CMMC announces Q1 financials

Copper Mountain Mining Corporation (TSX: CUM) (the "Company" or "Copper Mountain") announced April 27th revenues of \$71.5 million after pricing adjustments and treatment charges for the quarter ended March 31, 2015 from the sale of 21.5 million pounds of copper, 7,600 ounces of gold, and 92,700 ounces of silver.

Jim O'Rourke, President and CEO of Copper Mountain, remarked, "We are very pleased with the increased SAG mill throughput

being achieved with the finer feed from the new \$40 million permanent secondary crusher. Mill throughput of 37,780tpd average for the first 22 days of April is a 29% increase in tonnage over the first quarter of last year and 14% improvement over the current quarter. The steady improvements in mill throughput and reduced site operating costs achieved this quarter position the Company well going forward."

O'Rourke continued, "Looking forward, we see the next twelve

months as a period of continued optimization to further strengthen our operating base. Production for 2015 will come mainly from the Pit 2 area and therefore we are anticipating higher gold production. We have a strong operating team and I am confident that the mine will meet our production goals."

During the quarter, the company completed four shipments of concentrate containing approximately 21.5 million pounds of copper to Japan for smelting and recorded revenues, net of smelter charges and pricing adjustments, of \$71.5 million, realizing a gross profit of \$6.7 million. The total cash cost of copper sold for the quarter ended March 31, 2015 were lower than planned at US\$1.77 per pound of copper net of gold and silver by-product credits as a result of cost cutting measures taken at the mine site.

Mining activities continued in the Pit 2 and Pit 3 areas throughout the quarter. Phase 2 of Pit #3 was com-

pleted during the quarter and the start of the Phase 3 pushback on the west side of Pit #3 commenced. Mining in Pit #2 area is progressing well and the majority of ore will be supplied from the Pit 2 area for the balance of 2015. Copper head grade for the year is forecasted to be on average 0.33% copper, but because of the higher gold content in the Pit 2 ore the copper equivalent grade is approximately 0.41% copper. The recently installed mine dispatch system continues to be a valuable tool to maximize haulage truck load factors and improve mining efficiencies. During the quarter a total of 14.7 million tonnes of material was mined, including 5.6 million tonnes of ore and 9.1 million tonnes of waste. The mining rate at the end of the period was in the range of 165,000 tonnes per day moved. As a result of cost cutting measures taken early in the quarter site cash costs were lower than planned at US\$1.21 per pound of copper after gold and sil-

ver by-product credits.

Mill throughput from the concentrator improved approximately 13.5% during the quarter as compared to the first quarter of 2014. During the first quarter of 2015 the SAG mill throughput averaged 33,200 tpd as compared to 29,300 tpd for the first quarter of 2014. The increase in throughput is directly attributable to the installation of the new \$40 million secondary crusher that is operating at its designed rate and crushing ore to minus two inches which allows the SAG mill to operate at rates above its designed capacity.

During the quarter the mill processed a total of 2.9 millioncontinued on Page 2

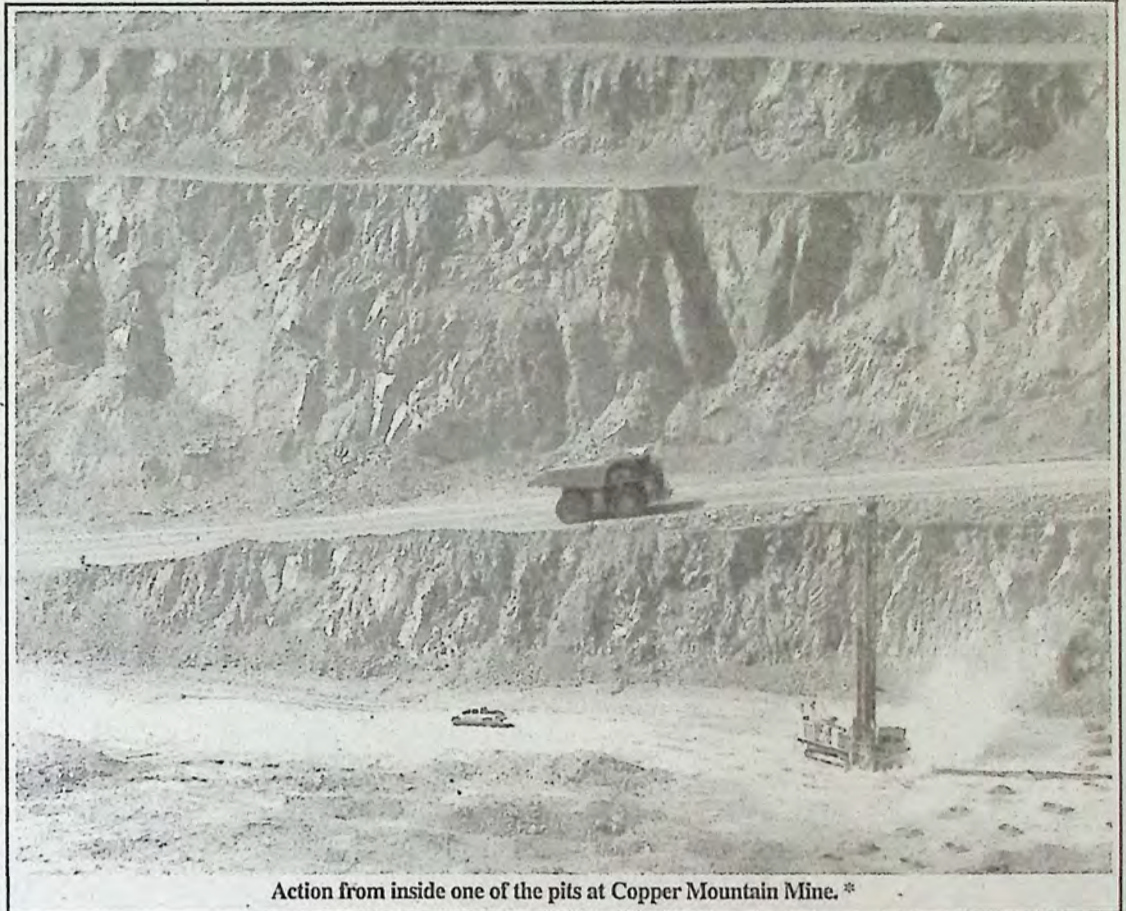

.....continued from Front Page tonnes of ore at an average grade of 0.35% copper to produce 18.4 million pounds of copper, 7,800 ounces of gold, and 80,300 ounces of silver. SAG Mill availability was 93.2% during the first quarter, slightly above the 92% target. Copper recovery averaged 80.6% which was lower than plan, primarily due to outages of the regrind and one ball mill during part of the period. Once these limitations to processing were rectified in late March, the mill achieved an all time throughput record of 45,939 tpd in early April, thus providing management with the confidence that the budget rate of 37,500 tpd is achievable.

At the Copper Mountain site the Company completed a detailed helicopter-borne magnetics and radiometric geophysical survey over most of the mine property. Three dimensional inversions of the magnetic data have recently been completed and this data is being compiled together with new geological mapping and the existing Titan 24 3-D chargeability data. The inversion technology is being used to provide a three dimensional model of various rock units and

alteration zones in order to help define and prioritize drill targets, particularly those targeting mineralization at depth. Additionally, petrographic and geochemical studies in conjunction with the Mineral Deposits Research Unit at the University of British Columbia have been carried out examining the mineralogical changes associated with mineralization and alteration. It is anticipated that this research will contribute to a better understanding of the both the geophysical and comminution characteristics of rocks within the ore zones.

During the fourth quarter, 2014 a 1,650m fifty-five hole, shallow percussion drilling program was carried out in the Virginia pit area with results being received early in the first quarter, 2015. The drilling program was undertaken in order to: confirm resource estimation using a different drill orientation; test for surface oxidation; and obtain material for metallurgical testing in preparation for potential mining activities in this area. Drill-holes were spaced on approximate 20m centers, inclined to the north and drilled on three different benches. Results confirm the resource estimation and indicate minimal levels of oxidation within the central pit area.

Conversion of inferred resources to reserve status is the major goal of the long-term exploration plan for the potential extension of the mine life. Discovery of new mineralized areas, both open pit and underground, is also a focus of the ongoing exploration program and a requirement for long term mine planning.

The 2015 guidance remains unchanged for the balance of 2015. It is based on mining at a rate of

180,000 tonnes per day to mine a total of 16.6 million tonnes of high grade material, 13.8 million tonnes of low grade material, 37 million tonnes of waste at a strip ratio of 1.22 to 1. Mining costs are estimated to be \$1.75 per tonne mined. Mill production is based on achieving 37,500 tpd through the mill at an average head grade of 0.33% Cu (0.41% CuEq) and recoveries of 82% to produce about 100 million pounds of copper equivalent which includes about 80 million pounds of copper, 35,000 ounces of gold, and 290,000 ounces of silver.

About Copper Mountain Mining Corporation:

Copper Mountain's flagship asset is the 75% owned Copper Mountain mine located in southern British Columbia near the town of Princeton. The Company has a strategic alliance with Mitsubishi Materials Corporation who owns the remaining 25%. The Copper Mountain mine commenced production in the latter half of 2011, and has continued to improve its operations. The key development for 2014 was the installation of the secondary crusher as a permanent solution to maximize concentrator throughput and improve overall efficiencies for the company. Secondary crusher construction was completed by the end of July 2014 on budget and on schedule. The 18,000 acre site has a large resource of copper that remains open laterally and at depth. The mine has significant exploration potential that will need to be explored over the next few years to fully appreciate the property's full development potential.

Flip Of The Coyne

If you haven't been following the Provincial election in Alberta you are missing history in the making. As of the last poll, the New Democrats were leading with 44% and the Wild Rose was in second with 26%. Your Call Cannot Be Completed...

The Coalmont payphone story has been interesting to me. And lucky for me residents in the area have been kind enough to keep me in the loop with copies of e-mails sent to Telus and larger media outlets.

The part I find interesting is that something I barely paid attention to in the rare times I have been in the Coalmont area is a big issue to those affected by the loss of that form of communication. Oddly enough, it is also the same reason that I see it as a serious problem.

In the world of internet and cell phone technology Coalmont is still under served. Reports indicate that even emergency crews have difficulty transmitting and receiving vital information from the area.

That alone would make me think that Telus needs to rethink their stand about not replacing the payphone. Should a major disaster hit the Coalmont area and communication issues surface I wouldn't want to be on the receiving end of a number of phone calls to the service provider - or according to some - the service unprovider.

To their credit, Telus did hint that cell service would eventually creep into Coalmont but I doubt there will be a lot of residents keen on signing up for a three-year contract for something they used to have regular access to for far less of a commitment.

Rogers seems to be planting cell towers in areas around the region to expand their network. Possibly they could see sticking a low power mono pole (like the one in Hedley) as a great public relations move in essence kicking their competitors in the - a-hem - bells and saving the day by leaving a 'free to use' emergency cell phone somewhere sensible in Coalmont to remedy the situation.

What could turn into a major triumph by a corporation choosing to do the right thing has been lost on the emphasis on where the bottom line sits. Who cares what the traffic numbers are on any payphone? What should matter is that the residents of Coalmont can rest easy knowing that they have a link to the outside world the moment they may really need it.

Whether that's in the form of a phone booth or satellite phone link attached to the side of a building at least those customers are being served. I don't care that figures show that the payphone was rarely used (according to Telus). I don't think any of us in business in the downtown core would be willing to turn away a small percentage of our customer base because a paying customer is still a paying customer.

That is a fact I think Telus has forgotten. In the competitive world of phone communication they really aren't the only service available anymore - especially when you add cell phones and internet to the equation.

In today's business atmosphere none of us can afford to turn away any of our customers and based on that I think Telus needs to recalibrate its moral compass.

Federal Election 2015 Our Big Chance to Bring Electoral Reform

In the last dozen years eight out of nine commissions or citizen assemblies created by governments in Canada have not only advocated getting rid of our first-past-the-post (FPTP) electoral system but have recommended adopting MMP, or mixed-member-proportional representation.

In the upcoming 2015 federal election Tom Mulcair is offering Canadians a chance to change the current system by electing an NDP government with a strong mandate to implement MMP. The NDP is the only federal party that has consulted widely across the country to develop a clear way forward that is fully committed to bringing about electoral reform.

Here are just a few of the many things that are wrong with Canada's current FPTP electoral system:

1) It promotes false majorities in the House of Commons. There is no better example of this than Stephen Harper's current Conservative majority government won with less than 40% of the vote. And, because the Prime Minister has so much executive power embedded in the legislature, he has radically transformed

our country by ramming through numerous pieces of legislation that were opposed by 60% of the electorate.

2) It exacerbates a false sense of regional differences. For example, although a full third of Albertans marked their ballots in 2011 for other parties only Conservatives MPs were elected. This result creates an image that the entire province is monolithically Conservative which is clearly untrue.

3) There is a consistent under-representation of women in our system.

4) It exacerbates adversarialism and hyper-partisanship rather than co-operation and compromise in legislative activity and government policy.

5) The role of MPs is undermined because voters have to choose, with one vote, the local representative they would like to have representing their constituency, the party they would like to see with the most seats in the House of Commons and, very often, which party leader they prefer.

All of these things, under a properly structured proportional representation system, would be dealt

with and result in a more balanced democratic system.

Under the mixed member proportional (MMP) system favoured by the NDP, voters' preferences would be counted in two ways:

a) voters will elect a single MP to represent their constituency as they have always done; and

b) their votes will additionally count as part of the popular vote that determines a proportionate seat total for each party in the House of Commons. By combining a proportional representation of parties in Parliament with the direct election of an MP in each constituency - a party receiving 40% of the vote would gain only 40% of the seats.

This is the system that is being used quite successfully in New Zealand, Scotland and in Germany. These jurisdictions are electing a higher percentage of women and partisanship has decreased while civility, cooperation, and thoughtful debate leading to better policies have become the norm. Because it is rare for any given party to get over 50% of the popular vote (and thus over 50% of the seats) cooperation withcontinued on Page 18

What Is Our Earth Doing?

I follow a few internet sites in which news about our planet's activities are the theme. The past few weeks have brought out some weird events.

First and foremost was the 7.8 earthquake in Nepal where thousands of people were killed. Many people in northern India died from the same quake. That quake shook Bangladesh as well. What you may not know is a second quake, 6.2 on the scale, hit one day later in the same region. It was not an aftershock. Between the two quakes and the numerous aftershocks, Nepal kept on shaking for days.

We keep hearing about the 'big one' on our own coastline. Using the quake in Nepal as an example, we could expect a lot of shaking in our own valley. In fact, the 'big one' could likely be felt clear out to Calgary. Just a day before the quake in Nepal, there were three quakes in northern Idaho, moderate quakes in the 4 range, but they were felt in Cranbrook and Castlegar. The quakes were at the north end of the Pend d'Oreille lakes. The same day, there was a 6.2 jolt just south of the Queen Charlotte Island chain. The jolt was at the north tip of the Juan de Fuca plate, a skinny plate in the earth's crust that borders our west coast from northern California to the Queen Charlotte Islands.

The same day as the Nepal quake, a new beach rose up out of the sea on a peninsula on the east coast of Hokkaido, the island north of Fukushima. Japanese news media stated the new stretch of land is 1,000 feet long and rose 50 feet in one day, pushing up the former beach. The new beach is

quite ugly, full of seabed junk and sea-washed boulders. The odd thing about this rising beach was it was not accompanied by any earthquake in the area, although there have been a number of quakes in the general area during the past few months. Quakes in Japan are common. Geophysicists in Japan stated the rise of the beach front is the result of movement in Earth's crust.

Imagine owning some nice beach front property on our coast and waking up one morning to discover a 17 metre high mound of seabed debris and boulders is now between your sandy beach and the sea! If it could happen in Japan, it could happen here. In 1960, a similar rise in the earth's crust occurred in the Mediterranean area. A 6.1 quake in Morocco and a series of aftershocks left some fishing boats high and dry at shallow water docks. The Mediterranean seabed rose at least a metre, more in some areas. Divers working in the Mediterranean Sea made some interesting archaeological discoveries which had not been visible before. On the coast of Sardinia, an entire Roman town was suddenly only two meters below the surface of the sea. A sea wall was built around it, the water pumped out, and it became a tourist attraction. It is called Nora.

What most people are not aware of is the high number of earthquakes in the Mediterranean for the past two months. A 6.2 quake east of the island of Crete was followed by a number of aftershocks. However, Crete was just the largest quake during the one week extending from April 19 to April 26. In total, there were 101 quakes in the Mediterranean area during that week, and most of them were strong enough to be felt. No alarms were sounded worldwide, but some earth scientists are keeping a watch on the area.

Another article I read was about the discovery of a second magma pool under Yellowstone. The known magma chamber under Yellowstone contains enough lava to fill Grand Canyon. This second chamber is under the known chamber and is much larger than the first chamber.

Geophysicists at the University of Utah mapped the second chamber and it goes deep into Earth's crust. Not only is it deep and wide, it is a peculiar shape, looking as if it is filling a huge crack in the crust. The geophysicists wonder if it is feeding the top magma pool. What is known about Yellowstone is that it sits at the edge of an earth rift that begins just east of Yellowstone and eventually forms Grand Canyon. The rift was discovered by satellite back in the 1980s when heat emissions from the land under Wyoming were mapped. Until then, nobody suspected a continental rift in North America.

I was astonished at another bit of news in the same report about Yellowstone. It seems Yellowstone gives off 45,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide every day. I calculated an annual total of 16,425,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide emitted from that one volcano. There are 48 erupting volcanoes in the world, spewing all kinds of crap into the atmosphere, and there are just as many volcanoes which are considered low-level, meaning they are giving off fumes all of the time. There are a total of 1,500 active volcanoes worldwide, most of them occasionally emitting fumes. I wonder just how much carbon dioxide these 1,500 volcanoes are putting into our atmosphere in a day?

There are more volcanoes erupting right now than the average 'yearly' total for the entire 20th century.

If there is one area of the world you should stay away from, it is Indonesia. This island chain has had three volcanic eruptions and daily earthquakes, ranging from 3 to 6 on the Richter scale. In one location, an entire city is on the move as a mud volcano keeps spewing mud into the city streets. Residents have to move out and find homes elsewhere. There were three volcanoes erupting in late April and 19 more on alert. People in Indonesia live on the edge every day.

We live on an evolving planet. Earth is doing something every day. We cling to an illusion of control, like the illusion we can control carbon dioxide emissions, but our planet is doing its own thing. All we can do is watch what happens.

Beekeepers seeking Similkameen swarms

Beekeepers of the South Okanagan and Similkameen are asking residents to report bee swarms. Volunteer bee keepers will come to where swarms are located and collect them.

Bees generally swarm in later April or early May but can occasional swarm later in the summer. A bee swarm happens when the queen bee leaves a colony with a large group of worker bees to establish a new colony.

Up to 60% of the bees in the hive, which could total thousands of bees, will leave the old colony all

at once. Swarming is the natural means of reproduction that in the wild allows for new colonies to be established.

"Seeing a swarm in flight is incredibly impressive," explains Tim Bouwmeester a local bee keeper.

"It is something you will remember for the rest of your life."

Although impressive, a swarm is in not dangerous.

Without larvae to protect the bees will rarely sting. The bees will often form into a large ball on trees or overhangs. This protects the

queen and keeps the bees warm until they can find a new home. This is the best time to capture a colony as the bees are often sluggish and easy to handle.

Bouwmeester thinks capturing swarms is best for the bees and homeowners. A new bee colony can cost well over \$100 to purchase.

Capturing swarms is an afford-

able way for beekeepers to get a new colony. Uncaptured swarms can also cause problems for homeowners.

"Bees have been known to find small openings in roofs. If they establish a colony in the roof they can cause a mess and often need to be exterminated. Having bee keepers capture them and take care of them is the best alternative for

everyone."

To report a swarm anywhere around Penticton, Summerland, Oliver, Osoyoos or anywhere in the Similkameen Valley you are asked to contact Tim Bouwmeester via e-mail at tim_bouwmeester@yahoo.ca or 250-770-1434 who will then contact a local beekeeper to pick up the swarm.

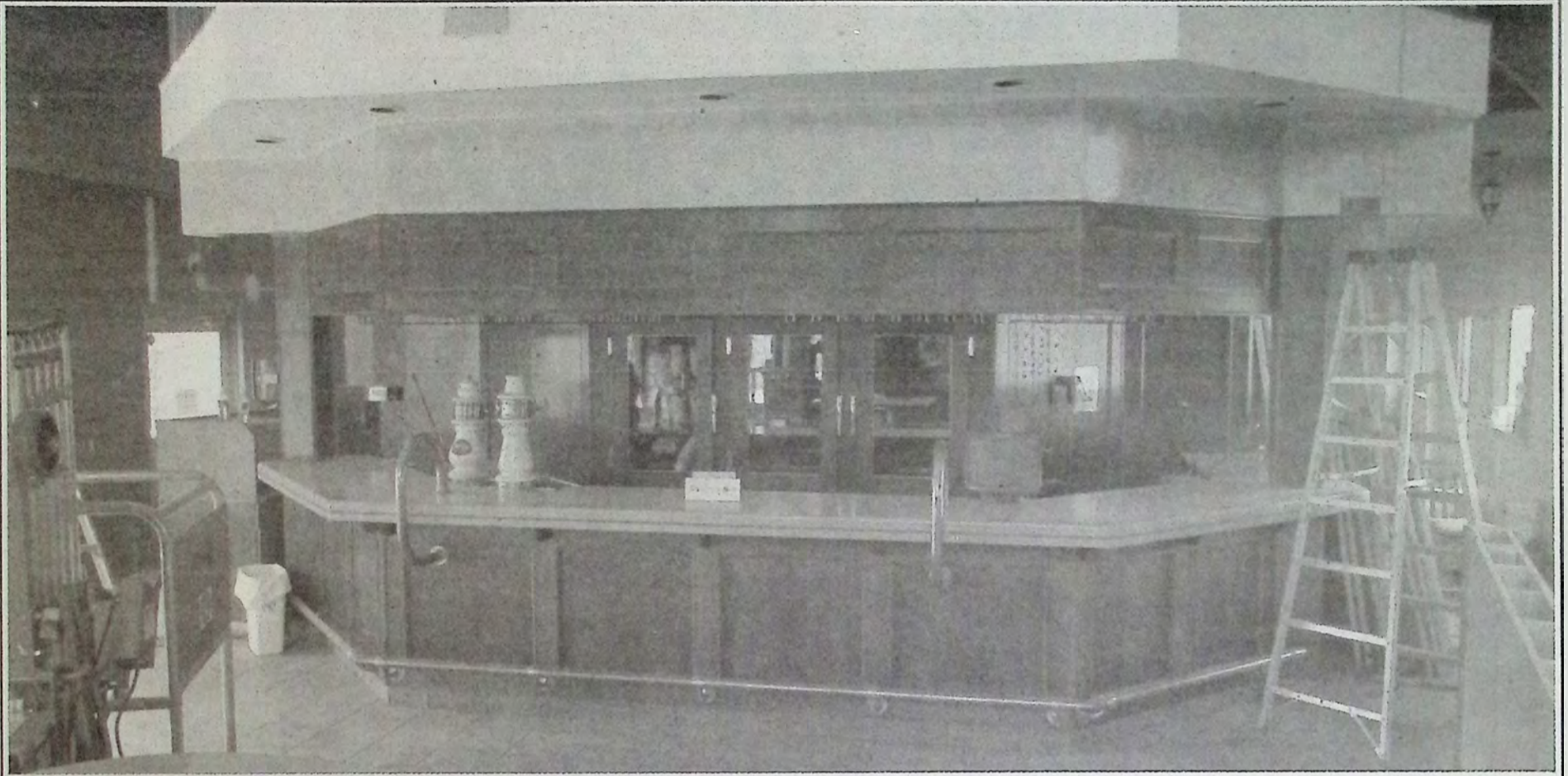

Steering committee shares meeting details

The Princeton Health Care Steering Committee (PHCSC) held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, April 21 at Princeton General Hospital. The meeting was attended by representatives from the Town of Princeton, Area H

(RDOS), health care practitioners, Interior Health, and SOHC.

A report from the Shared Care Committee provided the latest figures on the Princeton Access to Specialists program. Since January 2014, there have been approxi-

mately 60 specialist outreach clinics and over 450 patient appointments in association with the project. Specialty areas presently being covered include Cardiology, General Internal Medicine, General Surgery, GP Mental Health and Substance Use, Orthopaedics, Psychiatry, Paediatrics, Nephrology, Respiriology, Rheumatology, and Urology, with more specialty areas being explored.

On February 19, Dr. Ella Monro joined Dr. Brian Forzley and Lisa Needoba to give a presentation on the Access to Specialists program at the 2015 Quality Forum in Vancouver. Organized by the BC Patient Safety and Quality Council, the forum is attended by health care practitioners and administrators from across the province.

Ed Staples and Dr. Ella Monro reported on the newly formed Healthcare Sustainability Society that is raising funds to support the recruitment and retention of doctors for our community.

Marilyn Harkness gave a report on recent developments involving the South Okanagan Healthy Living Coalition. The Coalition is working with the Town Council in their efforts to pass a Smoke Free Outdoor Places bylaw for Princeton. Harkness provided information on the healthy eating initiative and local plans to raise community awareness of the health dangers of over consumption of sugar.

Jennifer Clement was welcomed as the new staff representative on the Steering Committee. Clement is the social worker at Princeton General Hospital.

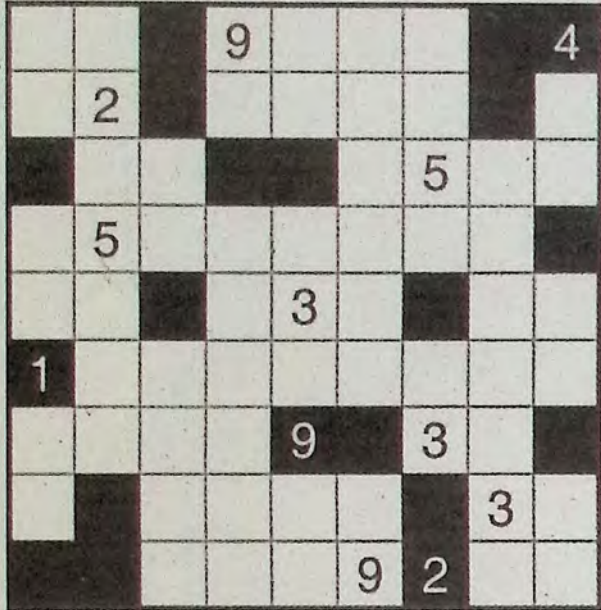

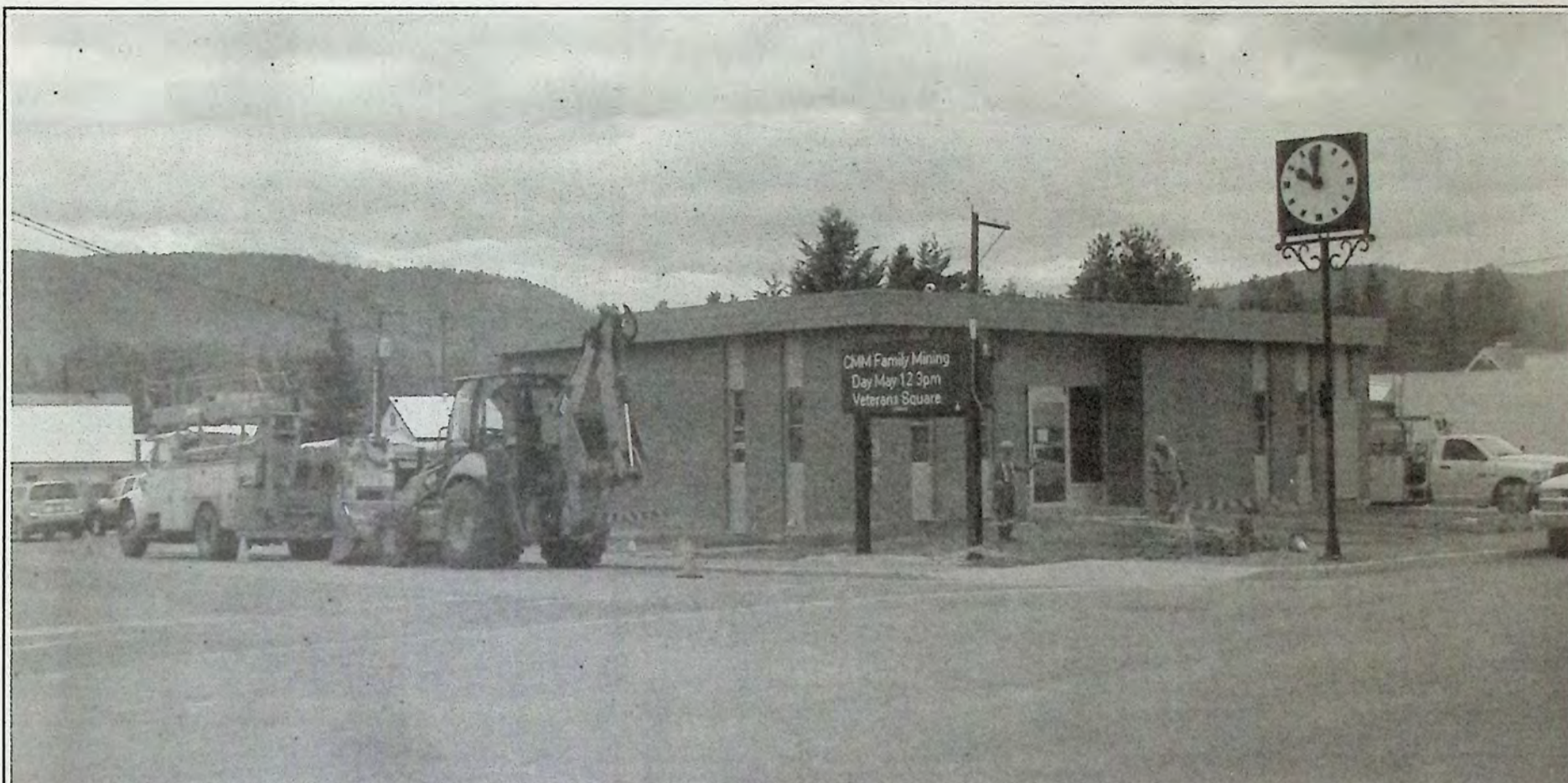

The Town of Princeton and Chamber of Commerce have joined forces for a great community project.

They have given it the awkward title of "Princeton Downtown Rejuvenation Venture" but in reality it is something that has needed to be done for quite some time.

The idea resulted from those regular meetings I have written about here that took place over a year ago when Town Council pooled local business owners and operators together to try to find solutions to the local economy.

One of the ideas to come out of those meetings was a plan to see local businesses clean up their appearance with the hopes that in following years the program would be expanded to go beyond the downtown business core. It's not a new idea by any means but it is something that we sometimes forget about when those of us in business in the community are too busy

trying to conduct business.

There are a lot of things I like about bringing back a business clean up program. I've mentioned it before in this column that clean streets and inviting business storefronts generate interest. The example I have used before is how I look at storefronts when visiting a different community. I am more likely to explore a business that is easy to park near, has an attractive storefront and looks interesting from the front door.

Once inside I am likely to look around (and maybe buy something) if I'm acknowledged by staff, the aisles are not cluttered and difficult to walk down and the overall appearance of the inside of the business is tidy and clean. I figure that if the business owner and staff are happy to see me and treat their business/job as something they like, I should feel that vibe off of them. Also, if they have pride in what they do and the service they provide, it

should also show in how the business looks inside and out.

Essentially that is what the "Princeton Downtown Rejuvenation Venture" is all about, but in baby steps. The first step is the designation of April and May by both the Town and Chamber as "Clean-Up Months."

For many of us downtown business owners we rent our location so we are restricted in what cosmetic changes we can do to our storefronts. However, that does not mean we can't take care of some of the outside details. For our business we keep washing our windows, sweeping the sidewalk in front and picking up garbage. These are really not hard for any of us to do and for a visitor it shows we have some pride in our business.

 "Annual Maintenance" to get retail operators thinking and inspired.

At the very least it is a start and all that is happening here is a 'steal' from the real estate industry where the teaching is that curb appeal can snag a sale. It's the same with customers. Using my example above of what I look for when in a different community, I rarely go into a business that does not attract me by catching my eye.

Let's face it, we all use this time of year to spruce up our yards and living space, why wouldn't that same exercise extend to our businesses and places of work? What we need to remember is that the downtown business clean up is not just to attract out of town business, either. For the majority of us in business in downtown Princeton the bulk of our revenue comes from residents in and around the community. We need to keep them coming back by treating them as

we would want to be treating when we are supporting the local economy.

That means that this year's exterior clean up is just the tip of the iceberg. As Spencer mentioned in a recent column of his, programs like the old SuperHost can teach staff in retail locations a lot about providing service that brings customers back in the door. The importance in that is the money spent by repeat customers also provides some indirect job security to the staff working there.

I see the jointly-sponsored Town of Princeton and Chamber of Commerce "Princeton Downtown Rejuvenation Venture" as the start of something great and a fresh new spin on an old idea we are in need of implementing in our community.

How does this save downtown Princeton?

Simple.

When you go out of town and to a street lined with businesses you

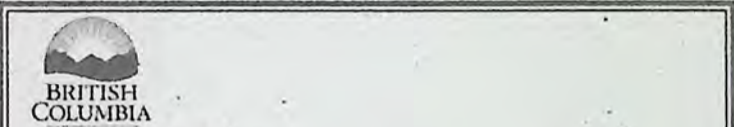

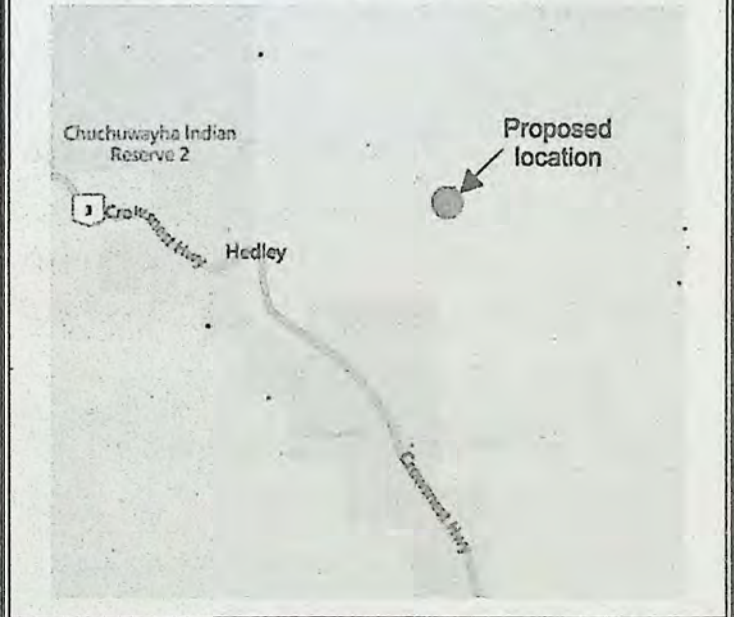

Highway Improvements Benefit The Riding

As summer gets closer, those who travel our highways will begin to see more road improvement projects throughout Fraser-Nicola.

These are all part of 'B.C. on the Move,' our government's 10-year plan for the improvement of our province's transportation network.

We don't generally like having our drives interrupted by delays for road-construction crews, but B.C. is no different than anyplace else: most of this kind of work has to be

done when the weather is best, and that means late spring, summer and early fall - the prime driving season.

There are several projects in our riding that are either underway, nearing construction or at the tender phase.

Of great interest to everybody in and around Princeton, 5.3 kilometres of Highway 3 from Sunday Summit to Sunday Creek will be widened and realigned to straight-

en curves and improve sightlines, including four kilometres of new climbing lanes. This federal-provincial project is expected to be completed in the fall of 2017.

Also near Princeton, Highway 3 will be upgraded to three lanes at Saturday Creek, including 2.5-metre paved shoulders, with an estimated completion in fall 2016.

Elsewhere in the riding:

On the Coquihalla Highway near Merritt, a Variable Speed Limit System will be installed at Ottomite Bridge (Portia Interchange to the former toll plaza). The system includes message signs, road weather information system stations, web cameras, pavement condition and temperature sensors, visibility sensors and variable speed limit signage. Completion is scheduled for next winter.

Near Ashcroft, a 6.1-km section of Highway 1 from the Ashcroft four-lane to the junction of Highway 97C will be resurfaced.

On Highway 1, the Walhachin Bridge re-decking project, to be completed this spring, will return the bridge to full load capacity.

These projects and dozens like them around the province this summer are part of our government's commitment to enhance safety, grow the economy, maintain and replace aging infrastructure, and support trade for B.C.'s resource sectors.

"Working in the trades requires a high level of training and expertise, and I'm proud that this funding will make these new opportunities a reality for students here at home."

NVIT's support is part of a \$6.1-million initiative to fund 1,429 additional critical trade seats this year in 14 public post-secondary institutions throughout the province and supports B.C.'s Skills for Jobs Blueprint.

Foundation training programs provide students with the basic knowledge and skills needed for entry into a particular occupation. Students receive credit for the first level of apprenticeship training in a specific field by the Industry Training Authority (ITA) upon successful completion.
