## Open burning ban in place

Effective at noon on Sunday, June 15, 2014, the current open burning ban was expanded throughout the entire Kamloops Fire Centre to include the Salmon Arm Fire Zone and Clearwater Fire Zone. This was to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect the public.

This prohibition will remain in place in the Clearwater Fire Zone and Salmon Arm Fire Zone for elevations above 1,200 metres until September 15, 2014. For all other elevations in those zones, this prohibition will remain in place until October 1, 2014.

This prohibition will remain in place in the Kamloops, Vernon, Penticton (including the Lower Similkameen), Merritt (including the Upper

Similkameen) and Lillooet fire zones until October 15, 2014, or until the public is informed otherwise.

Specifically, this open fire prohibition applies to:

- The burning of any waste, slash or other materials.
- The burning of stubble or grass.
- The use of fireworks, sky lanterns or burning barrels of any size or description.

This prohibition does not ban campfires that are a half-metre high by a half-metre wide (or smaller) and does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes.

This prohibition covers all BC Parks, Crown lands and private lands, but it does not apply within the boundaries of a local government that has forest

fire prevention bylaws in place and is serviced by a fire department. Before lighting any fire, residents should check with local civic authorities regarding any current prohibitions.

The Kamloops Fire Centre stretches from the northern border of Wells Gray Park to the U.S. border to the south, and from the Bridge River Glacier west of Gold Bridge to the Monashee Mountains east of Lumby.

Anyone found in contravention of an open fire prohibition may be issued a ticket for \$345 or, if convicted in court, may be fined up to \$100,000 and sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person may be subject to a penalty of up to \$10,000 and be ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.

## Board hears reading report

At the June 11 Board of Education meeting, school trustees learned some new information about student achievements in reading and how it related to graduation rates.

Assistant Superintendent Steve McNiven showed a graph which tracks student achievement from Grade 4 to graduation. The information was surprising.

Students who had substandard reading skills on the Grade 4 tests were not necessarily those who did not graduate. During the course of

their school years, many improved their reading skills.

Oddly, some showed a decline in their last two school years, failing to meet the required level of reading skills.

McNiven said he was pleased to see some problems had been identified and corrected between Grade 4 and later school years. The graph showed a graduation rate of 70 per cent for the district. The district will continue to work on improving reading skills and graduation rates.

## Student trustees review year

School District #58 (Nicola-Similkameen) is one of three school districts where students sit as trustees on the Board of Education. During the past year, Hillary Riel and Andrew Silbernagel have served as student trustees for Princeton. Merritt has two student trustees who attend when the Board of Education meets in Merritt.

At the June 11 Board of Education meeting, Board Chair Gordon Comeau thanked the students for their service during the year, and they were presented with electronic tablets in appreciation.

This is the final Board meeting for the student trustees, who graduate this year.

Trustee Richie Gage asked Riel and Silbernagel how student trustees might be more involved in the future.

Riel suggested the student trustee positions should be open to all students who wish to apply. Silbernagel agreed and added a Grade 11 student should be recruit-

ed as he or she could serve for two years. This was given approval by the Board.

A further suggestion from another trustee was to have student trustees attend meetings in both Princeton and Merritt, and they be invited to attend special functions.

When the student trustees gave their reports, they mentioned the general frustration felt by all students at Princeton Secondary regarding the teachers' job action. Few students walked out in protest, however. Riel said there was no logic in losing a day of school because they had lost a day of school.

Riel reported the rugby players are doing well and enjoying the sport.

## PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen recognizes the significant value of volunteers, volunteer groups and agencies to the spiritual, educational, social, cultural and physical well-being of the region.

These non-profit organizations have the opportunity to apply for a Property Tax Exemption. The following criteria will determine eligibility.

The applicant(s) must:

- Qualify for an exemption under the provisions of the *Local Government Act*, the general authority for property tax exemptions. (Sections 809 and 810);
- Be in compliance with Regional District policies, plans, bylaws and regulations (i.e. zoning);
- Be a non-profit organization;
- Not be in competition with for-profit business;
- Provide services or programs that are compatible or complementary to those offered by the Regional District.
- Provide a service that fulfills some basic need, or otherwise improves the quality of life for residents of the Regional District.
- Not provide liquor or meal services as their primary function or source of revenue.
- Not collect rent on a caretaker or other residence located on the property.

Application forms are available online at [www.rdos.bc.ca](http://www.rdos.bc.ca) or at the RDOS office, 101 Martin Street, Penticton, BC.

The deadline for submitting completed application forms including supporting documentation is **JULY 31, 2014**.

Successful applicants may be asked to publicly acknowledge the exemption.

## The Unfair Elections Act - Part 2

### A Page from the Republican Dirty Tricks Book

In Part 1 I talked about the first of three main themes that our critic for Democratic Reform has identified in Bill C-23, that of voter suppression. The second category of problems can be regrouped under the heading, "Pretending to Fight Electoral Fraud".

According to our critic, Craig Scott, Bill C-23 is being spun as a response to the fraudulent voter calls that constituted, as the Federal Court ruled, a cross-Canada fraud. The Conservatives are also trying to sell the move of the Commissioner of Elections Canada into the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions, which is part of the Ministry of the Attorney-General (Minister of Justice), as an enhancement of investigative powers.

However, the reality of C-23 is that the above reforms actually are being deployed by them as a smoke-and-mirrors, carefully con-

structed effort to make it far less likely that electoral fraud will be prevented, rigorously investigated and prosecuted.

For example, C-23 muzzles the Commissioner of Elections Canada - the head investigator of offences under the Canada Elections Act - from providing Members of Parliament and Canadians with information about what was learned during investigations after the investigation has been ended.

The Third theme identified by Craig Scott is, "Worsening the Distorting Impact of Money Politics on Our Democracy". The government trumpets its bill as somehow being about keeping "big money" out of federal party fundraising and election campaign financing, but how believable is this when we consider the following changes in C-23?

The Conservatives are jacking up maximum individual donations from \$1,200/year to \$1,500/year.

Nobody asked for this. So, why is it there? Well, the Conservatives receive 20% of their donations from people who can already afford to give \$1,200, more than the Liberals and far more than the NDP. C-23 re-introduces a scheme from a previous Political Loans Bill that representatives of Canadian banks made clear was unworkable. The likelihood of banks providing start-up loans for campaigns under this scheme are clearly limited, or at the very least unpredictable. This will benefit candidates from parties that have enough cash on hand to transfer to their candidates or that will guarantee loans to their candidates.

Then there was the Moby Dick of loopholes in C-23. In this bill as introduced, parties would not have had to count as campaign expenses any phoning of previous donors (defined as anyone who has given at least \$20 over the previous 5 years). This would have given ..... continued on Page 19

## My Turn...

### Thank you, Town Council

If our current Town Council is remembered for any accomplishments achieved in their three-year term of office I hope it has to do with the Town Hall.

They essentially took an 85-year old, rapidly deteriorating historic building on one of the main streets and not only revitalized it at a fraction of the cost an engineering report pegged the job at costing, they also put new life into it by repurposing it as the 'new' Town Hall.

The building itself looked as if it was suffering from some kind of severe skin condition with the way the paint was peeling this time last year. Had it not been for the court chambers on the second floor, the building may have been completely abandoned and left for dead.

But there was a lot of life remaining in the old girl because, to use my favourite 'realty-speak' phrase, she had good bones. The engineering report that claimed it would cost close to \$900,000 to save, and the Town Hall building on Bridge Street close to being officially condemned, it was looking as if the nuts and bolts of running the community could end up jammed into another municipally owned building.

Lucky for all of us local contractors and trades people worked together with Town Staff to come up with a solution that not only cost a fraction of the projected \$900,000, but resulted in a building that stands proud on Vermillion Avenue as it probably once did in 1930 when it was first opening.

The historic courthouse building, as many of us know it as, will continue to make history in our community thanks to the responsible revitalization of the structure.

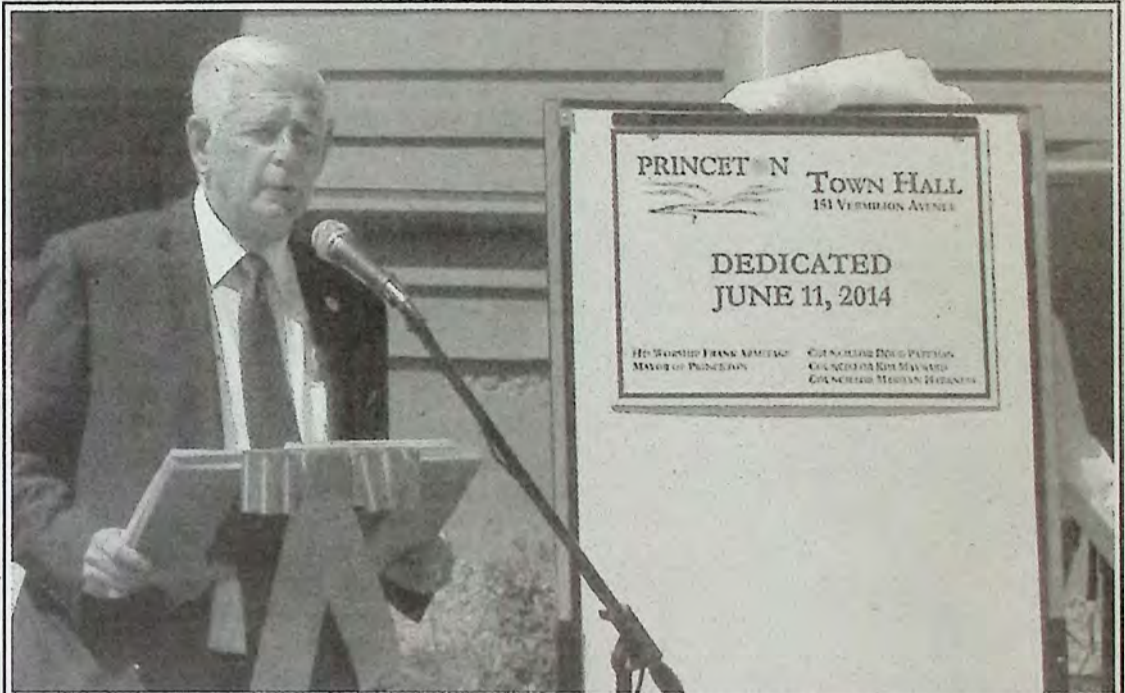
If the current Town Council has done anything worthy of praise in this current term (and there are a few others) this project will live on as their legacy. It will be looked back upon ten, twenty, fifty and one-hundred years from now as an example of what can be accomplished in a small town, with a soft economy and seventeen empty storefronts in the commercial, downtown core.

Other communities can learn something from this fiscally sound, morally correct, appropriate, well-timed, well-executed project that involved a number of local players in key roles from start to finish.

I think it also shows that sometimes engineers get it wrong. They didn't view the 'historic court house' as the centerpiece of an evolving downtown. They didn't see the cultural, historic and significant connection the building had with the community.

Sometimes when it comes to saving something special you need to be guided by the emotional response that item gives you.

I am glad the Town of Princeton saw beyond the walls and boards and used their hearts to save something near and dear to the rest of us.



Town of Princeton Mayor Frank Armitage reviewed the history of the 85-year old court house building during the 'new' Town Hall dedication ceremony June 11th. Gordon Comeau, who working 27 years in the building when the forestry office was there stated, "This building really does have a lot of history. They (the Town) did something that will be treasured and we will forever remember them for doing this for us." Councillor Marilyn Harkness said the building was a "wonderfully preserved Town Hall we can all be proud of" and Councillor Kim Maynard added, "It does nothing but add to our community." ## Where Are Our Dam Deal Watchdogs?

One of the most alarming things I heard about the proposed dam on the Similkameen River was the fact that our British Columbia government has turned negotiations over to a private corporation. In short, the people we elected have abdicated their responsibilities to safeguard our water supply and our rights to water. They are allowing a corporation to negotiate the deal. Is the BC government so busy trying to sell fracking and pipelines to the people that there is no time or interest in what happens to our water?

As far as I know, there is no federal representative involved, either, despite the fact that most of the Similkameen watershed is in Canada. Where are the feds when we need them? Are they so busy spying on us they have no time to be concerned about a deal being made to utilize the water in an international river?

If neither our provincial nor federal governments care about what is being negotiated, does this mean they are turning control over our watershed to a foreign corpora-

tion? If so, then we had better sit up and take notice.

Control of our watershed is likely to mean control of all of our water, surface and ground water (wells) and may include control of how much water we use. Are we prepared to put that kind of control of our water into the hands of a foreign corporation?

This dam on the Similkameen River is touted as being needed for water storage and control of the flow of the river. It will not be for flood control. It will be for storage of water for use downstream, mainly in Washington State. Our water will not be used merely for water for crops.

Much as we might sympathize with the American farmer, the economic value of our water reaches beyond agriculture.

In 1994, my husband and I took a trip across the continent in October. Our route took us south through Coulee City which is located on Roosevelt Lake, which is formed by the water stored behind Grand Coulee Dam. The year was dry, one of the most dry years in recent history. The level of water in Roosevelt Lake had dropped so low there was not a drop of water in the Coulee City marina. There was a loss to motorboat business, and all services connected with tourism. Think about this when you hear "downstream benefits".

In a dry year, will our water use be restricted in order to maintain the level in Roosevelt Lake? Who will monitor our water use? Who will decide how much we can use? Are we to leave these decisions to a foreign corporation?

In 1996, my cousins from Australia, along with my husband and me, stopped at Grand Coulee Dam with the idea of going on a tour of the generator plants, which is a tourist attraction. We were told tours were cancelled that summer because some river in B.C. had a flash flood that filled the dam so deep they had to run extra water through the floodgates during the winter. Due to the excessive water, the generator maintenance program had to be delayed until summer. The river that caused all this was the Similkameen, which had a flash flood on November 30, 1995. Yes, our river has a big impact on Grand Coulee Dam. Could one of the downstream benefits be maintaining the best level of water in Roosevelt Lake? Could it also mean Grand Coulee could generate more hydroelectric power due to steady water levels? Could this added power generation be an additional downstream benefit?

According to Ken Farquharson, speaker at a recent forum on the proposed dam, FortisBC has already negotiated for 25 percent of the downstream benefits for itself. FortisBC may be entitled to that benefit. Who gets the other 75 percent? Who ensures it goes to the people of the Similkameen Valley? There is talk of a Similkameen Valley Trust being set up.

Who will administer it?  
Who will audit it?

I have too many unanswered questions about this whole dam proposal. There is one thing I am absolutely sure of: I do not want a foreign corporation making decisions about water use in my valley.

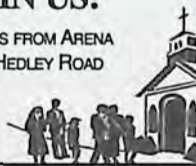

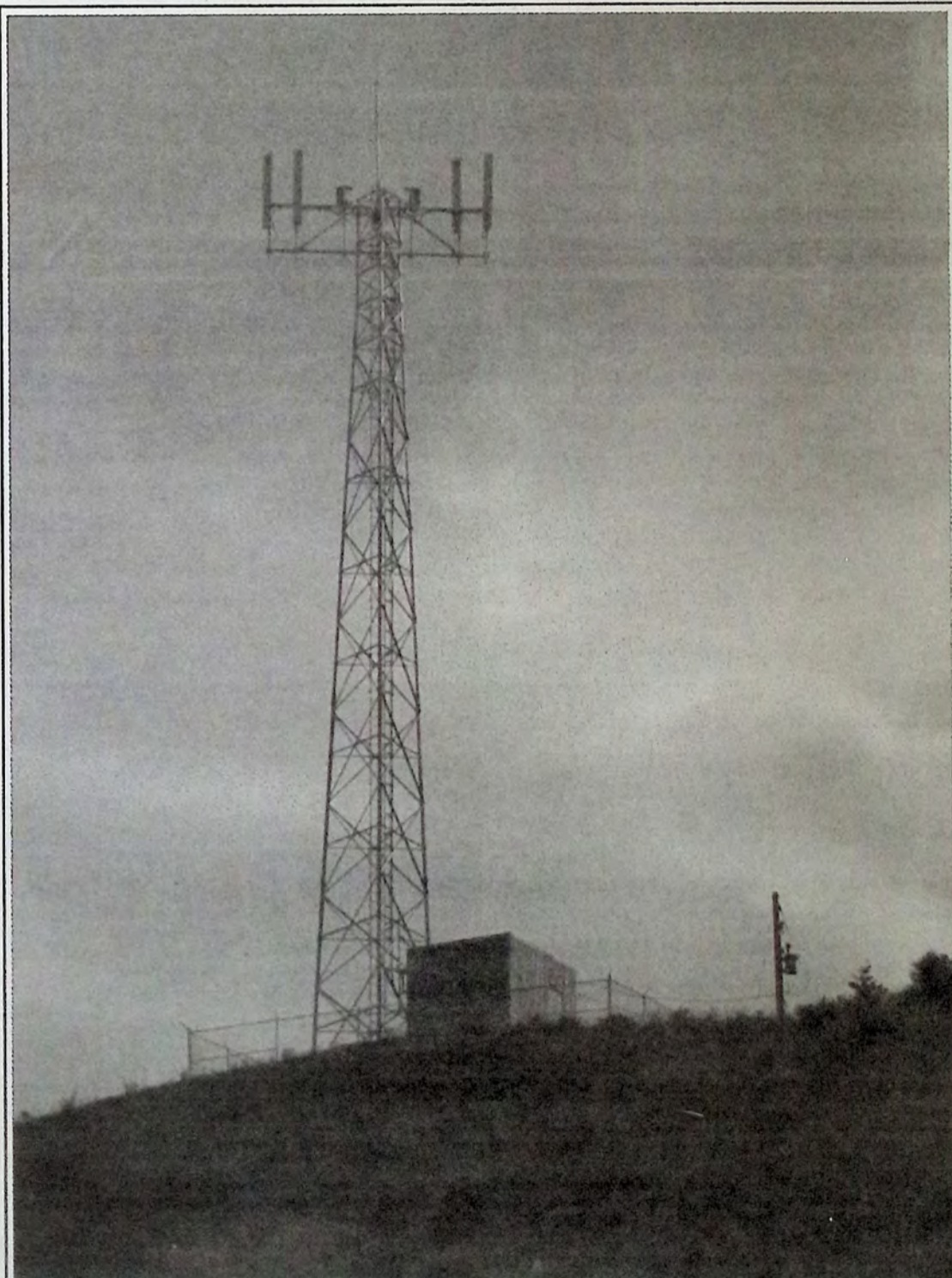

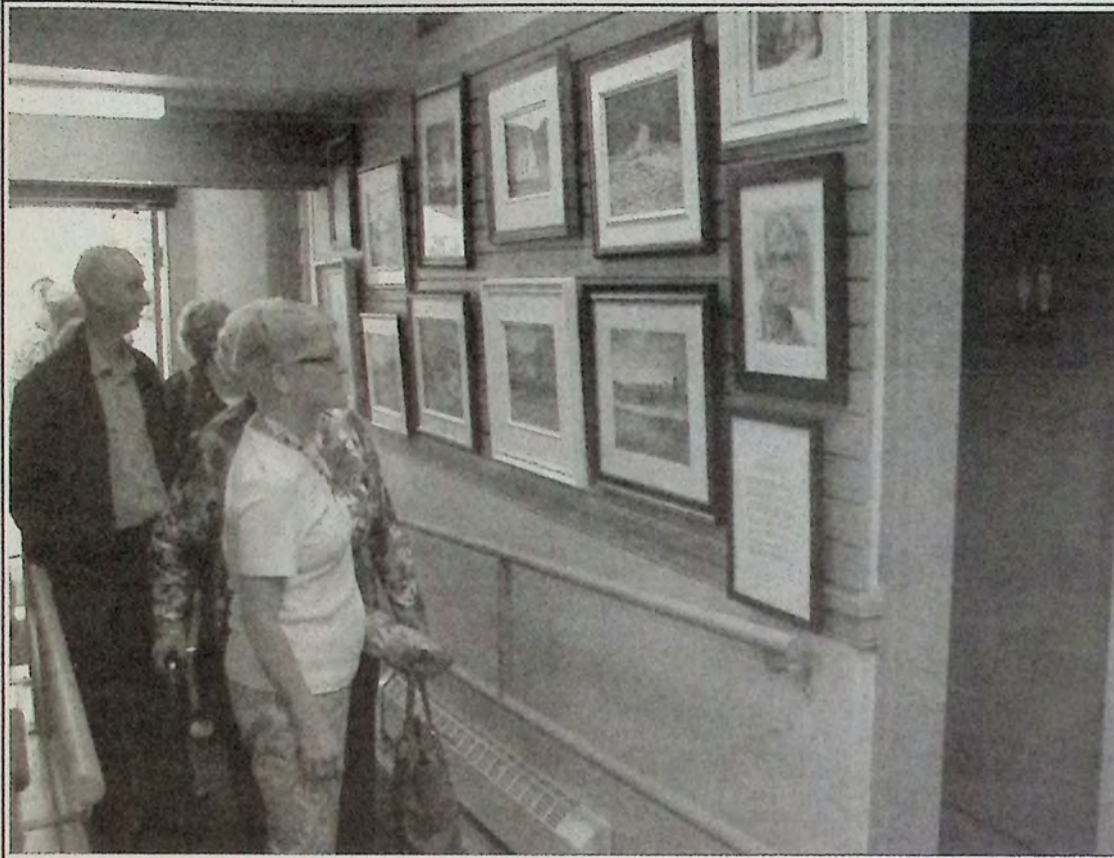

Bob was a friend of mine and for a short time lived in 100 Mile House. One day he phoned me and asked me for help loading two colts, both two years old, on his trailer to take home and train for the owners.

They had not been handled but the owners had them corralled in a loading pen. I was the one that was able to rope better so I lassoed the first one and together we managed

to get a halter on with a lead rope. I lassoed the second one and he was nowhere near as cooperative but I held onto him as best I could and he got away from me and ran up the narrow loading chute which was blocked at the end.

The lariat trailed behind and I began picking up the lariat as I was walking up the chute thinking the horse couldn't turn around. I'm not sure what my plan was coming up

## Living Past 100

### Why You Should Eat Cherries

The cherry crop is ready for harvest and fresh cherries will be available from late June to August. Cherries are excellent food, so go ahead and indulge yourself. You may want to can or freeze some cherries, sweet or sour.

If you suffer from gout, cherries are a medicine to keep gout under control. Eat a couple of handfuls a day, or make a cherry juice concentrate and take about one tablespoonful each day.

Some people who suffer from arthritis swear by cherry juice, and by eating fresh cherries, as a method of reducing joint pain. Cherries reduce blood pressure and help prevent blood clots. Cherries reduce the risk of cataracts. If you suffer from lower back pain, make sure you eat cherries almost every day. A study published in the British Journal of Sports Medicine indicated that athletes who drank a bottle (standard soft drink size) before doing sports suffered less soreness and pain from strained muscles. As lower back pain is generally a muscle problem, consider drinking cherry juice.

People who suffer from hemorrhoids need plenty of flavinoids and fibre to correct the situation, and cherries are full of these. Cherries are a member of the prune family, and relieve constipation, but because cherries are rich in anthocyanins, cherries tone and strengthen blood vessels thus reducing the pain and swelling.

Cherries contain small amounts of vitamin C, calcium, phosphorus, and larger amounts of Vitamin A. The main value of cherries is not so much in the vitamins and minerals, but in the enzymes and colour. The dark red berries that taste the best are not necessarily the best for your health, as sour cherries are rich in Vitamin A which is excellent for your skin, eyes and lungs. Make a pie of sour cherries or make sour cherry muffins, and reap benefits for your largest organ, your skin.

## HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

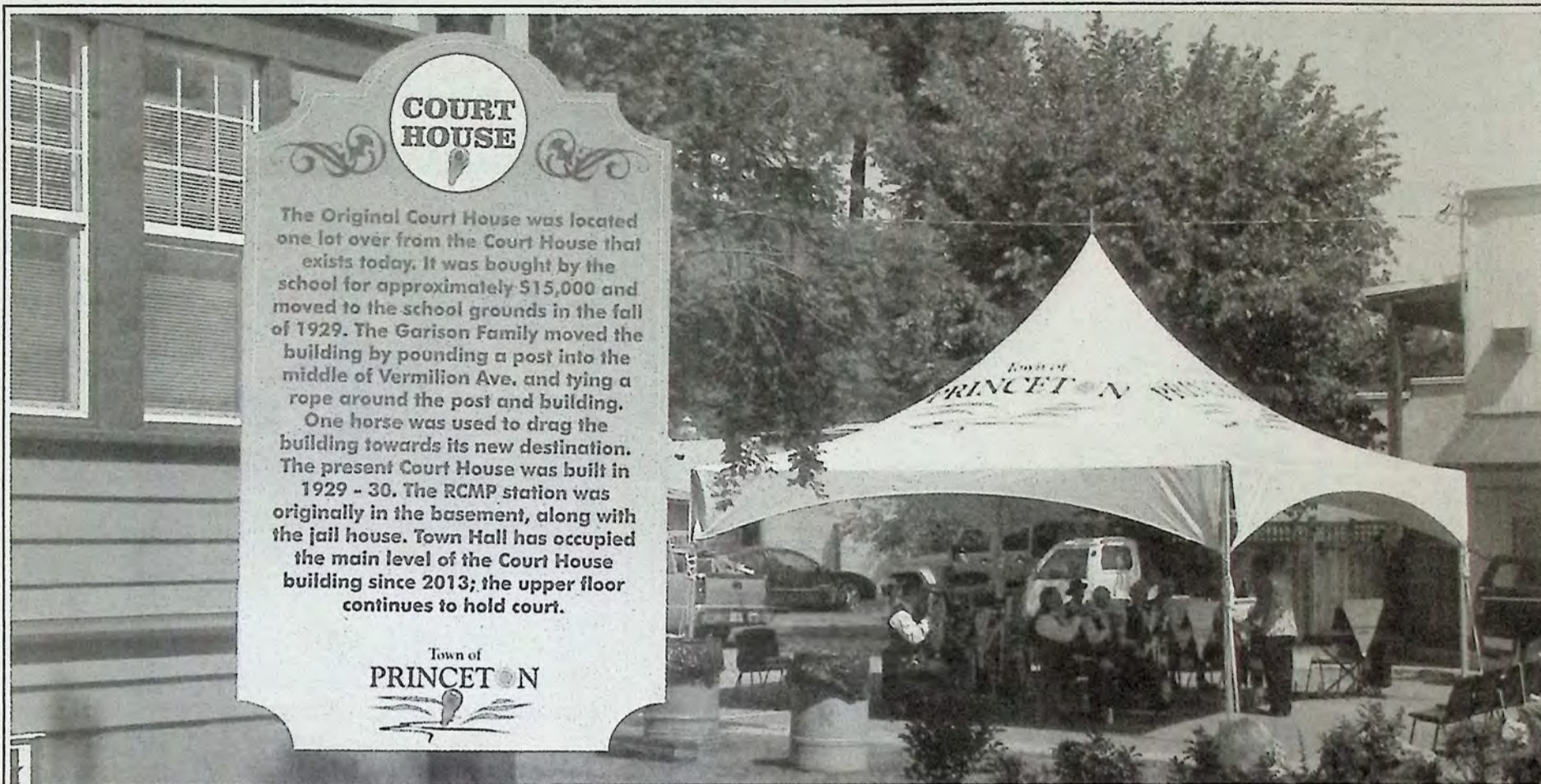

# Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

If you've been following this series you'll know I've been focusing on the need to support local business and have looked at a number of ways that can be done.

For a change I would like to take a look at what has been working in regard to assistance from Town Council and the staff working for the Town of Princeton.

I have been in a number of discussions with local business owners. Some of them appear to have the impression that the town doesn't care or is too busy doing 'town

business' to bother with the local economy.

This is where I'm going to try to clarify a few misconceptions about what may or may not be happening at the new Town Hall.

First off I need to emphasize that the first meetings of the downtown/highway business owners and operators were set up by Town Hall. There had been a lot of grumbling going on about the local economy and, certainly not their fault, the Chamber of Commerce did not have the strength or manpower to

pool together local business.

The Town of Princeton organized the first set of meetings, over six months ago now, with the Chamber of Commerce participating. I have written here before giving Town Council much credit for doing this and still feel they did the right thing in recognizing there were a number of issues that needed attention.

Secondly, as the meetings progressed and under the skillful direction of Susan Robinson, it was becoming clear that business owners and operators needed help and the Town of Princeton made it clear on many occasions after that they were more than willing to help.

This is where some of the conversation takes a left curve when I've talked with a few of my fellow downtown 'partners in commerce.' There still appears to be a disconnect with some business owners and operators as to what Town Council is actually doing to help us.

Well, quite frankly, they have done, and continue to do a lot. Not all of it out in the open where it can be seen, but there has been a lot of attention put towards such things as turning our community into a more business-friendly option for new commercial development. This has been done with a closer eye to restrictive bylaws and making some changes, exceptions and alterations that show the Town of Princeton wants new business to plant roots in the downtown core.

That in itself has been a huge plus as far as I'm concerned.

Another way Town Council is helping the local businesses is by listening to us. The business group that formed from the series of meetings resulting from over six months ago will become part of the Chamber of Commerce, which will in turn become a stronger voice for local business. This may not have happened had the Town of

Princeton not chosen to act on requests from local business to do something to help us.

I can personally vouch for the ear twisting I've been able to do and the mutual respect I feel from any and all employees working out of Town Hall when discussing matters of concern to local business.

Then there's the eye opening exercise that saw Mayor Frank Armitage, Town of Princeton CAO Rick Zerr and Chamber President Brenda Crawford reveal a total of 17 empty storefronts in 75 buildings. They surveyed local business and listened to our concerns taking note of what issues we were facing and improvements we'd like to see.

Lastly, I'd like to commend the Town of Princeton for sprucing up parts of downtown Princeton with new directional signage and the beautification of the old court house/new Town Hall. The Town ..... continued on Page 19

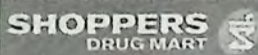

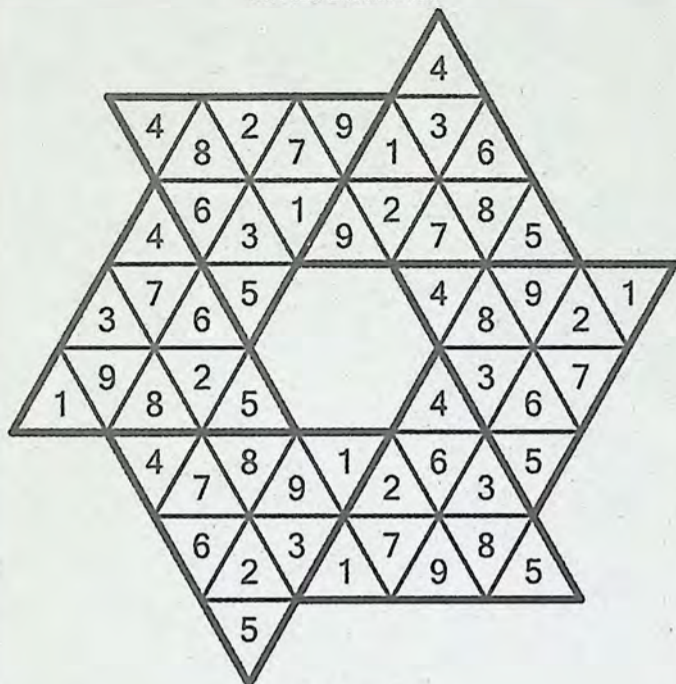

## Driver loses license

Lorne Karl Boehmer appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on June 12 charged with impaired driving and driving while prohibited. He entered a guilty plea to driving while prohibited and was ordered to pay a \$500 fine with a 12 month driving prohibition.

The same incident resulted in the impaired driving charge. On December 4, 2013, police driving toward Hedley noticed a vehicle being driven at only 50 kmph, and following it, the police officer noted the vehicle crossing the centre line on one occasion and over the fog

line on another occasion. When Boehmer pulled over, he failed to take the vehicle completely off the eastbound lane.

On stepping out of his vehicle, Boehmer appeared to have a problem with standing and walking. Boehmer told the court he had not had anything but non-alcoholic beer, although the police officer had recorded detecting the scent of hard liquor on Boehmer's breath, and

had found a partially empty bottle of vodka under the driver's seat of Boehmer's vehicle.

Boehmer stated further that he had had a groin injury preventing him from walking properly and the vehicle had a steering problem. The judge told Boehmer it was fortunate he had not been arrested for dangerous driving. Boehmer will stand trial September 12 on the impaired driving charge.

## Guilty plea earns fines

Dean Curtis Stevens entered guilty pleas in Provincial Court on June 12, pleading guilty to assault and mischief under \$5,000. He had been charged as a result of a complaint from a woman who had gone to his home on October 24, 2013, to pick up a backpack she had left there earlier in the day. She went to police to say he had shoved her against the wall when she entered the house, and she had fled, with him following. He had caught her and choked her to stop her screaming. Her car was parked on his property but when she managed to get free from him, she ran away and caught a ride with

another person. While her car was parked at Stevens' residence, the rear window was smashed, with a replacement cost of \$900.

Stevens, age 48 of Princeton, had a prior record for assault and mischief. He was ordered to pay a \$750 fine for assault, \$250 for mischief, and must pay for the car window. He is to have no contact with the complainant, may not own firearms nor a firearms permit for five years, and must submit a DNA sample to the RCMP. He was placed on a 12 month probation with the condition that he not consume alcohol except in his own home.

## Breach brings new probation

Brandon Morris, charged with breach of recognizance, appeared in Provincial Court in Princeton on June 12 to enter a guilty plea.

He had failed to report to his Probation Officer as required.

He was sentenced to pay \$325 and to serve an additional 12 month probation period with conditions for counselling, a copy of the same sentence he had received in 2013.

## Drug case goes to trail

A preliminary inquiry was held in Provincial Court on June 13 in the case of Dwayne F. Costa, charged with possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking. The court heard testimony from three witnesses for the Crown. Costa, representing himself, called no witnesses.

Judge G. Sinclair determined there was sufficient evidence to take the matter to trial. A date for a Supreme Court trial will be set on July 21 in

Penticton.

Costa stood trial on June 13 on a charge of breach of recognizance for failing to appear in court on July 11, 2013, as required by conditions set at a prior bail hearing. Costa, in his own defense, appeared to have been confused between the matter set for July 11 and another date set for a different court matter. Judge Sinclair found him guilty as charged and ordered Costa to pay a \$200 fine.

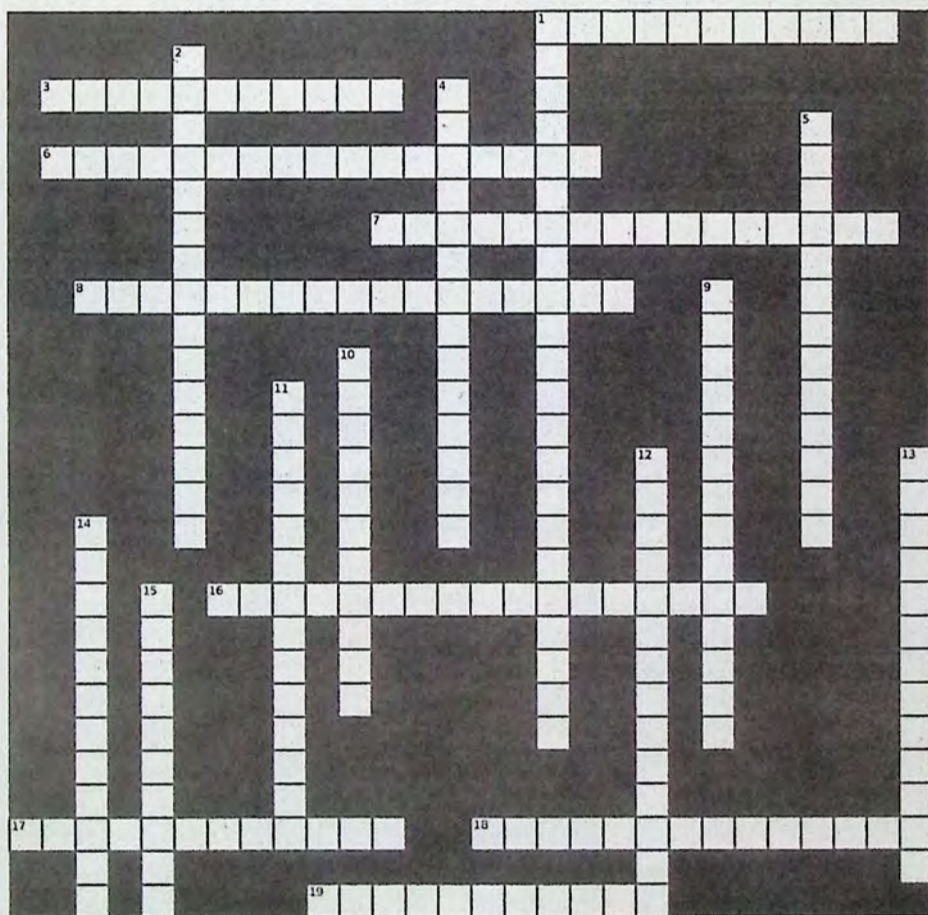

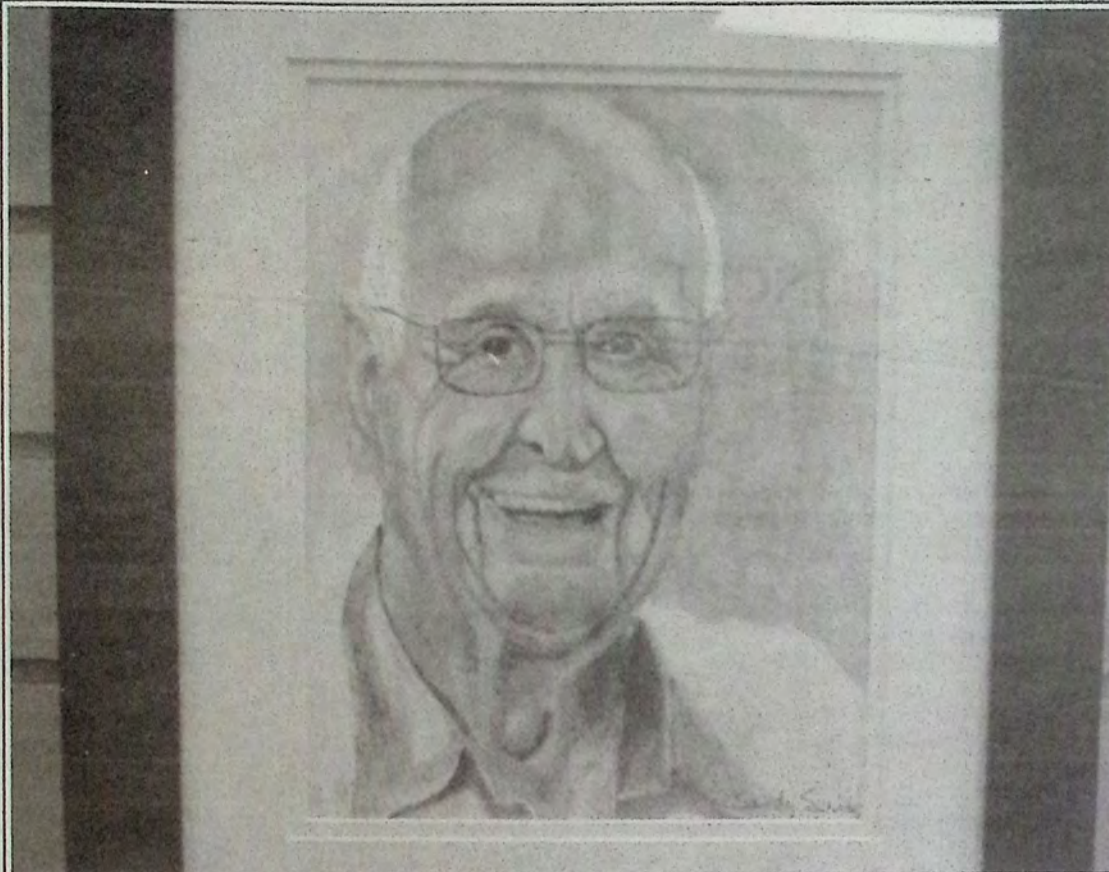

 advantage to a party with large donor bases and, more importantly, with the extra cash on hand to pay for this kind of fund-raising in the first place. I say "was" a loophole because the NDP Opposition caused the government to back down and drop this "reform".

Clearly, the Conservatives are using this bill as a way to try to stack the deck in their favour for the 2015 election, and beyond. No wonder the process they have carefully planned has unfolded as it has: it is designed to short-circuit awareness, scrutiny, and opposition.

There was a 17 month delay from the month they had committed to table this bill (promised for September 2012). Then, there was no consultation with Elections Canada or with other parties and MPs in the House -- something that had been the tradition when it comes to changes to such a foundational statute in our system as the Canada Elections Act.

Then, a lengthy 240-page bill was tabled one day and debate forced to begin the very next day. Next, the government refused to agree to the NDP motion to send the bill to committee study after First Reading. After only three speeches in the House, the government moved to curtail Second Reading debate with a time allocation motion that resulted in a total of only three days of debate.

In conclusion, what in effect can be said of this piece of legislation? As the Op-Ed in the Globe and Mail of May 24th states, the opposition to the Fair Elections Act was

so great that the government was forced to back down. There have been some positive changes:

- As noted, the "Moby Dick" of loopholes that I mentioned above is gone.

- The winning party in each riding no longer has the power to name the central poll supervisor at each polling station.

- Vouching was restored, but becomes more complex.

- The Chief Electoral Officer is no longer muzzled. However, Elections Canada is. It will not be allowed to run public education and outreach campaigns to promote voting.

Obviously, the amended version of

the Fair Elections Act is better than what was originally proposed. But, as the Globe article also states, "The bill's history is a case study in how legislation affecting the fundamentals of our democracy should not be drafted, amended or passed. Almost everything about the process has been wrong."

Finally, I would go so far as to say that this whole exercise has been a colossal waste of time. The system was working, and there was no major abuse -- Elections Canada was doing its job. Surely there are more important issues to debate and correct in our country than an electoral process that basically works well for Canadians.
