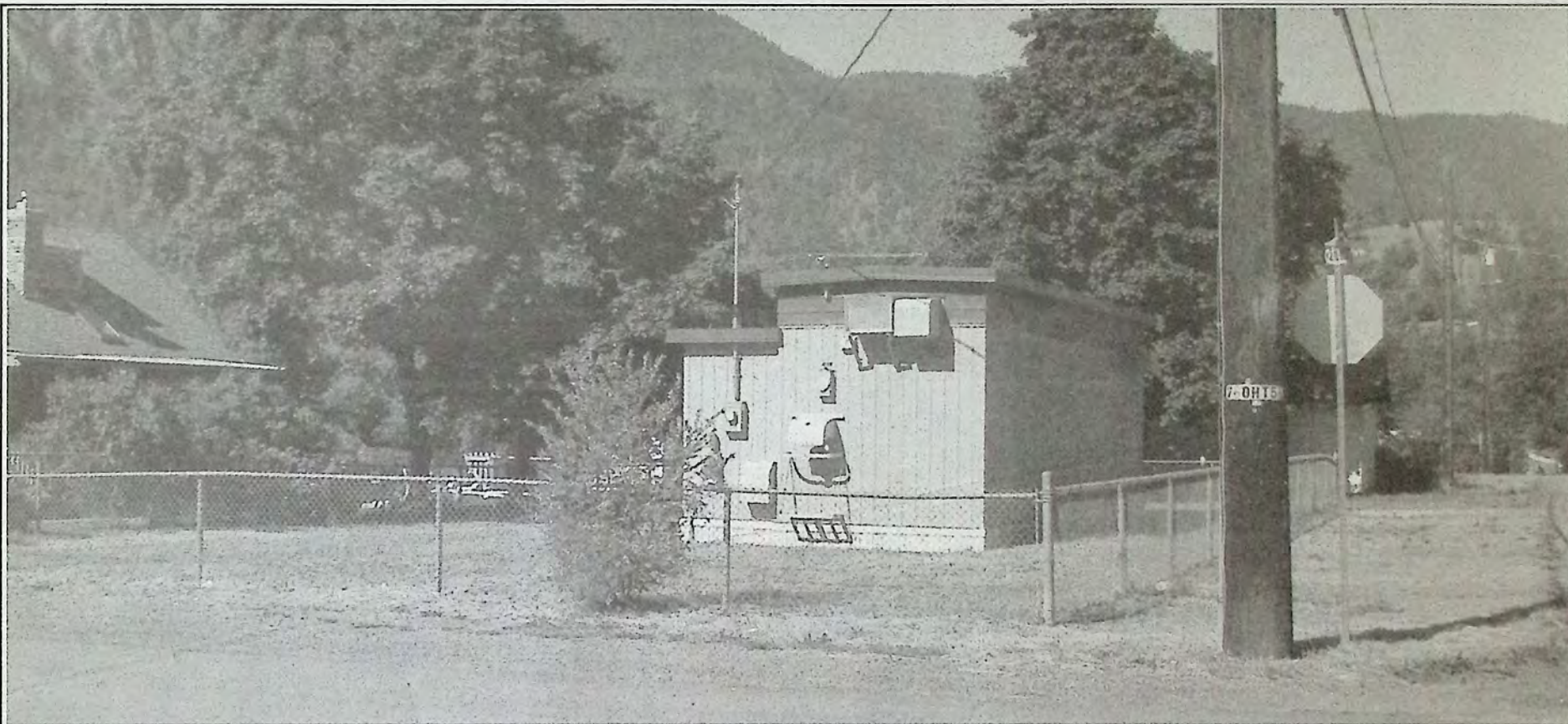

Polling scheduled for Hedley, August 10, 2013

On August 10, 2013 residents of the proposed service area that would receive cell service from a monopole erected at 796 Scott Avenue will be asked to weigh in with their opinion. The polls will be open from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM giving a full day for voters to get down to the Community Club, located at 956 Scott Avenue.

The question to be asked of residents is as follows:

Do you support a 20-meter monopole for cellular phone and data service at 796 Scott Avenue?

Yes or No

This poll is open to all residents of Hedley, including members of the Upper Similkameen Indian Band, who live within the boundaries of the poll area as described by the poll map, and who,

- Are Canadian citizens at least 18 years of age;
- Have lived in the polling area for at least 30 days and British Columbia for six months; or
- Are owners of property within the polling area who meet the require-

ments above but who live elsewhere in British Columbia.

The polling is not binding on the Regional District or any other party. The polling is offered to assist involved parties in better understanding the disposition of Hedley residents toward the construction of a monopole cellular tower within the community.

In other RDOS News

From the August 1st regular meeting of the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen:

Regional Directors want more time to consider a tri-party arrange-

ment to provide funding to maintain the Penticton Channel Trail. The trail is owned and operated by the Penticton Indian Band.

With the three-party agreement, the Regional District would contribute \$5,833 for the remainder of 2013 and \$14,000 annually each of the following five years to assist with maintenance and enhancement of the trail.

The Regional District, as part of its commitment to improving client and stakeholder experience, is working to develop the KVR Trail to link communities within the

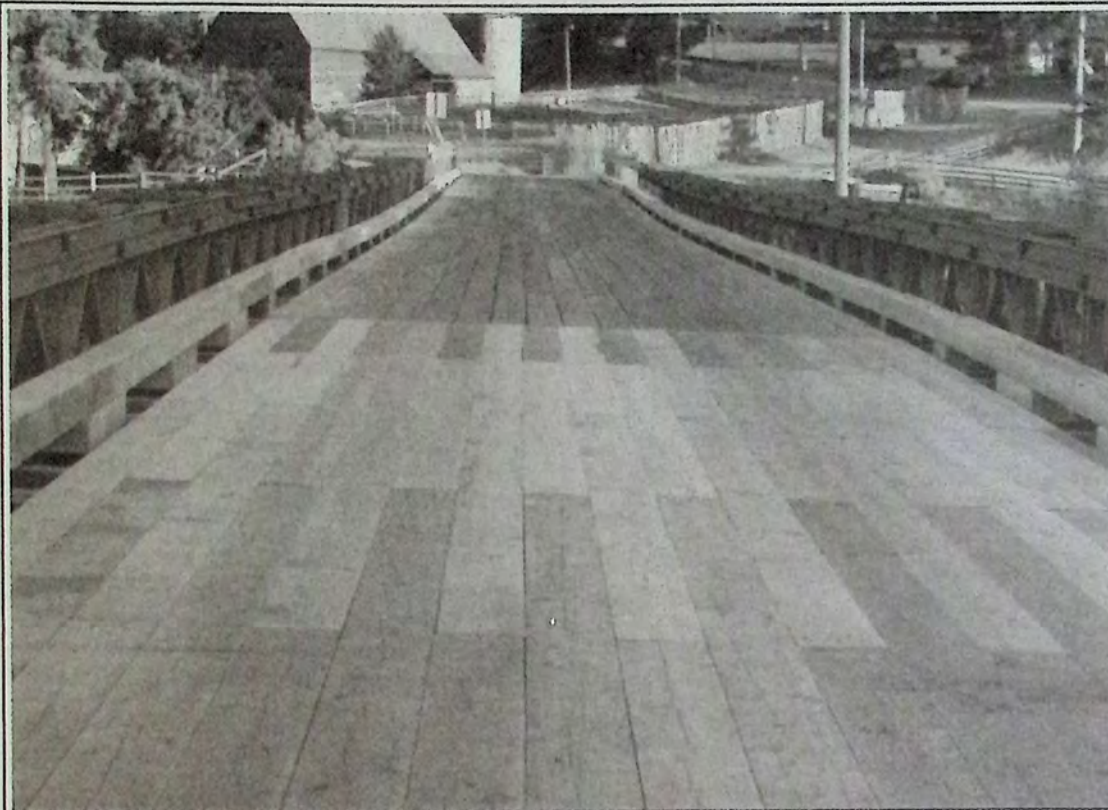
Okanagan and Similkameen valleys. The Penticton Channel Trail is part of this network.

Since 2009, the Penticton Indian Band has solely funded the maintenance of the trail between the dam at the north end of the channel and the parking lot at the south end.

The Regional Board approved an amendment to the Area 'D-2' Official Community Plan to include a provision regulating short-term vacation rentals. The amendment will make the OCP consistent with community plans in other Electoral Areas.

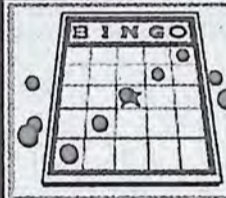
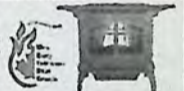
