Deer issue: no simple solution

Wildlife Biologist Brian Harris of Penticton attended the December 2nd regular meeting of Princeton Town Council and gave a presentation on urban deer.

According to the presentation, deer are in communities simply because we live in traditional deer winter range and there is an abundance of food available. There's also safety from predators and hunters.

"So it's a pretty ideal situation for

deer," Harris stated.

Consequences of increased deer abundance in urban settings include damage to gardens, motor vehicle collisions, aggressive deer behaviour, the attraction of predators in communities and possible disease issues.

CMMC closes bought deal financing

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) (the "Company" or "Copper Mountain") announced December 3rd that it has closed its Cdn \$30 million bought deal financing (the "Offering") announced on November 11, 2013. The syndicate of underwriters was led by National Bank Financial Inc. and includes Canaccord Genuity Corp., Scotia Capital Inc., CIBC World Markets

Inc. and Raymond James Ltd. (collectively the "Underwriters"). The Offering consisted of the issue of 17,700,000 common shares at a price of Cdn \$1.70 per share, resulting in Cdn \$30,090,000 in gross proceeds to the Company.

Copper Mountain plans to use the net proceeds of this financing for the construction of a secondary crusher to increase production at the Copper Mountain Mine site and for

general corporate purposes.

The Underwriters also have the option to increase the size of the Offering by up to an additional 2,655,000 Shares (the "Underwriters' Option") at any time until January 2, 2014, for an additional gross proceeds of Cdn \$4,513,500 if the Underwriters'

Option is exercised in full.

MP announces summer job application deadline extension

Alex Atamanenko, MP for BC Southern Interior is alerting eligible local employers and organizations that the deadline for Canada Summer Jobs 2014 (CSJ) has been extended to January 31, 2014. Because the application period falls over the holidays, Service Canada has extended the original deadline of January 10th by three weeks.

"Service Canada has just notified my office of the new deadline," said Atamanenko.

"I encourage eligible employers to consider applying for CSJ funding and hire a student for next summer."

The CSJ initiative helps to create job opportunities for students aged 15 to 30 years in their communities. Funding is provided to not-for-profit organizations, public sector employers and small businesses to assist with hiring students who will be returning to full-time studies in the next school year.

Assessment of the BC Southern Interior applications are guided by local priorities, employment factors within the constituency, on the job mentoring and career related experience provided, provision of sufficient salary and other criteria.

This year Canada Summer Jobs

applications will be available online beginning December 2, 2013 and must be submitted by January 31, 2014.

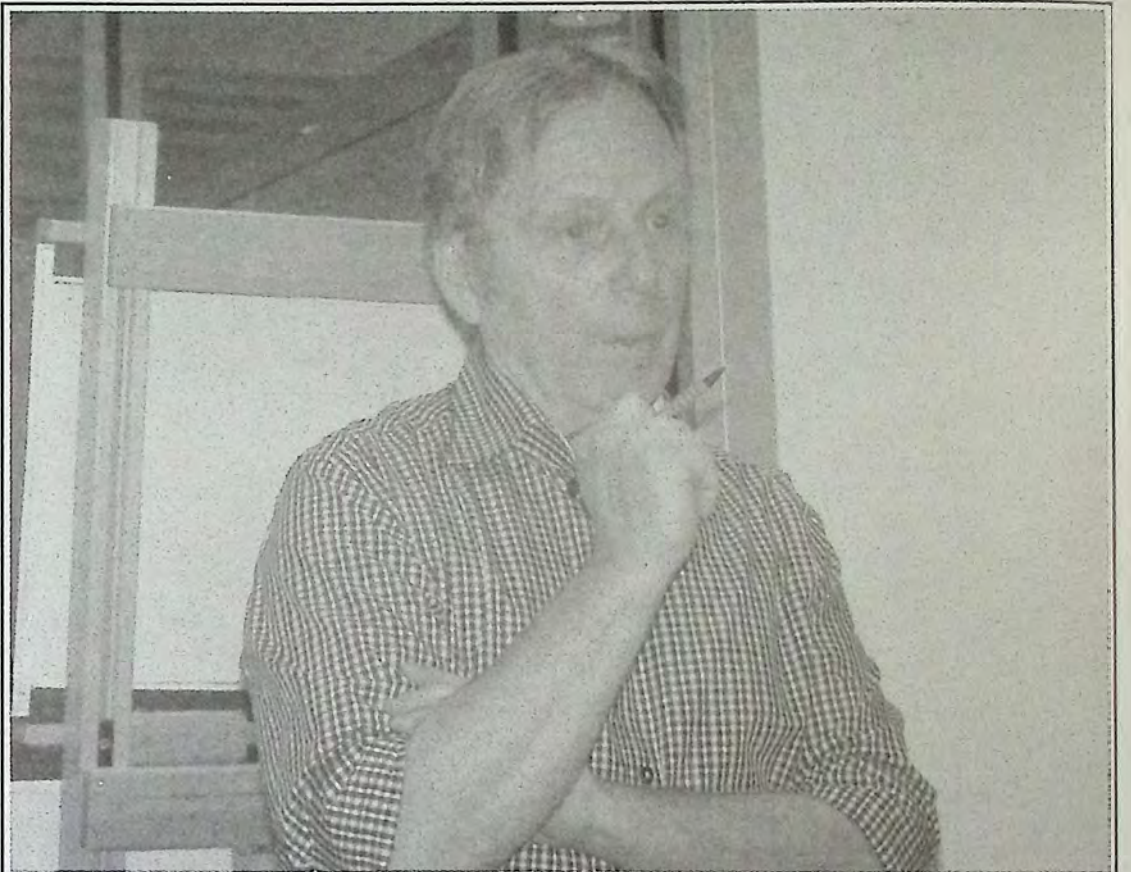

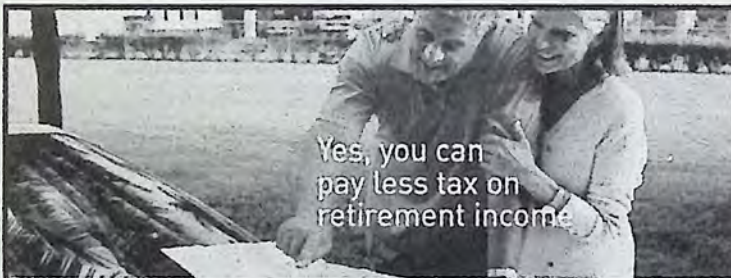

..... continued from Front Page complaints. reported showed an increase of two in Kimberley in 2004 to 10 five years later. In Cranbrook the figures went from one in 2007 to 5 the following year and down to three in 2009.

More detailed information from Grand Forks revealed deer count totals of about 130 in September 2007 up to just over 200 two years later and back down to just over 150 in September 2012.

Harris pointed out that in the case of Grand Forks, the community did not choose to follow a course of action and urban deer numbers ended up dropping.

There are four key management options, which are described as conflict reduction, population reduction, fertility control and administrative action.

Conflict reduction basically shifts actions on to the landowner that

could be in the form of hazing, the use of repellents (sound, scent or sudden motion), landscaping alternatives (using plants that are unpalatable to deer) and exclusion fencing (either individual plants or a whole yard).

Harris stated this option means the deer are still around, but the 'hassle factor' is reduced and pointed out, "They don't like ornamental grasses as it turns out."

Population reduction focuses on actions primarily made at the governmental level and include capture and relocation at \$800 per deer, capture and euthanize at \$250 per deer, sharp shooting (\$300 per animal), controlled public hunting and First Nations hunting by invitation on private land.

Harris says the capture and euthanize option was used in the Kootenays where Republic, Washington used a program of capture and relocate.

The fertility control option involves a vaccine that prevents conception but requires annual application. In addition, vaccinated deer need identification, as they are not fit for consumption once vaccinated.

Harris also explained that in order to have any success at least 70 percent of does need to be treated and there is a time lag before a reduction in deer population becomes evident.

As for administrative options,

public education, monitoring of the deer population through regular coordinated counts and bylaw amendments are the focus.

The Provincial Government has become involved in the urban deer situation in various ways including managing deer populations around communities with hunting, supported ecosystem restoration activities, responded to human/wildlife safety issues, coordinated deer counts and purchased clover traps and bolt guns.

Harris added that Cranbrook, Kimberley and Invermere are using the traps and bolt guns as their solution to the problem.

What seems to be missing in Princeton is an actual deer management plan that Harris says should have an objective, "...a measure of how successful it has become."

The last recorded urban deer count in Princeton took place between 5:30 and 6:20 the morning of May 16, 2009. A total of four people conducted the simultaneous count in four zones around the community with a total of 48 deer counted.

Harris summed up his presentation saying urban deer have it pretty good in that does remain healthy which means they often have twins and sometimes triplets.

"If there was an easy solution we would have done it a long time ago."

Hate Those Gifts At Christmas?

Grumble, grumble, grouch, grouch - these are the emotional responses to a season of gift-giving loved by so many and hated by so many!

"Christmas is so commercial!" is a frequent cry, as if Christmas is a plot to extract dollars from our wallets (or credit cards).

I supposed, at one time, that avoiding commercial enterprises meant making crafts at home to give as Christmas gifts, but after years of observation, I discovered it is not so. It is a cry of rebellion against the whole concept of spending money on gifts.

I have seen clever articles which tell you to give of yourself instead of giving money. That means donating a few hours of work to somebody or something. I have always done that all year long as

my contribution to community living. For those near and dear to me, I spend a lot of thought on what to give them for Christmas or birthdays or anniversaries, and it gives me pleasure to think they will be pleased with the gift.

What surprises me most is the number of so-called Christian believers who balk at all the gift-giving at Christmas time. More than 2,000 years ago, three men traveled great distances to find the child born in a manger in Bethlehem. What did the three travelers do? They gave gifts!

The birth of Christ was God's great gift to mankind wasn't it? Aren't the gifts at Christmas time given in recognition of that great gift? That's what I was taught.

Giving to the poor, especially to poor children, was a tradition begun by St. Nicholas, and it was a tradition embraced by most Christians. I give to charity year round, to the best of my financial means, but giving to the Christmas Hamper drive is a tradition in our family, begun by my husband more than thirty years ago. The poor among us need to feel their community cares about them. Certainly, those who give and those who work so hard to put the hampers together and deliver them are making that a reality. Christ advocated giving to the poor at any time.

Many businesses give Christmas

bonuses or host a Christmas dinner at this time of year, and this is a way of showing appreciation for their employees. Doing this at Christmas time helps make Christmas brighter, and increases the good feeling between employer and employee. This is a gift, too, as any token of appreciation is a gift, regardless of the form it takes.

I am amazed at the number of non-Christians who celebrate Christmas. People of Japan and other non-Christian nations will not only show respect for Christian beliefs, but will give gifts at Christmas time. I guess they pay tribute to the meaning of Christmas as a time of goodwill toward one's fellow man even if they do not share the religious belief nor follow the religious rituals.

Whether we are devout Christians or doubters, most North Americans celebrate Christmas and put up Christmas lights and/or Christmas trees, and give gifts. It is a tradition and a custom in nations settled by Europeans.

I am among the elderly now, and I know many older people, especially those who live alone, who do not bother much with Christmas. They do not put up a tree, and some do not give gifts as they have nobody close to give to. For those people, one of the great gifts is being invited to share Christmas dinner with others, to share the feast and the celebration, decorations and friendship. I like to do that - the more the merrier.

Among the many gifts we give each other at Christmas time are the greeting cards (electronic or other) we send and the verbal wish of "Merry Christmas!" as we go about our errands downtown. You don't have this feeling in the city, with all its glitz, because people do not know each other, but in this valley of small towns, "Merry Christmas!" is the greeting heard from everyone, not just from a fake Santa on the corner or the clerk at the grocery store. The smiles and good wishes warm our hearts, and are a gift we take for granted.

If you are one of the Scrooges or Grinches about giving gifts, try saying "Merry Christmas!" to somebody. It will be the first gift you give, and it will make you feel good. That's why giving is better than receiving.

Mills writes Princeton history

Nicholas Mills, former manager of Princeton's museum, has written *Once Upon A Time In Princeton*, a book of Princeton's history. If you want to know accurate information about Princeton's industrial and business history, this is a good book to read. It is a fast read, too, as the language is straightforward and clear.

The coal mining, copper mining, railroads, floods, mine disasters, road construction, electrical power, and the cement plant are found in this book. Old photos add to historical data.

Mills left Princeton a few years ago to live in the lower mainland area, but it is obvious much of his affection for Princeton can be found in his book about the tri-

umphs and tragedies of local history. While most of the history is economic, he does devote a chapter each to John Fall Allison and his wife, Susan. Other historical figures are mentioned throughout, but a few have pages devoted to them - Mom and Pop Irwin and Amber Ski Club, Dr. John Goodfellow, Dave Taylor, A. Wagenhauser and Podunk Davis.

Nick has written two other books, which tells us what he has been doing since he left Princeton! He has written a collection of short stories called *Stories for Bedbugs!* and *Suzanne*, a novel set in England and France.

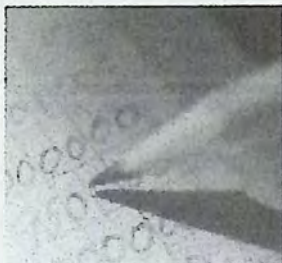

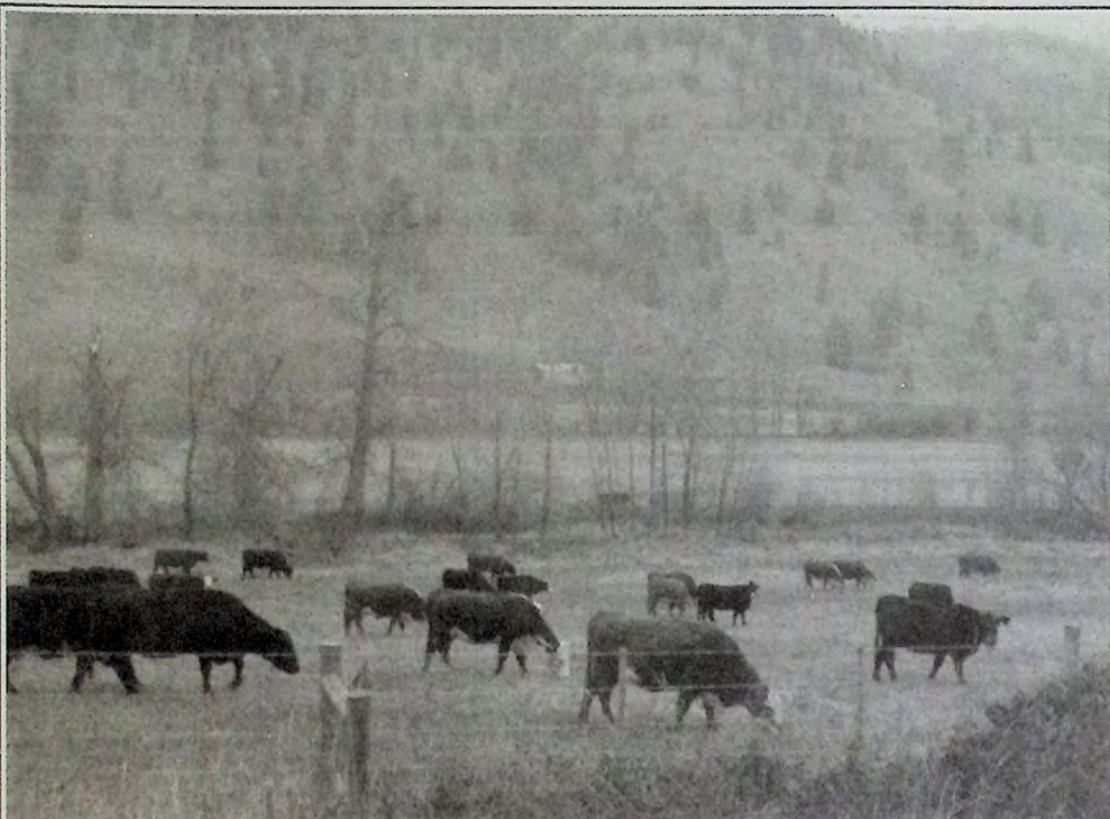

Goldcliff Resource Corporation

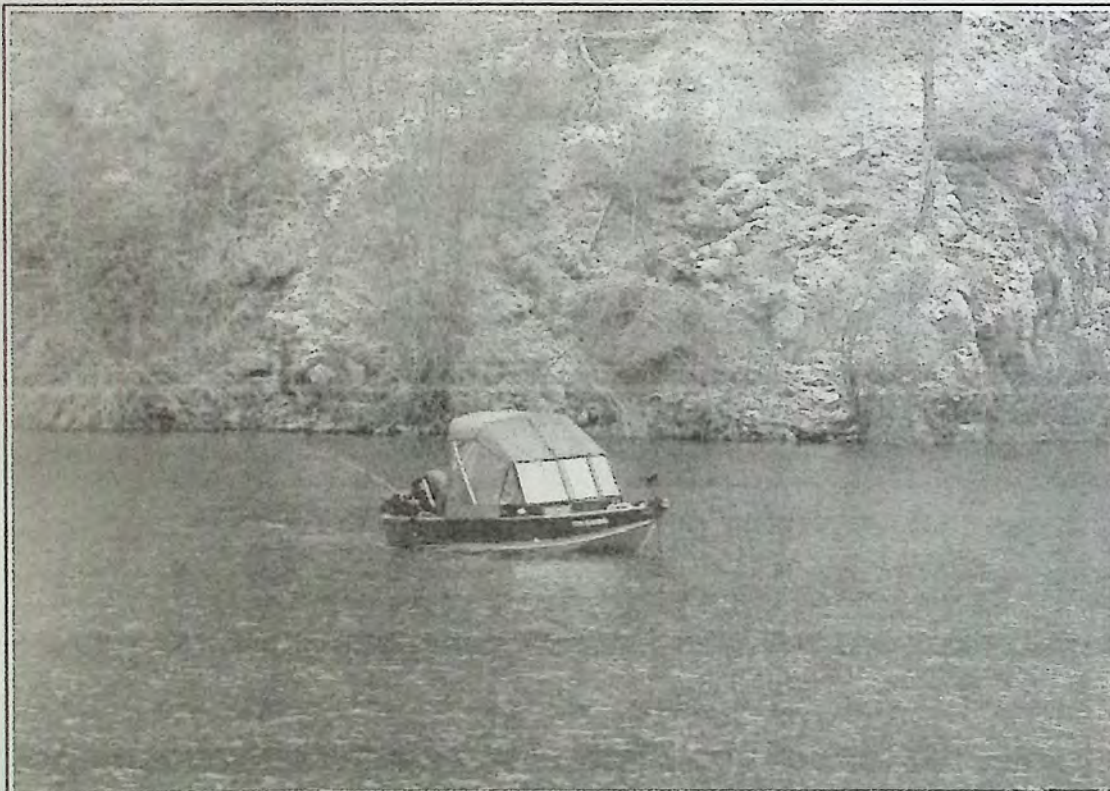
George Sanders, President of Goldcliff Resource Corporation (GCN.TSXV), announced last week that the company has entered into a Sale and Purchase Agreement with Badger Minerals Ltd., a privately held non reporting issuer. Badger will earn a 25 per-cent interest in Goldcliff's Tulameen Copper property by funding a \$250,000 exploration program by November 2014 and paying \$25,000 upon signing. The \$250,000 exploration program will include drilling the Whipsaw Trojan-Condor target. Upon completion of the \$250,000 exploration program, the two companies will enter into a joint venture agreement

for further development of the property to be funded 75 per-cent by Goldcliff and 25 per-cent by Badger. Goldcliff will be the project operator throughout.

The Tulameen Copper Project is near Princeton, and within the Copper Mountain Camp approximately eight kilometers southwest of the operating Copper Mountain Mine. The Whipsaw Trojan-Condor target has alkalic porphyry copper-silver-gold showings with rock samples that contain values ranging from 0.175% to 0.655% copper, 4.8 g/t silver and 0.17 g/t gold. The mineralization is chalcopyrite, malachite, pyrite, pyrrhotite and mag-

netite. These showings are located within the strong 3D Induced Polarization chargeability anomaly that has a depth of 500 metres and a surface area of about four square kilometres.

Leonard W. Saleken, PGeo (geologist), and Edwin R. Rockel, PGeo (geophysicist), are the qualified persons as defined by National Instrument 43-101 who supervised the preparation and verification of the technical information in this release. The qualified persons for this report are registered professional geoscientist with the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of British Columbia.

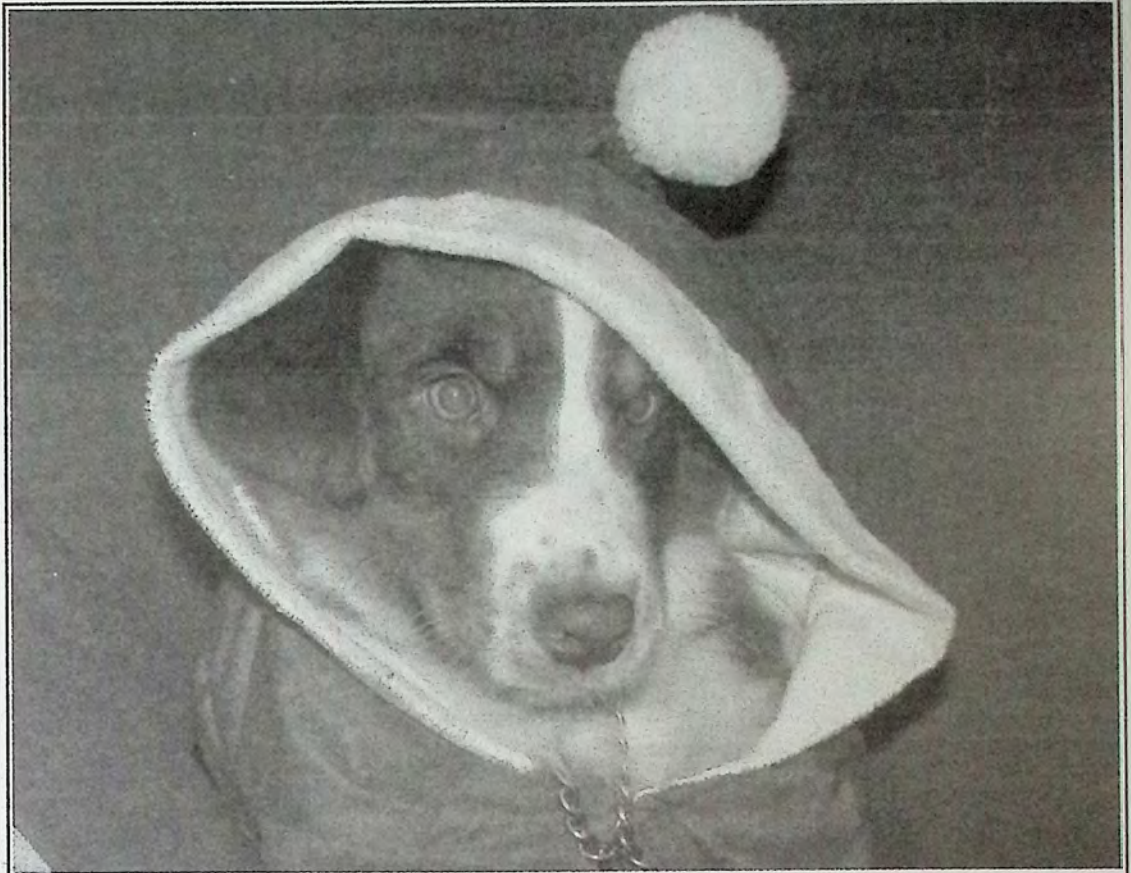

Plan Healthy Christmas Meals

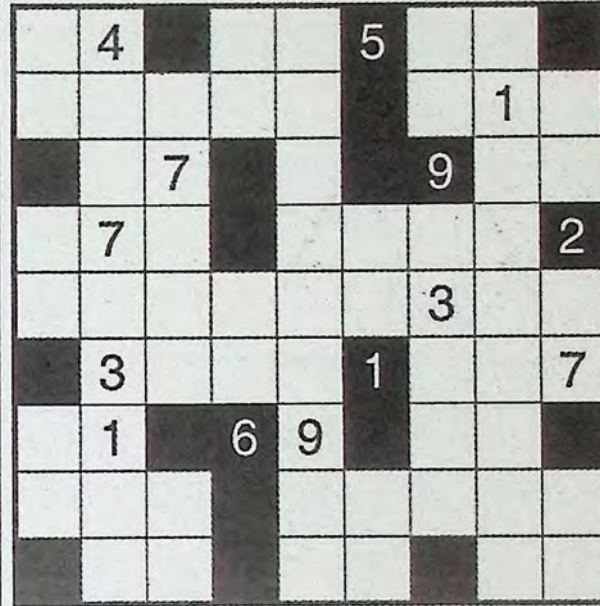

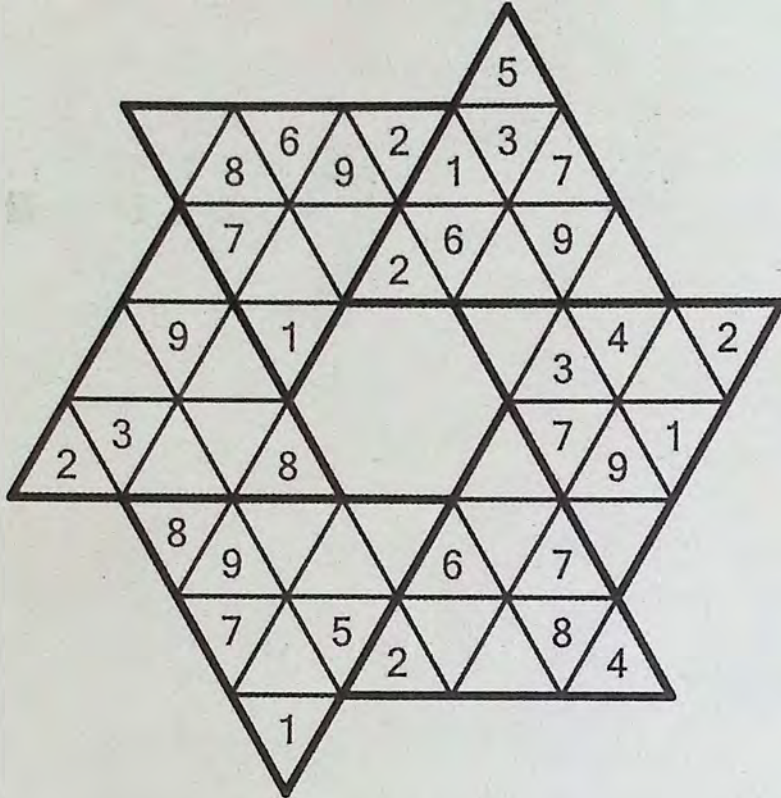

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

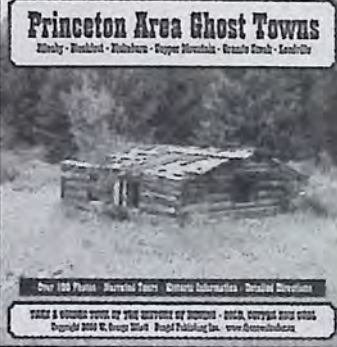

Asian Turkey Chili

Information: Serves 4.

Ingredients

- 1 lb (500 g) Canadian ground turkey
- 10 oz (300 g) onion, chopped
- 2 tbsp (25 mL) garlic, minced
- 2 tbsp (25 mL) ginger, minced
- 1 1/2 cups (375 mL) turkey stock
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) soya sauce
- 1/4 cup (60 mL) ketchup
- 3/4 - 1 tsp (4-5 mL) hot pepper flakes
- 12 oz (375 g) cooked black turtle beans, drained
- 8 oz (250 g) coarsely chopped sweet peppers (red, green or yellow)

Directions

In a large skillet or wok over medium heat cook turkey, onions, garlic and ginger, stirring constantly to break up meat, until meat is no longer pink.

Add turkey stock, soya sauce, ketchup, hot pepper flakes and beans. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer 15 minutes. Add peppers and cook just until heated through. Serve in bowls.

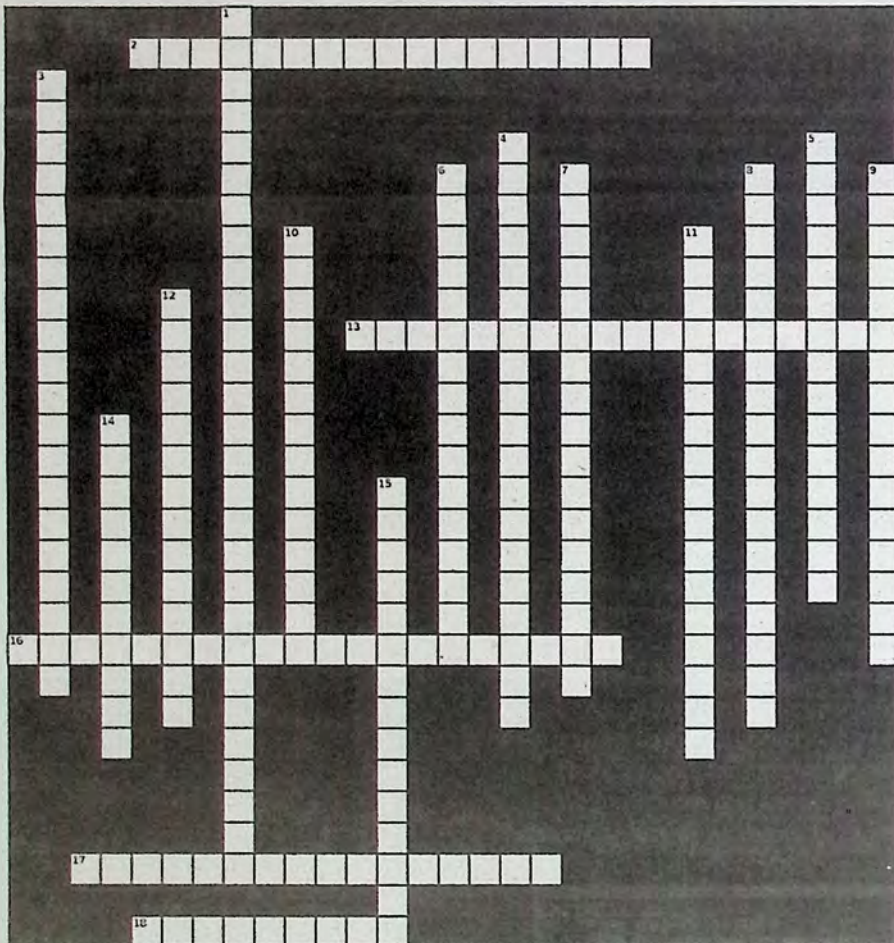

Princeton's Sister City

Tonasket Celebrates Winterfest

It started at the Princeton Racing Days Parade back in June.

That was when I met Tonasket Mayor Patrick Plumb. I had heard stories about him previously from Princeton Councillor Jason Earle and the fun he had representing our community in our Sister City.

I never really thought much about the Sister City relationship until recently.

It was 25 or 26 years ago I traveled over the border as a representative of the local media to report on what I believed to be just a casual meeting between the rodeo clubs of both communities.

There was talk about a Sister City connection possibly resulting from the meeting as a means to cross promote both rodeos.

I think in total there were five or six of us driving down one evening to meet in a pub/restaurant in Loomis, Washington.

Representing Princeton on the trip were Mayor Gloria Stout, Princeton Rodeo Club President Stan Thompson, Dawn Johnson (on behalf of the Similkameen Spotlight), myself (on behalf of radio CKRP) and one or two others I don't recall but were either from Town Council or the Rodeo Club.

We were not prepared for this meeting in any way whatsoever as when we arrived the pub/restaurant

was packed to standing room only as most of the residents of Loomis and Tonasket were there to welcome Princeton in what was apparently a 'done deal' Sister City partnership decided before any of us got there.

The relationship between the two communities was pretty significant in the early days with royalty traveling to each other's events - a tradition that continues to this day - and probably reached its peak when the Pony Express Ride was launched.

Many friendships were made over those years, many of them are still intact.

I used to visit Tonasket twice a year at the time. I wouldn't think of missing their Founder's Day Rodeo

in June and in September there was a Logger Sports event but as happens with most relationships, things start to change and you eventually find yourself doing different things.

It's been well over ten years since my last visit to Tonasket and after meeting Mayor Plumb at Racing Days we hit it off. We bumped into each other frequently during that weekend and connected with each other through social media. 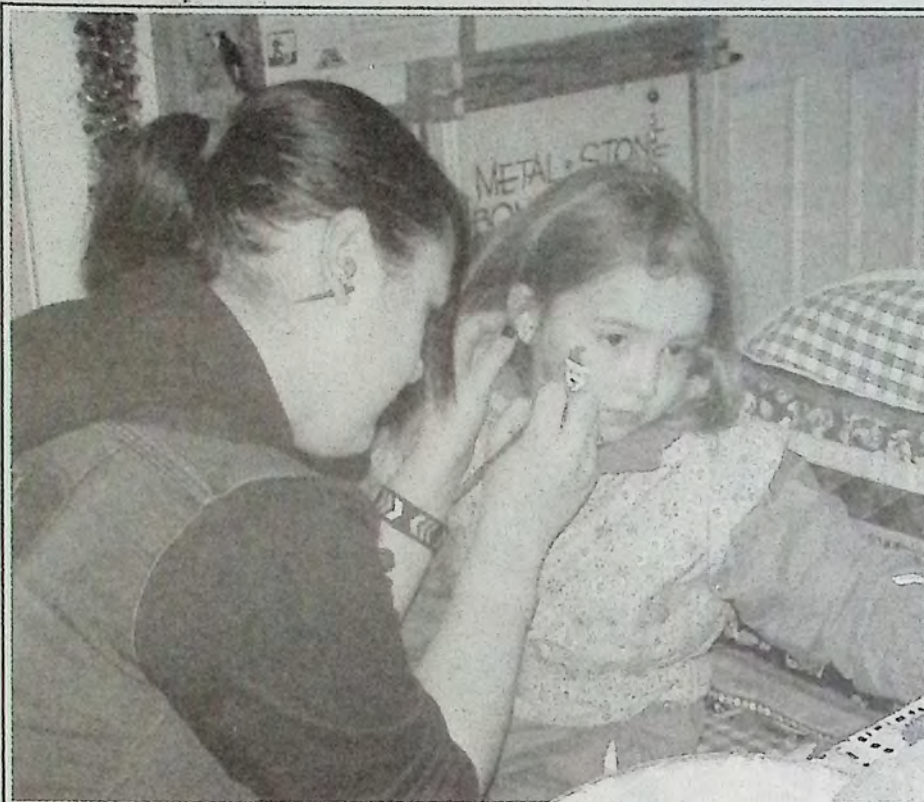
Shortly after meeting Brenda for the first time, Mayor Plumb started connecting with contacts and we continued on Page 23

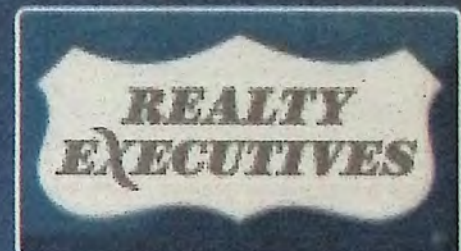
