## Council honours fire chief

Fire Chief Eric Gregson, who has served Princeton for 32 years as a volunteer fire fighter, received four awards and two medals at the April 22 Town Council meeting. The Town of Princeton gave him a certificate of appreciation, but presented him with 20, 25, and 30 year long service awards from the province and from Canada, two of which were accompanied by medals.

"Your commitment has been exemplary," Mayor Frank Armitage told Chief Gregson.

Commenting on Chief Gregson's service to Princeton Volunteer Fire Department, Mayor Armitage noted Chief Gregson has assured Princeton that the volunteer fire fighters had the best training, made sure things were done properly, and led by example.

Mayor Armitage thanked Chief Gregson's wife for sharing her husband to the fire department for the past 32 years.

Chief Gregson received his awards with genuine modesty. He and members of the fire department attended the ceremony in uniform and Princeton Detachment's Sgt. Barry Kennedy dressed in red serge to honour Chief Gregson.

In a short acceptance speech, Chief Gregson said he could not have done the job without the support of his excellent crew of fire fighters.

## BC Arts Council supports culture in Fraser-Nicola

Three arts and culture organizations serving the riding of Fraser-Nicola have been awarded a total of \$22,020 in B.C. Arts Council grants, Fraser-Nicola MLA Jackie Tegart announced April 24th.

"I can't imagine a world without arts," said Tegart.

"When you look at a talent like

JUNO award winner George Leach, you realize how important it is to nurture talent right here in our own community."

The B.C. Arts Council awarded grants to the following arts and culture organizations:

- Princeton Community Arts Council received \$14,000.

- Nicola Valley Community Arts Council received \$6,020.

- Logan Lake Arts Council received \$2,000.

The funding comes from a record-high \$24 million the B.C. Arts Council received from the provincial government to support artists, arts activities and culture in the 2013-14 fiscal year.

As B.C.'s lead agency for arts funding and development, the B.C. Arts Council enlists the expertise of British Columbia's artists to evaluate grant applications through a peer

review process independent of government.

Established in 1995, the B.C. Arts Council consults with the arts and culture community to develop policies, programs and strategic priorities for the sector. Last year, the Council approved more than 1,000 grants in over 200 communities in every region of the province.

The provincial government is providing \$24 million to the B.C. Arts Council this year, the highest funding level in the Council's history. Overall, it is investing \$60 million

towards B.C.'s artists, arts organizations and cultural institutions during the 2014-15 fiscal year.

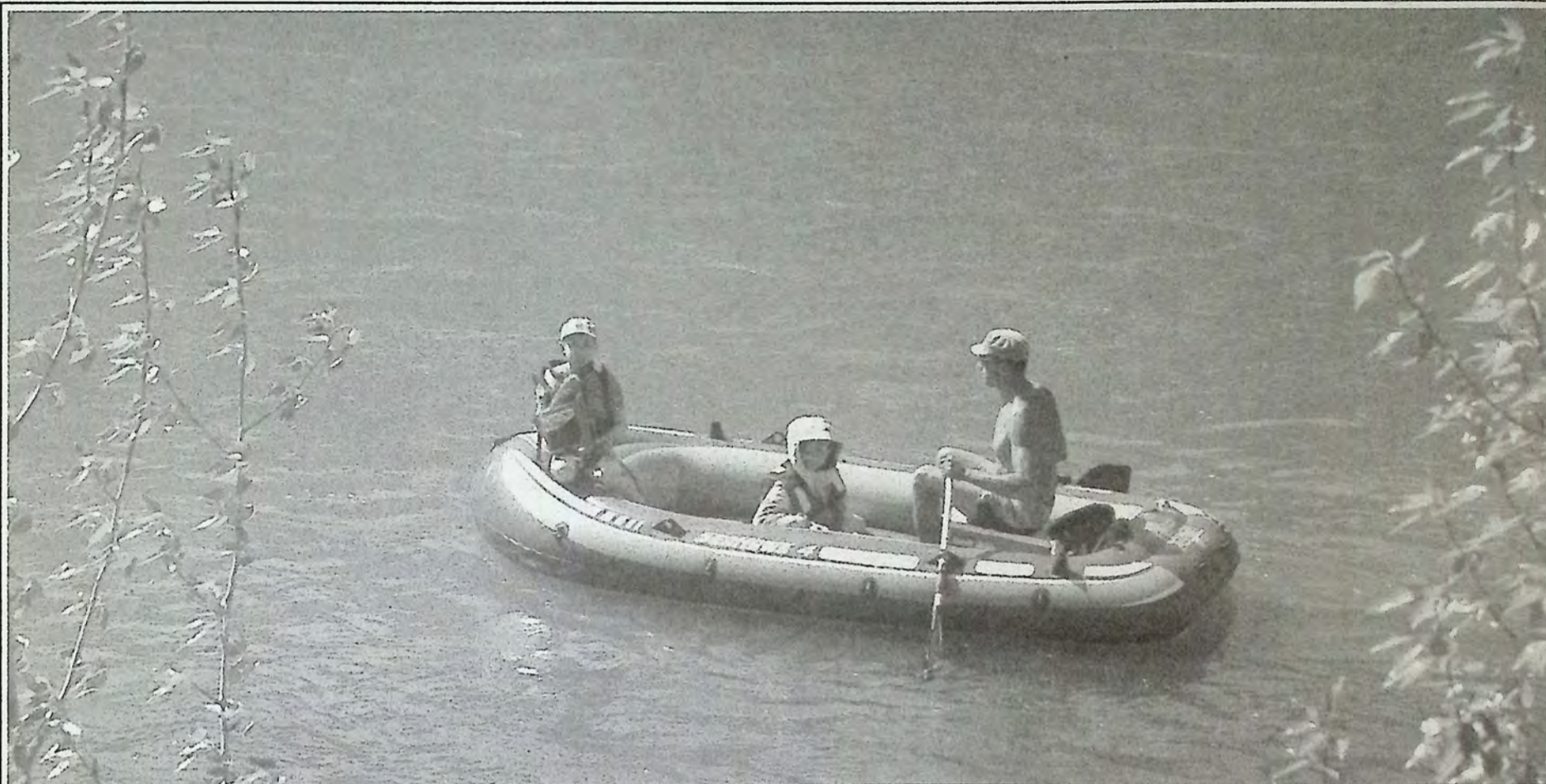

## Council hears plea for new bylaw

The April 22 Town Council meeting heard a presentation by Jenlyn Maki and Trish Hall meant to persuade Town Council to enact a bylaw making Princeton a town with smoke-free outdoor public spaces.

Representing Interior Health Authority, they offered facts and figures to show the benefits of having a ban on outdoor smoking in public places. A study done in Ottawa showed people can be affected by second hand smoke even outdoors.

The presenters stated that 30 percent of all cancer deaths and 85 percent of all lung cancer deaths are linked to smoking. Interior Health region has a higher percentage of

smokers than the B.C. average of 85 percent non-smokers.

The bylaw would ban smoking in all areas managed by the municipal-

ity, including trails, recreation facilities and all municipal property.

Council has not made any decision on the matter.

## Satellite broadband program helps connect Fraser-Nicola

Residents of Fraser-Nicola will soon have faster Internet access, thanks to the B.C. Broadband Satellite Initiative, MLA Jackie Tegart announced April 24th.

"Our government's goal is to see every British Columbian have access to affordable high-speed Internet by 2021," said Tegart.

The B.C. government is committed to spending up to \$2 million to make access to satellite-based high-speed Internet more affordable for British Columbians in remote areas who don't have access to traditional broadband Internet.

The program is the result of a partnership between the provincial government, internet provider Xplornet Communications and local installers. British Columbians who don't have traditional wireless or landline broadband solutions available can receive funding assistance of up to 50 per cent of installation and set-up costs, up to a maximum of \$250.

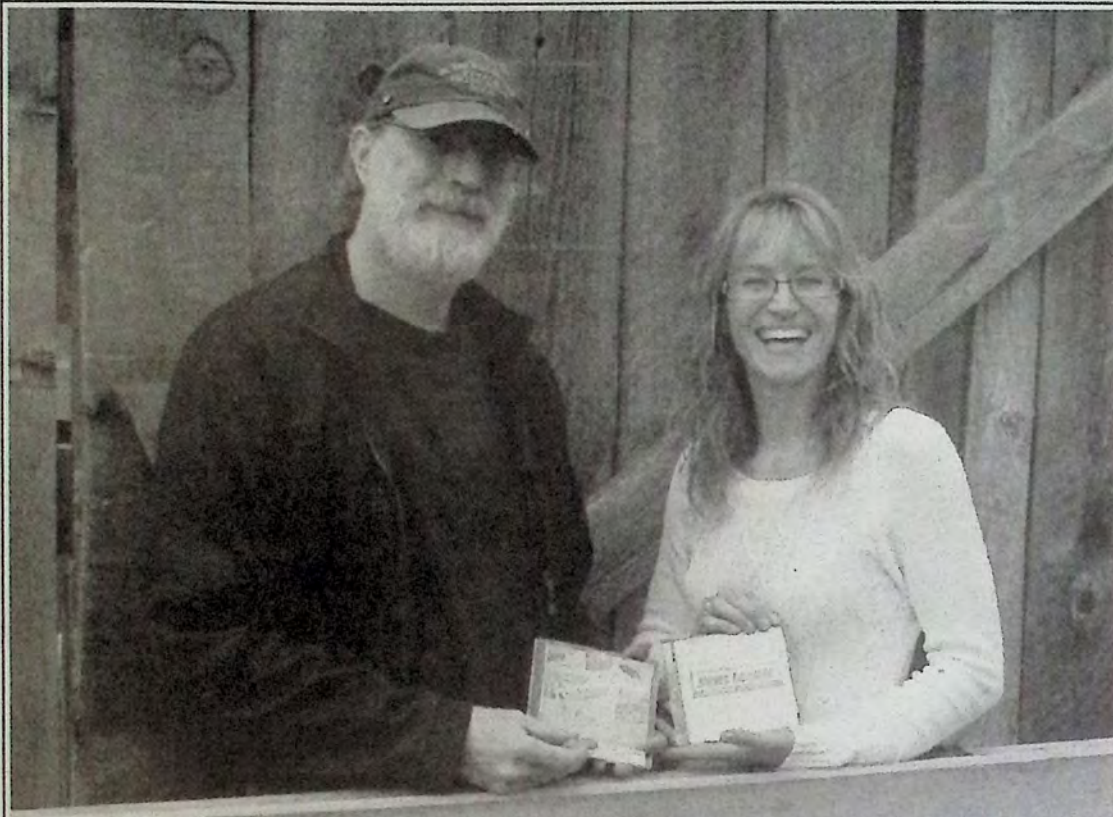

## Flip Of The Coyne

If there is one thing about the mess in the Ukraine that we know for sure it is that there is a lot of uncertainty as to who is doing what. We have heard that Russia is instigating and directing pro-Russian forces and then we hear a day or two later that the proof was actually fake. We heard that pro-Russian officials were making the Jewish population register then we find out that is fake too. The Obama administration eager to point fingers at Putin hold this faulty intelligence as fact only to retract it days later. It makes you think back to the build up to the Iraq war.

Canada's military is too small,

under funded, and ill equipped for these types of operations. I am a supporter of our military, so when I say this I am not picking on them. I am concerned for their safety. Yes our army has had some hardware upgrades thanks to the Afghanistan war but after talking to friends who have been over there our army is tired and not prepared to go back to war. We need more people, more equipment and more of everything. It's just a fact. Then there is our Navy. We do not even have the capability to patrol our entire coast line and seeing as our country is surrounded on 3 sides by coastline this is pretty concerning.

We do not have lift capability to move our military to and from the theatre of operation. We do not have helicopters to get our troops to and from the field. We have to rely on our allies to get our troops to the fight. It's a little embarrassing when you hear this and then you hear our Prime Minister is trying to talk big against one of the world's super-

powers.

I know Harper thinks he has to talk big against Russia to show Putin that we own the North but does Harper really think he can talk big without a big stick to back up his rhetoric? It is fine to sabre rattle but when your sabre is a prop what do you do when the other guy calls you on it?

Putin is annoyed by Canada. He has been practicing landing paratroopers on ice flows in the arctic and he has announced that he is building a new naval base that will house an arctic submarine fleet. We cannot even get a naval patrol up there, yet Harper seems pretty sure that he can poke the Bear without any repercussions. I for one don't feel as confident as the Prime Minister and I am not so sure that Canada is in any place to be flexing muscles it doesn't have when it comes to the Ukraine. You never know, that Bear might roll over and take a swipe at whatever is poking at it.

To The Editor:

*Re: BC Health Coalition & Canadian Doctors for Medicare - For-profit clinics attack Medicare in court, seek US-style system.*

We risk losing Canadian Medicare as we know it.

Right now, there's a legal attack before the courts that could turn Canada's Medicare system into a US-style system.

The attack is driven by Dr. Brian Day, owner of the Vancouver-based Cambie Surgery Centre, a for-profit surgical clinic known for unlawfully billing for medically-necessary care.

The case is being called the most significant constitutional challenge in Canadian history. And it's going to trial in BC Supreme Court in

2014.

This challenge aims to do away with Medicare in Canada by striking down provincial health legislation that limits the for-profit delivery of medically necessary services, claiming that these rules violate the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

What does this mean for me and my family?

If Dr. Day wins this case, we'll lose the public health care system that we all rely on.

Expensive private insurance will become the new norm, like in the United States where it costs the average family \$16,000 a year. Most bankruptcies in the US are due to medical bills - we don't want to see a system in Canada

where we risk losing our homes or go deep in debt when we get sick or injured.

Public wait times will also become longer, as doctors and nurses are drained from the public system to the for-profit system.

Why it's a national issue affecting everyone in Canada: Even though the case is in the BC Supreme Court, it threatens health care across Canada. Because of the constitutional nature of the case, if Dr. Day wins the challenge, the laws that protect our public health care system will crumble across the country.


We have to make sure Dr. Day is defeated. In contrast to the aims of these for-profit clinics owners, Canadians don't want US-style health care. Poll after poll show that the public favours investment and innovation in public health care to improve the system for everyone, not the expansion of for-profit health care that benefits only a very wealthy elite.

Who's fighting for our public health care system?

## Ridiculous Expectations Ruin Relationships

I watched a Dr. Phil show with another woman, and we were appalled by the attitude of a husband who was the focus of the show. His wife had initiated contact with Dr. Phil to ask what she could do to make her marriage better because her husband complained constantly about her shortcomings. He was on the show feeling quite self-righteous about his complaints.

The couple had not been married a long time, had a toddler at home, and his wife stayed home to look after the child. She was a pretty woman, a little overweight. He was very ordinary looking, gone bald early.

His list of complaints about his wife could be fixed, he said, but she had not fixed her problems, so he had been having affairs with 'hot' women. The following is a list of what he wanted her to do: lose 20 pounds or more, until she had a 'hot' body; cook better meals; keep the house spotless; find a good-paying job, and be glad to see him come home and

have sex at least four times a week.

A man who criticizes his wife all the time is totally insane if he expects her to be happy to see him come home and is certainly not going to be excited about having sex with him. That is like expecting somebody you abuse to be thrilled with your company. It ain't gonna happen!

What made all of his remarks so incredible was that he thought his criticism was justified. Anyone who thinks looking after a toddler, cleaning house and cooking meals is easy has never tried it. Add to that his expectation that she should go out and find a good-paying job was adding insult to injury.

Amid all of the criticism was his self-righteous attitude that keeping the relationship together had nothing to do with his behaviour. According to his point of view, he did not need to do anything but bring home the paycheque and reap the benefits of her efforts.

Dr. Phil called the man a male chauvinist and offered the woman counseling to rebuild her self-esteem. The issue of his affairs was another matter she would have to deal with, but first she had to restore her own regard for herself.

During the winter months, I often watch Dr. Phil, and have come to the conclusion that relationships are the biggest issues in people's lives, and unrealistic expectations are the cause of most of the problems. Generally, it is mothers-in-law and their sons who have ridiculous expectations of the son's wife.

Being an emotionally mature per-

son means taking responsibility for one's expectations. If a man expects his wife to be super-woman, that is, have a full-time, good-paying job, keep the home spotless, have children, be a top-notch cook and be 'hot' looking and 'hot' in bed, he should have informed her of that before marrying her. The marriage vows talk about love, honour and cherish, not all these expectations. Obviously, the man on the Dr. Phil show should have added his list to the marriage vows, giving his wife an opportunity to back out early.

There have been some mothers-in-law on the Dr. Phil show who need the same kind of lesson. They complain and criticize their daughters-in-law for not being the perfect wife to satisfy the mother-in-law. Before the wedding, they should have submitted a list of what they expected of their daughters-in-law and allowed the prospective bride to have a clear picture of what was needed to have an approving mother-in-law.

The person who has the expectations that are disappointed should take responsibility for his or her own disappointment. If I expect you to do a certain thing, or behave a certain way, and you have not agreed to this, and do not live up to my expectation, then I must take responsibility for being disappointed.

Relationships would be so much better if people were honest enough to spell out their expectations of others in advance. That gives the other person fair warning and the opportunity to agree to meet those expectations or run the other way.

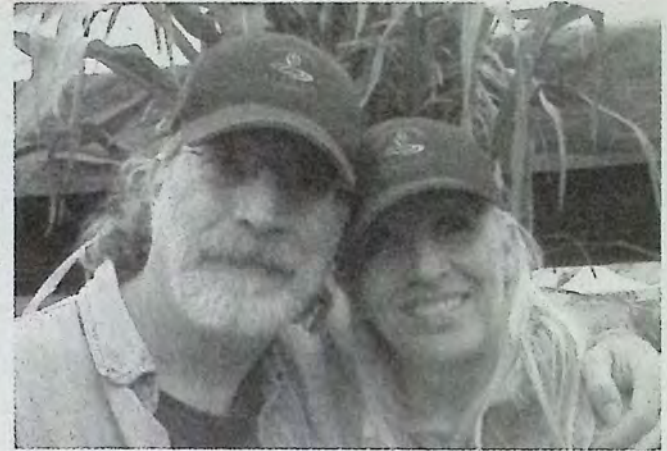

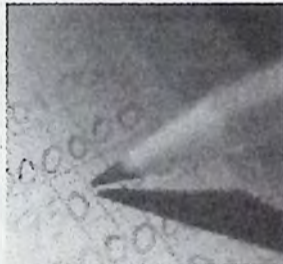
Keremeos - Cawston - Olalla



A sure sign of Spring: over 20 motorbikes were parked along 7th Avenue in Keremeos April 12th. If you don't own a motorbike and you want to meet people, you might consider getting your motorbike license - and a motorbike. There is automatic camaraderie amongst motorcyclists wherever you go. And if you are new to motorbiking, be sure to give the proper hand signal in greeting: two fingers pointed downward at your side translates to "Keep two wheels on the road, friend". ## Enowkinwixw brings groups together

On April 9th and 10th a noteworthy event took place with representatives of the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen, Osoyoos Indian Band, Lower Similkameen Indian Band and the Penticton Indian Band. The intent of this two day event, known as an Enowkinwixw, was to bring together First Nations and Local Government leaders in the South Okanagan and Similkameen to discuss common goals and opportunities, as well as to continue to build and strengthen relationships between communities.

The Enowkinwixw provided a time and place for dialogue on how to best move forward with the South Okanagan Similkameen Protocol Agreement which was signed by the parties in June 2013. The event also provided an opportunity to improve upon the relationships and strengthen the partnerships of all of the communities within the region.

The Enowkinwixw is a tradition-

al, ceremonial and harmony building process. The methodology draws inspiration from the Four Food Chiefs story and the multiple layers of meaning and teaching embodied in the creation story of the Okanagan People. The process works to embrace multiple community perspectives of reality and to draw on collective knowledge which is held across the communities.

It was identified that the intent of the Protocol Agreement is to provide a frame work to formalize government to government relationships, to recognize and celebrate diversity while cooperating with each other to achieve mutual prosperity, to improve consultation, communication, information sharing, education and cooperation between the parties, and to work towards collaborative decision making or negotiations in appropriate areas of common interest.

Some of the outcomes of the two

day process were a commitment to continue with the South Okanagan Similkameen Steering Committee (working group) which was created after the Protocol Agreement was signed.

The Steering Committee consists of Administrators and Senior Staff representatives who meet bi-monthly to discuss matters of mutual interest to the communities, and report their work to the Joint Council, which includes the Chiefs of the three bands, as well as the Chair and Vice Chair and one other designated Board member of the Regional District.

The parties identified a need for improved communication, not only between themselves, but to all constituents and communities in the South Okanagan Similkameen. The parties also discussed the potential for a one year anniversary celebration of the South Okanagan Similkameen Protocol Agreement signing to be held on or around June 21 which is National Aboriginal Day.

The Community to Community Enowkinwixw was funded through a Union of British Columbia Municipalities grant.

A detailed report on the Community to Community Enowkinwixw will be provided to all parties and posted on the Local Government and Band website in coming weeks.

## Local Leaders for Literacy prepare for 2nd annual race

Last year, a literacy experiment gone right led Vermilion Forks Elementary School students on a wonderful day long learning adventure. This year, the event is back with new challenges, new enthusiasm and new sponsors.

"We are thrilled that the Amazing Literacy Race went so well last year," stated Dierra Maynard. Maynard is the Literacy Outreach Coordinator for Princeton Leaders for Literacy (PLFL) and the mastermind behind this event.

"I thought it was a huge undertaking and greatly appreciated," said Vermilion Forks Elementary School Principal Barry Clarke.

"It is always nice to have new opportunities for our kids. My initial response was to make sure that any safety concerns were covered, as the idea of having all our students "racing" around downtown raised more than a few questions. When all was said and done after the first race was completed, I thought it was a fantastic opportunity to explore the town and have the students engage in the many different forms of literacy that exist. The sponsor venues were all ready to receive our students and I think it was a great experience for everyone involved."

Many local businesses immediately jumped on board to help once they were approached with the idea. The Princeton Museum, the Princeton and District Community Skill Centre and Cooper's Foods all offered up their space for the school with Museum Manager Robin Lowe creating a historical scavenger hunt for the teams, Career Development Practitioner and

PLFL board member Leah Ward from the Skills Centre leading students through an online information maze and Cooper's Foods Manager Rob Bett giving the teams room to roam on their quest for a healthy meal on a budget. All three of these locations also gave out prizes to the winning team of their challenges.

Weyerhaeuser, Orica Mine, Princeton Rotary Club and VFE PAC all donated money for the event to assist with snacks, drinks, supplies and prizes. Reicherts Sales and Services donated a body (Bill Reichert) and their avalanche gear for a timed challenge to find a hidden beacon using a locator device. The Princeton Arts Council came prepared with extra art supplies to help the students find their creative side. FortisBC brought a unique set-up that included a self-propelled power station bike that lit up more and more the harder students pedalled and a pile of prizes.

Three other challenges were also a part of the day; a physical challenge, a puzzle challenge and a school curriculum challenge. Students were arranged into 10 person teams consisting of students from each of the Grades 4 through 7. PLFL Board member and Princeton Cultural Director Nadine McEwen was also invaluable to the event. As the liaison between the town and Maynard, she helped make the vision a reality.

"My favourite part of the whole day was watching all the kids learning and not even really realizing it because they were having a ton of fun," Maynard stated.

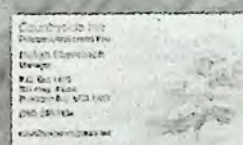
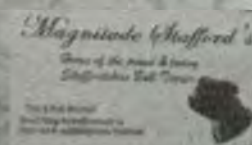

Living Past 100

Avoid Old Age Blindness

Vision problems in old age are not uncommon, but there are ways to avoid the typical vision problems. Eyes need care long before the problems develop. Anyone over age 50 should be conscious of the need to prevent vision problems associated with aging.

Visiting an optometrist every two years is a good start. Having the right kind of lenses to correct vision is just the beginning of eye care.

Eating the right foods is essential to vision health in old age. At the top of the list of foods to help avoid blindness are the foods from the cabbage family: broccoli, cabbage, kale. Cooked carrots and all orange or red vegetables are excellent. Salmon, mackerel, sardines and tuna are great food for the eyes. Vitamin D is essential for eye health.

Eye health can be found in supplements. Experts recommend 6 to 10 milligrams of zeaxanthin and 20 milligrams of lutein every day, which you can obtain from eating a lot of broccoli or spinach or kale, and being sure to eat red, yellow and orange fruits and vegetables daily.

Protecting your eyes with sunglasses is extremely important when the sun is bright, whether in summer or winter.

Vision loss in old age is permanent. Although macular degeneration (a condition causing blindness) can be slowed, there is no cure, and loss vision cannot be restored.

It is far better to prevent vision loss while you can. Prevention is essential.

## No local races planned in 2014

A reduction in funding fed to interior horse race tracks in 2014 has effectively killed Princeton Racing Days Association's annual event. Live horse racing at Sunflower Down will not take place this June as a result.

The BC Interior Horse Racing Association, of which Princeton is a member track, used to split a total of \$150,000.00 in funding between four race tracks. In 2011 the responsibility shifted to a management committee and reductions started to take effects.

For example, the total funding for interior tracks dropped to \$25,000.00 that year and down to \$20,000.00 in 2012. Last year the total available fell to \$13,500.00 with only \$11,000.00 available this year for three interior tracks.

It cost Princeton Racing Days Association \$50,000.00 to host their single-day live race meet last June.

Racing Days President Karie Crucil is not impressed with the constant whittling away at funding to horse racing outside of the lower mainland.

"In my opinion, horse racing in the whole province is in serious jeopardy."

Her statement is backed up with a lack of horses available to race in the province with numbers at Hastings Park (Vancouver) dropping from 700 to 200. Add to that changes in the Foreign Workers Policy by the provincial government, which has affected the pool of jockeys available, and Crucil says, "This is not just an Interior issue, it's an industry-wide issue."

Another snag in the attempt to bring live horse racing to Princeton this summer is the lack of betting equipment. The company that usually provides the tote equipment doesn't see much profit when working single day events in the interior.

"The interior tracks don't make as much as the larger tracks do," Crucil says so in order to cut costs and make a better profit, the tote company is not servicing interior tracks this season.

"It actually costs them to operate, but we are hoping to change their minds."

Former Racing Days President George Elliott says he's not surprised there won't be racing this year.

"The Interior tracks have always struggled to be recognized as an important part of the provincial racing scene," he says.

"I attended far too many BC Interior Horse Racing meetings in Kamloops where the smaller tracks were viewed as not much more than the black sheep of the family."

Elliott was Racing Days President from 1990 to 1998.

"Even back then we saw shortages of horses in the system. I was President the year we went from two full days of racing to a single day and it has never bounced back."

Elliott says that the tradition of live horse racing has such a deep-rooted connection to the community that he believes things will be different next year.

"The local committee has never stopped working hard to bring this fun event to Princeton and I doubt this will change that. It's just unfortunate that politics has had a hand in this which in turn has an adverse

affect on a giant community event."

The Princeton Racing Days Association will still do something this year and are planning different

race events, family activities, a Saturday night dance and will host Little Britches Rodeo June 28th and 29th.

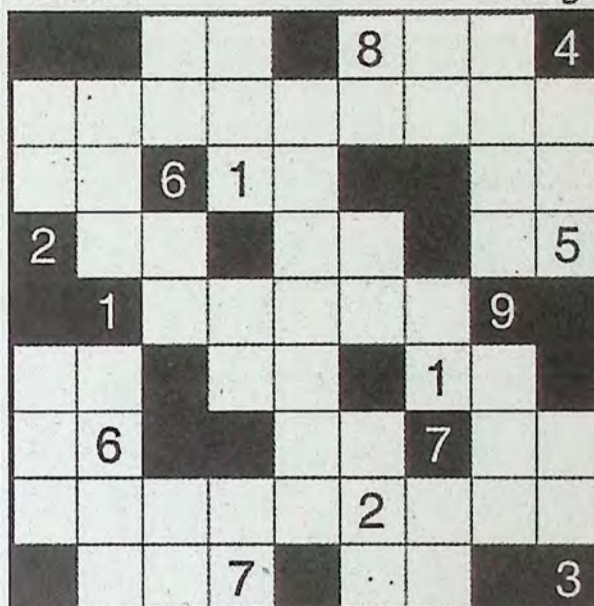

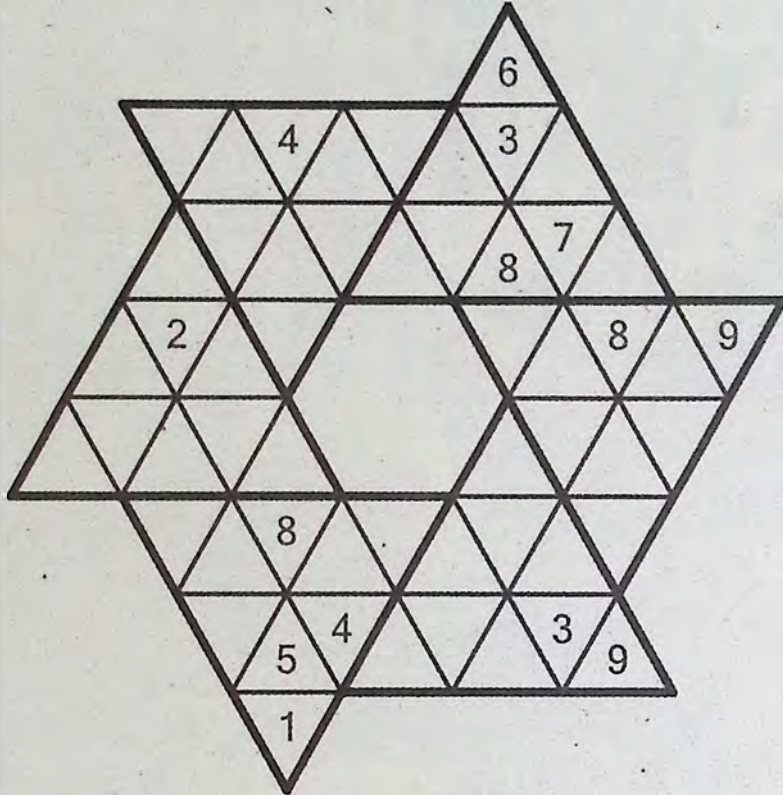

## HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

## Strawberry Rhubarb Almond Crumble

(NC) Show mom you care this Mother's Day by adding a nutritious spin on one of her favourite desserts. Packed with crunchy wholesome almonds, fresh strawberries and tasty rhubarb, this crumble is the perfect little treat to enjoy on this special day. The recipe was created for the Almond Board of California by Emily Richards, author of Get In The Kitchen and COOK. Serve the crumble with a drizzle of velvety almond cream for that added hit of deliciousness. Serves 8.

**Ingredients**

- 3 cups (750 mL) fresh or frozen chopped rhubarb
- 2 cups (500 mL) halved fresh strawberries
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) packed brown sugar
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) ground almonds
- 1/4 cup (60 mL) whole wheat flour
- 3/4 cup (175 mL) large flake oats
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) chopped almonds
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) soft non hydrogenated margarine

**Almond Cream**

- 3/4 cup (175 mL) almond milk
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) cornstarch
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) vanilla

**Directions**

**Crumble:** In a large bowl, combine rhubarb, strawberries, sugar, ground almonds and half of the flour. Divide among eight 1/2 cup (125 mL) ovenproof ramekins or mason jars; set aside. In another bowl, stir together oats, chopped almonds, remaining flour and margarine until crumbly. Spoon on top of fruit and place jars on a baking sheet. Bake in 375 F (190 C) oven for about 30 minutes or until fruit is tender and bubbly and top is golden. Let cool slightly.

**Almond Cream:** Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, heat almond milk and vanilla over medium heat until just bubbling. Whisk together cornstarch with 1 tbsp (15 mL) of water and whisk into almond milk. Cook, stirring for 1 minute or until thickened. Drizzle some of the almond cream over each crumble to serve.

# Saving Downtown Princeton...

I've touched on this subject before, but I think it's time to take a deeper look at value.

There are a lot of different types of value and most commonly it's consumers looking for the best value for their dollar. That can be in a variety of forms and is closely connected to the type of value I want to discuss.

Employees have value.

This means they deserve to be treated fairly and with respect.

The other side of the coin is that employers have value and deserve the same kind of treatment.

Have you ever entered a local business and got the feeling from the member of staff you are being served by that they don't like their job and would rather be somewhere else doing something else? When I feel this I often wonder one of two things. Does the employee feel valued by their boss and do they value their job?

I'm not suggesting that this is the only reason why some employees don't like their jobs, but I know for a fact that if you ask someone in a local business who is the opposite of the 'I-don't-like-my-job' stereotype I'm discussing here you'll find a couple of interesting reasons for why they are at the other end of the spectrum.

Typically if the employee feels valued, they will enjoy the work. If they like the job and their co-workers, employers and all the other parts of the work environment, they will display that when with customers.

It's not rocket science. If you own a business and your staff like what they are doing there, they will increase your sales. With the right employee, if they like their job, they will work a little harder and become a valued asset making contributions to the success of the business.

If an employee is treated in any way less than a valued part of the staff, you get what you get. I remember one of my clients telling me a few years ago that income tax time was a real pain for them because they had to issue so many T4 slips. I knew what the work environment was like as I had observed a number of incidents where staff was treated poorly on the job. No wonder there were so many T4 slips, as there was a lot of hiring and firing going on at that business.

It was obvious to me that the staff there did not feel valued and as a result they likely did not value their jobs. This made it difficult for the employer. However, I don't really blame the employees.

There's another kind of value that needs to come out of local businesses as well. Customers have probably the greatest value to any business, as they are what keep you

in business. If a customer is not valued at the front counter, chances are the business will suffer, as it will lose its value to the customer.

What has this got to do with saving downtown Princeton?

I hear it a lot in our office and I read it a lot online. Many local businesses still aren't being run with these values in place. If a business owner does not value their staff or customers, your time in business is limited.

I experience it first hand frequently when I'm in a few local businesses. I find myself standing around the front counter waiting. All that needs to be done is a simple acknowledgement that you see me and I'll be patient after that. I find it most annoying to be part way through a business transaction only to be interrupted by a cell phone call where I'm no longer the focus of that conversation. You're welcome for my business, now get off

your freakin' phone and thank me for putting money in your cash register!

I don't own a cell phone because I know how it feels to suddenly be ignored. I don't need someone with a cell phone to be ignored, as there are a few local businesses that do a good enough job of that without the added complication of handheld technology.

There's no wonder some people would rather shop out of town, as they don't feel valued when they try to support local business.

This is where I'm trying to make my point.

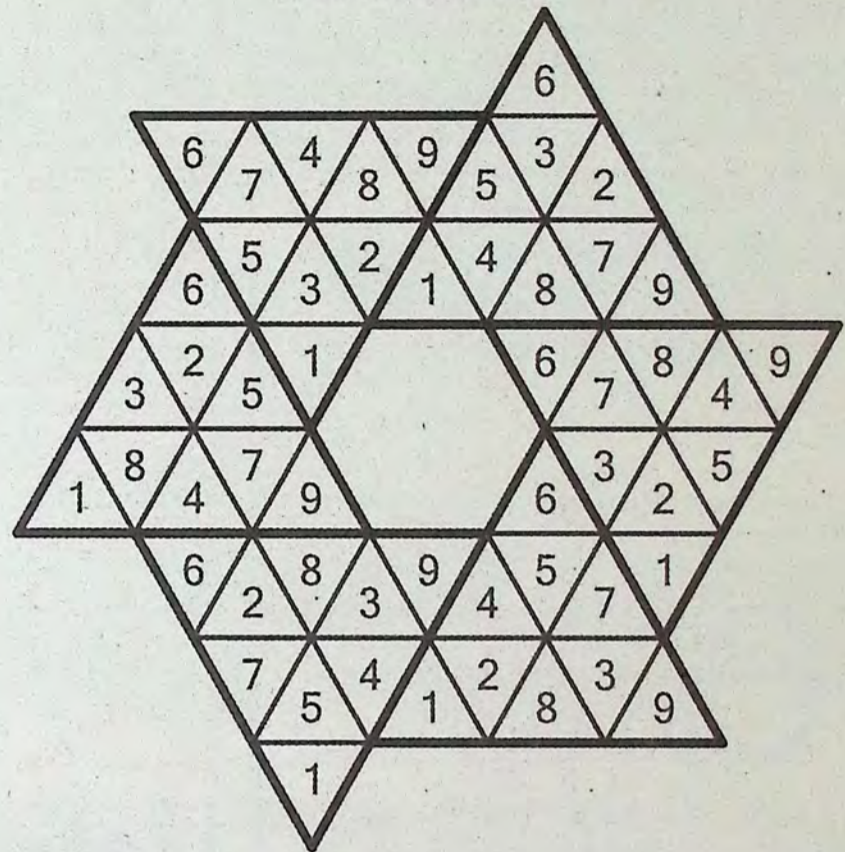

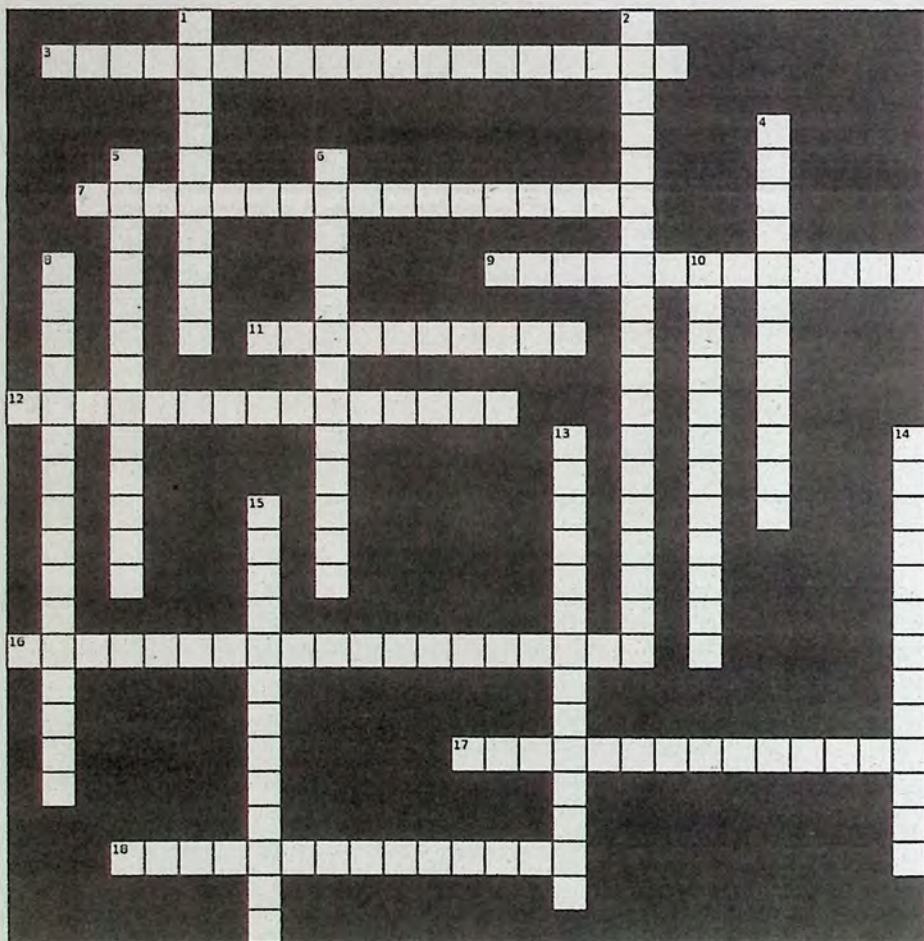

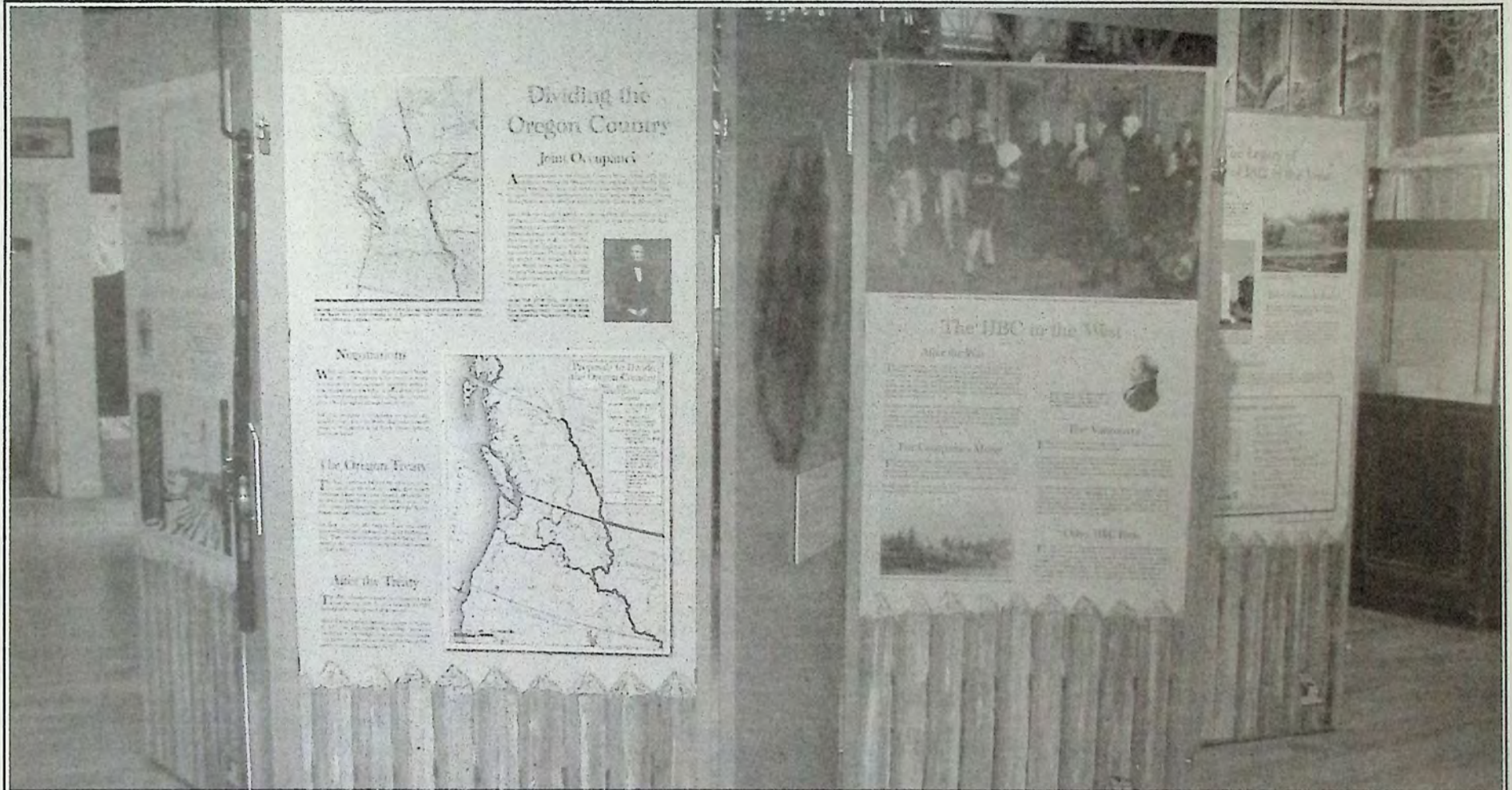

up," said Maynard.

"It was such a community run event," Maynard continued.

"Everybody just pitched in and made the whole thing work. We didn't really know how any of it would go. It was a good mad experiment with all the people working together with all the staff from VFE and all the businesses that created the success."

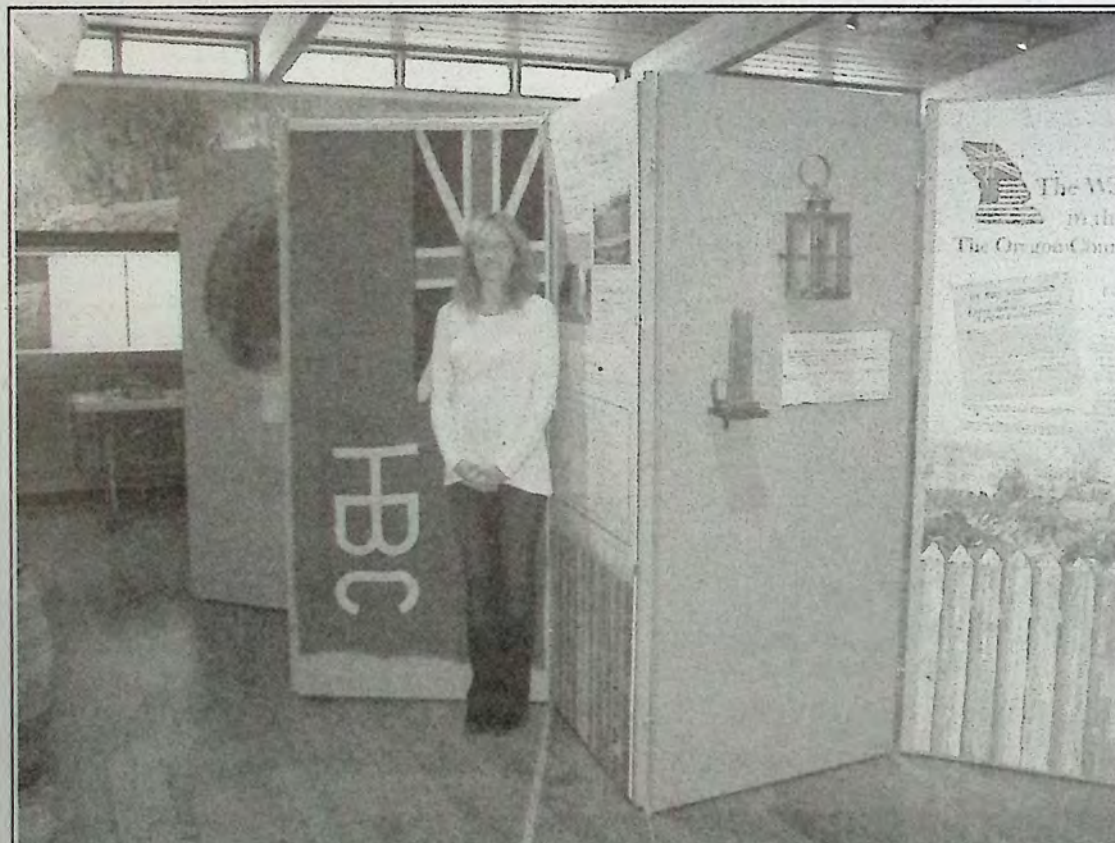
