Racing Days AGM flops

Princeton Racing Days Association annual general meeting, called for 7:00 PM, December 16 at the library, was a dead end. The meeting could not take place due to lack of a quorum, and lack of three executive members.

A new date was set for the annual general meeting: January 23, 2015, at 7:00 PM at the library conference room. If a new Board of Directors cannot be elected, the Racing Days Association will have to fold. What will happen at that point is a discussion of the legal process required to

dispose of assets and revoke the charter.

At the December 16 attempted meeting, there was an informal discussion of what the impact will be on the community. Without the horse races, how can the community have a weekend celebration called Racing Days? What other activities might there be to create a new kind of weekend celebration?

The original intent of Racing Days was to attract visitors to Princeton for a weekend of fun. The plans were put together by downtown business people, along with Town Council, to stimulate a depressed local economy. The plan worked very well. Racing Days became a community tradition and Princeton became the destination for a weekend of fun.

The celebration survived for 50 years, but horse racing is a dying industry today. The other thing that has been dying is interest from the business community. Although the Racing Days Association has money in its coffers, it no longer has enough members to do anything with the money. Karrie Crucil, who has been President, cannot continue due to her health, and nobody is stepping forward to take that position. In fact, present membership is down to too few to form a new Board of Directors, let alone plan an alternative event for a weekend of celebration.

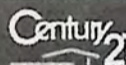

Racing Days - Version 2.0

I have the solution to save Princeton Racing Days and it won't involve changing the name of the celebration or that of the organizing committee.

The Princeton Exhibition Association has been working with Princeton Motor Sports to bring an event to the site. For those of you recently new to the area, the motor sports group hosted a few small-scale events in the in field at Sunflower Downs a number of years ago.

There has been interest in bringing racing vehicles, and possibly a mud bog and assorted other wheeled activities to the site. I think the racetrack formerly used for horse racing could easily be transformed into a venue to host some sort of motorized racing event.

If I had a Christmas Wish it would be to see that piece of land out on Laurie Currie Way become a going concern on Racing Days weekend and the magnet it has been in the past bringing people to the community.

I say this for a number of reasons.

First, don't expect horses to race there anytime soon.

Second, the track is perfectly flat and was engineered that way when it was first built. Newmont Mines gets credit for that incredible contribution to the community dating back nearly fifty years.

Third, there is no venue between Chilliwack, Merritt and the Okanagan for small-scale motorized racing. I'm not talking stock car or hot rod, but the races could encourage hot rod owners to bring their wheels and - dare I say it - host a mini show 'n' shine at the track during races.

I'm already getting excited about the next Racing Days Parade featuring a number of racing vehicles revving up and making noise.

The best part is that Racing Days stays Racing Days.

And...the races will still involve horsepower.

If you think this could be the answer to save the Princeton Racing Days Association, get out and say so. Another attempt at forming a Racing Days Committee is planned for 7:00 PM on January 23rd in the Library Conference Room on Vermilion Avenue.

I would hate to see a half-century tradition die on the table without a different kind of racing not being explored. If you are a car nut or a racecar nut, show up at that meeting.

Let's put Princeton back on the map for racing...but racing cars instead of horses.

I grew up having a father who loved celebrating Christmas. He was not a religious man. In fact, he grew up as a preacher's son and developed a real rebellion against the puritanical Methodist Christmas which was primarily a religious celebration. There was no Christmas tree, and each child received a gift of something they needed anyhow, like a pair of socks or mittens. They did have a

big Christmas dinner, but that was as far as it went.

Although my father was not religious, at Christmas time he did not object to celebrating the birth of a man who believed in peace on earth and goodwill to all mankind. My father was against war, as any sane person is, and he tried to live up to the concept of goodwill toward all mankind. Other than those exceptions, my father's idea of Christmas celebration was to do everything he could to make his family happy on Christmas day.

I remember him planning in October what to give for Christmas. Even as a pensioner, he carefully picked out gifts for family members, sneaked them into his closet, and enjoyed every aspect of giving to others. He liked the house decorated for Christmas, and he loved decorating the Christmas tree. He made a point of buying a poinsettia plant, boxes of chocolates, bags of nuts and candy, candy canes, and man-

darin oranges. He loved Christmas lights and Christmas wreaths on our front and back doors. He loved having people gather in his home to celebrate Christmas.

My father was the ultimate Christmas consumer. For him, giving gifts, buying the turkey and other goodies, was so pleasurable he savored going shopping. When he died on the morning of Christmas Eve, he had already wrapped all the gifts from him and placed them under the tree.

This spirit of taking joy in giving to others has stayed in our family. To us, the giving to others is the real spirit of Christmas. For one day each year, no matter how poor my parents may have been, there were always gifts to be given. This is a treasured tradition. I hope I have passed it along to my children and their children.

Now that I am an old lady on a pension, I find it more difficult to afford a lot of gifts, so I make many of the gifts I give, and I buy gifts throughout the year. I still feel that joy of giving, of making family and friends aware that I care enough to want to give to them.

To many people, it is the season of Christmas that gives them pleasure - going to parties and dinners, mixing with people they know, enjoying festivities downtown, and for many, going to church and singing carols.

Each person and each family celebrates Christmas in their own way. I have come to believe it is the celebration that is the most important aspect of the Christmas season. All of us need special days in which celebration is the key factor. For those of us who live in the northern hemisphere, Christmas is a time to light up the dark world, get away from the cold, and enjoy ourselves on a day off work (at least, for most of us).

For those people who do not get a day off work, we owe you our thanks for the gift you give, the security you provide by clearing the roads, manning the telephone network, providing comfort in hospitals and residences for the infirm, and for keeping gas stations open, airplanes flying and restaurants operating for those of us traveling.

May all of you have a happy Christmas in peace and goodwill.

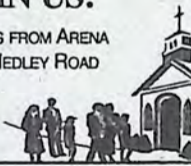

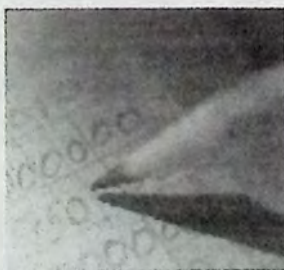

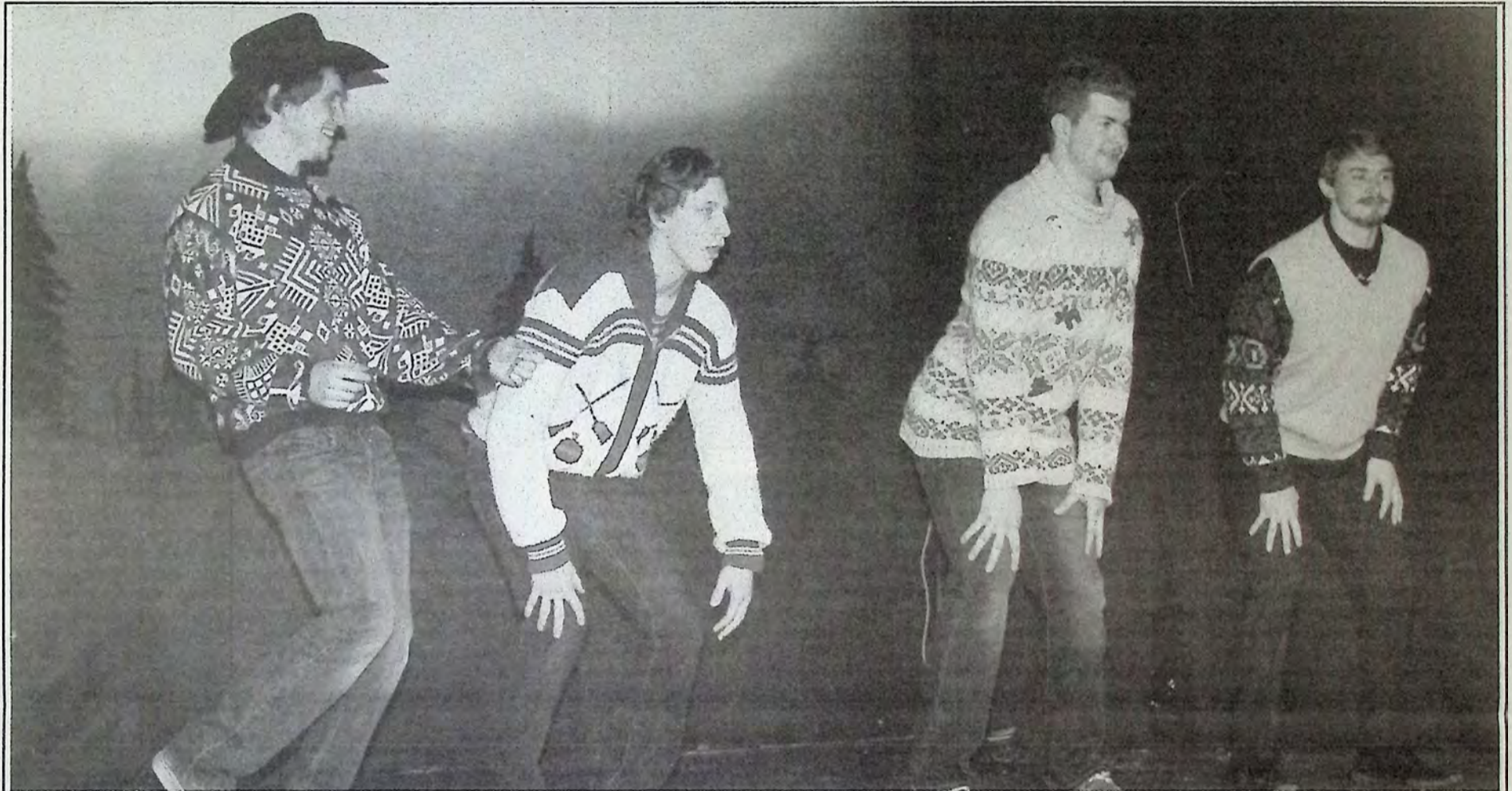

Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

According to the Chamber of Commerce, over \$72,000 was spent locally during their Christmas Passport Program. Regardless of how you slice that figure, that's a pretty fair chunk of change and I'd be lying if I said we didn't see a wee bit of that come into our office as well.

I give the Chamber of Commerce a lot of credit for trying to steer shoppers into downtown Princeton during Christmas shopping season

and I credit a number of local businesses for putting together deals to get customers in their doors.

This week I want to look a bit deeper at what happens to your money when you spend it locally versus spending it elsewhere.

For example, for every dollar spent locally it can be spent an additional six to fifteen times before it eventually finds its way out of town. So, using the figure from the Chamber of Commerce of \$72,000

spent in roughly two weeks of shopping, it translates to \$720,000 fed into the local economy if it gets spent another ten times.

For example, this newspaper is 100-percent locally owned. If you buy some advertising or a copy of the paper from our office every single dime goes directly into our Princeton bank account. Aside from the usual costs of doing business such as utilities and printing costs, most of our revenue ends up spent directly in Princeton. There are four people here who collect pay-cheques from my company. A portion of their pay goes back into the local economy.

Conversely, if you buy a copy of this paper at one of the many news-stand locations we have in the Similkameen Valley, we have to give a portion of that dollar to the business selling our papers for us.

Our landlord owns a local business and conducts a lot of business in the community so part of our rent

cheque comes back to Princeton. The wages that find their way into our home are mostly spent in the local economy on groceries, the odd meal out and various other living expenses that are paid to local interests.

And, yes, a portion of our business income does end up out of town, but far less than what stays in the community.

Going back to the Chamber of Commerce figure of \$72,000 spent in downtown Princeton during the Christmas Passport Program, if each and every penny of that figure was spent exclusively in national chain stores a total of 80-percent of that leaves the community instantly. Or in other words, \$57,600 of that \$72,000 disappears. The remaining 20-percent will likely pay for staff that live in the community, but that figure has far less impact on the local economy when it is not spent directly in businesses owned by those who live in Princeton.

Another thing that hurts the local economy is when government agencies requesting quotes for service and then follow a procedure that sees the lowest bidder winning contracts. Often the lowest bidder is a corporate entity that feeds far less into the local economy than it takes. These are the kinds of companies that undercut smaller, local businesses to the point where they can't compete although it's the smaller, local business that feeds far more into the local economy.

When you are supporting giant corporations because the price is cheaper, you essentially hurt local business.

This is very likely one of the many reasons why the Chamber of Commerce introduced the Christmas Passport Program to stimulate the local economy at a time of year when consumers are in a spending mood anyway. It's a good time of year for shoppers tocontinued on Page 20

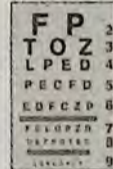

The Town of Princeton entered into a three-year lease agreement with Okanagan Regional Library at the December 15th meeting of Town Council.

The agreement is to provide exclusive use of part of the building at 107 Vermilion Avenue, totaling 2,239 square feet of space currently used as the Princeton ORL Branch.

"The Okanagan Regional Library has leased the majority of the building since the Town purchased and renovated the site in 2009," states Director of Finance Shirley McMahon in her report to Council.

It is library policy to review lease rates every three years.

Historically ORL has been a tenant of the Town of Princeton since 1975 when citizens approved a referendum to join the Regional Library system. The library origi-

nally shared space with Princeton Museum at 167 Vermilion Avenue. By 2007 both had outgrown their respective spaces and the ORL Board of Directors unanimously endorsed the relocation of the library to its present location.

Long time residents will remember the 107 Vermilion Avenue location as being occupied by the Traveller's Café and then the Goldion Restaurant. That property was purchased by the Town of

Princeton in March 2007 with renovations starting just over two years later. The library moved into the new space in 2010.

The lease rate has not changed from the previous term and is set at \$10.00 per square foot or \$5,597.50 quarterly. The rate is set by ORL and the library pays an additional 57.3-percent of the total expenses for the building.

The term of the new lease begins January 1, 2015.

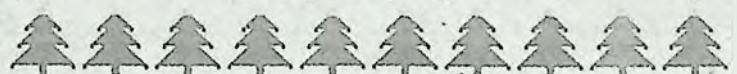
