Princeton receives grant-in-lieu

The government of B.C. distributed approximately \$18.2 million in compensation for municipal property taxes to 63 communities throughout the province on November 15th. This year's compensation represents an increase of \$1.3 million over last year's payments.

Grants-in-lieu of property taxes are distributed annually as a way to reimburse municipalities for ser-

vices that have benefited government properties, such as sewers, roads and fire protection. The amounts paid are based on the assessed value of the properties and the municipality's tax rate.

According to the Municipal Aid Act, a grant-in-lieu is payable on land owned by the provincial government - for example, courthouses, provincial government office build-

CMMC announces \$30M bought deal financing

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) ("Copper Mountain" or the "Company") announced November 11th that it has entered into an agreement with National Bank Financial Inc. as a lead underwriter on behalf of a syndicate of underwriters to be formed (the "Underwriters"), for the issuance of 17,700,000 common shares (the "Shares") of the Company, on a bought deal basis, at a price of Cdn\$1.70 per Share for gross proceeds of Cdn\$30,090,000.

Copper Mountain plans to use the net proceeds of this financing for the construction of a secondary crusher to increase production at the Copper Mountain Mine site and for general corporate purposes.

The Underwriters also have the option to increase the size of the

Offering by up to an additional 2,655,000 Shares (the "Underwriters' Option"), for aggregate gross proceeds under the Offering of \$34,603,500 if the Underwriters' Option is exercised in full.

The Shares will be offered by way of a short form prospectus to be filed in certain provinces of Canada, other than Quebec, pursuant to National Instrument 44-101 Short Form Prospectus Distributions.

The offering is scheduled to close on or about December 3, 2013 and is subject to certain conditions including, but not limited to, the receipt of all necessary approvals including the approval of the Toronto Stock Exchange and the securities regulatory authorities.

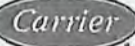

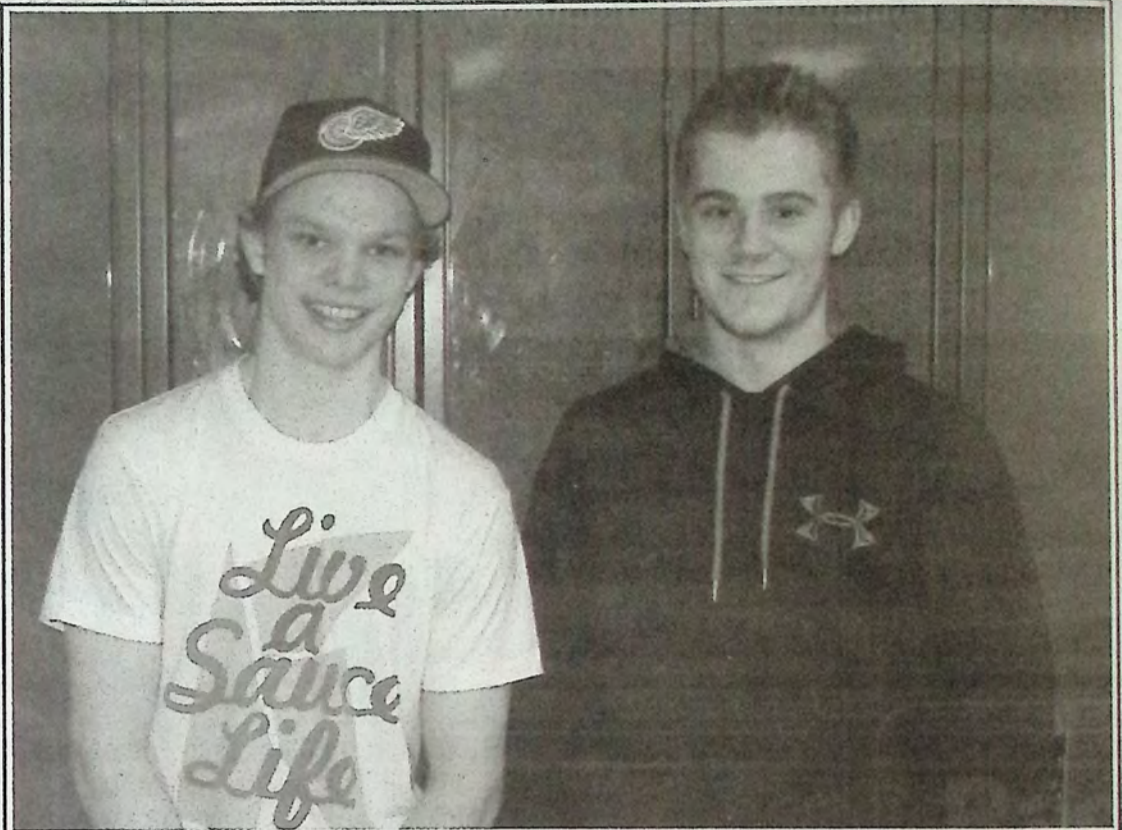

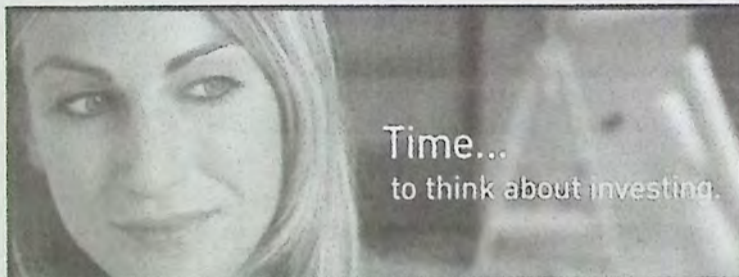

The other day I was working on an outside project, which relied on the internet to function. A server error rendered the operation useless and everything came to a grinding halt.

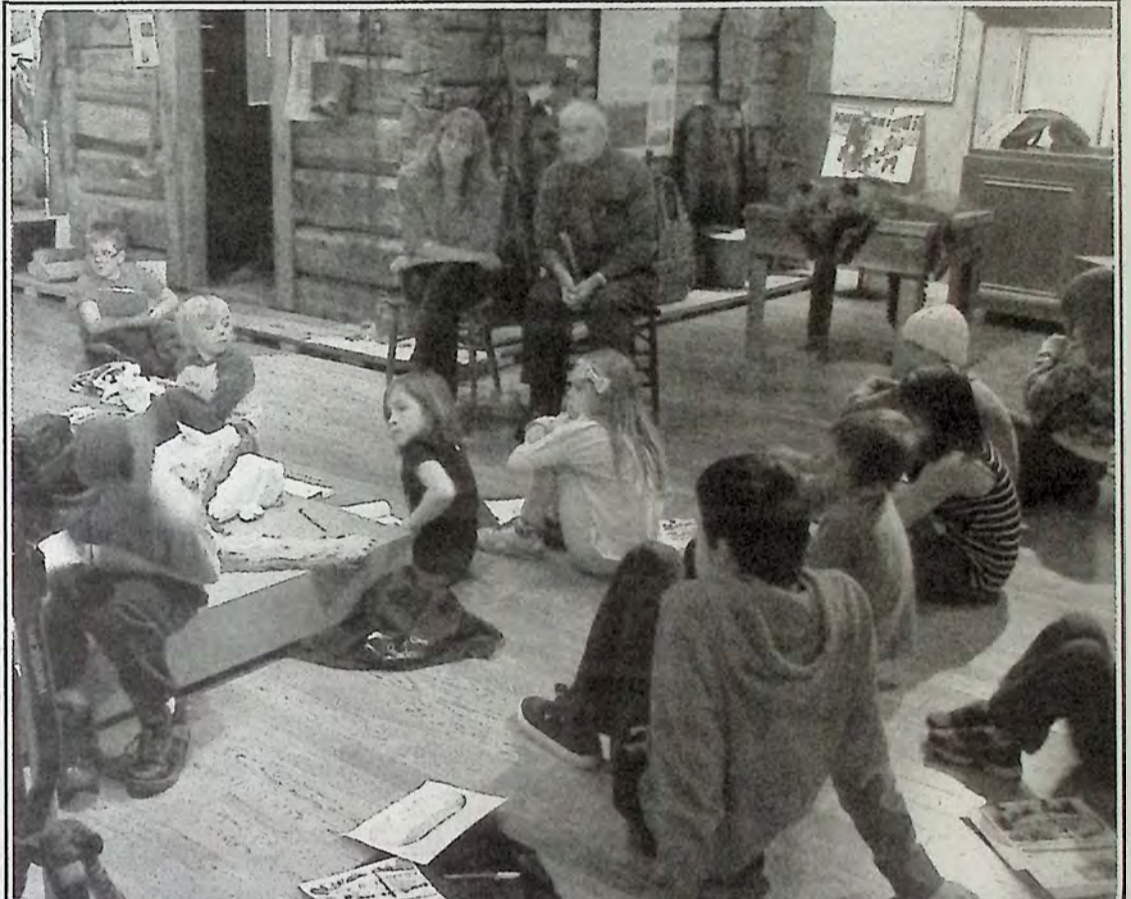
It was at that moment I was reminded of someone asking me how long before newspapers cease to exist in printed form.

Letters And E-Mails Received This Week

To The Editor;

Thank you for your editorial of November 12, 2013. It totally reflected my feelings and experiences as a ten-year resident of Princeton, and a champion of the wildlife that, from time to time, has come under attack through these years – deer and marmots. Like you, I see deer in my front yard on an almost daily basis and have never had a problem!

Ironically, on the same page as the editorial we again saw a letter from Kay Goglin, complaining about the deer and calling for action. Kay can not understand why some people find deer "cute"!

Sorry Kay – there are lots of us who do like them and find them cute!

It was with regret and some sadness that I submitted my resignation from the Princeton Deer Management Committee. I am writing this letter so my position as a "conscientious objector" is made clear to all concerned.

I originally volunteered for this position in the hope that the committee would look for practical and humane solutions to the concerns about the "town deer" population, voiced by a number of residents. This cumbersome process, however, was avoided. Instead, the com-

mittee was asked to edit a questionnaire circulated by the City of Cranbrook to gather public input regarding their own, local, deer issues for use in Princeton.

I expressed my disappointment to, then group leader, Councillor Jason Earle, in an e-mail dated April 23 wherein I said:

"I have never served on a committee that asked so little of me, especially on one to which I was prepared to give so much. When I offered to serve on the Urban Deer Management Advisory Committee I anticipated that this group would, perhaps, become involved in a long-term project of creating and maintaining a strategy for resolving, or at least mitigating, the Princeton urban deer dilemma. I had hoped for a strategy that might involve the community in a defensive plan, employing efforts at public education and strategies for landscaping, gardening and fencing. This would have been a unique, practical and enlightened Town Plan to deal with a potentially, highly divisive issue – a public

After Remembrance Day Is Over

What our government is doing to veterans today is appalling. Veterans of Afghanistan are losing pension benefits, even those who suffered terrible injuries. Our government is using a quit-claim payout to effectively say, "Okay, you served your country, now get lost!" Canada sent troops to Afghanistan where so many were injured and so many died in this so-called peace-keeping activity. Why are they considered less worthy than former veterans?

I kept thinking of the hypocrisy of our leaders laying wreaths and giving lip service to the bravery of our veterans of the past while trying to dump responsibility for the veterans of the present.

There is a petition you can sign if you feel the way I do. It is located on change.org.

The petition will tell you that in 1917, a commitment was made by our government that those who went into the service would be cared for. That commitment held until this present government came into power. Now our government

has changed the rules and is abandoning its commitment to those who serve in our military forces.

In fact, the disabled veteran's reimbursement is up to 90 percent less than that of a disabled civilian!

I signed the petition. I hope you will, too.

The average Canadian is opposed to war of any kind. We are not a militant population. For most Canadians, even the peace-keeping action was too costly in Canadian lives and Canadian injuries. Those soldiers who went to Afghanistan faced the daily threat of being shot or being blown up by a land mine or other explosive device while traveling along the roads. Although Afghanistan was supposedly a peace-keeping action, it looked very much like a war. To downgrade the service of those who were injured is to pretend nothing happened to Canadians in Afghanistan.

Does our government believe we Canadians will forget Afghanistan? If our politicians believe that, then they must believe we intend to cancel Remembrance Day. We do not.

Part of what the Canadian Legion does is conduct a service of remembrance each year so that none of us forget that Canadians have fought and died in war and in peace-keeping action. Our military is set up to defend our country in conjunction with allied nations, and our government has honored the commitment to those allies by sending troops to war in far-flung nations in which war has erupted. The Canadian Legion was organized to see that those who made the sacrifice were remembered,

that their dependants were provided with a means to live, and that those who were wounded and disabled were cared for, and that includes not only treatment, but a pension. The Legion was established to make sure the government met its commitment to its military personnel.

I am surprised we have not seen members of the Royal Canadian Legion picketing in the streets by now over this disgraceful decision made by our government. Sometimes an issue must be thrust before the public before the public wakes up and demands justice. Signing a petition is great, but sometimes we have to do more than just put our signature on a piece of paper. Sometimes we have to get out on the streets and tell the politicians we are very angry with what they are doing.

The Legion cannot be expected to oppose this government's action alone. This is a public issue which involves every Canadian who demands that our government honour its commitments to its citizens. I believe it is time for all of us to make our government reverse its current position regarding disabled veterans and stand by the commitment made in 1917.

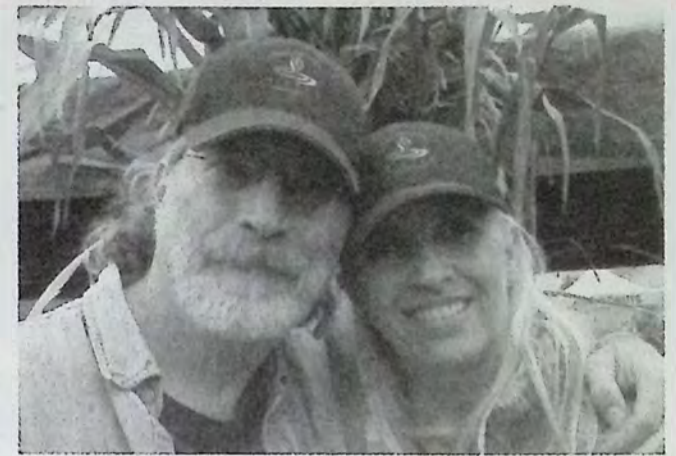
If this government will not change its stance, perhaps it is time for a new government?

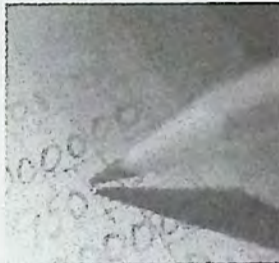

Two Canadian scientists will be speaking in Osoyoos to answer your questions and concerns regarding GE (genetically engineered) - also called GM or genetically modified - foods and human health. The event will include commentary from local experts.

Alex Atamanenko, MP and the Okanagan-Similkameen Farm Labour Society are excited to bring this event to the South Okanagan. "Genetically Engineered Foods

and Human Health: A Cross-Canada Speaker's Tour" will tell you what you stand to lose and how you can make a difference in your family and your community.

Dr. Thierry Vrain, a retired soil biologist and former head of the biotechnology department at the Summerland Research Station, was paid to research and promote genetically engineered organisms. After a 30-year career with Agriculture Canada, he speaks

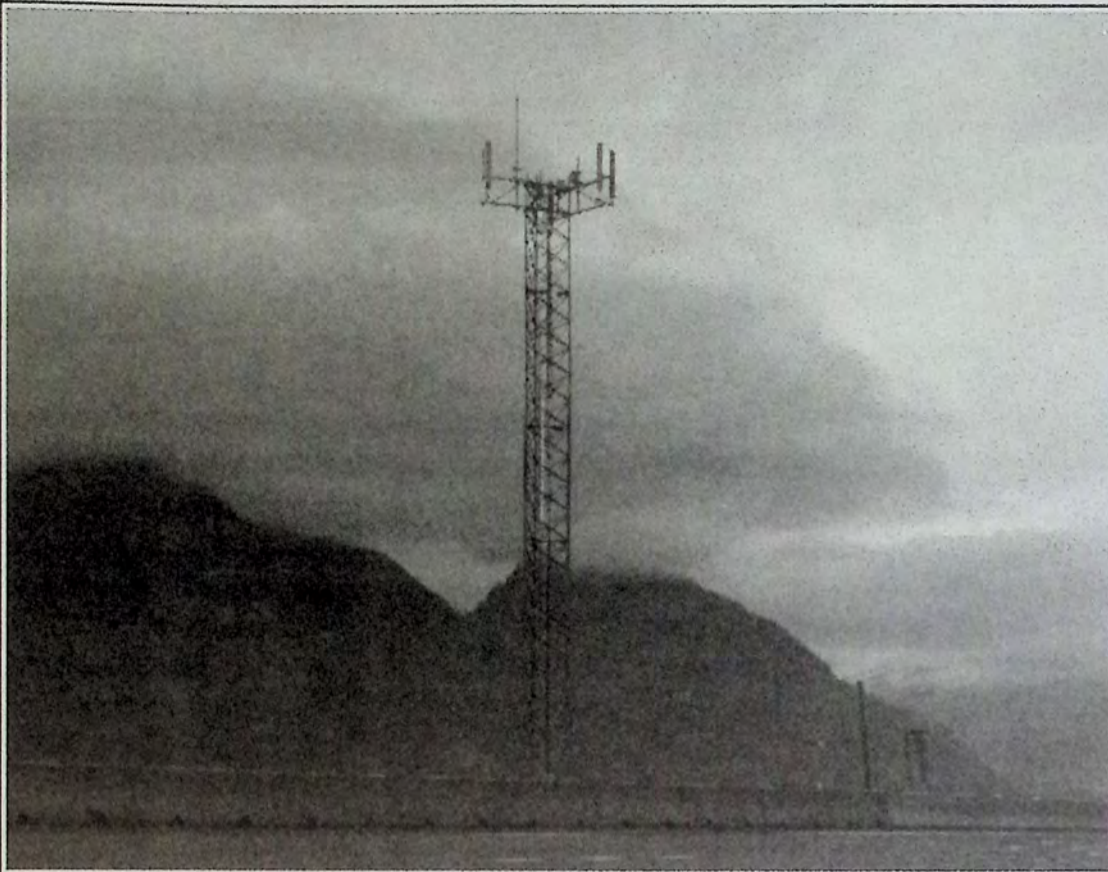
against GE technology.

Dr. Shiv Chopra is a former Health Canada senior scientific advisor who blew the whistle on bovine growth hormone (rBGH).  Cawston, BC is the "Organic Capital of Canada". Although genetically-modified corn for cattle is grown in the Similkameen Valley, both the BC Fruit Growers Association and the Similkameen Organic Treefruit Growers are against introduction of genetically-modified fruit including the Arctic Apple.
 The technology for the Arctic Apple was first developed in Australia. Ironically, the Arctic Apple was made possible in Canada with the assistance of the

Summerland Research Station. The Arctic Apple is promoted by Okanagan Specialty Fruits. The non-browning apple could destroy the organic fruit industry.
 Given that GE salmon, GE apples, and GE alfalfa are close to entering the marketplace in Canada, it is more important than ever for Canadians to learn and discuss this pressing matter and to discover how - and who - they can advocate for change.

Living Past 100
Live Better Uncluttered

There is a saying that people who live in clutter have cluttered minds. Canned goods and other non-perishables are often left in kitchen cupboards and expiry dates forgotten. These foods may not be safe to eat. In what was expected to be a high-spirited game, only twelve penalties were called.

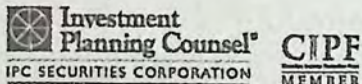

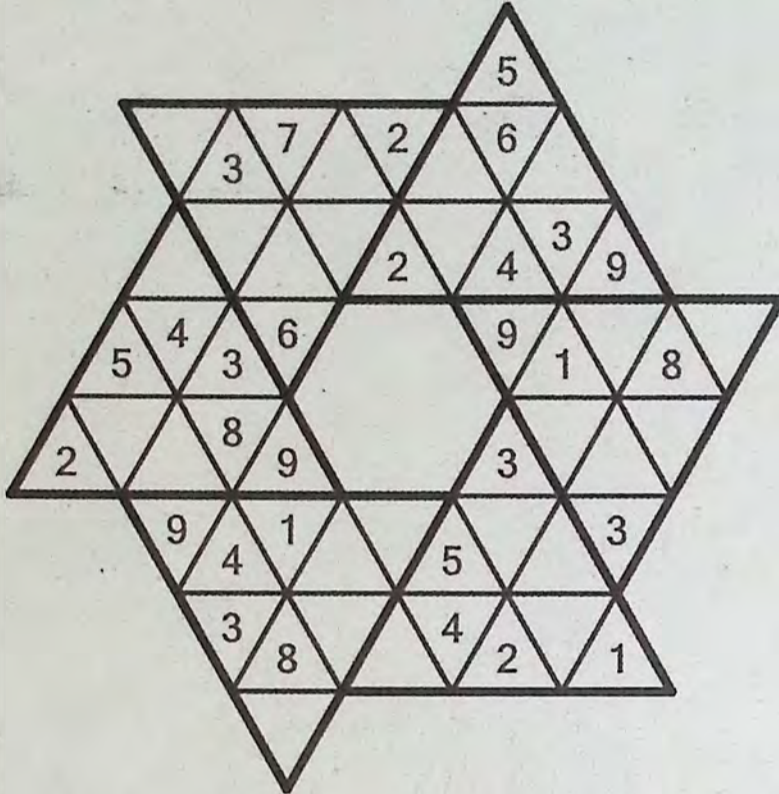

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

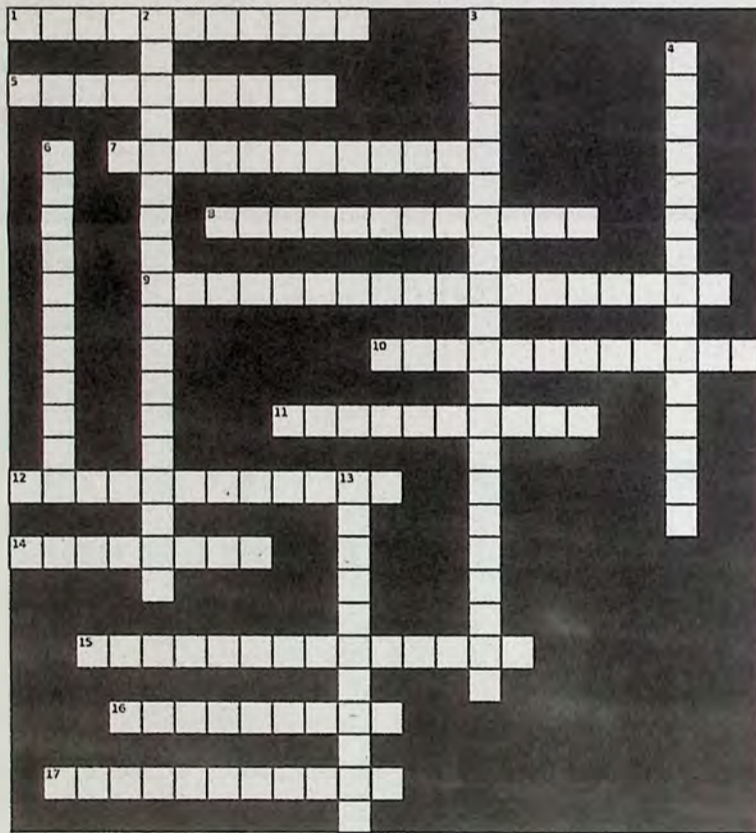

I added, "Had I know our only purpose was to initialize a dubious questionnaire, I would not have volunteered. Why copy other people's bad ideas?"

Nonetheless, the resulting questionnaire was circulated in Princeton to 1,270 recipients; 334 were returned. The results were tabulated by the committee and a detailed report was issued for council. It has been available on the Town website for some time. Some results have been publicized. Many are aware that 85 percent of the Princeton respondents declared that "No Action" was not acceptable and that 45.3 percent of these respondents saw "Capture and Euthanize" as the desired outcome, followed in third place by 41.3 percent who liked "Relocation". Omitted is the reality that 42.6 percent like the idea of "Professional Sharpshooting", another euphemism for "kill".

In my e-mail to Earle I offered the Town full, free access to an information booklet about defensive gardening in deer country that I began to create many years ago, first for myself and then expanded to use as gifts to our new home purchasers and new tenants.

It is primarily a comprehensive list of plants that are deemed "deer resistant" and "cold hardy". And - so it remained until the Urban Deer Management Advisory Committee was established. If available on the Town website, I saw the booklet as a possible catalyst for further action - as a way for the public to be easily informed and perhaps be inspired to action on their projects and their own properties. There was no interest in this idea.

It seems that learning something new has no appeal, as born out by the survey, where "Public Education" garnered almost no sup-

port and 30.8 percent found it downright unacceptable.

On November 8, 2013 the committee was reconvened under the leadership of councilor Doug Pateman. Given the material provided by Councilor Pateman and the ensuing discussion, I can only conclude that Town Council may either elect to do nothing because only a small percentage of questionnaires (26%) were returned, indicating that most Princeton residents are not highly concerned about the deer "problem" - or - Council may continue to follow the Cranbrook model, where a deer cull has now been adopted, despite strong opposition.

The committee learned that Town council did not especially want the Public Relations nightmare of a cull and a Three - Step strategy was suggested - and therein lies the rub for me! Step 1 is to "see the conservation office take a more active role in the removal and euthanizing of identified aggressive and territorial deer".

Once all the trouble makers, based on someone's opinion, are gone we would go to Step 2 - "Relocation" for which partial government fund-

ing may be available if the municipality has followed all the right procedures - someday! Step 3 would be the push for amendment of the Wildlife Act to allow "Hazing"; the idea being that if you have trained dogs scare the deer off often enough they will not come back! Good Luck with that!

The report to committee concludes, "This problem was created by mankind and like it or not, it must be corrected and managed by mankind!"

Yikes, I say to that!

Mankind so far has not had a sterling record when it comes to wildlife. We sent much of it into near extinction and now we are unhappy because it is making a comeback!

I have devoted myself to furthering the humane treatment and understanding of animals, domestic and wild. I can not, with clear conscience, be part of committee deliberations that will sanction the killing and harassment of innocent animals and could possibly lead to the adoption of a cull/kill policy for Princeton.

..... continued from Front Page -ings, ambulance stations and warehouses. Because schools and hospitals are exempt from paying municipal property taxes, a grant-in-lieu is not payable on these properties. In addition, highways, forests, parks or land under the control, management or administration of a Crown corporation are also excluded from compensation under the act.

Since 2002, the Government of British Columbia has distributed

more than \$208 million as grants-in-lieu to communities. Each municipality distributes a portion of the funds to its regional district, and those governments use money to help pay for local services.

The funds are distributed electronically on behalf of government by the Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services.

The Town of Princeton was the only Similkameen Valley community to receive a grant-in-lieu which totaled \$1,218.93.

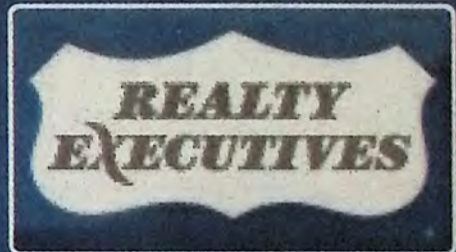
