## Similkameen residents support entrepreneur

Penticton's Dennis Walker has long been a fixture for Similkameen Valley residents. He will be best known to many in the region as the morning personality/newsman at CIGV-FM (Great Valleys Radio, and later known as Giant-FM).

A corporate take over of the company in April 2012 saw Walker and his coworkers jobless. Within weeks SoCountry.ca internet radio went on-air from Walker's kitchen and five months later a studio was built in space gifted to him by Penticton Soccer Club in their Sportsplex.

Walker credits many for his successful transition including support from friends in both Princeton and Keremeos.

This month SoCountry.ca internet radio has been nominated for the Premier's Choice Award of the Small Business British Columbia Awards program.

Sponsored by the Government of British Columbia, the Premier's People's Choice Award celebrates BC's entrepreneurs by recognizing a small business in the heart of a community.

"The new Premier's People's Choice Award is presented to a BC business that can demonstrate that they have the unwavering and loyal support of their community," states the Small Business BC website.

"This award is for a small business that their community thinks they go above and beyond."

The eligibility requirements are simple, a nominee must currently own a business in the province which employs less than fifty peo-

ple. "Dennis and I go back around thirty years," states Similkameen News Leader Owner/Publisher George Elliott.

"When he first started testing his internet radio station I got very interested in what he was doing and knew that partly based on his incredible reputation throughout the entire South Okanagan and Similkameen, and partly due to the circumstances revolving his loss of employment that he would be successful with his new venture."

Elliott and Walker are frequently in contact to this day and Elliott has assisted Walker on occasion with co-hosting duties or with information related to activities of interest in the Similkameen.

Voting for the Premier's People's Choice Award is taking place online and will end November 30th. There are a total of 65 nominees in the same category as SoCountry.ca internet radio.

## Council gives bylaw 3rd reading

Town of Princeton Bylaw No. 883, 2013 that will amend the Official Committee Plan Bylaw No. 808, 2008, moved one step closer to adoption at the November 4th regular meeting of Town Council.

A motion made by Council Doug Pateman and seconded by

Councillor Marilyn Harkness, gave the amendment to the bylaw third reading. It received first and second readings at the October 7th Town Council meeting.

The amendment resulted following a review of the new Zoning Bylaw (No. 880, 2013) land use map and when it was being com-

pared to the Official Community Plan land use map an error was noted.

The error, on the OCP map showed a portion of Town owned land near the landfill, more specifically the rifle range at 304 Laurie Currie Way, was in the wrong land use category.

The OCP map had it identified as being in the Country Residential (CR) category where it should have been in the Industrial (I) category.

A public hearing was held prior to the November 4th Town Council meeting which focused on the OCP Amendment and the Zoning Bylaw where a couple of presentations were made but did not adversely affect either of the bylaws.

The Zoning Bylaw basically replaces the Town of Princeton Zoning Bylaw No. 646, 1994 and

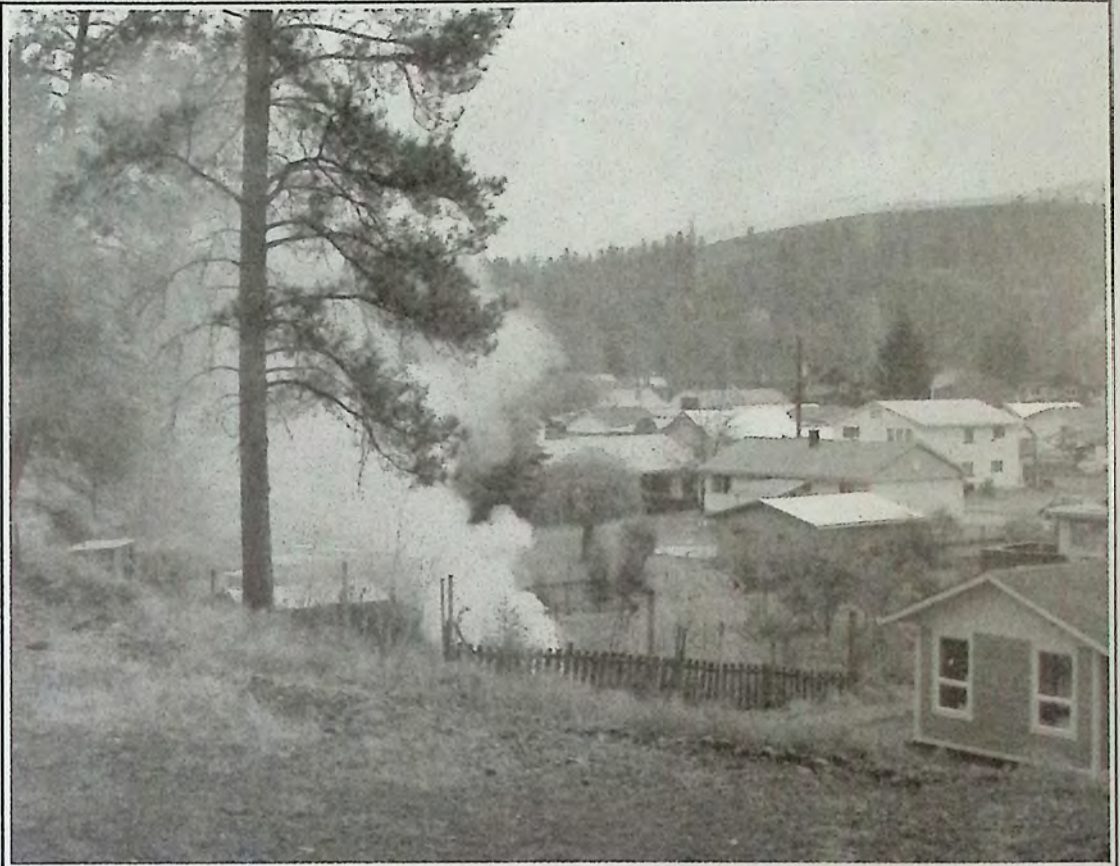

**Remember to burn smart**

The arrival of cooler weather announces the beginning of wood stove heating in our community. With access to a plentiful supply of wood and wood byproducts, it's no surprise that a large percentage of Princeton and area residents use wood and pellet stoves to heat their homes.

Princeton, like so many communities in the interior, is located in a narrow valley. This geographic location, combined with frequent temperature inversions, results in several days during the winter months where wood smoke and other air pollutants are trapped and accumulate into levels that are hazardous to our health.

According to the BC Air Quality website, "wood smoke is much like cigarette smoke, containing a mixture of tiny particles (called particulate matter, or PM) and gases. The smaller particulate matter, PM2.5 can be breathed into the deepest reaches of our lungs. They are associated with serious (sometimes fatal) breathing and heart disorders. Particulate matter also tends to pick up other hazardous pollutants, giving them a free ride into the lungs."

The BC Ministry of Environment has set clear air quality standards aimed at reducing air pollution and improving the health of the province's citizens.

They are working with industry to turn more wood waste into energy and encouraging companies to use the cleanest available technologies. In addition, they provide information to BC residents aimed at improve air quality.

Here are some things that we can all do to improve the air we breathe:

- Instead of burning your garden leftovers, use the leaves, clippings and branches to make compost or wood chips (mulch). Or you can take your garden materials to the landfill site where they will recycle it, free of charge.
- Don't burn your garbage or building materials (e.g. plastics, tires, garbage, painted wood, paper and cardboard). These can release very toxic substances when they are burned. Reduce your waste by .....

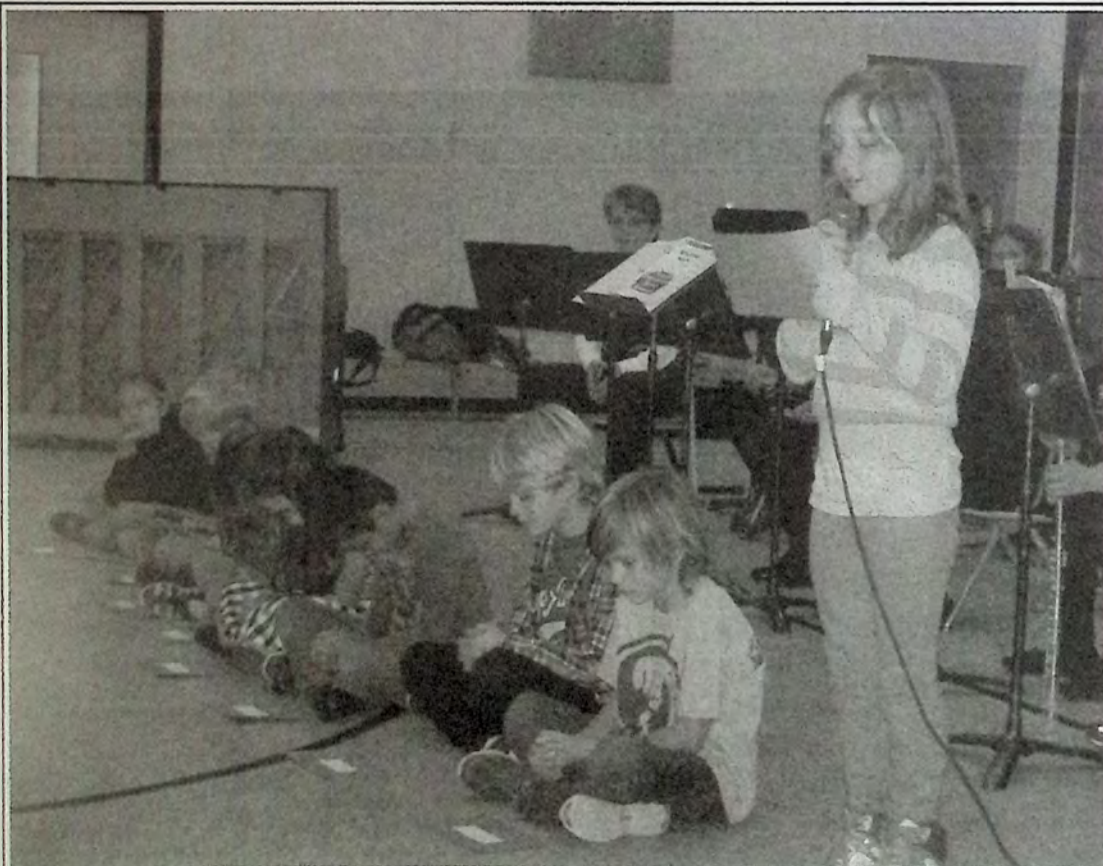
# Flip Of The Coyne

### Oh, Deer!

I don't mind the deer in town.

In fact, I am pretty used to seeing two different partial families in our yard.

Typically a doe and a fawn visit us daily.

Sometimes we see another doe and sometimes it's a buck and a fawn sleeping at the bottom of the steps outside our two decks.

We are so used to them, and they are so used to us, that somehow all of us have managed to get along in our yard.

For the record, we do not live on acreage on the outskirts of town.

We have two lots wrapped by a single fence. The entire size of our property measures roughly 100 feet by 100 feet, give or take a couple of feet due to the 'not exactly square' shape of the lots on our street. Oh, and we live in a part of town that is considered mostly industrial.

We've had deer in our yard as long as we've been in our house, which is over 15 years.

We have had hundreds of encounters with them, but have been wise enough not to confuse them as pets and respect their space and are at a point now where we can just walk past one within a few feet and not have a problem.

I'm always careful not to get between the doe and fawn and have not had an issue. Only once did I see a doe 'stamp' her feet at me, but once I was far enough away from her all was fine.

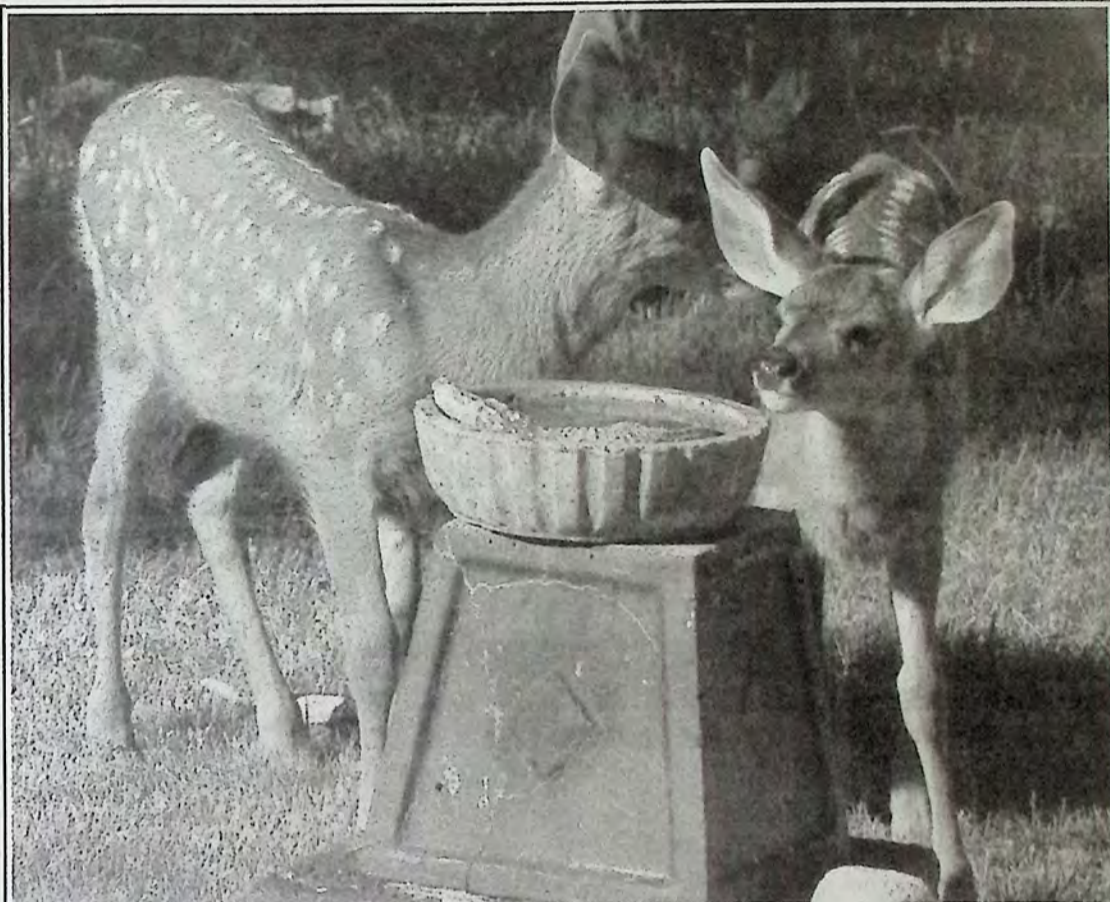
I'm telling you this to demonstrate that we have somehow been able to co-exist with the deer and although we have heard some horrific stories about attacks, we have not seen aggressive behaviour.

That's probably why the deer issue in town has yet to be solved. It's complex with no clear solution as there are people on both sides of the fence.

It doesn't matter to me personally if we have deer in our yard or not, but for now, I see them as one of the benefits of living in a rural community.

And that is what we need to remember. If we want to keep our community rural in natural, we need to closely examine what rural is as opposed to trying to remove it from the character of our community.

Rural is defined as 'of, relating to, or characteristic of the country' and the last time I looked Princeton fit that definition. If we want to remove one element of country living from our community (deer), what's next?

## How Buddhists Fight Greed

I was watching a program about people living in a Buddhist city and was surprised to learn that most Buddhists give to the poor as a way of preventing themselves to become greedy. I thought it was such an interesting idea.

I have heard of cultures in which giving to the poor gains a place in heaven. In other cultures, giving to others is a way of gaining what one's heart desires, or giving to the poor is a way of making more money. For example, one man told me the more we give, the more we receive. So his way of giving is to gain more for himself. The Buddhist way is to prevent the self from becoming greedy.

Greed is something all of us experience. From the time we are toddlers, we want more than our fair share of whatever we think is good. For some of us, the 'fair' share is more than fair, it is far more than an equal share of wealth.

To see greed as a sin is not a new idea. Being greedy is well-known as a motive for doing all sorts of nasty things, and greed is often a motive for crimes at all levels. A man who steals a loaf of bread

because he has no money to buy food is not a crime of greed, it is an attempt to survive. A man who has plenty of everything and yet steals from others is motivated by greed.

Greed is a motive that leads to many unpleasant emotions, such as envy of those who have more wealth, anger toward others because others have succeeded, and often includes a lot of deception through pretending one has more than others. The Buddhist approach to preventing greed is a recognition that preventing greed prevents a lot of nasty emotions that can work against the self.

I wondered what our society would be like if all of us decided we had to prevent ourselves from being greedy. First, it would probably prevent a lot of crime. Second, it would make organized charities and churches far better able to operate. However, what would it do to business? Is it not greed that keeps people buying things they do not need?

I thought about the effect on business, and then thought what happens when the poor receive gifts or money. They tend to use free money to go to buy something, so the effect on most businesses would be negligible. The effect on luxury businesses might be serious. Suppose a man could afford to buy a Lincoln but bought a Toyota instead and gave the savings to charity? The Toyota dealer would be happy but the Lincoln dealer would not.

Much of what we consider wealth are things we do not need. Nobody needs a diamond or ruby ring, or even a ring of any sort. The valuables we wear are a show of wealth, just as the large expensive homes, boats, cars, and vaca-

tions at fancy resorts. They are not things we really need, they are displays of what we can afford. In short, they are displays of wealth and possibly displays of our greed, our need to have more and better than others.

Sometimes greed is the result of personal failure. The person who has poor social skills thinks, "If I had more money, people would like me." The man who is not successful with women wants to drive the best car so he can be more attractive to the opposite sex (there are jokes about this!). The woman who feels she is not attractive enough may become greedy for more expensive clothing, make-up or hairdo. Greed can be traced back to all kinds of sources.

When you look at our culture, the way the rich are becoming super-rich and hiding wealth in banks on foreign soil, then you think of the Buddhist concept of preventing one's self from becoming greedy, you really have to think about what motivates the rich to accumulate so much money. One of the answers is greed, but it may be greed for something intangible. It may be greed for a sense of security, or greed for power. Both of these kinds of greed fall into the category of exposing personal failure, in this case, insecurity about having enough or needing power.

I rarely think about greed and how it influences our culture, and how people are often rewarded for their greed or condemned by it, but now that I have heard of the Buddhist effort to prevent one's self from becoming greedy, I have to give more thought to an alternative culture in which the sin of greed is something people think about every day.

This year's pepper festival was organized entirely by a very small committee of volunteers, possibly the smallest group to take on the project in the twelve years the event has been held.

The organizing committee also looked at getting together starting in

January to get an early start on some of the essential pre-booking elements for the 13th annual Sizzle set for September 20th, 2014.

The 2013 event went smoothly although a couple of minor issues presented themselves. Feedback during the meeting saw a suggestion on running the Chili Cook-Off a little longer to allow for late arrivals and more voting.

In addition, a little fine-tuning, better communication and earlier promotion were touched on as items that could assist with improving the next event.

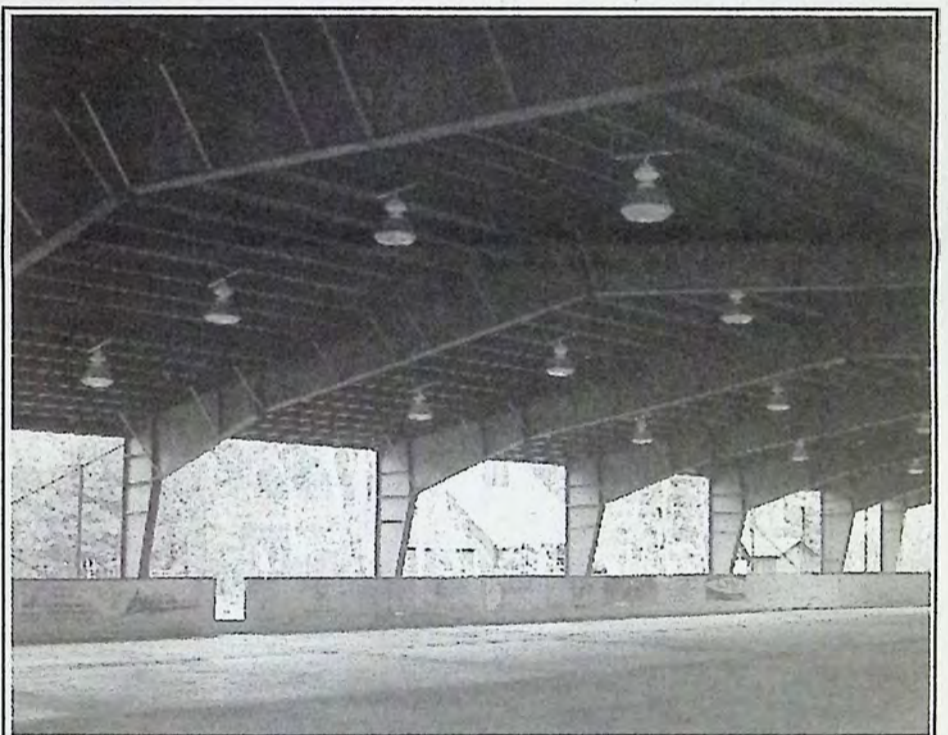

Living Past 100

Stay Active For Winter Health

Every spring there are advertisements and articles about how to shed that winter weight. The reason is lack of exercise during the cold months. Winter is no time to become a couch potato. Exercise is more important in winter than any other time of year. We need to be healthier in winter to fend off those cold and flu viruses that thrive when sunshine is at a minimum.

During winter, most of us spend too much time indoors doing very little, except perhaps overeating. This is very bad for health. The best way to stay warm in winter is to keep your circulation at its best level, which means exercise. Whether you go to a gym and work out, or just go for a walk every day, or work out on exercise machines at home, you will feel warmer and be healthier by exercising.

Taking Vitamin C and Vitamin D daily will help you feel better and will keep those viruses away, or at least help you fight them off when they do attack. However, taking these vitamins is no substitute for exercise. If you feel chilled, then move your body and get the blood flowing well.

This advice applies equally to the elderly as it does to all other ages. The elderly may not be able to exercise as vigorously as the young, but activity might be just walking up and down the stairs or back and forth through the house. Often, taking a walk outdoors in the snow and ice is more dangerous to health than sitting at home, but sitting around at home is not good, either.

Working on projects during the winter months is one way to keep active, unless those projects involve a lot of sitting. Do projects that require moving around. Some people do heavier house cleaning in winter, which involves a lot of bending and stretching, which is good for health. Others dance or work out on machines. Whatever you choose to do, keep your body moving even when you feel like just hibernating.

As we grow older, we tend to feel the cold more acutely, but this is no excuse to become a couch potato. In fact, if you are the kind who uses winter as an excuse to do very little, think back to our pioneer ancestors who would have frozen to death if they had not brought in the wood every day. They had winter chores to do such as feeding the horses and cattle, breaking ice on the pond for the livestock, and so on. This is how they managed to stay healthy during the winter. You may need to get out and work at something outdoors every day, too. Just keep moving - you will be much healthier.

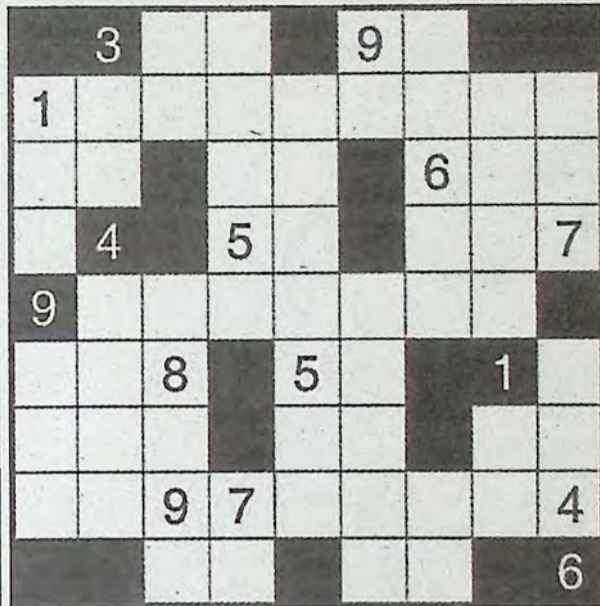

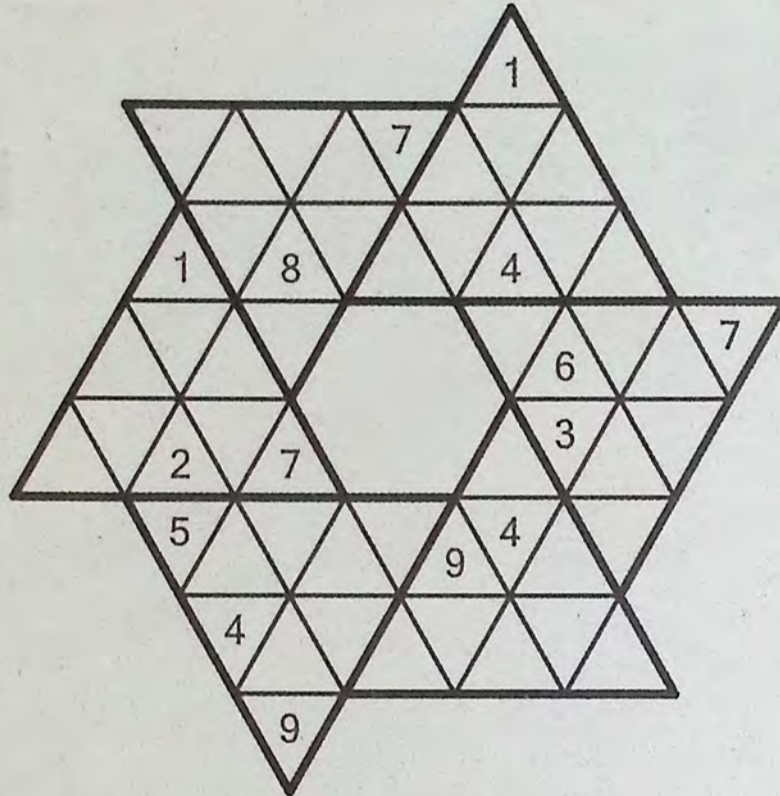

## HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

## Peanutty Chocolate Raspberry Rugelach

(NC)—Rugelach is a traditional holiday pastry that is always a hit at any cookie exchange. Consider giving them as a hostess gift, topped off with colourful ribbon for a festive holiday flare. Additional recipes can be found at [www.peanutbureau.ca](http://www.peanutbureau.ca). Prep time: 20 minutes. Refrigeration time: 1 hour. Baking time: 20 minutes. Makes 16 to 24.

### Ingredients:

- 1/2 package block cream cheese, at room temperature, cut into chunks (4 oz (125 g))
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) unsalted butter, at room temperature, cut into chunks
- 1/4 tsp (1 mL) salt
- 1 cup (250 mL) all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) peanuts, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup (60 mL) mini chocolate chips
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) granulated sugar
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) cinnamon
- 1/4 cup (60 mL) seedless raspberry jam
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) milk

### Directions:

1. Place cream cheese, butter and salt in a mixing bowl. Beat on high until smooth and creamy. Beat in flour, on low, until combined. Form dough into a flat disc and wrap with plastic wrap. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour.
2. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, stir peanuts with chocolate chips, sugar and cinnamon. Upon removing from refrigerator, if dough is too firm to roll, let stand for about 10 minutes before moving on to the next step.
3. Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C). Line 1 or 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. On a floured surface, use a floured rolling pin to roll dough very thinly into a circle, about 15 inches (38 cm) in size and about 1/8-inch (3-mm) thick.
4. Scantly spread dough with jam to cover, then sprinkle with nut mixture. Cut dough into wedges like a pie – for larger cookies, cut into 16 wedges, and for smaller cookies, cut into 24 wedges.
5. Tightly roll each dough wedge from wide edge to point to enclose filling. Place on baking sheet. Whisk egg yolk with milk and brush tops of cookies.
6. Bake in centre of preheated oven until lightly browned, 22 to 25 minutes. Cool completely on rack.

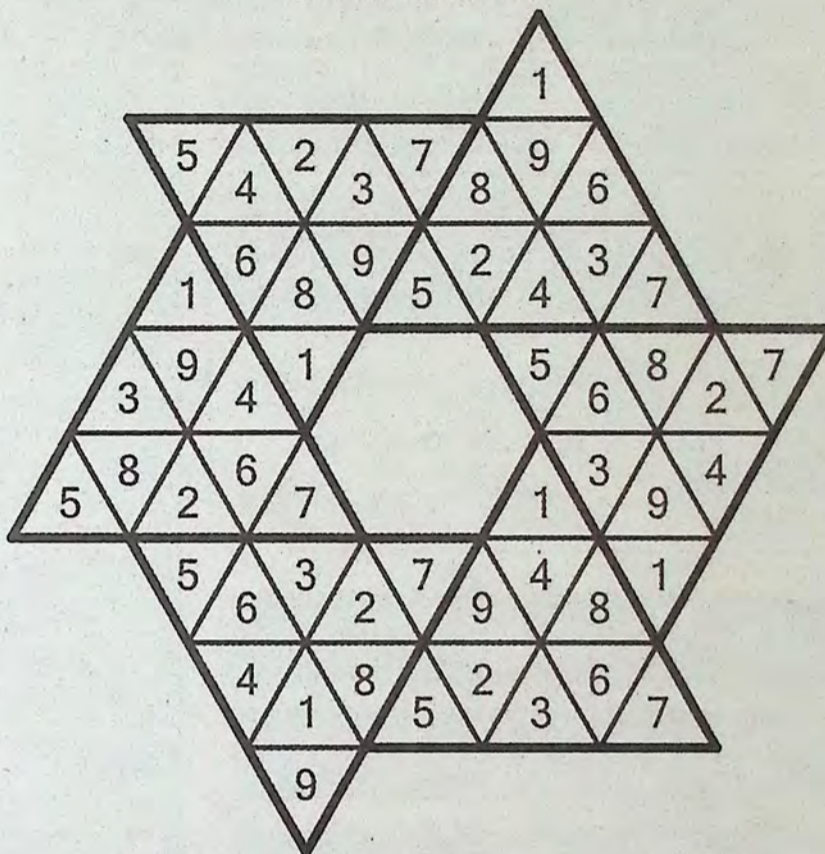

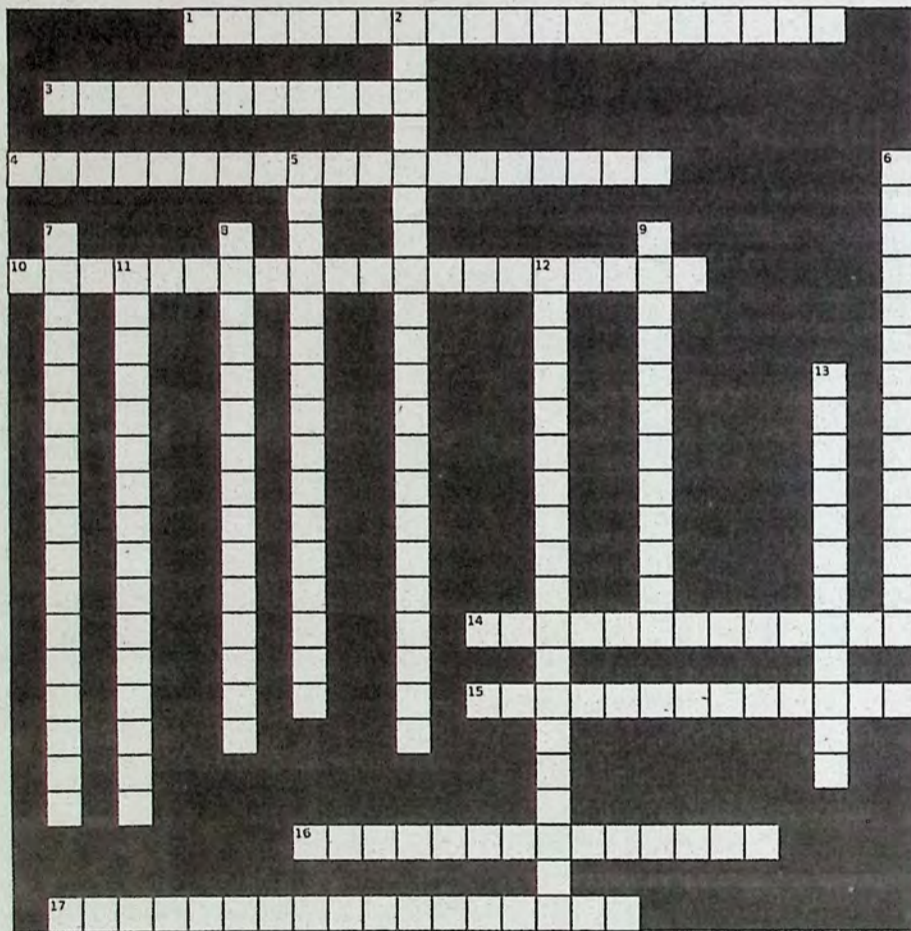

avoiding over-packaging. And recycle everything you can.

- When you burn wood to heat your home, make sure the combustion is efficient, releasing the least possible amount of smoke:
- Wet or green wood produces a lot of smoke. Wood should be properly seasoned in a dry place for at least six months.
- Do not burn wood that is treated, painted, or laden with salt from exposure to sea water.
- Use an efficient, certified wood stove that's just the right size for your home. Install and operate it

correctly. Overloading your stove or starving the fire of air are both harmful.

- Think of your neighbors' health, not to mention your own — avoid burning when the smoke won't dissipate from the area, such as on cold, clear and calm nights.
- Be aware of the "no-burn" periods in your community, and don't bend the rules! (BC Ministry of Environment: BC Air Quality).

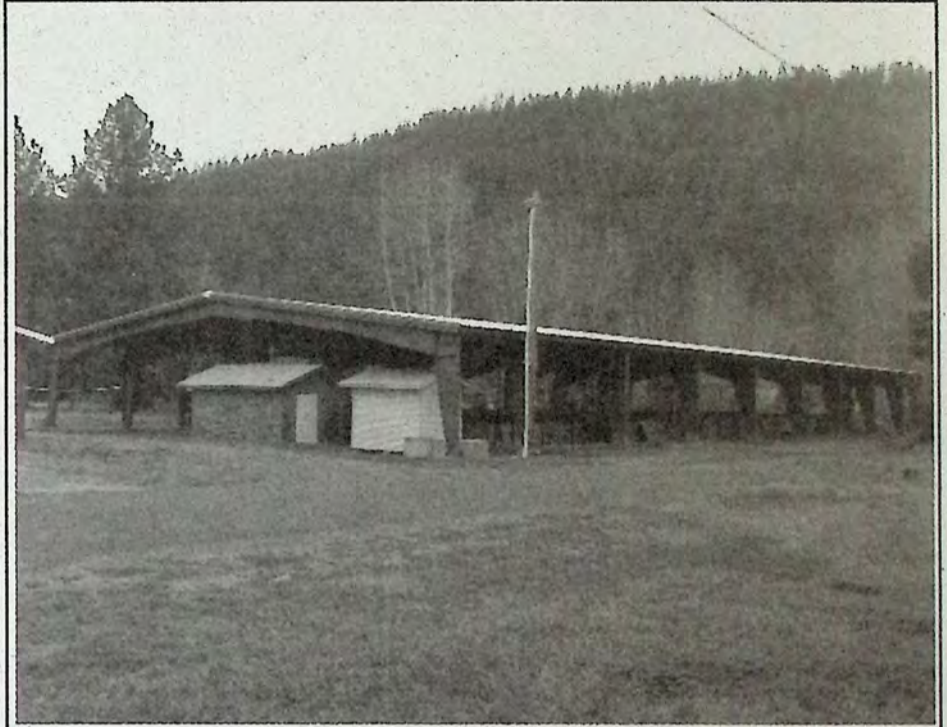

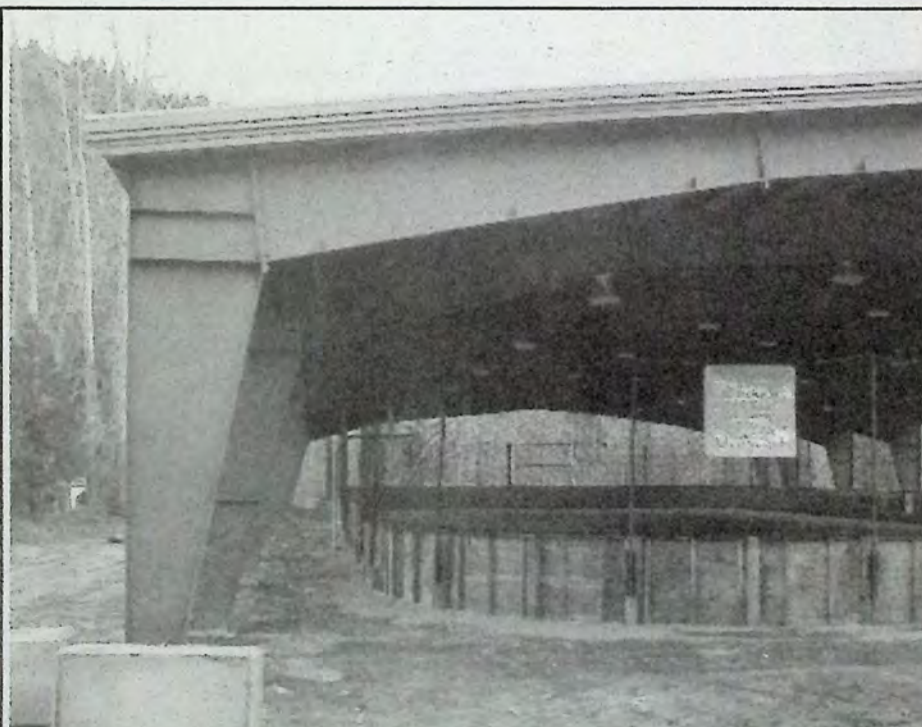

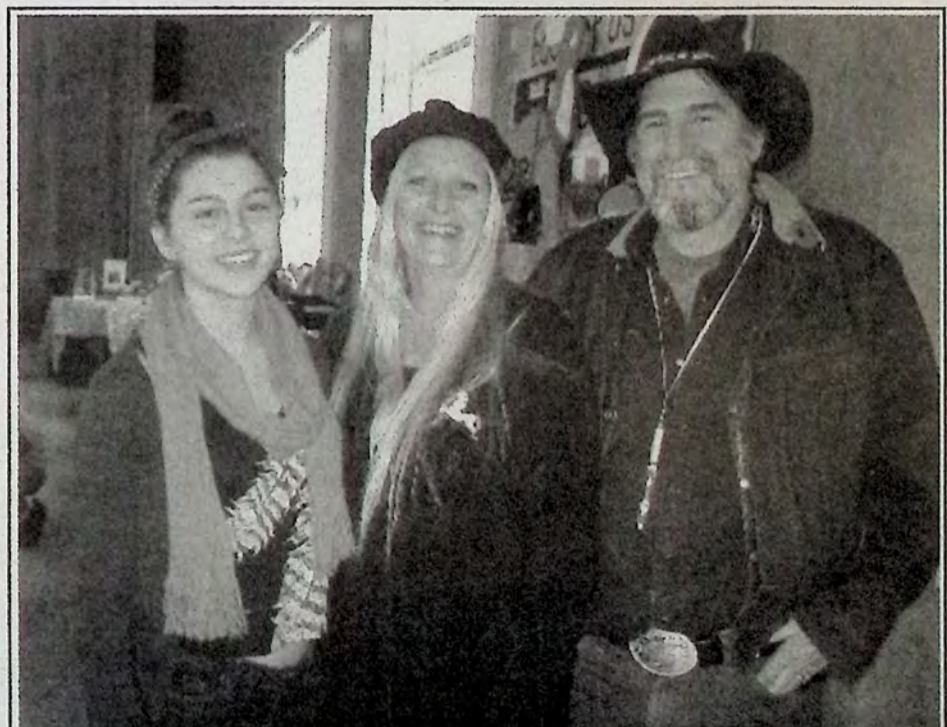
