This week is Pet Awareness Week in Princeton and to celebrate dog owners will make a new friend downtown.

Bylaw Enforcement Officer Bob Riley has taken on the task of stopping each and every person spotted downtown with a dog. His goal is to spread the word about the Animal Control Bylaw in an effort to educate dog owners on fineable offenses that exist within that bylaw.

This week will be an educational blitz with enforcement starting next week.

There is no doubt that most pet owners in the Princeton area are responsible, but there are also some who aren't and Riley wants to give each and every pet owner a chance to learn what habits could result in a fine.

Five sections of Animal Control Bylaw 782-2006 will be focused on during Pet Awareness Week, which will centre primarily on Bridge Street and Vermilion Avenue along with the side streets that run off of those two major arteries.

Local Arts Council receives grant

More than \$6.9 million is being provided to 277 artists, museums and arts organizations in 97 British Columbia communities as part of the latest round of successful BC Arts Council grant adjudications.

Princeton's Community Arts Council is the only local recipient in this round of grants. They will receive a total of \$14-thousand.

Highlights of this most recent fund-

ing includes:

- \$1.47 million to museums
 - Almost \$900,000 to 71 community arts councils
 - \$780,000 towards professional arts festivals
 - \$1.95 million to 31 visual arts organizations
 - \$430,000 to 50 creative writers
- These most recent awards are a result of applications examined by

the BC Arts Council's independent peer-review process between November 1, 2014 and January 31, 2015.

The funding is part of the \$24 million provided to the BC Arts Council by the Government of British Columbia to support the province's arts and culture sector in 2014-2015.

As British Columbia's lead agency for arts funding and development,

the BC Arts Council enlists the expertise of the province's artistic community to evaluate grant applications independent of government.

Community, Sport and Cultural Development Minister Coralee Oakes states, "Arts and culture are key building blocks for creative and vibrant communities and they are essential to our quality of life and competitiveness. The arts and culture sector is a significant contributor to our provincial economy and is vital in the promotion of British Columbia as a prime location to visit, work, live and invest."

BC Arts Council chair Stan Hamilton adds, "With the invaluable assistance from dedicated participants of the independent review process, the BC Arts Council works to support our province's outstanding artistic talent thanks to funding from the Government of British Columbia. This public investment helps foster and promote the creation and enjoyment of the arts for

the benefit of all."

Quick Facts:

Again this year, the Government of British Columbia is providing \$24 million for the BC Arts Council - the highest level of funding in the council's history. Overall, the Government of British Columbia invested \$60 million in BC's artists, arts organizations and cultural institutions in 2014-2015.

Last year, council approved in excess of 1,000 grants in more than 200 communities in every region of the province.

Since 2001, the Government of British Columbia has provided more than half a billion dollars for arts and culture in B.C.

Fat dogs take note

The annual Fat Dog 120 Race will be using Princeton as their race headquarters this year. The ultra marathon takes place from August 13 to 16 and is open to a total of 225 runners.

According to Recreation, Culture & Tourism Coordinator Nadine McEwen, this year's event had 70-percent of it's registrants as of January 18th.

In her report to Town Council on February 2nd she noted, "Fat Dog attracts racers looking for stunning views, daunting distances and unique challenges."

This year's field of runners includes participants from not just Canada. Some will be traveling from as far away as Peru, Mexico and throughout the United States.

"The 120 miles of the Fat Dog Race spans provincial parks adja-

cent to Princeton including Cathedral, Cascades, Skagit and Manning Park."

Princeton will welcome Fat Dog racers, volunteers and organizers on August 13th at Riverside Centre and they will arrive in town that afternoon and evening. A shuttle will transport all involved to the start of the race the following morning. The start will be on Ashnola Road near Keremeos.

"Fat Dog organizers are promoting Princeton this year as the place to stay and visit," McEwen says.

"Local Princeton businesses have come on board and are supporting this event."

There is a local Princeton volunteer team who will be operating an aid station along the race route. Racers who check in will receive a dinner meal pass, first aid attention and encouragement. The aid stations along the route select a theme and this year the local volunteers will be using "Welcome to Princeton" as their theme.

The Fat Dog 120 ultra marathon started in 2011 and is considered a world-class event that has been classified as one of North America's toughest running races. It is rated 9th overall in the toughest ultra marathon challenges in the world listing.

My Turn...

An Old Memory I Carry

I often think about the first time I watched what was then known as pay television. It was exactly thirty-two years ago this month when Canada's first-ever pay channel hit the air. It became a reality in 1982 when the CRTC commissioned the channel, at the time known as Super Channel, along with a handful of smaller niche channels that have mostly since disappeared.

I remember living in Penticton at the time that Super Channel was going to launch Canadian television programming into the future. It was at 12 midnight on February 1, 1983 when the much promoted first event of a live concert featuring The Who put Super Channel into the minds of many Canadians who had heard of pay-TV from satellite viewing of such wild feeds from over the border.

That, by the way, was a long, long time before mini dishes.

It was truly the start of something amazing in the world of television in Canada and simply miles beyond the very first television channels that signed on in Montreal and Toronto in 1952.

We disconnected our mini dish a number of years ago, so in a way I'm completely out of the loop on what is happening with television programming these days. I felt as if I had made a major breakthrough this month when I was listening to the SuperBowl live on my laptop computer at home as I worked on a couple of freelance projects.

I guess what I'm getting at here is that we are living in a pretty amazing age of technology. In just sixty-three years television alone went from the first black and white signals to mini dishes and streaming feeds you can watch on a handheld device. That's just what's happened in television.

When I look at my office and see I have three different generations of computers I use I shake my head. If I had been born one generation before I may have missed out on such things as tablets and wifi.

I think maybe that's why I think back to the Who concert I watched on Super Channel so many years ago. My roommates ignored it but I remember thinking I needed to see it, although I was not a big fan of the band, simply because I knew it was going to be a significant moment in my memory bank.

Believe me, I had no idea it would become the moment I recall most when I try to measure where I am in the world of technology now and how far it has moved since then. I had no way of knowing that Super Channel would eventually lead to pay programming where there are now hundreds of channels to choose from. Nor did I know there would be channels on just about any possible topic.

All I knew was that I was witnessing something big.

Is there something in your collection of memories that stands out for you?

There's nothing wrong with revisiting them as they give us a way of measuring how far we've gone and what kinds of progress has taken place.

For me it's Super Channel. For you, it will be something else.



Garbage collection isn't rocket science, but it is risky in more ways than one. Harvest allocation ensures certainty for hunting sector

Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations Minister Steve Thomson released a revised decision on wildlife harvest allocations February 6th.

Conservation is the highest priority, and if there are concerns for the viability of a wildlife population then harvest opportunities will be reduced or even suspended. Allocations for resident and non-resident hunters are set only after conservation requirements and First Nations food, social, and ceremonial harvest opportunities have been met.

Currently, there are 34 hunts in the province that need to be allocated between resident hunters and non-resident hunters. Initially issued in December 2014, last week's decision revises allocation splits for the following hunts:

- Bull elk and either sex elk on Vancouver Island.
- Moose in the Thompson and

Omineca regions.

- Bison in the Peace.
- Bighorn sheep and grizzly bear in the Kootenays.

Overall, the number of animals transferred to guide outfitters from resident hunters as a result of the February 6th decision is about 60 animals, when compared to 2014. Of the 45,700 animals harvested by resident hunters each year in B.C., only about 8% are on allocation.

Thomson has also committed to a review of the thinhorn sheep hunt and "either-sex elk hunt" in agricultural portions of the Peace by fall 2015.

Other elements of the December decision remain. Specifically, the wildlife harvest allocation policy ensures:

- By regionally tailoring the allocation decision, impacts on resident hunters are minimized. Resident hunters will continue to receive

priority shares of the wildlife allocation, with a stable and predictable percentage.

- Vacant areas and areas not currently allocated to guides will continue to be maintained as unguided areas, and available for resident hunting.

- The decision to have clear and legislated splits for each harvest will result in less discretion in the hands of regional managers - and therefore more certainty for all user groups. Until legislative amendments can be made, the allocation splits will be set in policy.

- Targeted increased shares of allocation for guide outfitters to help ensure the guide outfitter industry remains economically viable.


The Harvest Allocation Policy Review project began in 2003. Its goal was to give certainty to both resident and non-resident user groups in how wildlife allocations were made to each group. The previous wildlife harvest allocation policy had been transitionally in place since 2007, with the most recent changes coming in 2012.

Over the last few years, ministry staff have worked closely with the BC Wildlife Federation on a number of programs and policies to benefit their members. In addition

Where Did The Vision Go?

There is a book about the history of the use of lysergic acid, better known as LSD. This hallucinogenic drug was manufactured from ergot, a mold that infests rye grain. Its poisonous effects have been known through history. A researcher refined the drug and was unaware of its properties until he spilled a few drops on his hand and become intoxicated.

After the Second World War, researchers began a serious study of LSD, hoping to find a drug that could be used as an interrogation tool. The goal was to put the interrogation subject into a state in which he or she would talk and hopefully forget what was said. LSD was not that drug.

The next step was to see if it could be used as a weapon, by putting it in a city's drinking water. That did not work either, because the chlorine in the water neutralized LSD.

The CIA set up MK-ULTRA, a highly secret research project in

which unsuspecting persons were subjected to LSD. It was used on army personnel, prisoners and patients in mental hospitals.

In the meantime, a wide variety of upper echelon government employees and elected officials in Washington and Britain were using the drug and reporting wonderful experiences that opened their minds to a new vision of the world. They urged others to try the drug, but these were the elite people of government and their friends, and they did not want to see it being used by the masses. In this respect, it was something like a cult for the elite.

Lysergic acid is a very unpredictable toxin. One person may take it and claim to have had mind-expanding visions, while another may experience terror and depression. Lysergic acid concentrates in the liver and kidneys, and about only three percent of it gets into the brain. If more gets into the brain, there can be serious consequences, so early users took the drug under controlled conditions.

When LSD became a street drug, the effects depended on who was making it and how potent the dose was. There were those who experienced the psychedelic effects as positive, but others experienced the terrifying or depressing effects of the drug. Some people died, some were left with serious nerve damage, and some underwent radical behavioral changes which messed up their lives. These were the casualties. A CIA agent was making LSD available to university students, but drug peddlers

were taking it to the streets.

Eventually, LSD was outlawed, despite the claims that it increased creativity and made people more peaceful. At the music festival in Woodstock, the huge gathering was peaceful despite bad weather and crowding, but those observing the situation said it was relatively peaceful because nearly everybody was stoned out of their minds, incapable of creating a disturbance. For those suffering from the bad effects, a local medical clinic intervened to provide help.

MK-ULTRA was shut down in the late 1970s, but lawsuits followed press exposure of the operation. Numerous people came forward to sue the American government for the permanent damage LSD had done to them when they were unwitting guinea pigs in LSD research.

Lysergic acid has much the same effect as mescaline, loco weed and magic mushrooms, although LSD is more powerful. Those who promoted the use of hallucinogens for visionary purposes made great claims about the positive effects on their way of seeing the world. A whole generation of young people born between 1945 and 1955 made statements praising the hallucinogens, particularly LSD. They said they would change the world for the better because of those experiences.

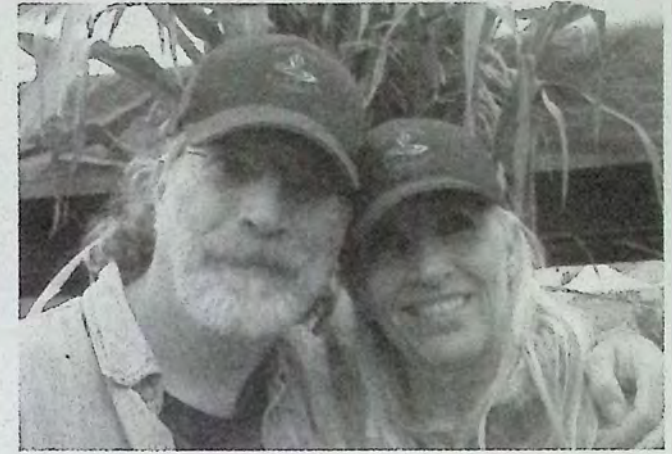
Where is that vision now? Those people are now old age pensioners, and I believe we can estimate whether or not our world is that much better a place in which tocontinued on Page 18

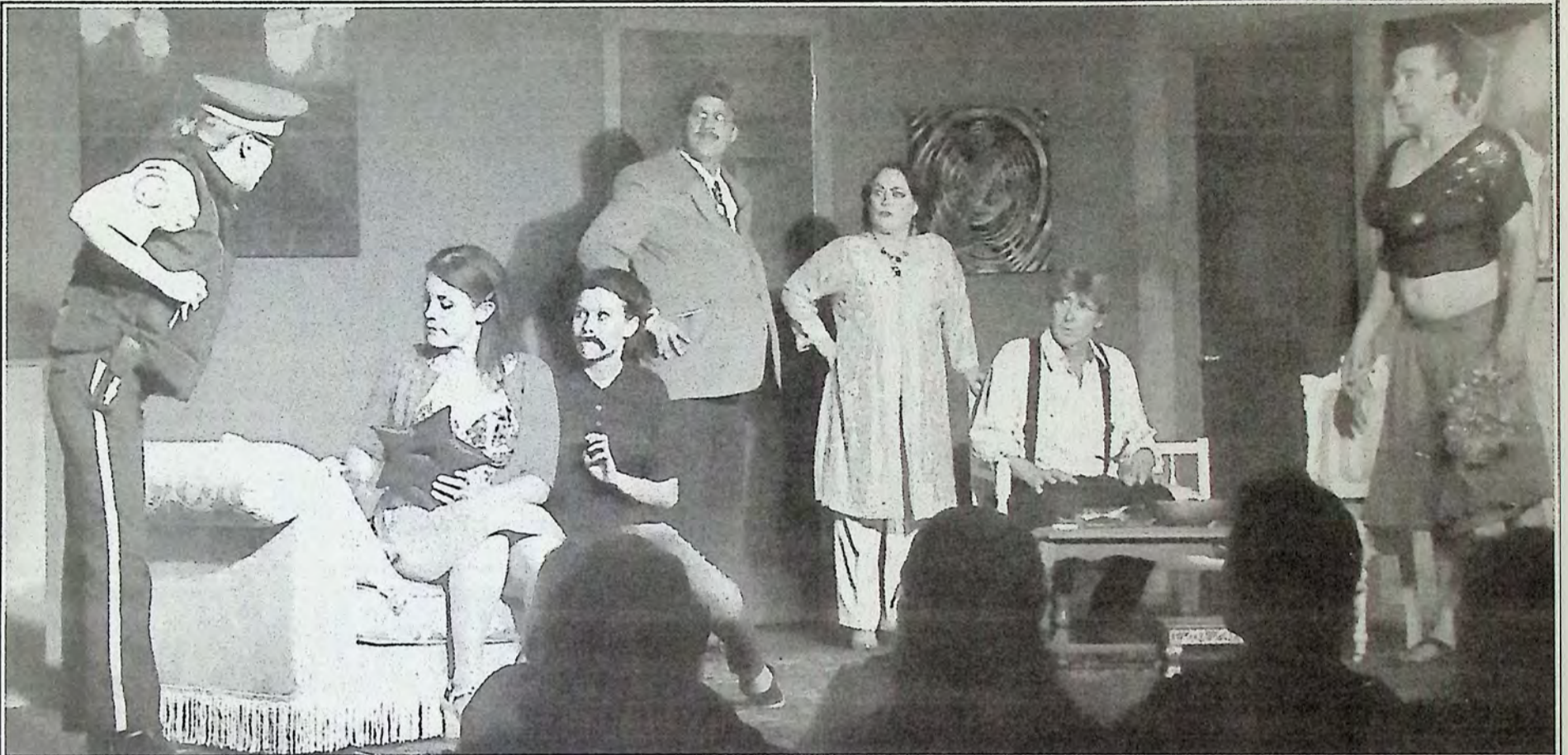

The Affordable Childcare Plan

NDP leader Tom Mulcair has recently launched a plan for affordable childcare in Canada. It is no secret that Quebec has the most

affordable childcare in the country, and Tom, as a former Quebec cabinet minister, witnessed the success affordable childcare played in help-

ing families and boosting the economy of the province. His plan would build on the Quebec model to bring quality, accessible childcare to all of Canada.

Compared with some European and English-speaking countries, the employment rate for women in Canada is high - at about 75 percent. Both parents work in two-thirds of Canadian families. There are currently 900,000 Canadian children in need of care with no access to regulated affordable spaces. Some families pay thousands of dollars every month for licensed childcare - more than they pay in rent or for their mortgages.

Tom's plan anticipates creating one million new spaces over the eight year phase-in period and reducing parents' costs to no more than \$15 per day for each child. Recognizing that delivery of childcare is regulated provincially, the NDP will consult with provinces, territories and indigenous communities in the development of a childcare strategy that will work for all stakeholders.

The initial annual investment of 1.9 billion dollars will fund 370,000 new spaces. After eight years the annual federal investment in childcare will have increased by \$5 billion. Costly, yes, but over and above the obvious benefits to parents, the economist Pierre Fortin asserts that the program will be self-financing. A TD Bank research survey suggests that for every \$1.00 invested in early childhood education, the benefits to federal and provincial governments range from \$1.49 to \$2.78 in increased tax revenues and decreased social spending.

Living Past 100

Food Costs Rising Cause Change

The cost of food rose eight percent in the United States last year. Many families have had to turn to low-cost foods of questionable nutritional value. The percentage of increase in food costs in Canada may not be the same, but everybody who buys a package of meat or a dozen eggs or a head of lettuce knows how much prices have risen.

In the United States, there are a number of organizations promoting growing food at home. The back yard is now being looked at as a food resource rather than a playground for the kids. The question for many poor people living in apartments is "how can we beat the rising costs?"

The first step in making sure you keep food costs down is to buy few carbohydrates such as sugary breakfast foods. Buying a big bag of oatmeal costs the same as one family size box of dry cereal and lasts twice as long. Making traditional foods at home costs less. For example, making chili con carne is not expensive and nutritional value is high. The same is true for pork and beans, and for stew.

Some vegetables are more expensive than others. One kilo of spinach costs much more than one kilo of turnip or carrots, and the turnip or carrots will provide more meals.

Nobody needs cake, donuts, cookies, or ice cream. These foods are not "needs", they are just "treats". When food prices are rising, eliminate treats and focus on food value for every dollar spent.

Soup made at home has less salt than canned soup, and making soup is easy. A big pot of soup can be made using little meat, lots of vegetables, dried beans, rice or barley.

Potatoes, carrots and onions are nutritious and generally less expensive than hot-house and imported vegetables.

Even with cost-cutting at the grocery store, growing some of your own food makes sense. You can grow green onions in a pot indoors by using onion sets. An apartment with a balcony is a great place for a container garden and is not very expensive to start.

Growing food in your back yard is more expensive to begin with, because you need a good fence and tools for gardening, but the produce you can raise will pay you back in savings from the supermarket. You will be amazed at how much you can grow in even a small garden space. If you have never planted a garden before, talk to good gardeners or go on internet for tips on gardening. Look for gardening tips from places with the same climate as yours.

Many communities allow back yard chickens. Three or four chickens will provide you with all the eggs you want. Eggs can be eaten instead of meat, and can be used in many ways. Chickens will eat all of your kitchen scraps, all of the weeds you pull and all of your grass clippings. Chicken feed is available at feed stores, and you may have to buy more feed in winter. For more information, look up back yard chickens on internet.

Princeton did score again during the game.

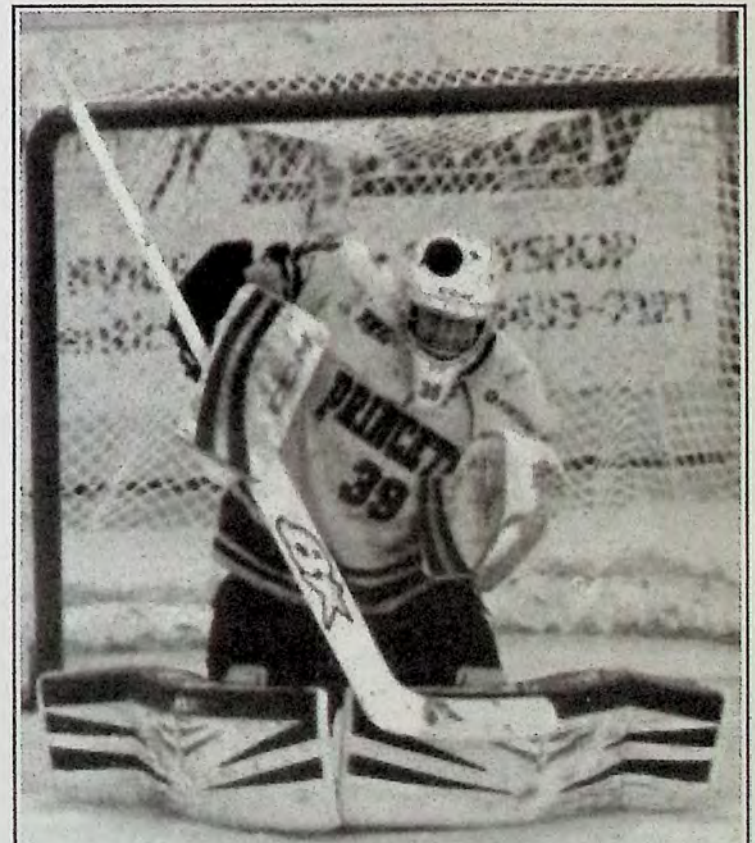
It was a power play goal with 1:44 left to play that was credited to Cody Lassiter with assistance from Keith Come.

Community pride.

Either you have it or you don't. Sometimes it's a hard thing to pin down but when you get upset about something that casts a negative light on Princeton (and area) it is because you are proud of your community.

If I were forced to list a number of things that make me proud of Princeton and the Similkameen there would be many. I would have to include (in no particular order) the number talented people who live in our valley as one of the top assets. I'm talking about everything

thing from academic to cultural, arts and crafts. There are a number of uniquely qualified people living in and around the community who have had a hand in putting their personal fingerprint on the character of the region.

I would have to include how friendly people are and the way residents band together to help others in genuine need in the community. The annual Christmas Hamper Drive is evidence of this as well as how neighbours helped neighbours during the power outage in late November following the first heavy snowfall of the season that broke tree branches and knocked out power lines all over the region.

Another sign of community pride is how people keep their businesses and private yards clean and tidy. I've mentioned it here before but one thing I notice when I'm in a different community is how clean the downtown streets are. When I make a comparison I have to give

the Princeton Public Works department heaps of praise on the job they do to keep our streets and sidewalks clean. A few communities not far from here could learn a lot from their example.

Speaking of clean sidewalks, and as a downtown business owner, nothing gets my attention quicker than a deposit left behind by a four-legged pet on the sidewalk that goes past our front door. We have put a lot of effort into keeping our 'main street frontage' clear of snow and ice all winter. It means we'll also likely have our share of dog poop to clean up as well when the seasons change.

Lucky for us the Town of Princeton is getting a bit tougher on the bylaws that deal with dogs in our community. We are no longer dog owners ourselves, but when we were, we were always prepared to clean up after our pets and found it quite easy to do. I know how it feels to find a fresh pile sitting out-

side my office, so the last thing I would do is teach my dog to leave a deposit somewhere else.

Yup, dog poop on the sidewalk is a pet peeve of mine and as such shows that I do have some community pride.

This week the bylaw enforcement department is educating dog owners on the importance of cleaning up after Fido or Fifi. The particular focus is being concentrated on the two main streets (Bridge Street and Vermillion Avenue) and side streets that run off of those two routes. In other words, the downtown core is going to be combed and educated.

What I like most about that is that if we are trying to make our community attractive to visitors, it has to start somewhere. Call it the Poop Patrol if you must but the whole point here is that if those dog owners who aren't being responsible with their pets start to change their habits it contributes to a much,continued on Page 18

Harvest allocation ensures certainty for hunting sector

.....continued from Page 4 to working on a hunter recruitment strategy to increase the number of resident hunters from 82,000 to over 102,000, the ministry has done the following:

- Formed the Provincial Hunting and Trapping Advisory Committee and regional hunting committees to ensure that proposed changes to wildlife management regulations receive comprehensive stakeholder review.
- Invested more than \$750,000 since 2011 in inventorying big game including deer, elk, goat, sheep, moose and caribou.
- Have undertaken a comprehensive five-year moose study that will

investigate the declines, determine what is causing them and what can be done to reverse them.

- Committed to the hunter licensing transformation project, which once complete in 2016, will allow hunters to make all licensing transactions online 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations Minister Steve Thomson said, "I made slight revisions to the hunts for moose, bighorn sheep, grizzly bear, Roosevelt elk and bison to address the concerns I heard after the decision was released. I now look forward to working with the BC Wildlife Federation and Guide

Outfitters Association of B.C. on ways we can all work more effectively together on wildlife management."

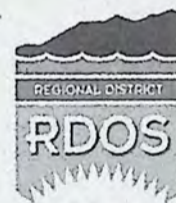

 Most Canadians don't equate affordable childcare with growth in the national economy, but the accessibility of childcare plays a significant role in labour force participation, particularly for women. David MacDonald, a senior economist

with the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives, has found that when parents are given an affordable childcare option, as in Quebec, they overwhelmingly choose to work. Contrast this with income splitting, the tax incentive being implemented by the current federal government.

In other countries where income splitting has been introduced, participation by women in the workforce goes down with no comparable increase in men's participation. The consequence is a smaller labour force which ultimately slows economic growth.

In the last nine years costs for childcare have skyrocketed. BC has among the highest fees in Canada, and in many households with infants or very young children both parents cannot afford to work. Even if they could find licensed childcare space, their cost per child could be as high as 35 percent of their income.

My colleagues in the NDP have a plan for a national program of quality, affordable childcare that will help to keep parents in the workforce, supporting their families and giving their children the best possible start in life. The benefits of investing in childcare are far reaching. It is time for Canada to make a real commitment.
