Dr. Smith shares healthcare information

Dr. David Smith has recently been working throughout the province in different clinics. Here he shares some interesting details on his discoveries with Similkameen News Leader Owner/Publisher George Elliott.

Similkameen News Leader: Hello again Dr. Smith and welcome back to Princeton. We believe that you have been working all over BC in various clinics and would love to hear some news from you on how Health Care is performing in other parts of the province.

Dr. David Smith: Yes, George thank you, it's great to be "home again."

SNL: Please tell us where you have been, and what your impressions have been like.

Dr. Smith: Well first of all let me tell you about the places I have worked in which fall under the aus-

pices of Interior Health (IH) which is, of course, quite relevant, to our present setting.

SNL: Please do.

Dr. Smith: First of all I worked for six weeks in 100 Mile House in a clinic downtown and did "ER call" at the hospital. There have recently been massive alterations to the hospital with a wonderful new ER. I believe that the costs were in the region of about \$4 million of which half the costs were from a local benefactor and the rest from IH. What is interesting about 100 Mile House is that they still have a very active operating room (OR) as well as delivering babies. However, the current situation is, that both the GP Surgeons as well as the Anesthesiologist are very keen to retire and have been advertising extensively for a replacement.

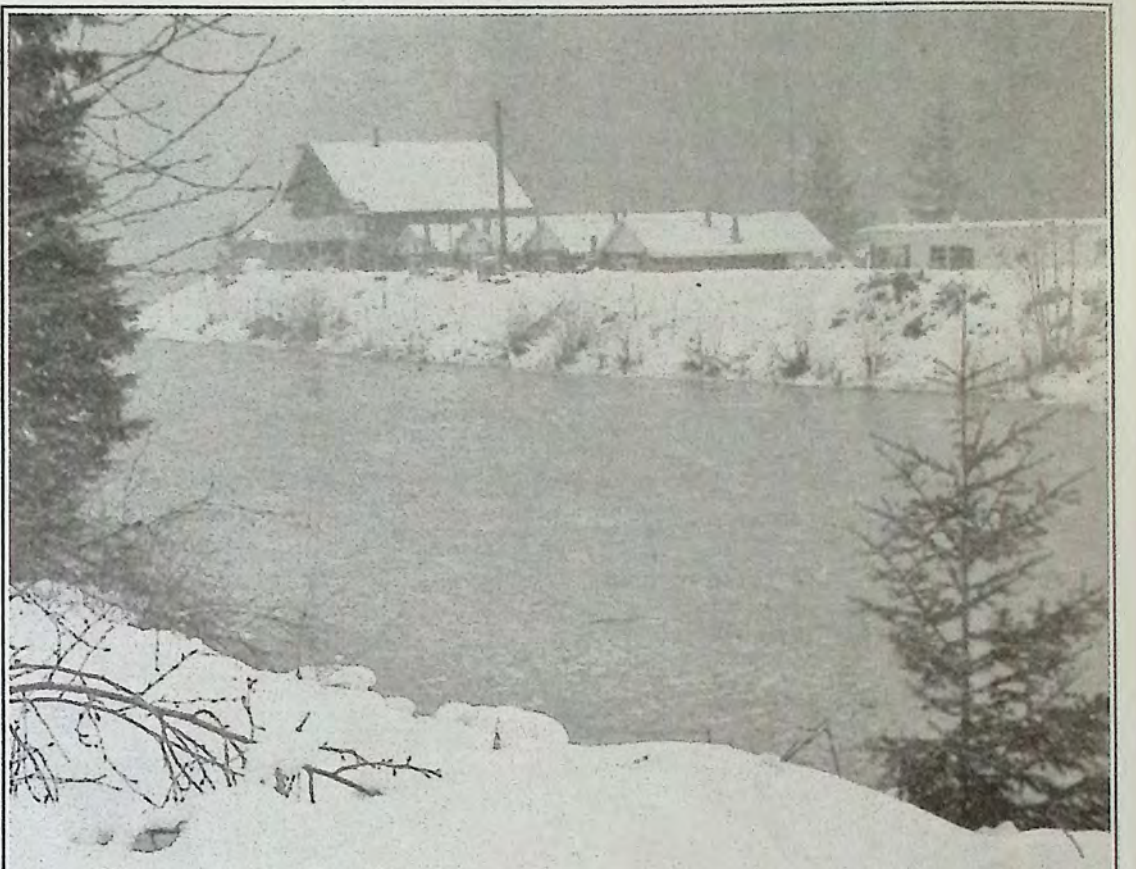

Dr. Smith shares healthcare information

SNL: Have they found replacements?
Dr. Smith: To date, and over the last two years, there has not been one single applicant for either of these positions. Note this inability

to staff a fully functional surgical unit in the future must surely now put to rest anyone who has the misconception that a OR could be possibly be opened in Princeton in the future. Not only are the costs exorbitant (over \$2 million to build a new OR) but now it has become obvious that staffing of such a unit is also impossible.
SNL: Understood. Where else have you been?
Dr. Smith: The second town I worked in under IH was the town of Lytton which is, as most probably know, is only two hours away from us on Highway 1. What an incredible facility IH has built at this site. Under one roof one has the Ambulance Centre, a modern up to date and fully equipped ER, a four examining room medical clinic and a pharmacy which has an entrance directly from the clinic as well as from the main road. On top of all of these is a three bedroom apartment which houses the nursing and medical staff in fully equipped and very comfortable quarters. And all of this under one roof!
SNL: Sounds pretty nice. How is the staffing situation there?
Dr. Smith: It appears that the Lytton Clinic has no problem in retaining permanent doctors as well regular Nurse Practitioners and RN's to staff the ER, which goes a long way to proving my theory that if you provide good or excellent working conditions then the staff will come.
SNL: That sounds logical. Dr Smith, I understand that you spent some time on Vancouver Island as

well.
Dr. Smith: Yes I worked both at Campbell River on the east coast of Vancouver Island and then Tofino on the west coast.
SNL: What are the set ups like in those places?
Dr. Smith: Campbell River has a clinic which has twelve doctors on the main floor (yes, twelve), as well as four specialists on the ground floor.
SNL: That had to have been a unique arrangement for you and patients.
Dr. Smith: It was wonderful to have instant access to specialist opinion on occasions, by just simply taking the patient downstairs for a quick consultation. More impressive however was that on every Friday afternoon the entire staff of the clinic are invited to attend a "social" gathering in the lounge to discuss current and future issues while having a glass of wine in your hand.
SNL: That had to be very productive in such an atmosphere.
Dr. Smith: The camaraderie and friendliness was like a ship at sea guided by a captain in charge and a very organized and happy crew. I was extremely impressed with the way that things got done in such a casual and friendly setting. With twelve doctors available, they very rarely needed locums and never really advertise for medical staff.
SNL: I don't doubt that at all. Tell us about Tofino.
Dr. Smith: From there to Tofino which is, as far as I am concerned,continued on Page 18

While 'they' complained about what the weather was doing to their day, life, plans and mood, we were grateful it wasn't minus 35 and an ice storm.

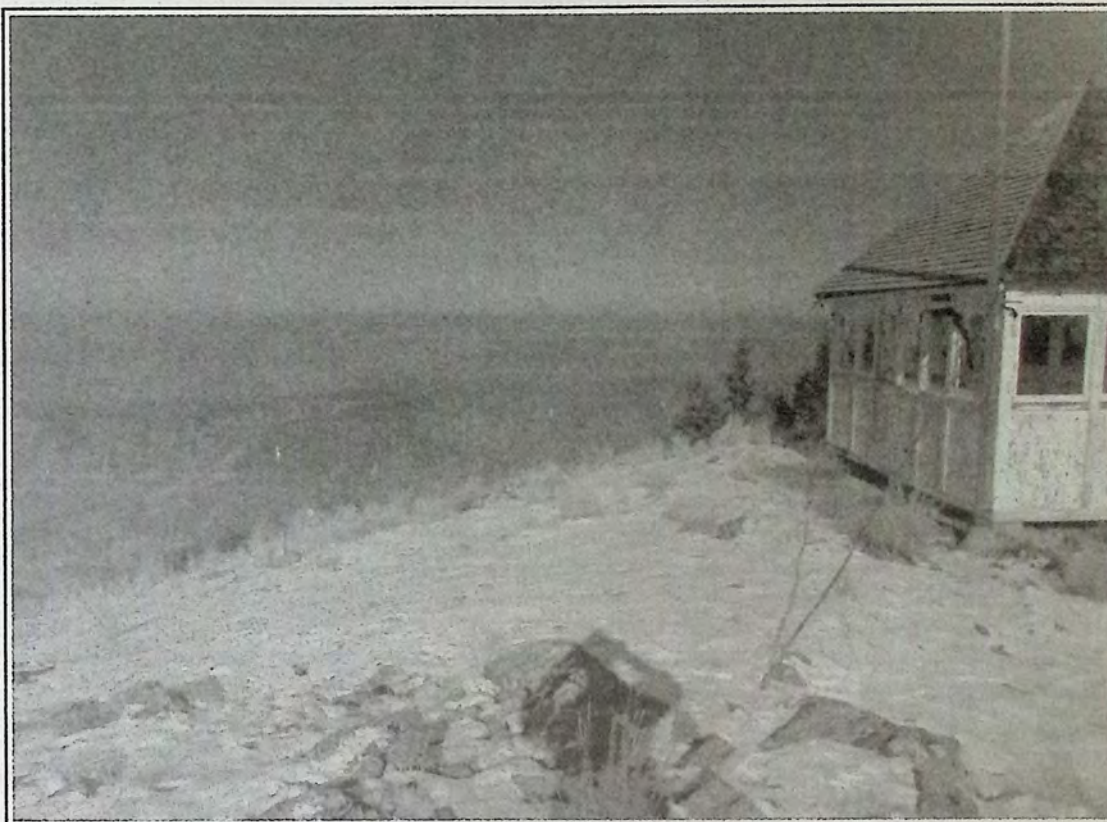
While 'they' launched various attacks online about bothersome details of how the weather inconvenienced them, we were thankful when we could access the internet so we could tell family and friends we were okay.

Questions About What We Saw

There are a lot of questions being asked about what we saw happening in Ottawa on October 22, 2014. That day, a lone gunman shot a reserve soldier at the war memorial, then ran through the streets wearing a plaid scarf covering his lower face, and rushed into the Parliament building where he was shot. We saw the whole thing on television, didn't we?

Questions are coming from a variety of sources about what we saw and heard that day. The Ottawa Citizen newspaper has asked where the photo of the shooter came from. They were still asking on November 19. This photo is important. If you look at the photo down to the shooter's waist, you see a well-defined white handle with a chrome stem on the lower left side. This leads to a bluish blob. The right-hand fingers of the shooter have the yellowish tint of the shooter's face, except for the tip of one fin-

ger, which is a ghostly white. The left-hand fingers are also a ghostly white. Why? People who work with computer imaging think the photo has been 'doctored' or 'photoshopped'.

There are other serious questions being asked but not answered. The Ottawa Citizen kept asking when the shooter's body would be released. It was not until November 16 reporters learned it had been released a week before. When asked to whom the body was released. The chief coroner said the law did not permit her to give that information.

If you look on the website freethepressCanada, there is criticism of the reporting of the event is based on a time line of reporting. The first report of shots fired was at 10:00 AM. At 10:13 AM, a reporter tweeted that reporters were ordered at gunpoint by Ottawa tactical police to put up their hands and get down on the ground! This presumably came from the war memorial site.

At the same time, before either the Canadian reporters or parliamentary staff and Members of Parliament knew what was going on, CBS, Associated Press and Google were informing the world that Ottawa was on lockdown. By 10:54 AM, these news sources had the event solved, including the shooter's name, stating the information came from U.S.A. officials. An hour later, CBS was no longer giving the name of the source of their information, but it was already

out there on the net. The story came back later as coming from "law enforcement" and added the middle name "Abdul".

Another story had gone to the Toronto Star two days before describing two soldiers run down in a parking lot in Quebec. The driver had fled, and later went into a roadside ditch after losing control of his vehicle in a police chase. The story originally was sent by five reporters who said several witnesses saw the driver had his hands in the air when police shot him. The Star altered the story later to say the driver had emerged from the vehicle with a knife in his hand. The new version said the man was an Islamic radical.

There is more criticism from a website (dutchsinse) in the United States. In freeze-frames of the 'official' CBC video inside the front hall of the Parliament building, photographers with big cameras are glimpsed at the edge of the hall. Who were those photographers? Why were they set up in the hall? The website asks why the photographers were not running away from the man with the rifle instead of taking photos. I wonder why they were not told, at gunpoint, to get down on the ground like the other reporters were told.

Finally, if you want a good laugh about the whole event, go to comedian Russel Brand's video.

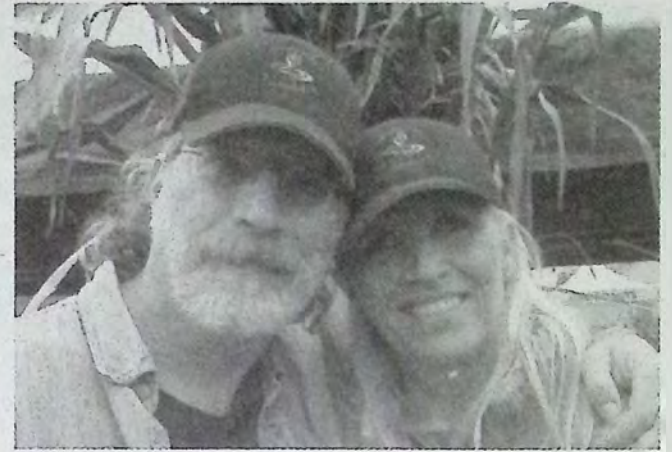
What we have are a lot of serious questions and no answers. If you know any of the answers, please let me know.

RDOS releases 2014 survey results

The Regional District is making progress in their effort to improve the customer experience of their citizens.

The Regional District conducted a

survey to measure the satisfaction of citizens in the eight electoral areas in April of this year and released the results of the survey last week.

"A Key Success Indicator for our organization is to improve the customer experience," stated Mark Pendergraft, Chair of the Regional District.

"We gather this information so the Board can make informed decisions about where to best apply our resources in the future to make the biggest difference for our citizens." The Regional District surveys citizens in its electoral areas every 2nd year.

Four hundred residents were randomly selected to share their opinions and ideas about the Regional District as their local government

with respect to Quality of Life, Service Satisfaction, Environment, Communications, Information Technology, and Fiscal Responsibility.

Overall satisfaction ratings indicated 80% of our residents rate the quality of life in their community as excellent. 72% rate it as an excellent place to raise children, and 80% rate the Regional District as an excellent place to retire. 62% agree the Regional District is doing a good job overall.

"Sixty-percent of our citizens believe they get good value for taxes paid. When asked, 70% of

our citizens prefer that we offer the same level of service at the same level of taxation while 8% would prefer that we reduce the current level of service. Asked whether they might support a tax increase, 16% said they would support an increase for increased service."

Chair Mark Pendergraft said the survey results are an important part of the Regional District's Strategic Plan.

"The Regional District Board and staff will use this feedback to guide the organization's decision-making and financial planning processes."

As a next step in the Citizen Survey process, the Regional District will now review the statistical and narrative results and determine areas that need to be addressed. This information is used in the Strategic Planning and Budgeting processes for the Board.

In addition to the telephone Citizen Survey, an online Citizen Survey was conducted. The online survey was added as another way to determine the satisfaction of residents within the Regional District and to incorporate an accurate reading from all citizen demographics. 198 citizens were surveyed by online survey.

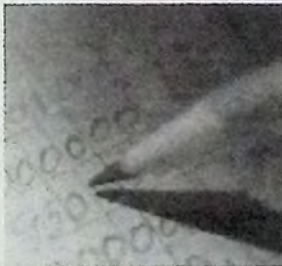

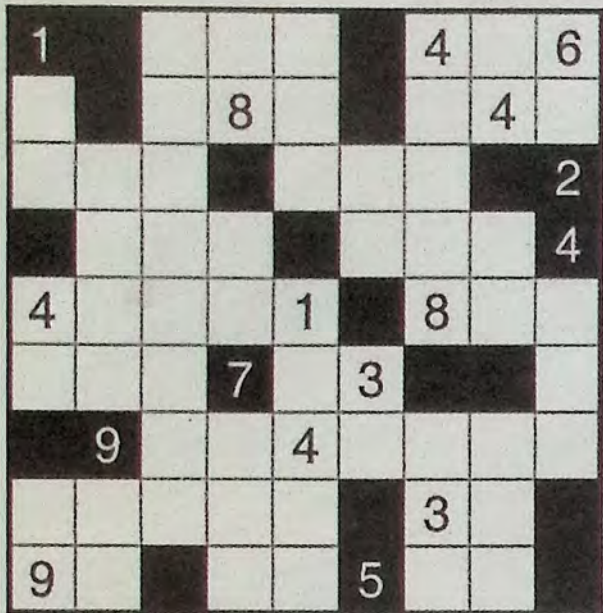

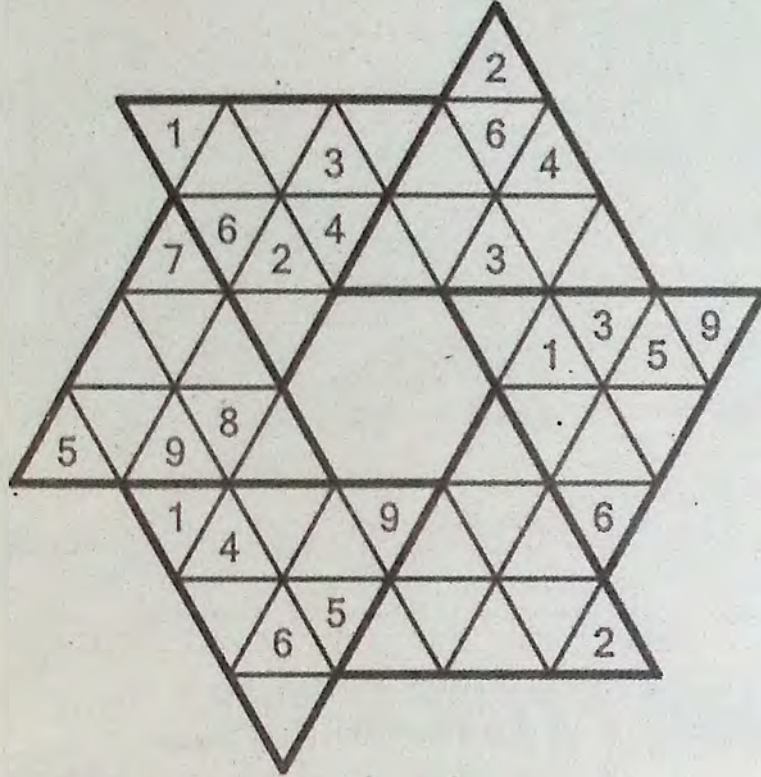

Sudoku - also known as "Number Place" - is a logic-based, combinatorial number-placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to enter a number from 1 through 9 in each cell of a grid, most frequently a 9x9 grid made up of 3x3 subgrids. Each row, column and region must contain only one instance of each number. This Sudoku variant is called "Hoshi Sudoku". It contains six large triangles. The numbers 1 to 9 must be placed into the cells of each large triangle. Every line of any length - even uncontinuous - must contain every number not more than once.

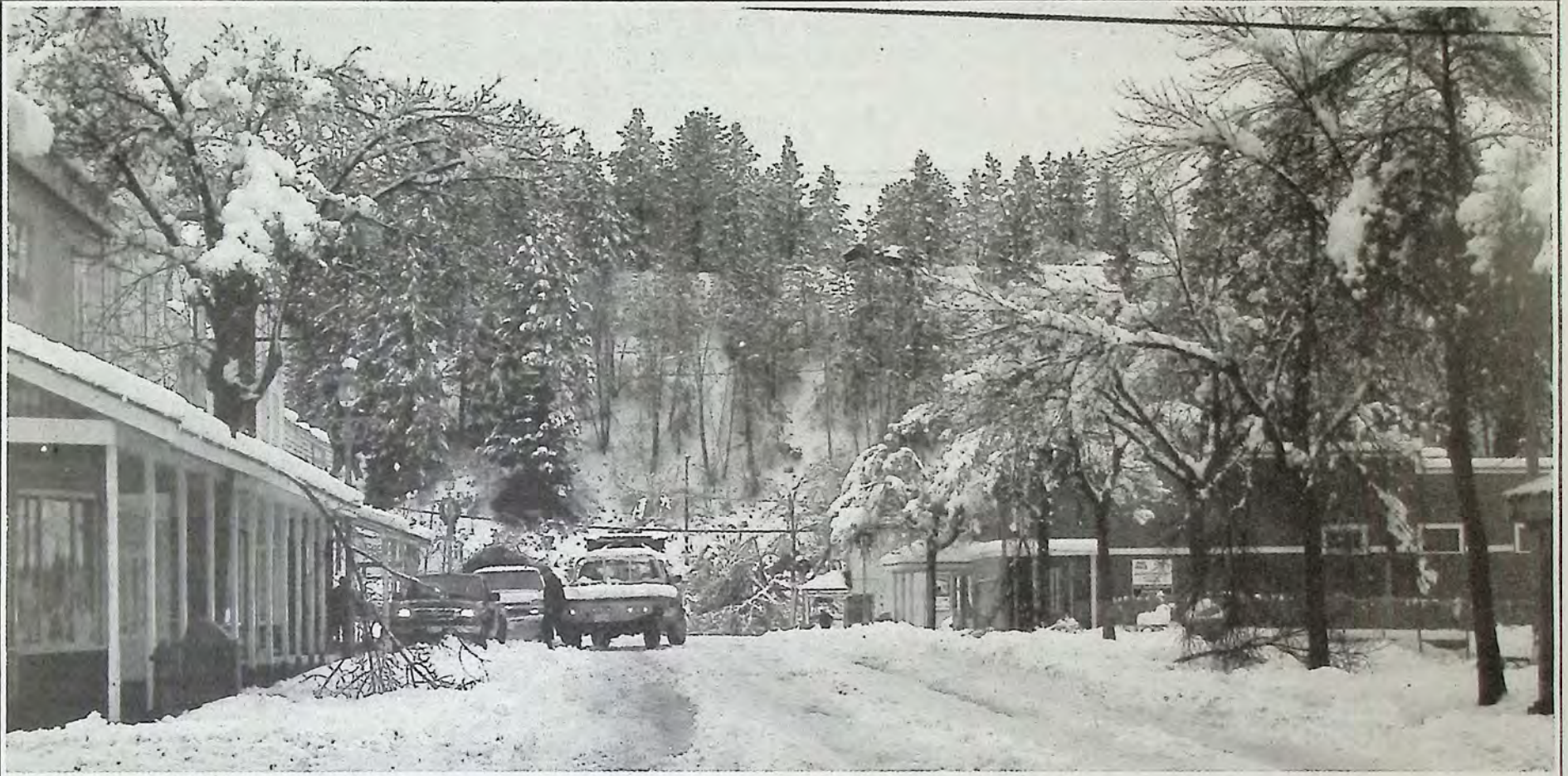

Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

Last week's unusual snowstorm and power outage had an amazing effect on the community. We did not realize how widespread the outage was until we called the utility company for a status update.

At one point when we checking into it, there were over 80 outages listed. Chances were that that was just a partial list as we soon learned pretty much the entire southern half of the British Columbia interior was without power, or parts of communities were.

The fact that it was on a

Wednesday and during a day that wasn't well below freezing worked out fine for us. From what I've heard, we were lucky to have 'suffered' with just a six-hour outage compared to other parts of the community and surrounding area. It did force us to shut our downtown office for the day, although there really wasn't much movement in the downtown core, anyway.

Princeton Town Crew worked tirelessly to clear streets of snow in addition to removing broken tree branches that snapped under the

weight of the over 13-inches (measured at our home) of wet, heavy snow.

There is no doubt the loss of a business day for many downtown businesses will hurt for some time, but what I really noticed about the darkened downtown was what the power outage forced some of us to do.

There were pockets of business neighbours who gathered and visited.

I got bored sitting in my office and heard voices nearby so I ventured out to see what was going on. I found myself in the hair salon located directly behind our office (The Style Chamber) and joined in a conversation between salon owner operator TamAirah Campbell and customer Rika Ruebsaat.

Earlier that morning, before I decided digging the car out of the driveway only to likely get stuck on the yet to be plowed side street we live on would be pointless, both

Brenda and I had an opportunity to introduce ourselves to a neighbour we've only just waved at to this point.

The conversation at the hair salon was an example of how networking used to be done, long before technology, as we know it. Eventually Rika left and Brenda found me and became part of the conversation. After the power went back on the three of us were still engaged in conversation that spilled over to our house and turned into dinner.

Later in the evening I learned from other residents that they had opened their homes to others in need of warmth, a hot beverage or company.

I also realized that since the majority of Princeton was locked down tight, and leaving town for supplies was not an option for many, suddenly the focus shifted back to downtown.

Concern regarding whether or not groceries or gas were available

became the topic of some online banter where only a week before the same places were being criticized for pricing. Maybe we need a power outage and complete loss of access to the things we complain about to understand that maybe we don't have it so bad after all.

I'm sure that by the time you read this there will be those who will forget how fortunate they are to have a downtown retail core with unique shopping opportunities and focus on one of many negatives. In the case of last week's storm/power outage, those negatives will have nothing really to do with what happened and will revolve around personal inconvenience.

I'd be lying if I said I really could have done without the lost day of office work, but we were able to adapt and make up for it the following day. It's not like we have these kinds of outages on a regular basis, either.



If you own a 4x4, or live along Coalmont Road, evacuation would not have been a problem, as it is well maintained.

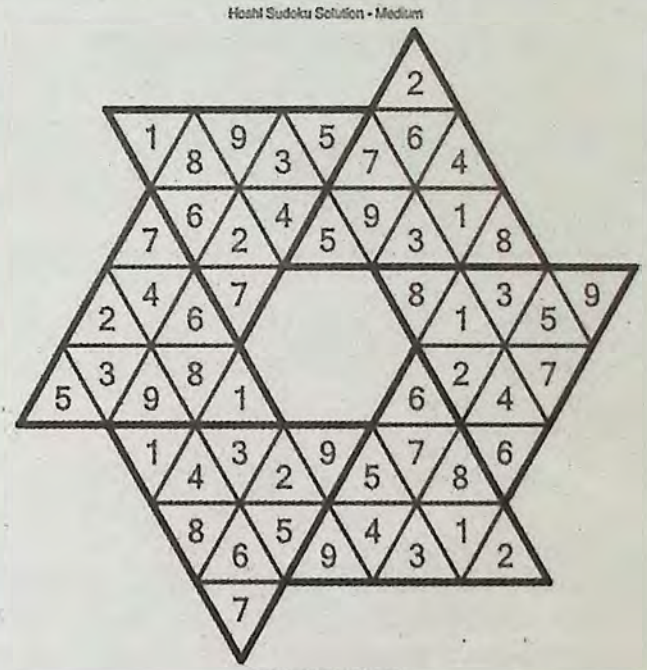
For those of us who do not fall into that group, the condition of the side roads was and still is this morning

.....continued from Page 2 the Mecca for naturalists and Greenpeace adherents. There was nothing more spectacular than walking along many of the beaches or strolling through forests which are 800 years old or more. The hospital was old but extremely well equipped and the Tofino Tonquin Clinic as well as the Uclulet Clinic has no problems in acquiring medical staff as well as ER doctors who are mostly young graduates from Victoria and Vancouver and who are all only too keen to keep their skills up to date. It is the first practice that I have ever worked at where one consulted more young

people than older people during the daily clinic.

SNL: Dr Smith I seem to recall you saying in our office one time that you were also heading 'up North.' Can you share some insight on being there?

Dr. Smith: Yes, I had the privilege of working at both the new clinic in Fort St. John as well as the relatively new hospital in Dawson Creek. The clinic in FSJ was only completed five months ago and is absolutely magnificent. It has space for at least six doctors, three Nurse Practitioners and numerous offices for the managerial staff as well as, offices for the Physiotherapist,

Mental health workers and Social workers. It has a waiting room the size of most houses in Princeton with an area on the one side dedicated to amusing children while they wait for appointments. Attached to the clinic is a coffee shop which is in full swing. The cost of this clinic was in the region of between \$12 and \$15 million and was paid for by Northern Health.

SNL: Hmmm. Very interesting.

Dr. Smith: Working in the ER in Dawson Creek was also a unique experience for me due to the fact that I had the use of a CT Scanner which I could access at the drop of a hat, for any case that I deemed nec-

essary without prior consent or waiting lists. It's unbelievable that another CT scanner was also available in Fort St John which is only an hour away.

SNL: Talk about an amazing adventure. Are you going to work at any of these places again?

Dr. Smith: Yes indeed, it was a privilege working in some of these wonderful clinics and once my wife and I return from our six month "snow

birding" in South Africa, we will surely go back for more.

SNL: As always, it is a pleasure chatting with you Dr. Smith and please keep us informed about your work.

Dr. Smith: I would like to take this opportunity of thanking you for the interview and to wish all your readers a very Merry Christmas and an exceptional 2015 and au revoir, see you in May next year.

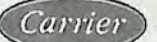

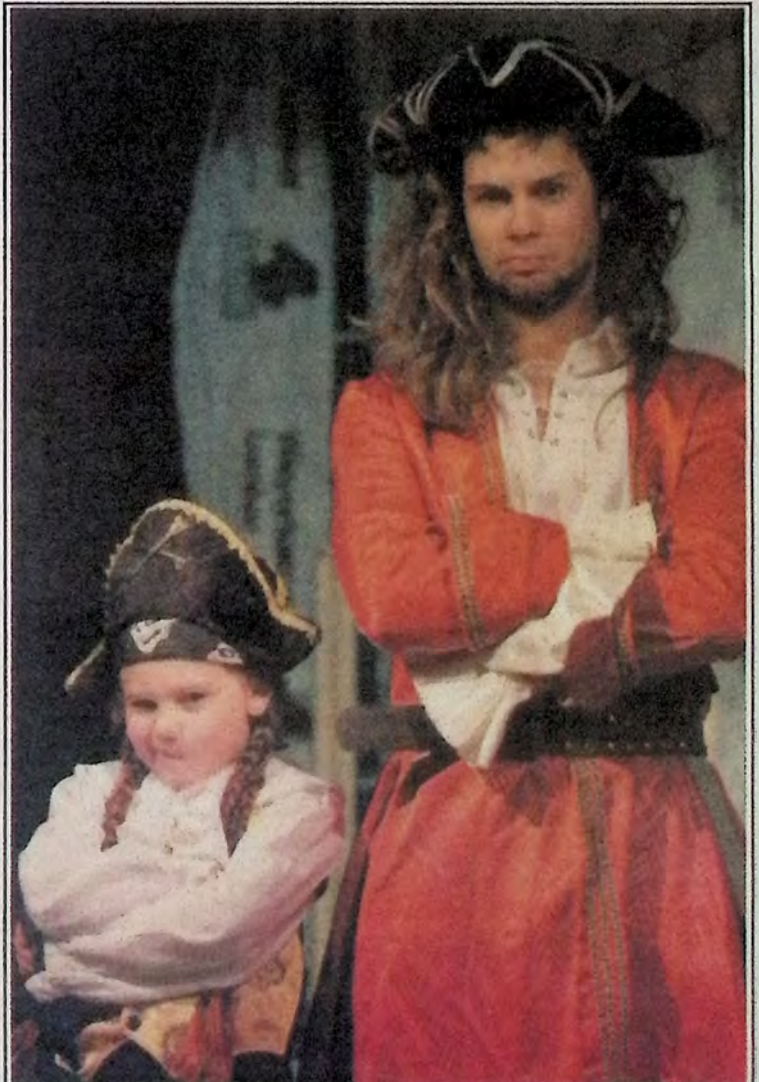
