Princeton postal franchise opening outrages Atamanenko

Alex Atamanenko, MP for BC Southern Interior, has learned that the Canada Post Corporation has opened a franchise postal outlet in Princeton, just steps from the main post office.

"I am outraged at the irresponsible decision by Canada Post that creates direct competition with an existing corporate post office," said Atamanenko.

"This is not the fault of the private

business operating the postal outlet. It is another example of the unspoken agenda of Canada Post to privatize and shut down its corporate offices."

Atamanenko has written to the CEO of Canada Post, Deepak Chopra, to express his concerns at this latest example of poor decision making and to urge the corporation to protect current postal services. "Canada Post will use the reduction in business at their corporate offices to justify further downsizing of services and reductions in staffing and hours," said the NDP MP. "The loss of good-paying jobs will be a blow to our small communities."

Atamanenko pointed out that in February of this year a dealership outlet was also opened in the town of Osoyoos, across the street from the main post office, and that Canada Post has plans to open more franchise operations in other Southern Interior communities.

"I would like to call upon local Chambers of Commerce and others in our communities to support our postal workers and speak out against the creeping privatization of our postal services," said Atamanenko.

"The survival of our rural communities depends upon it."

CMMC reports Q2 highlights

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) (the "Company" or "Copper Mountain") announced August 11th sales of 18 million pounds of copper, 6,300 ounces of gold and 94,900 ounces of silver to produce revenues of \$68 million after pricing adjustments and treatment charges, including a \$5.8 million positive pricing adjustment for the three months ended June 30th,

2014.

2014 Highlights (100% Basis)

- The Company achieved record production for the 2014 second quarter at Copper Mountain Mine with 19.9 million pounds of copper, 5,000 ounces of gold and 113,300 ounces of silver being produced. This represents a 27% increase in copper production above the same period last year.

- Mill throughput averaged 30,477

tpd which was a 4% improvement from the 2014 first quarter.

- Mining rates improved with the addition of two additional trucks and the dispatch system. The mining rate set a new record in June which averaged 200,000 tonnes of material moved per day.

- Revenues for the quarter were \$68.0 million including positive pricing adjustments of \$5.8 million EBITDA was \$25.3 million for the quarter ended June 30th, 2014.

- Gross profit totaled \$10.4 for the three months ended June 30th, 2014.

- Site cash costs for the 2014 second quarter were US\$1.63 per pound of copper produced net of precious metal credits.

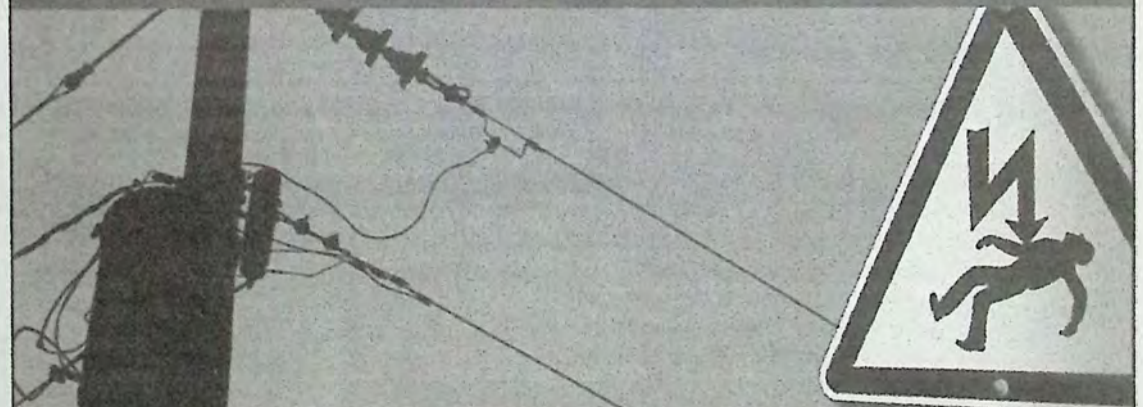

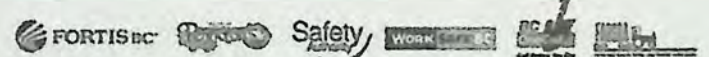

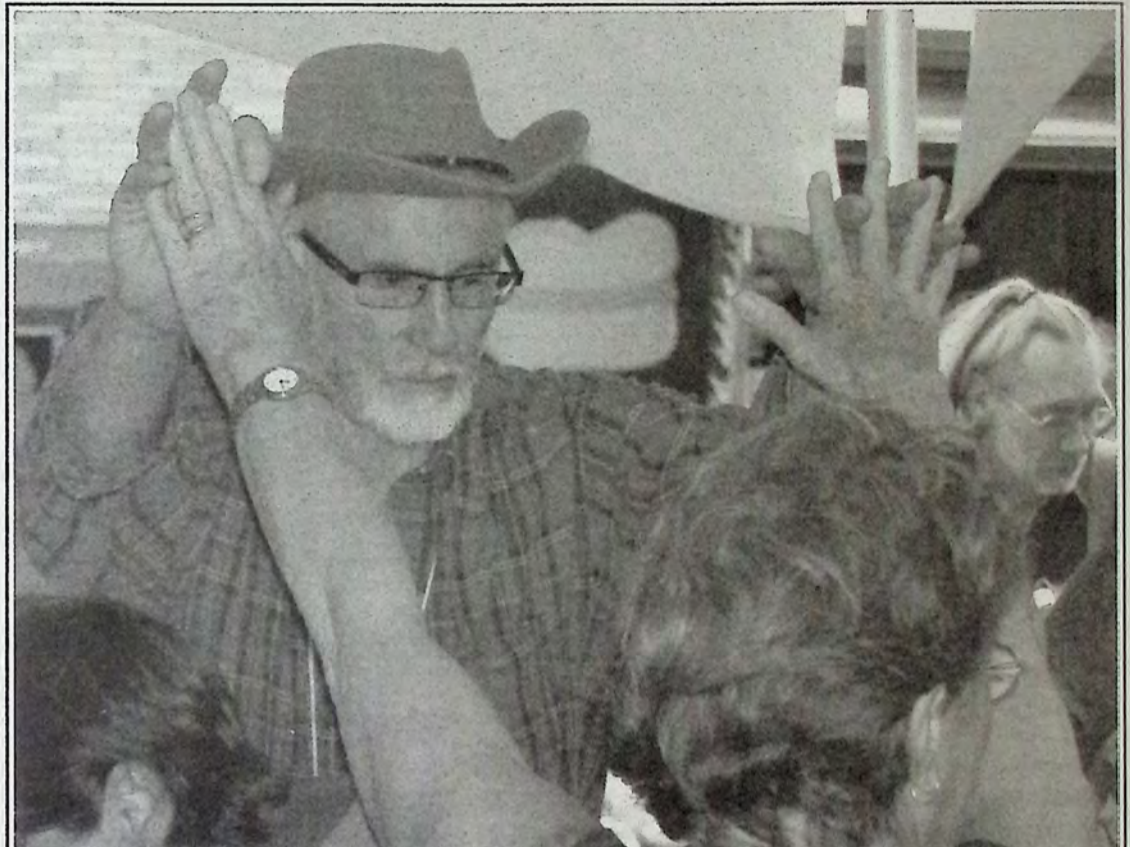

August 12, 2014 may officially mark the new era of the Princeton Posse. 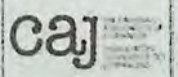

Teen Brains Aren't Ready For Life

fully developed actually retards the development of the prefrontal cortex, and more easily turns a young person into an alcoholic. Smoking pot and taking drugs can seriously, perhaps permanently, retard the development of the prefrontal cortex.

Although the body has reached full maturity at around age 19 for a female and around age 22 for a male, the brain is still growing if it has not been damaged by alcohol, smoking, and drugs, including prescription drugs. It is this mature body and immature mind that tends to get young people into trouble, but it also tends to see young people as more mature than they are. We allow them to live as if they were fully mature adults, even though their ability to make decisions based on consequences is impaired. We allow them in bars, in the military, and we allow them to marry years before their brains are mature. It is no wonder so many who marry young end up in divorce court.

Perhaps we should be teaching our teenagers they have limitations because their brains are not fully developed until age 25. Our young people should know this is a medical fact that affects all of their decisions and all of their choices. Perhaps we could save them a lot of grief by having them understand the impact of making poor decisions and poor judgements while they are still in their teens. We might help save some lives, too.

Parents can do a great deal toward solving this problem by helping their teenage children learn how to plan ahead, how to make decisions, how to make judgement calls about situations and people with whom they come into contact.

I remember one of my foster children who desperately needed that sort of guidance. She had never been allowed to make decisions about her own life. Her parents had controlled every aspect of her daily life and at age 14, she had no idea how to plan ahead. She would be in tears because the clothes she wanted to wear to school needed laundering, but she had not thought that far ahead. She had permission to go on a bus trip, but had no money to do so because she had spent the money she had been given for the trip. Most children learn very young that the decisions they make have consequences. She had a major learning curve at my house because I insisted she learn to plan ahead, and I insisted she live with the consequences of her decisions.

All of us go through our early years being forced to make choices, and I expect all of us have made a few of the wrong choices. I recall teachers and parents pushing me to choose what I wanted to do when I graduated from high school. I wanted to go to college and I went, and studied to become a teacher, but after I was actually on the job, I discovered teaching was not what I really wanted to do. Eventually I had the opportunity to do the job I really loved.

Our young people are provided a lot of tools to help them make career decisions while they are in school, but I think they should be taught more about how their own brains function and why they need to seek the advice of mature adults. Instead, they rely heavily on what their friends advise, and this is a case of one immature brain advising another immature brain, like the blind leading the blind.

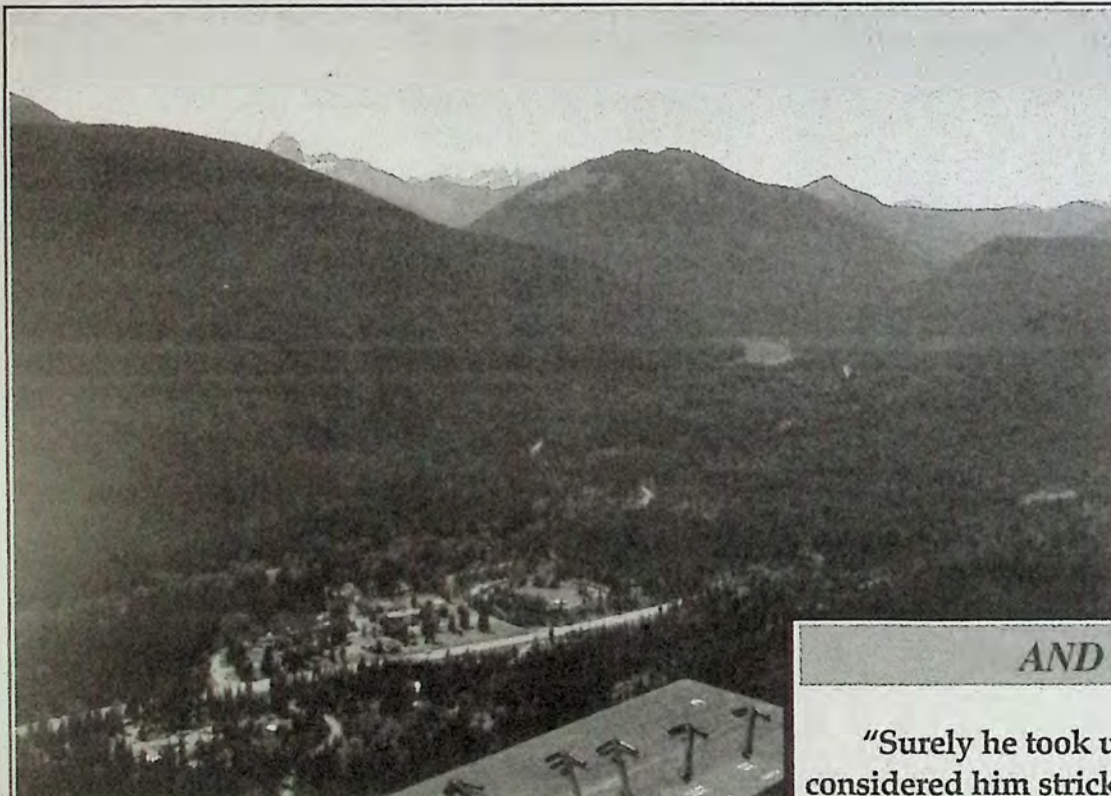
Research into the human brain through the technique of brain imaging have shown the human brain has not stopped growing until age 25!

When I learned that fact, I changed a lot of my ideas about how we raise our children, particularly our teenage children.

The final part of the brain to mature is the prefrontal cortex. This part of the brain is where we develop planning skills, and it governs conscience, decision-making and exercising judgement in terms of the consequences of our actions. This key element of being mature, being an adult, is the very last to fully develop.

This explains why teenagers who are 'good kids' still make horrible choices and stupid mistakes. Their judgement is impaired! Not only is their judgement impaired, they are not good at making decisions, planning ahead, and may be lacking insufficient conscience (the ability to feel sorry when we do something wrong).

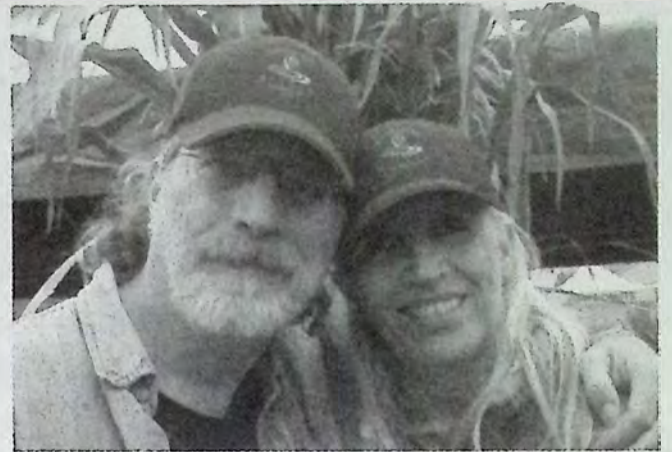
We probably should have kept drinking age and voting age at 21. Drinking alcohol before the brain is

Skin is somewhat elastic, and if you are under age 40, you can probably lose 30 pounds and your skin will adapt to your new size. However, if you are over 40, and especially if you are over age 50, the skin will not rebound quickly and you will be left with wrinkles and flabby skin. Chances are, the people in the television advertisements are actors. If they are not, they likely underwent some cosmetic surgery.

Many people who have lost a great deal of weight are often advised to undergo some cosmetic surgery, particularly on the belly. Most people who are extremely overweight gain most of the weight on the belly. This is generally true for women who have had children, and men who have had what is commonly called a beer belly. When extreme weight loss takes place, they are left with belly skin that seems like the folds of an accordion. These skin folds can cause problems by harboring excessive sweat and bacteria. Skin infections can occur. Having excess skin removed is a matter of hygiene as much as appearance.

The other area of the body most likely to receive cosmetic surgery is the chin area. Without the fat to fill in the skin around the jaw line, many people find they have loose skin in that area and it makes them look much older. Cosmetic surgery is the remedy.

If you are planning to lose more than 30 pounds, do it gradually, over one or two years, and make sure you exercise frequently to keep your skin elastic enough to adapt well to the weight loss. Swimming or showering in cold water helps the skin shrink down and increases elasticity. Keeping the skin well moisturized is helpful, too. The healthier the skin, the greater its elasticity.

Perhaps the best way to prevent these problems, as with all health matters, is to eat healthy and not gain the weight in the first place. Prevention is always preferable to the cure.

lucrative."

Hilton also points out she was cautious about her decision.

"I knew going into this endeavor that Princeton can be a hard place to own a business but so far Princeton has been a good place for me to do this and because of the type of business I do I am not limited as to who or where I can do this."

These are important factors as Princeton is a tough place to own and operate a business. Part of it is a result of our geographic location with traffic flowing from here to Penticton, Kelowna, Merritt and Kamloops. If you own a business and do not view similar businesses in these communities as your competitors, then you need to start asking yourself why your revenues have taken a dip.

Sure, a lot of that in 2014 is related to the economic slump felt throughout the province but if you aren't doing your job as a business owner for your customers, they will go somewhere else. Penticton quit being a daylong trip by horseback many, many years ago and is now just down the road.

Another interesting thing to keep in mind about the local economy is that in Princeton there are a lot of

different kinds of business. If you take out the abundance of eating establishments there really is an interesting mix of services, retail and specialty shops. I truly believe the future of downtown Princeton will include the addition of more unique, unusual shops that will add flavour and character to the downtown core.

However, if we expect them to assist our community by increasing

revenue spent in the local economy, we need to support them. We also need to applaud those businesses that are stepping outside the box and adding different things to their business.

I mean, really, where else can you find fresh baked goods in a dollar store? Or garlic products in a u-brew shop? Or homemade jams, jellies and relish in a newspaper

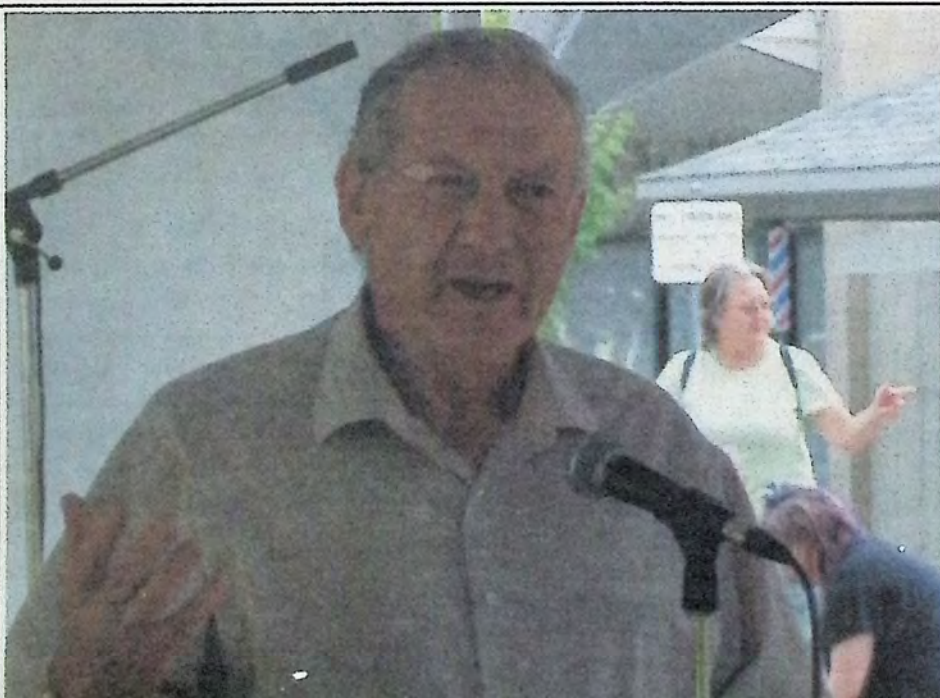

HOSHI SUDOKU - About The Puzzle

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

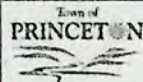

Improvements continue on Highway 3

Motorists who use Highway 3 between Princeton and Hope will see some significant safety improvements in the Saturday Creek area, thanks to construction activity that is getting underway.

A 1.8-kilometre stretch of the highway located approximately 22-kilometres southwest of Princeton will be widened from two to three lanes to provide an eastbound passing lane and realigned to improve sightlines. The project will also improve access to several forestry roads by relocating accesses and widening the intersections. Construction of 2.5-metre

paved shoulders and drainage improvements will improve safety for pedestrians and all other road users.

"The Highway #3 Mayors Coalition is pleased to see the provincial government moving forward on this important part of the region's highway system. The improvements between Princeton and Hope have been a long term priority of the Coalition, and are a necessary step toward the economic development along the Highway #3 corridor."

"Local mayors have worked hard to identify priority road work along

Highway 3," said Fraser-Nicola MLA Jackie Tegart.

"I'm looking forward to working closely with them in the future to ensure our road network is safe for everyone and supports job creation in the region."

Hoban Construction Ltd. has been awarded a \$7.85 million contract to carry out the project, scheduled to be completed in September 2016.

Motorist disruptions and delays are expected to be kept to a minimum and negligible changes to the speed limits are anticipated during construction.

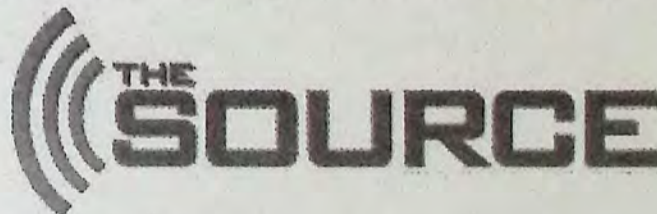

Jim O'Rourke, President and CEO of Copper Mountain, remarked "This quarter marks our
