Flip Of The Coyne

The honey bee (Apis mellifera) the hard working pollinator the bringer of life and fruit, Little do most people realize, if it wasn't for that little buzzing yellow and black bug that visits our flowers each spring and summer, we would be a very hungry species. Actually if there were no honey bees, there is a really good chance that we wouldn't even exist or most of life on this planet wouldn't exist. The honey bee, for as small as it is, brings life to anything that has a flower. Honey bees and other pollinators fertilize the world's plants and our food crops depend on none more than the

So you understand my shock that at the last Town Council meeting the motion to receive and file a simple proclamation declaring May 29 the day of the honey bee. I understand council gets more of these proclamations than you can shake a stick at, but let's face it, for the most

part they are symbolic motions used to bring awareness to a cause. It wasn't like the proclamation was asking the Council to ban all cosmetic pesticides or find a cure for colony collapse disorder (which is wiping bees out at an alarming rate, so much so that beekeepers are struggling to keep their colonies alive). The scary part is that no one knows for sure what is killing off our bees.

All Council had to do was show a little solidarity with our hard working little partner the bee. They only had to proclaim May 29 the day of the Honey Bee, but they didn't. Instead they received and filed the request and our much needed little friend got no recognition from the elected officials of Princeton. I know it sounds funny making a stink out of what may seem like such a trivial action, but it isn't really trivial. It isn't trivial because it shows that our elected officials do

not understand that without the bee there would be no agriculture. Without agriculture there would be no food and without food there would be no people. Unfortunately, this little fact was overlooked or ignored.

The funniest part of all this is that one of the councillors is a food security advocate and was part of a workshop in Hedley recently about food security. His fellow councillors, however, didn't get the memo on how important food security is, to not just the valley but the world. I wrote for years about local food security and its importance. Now you see local food security issues making national headlines with droughts, floods, and the death of bees, but that doesn't seem to be enough to get the rest of council's attention.

Maybe it is because I live on a farm that has a market garden that I understand that we need bees and

how important local food security is. Maybe it is because if you want food you just run down to the local supermarket and pick up your groceries and never think twice that there is a system behind getting that food to your plate. The bee is a big part of that system and about one third of the food you eat or more is dependent on the bee for its survival

I don't know what the rationale behind the decision to receive and file the proclamation was. I do know that the disconnect between the farm and the table is growing

each and every day and maybe this is an example of that. Not thinking that the honey bee has anything to do with your everyday life is a sad example of how people no longer understand how food is made and how farmers get food from the field to your table. Maybe next time a simple proclamation like this comes across the desk of council members they will take a few moments to use that google machine and look up why it might be important rather than just tossing it out because they can't see the relevance.

Well, I am here to tell you there's guys like me who get paid to write those things you read online raving about Product A or B and use works and phrases that are supposed to woo you into buying the product as it is something you need so badly you can practically taste it.

The funny part is, of all the consumer product testimonials I've written I have never touched any of the items. As they are freelance jobs, you won't find my name attached to any of them. Plus, they have been posted on blogs, how-to sites and just about any other consumer rating website you may use to find this information.

Remember The Lessons Of D-Day

This Friday is the seventieth anniversary of D-Day, the day the Allied Forces stormed the beaches of Normandy and began the march to Berlin. It was not the end of the war, but D-Day led ultimately to the defeat of the Nazis. Through the 11 months after D-Day, millions died, and a high percentage of those millions were people in concentration camps. Films and photographs of the horror discovered at those camps has haunted the world for generations.

Analysis of how a civilized nation could engage in deliberate extermination of a whole sector of population has led to many lessons for the world, some of which are being forgotten.

The Nuremburg trials that began after the war ended focused on convicting key participants in the extermination plan. Testimony of the elite of the Third Reich was as revealing as the testimony of those victimized by the Nazis. Perhaps what was said in the defense of the Nazi elite contained the greatest lessons for all of us.

Judge Haywood, at a trial of Nazi judges who were found guilty of sentencing innocent people, spoke of the need to protect civilization itself from perpetrating crimes against humanity. He said it was essential that the truth be told.

D-Day marks the beginning of the end of Nazi domination of Europe. D-Day cost the lives of thousands of men. Hollywood has done a good job of showing us what a bloodbath took place on the beaches of Normandy, but that is what war is about. Soldiers are prepared to sacrifice their lives, and nations are prepared to sacrifice the lives of soldiers. What the Nazis had done in Europe was sacrifice members of society who were opposed to the Nazis, or who were Jewish, or who suffered from mental or physical disabilities. Those people were sacrificed for the greater glory of Nazi political power.

Nazi war criminals justified what they did by saying it was for the good of their country, or that they were just following orders, or that they had little choice because of the fear of what would happen to them if they did not go along with what the Nazi government, or Hitler, wanted. One of the favourite lines of defense was that those who signed execution orders did so because it was the law. They were only following the law

of the land, laws passed by the Nazi government. The Nuremburg trials said those were not good excuses for the deliberate extermination of millions of people.


We need to be reminded of what happened in Nazi Germany. We need to be reminded that political leaders should never have so much power that they can change the laws so that people live in fear of their own government. We need to be reminded that those who speak out against injustice must be protected from the wrath of political leaders. We need to be reminded that those who speak the truth need protection from those who find the truth unpleasant or politically detrimental. We must be reminded that we have to protect justice itself in order to protect civilization.

Looking back 70 years gives us the feeling that what happened in Nazi Germany is just part of the past, that things are different now, but that kind of thinking is delusional. Since World War II, we have seen the rise of political leaders who thought nothing of murdering those who spoke out against an unjust government. It happened in Uganda under the rule of Idi Amin, who murdered thousands of Ugandans for the sake of protecting his brand of politics. Idi Amin was a great admirer of Hitler. We saw it in South Africa and in the southern United States. We have seen this kind of unjust government arise in many countries, and we have witnessed injustice in the name of politics not only in civil wars but in countless ways in so-called civilized nations. We have witnessed the truth buried in the name of political power, and we have seen those persecuted who tried to expose the truth.

Those who protest government action, or expose truths the government wants to bury, or tell the truth about certain situations the government or corporation would rather conceal, are often treated unjustly. They may face police attack, be imprisoned, lose their jobs, or be called "conspiracy theorists" or lunatic fringe. For example, people opposed to HAARP were told there is no such thing, they were labelled conspiracy theorists, yet HAARP and the future of HAARP was discussed in Congress in May. As the Similkameen Valley becomes a destination for the creative cook to source the freshest ingredients, one of its iconic historic sites has added a seasoned chef to its team.

The Grist Mill and Gardens at Keremeos welcomes Chef Natasha Schooten, whose career has taken her from two Delta Hotels and Resorts, to Mission Hill Family Estate Winery, and most recently to Terrafina Restaurant at Hester Creek Estate Winery.

"Here in the Okanagan and Similkameen valleys, chefs are blessed with plentiful access to the freshest ingredients, from organic vegetables to thoughtfully raised proteins," says Chef Natasha.

"Setting menus for the Tea Room and events at the Grist Mill in the heart of farming country is an exceptional opportunity for me as a chef."

The Grist Mill is home to the mill itself – the only working mill of its type west of Winnipeg, and a provincial heritage site – where

Many of the vegetables and herbs used in the dishes will come from heritage plants grown on the site's two acre garden, and of course the freshly milled flour will be highlighted.

Tis The Season For Asparagus

The annual asparagus crop is available now. This season lasts only a short time, but if you like asparagus, keep in mind it can be frozen simply by blanching it for about half a minute and putting it in freezer bags.

In some places of the world, people would be astonished at what we pay for asparagus. In Poland, it grows like weeds at the edge of the tundra. They simply go out and pick it. There is so much of it that cattle graze on

The health benefits of asparagus have been known for centuries. Cleansing the face with water in which the asparagus has been cooked is a traditional treatment for those teenage pimples. Cooked asparagus is good for dissolving uric acid deposits in fingers and feet, and is excellent for kidney function. Asparagus is good for the digestive system and relieves constipation. Asparagus is known to lower blood pressure.

Asparagus is rich in folate, a B vitamin that helps your body cells renew themselves. Asparagus fights heart disease because heart problems can be caused by lack of folate. Most North Americans do not eat enough foods rich in folate. Folate is also important in preventing colon cancer.

Glutathione is an protein which acts as an antioxidant. Asparagus has an abundance of glutathione, another substance which helps prevent cancer.

There is a lot of Vitamin E in asparagus, and vitamin E helps protect the pancreas. This organ is essential for producing insulin, and needs to be


When preparing asparagus for a meal, cook it gently. Steam cook it for only five minutes. You will preserve all of the nutrients this way. Canned asparagus has lost much of its original food value, but frozen asparagus will retain much more of its nutrients if blanched quickly before freezing. When using frozen asparagus, drop it into boiling water and turn off the heat immediately, allowing it to cook for five minutes in a pot with a lid on it.

If you would like to grow your own asparagus, you can buy asparagus roots and plant them in reasonably good soil. When the plant is firmly rooted and cared for, it will produce for years.

Osprey Lake friends conduct clean up

Twenty volunteers from Osprey, Link and Chain Lakes area participated in the 7th annual roadside cleanup on Saturday May 25th. They picked up garbage on approximately 40 kilometres of roadways, some sections of the Trans-Canada Trail as well as the Osprey and Link Lake Forestry Recreational Campsites. The total weight of the debris clocked in at 410 kg. or 900 lbs. The waste was sorted after it was collected. Categories of the litter included items which could be reused, metal, glass, recyclable bottles and cans, clean Styrofoam, propane cylinders, plastic and landfill mate-

rial.

Two members of the cleanup had to clean up an illegal dump site on a very steep embankment using a winch and rope. The dumped items were likely used for a party crowd and included plastic cups, paper plates, remnants of food and plastic utensils. Also at this site were many plastic garbage bags

filled with dirt. The soil was dumped and the bags collected for disposal.

The most disappointing part of our cleanup is that no matter how much education we have had, people are still leaving garbage in firepits at the campsites and outside their residences. The bears who have found this food source are no doubt the ones which will have to be destroyed in the future. "A fed bear is a dead bear" is a statement we should all take heed of if we want to preserve nature and our environment.

Finally, cigarette packaging and remnants of the filters are one of the most frequently found items. The butts of cigarettes can be ingested by wildlife, birds, fish or

turtles. They can cause choking and death for those unsuspecting creatures. The next time you dump your vehicle ashtray or cigarette on the ground consider the consequences for them and for the possibility of causing a forest fire which can lead to criminal charges.

Many kudos go to all the volunteers and people who care for our earth and keep it safe and clean for all to enjoy. Special thanks go to Norm Christman, Jill Pelland who took the garbage to the landfill and to Lynne Adams who recycles the bottles and cans. We also would like to commend the Town of Princeton for waiving the landfill fees and the Osprey Ratepayers who advertise the event on their website throughout the year.





HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku", It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinous - must contain every number not more than once.



Crunch Burgers

(NC) Making a tower of chips and crushing them into smithereens is bound to bring back the kid in you. From Weber's Big Book of Burgers, this is a recipe creation that your own kids will love building too. Serves: 4 (makes 8 sliders) Prep time: 10 minutes. Grilling time: about 6 minutes.

- 11/2 pounds ground chuck (80% lean)
- 1 tablespoon ketchup
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 slices cheddar cheese, each about 1 ounce, cut into quarters
- 8 slider buns, split
- Ketchup (optional)
- 16 dill pickle chips
- 8 handfuls thin potato chips, such as Lay's® Classic
- 1. Mix the patty ingredients, and then gently form eight patties of equal size, each about 1/2 inch thick. Refrigerate the patties until ready to grill.
- 2. Prepare the grill for direct cooking over medium-high heat (400° to 500°F).
- 3. Grill the patties over direct medium-high heat, with the lid closed, until cooked to medium doneness (160°F), about 6 minutes, turning once. During the last 30 seconds to 1 minute of grilling time, place a quarter-slice of cheese on each patty to melt, and toast the buns, cut side down, over direct heat.
- 4. Place a patty on each bottom bun half and top with ketchup (if using), a patty, pickles, and a stack of chips. Put the bun tops on and then press down. Serve immediately.





There are a number of ways you can help save downtown Princeton.

I'm sure you're getting tired of me telling you that you need to support your local retailers but did you know that doesn't always have to be through shopping?

Well, you can show your support in many different ways including directing a friend, neighbour or relative to a local store when they mention they are looking for something and plan to look for it out of town.

You can be a good ambassador of your community by doing the same thing online in social media sites and when you encounter strangers and tourists wherever you go who mention they are looking for (fill in the blank).

Another great way of helping your downtown core grow and build strength is to compliment those who are doing good things. This also means telling any of us when we aren't meeting your expecta-

I've never shied away from publishing Letters to the Editor patting local businesses on the back for doing a good deed or for going that extra mile for a customer or stranger. Those things do have an impact on how all of us do business in a small town.

That being said, I did have to reject a letter recently that was very critical of a local service. It's not the first time I've had a letter like that come across my desk and in all honesty, they aren't as frequent as the complimentary ones.

My suggestion to those who encounter a problem with a local business where you feel you were done wrong in some way is easy.

First take it up with the business owner. If that doesn't work, or is not possible to do for some reason, my next suggestion is to take it up with the Chamber of Commerce. Yes, that's right.

You may not realize this, but if the Chamber of Commerce is supposed to represent local business, then they should be the ones notified of any wrongdoing of their membership. I have been assured that complaints are dealt with professionally and I am glad to see they don't take that sort of thing lightly.

The last thing any local business owner/operator needs is a nasty letter to appear in this newspaper (which won't happen) or spread all over the internet.

Looking at it from the perspective of the customer, I can see how tempting it is to spread all kinds of nasty things about a business when you aren't satisfied with their service, pricing, selection or whatever. However, it is because of this that you can provide a vital piece of the puzzle to the retail core.

I know I may not always like to hear what some of you think about my business, but if I want to improve my business I better listen to it and try to figure out what I can do about fixing some of the things that generate complaints.

Lucky for me, we don't get a lot of criticism in what we do but when we do it's usually constructive and some of the suggestions we have acted upon. I like to think those changes help to make my product better and hopefully more appealing to customers.

If I had a retail business I would think the same way so if you shop somewhere in town and they don't have the brand of (fill in the blank) you are looking for, ask. Maybe they'll start to carry it. If they aren't as accepting of your suggestion, then I don't blame you for trying to shop elsewhere for that same item.

As business owners/operators in a small town we all face the same issues. We have only so many people to choose from for customers and if we don't listen to them we can find that number of potential customers slowly decrease.

What does this have to do with saving downtown Princeton?

It puts you, the consumer in control. If you don't like grocery prices in town, lobby the Chamber of Commerce to get their business development committee working on attracting that kind of investment

This means encouraging another grocery store to join the downtown core.

When that happens, it keeps grocery spending in Princeton and forces competitors to take a look at pricing, which ultimately benefits shoppers.

I use groceries here as just an example but it can be used on anything you buy in Princeton. Think about it the next time you think you have no say and decide to take your business out of town.







BC Southern Interior MP, Alex Atamanenko supports the Official Opposition's fight against the reckless implementation of the U.S. Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA) and urges his colleagues to continue to push Conservatives at Finance Committee to remove it from Budget Bill C-31 so that it can be properly scrutinized and amended.

Study shows 2009 recession continues

A new report by the Chartered Professional Accountants of BC (CPABC) indicates that in 2013, population and development activity decreased in the Thompson-Okanagan.

According to the BC Check-Up, Regional Edition, population declined in 2013, as net migration, a main source of the region's growth, fell for the first time in more than 25 years. Retirees and second home buyers, who were growth catalysts for many years, have yet to return to the region. As a consequence, development activity dropped to its lowest level in six years and jobs were lost in construction and other related service industries.

"The relatively lower housing prices compared to our neighbouring markets than before might bring

the attention back to the region's housing market," said Jeff Omland, CPA, CA, partner with Omland Heal Chartered Accountants.

After job gains in the last half of 2012, the region's employment plummeted until April 2013, when employment numbers began to recover. Nevertheless, average annual employment was down 7,500 jobs-a decrease of 2.9 per cent and the largest job loss since 2009. Almost three-quarters of these losses were part-time jobs. The region's employment loss (-2.9 per cent) was more than three times the provincial average of -0.9 per cent.

Business bankruptcies in the region rose for the second consecutive year, increasing from 43 in 2012, to 54 in 2013. This increase is continued on Page 23

continued from Page 22 not surprising given the region's struggling economy and lack of population growth in 2013. It also reflects that the region's economic performance in 2013 was still hampered by the 2009 recession. In contrast, the rate of consumer insolvency in the region decreased by 5 per cent in 2013. Despite the decrease, the region's insolvency rate remained the second highest in 2013.

Two bright spots last year were the continued strength of forestry and wood products manufacturing, and the stimulation of real estate sales as a result of low interest rates and lower prices. The outlook for the region's economy is uncertain for 2014, and will depend upon the continued performance of the resources sector.

"For 2014, forestry, support activities, and mill employment appear poised to expand or at least remain stable," said Omland.

"Demand for forest products is expected to continue to grow this year, increasing prices and sustaining mills with higher production costs. Also, the lower Canadian dollar may encourage more American tourists and Canadians to spend vacation in the region."


