RCMP reports more crime, more arrests

Sgt. Barry Kennedy attend the October 19 Town Council meeting to report on the activities of the Princeton RCMP detachment for the past six months. Compared with last year, 2015 had nearly 100 more calls for service, most of them within Town boundaries. The reporting period is from April 1 to October 1.

There was an increase in the number of property crimes this year. Sgt. Kennedy noted there is a small group of people involved in committing these crimes, and with the help of local residents who have phoned to report suspicious activity in their neighbourhoods, police have been successful in making arrests.

Sgt. Kennedy did state there are traveling criminals who target rural communities. There were 57 break and enter incidents reported during the first six months of 2015, an increase over 2014, but there was a corresponding increase in the number of crimes solved and charges laid.

A total of 526 traffic tickets were issued in the Princeton area during the summer months.

There were more collisions in this reporting period, 90 in total, with 40 causing personal injury, and two fatalities.

Drug and alcohol crimes are a specific target of RCMP officers in Princeton. Eight impaired drivers were arrested and charged. RCMP officers target drug traffickers in the community and have focused on several individuals related to the drug trade. Four people involved in the local drug trade have been charged. An undis-

PXA looks at motocross

Princeton Exhibition Association (PXA) is considering a new type of event: motocross. There is plenty of room in the infield (area inside the race track) to set up a motocross track. A group of motocross enthusiasts has approached PXA President Paul Bedard to find out how PXA members would feel

about having motocross at the fairgrounds. As Princeton is centrally located for travel and has a suitable facility, the motocross group felt Princeton offered a good venue.

Members discussed where a motocross track could be fitted into the grounds without interfering with any of the other activities, and

agreed it could be done. Bedard heard no opposition, and said he would invite the group to bring a proposal to the PXA.

Another group approached Bedard asking whether snowmobile races could take place at the fairgrounds this winter. Bedard said he told them to bring a proposal to the

PXA. None of the PXA members had any objections as snowmobile races have been held successfully at the fairgrounds in the past.

Back Country Horsemen are planning a rendezvous next year to celebrate their 25th anniversary. This group has approached the PXA about use of the fairgrounds. Bedard met with them and answered many questions about costs related to use of the facility. This information will be taken to the Back Country Horsemen's executive. Princeton and two other locations are being considered and the decision will be made soon. The rendezvous would take place in late May or early June, and Princeton's facility is available at that time. Princeton is being considered due to its central location for the 20 Back Country Horsemen organizations.

There was a great deal of discussion about bringing the fee structure up to date. Princeton's fee structure has been different and lower than similar venues. When the new fee structure has been settled, brochures will be printed and made available

In a little over three week's time Canadians will gather on the 11th day of the 11 month at the 11th hour to honour those brave Canadians who made the supreme sacrifice in defence of freedom and democracy. On October the 19th it was encouraging to see one of the largest electoral turnouts in over two decades as Canadians attended the polls and advanced polls in large numbers for our nations forty-second general election. Locally in our new riding of Central Okanagan-Similkameen-Nicola our voter turnout of 71.8% was even higher than the national average of 68.5%. I believe this can be attributed to the fact that we had some very good candidates representing our national political parties who all ran very robust and honourable campaigns. It is also fair to say that increased turnout was reflected as a result that voters wanted a change. A change in Government and also a change in official opposition.

While some will be happy with the election results and others disappointed I think we can all agree it is exciting to live in a free and democratic country where citizens can come out and vote for change. It is also incumbent upon elected officials to hear and respect the message sent from voters. From an Ottawa perspective there will now be many hectic weeks during the transition period as the new Government must logistically move into place, staff must be hired and other arrangements made not unlike what will occur with many newly elected Members of Parliament, including here in the Okanagan. On that note I would like to take a moment to sincerely thank our local departing MP Ron Cannan for his

many years of service to our region. Ron worked tirelessly on behalf of the entire Okanagan region and his representation was always honourable and positive.

Currently the new Government has not yet set a date when Parliament will be recalled although the new cabinet is expected to be announced in early November. As a member of the official opposition I am looking forward to the opportunity of holding the new government to account on your behalf and continuing to bring your concerns to Ottawa. Flip Of The Coyne

The election is over, the people have spoken and we have a new government. All eyes are now on our new Prime Minister. Some still say he is too young, others not enough experience. Unless you have been Prime Minister there is no experience that is the same so let's just put it to bed and move on not because we want too but because we have too. Now that is out of the way why not look forward? Trudeau has made some very large promises and as we all know political promises are a dime a dozen but Trudeau made one promise that I think we all need to keep him too. He promised to end the current first past the post system.

If you don't know what first past the post is here is a simple explanation we don't vote for the Prime Minister we vote for a local representative a Member of Parliament or MP for short. We all go to the polls within our riding and vote the person who wins the most votes in the riding wins the seat. On paper it works pretty good in reality we see major majority governments with less than half the total votes of the Canadian people. In a two party

system first past the post makes more sense than in a system like ours. We have at least four real parties and this spreads the popular vote out leaving the majority of the vote not going to the party that forms government and within a riding the majority of votes do not always go to the one who wins the riding. A proportional system changes this depending on what system is chosen. The legislative body that is elected by a proportional system closer represents the overall will of the electorate.

Now some will argue that a change in the system will result in more elections because we will have more minority governments. Some people believe that minority governments are not as good as majority's. What minorities do is force politicians to seek common ground and work together creating a consensus around common issues and goals. This should create better legislation because if a party wishes to pass legislation it cannot be solely partisan and will have to have the support of others to pass into law. This eliminates things like omnibus bills that ram legislation through with little to no debate.

I will concede that majority governments are better for long term stability and in a world where investor confidence can be shaken by something as little as a winter storm it will take some ironing out

before the public would become accustomed to a new form of government where an election is always possible with the defeat of a confidence motion in the House of Commons. You could counter that

if this becomes the atmosphere of the House of Commons then we would most likely see stronger coalitions form after elections creating a strong government based oncontinued on Page 20

Town Council Meeting Briefs

OCP to be updated

The Town of Princeton Official Community Plan (OCP) requires updating. The present plan was adopted in 2008. It was drafted by Urban Systems. At the October 19 Town Council meeting, a motion was made to hire Urban Systems to begin working on the update. The cost would be \$42,500, with \$20,000 of the cost covered by the provincial government.

Councillor Jerome Tjerkstra said the cost was too high. He favored going to the public and involving them in the process and volunteered to do person-to-person discussions to find out what people want.

Councillor Douglas Pateman said there is an opportunity in the process under Urban Systems management to have the public provide input.

Council voted to hire Urban

Systems, but Councillor Tjerkstra requested his negative vote be recorded.

Zoning Hearing Scheduled

Three local businesses objected strongly this year to the 'residential' zoning applied to their properties. N&L Automotive Services, Sawin Enterprises, and Ace Hardware applied to the Town for zoning bylaw amendments to change the zoning designation on their properties from residential to commercial or business.

First and second readings were given at the October 19 Town Council meeting. Public hearings will be held on November 16 at 6:00 PM.

Legion plans approved

Remembrance Day is Wednesday, November 11, when the Royal

Canadian Legion Branch #56 plans to conduct a service of remembrance at the Cenotaph in Veterans Square. The Legion applied to Town Council for a number of items, including permission to use Veterans Square.

The Legion asked that the sound system will be available with a cordless microphone available, and that road closures be put in place for the ceremonial march from the school district administration building to the Cenotaph. A request was made to have Bridge Street blocked in front of the Post Office during the ceremonies.

Mayor Frank Armitage was asked to lay a wreath on behalf of the Town, and to attend the Legion Hall lunch following the official ceremony.

All requests were granted at the October 19 Town Council meeting.

A Quiet Twenty Years Of Service

What do you know about the local Skills Centre?

I can tell you that it was one of 22 skills centres that were put in place by the government of the day in BC to provide skills training to residents in 'remote' communities not located in major centres. Princeton's is the only one that remains from that original planting of services.

Over the years the local Skills Centre has had to duck and weave as it molded, rebranded and expanded to fit the changing trends in employment and technology. They have done all of this as a non-profit organization without the benefit of regular annual funding from local or regional government. They run a tight ship because they have to. There are only three paid staff members and the Board of Directors is comprised of five community members - two of which have been involved from the very start.

I attended the 20th anniversary open house of the Skills Centre last week. That was when the numbers started to make sense to me. They have provided services to 300 students a year and touched about 4,000 annually through career counseling. That alone equates to 80,000 services being fed to the people of Princeton during the twenty-year lifespan of the facility.

On top of that the skills centre is still pushing forward with various new programs and components to make up the structure of their upcoming phase. This includes the introduction of youth employment services.

Did you know they were that busy over there on Vermilion Avenue?

Chances are you or someone you know in Princeton has been touched in some way by the services provided at the Skills Centre. Brenda has taken a course or two there, I've been part of meetings hosting there as well as have appreciated the fact that out-of-town services (MP, for example) have used the building as a base in town so guys like me don't have to go to an office in the Okanagan to access the same thing.

What I think stood out most for me about the lifespan of the Skills Centre is that, for the most part - they have been basically quiet and low key about what they are doing. We know they are there, but without a program guide in the mail or an ad in this paper we tend to forget what they are doing.

That's not to say we aren't paying attention, either. I think I'm so used to the building being there that it's just an automatic for me to refer someone there for (fill in the blank).

Watch for some really innovative things to come out of that building in the next little while as they continue to move and shape to fit whatever is going on to stay current and be your local skills and training centre.

May they celebrate many more successful years of serving our community!

Three weeks ago my brother, his beloved dog Boris and a group of friends went from Nelson, BC to the Princeton area to go 4x4ing and camping on the Whipsaw loop. On the last night camping at Lodestone Lake Logan's dog Boris got spooked and ran off. Since he wasn't in the area he knew he got lost.

Logan and friends searched and searched for Boris and after staying two extra days, Logan eventually had to end his search and go home and back to his job in Nelson. He and our entire family was devastated. He shared the news with me and I informed the Princeton Bylaw officer Stephanie, the SPCA and made a few posters which were emailed to the various organizations in the Princeton, Coalmont and Tulameen area for posting. Stephanie was extremely helpful and said she was going to post it on her Facebook page. We also began posting the information about Boris's disappearance on every Facebook page we could find in these communities.

On the Wednesday after Boris when missing, a wonderful woman Candace at the Tulameen store called to say she had seen Boris on Monday, and had just seen the

poster which was put up at the store by the Tulameen Fire Chief. This was amazing news, so Logan went back to Tulameen and spent four days searching for Boris, and finally on the Sunday had to go home and back to work. Another devastating blow, going home without his beloved dog.

Another week went by with no information, until the Friday before Thanksgiving when a hunter in the area called to say he had seen Boris. Logan went back again, to the exact GPS coordinates of where the hunter had seen him. And again after three days of searching and many difficulties like blowing two tires Logan again had to go home to Nelson on Thanksgiving Monday with no Boris. We were all beginning to lose hope, and were feeling defeated.

Then on Tuesday morning we got a phone call about a posting on one of the Princeton Facebook pages that Boris had been seen again on Thanksgiving Monday. Logan was able to talk to the person who saw Boris and to get some tips on the area he was seen and turned around again and went back to Princeton and to the exact area of Wells Lake.

He drove back to Princeton and

this time took an ATV with him so he was able to get to remote Wells Lake. When he arrived at the lake he called and called and then noticed something moving.

It was Boris! Once Boris knew it was Logan the two were reunited. Logan rode all the way back to Lodestone Lake on the ATV with Boris on his lap! Both were thrilled to be together again. Boris was skinny, but seemed amazingly healthy other than that.

If it wasn't for the ability to spread the word through social media and wonderful citizens in the Princeton, Coalmont and Tulameen areas putting up posters and keeping the word out and informing us when they saw Boris, Logan and Boris never would have been reunited after 18 days being alone and lost in the wilderness.

Our family would like to thank all of the wonderful, animal loving citizens in Princeton, Tulameen and Coalmont who helped us so that we were able to find Boris.

If you ever lose your pet, don't give up hope! It's amazing how the will to live can keep a pet going and the love for pets by people can bring them together again.

Who Judges And Who Suffers

A true life story shocked me. The book was about the treatment of a teenage girl in 1967. She was pregnant, having been taken advantage of by a fellow in university. That part of the story was not unusual. What was shocking was the shunning of the girl. She was no longer welcome at her school, nor at home. Her mother bundled her up and sent her to another town to live with her father and his new wife. She was instructed not to go out into the yard (the neighbours might see her). Worst of all, she missed her church, a good Christian church where she had found a great deal of comfort.

This girl was shunned. She spent days totally alone in her father's home as he and his wife frequently traveled for business. It did not seem to occur to anyone that she might have an accident and die, or miscarry and bleed to death while alone. The most important thing to everyone seemed to be to avoid having to deal with the fact that she was sixteen years old and expecting a child.

She gave up the child for adop-

tion, but the shunning never stopped, not really. Her former school would not take her back. Her family found a boarding school that would take her, but even there, she could not share a room with another girl.

What shocked me most was the abandonment of this girl when she most needed care and love. Raised in a home where the church was a big part of her social world, where her mother was a pillar of the church, she was nevertheless considered not worthy of love and care by the very social group who should have been providing emotional support.

I had thought the practice of shunning people belonged only to certain fundamentalist sects that are a small minority among Christians, not the mainstream church. Worse still was the fact that nobody offered help in any way. Apparently casting her aside made everything good for everybody else. She had sinned, so she was punished by being shunned. Even finding solace and comfort in church was denied her. She paid a high price for what was seen as 'her' sin. Nothing was done regarding the university student who had a greater role in her condition.

I wondered about the ethics of her church and the people in the congregation, including the girl's mother. What kind of Christians sit judgment on others and cast them aside? What kind of Christians decide who should be punished and shunned? What kind of pastor does not reach out to those most in need of comfort and love? What kind of Christian congregation is composed of people so without sin

that they can cast the first stone? What kind of Christian woman chooses to abandon her teenage daughter in a crisis, for fear of what the congregation may say?

In any Christian gathering of which I have been a part, people say the Lord's Prayer. I suspect the congregation to which that girl belonged recited the Lord's Prayer without even thinking about what they were saying. One of the clauses of the prayer is "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive others who trespass against us." This means, according to what I was taught, that each of us will be forgiven in the same manner in which we forgive others. Apparently, that girl's congregation had ruled out forgiveness for themselves because they were not extending any forgiveness to her.

Does this sort of thing go on in today's Christian congregations? Does a member of the congregation make a mistake and have the others sit judgment on that person and find a way to punish that person? Would a pastor sit judgment and mete out punishment? Does anybody ask what Jesus would do in that situation?

Back to that girl who was shunned: what became of her? She tells the story of her youth, how she walked away from her family, her church, her former school mates, and how she joined the hippie movement, did drugs, tried to walk all the way to India from Luxembourg, and finally began to think through her life. She found herself, then found the child she had placed for adoption, and wrote a book about her experience. Perhaps some of her readers will learn a lesson about casting stones.

Urine Stones More Prevalent In Winter

As winter hits and our pets spend less time outside in the heat, they also stop drinking as much water to stay cool. To compensate, they concentrate their urine to prevent dehydration, and we begin to see problems with urinary crystals. Crystals are common in urine and it is only when the urine concentrates that the crystals concentrate. As they concentrate, they precipitate out of the urine and begin to irritate the bladder. In worse case scenarios, they accumulate into stones and block the urethra. Once the urethra is blocked, it is a very short time before our pets are very sick and can often be fatal if not caught early enough.

While we see blockages more often in male cats, because their smaller urethra diameter, crystals are common in dogs and cats of both sexes. Bladder stones are commonly found incidentally on exam for other problems. So what should you look for to catch crystals early, before they become stones and a risk of blockage?

Signs your pet has crystals include: frequently urinating small amounts, blood in the urine, recurrent bladder infections, vocalizing

during urination, licking penis/vulva after urination, licking abdomen or pain when the abdomen is touched.

The most common crystal is Struvite followed by Calcium Oxalate. Struvite crystals form when the urine pH is alkaline or when there is an imbalance in Magnesium and Phosphate. Calcium Oxalate crystals most commonly occur when there is an excess of Calcium in acidic urine. Normal urine contains small numbers of crystals - it is only when they accumulate faster than they are excreted or the urine becomes concentrated that they become a problem.

Prevention, is best with urine crystals because of the short time between stones forming and death. The first step is to ensure our pets are eating a proper meal - at least 90% of the cases of urine crystals and bladder stones are being fed poor quality, cheap diets bought from supermarkets and pet stores. Feeding a properly balanced food that keeps the urine at a neutral pH is the best way to prevent crystals from forming.

When it is hot, our pets drink more water to cool off and their urine stay very dilute. During the cooler

month, it is very important that we encourage drinking to prevent urine concentration and stone formation. The first step is to make sure they have water easily accessible at all times. Other ways to increase water consumption include:

- multiple water dishes
- changing the water frequently to ensure it is fresh
- fountains with moving water
- adding flavouring such as canned meat water.

The other 10% of bladder stone cases are due to recurrent bladder infections. Prompt treatment of bladder infections prevents stone formation in these instances, as long as the pet is being fed and watered properly. Anytime you see any changes in urination, you should have your pet examined.

Treatment for bladder stones consists of surgically removing the stones from the bladder. By the time we catch them in our pets, they are often too large to break up, as is common in people. If the pet is blocked, it become much more serious as they commonly block afterwards from the scar tissue that forms around the stone.

As with all diseases, prevention keeps our pets happy and healthy for much longer. Proper nutrition goes a long way to ensuring that.

Council supports Fishing Championships

The Canadian National Fly Fishing Championships will take place in October 2016. At the October 19 Princeton Town Council meeting, Council approved becoming a supporter of the event. The competition will take place on lakes in the Merritt area, and the river fly fishing will be on the Similkameen River along Old Hedley Road between the Town and the east junction with Highway 3. The dates of the Similkameen River portion are October 5, 6 and 7.

Mayor Frank Armitage will attend the opening ceremony of the championship competition. There will be 60 competitors involved in five fly fishing sessions on the Similkameen River, with only 12 competitors on the river in each session.

Mayor Armitage told the News Leader he is looking for 12 volunteers who will work for the three days the competitors are fishing the Similkameen River. Anyone wishing to be involved as a volunteer should contact Mayor Armitage at Town Hall.

This championship event will bring national attention to Merritt's lakes and to the Similkameen Valley. The opening and closing ceremonies will take place at the Quilchena Hotel.

Living Past 100

A Health Care Lesson From USA

We Canadians have heard a lot of negative reports about the American way of providing health care, commonly referred to as 'Obamacare.' The Kaiser Foundation did an interesting study comparing the health care costs of states that opted into the expanded Medicaid program and those 22 states that did not. The results are surprising to the Republicans who have been so opposed to the whole notion of Medicaid.

Medicaid has been around for years for the elderly, but two years ago, states had the option of expanding Medicaid to poor families and individuals below a certain income level. Twenty-two states refused to expand Medicaid despite the offer of federal assistance to the state health care programs.

Those states that expanded Medicaid saw an increase in costs amounting to 3.4 percent. Those who did not expand Medicaid saw an increased cost to the state of 6.9 percent. The difference was due to the fact the state is obliged to care for those without health insurance when they have a health crisis. Although more people were served in the states that chose expanded Medicaid, the largest increase in costs were in the states that did not expand health care to the poor.

At this point, the Kaiser Foundation has issued no analysis of why this difference has occurred, but perhaps the answer lies in the "health crisis" area. It is much more expensive to deal with a health crisis than to extend regular care. Often, routine health care serves to prevent a health crisis. For example, routine health care would detect high blood pressure and provide treatment. If a person is too poor to afford health insurance, and too poor to pay cash for a routine appointment, that person could suffer a stroke or kidney failure, which now becomes a health crisis requiring a great deal more care. Comparing the cost of high blood pressure pills to the cost of hospitalization and specialized treatment puts high blood pressure pills a much cheaper way to go.

There is a lesson in this for those Canadians who believe we really do not need a Medicare system of health care. Human suffering aside, it is much less expensive to try to keep everyone healthy through routine health care than dealing with health emergencies.

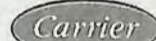

Joint Trip With Nicola Valley Naturalist Society Near Merritt

Ten Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists enjoyed a joint outing with the Nicola Valley Naturalist Society at Lundbom Common, just east of Merritt, on Saturday, October 17th.

Our neighbouring naturalists hosted us, and their president, Alan Burger, was our guide. The area is beautiful, with sheltered gullies of marshlands and a myriad of turquoise coloured ponds and lakes interspersed throughout vast golden

rolling grasslands, surrounded by small pockets of forest.

We met at the Laurie Guichon Memorial Grasslands Interpretive Site, where Alan gave us a short history of the area. Then we drove 7-kilometres along a gravel road before we began hiking along a designated trail. The region is a birder's delight, and even at this time of year we observed 21 different species, including Buffleheads, Green-winged teals, Pileated woodpeckers, a Northern Harrier, and a Rough-legged hawk.

After our morning hike, we settled onto a hillside overlooking a pond, to eat our lunch and revel in the

warmth of the sun, as the temperature was 24 degrees! After lunch we visited a nearby forested area where a dead but standing ancient tree bears the mark that once signified a First Nation's trading site.

A few of our members had time for an additional one-hour hike, a steep climb to the top of Sugar Loaf Mountain, which provides a powerful view of the Nicola Valley and mountains beyond. A granite glacial erratic that perches on top of the volcanic peak was of particular interest to our group.

This field trip not only introduced us to a unique, protected and diverse ecosystem, but also to fel-

low naturalists. We look forward to another joint outing with this group, closer to home, in the spring!

Our next field trip will be to Barcelo Falls, just east of Keremeos, on Saturday, November 7th. Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

Our town leaders revealed how much they truly understand about the downtown core at their October 19th regular meeting. They have hired Urban Systems to work on updating the Official Community Plan.

To bring you up to speed on this, that very same consulting/engineering firm put together the OCP that is currently in place. The Town of Princeton adopted that document in 2008. The OCP has created a fair amount of discussion, controversy

and closed-door discussions in and around Town Hall from residents - and in particular commercial property owners.

The price tag to have Urban Systems 'update' the OCP is \$42,500. Sure, \$20,000 of that will be covered by the BC government but what it really means is this: Town Council would rather hire outside the community to create a document on the future of Princeton than consult with those of us directly affected by the final

results.

Yes, part of the process allows for public consultation, but that usually translates to a single afternoon/early evening open house that is poorly promoted.

I give Councillor Jerome Tjerkstra huge praise on this issue. He spoke up during the Town Council meeting and said the price tag was too high and that locals should be consulted one-on-one for input. He even offered to do the footwork himself.

He was out voted and taxpayers get to foot a \$22,500 bill. Tjerkstra requested his negative vote recorded and I'm sharing that here to show you that at least one member of Town Council gets it. I know, Jerome is a downtown businessman. Of all the elected (I know, acclaimed) officials in our town, he should get that the OCP has been an issue to the retail core.

The problem here is that Town

Council has been running in a reactive mode since first installed almost a year ago. Spencer has pointed it out frequently in his column the lack of communication and consultation within the community they serve. The technology exists to remedy most of this but instead we get a downtown electronic information board that seems glitchy at best and two or three news releases a year.

Oh, but they do talk to local business owners all the time.

The last time the Mayor asked me how business was I gave him an honest snapshot of what 2015 had been like up to that point. His response was less than supportive.

The point I am trying to make here is two-fold. Town Council gets credit for updating the OCP, which obviously was flawed as soon as commercial property owners started putting together how it would affect their pocketbook if they

chose to sell their land. Before you start patting Town Council on the back for the OCP update plan, it was scheduled for update long, long ago as that is part of the ordinary process of the lifespan of an OCP. They are just doing what they are supposed to do with the document.

The other part of the point I'm trying to make here is that since they are following protocol, the rest of us had better do the same. When the time comes for public input, a lot of residents/business owners should make the effort to attend the open house to be heard. It's not the fault of Town Council or Urban Systems to assume everyone is okay with the OCP if no one opposes it. However, they also need to promote it better and actually listen to us when we tell them something they would rather not hear.

RDOS announces Olalla water upgrade

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen (RDOS) awarded the design of watermain upgrades for the Olalla Water System to WSP Canada and the communications system upgrade and transfer switch installation to Interior Instruments. The announcement was made October 22nd.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was released seeking qualified consultants to provide a complete set of

engineered design drawings, cost estimates, tendering and construction services for the Olalla Water System upgrades.

A large part of the water system was upgraded in 1998/1999 which included construction of a new well with pump, a concrete reservoir, a pump house complete with electrical controls and various watermain replacements. The remaining old watermains will now be upgraded

to further the efforts in reducing leakage within the Olalla Water System.

The design and cost estimates for all the remaining replacement work within the system started last week. The construction of the watermains will be completed in phases. Tendering and construction for Phase 1 of the replacement project is expected to occur in the spring of 2016. Additional phases may be

added to the spring construction work depending on available budget.

The other main upgrade area for the Olalla Water System is the communication system. There have been frequent issues with the current system causing RDOS operations staff to spend valuable time with false alarms and troubleshooting.

Also, the Olalla Water System currently does not have the ability to generate back-up power during a power outage.


The Regional District has retained

Interior Instruments to upgrade the communications system and install a transfer switch to allow for a portable generator that can be utilized in the case of a power outage ensuring delivery of water to the Olalla system users. It is expected that this communication system work will be complete before the end of the year.

The Regional District continues to strive to develop an environmentally sustainable community and meet public needs through the development and implementation of key services.

If we want to build our community, we also need to build our leaders and finally there has been a sign to indicate a door has been opened for that. In my mind, that is more welcoming than the "We will not be intimidated" battle cry of dictatorship.

How does this save downtown Princeton?

The OCP update could be part of the answer to making the right

changes for the community. While the price tag and method of gathering public input could be issues, Town Council deserves credit for

trying to do the right thing. A strong Official Community Plan, with the correct elements to protect and enhance the retail core, could open
