Watch for falling rock

You've seen the bright yellow caution signs with the words above in black.

Motorists Monday, January 27th were not watching for rocks on Highway 3 about 8-kilometres west of Standing Rock (some reports said 18-kilometres west of Keremeos) for good reason, the four-lane stretch of the route is situated in a section of the valley where it is wide and open.

The highway runs along a hillside, but the tall rock formations are set back enough to not be considered a threat to most who travel that route daily.

Shortly after 12 noon on that day (most reports state 12:20 or 12:30 PM) a power outage struck most of the Village of Keremeos and Apex Mountain.

The cause was a rockslide that sent boulders "the size of pick-up trucks" down the hill overlooking Highway 3 and took out a number of power poles in the process. Traffic on the highway was not busy but two (some reports say three) vehicles were struck by the rocks and debris that tumbled down and covered the four lanes for about 150-metres.

One woman was sent to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries and the rockslide severed the Similkameen Valley at the core of its most vital transportation link.

As news started to spread about the road closure, so did photos of the incident, most of which were taken by Similkameen News Leader's Brenda Engel who was on her way back to Princeton with a carload last week's issue of this paper fresh from the printers and just delivered to newsstands in Keremeos.

Engel described the slide site in a radio interview as looking like "a war zone."

Power was soon restored to most of the close to 1,300 (some reports said 1,500) Fortis customer affected by the lines knocked down by the rock slide and the highway remained closed for the night.

Many reports have since circulated pointing the slide being triggered by an earthquake. The closest one recorded on January 27th was at 2:21 PM (just over two hours after

I had a chance last September to attend a lecture in Castlegar entitled, Unarmed Civilian Peacekeeping: A new Strategy for a Nonviolent World. The talk sponsored by the Mir Centre for Peace at Selkirk College, was given by Tiffany Easthom from Victoria. She is the Country Director in South Sudan for Nonviolent Peaceforce, an organization with the mandate to protect civilians and

reduce violence in situations of armed conflict.

In 2012, Tiffany was awarded the title, "Civilian Peace Keeper of the Year", for her work in utilizing non-violent strategies to break the cycles of violence in war zones.

In all honesty, on my way to the lecture at the Mir Centre, I was very curious to learn how it is that unarmed civilians are able to reduce violence, especially in volatile war zones such as in South Sudan.

Tiffany explained how the Nonviolent Peaceforce functions by working with local groups to foster dialogue among parties in conflict. They also seek the safe return of child soldiers and provide a protective presence in addition to offering safe spaces for civilians to develop local capacity for violence prevention. I asked her how it is possible for civilian peacekeepers to actually function in war zones. How could they possibly feel safe and were they not just human shields?

In her response, Tiffany mentioned that they do a lot of work on the ground before actually going in.

In other words, it is important to have the support of tribal chiefs, local politicians and others to ensure the safety of the unarmed peacekeepers.

In fact, in 10 years of operation, not one civilian peacekeeper has died.

This obviously shows that the idea of unarmed civilians bringing down violence has merit.

One has to ask, what potential

there is to reduce violence in the world if more resources were directed to non-violent means rather than flooding conflict areas with weapons?

Nonviolent Peaceforce was formed at the 1999 Hague Appeal for Peace and emerged from an international movement seeking alternatives to military conflict. There are currently member organizations in Africa, Asia, Europe, the Middle East, Latin America and North America.

The peacekeepers represent more than 40 nations and undertake intensive Mission Preparedness Training and extensive in-country preparations. The approximately 150 people on the ground in South Sudan are a mixture of local peacekeepers as well as those from other countries such as Canada. Their task is to create lasting alternatives to war and to help establish conditions in which permanent peace can take root.

What is interesting is that for the same dollars spent every 4 months by the world's militaries, Nonviolent Peaceforce could send 2,000 well-trained, professional peacekeepers into a war zone for an entire year.

As Mel Duncan, Founder of Nonviolent Peaceforce stated: "Nonviolent Peaceforce is a responsible approach to violent conflict, one firmly rooted in historical reality and emanating hope. By hope, I do not mean sentimental fantasies. I mean hard-nosed hope based on concrete, effective actions."

Let's give peace a chance.

Hired Equipment Registration Okanagan Shuswap District

The Okanagan Shuswap District of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure is creating its list of registered Equipment for Hire for the fiscal year of 2014/2015, which begins April 1, 2014. This district geographically covers the area from the United States border, east to Osoyoos, west of Princeton and north of Salmon Arm.

All individuals or companies registered in 2013 will have received invitations by mail to re-register hired equipment for 2014. If you have new equipment to be added to your profile, you can register online at www.bcbid.ca or contact the District Office in Kelowna to obtain the appropriate forms. Any individuals who were not registered in 2012/2013, but wish to have equipment listed are hereby invited to contact the District Office, either in person or by phone, to obtain the appropriate registration forms.

Note that while you do not need to have Commercial (Comprehensive) General Liability Insurance or up-to-date WorkSafe BC coverage to register, you will have to meet these requirements prior to working on any ministry projects.

Only owned or lease-to-own equipment is eligible for registration. Equipment may only be registered in one area in any given year. Seniority is not transferable from area to area.

The deadline for new registrations is midnight on Friday, March 14, 2014.

Late registrations will be accepted, but may appear at the bottom of the open list.

Note that there is no charge for registering new equipment, or for changing or deleting equipment information already listed.

It is hard for us who are working on changing the attitude of consumers to think local first when we have our public leaders who are not fully on board. When one of our

local council members was interviewed for Global News regarding the reopening of Highway 3, it came as a shock to most who heard him exclaim that "Penticton is Princeton's main city of commerce." Now yes, technically Penticton is considered the closest city that most Princeton residents frequent for their out of town shopping forays, but I do not believe that this was really the technical meaning of the statement. I don't want to get hung up on the actual words said by the councillor. The point that I want to make by quoting him is that there is a mindset that Penticton, Kelowna, Merritt and Kamloops are where we go when we want something and not Princeton.

As I said earlier, this is a complex issue, but it is an issue that we as the community can solve. We need to change our mindset and our civic leaders need to be part of this change in mindset. When the members of our municipal government do not see Princeton as the main centre of commerce for Princeton,

then we have a problem. We need Council, and not just one or two members, but all of them to be one hundred percent on board when it comes to thinking locally. We can no longer afford to think that if we continue to shop out of town that our business community will still be here when we get home.

It is time for people to start thinking locally about everything that we do. In the next couple of weeks the Chamber of Commerce will be rolling out a new campaign based

on this very idea. The idea is that we as the community need to Think Local, be it with food, entertainment or shopping, we need to look at what we have at home first. When this campaign starts, we need the support of our civic leaders because, whether they understand it or not, they too need to show that they believe in our business community, our arts community, our community as a whole, and that there is a real future in this community.

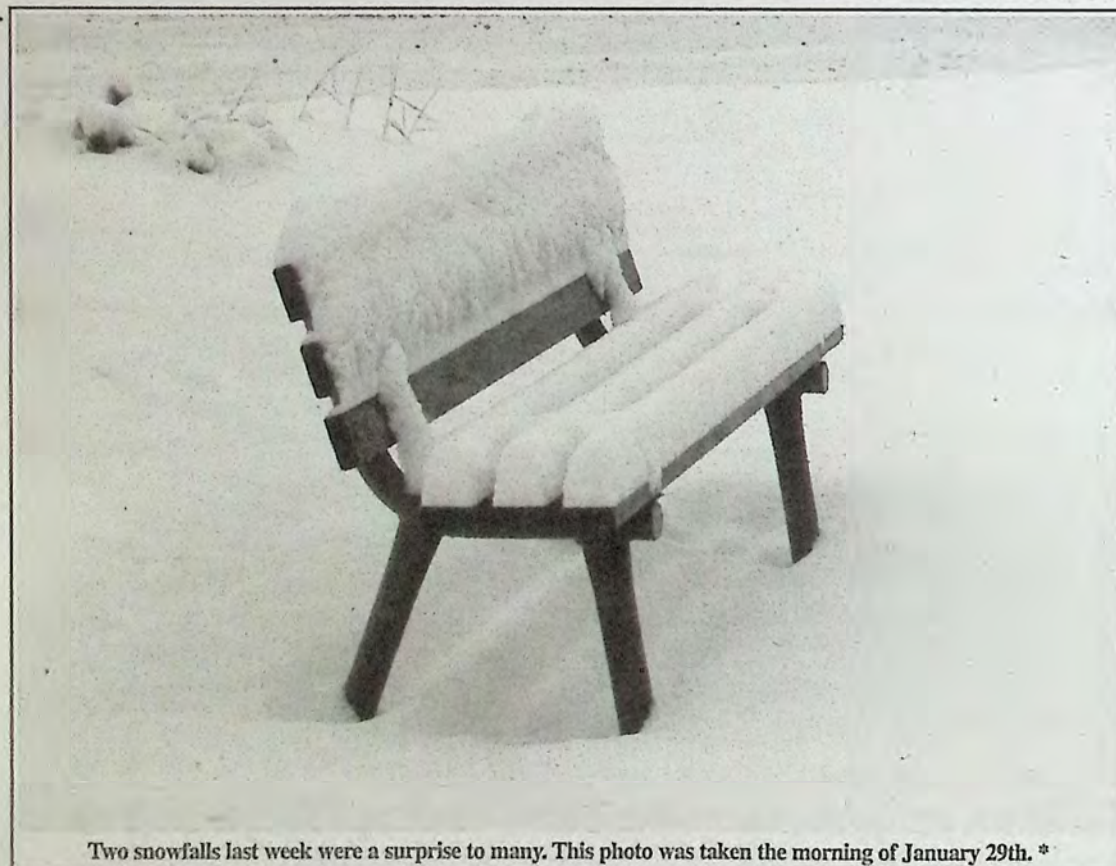

My Turn...

Rock 'N' Roll Reality

The rock slide last week near Keremeos taught me something.

I learned that I probably take regular trips on that road for granted and should pay a bit more attention to the actually topography Highway 3 snakes through.

Our newspaper is printed early Monday mornings in Penticton, which means a weekly trip for us to go and get them, plus stops on the way back delivering them in Keremeos and Hedley before we start distributing them in and around Princeton.

We take that trip so frequently that sometimes you pass a spot without realizing you've gone by it as it gets lost in the routine.

For some reason I chose not to take the trip last week, and Brenda ended up 'trapped' on the Keremeos side with a carload of newspapers yet to be delivered.

Everything worked out but it made me think about the road.

On even the worst weather day Highway 3 is still one of my favourite roads to travel. I love how it runs alongside the Similkameen River for most of the distance between Princeton and Keremeos.

I marvel at how the valley suddenly widens at Sterling Creek Bridge and you get to see some pretty spectacular ranchland on both sides of that bridge. We use the cattle fields as gauges of the start of spring as we watch them closely on each trip during calving season.

We take day trips in addition to our usual 'paper runs' along Highway 3. Special spots for us to kill time include stretches in and around Bromley Rock and near the old Hedley stamp mill.

The four-lane pieces closer to Keremeos are places we rarely stop, as there aren't many spots along there to do so. I think we subliminally view four-lane sections of highway as a signal to get moving along with a higher volume of traffic that can be accommodated in the extra lanes.

I've never really put much more thought into the section of Highway 3 where the rock slide closed the road because that's where we usually get up to speed and zip through on our way to our next destination.

Now I have to pay more attention and realize that although it is four laned there, anything coming down the hill can go all the way across the width of the road.

It also reminds me that we need to remember that living in such a beautiful part of British Columbia does have a risk attached to it. Luckily for most of us a rock slide closing the highway will force us to quit taking access to the next biggest town for granted.

A friend loaned me a book published by Time Inc. called America's Secret Agencies. 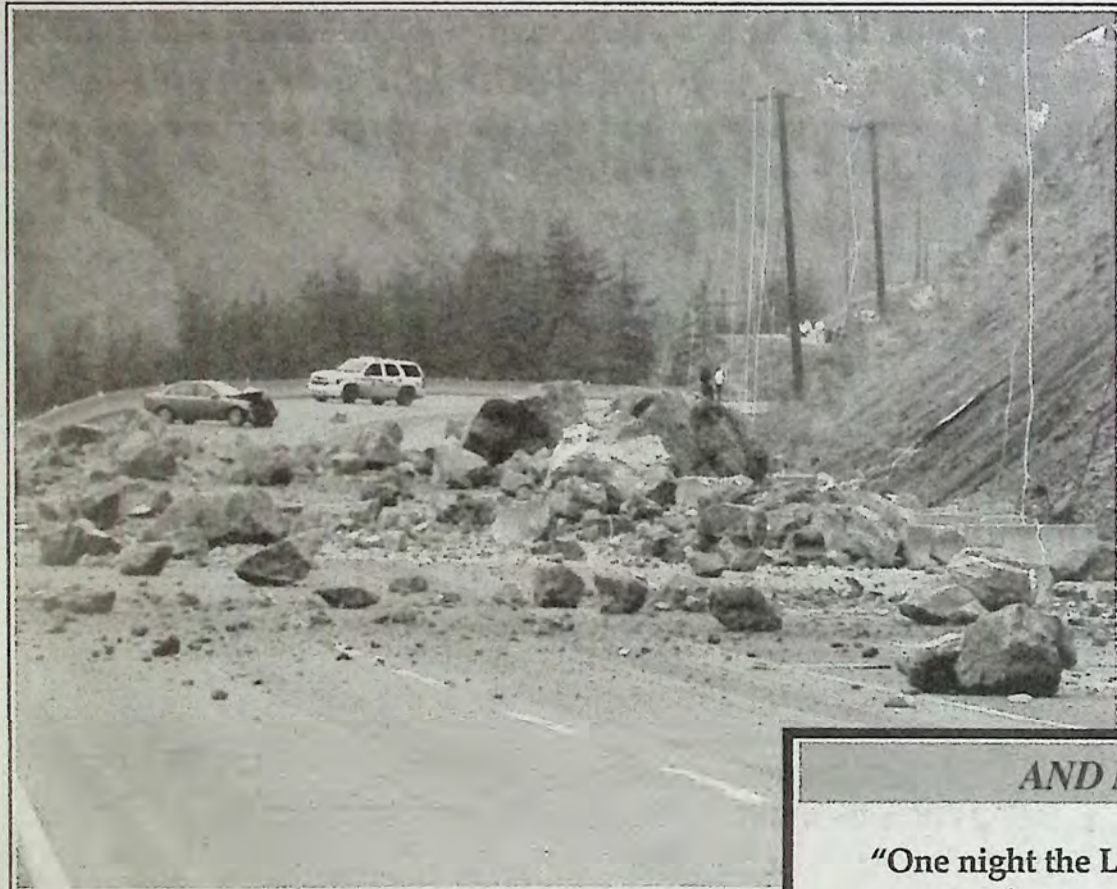

The implications of cyber warfare just boggle the mind. While reading all about all of the spying done on ordinary people, I found that information a lot less worrisome than the idea that I could freeze in the dark if somebody decided to start cyber warfare today. This is no longer the realm of science fiction. The future depicted in science fiction is here, now.

No wonder Washington, D.C. has one of the largest groups of survivalists in the United States. They knew what was going on before we did, and saw where it was leading.

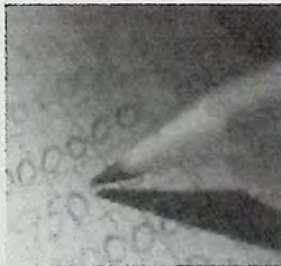

..... continued from Front Page the rock slide occurred) near Highway 3 approximately 9-kilometres SSW of Princeton and had a magnitude of 2.4. Locals will recognize that the 'quake' was actually a quarry blast at the Copper Mountain Mine.

A geotechnical crew was set to arrive at the scene at 7:30 AM the following morning to perform site assessment. Once the hillside was considered safe, heavy equipment would arrive and clean up efforts would begin. At the time, Highway 3 was expected to reopen later that day.

"There's probably five hundred at least, cubic metres on the road," Ministry of Transportation spokesman Dave Swales stated

Tuesday afternoon.

"As well, there is significant, major portion of the slide still uphill."

The proposed reopening of Highway 3 was delayed as a result.

"We've been monitoring and there has been more rock fall since the original slide."

The road remained closed for a second night and those who needed to travel from one side of the valley to the other used Princeton-Summerland Road or went to Peachland and took the Okanagan Connector to Highway 5A at Aspen Grove. Braver drivers tackled the Green Mountain Road to Nickleplate Road and around that way via the Apex Mountain turnoff.

On Wednesday, January 29th, a change in weather, which dumped

several centimeters of snow across the entire, Similkameen Valley also played a hand in delaying the reopening of Highway 3.

The helicopter carrying geotechnical crews could not take off as scheduled postponing an aerial assessment of the slide site for one more day.

By this time all the rock and debris that forced the closure had been cleared away but traffic was not allowed to move on the road until the slide location was cleared of safety concerns.

It wasn't until Thursday, January 30th when the highway was cleared for travel with a scheduled 6:00 PM reopening taking place an hour earlier.

Highway 3 was closed for 77 hours in total.

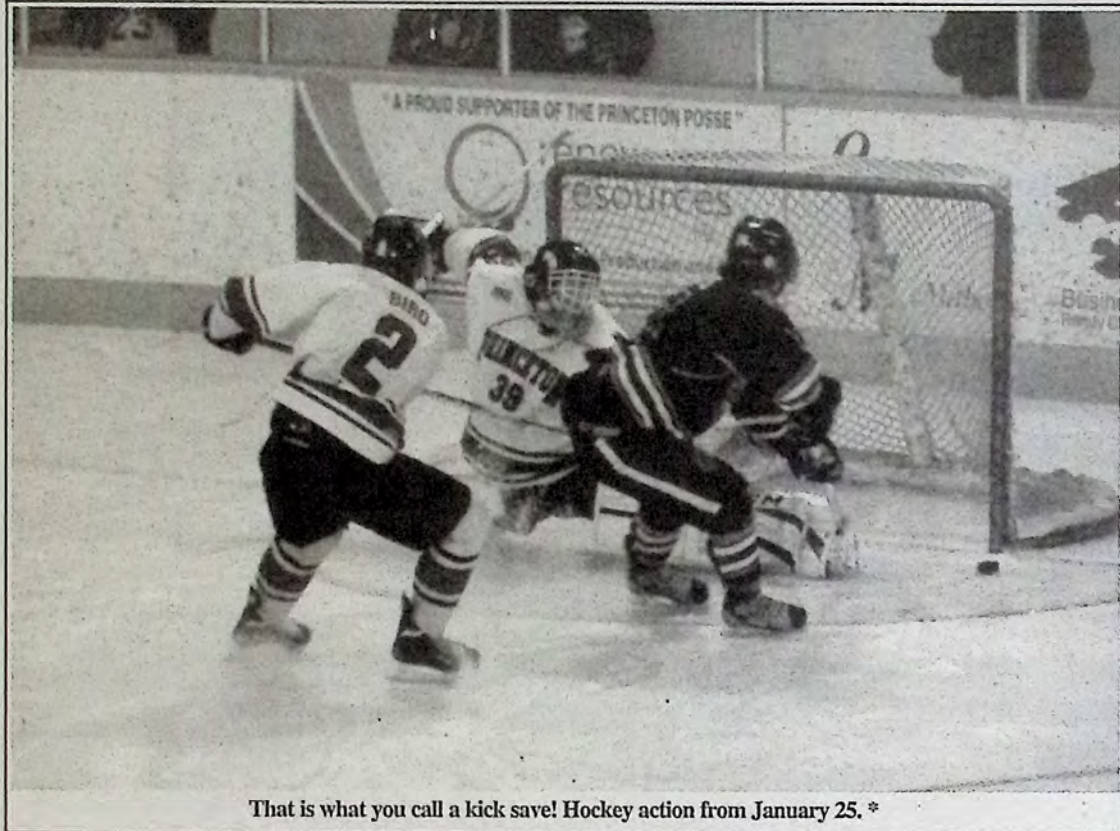

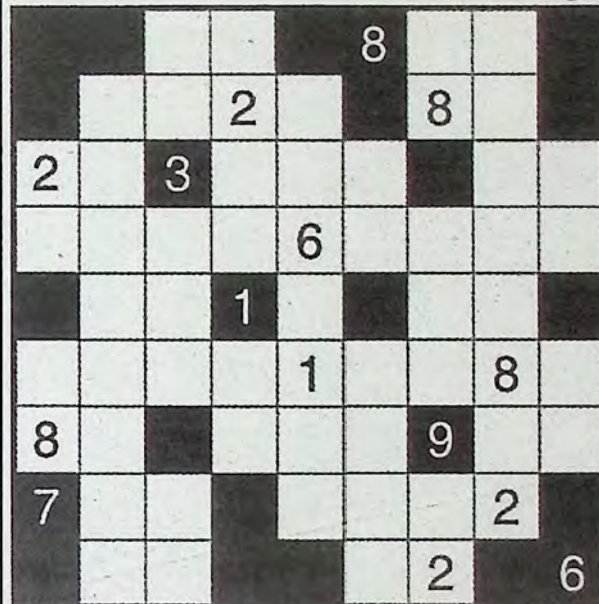

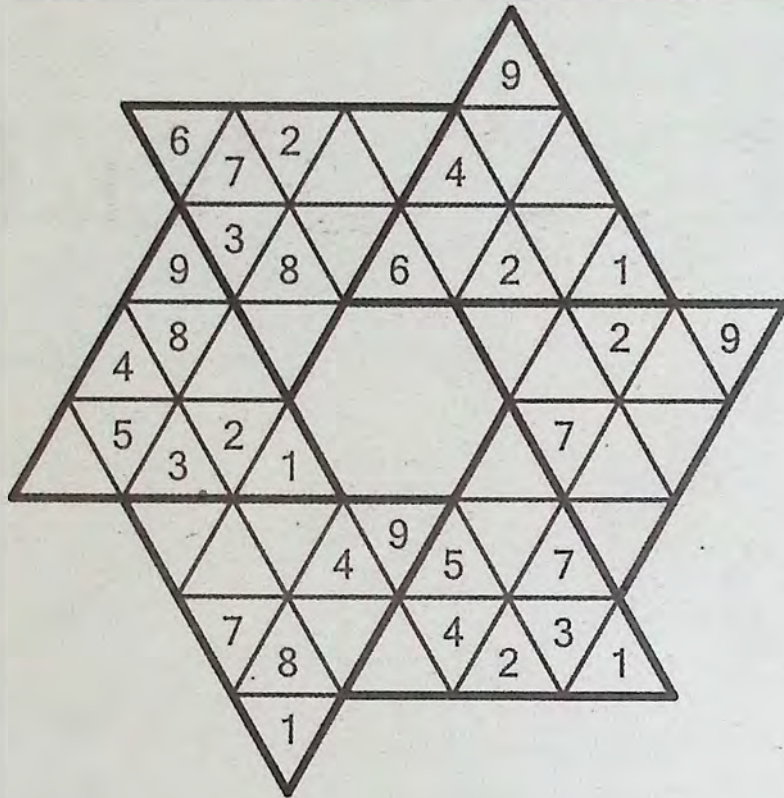

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

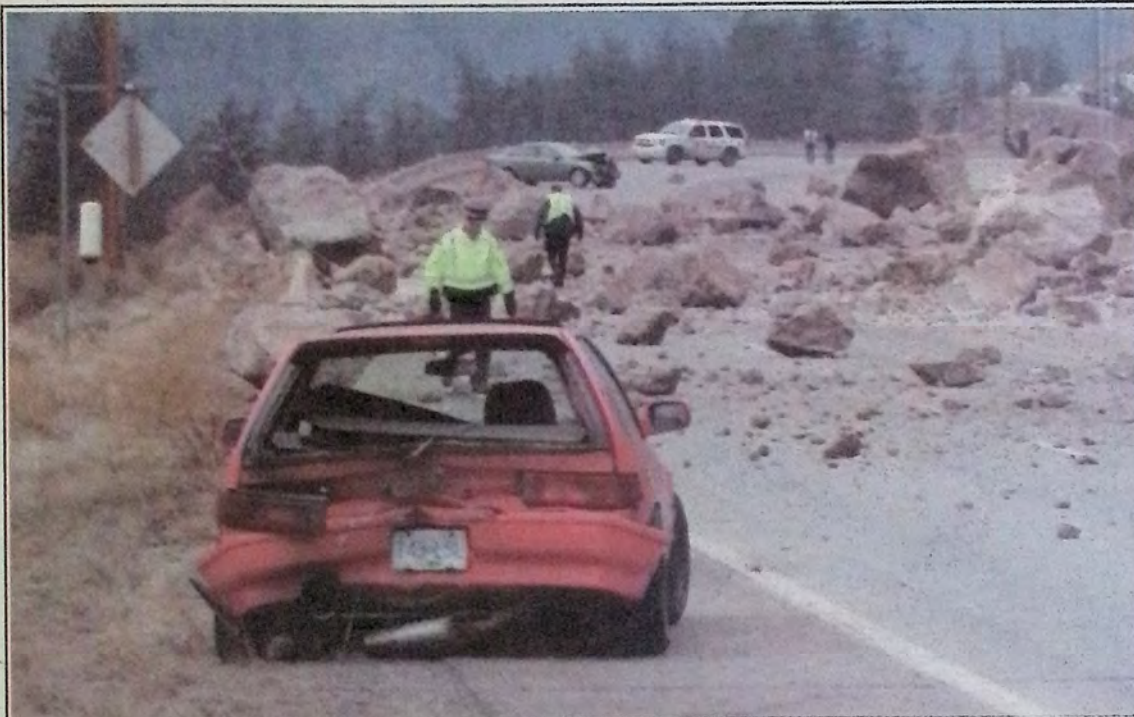

Baked Eggs with Mushrooms

(NC) by Isabelle of Crumb: A Food Blog

Serves 4, Prep Time: 10 minutes, Cook Time: 10 minutes

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 lbs mixed mushrooms, thinly sliced (ie. crimini, shiitake, oyster, etc)
- 2 tbsp butter
- 2 tbsp dry sherry or white wine
- 1/2 tsp dried thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 4 eggs
- 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Finely chopped parsley, for garnish

Method

Preheat oven to 400F. Lightly butter four large oven-safe ramekins, and arrange on a baking sheet.

In a large sauté pan set over medium-high heat, sauté the mushrooms in butter until soft and lightly browned, about 5 minutes. Add the sherry and thyme, and continue cooking for 2-3 minutes or until most of the sherry has evaporated. Remove from heat and season to taste with salt and pepper.

Spoon the sautéed mushrooms into the prepared ramekins, dividing evenly, then gently crack an egg into each one. Top with 1 tbsp cream and 1 tbsp grated Parmesan.

Bake in preheated oven until the egg whites are set and the yolks are done to your liking, about 10-15 minutes. Serve immediately with a sprinkling of chopped parsley and thick slices of toast for dunking.

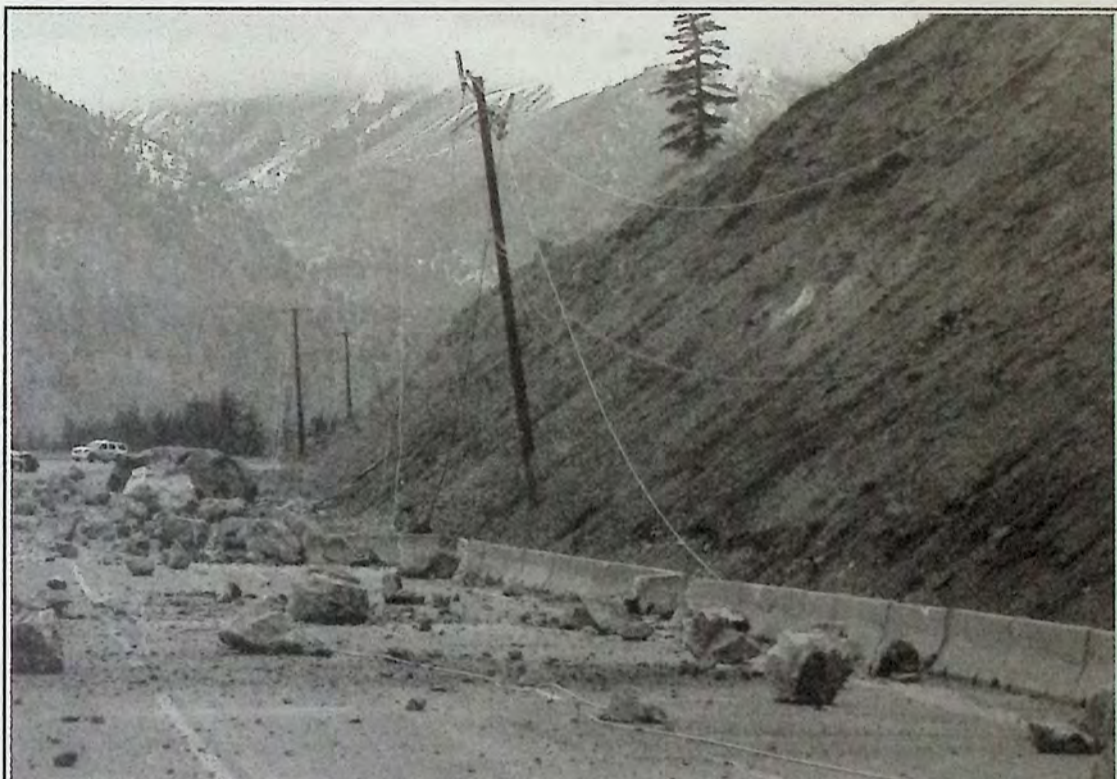

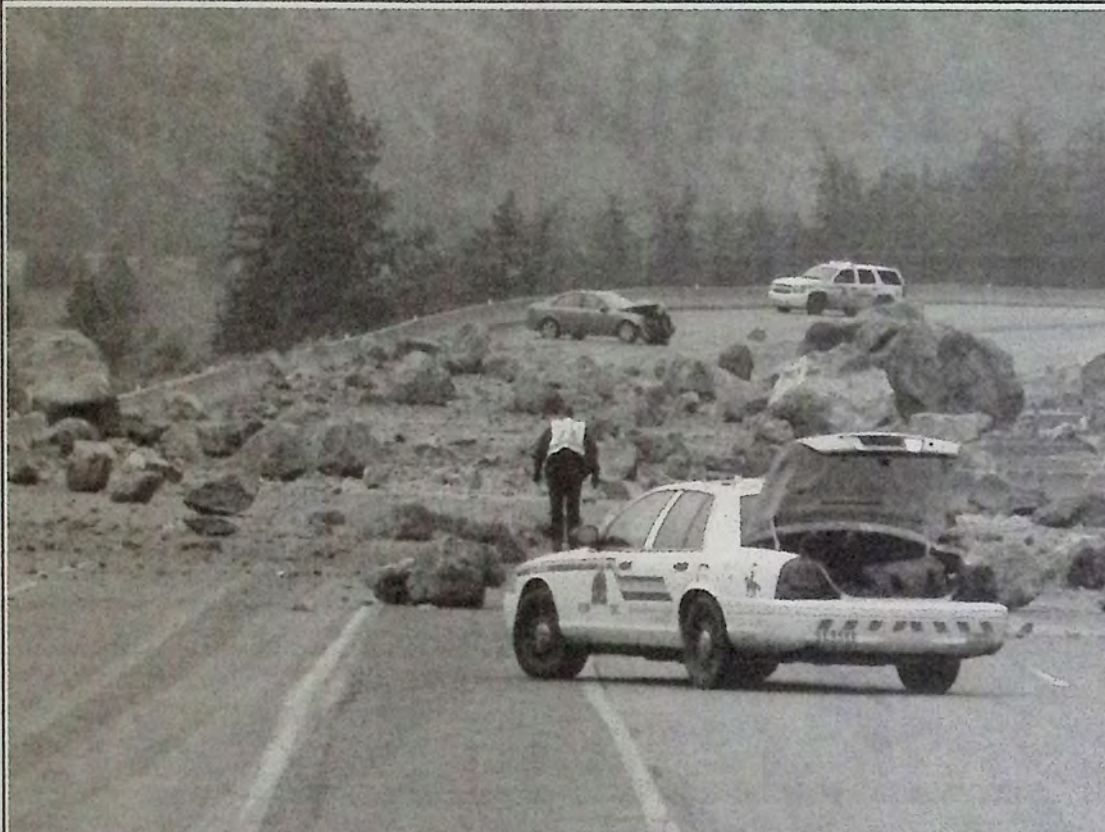

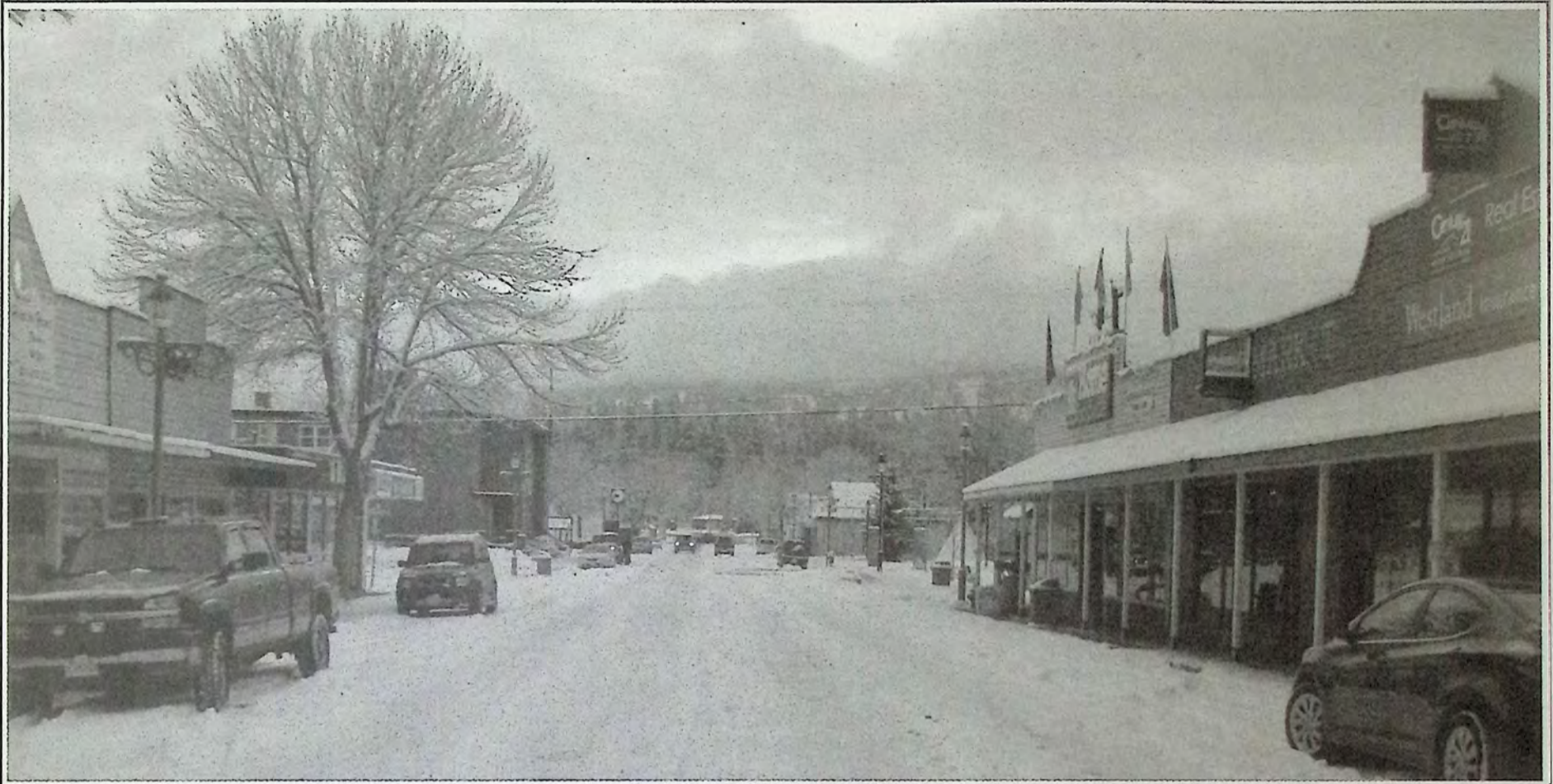

Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

For the past few weeks I've been sharing with you various things related to the local economy, mostly centred on trying to offer solutions to fixing the plight faced in downtown Princeton.

I'm talking specifically about the empty storefronts and the struggle faced by existing businesses to stay afloat in a downtown core that sometimes resembles a ghost town.

As I have stated all along, there is no simple solution as a number of different factors are in play here. That also means there are more than one smoking gun to blame for what has been happening to the business section of the centre of town.

I talk to a lot of business owners in an average week. I hear a lot of things and many of the discussions revolve around what some business people see as problems in Princeton.

Once again, I need to point out this series is not to point fingers or lay blame. It is intended to get you think-

ing about what is happening to your retail core.

Conversations last week were with a number of business operators who attended the Highway Business Forum. It was much like the Downtown Business Forum held a couple weeks before except it centred on businesses located along the highway corridor.

Oh, and there was a lot more notice issued to the participants (I thought I'd mention that).

As I was not at that meeting I was told some of the details.

Credit was given to the Town of Princeton (Town Council) for stepping up and getting involved. I still think it was a good thing for them to light the fire, but is this really the business of Town Council?

That is why I think it's a good idea that a joint committee has been formed with business owners/operators representing downtown and highways interests. The best people

for the job are those directly affected but what will they do?

Suggestions at the Downtown Business Forum included a sliding business license rate for those crafty entrepreneurs who don't have a local storefront and come to town, do their business and leave.

I'm sure you can guess what businesses that may be targeted at, but what about all the other ones with Town of Princeton business licenses who don't have VOX 1W0 in their address? Check the list online and you'll see there's quite a few.

The suggestion, which was purely said in jest at the meeting I attended, was to charge those businesses an annual fee in the neighbourhood of \$4,000 in an effort to discourage them coming to town.

While part of me really likes that idea, another part of me thinks that doesn't really say Princeton is open for business. If the goal is to protect the existing businesses, then there

needs to be a better plan than that.

Another item making the rounds is the suggestion that local businesses "need to diversify" in order to survive. While there is some validity to that notion, I think the down side to that is you eventually end up with a dozen places selling house plants and potato chips in addition to stationary supplies and ice cream.

I get asked frequently how Princeton can support two newspapers.

I usually respond by saying it seems to be able to along with two hardware stores, two auto parts stores, two coffee shops, three tire shops, and so on.

The point I'm making is that competition is good for the consumer.

A dozen stores selling a little bit of the same thing just confuses the consumer and before you know it, instead of having a dozen interesting "diversified" businesses, you end up with the two or three that can survive and customers expecting them to

eventually die off.

So what is the plan to save downtown Princeton?

I think the joint downtown/highway business committee needs to be given the power by Town Council to lobby on behalf of the business community to change things such as restrictive bylaws and zoning issues that are hurting business growth. There is talk about this happening.

I think the committee also needs to align itself with the Chamber of Commerce and fight together for changes and work together on economic development.

As much as I want to say Town Council needs to be involved, the only way they should be involved, in my mind, is on the other side of the table. It's not a case of 'us' against 'them' but I think in order to be effective in bringing about change to the business climate in Princeton, the line between the two sides needs to be clearly defined.

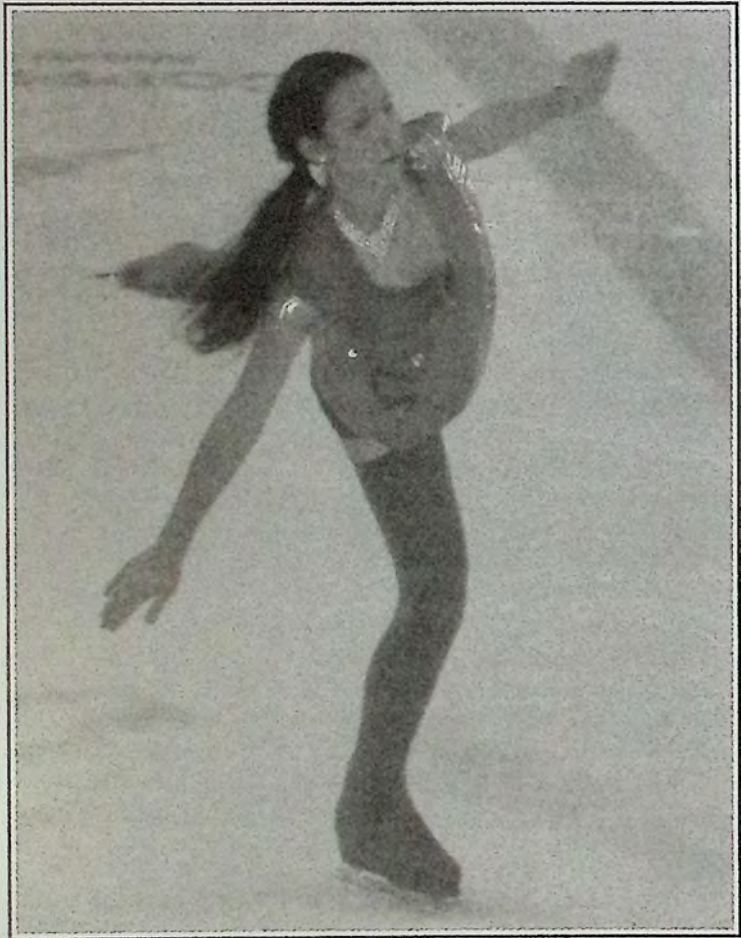

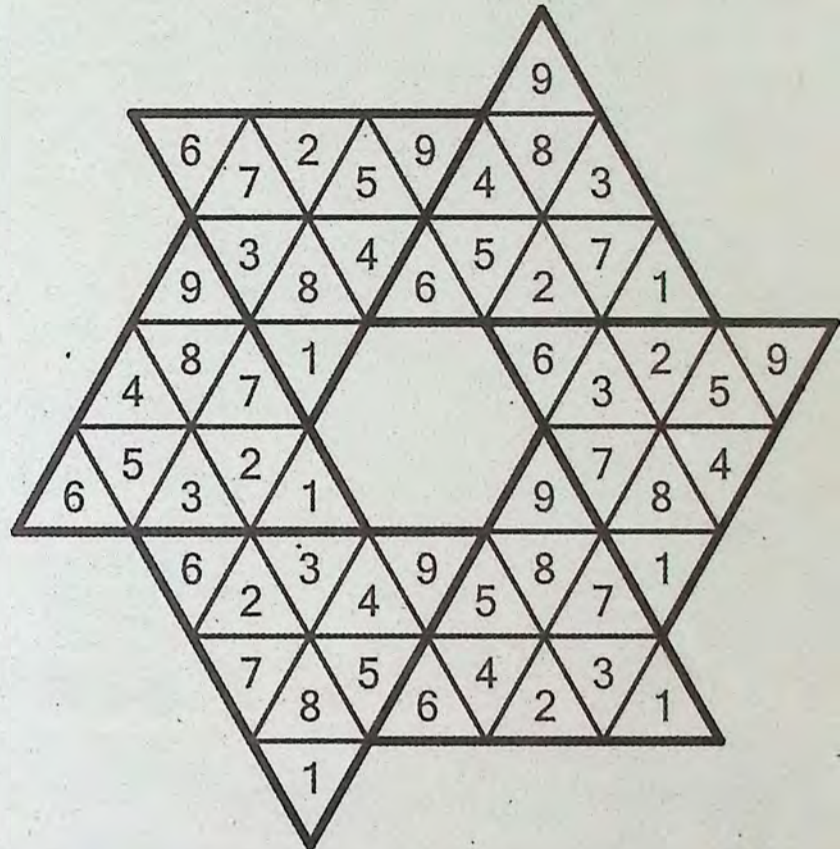

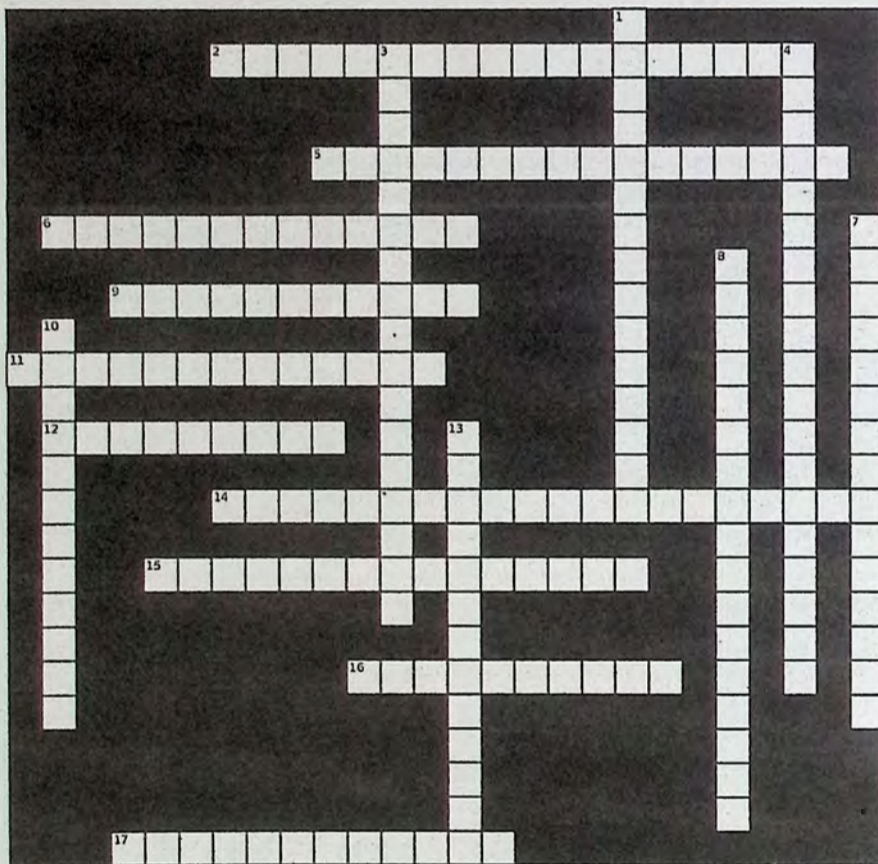
