Judge dismisses youth

A youth was tried in Provincial

Court in Princeton in December on a charge of assault causing bodily harm. The charge arose as a result of a fight involving several youths who attended festivities in Tulameen on the August long weekend in 2011. The young men involved had been confronting each other on previous occasions and there was evidence given that booze had been consumed at various times on that weekend. During the altercation, one youth was punched and his jaw broken. Another youth was identified as the person responsible, but he denied his guilt.

The judge's decision was given in Penticton. The judge determined there was some doubt as to who had delivered the punch that caused the broken jaw and the youth was found not guilty.

Judge fines man for breach

In Provincial Court in Princeton on January 9, Daniel Ostrom entered a guilty plea to two charges, breach of a no contact

order and breach of a condition of recognizance specifying Ostrom was not to consume alcohol. He was ordered to pay \$200 plus surcharge for each violation.

Hedley party ends in court

On January 9, in Provincial Court in Princeton, 45 year old Frederick Jay Bell entered a guilty plea to a charge of assault causing bodily harm. The charge was laid following an incident in Hedley on June 24, 2013. Bell and his wife went to a party in Hedley, where they reside. They walked home together, but when they reached the deck of their house, Bell threw a chair at his wife, then threw her off the deck to the ground, causing a broken bone.

Bell was ordered to pay a \$500 fine and serve a nine month probation with conditions. He is not to consume alcohol and he is not to enter any business selling alcoholic beverages. He is to take alcohol abuse counseling as required by his probation officer.

The purpose of the proposed multi-agency Pest Management Plan (PMP) is to manage invasive alien plants and/or noxious weeds on provincial Crown land in the southern interior of B.C.

The PMP applies to areas located within the Thompson Nicola, Cariboo, Central Coast, Squamish Lillooet, Columbia Shuswap, North Okanagan, Central Okanagan, Okanagan Similkameen, Kootenay Boundary, Central Kootenay and East Kootenay Regional Districts.

The PMP applies to areas in the vicinity of the communities of Bella Coola, Alexis Creek, Quesnel, Williams Lake, 100 Mile House, Lillooet, Clinton, Cache Creek, Blue River, Clearwater, Kamloops, Salmon Arm, Revelstoke, Golden, Merritt, Vernon, Kelowna, Penticton, Oliver, Osoyoos, Princeton, Grand Forks, Castlegar, Kaslo, Nakusp, Nelson, Trail, Salmo, Creston, Cranbrook, Invermere, Fernie and Sparwood.

The pest management methods proposed for use include mechanical, cultural and biological control and the use of herbicides within the area to which the PMP applies. The common name and examples of the trade names of the herbicides proposed for use under this plan include aminopyralid (Milestone), clopyralid (Lontrel), dicamba (Vanquish), diflufenopyr (Overdrive), glyphosate (Vantage Plus Max), imazapyr (Arsenal), mecoprop-p (Dyvel DX), metsulfuron methyl (Escort), picloram (Tordon 22K), 2,4-D Amine (2,4-D Amine 600) and tricopyr (Garlon XRT). Selective application methods include wick/wipe-on, injection, squirt bottle, cut surface, and foliar applications using backpack or vehicle mounted sprayer.

The proposed duration of the PMP is from May 1, 2014 to April 30, 2019.

Flip Of The Coyne

Someone asked me what is happening with the industrial park. I replied honestly that I did not know. What is happening up at the industrial park, or business park as it is listed on the Town of Princeton's website? According to the Town's website, there are 22 light industrial lots in the park, most of which sit empty.

Why is the "Business" park sitting empty? Could it be because the cost of the lots are too high? I have heard that from people who have looked into moving up there. It could be the zoning of light industrial. The way I have read the zoning bylaw, light industrial would be great for an area like the tunnel where you have a mixed residential/industrial area, but not up where

you want growth in Princeton's sorely needing manufacturing sector. Don't get me wrong. It would be great to buy up there if you were going to put in a warehouse, or a service centre, but if you want to put in some sort of value-added manufacturing plant, there are a bunch of restrictions like no outdoor production or storage of sawdust. In other words, most if not all of our value-added businesses in the area would not be able to relocate or start up there.

Putting zoning and price aside, where is the marketing plan to promote and sell the industrial lots up at the park? Where are the billboards along the highway informing potential investors of the great opportunity to build in Princeton?

Princeton needs the jobs that could exist in that industrial park. Jobs that would fill up the industrial park are the type of jobs that help a downtown grow. They feed off each other. Manufacturing requires a certain amount of services and those services fill up the downtown. The businesses that go in the industrial park either service larger industry, like mining or forestry, or they create things to sell to other markets. Princeton doesn't need more minimum wage jobs. Yes, we need minimum wage jobs, but we need middle income jobs even more, the kind of jobs that support the families we need to fill our dwindling school population.

If the Town's only plan is to have a write up on their website, with a pdf of the subdivision plan, that isn't

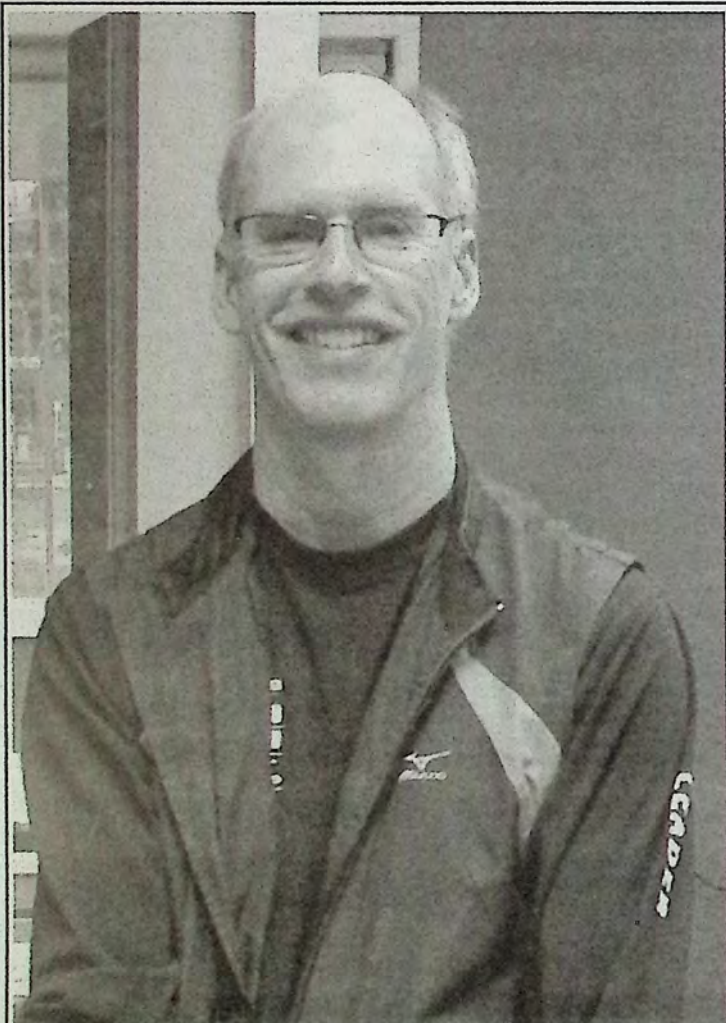
enough. We heard that the Town thinks that businesses in town need a better online presence. Let's talk about that for a moment. Where is the Princeton Business Park's website? Where is the long term plan for it with mapping, pictures and all the rest of the information necessary for someone who may be looking for properties from out of town? List the prices of the lots.

Having to call the town office for pricing and availability is a little hokey. Put the information that investors need at their fingertips so they will become interested in actually making that phone call to inquire or purchase the lots. If they are listed somewhere with a realtor, then make darn sure that your website indicates that.

If the Town Council is serious

about trying to bring life back to the local economy, then they need to be serious about what they are going to sell and allow for development. What happened to all the ideas of developing the airport? I see on the website that there is a development plan, but why has some sort of airport industrial been added with the industrial park across the way? There could be real opportunities for some sort of airport businesses to start here.

I know Council is starting to look at what can be done to save the downtown, but they also need to start looking at what should be done with all the current titles the Town holds to stimulate growth in areas that we need so the opportunity for a flourishing downtown can happen.

Local man pleads guilty

Stanley J. Beaupre appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on January 10 to enter a guilty plea to a charge of assault causing bodily harm. A judge will decide on a sentence at a later date in Penticton.

Judge orders fine for breach

In Provincial Court in Princeton on January 10, Daryl B. Murray entered a guilty plea to a charge of breach of recognizance. Murray had been ordered to have no contact with his former girlfriend, but he had breached the conditions by phoning her and making threats. The 43 year old man now lives in Calgary. He was placed on a 12 month probation and ordered to pay a \$750 fine plus a surcharge. One of the conditions of the probation is that he have no contact with his former girlfriend or her family.

Judge finds woman guilty

In Provincial Court in Princeton, Kyley Michaud, age 22, of Penticton, stood trial on a charge of possession of marijuana for the purpose of traf-

ficking. He lawyer argued there had been a violation of her Charter rights, and two police officers gave testimony in a voire dire, as well as Michaud herself. Judge G. Sinclair determined there had been no violation of Charter rights, and that, on arrest, Michaud had voluntarily admitted the marijuana belonged to her. She

told the police she had obtained it for her mother, who was suffering from cancer, in hopes it would alleviate her mother's pain.

Due to the circumstances, as well as the fact that Michaud had no criminal record of any sort, Judge Sinclair ordered an absolute discharge and a \$50 surcharge.

Let me say that most retailers in Princeton are making little if any money, yet most spend lots of money advertising, as an example go to the Arena and have a look at the rink boards. All the monies raised by this advertising goes to the Posse Hockey Club.

Is Mr. Maynard suggesting that business owners should stop advertising locally because there is no return to the monies spent and this revenue would bring better results

with out of town publications such as the tourist guide?

Perhaps he is correct and as business people we should stop supporting local clubs and organizations and advertise with larger publications in larger centers in the hope that if these people come thru the area and can actually find Princeton they stop at our establishment.

Perhaps we should review what Mayor and Council are accomplishing.

You have effectively continued the 20 year tradition of driving gainfully employed families out of Princeton. The success of this effort is clearly indicated by the 2,000+ decrease of population.

Further success of your effort will be insured with the recent rezoning

of highway commercial to residential a very clear signal that you do not want any new business in Princeton. I'm sure Mayor and Council enjoy watching \$30,000,000 in payroll leave Princeton every year.

The reduction in population is of course the basis for current business failures and a guarantee that all existing businesses will close.

However you look at things, as long as the monopolizing retailers are charging premium prices, those people that can afford to will shop out of town, also taking with them the money they would have spent with the smaller retailers. I do not believe courses in advertising or hospitality training for those merchants trying to figure how to stay in business for another month is going to be the answer. Revisiting the O.C.P. and amending zoning to accommodate commercial business would be a step. Signage to indicate there is town off the highway would help and advertising signs that do not have to be erected on First Nations Property because of the inflexible rules council have created.

Winter: A Test Of Who We Are

We never really think of winter as an asset, do we? Many Canadians actually flee winter, going to Arizona or Mexico or other warm places. We call them snowbirds, migrating south the way birds do.

However, having spent three winters amid palm trees and sandy beaches, I learned to appreciate the challenge of winter, although many people never think how winter is an asset to us.

Don't get me wrong: I am not enthusiastic about winter. I hate the dark days, and I am not happy feeling cold, but I do know winter is good for us. Winter develops our characters and teaches us skills we would find more difficult to learn if we lived in a friendlier climate.

Canadians are obsessive about weather reports. Because snow and freezing rain can seriously affect our ability to go anywhere, we watch the morning and evening weather forecasts. People engaged in agriculture want to know when to plant, when to watch out for frost, when it might rain, when we need to irrigate, and when we need to harvest. Gardeners feel the same way about the weather.

We consult the weather forecast before we go anywhere to do anything outdoors. We need to know not only the driving conditions, but what we should wear. When we travel anywhere, we need to know whether we should take a raincoat, a windproof jacket, a scarf, or a straw hat and bikini, or should we take our snow boots and parka? We are governed by seasonal highs and lows. We learn this the hard way, by enduring winter.

Winter is expensive. Higher heating costs, higher electrical costs, new winter tires and an oil change, block heaters, insulation, winter coats, boots, mittens and hats, all add to the cost of winter. My cousin who lives in western Australia tells me they are having a cold winter, it went down to 12C. My cousin in Phoenix tells me they had a cold snap and the daytime high was 7C. They do not own winter coats, boots or all the other warm things we accumulate to endure winter. They do not have to change tires and oil on their vehicles twice a year. They do not have to have big furnaces and heaters. My cousin in Australia does not have a clothes dryer - they hang their laundry out in the sun, and iron what they need to iron.

Because winter is expensive, we need to learn to budget for the cost of winter. In fact, one of the things we Canadians learn is to plan for winter. We plan ahead and we work to prepare for winter. We know winter will challenge us one way or another.

I think I am quite typical of most Canadians when it comes to planning for winter. I make sure I have winter clothing ready to go, winter boots, socks, long underwear,

gloves and hats are brought out of my spare closet and summer things are put away. This is one of my October chores, because November can see temperatures drop like a rock and we can have early snow. I budget to have money to change tires on my car and get the winterizing so my car will not freeze up if the temperature drops. I bring in hoses to store for winter, and make sure there is wood for the heater in case we have a power failure. My flashlights and candle supplies are checked. My extension cords are ready to attach to the block heater. I put up my Christmas lights in October in case it is too cold or snowy in December to get out on the step ladder. I haul out my snow shovels and put them on the porch, and I put away all of my gardening tools and the lawnmower.

I stock up on groceries for winter, making sure I have enough to last out a snow storm or freezing rain conditions without running out of certain things, like coffee, milk, pasta, toilet paper and toothpaste. I make sure I will be able to stay at home for a few days if conditions are really bad.

I like to read, so I stock up on reading materials. I like to do crafts in winter, so I plan what I will work on and I get the things I will need long before winter sets in. I stock up on cleaning products, too, because winter is a good time to do some serious house cleaning.

All of this takes planning, setting goals, and learning to follow through, because if you do not plan ahead and follow through, you learn the hard way how difficult winter can be if you are not prepared. The ability to plan ahead, set goals and follow through is a tremendous skill. When it comes to building character, winter teaches us to endure conditions we would prefer to avoid. Winter teaches us caution, but also teaches us courage and endurance, great character assets. Anyone who has braved going out to work when the temperature is -35C knows it takes courage and endurance. Anyone who has shoveled a metre of snow off the roof knows it takes courage and endurance. Winter builds life skills and character.

Despite all of this appreciation for winter, I will complain just as much as any other Canadian when continued on Page 21

Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

Here's an interesting fact to consider.

There were fewer empty storefronts in downtown Princeton before the copper mine reopened.

There are a lot of reasons why downtown Princeton has become what it is today and as a result the solution to fixing the problem will be complex and will involve a number of different phases.

While it is easy to point fingers and blame the situation on such things as "greedy landlords" as has been suggested more than once, it also has a bit to do with the mine.

It would be easy to say that the mine has done little to enhance Princeton, but those employed by the company who do actually reside in the community would be able to say otherwise.

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation has put a lot of Princeton and area residents to work and is paying them a good wage. Although a lot of the employees there do not live in Princeton full-time, there are more and more who are starting to make the Similkameen their home.

Copper Mountain has also worked at being a good corporate citizen with numerous donations to a variety of local non-profit organizations and recently signed an agreement with the Indian bands in the Similkameen which will see a great deal of funds fed to both for numerous projects.

Add to that the five-figure donation last month to the Christmas Hamper Drive where employees raised funds that were matched by the company and you see a slightly different picture.

There are also a number of Princeton businesses that have benefited a great deal from the reopening of the mine. However, the fact remains that there were far fewer empty storefronts in the downtown core before the mine reopened.

So how do we fix it?

Town Council has hinted at forming a committee to explore the mechanics behind what has been happening to the local economy.

I can save taxpayers a \$10,000 consultation fee right now with this simple phrase directed to Town Council: Talk to local merchants.

The first step to solving the problem is to get down in the trenches with those of us duking it out for survival in the downtown core.

But it does go both ways. Residents need to be educated on the benefits of supporting their local economy. My favourite story is of a guy who wanted to buy a (fill in the blank with any big ticket item). He went to the two locations in downtown Princeton he could get the same thing at but didn't like the price at either so he went to the nearest big city and bought the very same thing (different model, different brand as was available locally) and apparently saved a few dollars.

He bragged for some time about this miraculous deal he made, although he had to spend money on fuel and a meal, but didn't factor that as part of the purchase price. Nor did he consider the time it took out of his day to make the trip, find the item (which would have been stops at probably half a dozen locations selling the same type of product) then bring it home.

One day the product started to malfunction so he took it to the first

place he looked in downtown Princeton when he was originally shopping for the item. The clerk at the store sympathized with him but couldn't provide any service, as the product was not from the local dealer. It wasn't even a brand they carried so he took it to the only other place in Princeton that carried a similar product.

The storeowner there also sympathized with the fellow, but explained that he couldn't do anything for him as the product wasn't from his stock and therefore wouldn't be warranted.

Can you guess what happened next?

The fellow ended up taking the (fill in the blank with any big ticket item) back to where he bought it out of town, which cost him extra in fuel and lunch while waiting for service on the item.

But the story doesn't end there as the item was purchased at a giant big-box store that doesn't service products they sell.

Sure, you can't get everything in downtown Princeton.

But what sets downtown Princeton

apart from the big city is this: the majority of the businesses currently running in the community are owner-operated. They are not part of a giant invisible chain that only sees the bottom line in the form of dollar signs.

I dare you to look at local businesses downtown and on Highway 3 and find out for yourself the majority of them are entrepreneurs in business to give a service to you.

Are you thankful enough to give them your business?

What sets shopping in Princeton apart from any other nearby community is that you can get customer service that doesn't always exist in the big city.

If you buy it in Princeton, chances are pretty good it can be serviced in Princeton and it won't cost you any extra fuel, or time out of your day.

As for the meal you may still have to buy while your item is being looked at downtown, you can help an extra local business out by having that meal in one of Princeton's many dining options which, believe it or not, is a nice way to feed the local economy.

Living Past 100
Teen Sports Mean Longer Life

Encouraging your teenager to become involved in high school sports can mean a longer healthier life for your child. Studies done in the United States and Europe show a strong correlation between good health after age 70 and being an athlete during the teen years.

The people involved in the study were over 70 years of age. They were questioned about every aspect of their current health, and they were questioned about their activities throughout their lives. Those who had the best health had been athletes during their high school years. The majority of participants in the study were male, but youthful participation in athletic activities was the key factor for those enjoying good health after age 70.

For both sexes, but for males to a greater extent, the teen years are years of great physical development. Engaging in sports activities, which demand much more than simple exercising, appears to have made a big difference in physical development. Athletes devote longer hours to physical activity while at the same time meeting demands to achieve a level of fitness above average. Those athletes who become members of a team, whether it is hockey, soccer, basketball, skiing, figure skating, horseback riding, track and field or swimming, are required to attend practice every week, perhaps two or three times a week. The extra training has long term benefits.

In the studies, the surprising correlation between teen sports activities and good health after age 70 drew researchers to draw some conclusions. The first conclusion was that secondary schools should support a strong program of physical education as well as a strong program of extra-curricular sports activities.

Whether secondary schools will follow through with achieving greater sports participation for students remains to be seen, but in the meantime, parents and guardians can make greater efforts to encourage athletic activities in teens. Family outings involving physical activity are one way to engage youth in fitness. Hiking, swimming, bicycle adventures on trails and back roads, skating parties, and cross country skiing can involve the entire family in physically demanding activities. These activities will be good not only for youth, but for the adult members of the family.

What better gift can a parent give to a child than a longer, healthier life?

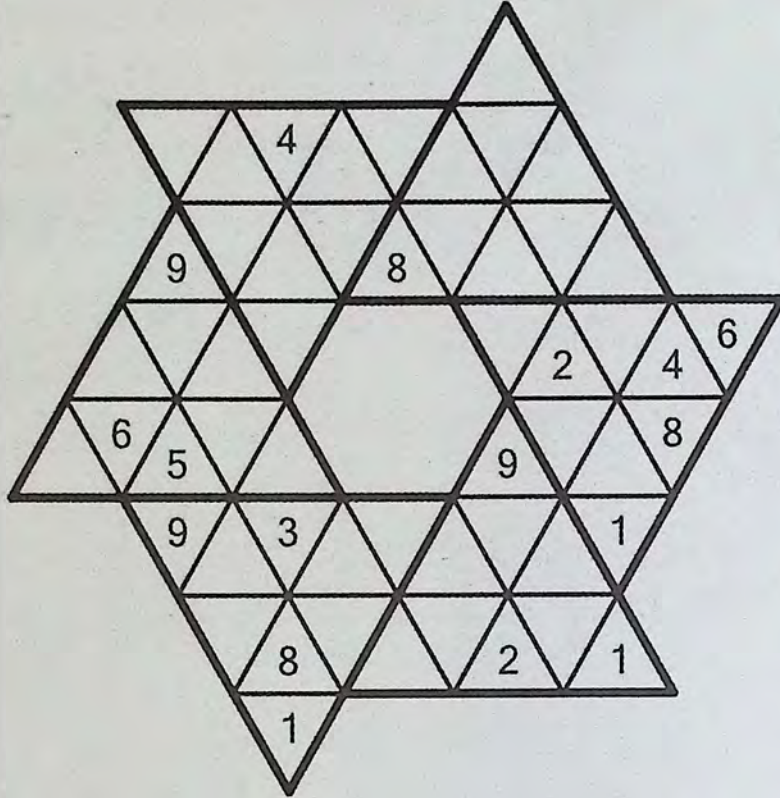

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

Browned Butter Mushroom Ravioli with Sage

(NC) by The Messy Baker Prep Time: 15 minutes, Cook Time: 15 Minutes, Serves: 4

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup butter
- 4 large sage leaves, whole (8 small is fine, too)
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 4 cups sliced mushrooms (about 1/4-inch thick)
- 1 pinch fine sea salt
- freshly ground black pepper
- 2 sprigs thyme, leaves removed (lemon thyme is lovely if you grow it)
- 2 tablespoons heavy cream (35%)
- 8 sheets pasta sheets, fresh is best but dried will do (about 4 inches square)
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan

Directions

- Put a large pot of lightly salted water on to boil for the pasta.
- In a shallow skillet, melt the butter over medium high heat. Add the sage leaves. Cook, swirling the pan occasionally, until the butter turns brown and smells like toasted almonds. The sage should become crisp but not burned. Remove skillet from the heat. Place the sage leaves on a couple layers of paper towel to drain. Reserve 1 tablespoon of the browned butter for later.
- Return skillet to medium heat. Sauté the garlic in the browned sage butter until it becomes soft. Add the mushrooms and increase the heat to medium-high, adding a pinch of sea salt and a generous grinding of fresh black pepper. Cook the mushrooms until soft, about 3 to 5 minutes. Stir in the thyme and cream, and cook until the cream has thickened a bit, about 2 minutes. Keep warm on low while you tend to the pasta.
- When the water reaches a full, rolling boil, cook the pasta to the al dente stage. Timing varies depending on whether you are using fresh or dried pasta. Drain the pasta being careful not to tear it. Torn sheets can be used as the bottom layer, so don't tell anyone if a sheet or two rips a bit.

Set out four plates and place one sheet of pasta in the middle of each. Spoon 1/4 of the mushroom mixture on each sheet of pasta and sprinkle with 1 tablespoon of Parmesan. Top with a second sheet of pasta. Drizzle with some of the browned butter. Garnish with a fried sage leaf. A dusting of more freshly ground pepper is nice, but not necessary. Serve immediately.

PDMHA's Dierra Maynard. She was in Logan Lake with her son at another hockey game when her ticket was drawn and was surprised when texts started coming in.

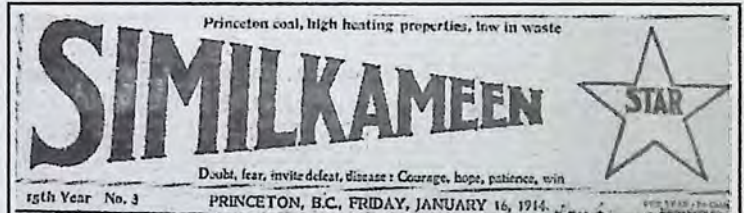
"At first, I just couldn't believe it," she said.

Ice in the Similkameen and Tulameen rivers has about all disappeared. A jam near the Similkameen bridge was caused by the rise due to the thaw on the head waters. There is not enough snow for good sleighing and the weather is remarkably mild and calm. So far the lowest thermometer reading has been two degrees above zero.

The Princeton Orchestral Society give a social dance tonight in the Thomas hall. The Society is favorably commented upon and has won its 'spurs' on pure merit. Tickets \$1, dancing from 9 to 12 p.m.

In the list of Dominion government legislation proposed for this session a uniform mining law including the best features of the various provincial acts will be enacted.

One hundred years ago, this article was published in the Similkameen Star newspaper. The date was January 16, 1914.

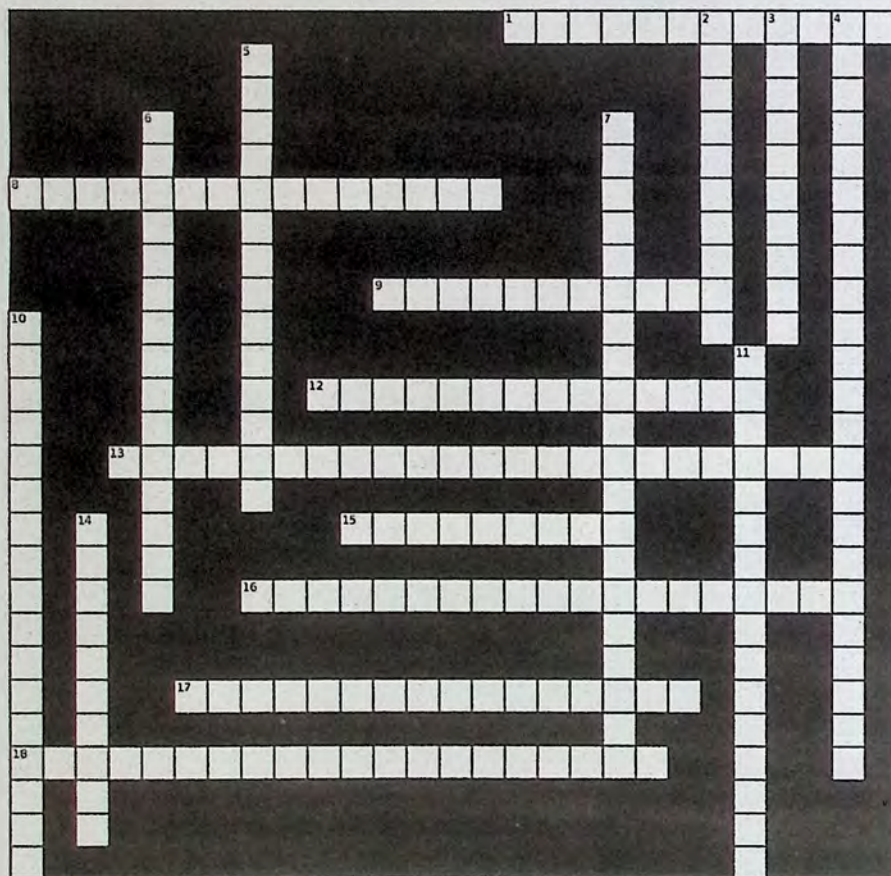

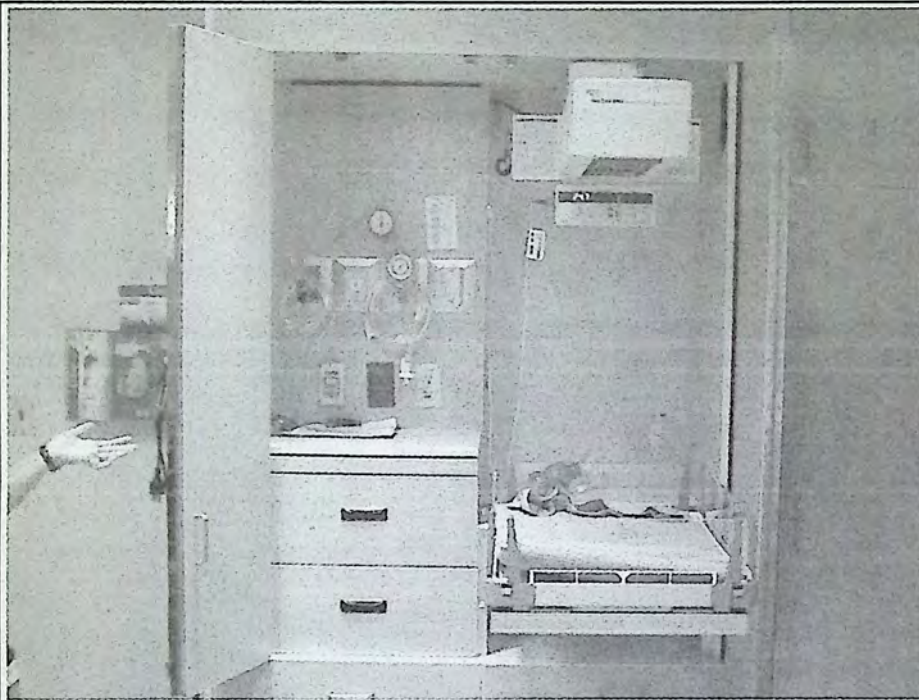

Princeton's Sister City Sets Healthcare Pace

If you build it, they will come. In the case of one small community, the thing they built and kept in good working order was their hospital.

The North Valley Hospital in Tonasket, Washington is a full service centre offering nutritional services, respiratory care, laboratory, emergency, imaging, extended care, obstetrical services, patient billing, rehabilitation, surgical centre, swing bed and a VA clinic.

Their website states: "It is our mission to provide outstanding care, both professional and compassionate, with community trust."

When we were in our Sister City (Tonasket, Washington) last month, the very first place we found ourselves was at North Valley Hospital on a personalized tour organized by Mayor Patrick Plumb and conducted by Hospital District Business

Development Coordinator Terri Orford.

The facility is situated pretty much in the centre of Tonasket, across the street from the City Hall, Library and Police Station. The hospital has an interesting past as explained by Orford.

"It started out as an 18-bed hospital complete with a nursing home, main kitchen, diet kitchen, bacteriological laboratory and x-ray. I have found historical newspaper articles dated August 25, 1938 telling of a dedication for what was then St. Martin's Hospital."

St. Martin's was a church hospital, which was operated by the Sisters of the Dominican Order.

Orford says the hospital was known as being "advanced beyond it's time and had the most up-to-date technology east of the Cascade Mountains for many years."

Our tour showed us that reputation has continued as everything from a CT 'CAT' scanner, MRI and other

imaging machines were the most current available. Computers and all other information technology equipment were the latest available in the market and we were told everything was regularly updated to stay current.

The hospital has also had a long connection with Canadians as a dedication on May 12, 1952 saw Major D. W. Hodsdon of Oliver, BC representing Canada during that ceremony.

The list of commonly performed

procedures at the Surgical Center of North Valley Hospital reads like the menu of a large medical centre and includes: Surgeries (gallbladder, appendectomy, hernia - inguinal, ventral, femoral, umbilical - carpal tunnel release, dupuytren's, tonsillectomy, adenoidectomy, rectal fistulas/fissures, entrectoce/rectoce/cysto-urethrocele), Endoscopy (EGD - esophagogastroduodenoscopy except esophageal dilations, colonoscopy), Reproductive (tubal ligation, partial

and total hysterectomy, salpingo-oophorectomy, vaginoplasty, vasectomy, hydrocele, spermatocele, varicocele, bladder suspension - stameys), Tissue (mastectomy, partial/radical, breast needle biopsy, temporal artery biopsy, split thickness grafts, spider vein removal, venous ligation, stripping and cut-down), Other (paracentesis, thoracentesis and closed drainage, circumcision, meatotomy, pilonidal cyst, hemorrhoidectomy, incision continued on Page 23

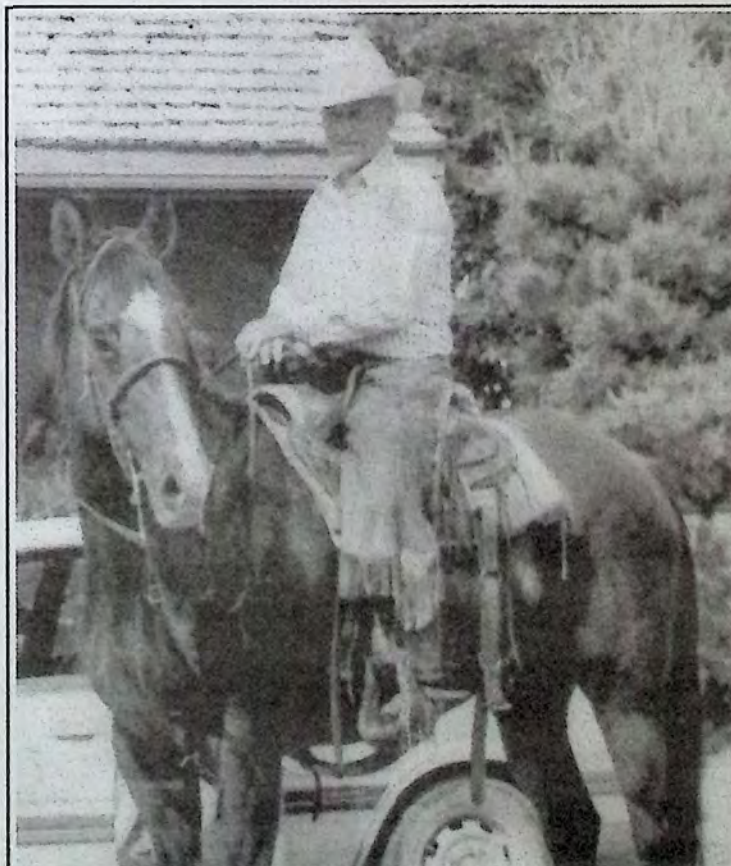

..... continued from Page 22 and drainage, peg tube placement, cryotherapy - liquid nitrogen).

Yes, they have a complete surgical ward, a birthing centre, Veterans ward, extended care, emergency ward and much more all in the centre of a small town in northern Washington with a population of 1,136 and serves a District of about 11,000.

You're probably thinking, big hospital in a small town over the border, it's going to be a 'for-profit' operation but Orford explains it is not.

"We are a non-profit hospital. We are one of four hospitals in Okanogan County. We are subsidized with our District's taxpayer money, but it only provides us with about two weeks of operating funds our of the whole year. So the amount is very small. We mostly rely on billing and payments from

Medicare, Medicaid and a small percentage of Commercial Insurance."

The facility also has a large staff, about 250 employees according to Orford who says that figure includes full-time, part-time and per diem staff.

"Some of the part-time employees also work at neighbouring medical facilities in Republic and Omak."

Canadian patients are not frequent at the Tonasket hospital although the ER has treated some who have either been in an accident or suffered a medical emergency of some kind while in the District served by North Valley Hospital.

"We would love to see more Canadians. In fact, we offer a 30% discount on services to Canadians because they are paying out of pocket. I believe that a lot of Canadians would benefit from our facility."


In fact, Orford has been spreading

the word on this side of the border.

"I did a presentation at the Summerland Kiwanis club last fall. I presented our surgical services, and informed them that they could get a consult with our General Surgeon typically within one week, and receive services the same or following week most of the time. They were astonished at the quick access to care that we are able to provide. This is one of the great benefits of seeking care across the border at our hospital."


Would such a facility work in the Similkameen Valley? We believe it could and look to the clinic at Keremeos as an example of many services "under one roof" working together.

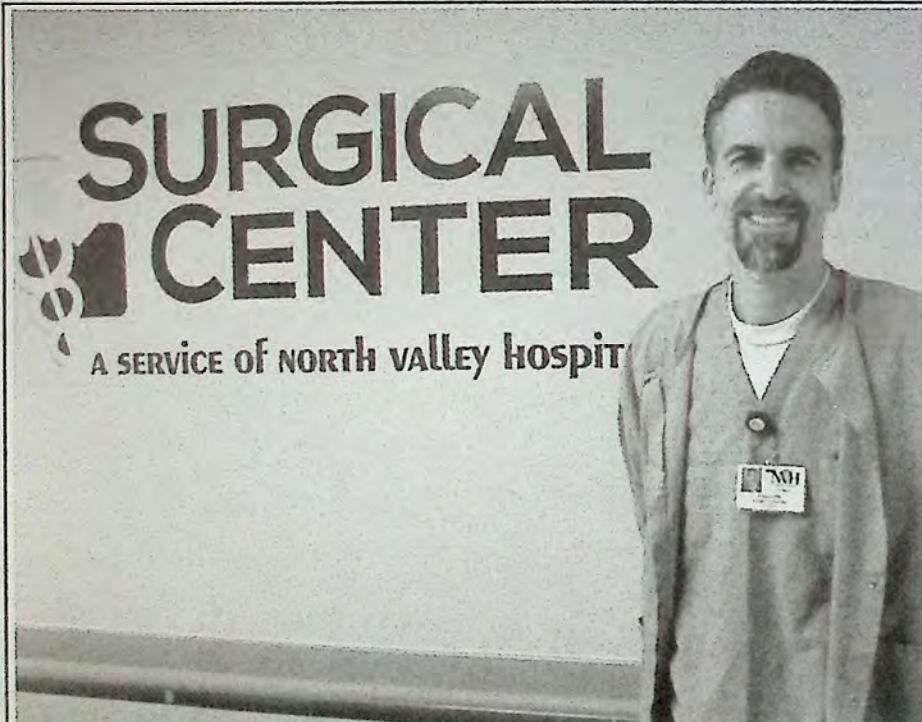
