Princeton receives \$289,527

Fraser-Nicola will be receiving a total of over \$1.5 million in unconditional funding from the Strategic Community Investment Fund announced MLA Jackie Tegart on July 9th.

It is part of almost \$74 million being invested into communities across BC to meet local needs including more policing, new

equipment, increased community safety initiatives, infrastructure and service delivery priorities.

"The government recognizes how important it is to support small, rural communities," said Tegart.

"This is a significant source of revenue for local governments," she added.

"They can direct the money toward their own priorities and it takes pressure off the local tax base."

The communities receiving the funding are:

- Lillooet \$273,135
- Merritt \$393,955
- Princeton \$289,527
- Squamish-Lillooet \$132,358

The Strategic Community Investment Fund is a combination of the Traffic Fine Revenue Sharing Program, Small Community Grant and Regional District Grant Programs.

Small Community Grants apply to communities with less than 20,000 and are used for infrastructure, to ensure stable administration and service delivery priorities.

Copper Mountain Mine sets production record

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) (the "Company" or "Copper Mountain") announced July 9th production results for the second quarter of

2014 from the Copper Mountain mine located in southern British Columbia.

Copper production for the second quarter of 2014 totaled 19.9 million

pounds of copper, a 4% increase as compared to the first quarter of 2014, setting another new production record for the mine. The concentrate also included 5,000 ounces of gold

and 113,300 ounces of silver. During the quarter the mill processed a total of 2.8 million tonnes of ore at an average grade of 0.388 % Copper. During the quarter the mill achieved 90.2% availability and averaged a total of 30,450 tpd throughput of which approximately 12,500 tpd of the mill feed was crushed to minus two inches with the temporary secondary crushing measures currently in place.

Mining activities continued to shift more towards Pit 3 during the quarter and mining in the Pit 2 area was entirely focused on the southwest end of the Pit. During the quarter a total of 17.1 million tonnes of material was mined, including 4.6 million tonnes of ore and 11.5 million tonnes of waste. The projected life of mine strip ratio is 2 to 1 but higher in the early years. The mine moved an average of approximately 188,250 tonnes of material per day.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen recognizes the significant value of volunteers, volunteer groups and agencies to the spiritual, educational, social, cultural and physical well-being of the region.

These non-profit organizations have the opportunity to apply for a Property Tax Exemption. The following criteria will determine eligibility.

The applicant(s) must:

- Qualify for an exemption under the provisions of the *Local Government Act*, the general authority for property tax exemptions. (Sections 809 and 810);
- Be in compliance with Regional District policies, plans, bylaws and regulations (i.e. zoning);
- Be a non-profit organization;
- Not be in competition with for-profit business;
- Provide services or programs that are compatible or complementary to those offered by the Regional District.
- Provide a service that fulfills some basic need, or otherwise improves the quality of life for residents of the Regional District.
- Not provide liquor or meal services as their primary function or source of revenue.
- Not collect rent on a caretaker or other residence located on the property.

Application forms are available online at www.rdos.bc.ca or at the RDOS office, 101 Martin Street, Penticton, BC.

The deadline for submitting completed application forms including supporting documentation is **JULY 31, 2014**.

Successful applicants may be asked to publicly acknowledge the exemption.

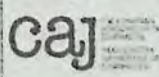

Our Government Ignores Us

Our present Conservative government does not appear to be interested in serving the people of Canada. I say this because this Conservative government has ignored the voice of the people it is supposed to serve.

Our government abandoned the Health Accord, despite the fact that 86 percent of Canadians want it kept in place. The Health Accord is the foundation of our medicare system, but our government is willing to turn its back on medicare, against the will of the people.

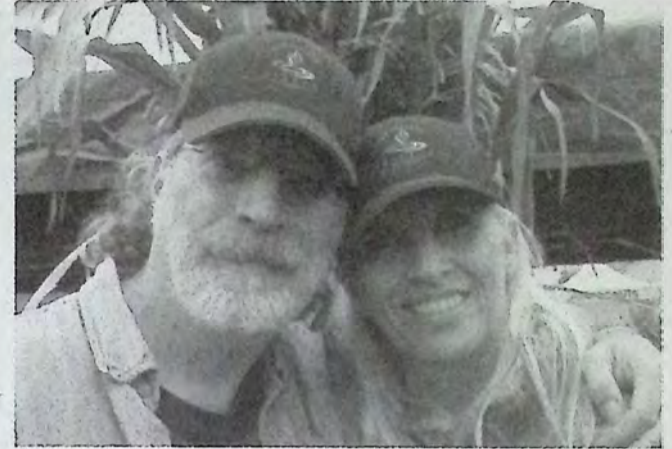

When a government ignores the will of the people, it is no longer a democratic government.

In less than a year, we will go to vote for our federal representatives once more. This time, when they come asking for our votes, let's ask them whether they intend to listen to the people they represent, and let's ask them if they are capable of keeping their promise. Let's ask them to serve us, rather than serving their political party or themselves.

Perhaps one way to further First Nations' culture is to learn their language. Few travelers along Highway 3 would be able to read all of this sign adorning the driveway of the LSIB School. The Nsyilxcen Language is one of 23 languages spoken by the Salishan people (includes the Salish and Interior Salish). Salish dialects are found from the east coast of Vancouver Island north to the Shuswap, east into Montana, south into Idaho and west to the coasts of Oregon and Washington. The Nsyilxcen Language is considered an endangered language.

Mini cars will do a Junior Show 'n' Shine.

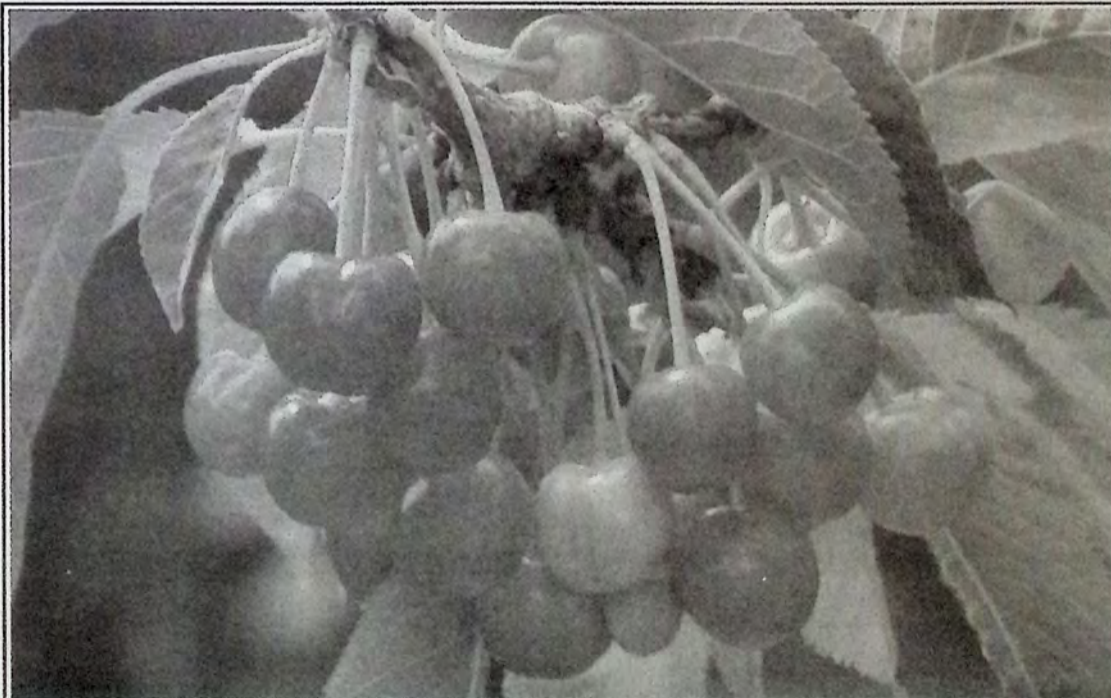
Kids World Entertainment, sponsored by A&W, offers a passport to fun. Each child receiving a pass-

Saddles 'n' Spurs

I had two friends from the city who were wanting to go horseback riding out from the Gang Ranch. We planned on spending several days on the ride so we left 100 Mile House with three saddle horses and two pack horses.

The Gang Ranch was west of the Fraser River and south from Williams Lake. When we arrived

at the ranch the cowboys were very friendly and said we could leave our trailer there and invited us in for lunch but we politely declined because we were anxious to get started on our ride.

We geared up with the pack horses and headed off to the west. We made about 20 miles before we decided to make camp and one of

the guys discovered that he had forgotten his sleeping bag in the trailer. I told him that he would have to rough it out for the night and use the sweaty saddle blankets and we'd figure it out in the morning.

When morning came I didn't want to send either one of them as they probably would have got lost and taken all day so I took the sturdiest horse, saddled up and galloped all the way back to the ranch, stopped briefly to talk to some of the cowboys and grabbed his sleeping bag, tied it to the back of my saddle and galloped all the way back to where I left the guys, arriving back about 11:00 AM. We carried on heading west and found ourselves in a thick stand of pine trees. It was really difficult to thread the pack horses around the trees without damaging the packs so we made very slow progress.

We were actually in the pine forest for three solid days without finding even a trail. My two friends were getting very nervous. One of them said, "my wife is going to be very worried and I'm getting scared." I told him that we had nothing to worry about, in fact we were good for the winter as we had two extra horses and I was packing a .357 Magnum!

That didn't seem to comfort him at all!

On the fourth day I had them stay at one site while I looked for a way out and told them to keep a fire going so I could find my way back if it got dark. I found a dirt road so I checked my compass and determined which way to go on it. In a couple of days we made it back to the Gang Ranch and headed home.

Funny thing is, I never saw those two guys again.

Apricots are a soft fruit, so handle them with care. They should be eaten while firm to the touch but not hard. Apricots can be preserved by canning, or can be cooked, then frozen in plastic containers. As with all soft fruits, they can spoil quickly and the season is short, so make the most of them while they are in season.

During the second quarter of 2014 the mine shipped 35,900 wmt of concentrate containing approxi-

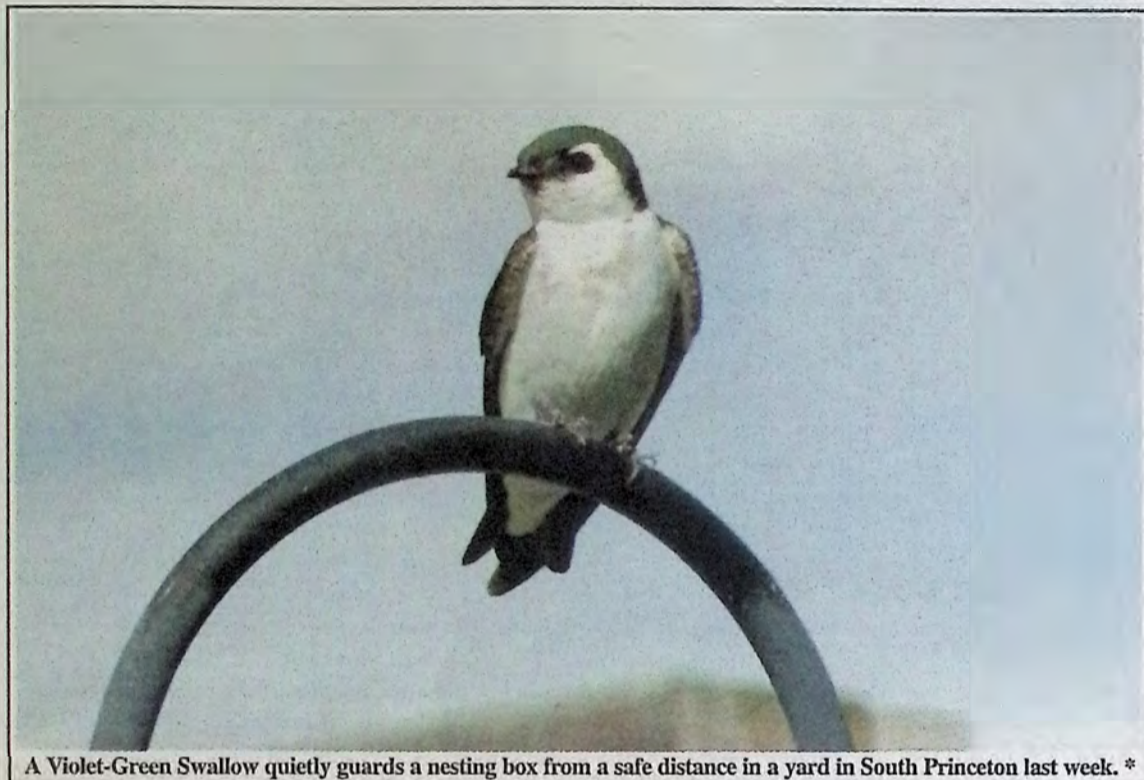

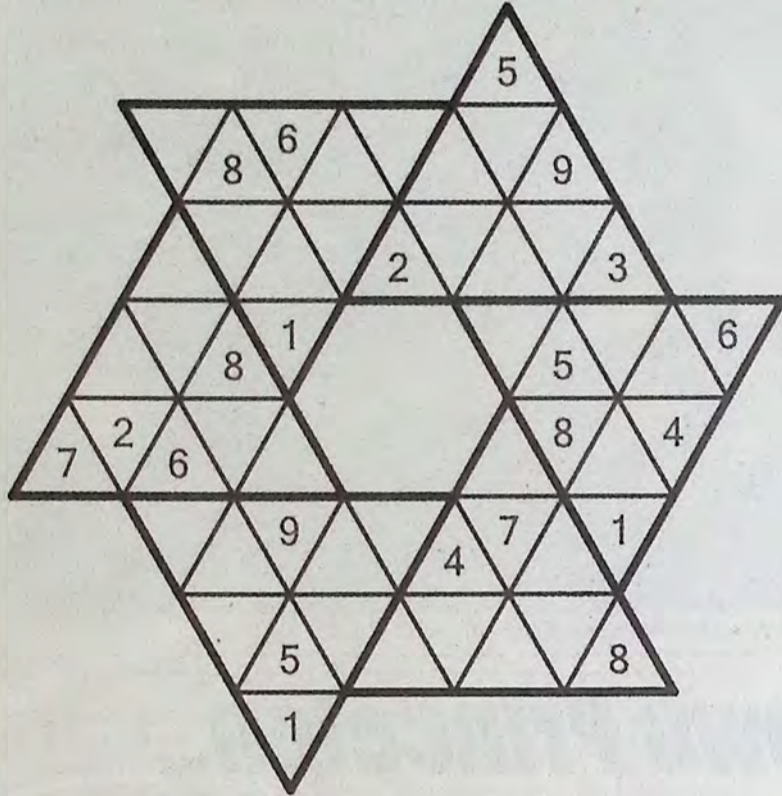

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

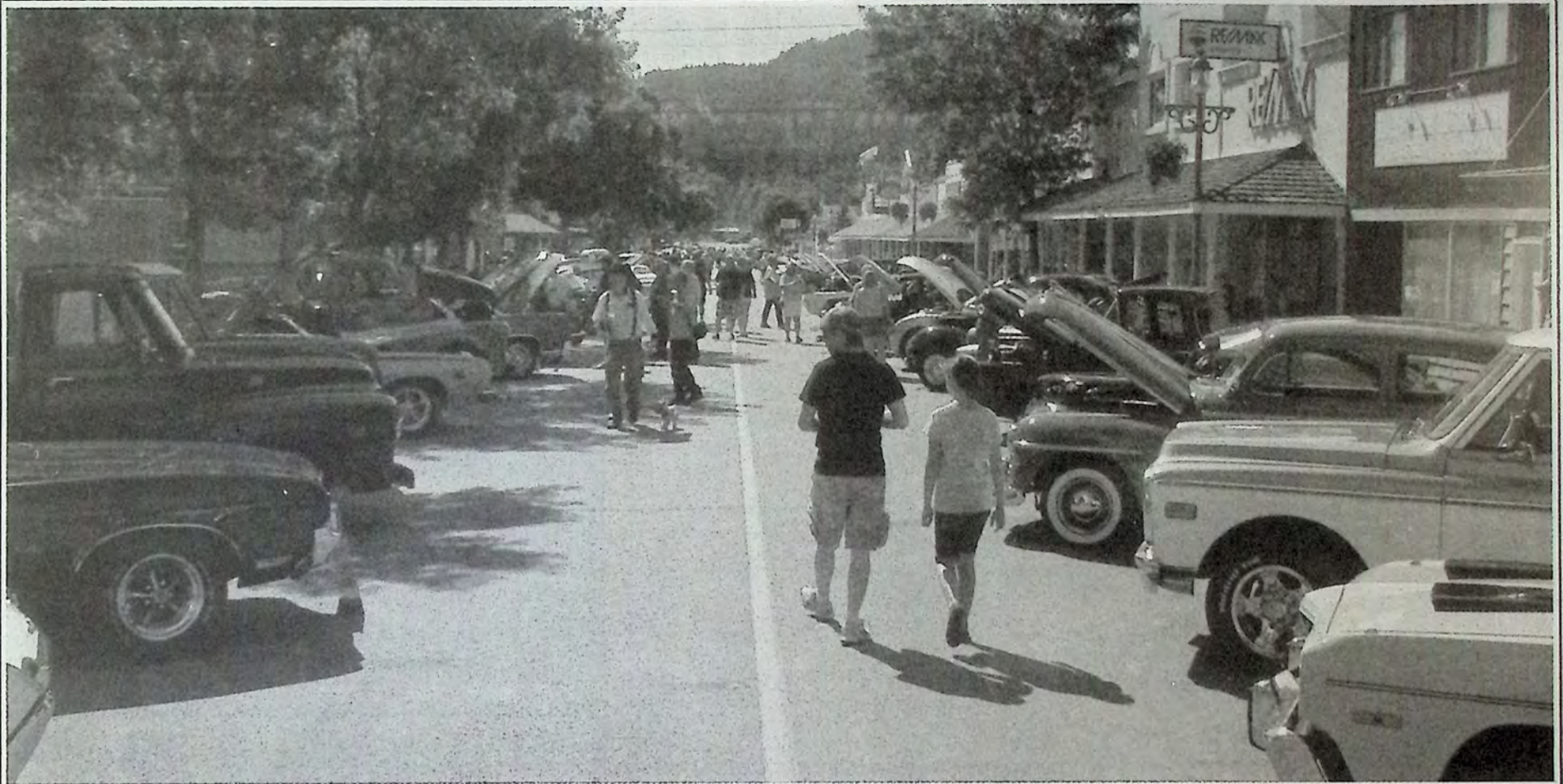

Does the annual car show save downtown Princeton? We think it does to a point. *

Saving Downtown Princeton...

This week I will continue to look at local celebrations and what they bring to the community.

The annual car show known as the Show 'N' Shine is a popular event. Without a doubt it is attracting more and more attention each year. The weather is usually perfect for the car show that takes place the first weekend in July, which puts it in the early part of the 'Car Show Season' in British Columbia.

You would think that with so

many people swarming downtown Princeton for a few hours, just one day a year would be a boon to local business. Depending on whom you talk to, this is not exactly the case with the car show.

Before I get into details on why some business owners aren't as keen as others on the event, let's look at what it is supposed to do.

The Show 'N' Shine brings collectors together to show off their fancy cars. Some are classics, some

are new and who doesn't like the look of a nice, clean car parked in a row of others along Bridge Street? As I mentioned last week local celebrations should contain two elements. They should attract visitors to your community and foster goodwill. I think it is safe to say that the car show accomplishes both of these goals with little or no effort. Luckily for Princeton area residents we have a number of locals who have a classic car stashed under a car cover, protected in a garage or carport just waiting for a sunny day so it can come out for a cruise.

The high school graduation parade and Racing Days parade are two examples of where local car buffs get to show off their pride and joy.

We are so fortunate to have so many local car buffs as an event like the car show would not be possible without their participation.

But what are some local business owners upset about?

Some don't like that Bridge Street is closed for a few hours on a Saturday in July.

Read that again and pull out the important parts. Bridge Street is closed only for a few hours, just one day (and not a full day) a year. If you really think about it, there has been longer closures to Bridge Street following a heavy snowfall, so I will defend the organizers by saying it's not a good enough reason to not support the car show.

Another complaint I hear is that there is little or no shopping done by the event participants.

Again, I will interject.

Yes, I rarely see anyone in my office to buy a paper during the car show and we are pretty much located at Ground Zero. That being said, I can't tell you how many papers I sell at other outlets during that day to participants, nor can I track the number of sales the following week when car photos get published.

However, I do know I have some sales so I can't see that as a valid argument to not support the event.

I will say there are a few things that may help win over some of those who aren't terribly big on the car show.

I'm not so sure the Show 'N' Shine needs to always be on Bridge Street. With Veterans Square being used as sort of the main stage of the event, maybe the Show 'N' Shine can line up on Vermilion Avenue every other year.

Here's my reasoning for that suggestion: Vermilion Avenue is wider. It includes the fabulously renovated Town Hall and the Museum. I suspect if the car show were to run down Vermilion Avenue the Museum would put on a special event or display for those car buffs who usually just sit at their parked cars and don't explore the community until later.

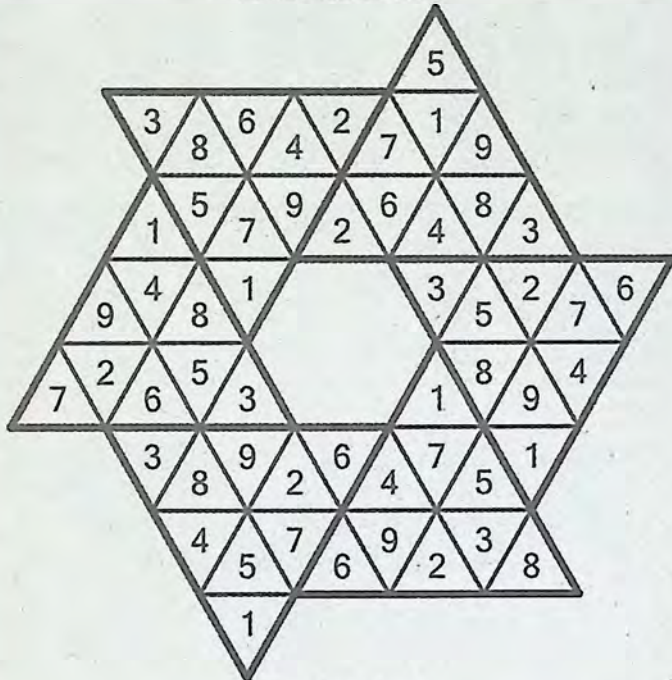

Traditional Music Fest

Everyone loves a banjo workshop!

One of the most popular sessions at the Princeton Traditional Music Festival over the past few years has been the banjo workshop. The banjo is one of those instruments that, when played badly, can be torture to listen to - but when handled by a virtuoso is inspiring. The Traditional Music Festival has been blessed with a collection of world-class banjo players over the years and this workshop provides a high-powered dose of banjo music, enough to last you a whole year.

The banjo is usually associated with country, folk, Irish traditional and bluegrass music. It was also central to African American traditional

music before becoming popular in the minstrel shows of the 19th century. Slaves were central to the origins of much American traditional music and the banjo was part of this phenomenon. The instrument is said to have evolved from an earlier African instrument. Banjos resembling today's instrument with fingerboards and tuning pegs are known from the Caribbean as early as the 17th century. Early, African-influenced banjos were built around a gourd body and a wooden stick neck. These instruments had varying numbers of strings.

Banjos first appeared on the stage in the US in the 1830s and by the 1840s they were popular in British Music Hall performances. Historically, the banjo was played "claw hammer" style by the slaves who brought their version of the banjo with them. In old time Appalachian mountain music, there is also a style called two finger up-pick, and a three finger version that Earl Scruggs developed into the famous "Scruggs" style picking, nationally aired in 1945 on the Grand Ole Opry.

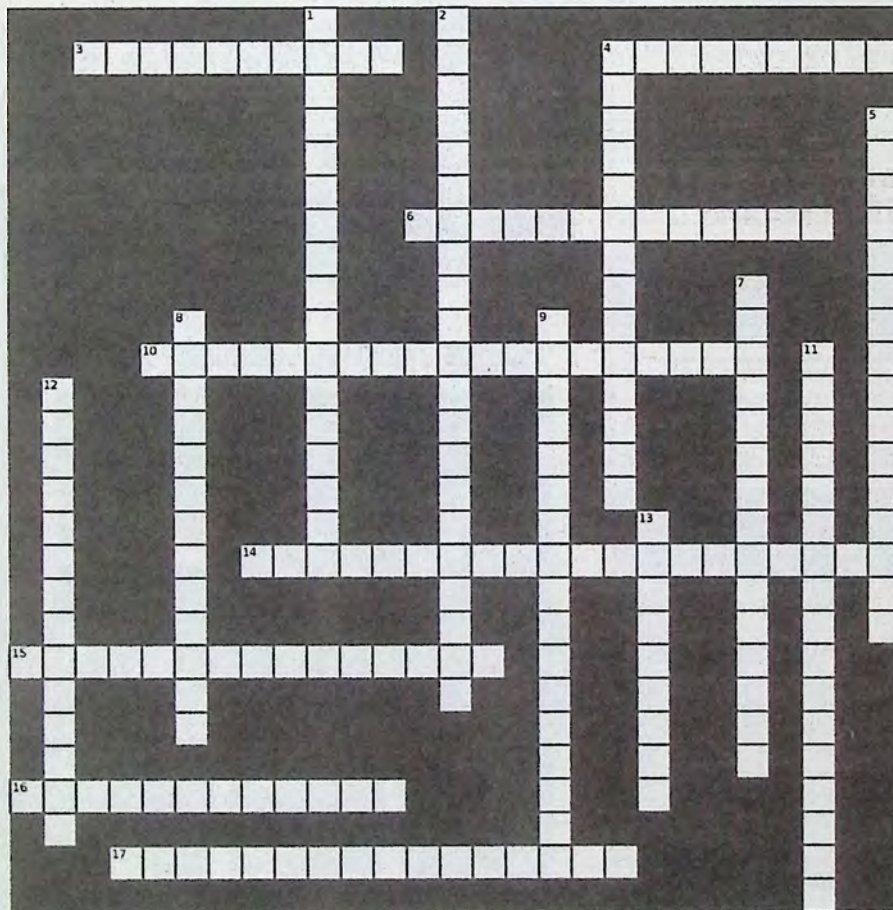
This year's banjo workshop will be hosted by Princeton's own Stuart James, who will be introducing the other participants as well as talking a bit about the history of the banjo and describing different styles of banjo music. Stuart has been playing banjo for many years and uses the instrument to play tunes and to accompany himself on both Appalachian and British songs. Joining Stuart onstage will be four other banjo players.

Tim Hall from Seattle is a singer of songs from varied traditions - from old-time to maritime to ragtime. Besides playing banjo he is also an accomplished instrumentalist on guitar and concertina and a collector of wonderfully clever and fun songs. Mike Marker from Bellingham is an interpreter of traditional American songs from the minglings of blues and southern mountain musics. He plays guitar as well as the banjo and writes songs. Jerry Middaugh is originally from Ohio and has deep roots in Appalachian music. He sings and plays guitar, banjo and mandolin. Jeff Warner comes to the Festival all the way from Portsmouth, New Hampshire. He sings traditional American and English folk songs and is a Folklorist and Community Scholar for the New Hampshire Council of the Arts.

The banjo workshop is just one item on the rich menu of music available at the Princeton Traditional Music Festival. The Festival begins at 6:15 PM on Friday, August 15th with an opening ceremony and a participatory dance on Veterans' Way. On Saturday and Sunday there is music from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM right in downtown Princeton. It's all free and everyone is welcome. 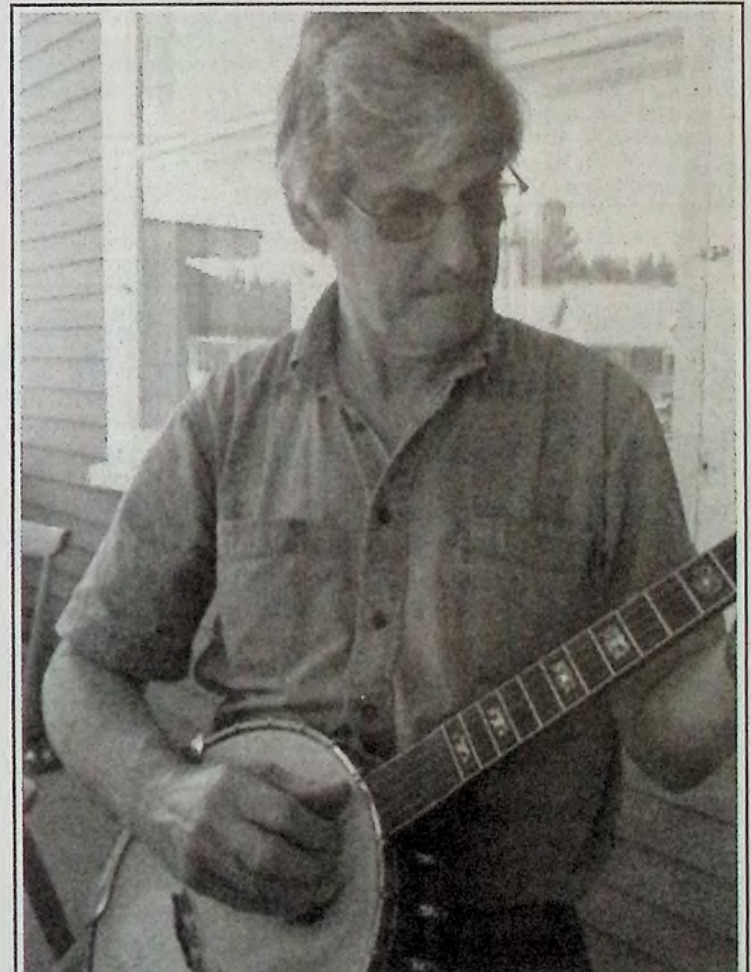
