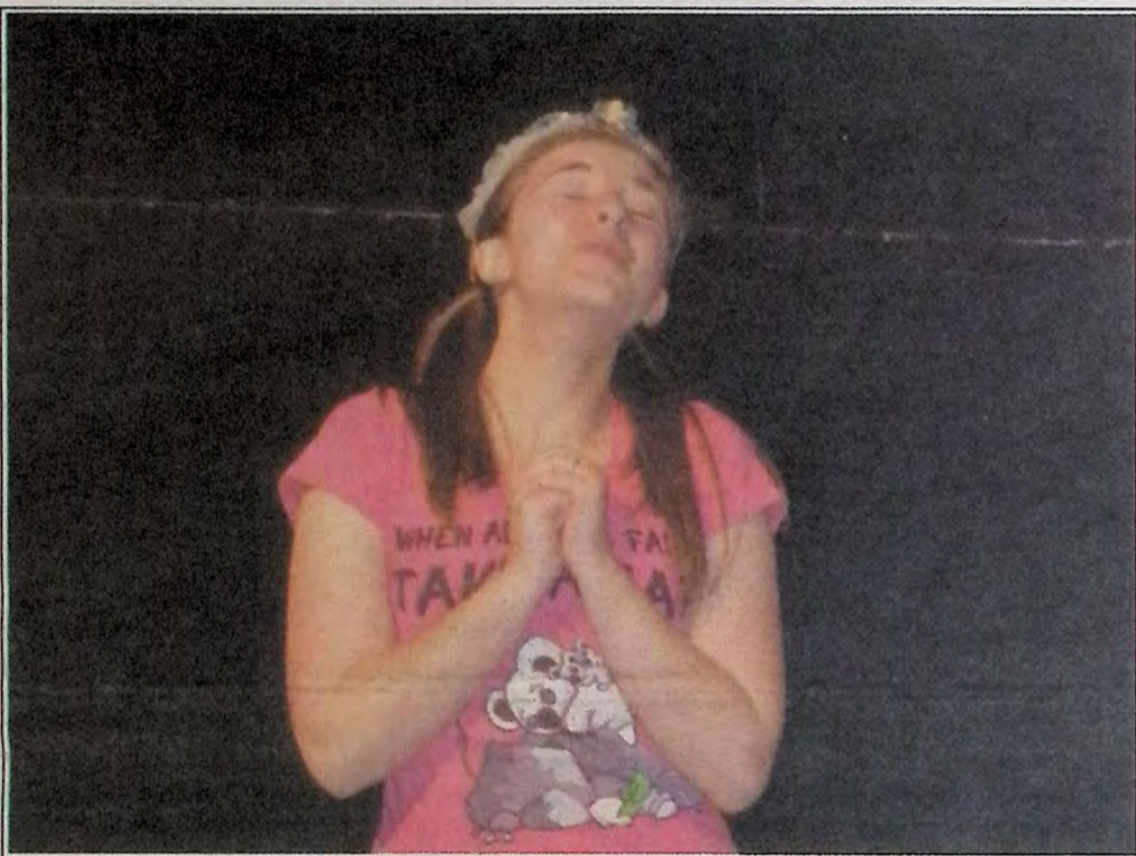

## Day's case threatens Medicare

If you value Canada's medicare system, you should have been at the June 4 forum held at Riverside Centre. Ed Staples, of SOHC, explained how Dr. Brian Day's Supreme Court challenge in defense of his private clinics, is a threat to Canada's medicare system. He gave an excellent speech covering the history of medicare and some myths (lies) being spread about the cost of medicare.

Staples began with the plan by Premier Tommy Douglas to bring medicare to Saskatchewan. After Saskatchewan proved medicare could work, Prime Minister John Diefenbaker, a Conservative, and Opposition Leader Lester Pearson, a Liberal, worked together to bring medicare to Canada. It is a system in which every Canadian has access to health care regardless of where they live in Canada. This is the Canada Health Act.

A lot of what we hear about medicare these days is myth, Staples advised. We are told that medicare is not sustainable, but that is not true.

Our aging population is NOT driving up health care costs. Health care costs more to consumers these days because of what they spend out of their own pockets, not because of what the government spends. Health care takes up a higher percentage of government budgets, not because it costs more, but because government revenues are lower due to private and corporate tax cuts.

We hear health care spending is

out of control, but that is NOT true. Health care spending by government has remained stable at between 4 and 5 percent of GDP. Private health care spending has increased 12 percent. Private health care spending is for the cost of dentistry, eye care and other treatments and medications not covered by medicare. The notion that privatization of our health care will control costs is NOT true. Privatization simply gives private health care providers more opportunity to set their own prices for health care services.

Staples ended with the statement that surveys show 94 percent of Canadians want their public health care system.

Guest speaker Rick Turner, Co-Chair of the BC Health Coalition talked about wait lists for surgery. He needed a minor knee surgery and waited a year. His wife had a medical crisis that could have killed her and had no wait. He said the average waiting period for heart surgery is one week. The argument in favour of private health care is to end long waiting lists. However, under private health care the patient will pay for that privilege. Day's clinic now charges much more than

## Forum 'dams' river project

A total of 45 people attended the Forum on Rivers June 5th at Princeton's Seniors Hall.

Speaker Lee McFadyen of Cawston presented a slide show explaining the significance of the Similkameen River. In her presentation she explained that the Similkameen Watershed is the largest watershed in the Okanagan system in that it contributes 75% of the water to the Okanagan River.

The Similkameen Watershed is drained by the Similkameen River, exists within the boundaries of the RDOS and covers landscape from alpine ecosystems to the grasslands of the dry lower Similkameen Valley.

McFadyen emphasized that prior to European settlement the valley experienced little change. Following it the changes that have taken place include mining, ranching, agriculture, logging, concentrated settlement, water extraction,

industry, recreation and fire suppression. All of these actions result in a chain reaction she stated.

The Similkameen River has four climate stations, six snow survey stations and numerous collection stations which result in a lot of data being recorded about the river.

"To me the Similkameen is the lifeblood of the Valley," McFadyen said.

"And like blood, it is very precious."

The Similkameen River flows to Palmer Lake in Washington State and eventually joins the Okanagan River system, which then joins the Columbia River system where the combined waters spill into the Pacific Ocean at Astoria, Oregon.

McFadyen concluded her presentation with the statement, "May the river forever flow free. Thank you for coming, listening and for being concerned."

Ken Farquharson of Victoria was

the next guest speaker.

He started his presentation with, "I think you would need an excellent reason to take a free flowing river and dam it."

His presentation focused on the Fortis proposed dam project and explained this is not the first time attempts have been made to regulate the flow of the Similkameen.

He listed a total of nine proposed projects dating back to the 1920's, with water storage being the main purpose of the proposals and the majority of plans were to put a dam at Shanker's Bend.

The first recorded project looking to generate power was in 1994 when Princeton Light & Power kicked off its campaign to dam the river. The four projects that followed also had electrical generation as part of the proposal.

Farquharson stated that electrical generation alone would not make

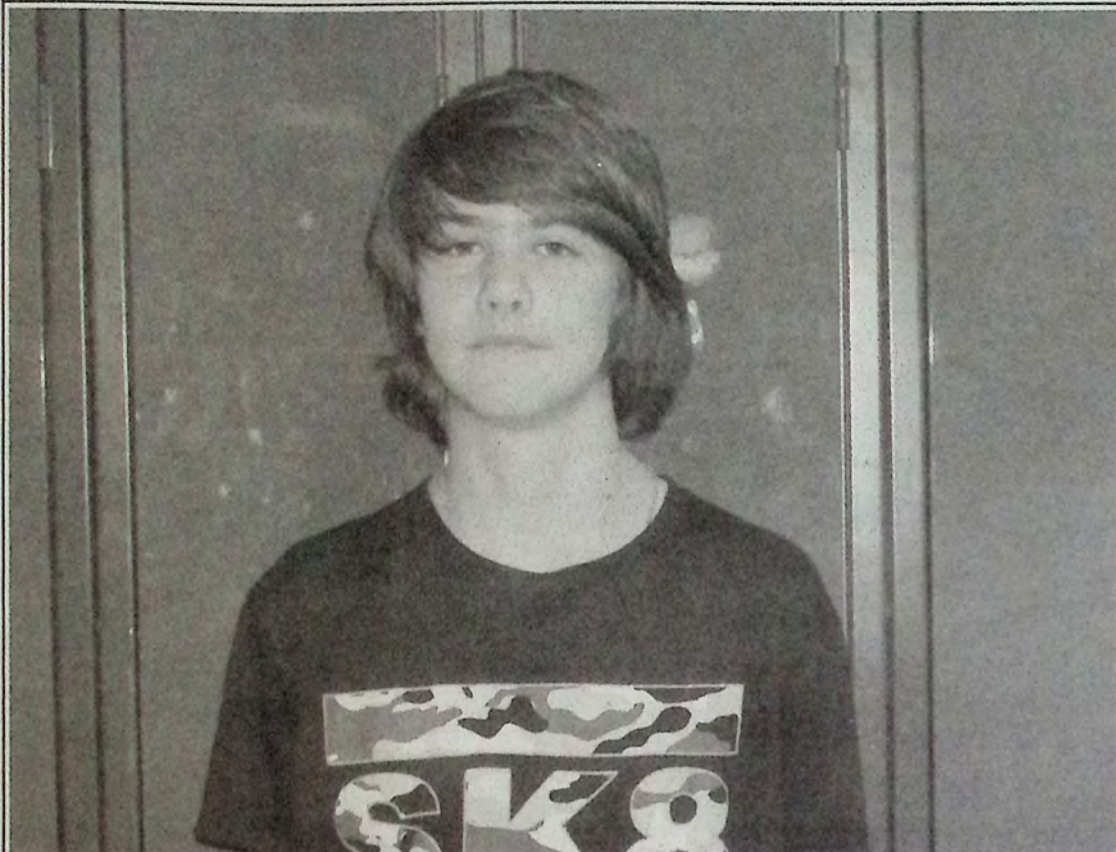

## My Turn...

### Undercurrents In The River

I haven't been following the Fortis Similkameen River dam project proposal very closely at all. I think part of it is because I seriously doubt there will ever be a dam on the river in my lifetime. Another part is because of how the utility rates have jumped I doubt the public is about to fall over themselves and sing the praises of regulated water control.

So I attended the Forum on Rivers last week expecting a 'rally the troops' movement to attack the utility company on messing around with our water.

What I was pleased to see was that did not happen and a large volume of information flowed around the room instead.

I learned a lot by dipping my toe into the pools of information. For example, I had no idea the Similkameen River provided 75-percent of the flow to the Okanagan River system. Nor did I realize the important backwatering effect shared between the Similkameen River and Palmer Lake in Washington State where, depending on water level, one recharges the other.

What really got my attention is the location of the dam. I had always thought it was 'secretly' planned to provide Copper Mountain with all of its power and that Fortis was 'secretly' working a deal on behalf of the mine to ram the dam into reality.

As it turns out, the mine was not even mentioned and the location was described as basically (my words) a damn stupid place to build. That is because so far upstream from the Tulameen River means the dam would have minimal effect on flood control.

With all of this in mind, why build what would be the third largest dam in British Columbia if its not to feed power to Copper Mountain, generate extra power to sell to US interests and keep the river flowing at a regular rate all year long?

I'm obviously not the only one asking that question. The only way to make money on a dam of that size apparently is to sell the downstream benefits. Since Fortis is a utility company that is privately-owned, how much of those benefits do you think will show up on your utility bill next to the line: 'Downstream Benefits Credit?'

I'm not expecting to see any because of the partnership made with the Washington State Department of Ecology Columbia River Policy Advisory Group. This is the group that has set aside \$1.6-million to give to Fortis to assist with the dam feasibility study. I'm guessing they are expecting more than their \$1.6-million back once the dam opens its gates and sends water rushing past the recently completed dike project along Waterfront Avenue in Princeton and beyond.

Trust me on this.

You haven't heard the last of this project and I hope I'm never proven wrong about not seeing a dam on the river in my lifetime.

## Museum receives heartfelt donation

Seventy years ago last Friday (June 6, 2014), allied troops executed operation Overlord, the largest amphibious invasion in

human history. Hundreds of thousands of troops were committed to the assault of five Normandy beaches: Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno

and Sword. Even though Canada had already been at war with Germany since September 10, 1939, D-Day still marked an important time for Canadian troops: Upon landing at Juno Beach, Canadians penetrated further into Nazi occupied France than either American or British troops at their respective beachheads.

Historian John Keegan stated, "At the end of the day, its forward elements stood deeper into France than those of any other division. The opposition the Canadians faced was stronger than that of any other beach save Omaha. That was an accomplishment in which the whole nation could take considerable pride."

Princeton Museum is proud to announce the acquisition of a unique collection of WWII era memorabilia: The Princeton Elks have graciously donated their "Smoke Fund" display, which includes letters to and from local soldiers, fundraising ads, and a number of other documents that will expand our understanding of Princeton's role in the war.

## Council approves truck purchase

Princeton Town Council approved the purchase of a bucket lift truck at their June 2nd regular meeting.

"This truck has been rented by the town on numerous occasions throughout the year for a number of years," stated Director of Infrastructure and Parks Kevin Huey in his report to Town Council.

"The owner has decided to get out of providing the aerial maintenance service and sell the bucket lift truck."

The price to purchase the truck is \$14,000.00 and the expenditure has been included in the 2014 Town of Princeton Budget.

"The town crew is familiar with this piece of equipment and has experience in its use," Huey states.

The bucket lift has been certified and the truck has been inspected and verified to be mechanically sound by a certified mechanic.

Huey shows in his cost analysis that with an estimated life expectancy of ten years and annual maintenance, repair and fuel costs set at

about \$3,950.00 the truck will cost \$5,350.00 per year to operate.

He has further included with his report an annual usage projection which would see the bucket lift truck used a total of 46 days a year doing tasks such as hanging banners, Christmas decorations, placing and removing hanging baskets, tree pruning and related jobs. In comparison to the rental of a Genie unit (there are no bucket lift trucks available for rental) the cost would be \$12,650.00 per year based on a \$275.00 per day rental fee. Huey says the purchase of the bucket lift truck would save the Town of Princeton \$7,300.00 a year.

In addition, costs would increase with the use of a Genie unit, as it would require transportation to and from each job site.

"The Genie lift is limited in its applications and will require more time to perform some tasks increasing the labour costs," Huey concluded.

## Are Young Men Better Fathers?

This Sunday is Father's Day. It is a day to pay tribute to our fathers. My father died years ago, but I can still pay tribute to him as a father. He worked hard to provide for his family, he was a faithful, loving husband to my mother, and sentimental about their wedding anniversary. He was a better father than his father.

Both my grandfathers were tyrants in their own homes. They demanded subservience from their wives and children, despite the fact that their wives and children often rebelled against this autocratic rule. They believed they were good fathers and husbands because they brought home the money and set the moral standards for the family, but there is more to being a good father than a paycheque and rules of behaviour. There should be love and appreciation and respect for the people their children should become.

My father learned something from his own childhood experience, but while he was no tyrant and taught us to think for ourselves, there was

no way he was going to go into the delivery room with his wife, and no way he was going to change a diaper. He rarely washed a dish, or cooked a meal and I never saw him ever do laundry. I don't think he ever swept a floor and I know he never scrubbed one. That was women's work.

To be fair, he raised his daughters to believe they were as good as men any day. I remember him saying, "Dawn, you never take a back seat to anyone just because you're a girl."

At the same time, if my mother wasn't feeling well, he expected his girls to do the women's work as well as some of the men's work.

Most men of my generation were a little more helpful with raising children and sharing the housework, but I see younger men today who are much better fathers than their fathers were. I see young men involved in their children's activities, whether they have sons or daughters or both. I see young men pushing strollers, doing grocery shopping, taking kids to hockey or dance lessons. I see my granddaughter's husband as capable around the house as she is, and taking it for granted that he should be doing part of the work.

I wonder if these younger men take pride in being good fathers, or if their participation in parenting is just the result of both parents holding down jobs. I tend to think they take pride in their role as a parent. They are involved from the time the baby is born, and most of them are in the delivery room when the baby arrives. When I was having babies, men were expected to stay out of the delivery room. These

days, fathers are expected to be there for the big event. I believe it makes them better fathers to be there.

Being a good father is very important to a man's daughters. He is usually their role model for the husband they will choose. If he wants his daughters to choose responsible, hard-working, dependable men who will love and protect and provide for their families, then the father must be the kind of man he wants his daughters to marry.

Being a good father to a son means being the kind of man he wants his son to become, because his son will learn easily from him how a man should be. If he is not a good father, his son may suffer a good deal of sorrow before he learns not to be the man his father was. I have seen that side of fatherhood and its effect on a son.

This Sunday, when those of you still have a good father living, take the time to tell him how much you appreciate the fact that he was a good father to you. Maybe he made mistakes, maybe you fought with him, and maybe he could have done things differently, but if you love him, he must have done most things right. If you still love him, make a point of letting him know.

As for you young fathers, maybe you ought to keep in mind that someday your children will be thinking of you on Fathers' Day. Will they think of you with great love and gratitude? That depends on you, and the kind of father you are.

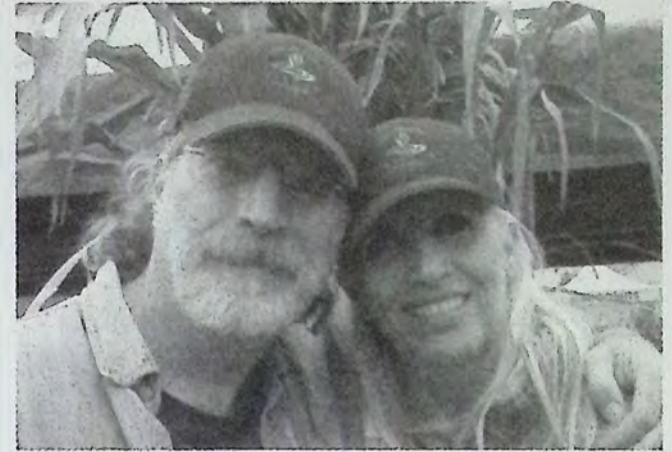
Father's Day gives all of us something to think about, doesn't it?

## Joint committee commends process to address roaming horses

The South Okanagan Similkameen Joint Council, made up of Chiefs from Penticton Indian Band (PIB), Osoyoos Indian Band (OIB) and Lower Similkameen Indian Band (LSIB) as well as the Chair, Vice Chair, and a Board representative from the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen (RDOS), commends the Penticton Indian Band, the RDOS and District of Summerland on their collaborative efforts to investigate the scope and scale of the free roaming horse issue in the region and eventually implement a Long Range Management Plan.

Free roaming horses range between Penticton Indian Band lands, Crown lands, West Bench, Sage Mesa, Summerland and occasionally the Kaleden (Highway 3A) area. The horses cause distress to some agricultural producers, homeowner's yards and gardens on and off Band lands. They become a safety concern for themselves and others when they

reach the roads and highways that dissect the areas they travel.

With the signing the South Okanagan Similkameen Protocol Agreement, June 2013, between the RDOS, PIB, LSIB and OIB many issues that cross boundaries are now seen as opportunities to be addressed collaboratively. A model example of this new partnership is a joint project to address the free roaming horse issue. The PIB, RDOS and District of Summerland are all contributing (combining) staff time and resources to work together on this issue. This unique alliance compelled Forest Lands Natural Resource Operations to contribute staff time and aerial support to conduct an aerial head count using a helicopter, and has many other outside stakeholders willing to come to the table to discuss mitigation options.

"From the protocol agreement, this is one of many opportunities that will bring local government and agencies together, to recognize

and acknowledge the common issues and work on solutions together" notes PIB Councillor, Dolly Kruger, a key member of the working group.

RDOS Chair, Mark Pendergraft agrees, "The RDOS is pleased with the great spirit of cooperation to address a long standing issue and we commend everyone involved."

A communications strategy is committed to keeping residents, politicians and agencies apprised of progress milestones. As the project unfolds a template is being developed, documenting the progress; successes, challenges and step by step actions. It is the intention of the working group to be able to share this template with other Bands, local governments and agencies throughout the Province grappling with similar issues.

"Working together it is hopeful that we can all be on the same page in coming to a positive 'resolve' for all involved," says spokesperson Maureen Fūgeta of District of Summerland.

## Living Past 100

### Obesity Is A World Crisis

Everybody in the world is getting fat. That is the conclusion of a world survey released last month. This should be good news as it tells us most of the people in the world are getting more than enough to eat. What it really means is that health care costs are getting higher and eating too much is the reason.

This may not be true. In fact, it is probably false. Studies done of low income families shows a higher rate of obesity due to filling up on cheap starchy food like potatoes and pasta. If that is an indicator, and the more well-to-do are more slender, it could be that increasing numbers of people cannot afford healthy food. If that is the case, then increasing numbers of obese people throughout the world are living on cheap food rather than healthy food.

What is the truth behind why people are getting fat? Why is diabetes, a disease associated with unhealthy diet, now at epidemic proportions? Is it due to income or lack of income? Who determines what is a healthy diet and what is not?

There are a lot of researchers looking into why people in the industrialized world are getting too fat. Some say it is lack of exercise, too much starch and sugar in foods. Some say too much grain is a problem, that we were never meant to eat so much grain, but we were meant to eat more meat, fruit, vegetables and fish. Some say obesity is due to too many people eating cheap food at fast food places. What if all of them are right, and all of them are somewhat wrong?

Until around 100 years ago, most people lived in rural areas. They had few household conveniences. If they wanted to stay warm, men chopped wood and stoked the fires. Women cooked on wood-burning stoves. Few people had automobiles, so they walked or rode a horse, and keeping a horse meant looking after it every day, making sure it had water and hay (more work!) Women washed clothes using a scrub board and clothes were hung on a line and then ironed. Even whipping cream took a lot of energy. Children did not sit around on Saturday mornings watching cartoons on television, they had chores to do. Nobody drove them to school, they walked.

You get the picture: life meant work. What did people eat in those days? They ate what was available in season. The first food of spring was spinach or other fast-growing greens, and the first fruit was rhubarb. Men and women worked at growing food and preserving it all during the gardening months. Families had root cellars and canning cupboards. This involved more work. There were bakers, butchers, dairies and grocery stores, and there were restaurants, but most food was prepared at home from basic ingredients. There was no such thing as going to a grocery store and finding packaged cereals, instant puddings, frozen dinners and peeled carrots in a bag. People knew what was in their food, too. They grew it themselves or bought it from the local farmer, and the farmer was not using pesticides. The baker was not using preservatives, the butcher was not cutting up hormone-treated beef and pork.

Yes, lifestyle and the wrong foods no doubt lead to obesity, but maybe we should be looking at lifestyle in particular and asking ourselves what we could be doing differently.

Our next building was on Green Lake. We had a truck load of logs delivered but because the driveway was so steep the logging truck couldn't deliver to the site. We had to drag them down behind the pick-up truck one at a time. We noticed that someone was building a log house just three lots away and perhaps because I had come from the city I thought we had competition.

After a weekend we went back to continue our construction and to our surprise all of our logs were neatly decked right beside our construction site. We walked over to our competitor and asked him if he knew who decked our logs. He told us he saw us struggling to get the logs down so he used his tractor and decked them up which saved us an immense amount of work.

I asked him how much I owed him and he said nothing, glad to help. We introduced ourselves, his name was Norm Granberg. I got to know him over the years and admired him and thought I'd like to be like him.

One day we were riding in his new to him pickup truck when he said to me, "George, it ain't the high cost of living that gets folks, it's the cost of living high." There was no indication that Norm ever lived high by world standards but he was a happy man and I was blessed to have known him.

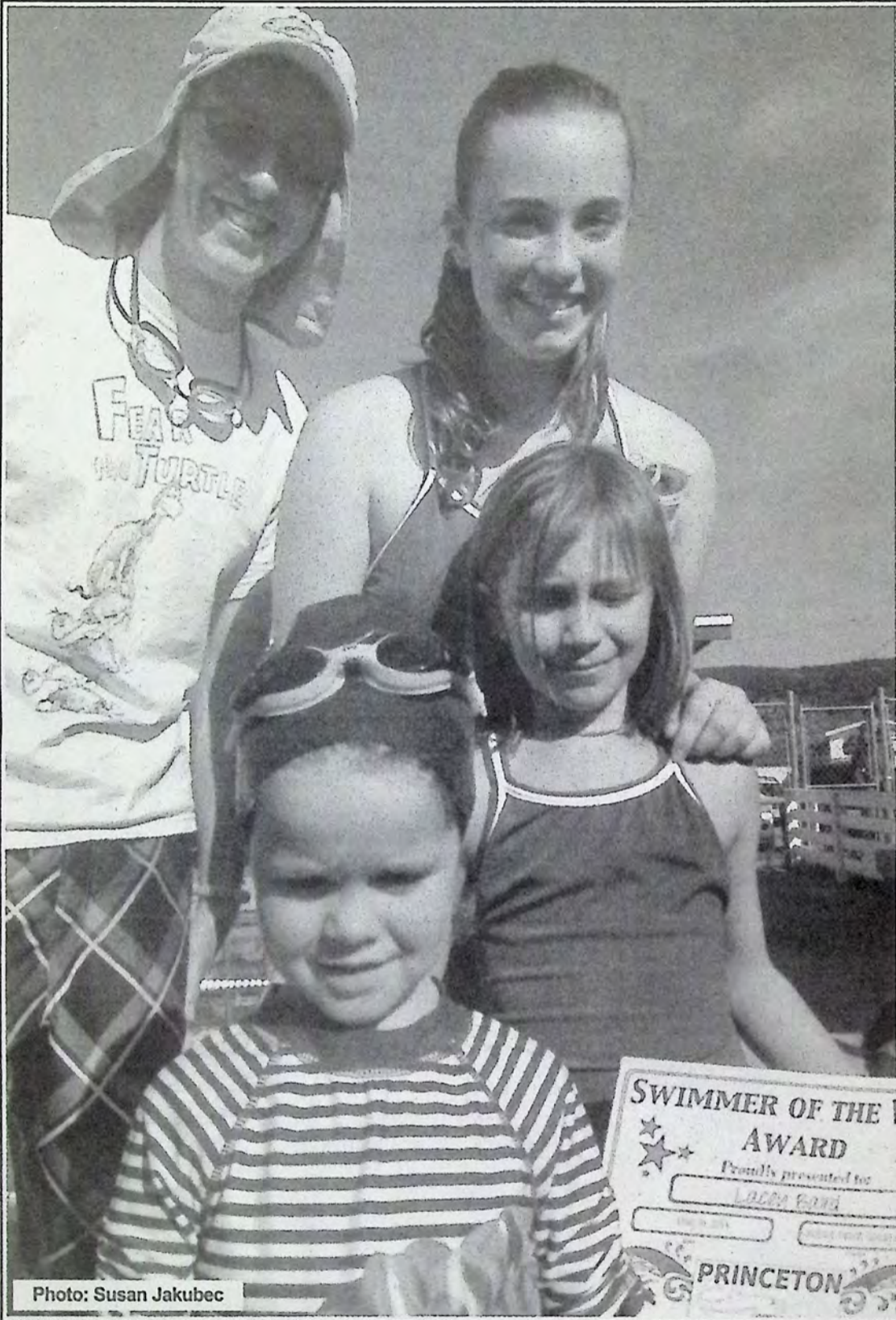

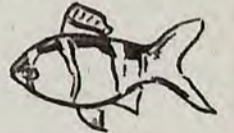

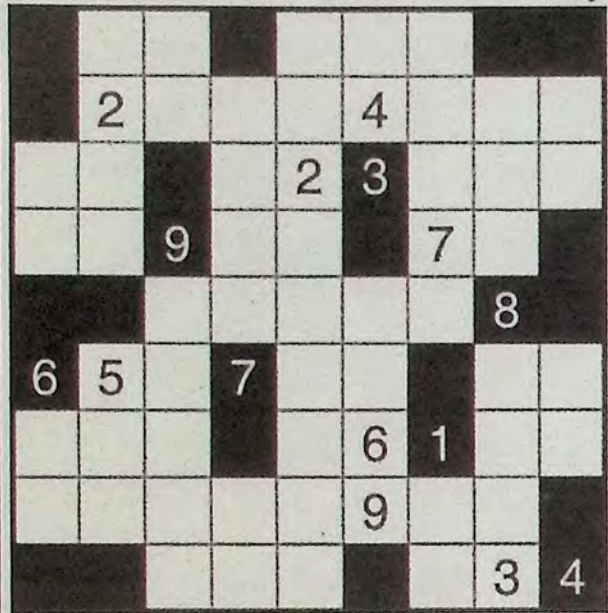

this will be our last meeting until September, but field trips will continue throughout the summer.

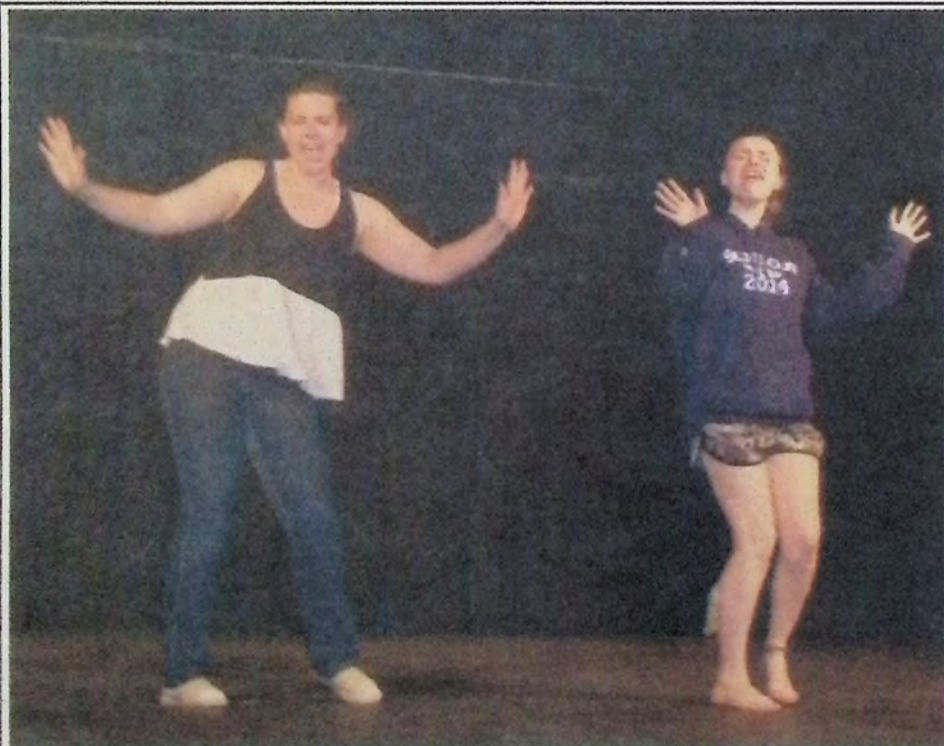

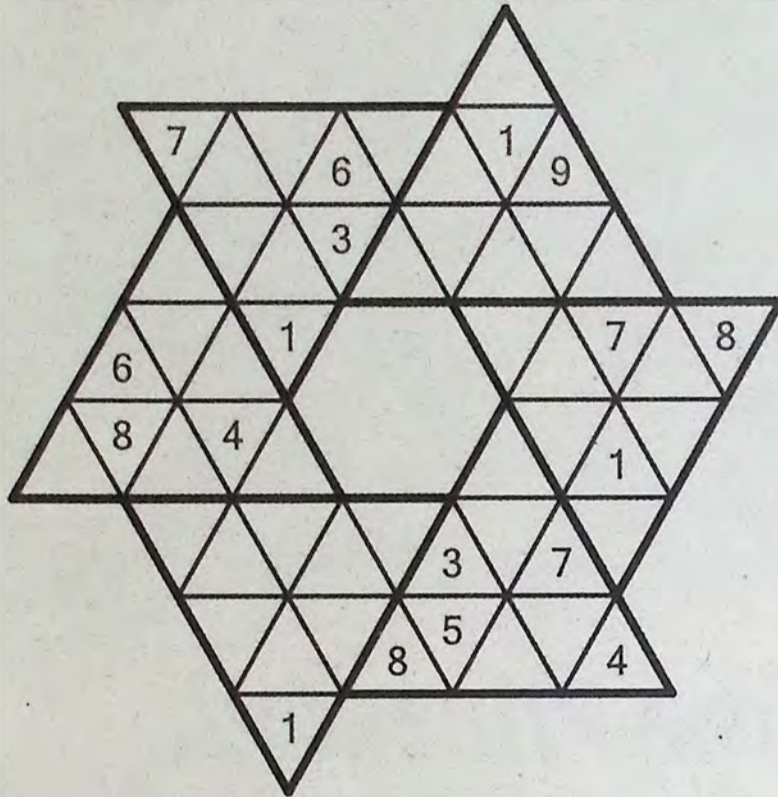

## HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

## ***Saving Downtown Princeton...***

**...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott**

This week I would like to revisit an issue I've discussed, but with an update.

The electronic sign downtown has been a bit of an issue to me. I am convinced it is in the wrong location. I've discussed it with various members of Town Council and employees of the Town and while I get the argument that it is easier to maintain where it is I still think it could be more useful somewhere else.

It won't be long before the former Town Hall location on the corner of Bridge Street and Kenley Avenue will be gone. The building is unsafe for use due to the level of contamination that exists there. For those of you who are relatively new to Princeton, the empty lot next to the old Town Hall building used to be a dry cleaners. It burned down and left behind a contaminated piece of property, which is why it has sat empty for a number of years. There

are ways to remediate the soil, but that is costly if another structure is planned for the site. As a result, some of the contamination leached into the basement of the old Town Hall building. This is why you haven't seen a 'For Sale' sign on the building and why the only use it has been getting lately is fire practice as it really isn't safe to rent out for anything that would attract living, breathing mammals.

So this means the best use of the property will be to turn it into a parking lot to increase the size of the lot already there and I think that is a good idea. We really do need more parking downtown.

But what about the electronic sign? Plans are to leave it where it is. My argument for moving it is simple: you can't attract people downtown without some sort of magnet to pull them off of Highway 3. The electronic sign does a great job of promoting many local activities and

points of interest but unless you are already downtown, you aren't going to see it.

My idea, which I've shared here before, it to have an electronic sign on Highway 3. I'm not convinced it should sit next to the Roundhouse, but if that were the only choice of location, at least it would be on Highway 3. If I had to choose two locations I would pick the pullout just West of downtown on Highway 3 across the road from the bottle depot, The Hut. My second choice would be to place one at the East end of town probably near the Chamber of Commerce location.

These signs could be solar powered like the ones you encounter at road construction sites and could simply say "Downtown, next left" or "Visit downtown Princeton, next left" or something simple enough to get the point across that there is a whole lot more to Princeton than what many travelers see as they whiz by on

Highway 3.

Why don't I offer this suggestion to Town Council?

Well, I did.

That's when I was told it wasn't feasible.

Remember I said I had an update to this story?

Well, I do. A local businessman who is willing to contribute a portion of the cost for these electronic signs for Highway 3 has approached me.

Town Council, are you listening?

I like to think my travelling habits are pretty normal. When I'm heading to a destination I usually go straight to where I want to be. If there is signage telling me about other points of interest along the way, I am more likely to check them out as I go by.

I do not plan any of my trips using the internet because not all the information is current or accurate. Especially when it comes to reviews. One angry person can set

the tone and hurt an otherwise pleasant destination just by posting a negative review.

But what does this have to do with saving downtown Princeton?

Simple, if you think electronic signs on Highway 3 pointing traffic downtown is a good idea, then let Town Council know. You can help save downtown Princeton in this case without spending a dime just by making a phone call to 250-295-3135 or e-mailing the Town of Princeton or individual members of Town Council. Their e-mails can be found at the Town of Princeton website located at [www.princeton.ca](http://www.princeton.ca).

You can't send people downtown if they don't know it exists and people zipping by on Highway 3 likely have no clue there's more of Princeton to see.

Bright, flashing signage telling them there is a downtown core just may make some of them stop and look.

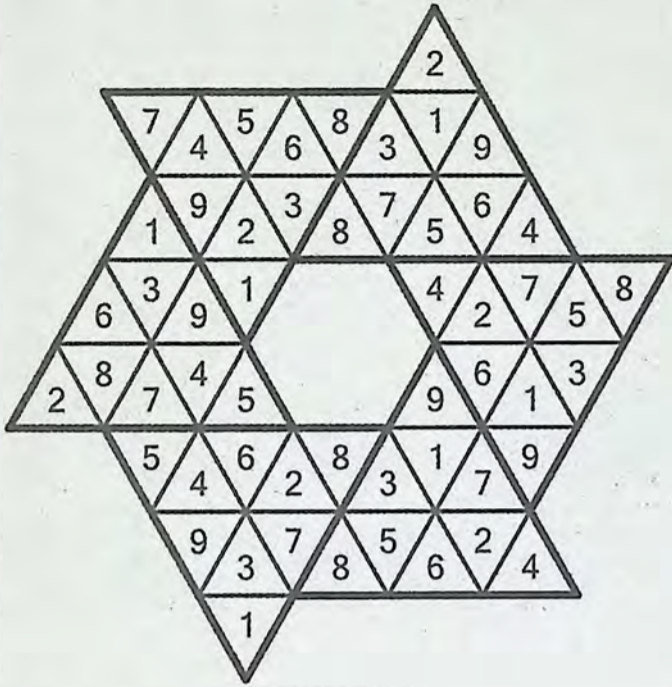

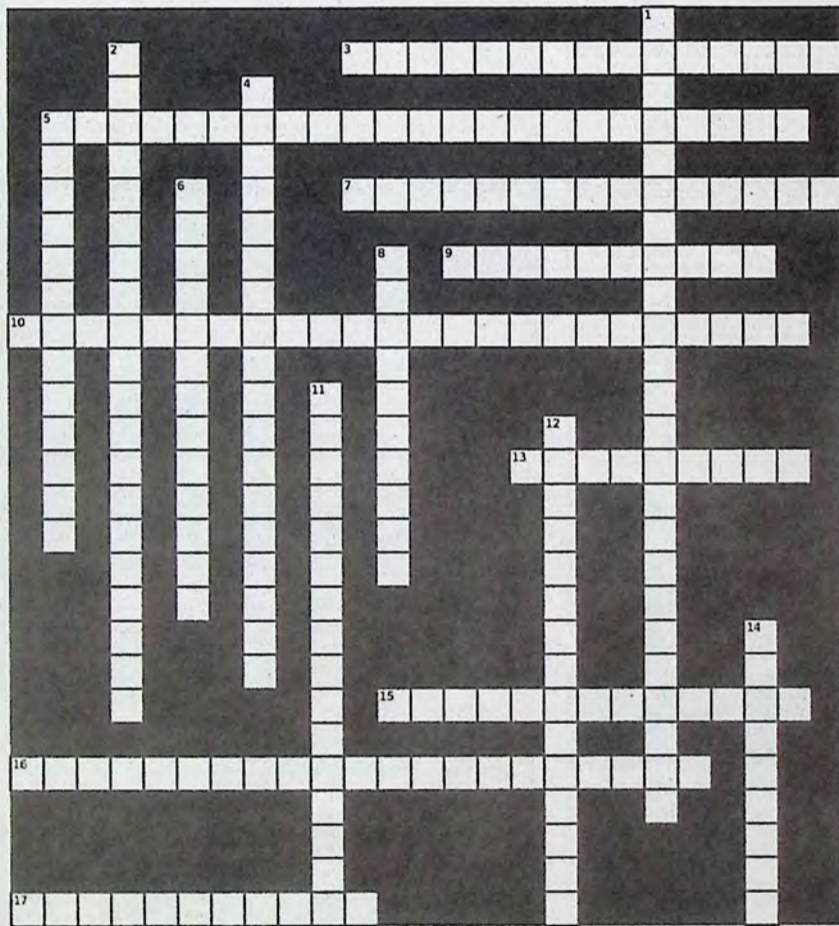

# Day's case threatens Medicare

MSP allows, such as \$9,000 for a hip or knee replacement.

The Day case is the result of Day doing illegal billing and double dipping (both MSP and patient pay for same procedure). The way the case is being presented to Supreme

Court is in the form of a constitutional challenge that if ruled in his favour would make way for a private health care system. The court hearing begins September 3, and the BC Health Coalition is opposing Day's position.

Dr. Duncan Etches is a G.P. who

has seen a lot of changes in health care during his long career. He attacked the myth that waiting lists would be shorter under private health care. He said the waiting lists would be longer for those in the public system because doctors and nurses would go for the higher pay of the private system. Reducing wait lists in our present system just takes good management, he said. He added that the two tier system has provided a lot of information for comparison. He gave the example of more people in the United States die of heart surgery in the private system than in the public system.

In his final remarks, he added there is a moral issue involved: how much do we care for one another?

Questions and comments from the audience followed the speeches. The first comment was from a man who had undergone heart surgery and had waited no time at all after he was diagnosed.

Dr. Etches responded to one question by saying about 50 percent of physicians and nurses support public health care, but 70 percent of

young medical graduates prefer a salaried position.

There was a comment about the Harper government shutting down the Canadian Health Council and refusing to negotiate a new Health Accord. Ed Staples replied it was a political agenda. Rick Turner added that B.C. is losing five billion dollars as a result of no Health Accord.

One man stated bluntly there should be a referendum to allow Canadians to say what they want. He received applause. Turner said people will have their chance to speak out this fall, but did not elaborate on what that meant.

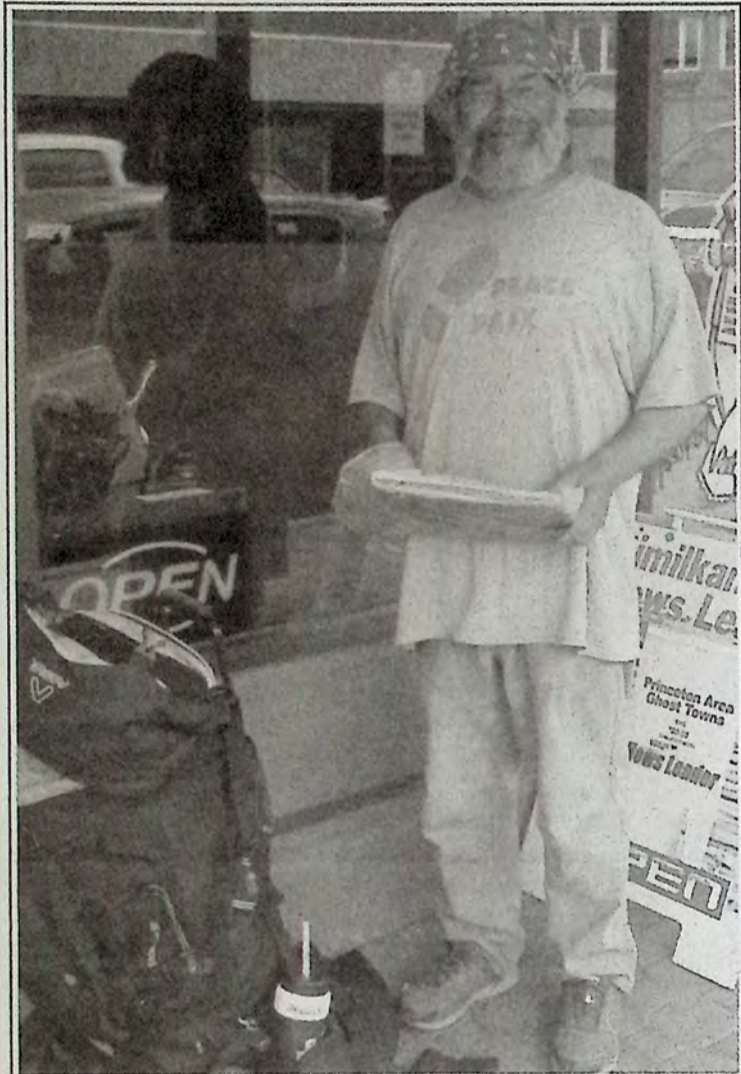
A questioner noted Day had been running his private clinic for many

years, and asked, Wasn't he violating the Canada Health Act from the start?"

Rick Turner replied there had not been the political will to shut down Day's clinic. He added there are 70 private clinics operating in B.C. now.

The final statement from the audience came from a man who said, "Why talk about private systems? People with money get their treatment anywhere."

The forum ended with coffee and an opportunity to donate to the BC Health Coalition fund. Many people made donations. Anyone interested in this health care issue can look up BC Health Coalition on the net.

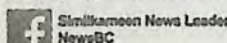
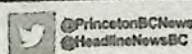

..... continued from Front Page the Fortis project viable however, downstream benefits would generate revenues to make it worthwhile.

"This project cannot fly as an electrical generation project," he stated and pointed out that benefits related to flood control, with a dam located so far up the Similkameen, would be minimal considering the volume of water contributed by the Tulameen River.

Farquharson described the simple principal behind downstream benefits as, "You provide extra flow from the storage you have, we will give you a share from the benefits."

What makes the Fortis project interesting is that according to Farquharson, the provincial government views the utility company as a private entity, therefore, they are not getting involved in the downstream benefit negotiations.

However, Fortis appears to have a partner in the Washington State Department of Ecology where the Columbia River Policy Advisory Group has budgeted funding of \$1.6-million to the Fortis BC Storage Feasibility Study for the "evaluation of a proposed hydropower and water supply, surface storage facility on the Similkameen River near Princeton, BC with shared cost and water supply for Washington and Oregon."

Farquharson noted, "This is not power for us," and that the power generated by the dam would be, in his view, to benefit the shareholders of Fortis and US interests.

He says that if the project proceeds, it would eliminate one of the last remaining free flowing rivers in the province and shift the management of the Similkameen to Fortis and its partners.
