Library boss explains Princeton problem

Stephanie Hall, CEO of Okanagan Regional Library, attended the February 16 Town Council meeting to explain why Princeton should have its library hours cut. It is all about who gets what for the taxes they pay.

Princeton pays \$108,000 into the regional system, but receives \$169,000 worth of services (including rent). The regional budget calls

for a \$17,000 decrease in funding, which results in cutting three hours from the librarian and nine hours from the assistant librarian. The library would be open five hours less per week.

Councillor Jerome Tjerkstra asked whether Area H opting into the system would bring up Princeton's contribution to the system. Hall said it would eliminate the shortfall in revenues.

Part of the problem is the funding from the provincial government, which provides some funding for rural libraries. Although costs have increased, the provincial government funds have not increased.

Councillor Rosemary Doughty said she does not want to see library hours cut.

"It seems we have to struggle to hold on to what we've got," she told Hall.

Mayor Frank Armitage noted a 25 percent cut in services and asked when this would be implemented.

Hall said she hopes to have a public meeting in approximately a month to hear how the public feels about the proposed cutback in service.

Princeton's library use has increased during the past two years. There are 30,000 visits to the

PXA approves events, plans

Motorsports receives green light

Princeton Exhibition Association has approved a proposal for a motor sports event at the fairgrounds on Labour Day weekend. Prior discussions of conditions to be met by the proponent led to a unanimous 'yes' vote at the February 17 meeting.

A key condition is the restoration of the rodeo arena immediately after the demolition derby, as the arena must be ready for the equestrian

event being held in conjunction with the Fall Fair the following weekend.

In addition to a demolition derby, the motor sports event will feature mud racing. The mud racing pits will be constructed during coming months.

Riding Club idea earns support
Princeton Riding Club wants to build an equestrian riding course on the fairgrounds property, utilizing

land not currently designated for any use. The course would include obstacles, challenges and natural terrain. Stephanie Antonick, speaking for the club, attended the February 17 meeting of Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA) to explain the concept and the potential for future use by organizations from other communities.

The proposal was met with wholehearted support from the Board of

Directors. The work on the course will be done by Princeton Riding Club members at no cost to the PXA. Paul Bedard, President of the PXA, will ride the proposed course with Antonick to get a clear perspective of the project and to discuss some details. Riding Club members plan to begin development of the course this spring.

Princeton Riding Club suffered a tragic loss recently with the death of Bonnie Thiel, who had guided members of the club and acted as a mentor for many of the members. PXA President Bedard remarked on the loss, and announced Princeton Riding Club will do a tribute to Bonnie Thiel later this year to recognize her leadership.

Princeton attends festival

At the February 17 meeting of Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA), members approved expenses for 200 brochures which will advertise local events as well as fairgrounds facilities. Rayleen

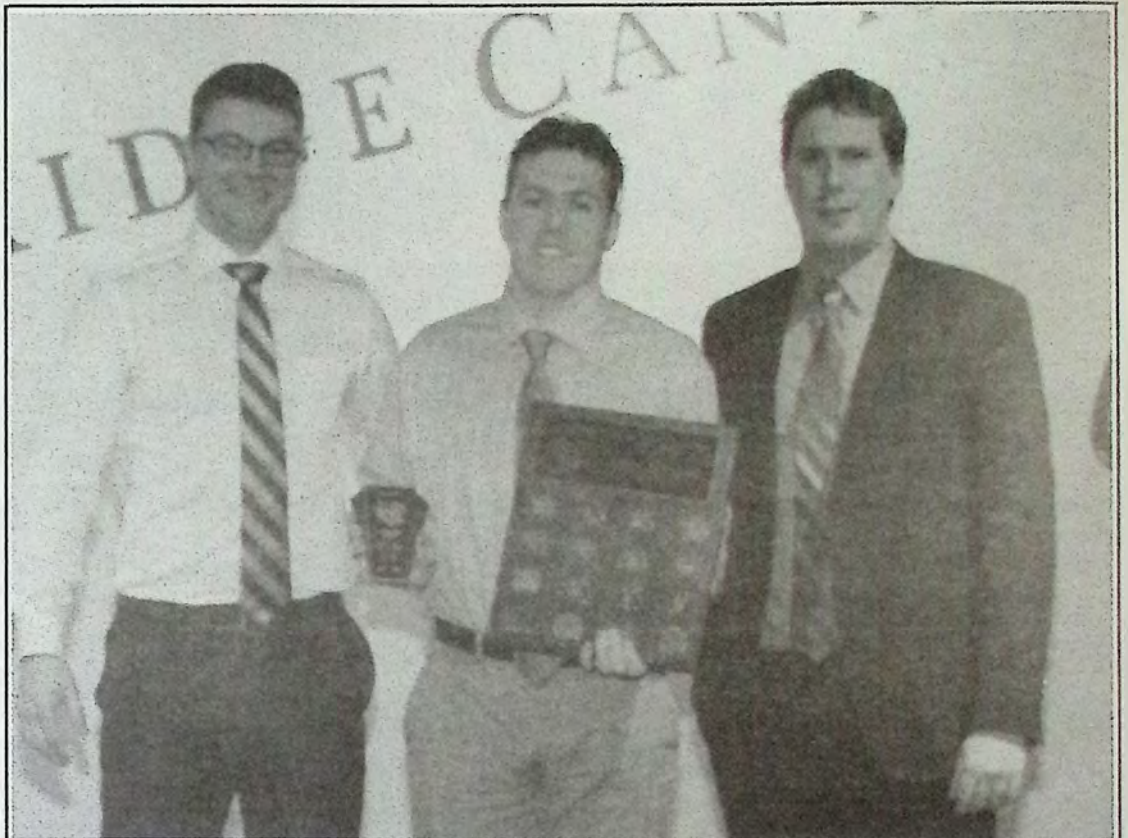

Tulameen has big plans

A representative of Tulameen Community Club, Mark Jones, attended the February 18 meeting of the Board of Education to ask whether the Board had any plans to use the old school grounds in Tulameen.

Tulameen Community Club has big plans for the grounds and has made inquiries about leasing the 28 lots.

Jones presented the Board with diagrams of how the Community Club would use the grounds. The

club wants to build a proper baseball field at one end, a playground/park at the other end, and a new community centre in the middle after the old school building is demolished.

The Ministry of Education owns the old school building, the teacherage, and the ground on which the teacherage rests, but does not own the rest of the site. The Board specified the community club must be responsible for both the demolition of the old school and the development of the property. When Jones said they would be, the Board encouraged them to move forward with their plans.

Town okays closure

Town Council has agreed to close streets around Veterans Square on June 19 - 21 for the 2015 Spirit Festival. This festival celebrates Aboriginal Day, which is held on the summer solstice. First Nations performers from across southern British Columbia will share their songs, dances, drumming and artis-

tic skills along with storytelling. A barbecue is planned for one evening. There may be some First Nations sports.

Interactive events will be part of the Spirit Festival. This event invites family participation. It is alcohol and drug free and will be policed by First Nations security.

Granite Creek scores 3rd listing

The Granite Creek Preservation Society has been a busy group since their inception in late 2013. The group announced February 19th that they had succeeded in getting the ghost town of Granite Creek on the Canadian Register of Historic Places.

"It's the third such list we have been able to get Granite on which

enables us to move forward with our preservation plans without fear of losing the work we have put into this project to date."

Granite Creek is also on similar historic place registries in British Columbia and the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen.

Elliott was returned to Chair the committee for another term at the AGM held as part of the same meeting. Diane Sterne continues as

Vice Chair, Jon Bartlett Secretary, Bob Sterne Treasurer and Directors Todd Lester and Ole Juul.

The group has an extensive online archive located at their website www.GraniteCreekBC.ca as well as minutes to all previous public meetings of the group.

The GCPS meets at 1:00 PM the third Thursday of each month in the George Kassa Research Room in Princeton Museum.

RDOS wants more tax money

The Finance Director of Regional District Okanagan Similkameen (RDOS) attended the February 16

Town Council meeting to talk about the need for a slight increase in the RDOS share of municipal property

taxes. This year, the RDOS administrative building, located in Penticton, needs renovation. This will add \$4.00 to the tax, bringing the total up to \$27 per household.

The Regional Hospital District needs \$122 million to contribute its 40 percent share of the cost of a new regional hospital.

The hospital tax will go up by \$5.00 per household in Princeton to cover Princeton's share, which is \$135,000 this year. This money will be put into a reserve fund for the eventual construction of the new hospital in Penticton.

Want To Get Chipped?

At a corporate-owned building in Sweden, called Epicenter, you can open the door to your office by putting your hand on the door. You can buy a cup of coffee with a wave of your hand and you can run a photocopier the same way. All of this is done because you have an RFID (radio frequency identification) chip under the skin in your hand.

This new technology consists of a microchip the size of a grain of rice imbedded under the skin. It is inserted much like receiving a hypodermic needle, and causes about the same amount of pain. When it is under your skin, it becomes your passport to go places and do things in any location set up to receive your signal, provided all the computers are working. Nobody knows what would happen during a power failure.

Yes, you could be constantly tracked and monitored.

The Swedish Biohacking Group is watching this chip system care-

fully. This group says it is gaining knowledge in preparation for a time when major corporations or big government decides to force everyone to be 'chipped.'

Religious groups are already calling it 'the mark of the Beast,' referring to a time written about in the Bible Book of Revelations. In Revelations, it states nobody can buy or sell anything without the mark of the Beast in his right hand or on his forehead.

I consider being chipped the ultimate invasion of personal privacy.

Of course, my privacy may be somewhat invaded right now. Chips are being put into phones, especially mobile phones, computers, Netflix, refrigerators and other appliances, video game consoles, credit cards, and almost anything you buy. Walmart has opted into microchipping its products, and its 'smart carts.' All of this is connected to internet.

Sounds far-fetched, doesn't it? However, this information is supplied by the CIA. They say you could be sitting at home watching television and any interested spy can find out what is in your refrigerator, what is in your home, and if you have a voice-activated remote control television set, they can hear what you are saying.

The main users of the chipped world are marketers who keep track of what you buy, whether you use a particular credit card or debit card, and how much you paid for each item. If your items are chipped, the trackers can find out where you take them, where you store them, and what you do

with them. Imagine taking home a bottle of shampoo which is recording how often you wash your hair!

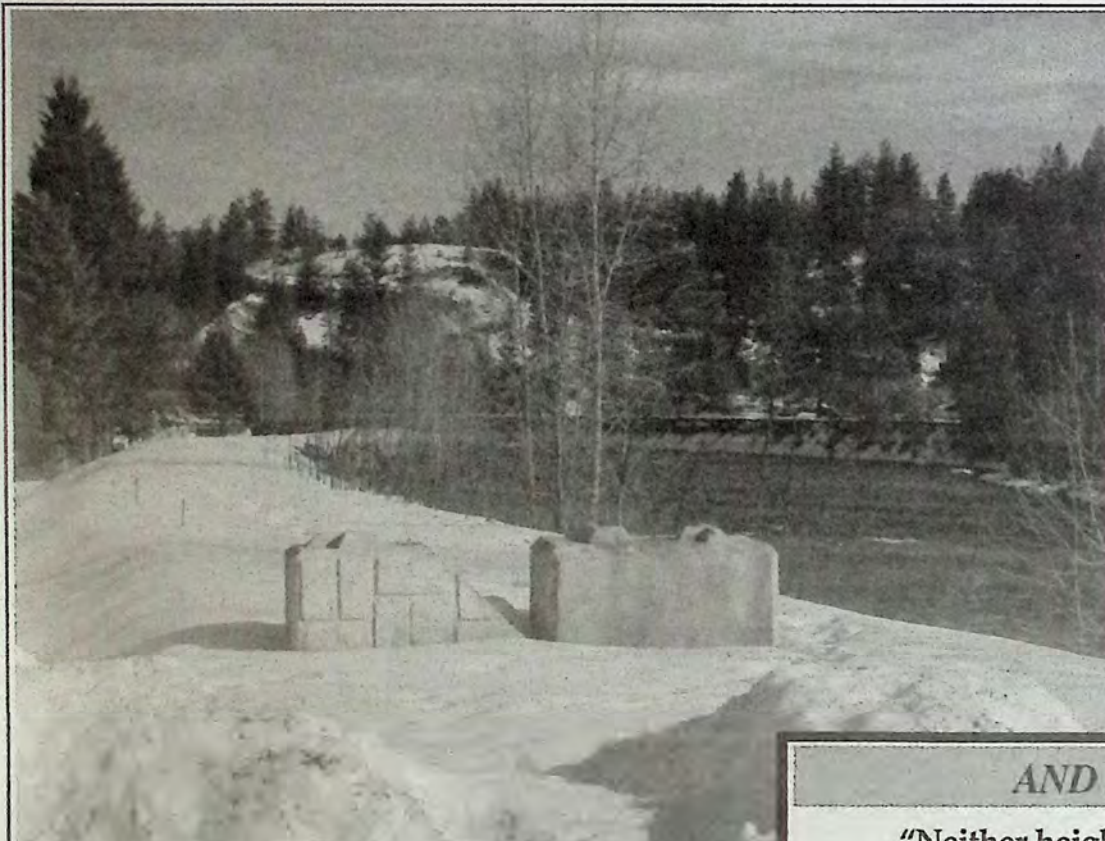
There are plans to put microchips into everything - your coffee maker, your furnace, light bulbs, and pets.

Microchipping pets is already mandatory in some locations. Cattle are being chipped, so are other livestock. Wildlife is being tracked through microchips implanted in them.

There is a danger to inserting RFID chips into livestock and humans. There is a link between these biochips and cancer in animals, although experts say the risk to humans is slight. Who knows?

The threat to personal freedom is great because these RFID chips can be used to control what you can and cannot do. If the company you work for decides all of its employees must be chipped, and you refuse, you are out of a job. The doors will be locked to you, the machines will not operate for you. It could be diabolical in everyday life. Suppose you fail to pay a parking fine, your car would not turn on because the chip in your ignition will be disabled. If you fail to pay your mortgage on time, you might be locked out of your home.

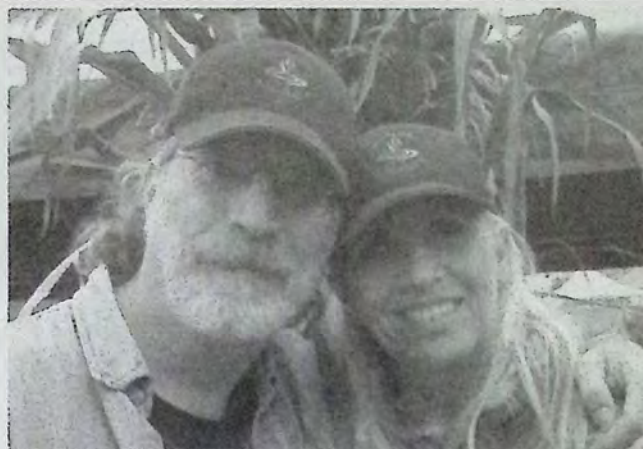
The RFID technology has almost no limits to what it can do, and right now, there are no laws to limit what can be done with these chips. What you do need to know, right now, is that new appliances are probably chipped, and new electronics are definitely chipped. You might be next.

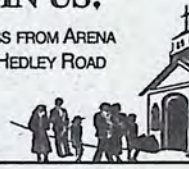

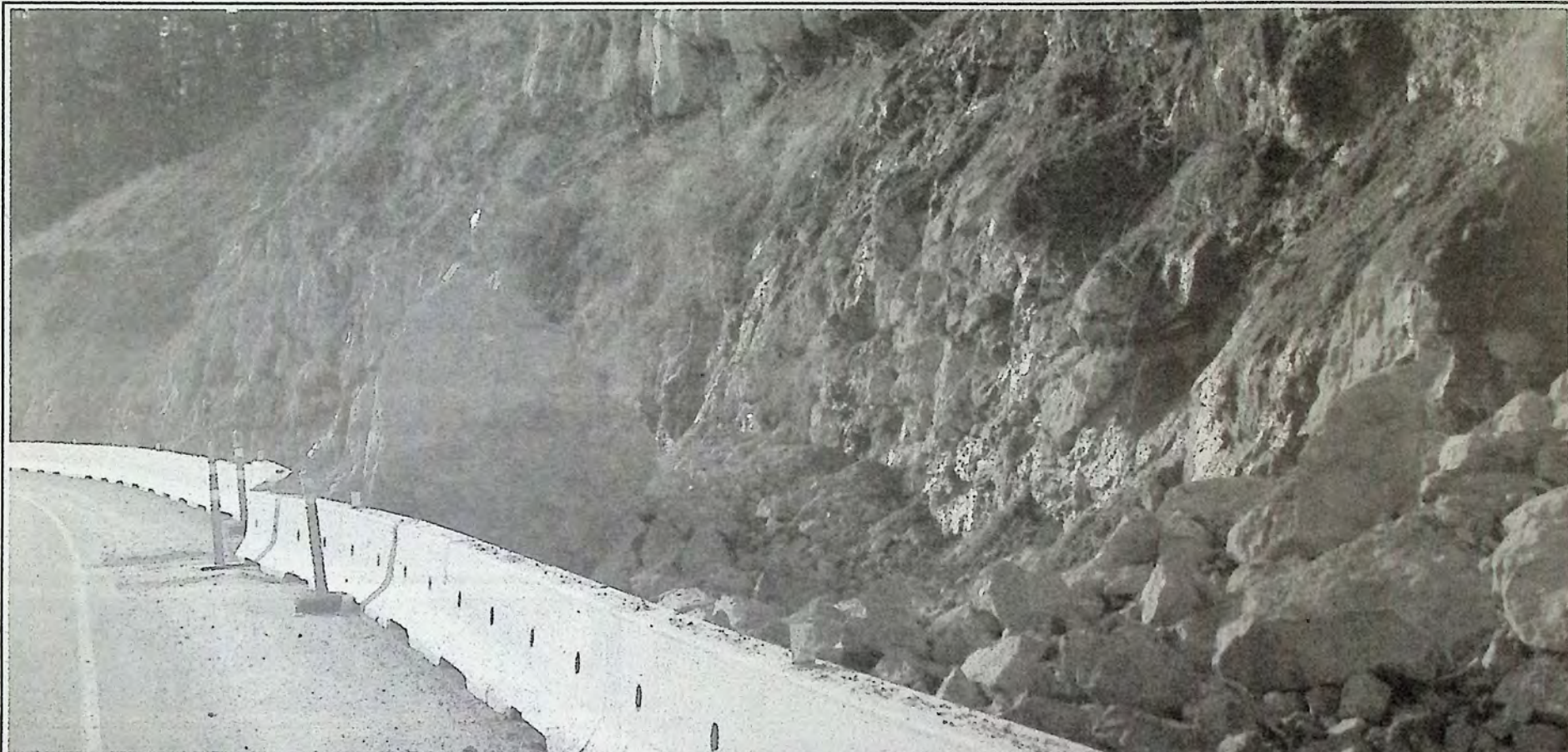

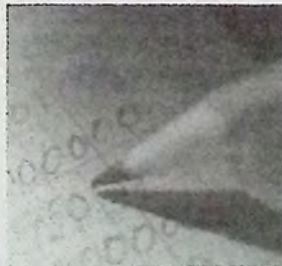

Students perform well

Princeton Secondary School students are doing remarkably well on their exams. At the end of the first semester, 97 percent passed their exams.

At the end of the second semester,

70.5 percent of the students were on the academic Honours List. This list has three parts: the Principal's list (A average), Honours (B average) and Honourable Mention (over 67 percent average).

Trustees increase benefits

Board of Education Trustees voted themselves a raise at the February 18 meeting. Trustees are paid an annual indemnity to compensate for their time and effort. Board Chair will receive \$17,000 per year, Vice-Chair will receive \$15,500, and regular Trustees will receive \$14,000.

At the same meeting, the Board approved a budget bylaw in the amount of \$28,865,990 for the 2014/2015 school year.

This is an amended budget. At the beginning of the school year,

the budget is guesswork based on the enrolment at the end of September.

By February, the situation is much clearer, and the budget is amended to reflect reality. A new budget will be created for the 2015/2016 year, again based on expected enrolment in September.

A Parent Advisory Council (PAC) budget survey is being sent to all schools, and a meeting will be held March 10 to discuss the PAC budget.

Just because the temperature soars to 20C does not mean your skin, or your whole body, can adjust to an hour of sunbathing after a winter of little sunshine. Fifteen minutes in the sun is quite enough. Do not risk a sunburn.

Remember to take your sunglasses with you as spring arrives. Protect your eyes.

Remember to consume more liquids when you are out in the sun. Your body has adapted to winter conditions, and is unprepared for a hot day.

Being sensible in springtime can set you up for a great summer!

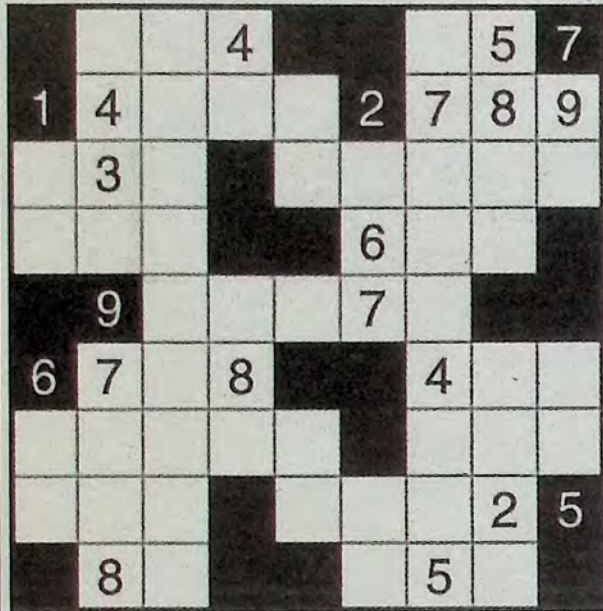

Pay more for water, sewer

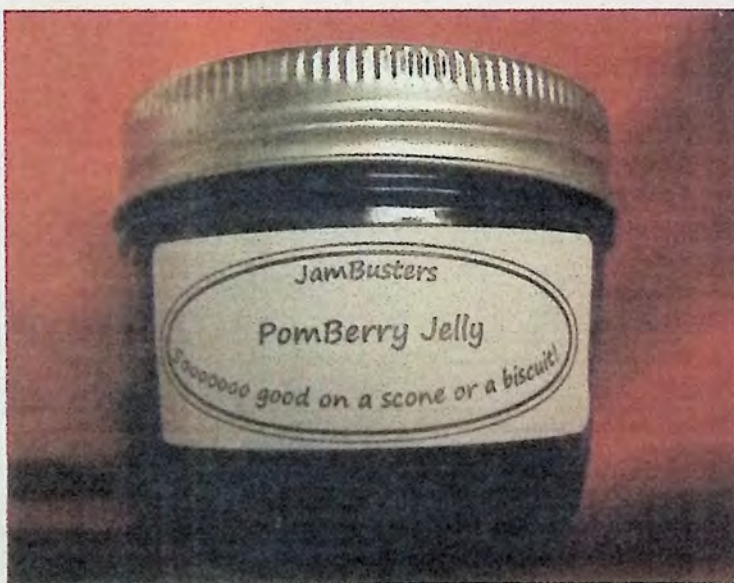

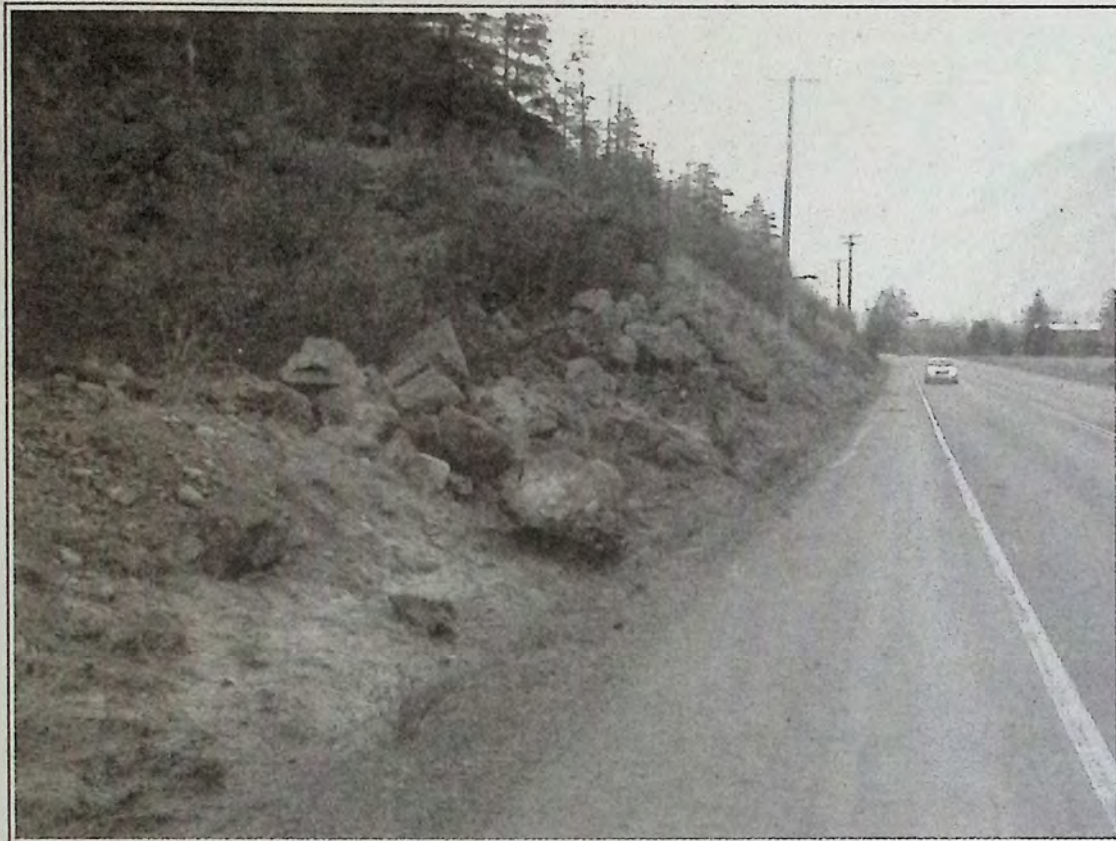

Saving Downtown Princeton...

There are a number of assets in and around the community that can have a positive effect on the downtown core.

One of them I think is the Trans-Canada Trail along the former KVR rail line. I do not own a horse, ATV,

snowmobile or dirt bike but I do walk along a short stretch of it on those days when I walk to work.

I am on the fence on the motorized/non-motorized debate as I can see it being beneficial to all users regardless of chosen mode of trans-

portation. I know that if we did not live within the Town Limits I would want to be able to travel longer stretches of the linear path on something other than my feet. As we have the trail passing by our home about 200-feet from our front door, it is easy for us to access and enjoy.

The Vermilion Trail Society deserves a ton of credit for the work they have done, along with the Town of Princeton, to beautify the section that runs through the community. I love the paved trail and especially appreciate the lighting when I'm walking home during the winter in the dark of an early evening.

I know there has been a lot of effort put into the project and I think having a section of a nationwide tourism trail pass through our community, as opposed to passing nearby the community, is something we can all benefit from.

There's no doubt a number of different racing events could be hosted

year round on the trail. I know the Terry Fox Run has been on the trail in previous years but I'm thinking about anything from major snowmobile poker runs to horse relay races to bike and foot races with Princeton being used as one of the stops along the race route.

Part of my idea here would also keep Princeton in place as a racing community. I truly believe that the loss of Princeton Racing Days (the horse racing part) needs to be replaced with other forms of racing and what better way of drawing more communities and racers from outside our region than to use the Trans-Canada Trail as part of a race event?

Forgive me for thinking outside the box but those six words I hear often that slow down a lot of progress are 'We've always done it this way' and I think in order for our community to stand out and gain attention is to look a bit beyond what we have always done.

For those who are dead set against anything with gas, a motor and grease on the section of the Trans-Canada Trail that passes through Princeton why not explore dog races? A reader was in our office a couple weeks ago filled with stories of such an event in the Yukon.

I think that if we just let the trail sit and not turn it into a larger asset than it already is, it will never become much more than just a pretty path. Too much energy and money has gone into the project to have it turn into nothing more. I'm convinced the full potential of the Trans-Canada Trail will involve allowing access to users who may turn it into a bigger asset than it already is through value-added usage.

How does this save downtown Princeton?

A New Session Gets Underway

The start of a new session of the B.C. Parliament is always a busy and exciting time in Victoria.

The legislature is again buzzing with activity which started February 10 with the Speech from the Throne, which outlined the government's plan for the coming year, and was followed by the release of the provincial budget on February 17.

We are proud of the fact that B.C. is the envy of other jurisdictions in Canada, we are the only government in Canada to deliver a budget surplus this year.

For that we can thank our province's diversified economy. Unlike our neighbours in Alberta, which is impacted by the drop in world oil prices, demand for B.C.'s products internationally remains strong.

For example, since 2003 we have

seen a 30-fold increase in the value of B.C. softwood lumber exports to China. That makes us less dependent on the U.S. market, which is still our largest customer for lumber.

Of particular interest to people in areas around Princeton is a promise in the budget to expand high-speed Internet to rural areas. This will give more people access to things such as online courses to further their education, and Telehealth, which puts patients in rural and remote areas in touch with health professionals without having to travel great distances.

There is also help for children and families in this budget. As of September 1, low-income single parents will get to keep every dollar of their child-support payments, additional funds have been provided for B.C. School Fruit and

Vegetable Program, and an additional \$250 children's fitness equipment tax credit to take a bit of pressure off of parents.

We've always said our commitment to health care is world class, now we have confirmation. The Conference Board of Canada ranks B.C. No. 1 in Canada on health performance, and around the world only Switzerland and Sweden ranked higher than our province.

In short, life in British Columbia is good and getting better.

Ministry audits special ed performance

In early February, a team of auditors reviewed the performance of Special Education in our local school district. This preliminary audit reviews student files to find whether the district is in compliance with Ministry of Education requirements that must be met to receive funding. A review of 131 files revealed 128 were in compliance with Ministry requirements. The three non-compliant files were the result of circumstances of individual students' lives.

The district was able to retain most of its funding. The audit team was highly complimentary of the work being done in the district for special education students.

That, by the way, is the only reason any community in the world hosts a local celebration 'to foster goodwill and attract tourists' so if we want to attract new people to Princeton we need to make better use of the assets that already exist. The former Riverside Intermediate School is an example of turning an asset into a bigger one through value-added repurposing.

The Riverside Community Centre is evidence of what that can look

like.

The Trans-Canada Trail passing through Princeton is part of a Canada-wide trail system. The section within Town Limits (I think is 4-kilometres or less) is paved and lined with lights. Focusing on it as a potential track for various forms of racing will bring people to the community who may never have stopped here before.

New people in the community will take advantage of local services, which includes the downtown core.
