Town Council reaches compromise

In a move described by Town Council as a compromise, two bylaws related to a controversial change to the Official Community Plan and Zoning were partially settled December 21st.

Council gave third reading to Bylaw No. 906, 2015, a bylaw to amend the OCP to place four properties on Burton Avenue in the (HC) Highway Commercial land use classification, and Bylaw No. 907, 2015, a bylaw to amend the Zoning Bylaw to rezone the properties to a (CS) Service Commercial

use classification.

The interesting part in this arrangement comes from a list of conditions that were passed at a meeting on October 19, 2015. The conditions include: approval by Town Council of a landscape buffer design, that the landscape buffer is installed prior to final adoption of the proposed bylaws, maintenance of the landscape buffer (the responsibility of the property owners) and that the conditions be completed within a year of third reading of the bylaw amendments.

Should the maintenance commitment not be met with the other conditions, Bylaws No. 906 and 907 would be abandoned.

The Similkameen in 2015

The year began with concerns about ice build-up in the Similkameen River. Ice jams in the past have spelled trouble but due to a mild winter, the ice flowed down-river in February without incident.

Racing Days Association tried once again to hold an annual general meeting, having failed to do so in November 2014. Once again, there were not enough members to

go ahead for another year. Princeton Racing Days Association, founded in 1964, came to an end.

Princeton Town Council began the first of a four-year term with two new members: Councillors Rosemary Doughty and Jerome Tjerkstra. They were in the newly renovated court house building. The old Town Hall was renovated

and became the Tourist Information Centre. In November, construction began on an elevator for the court house building. The courtroom will be renovated to accommodate Town Council meetings. The elevator will allow handicapped access to the second floor.

Town Council raised the water and sewer rates. They planned to hire a deer 'manager.'

The Board of Education welcomed Youth Trustees Reuben Howarth and Zoe Douglas. The Board also increased their annual indemnity. The Chair now receives \$17,000 per year, the Vice-Chair receives \$15,500 and the regular trustees receive \$14,000 each.

Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists hosted many hikes during 2015, four of which were done on snowshoes. They were part of the Meadowlark Festival for another year.

Princeton Junior Girls Basketball Team had a great season and went to the regional playoffs.

A local girl, Cayley Brown, went to Fort Worth, Texas, to receive an award as a world top cow breeder, winning with a cow she raised.

2015 was a federal election year. The New Democratic Party nominated Angelique Wood, of Hedley. After the election on October 19, the Liberal Party held a majority, but our riding, with its new boundaries, elected a Conservative, Dan Albas, our new Member of Parliament.

EC Manning Park celebrates 75 years in 2016

Manning Park Resort is enjoying over 160cm of snow base, with a lot of happy skiers lapping up the powder.

In addition to the amazing skiing, snowboarding, snowshoe and cross-country activities, there is a great bustle to get ready for the year of 2016, as EC Manning Park prepares to celebrate its 75th

anniversary.

Manning Park Resort and BC Parks are looking forward to celebrate this 75th year of EC Manning Provincial Park with a number of festivities and events planned all year long.

New Year's Eve marked the 75th Anniversary Kick-Off with a spectacular fireworks display at mid-

night, plus other evening events (a Moonlight Guided Snowshoe tour), kid-friendly activities and some special visitors, including Jerry the Moose, BC Park's mascot.

Different events throughout the year will highlight the Park's history, ecological diversity and the abundance of recreational opportunities in the Park, culminating in the 75th Birthday party on July 16, 2016, which is also Canada Parks' Day.

The Park began in 1941, when it was created and named after Ernest Calloway Manning. He was the Chief Forester from 1935-1940 and

tragically died in a plane crash in 1941.

EC Manning Park protects over 70,000 hectares of diversified terrain varying from the towering cedar rainforest of Sumallo Grove to the rare 2,000+ year old Subalpine Larch forest on Mount Frosty. The abundance of animals and flora in the Park, and the variety of ways to interact with this great outdoors, make it an incredible place to visit any time of year.

Owner Kevin Demers and his family purchased Manning Park Resort, the private company that operates within the provincial park, in 2013.

It is going into its third winter, and has been gaining momentum with the new ownership. The company includes all the amenities of Manning Park Resort, and also operates the provincial park campground bundle within EC Manning Provincial Park.

Manning Park Resort is operating 7 days a week for the rest of the Winter 2015/16 season, and year round for the Resort accommodations and camping.

.....continued from Front Page Ridge on February 9 was a great success, partly due to the good weather.

Princeton Rotary Club opened a kitchen facility at Riverside Centre. The club raised more than \$80,000 to put a kitchen into the facility which would make catering of dinners and other events far easier. The grand opening marked a two-year project culminating in success. Rotarians went on to host a wine fest to raise more funds for other groups in Princeton.

Despite assurances to the contrary, the hours of operation of Princeton Public Library were altered.

Princeton Curling Club had a successful winter, hosting enjoyable bonspiels and providing a lot of fun for local residents weekly.

Princeton District Community Arts Council hosted a Speed Control concert in February, then welcomed back Kelowna Ballet. During the warmer months, they kept the

Sunflower Gallery open and sponsored music in Veterans Square each Saturday. In the fall, they sponsored concerts and an Art Walk. Members of Crimson Tine Players had an excellent year, ending with a Christmas play called 1001 Arabian Nights.

A group of youngster from African came to Princeton to sing, and wowed the crowd.

Granite Creek historical site was entered in three registers as a B.C. historical site to visit.

Similkameen wineries received a boost in London, England, where they made their debut at Canada House.

In March, Princeton's booth at the Kamloops Cowboy Festival was a hit with the crowd. This booth, transportation and accommodation are funded by Princeton Rodeo Club to promote the rodeo, Princeton Exhibition Grounds, Princeton's events at the grounds, and Princeton as a tourist location.

Town businesses and the Chamber of Commerce provide materials for the booth.

As a result of all of their work at their Thrift Shop, Princeton Hospital Auxiliary members were able to give \$30,000 toward the purchase of an imaging machine for Princeton General Hospital. This machine provides rapid processing of X-rays and mammograms. The Auxiliary hosted a fashion show in May.

After many years as a member and volunteer worker at Princeton Museum, Evelyn McCallum was made Honorary President of Princeton Museum Society in appreciation for her dedication and her contributions.

On March 31, a public health rally was held at Veterans Square to urge the federal government not to abandon the Health Accord. Despite similar events across Canada, the Accord was abandoned.

What Will We See This Year?

In trying to come up with a subject for this week's Editorial, in my mind, I kept going back to the recent OCP developments.

That's probably because the most recent decisions will ultimately have a direct affect on the look and feel of the neighbourhood my wife and I invested in a number of years ago when we bought a small house. I'm still a little bit stunned about the developments, but in a good way.

I have to say I was very impressed with how calm and orderly the decision was rolled out in the last public meeting of Town Council. I was equally impressed with the fact that a transcription of the dialogue exchanged during the public meeting a month before was released to the public.

That alone told me a lot about what could be a shift in how Town Council is doing business. I saw it as a blatant attempt at revealing a level-of accountability that Spencer and I have hinted at frequently in this paper as being essential for residents to be informed about what is going on at Town Hall.

It doesn't surprise me at all that it took a controversial piece of legislation to bring this about and I can't find fault in any of it. In fact, I'm pretty excited about what this all says about our town leaders.

I like the fact that they 'stuck to their guns' in defence of the residents living on Burton Avenue and still managed to reach a compromise (their word) between residential and industrial properties in the area. I see the whole concept of a transitional focus on the two types of land uses as a huge plus in the community.

The idea of a landscape buffer to me is brilliant.

Not only does it serve as a form of a segue from one land use category to another, it becomes a form of beautification. I can hardly wait to see what the design concept will be as I get to pass it twice daily and look forward to a display of some kind to break up the view.

I also don't entirely understand the perceived resistance to some of these changes. If we all take a good, long, hard look at what parts of our community look like we have to realize that in order to attract new people there has to be some kind of change. Even if all we are talking about is cosmetic changes in the most basic form I still point to Veterans Square as an example of where landscaping, interesting features (gazebo, fountain) and signage can result in a wonderful showcase and beautiful meeting place.

It would not have happened if none of it changed to what it is now. I see the landscape strip/buffer along Burton Avenue as a sign of change coming for 2016 and I'm starting to think that we are all in for a pretty exciting ride.

As one year ends and another begins, it's important to take a look back at what we have accomplished in the past and what we hope to achieve in the future.

For the Princeton area it was a busy 2015 with some major road improvements along the Highway 3 corridor, funding for arts and culture - including \$14,000 for the Princeton Arts Council and nearly

\$50,000 distributed to local organizations through Community Gaming Grants, and \$250,000 to make two public buildings more accessible (for a complete list of Nicola Valley 2015 achievements visit my website www.jackietegart.ca).

Transportation is an ongoing issue in our rural areas and this past year the Ministry of Transportation has

completed significant portions of the 2015/2016 Road Improvement Program valued at over \$44M in Fraser Nicola. Road improvements in the Princeton area included a partnership with the federal government to widen and realign 5.3 km of Highway 3 from Sunday Summit to Sunday Creek, installation of two overhead warning signs at Whipsaw Creek, and road widening on Highway 3 at Saturday Creek.

While these works have greatly enhanced road safety, with winter now here, I'm aware of the importance of highway maintenance. That's why I met with local Highway's Department officials in late December to discuss ways we can ensure our highways are kept clean and safe. If you have specific issues regarding the condition of our highways, please contact my office and I'll ensure that information is included in the maintenance contract renewal process, which will begin in 2016.

Together we have accomplished much this past year. I am honored to represent you in Victoria, and thank you for the work you do for your communities. I am looking forward to a busy 2016 and wish you all a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year!

We're All In Debt, But I've Got Tips

Apparently each and every Canadian owes \$1.64 for every \$1.00 of income. That's not good news!

I am not one of those people who owes money. This may be because I am very careful with money due to the way I was brought up. My husband and I did have big debt during our working years, but it was in the form of mortgage. Our mortgage was paid off before we retired. That's just part of the picture.

When we got married, we were very poor. Then we had two children a year apart, which put a lot of financial pressure on us, but we still managed our money quite well.

We did not go out and buy a lot of fancy furniture and electronic equipment. We paid rent for the first eight years we were married, and then we bought a very cheap little house that needed a lot of renovation, most of which we did ourselves. We put up our own wall coverings, did our own painting. My husband learned to do plumbing and we did our own roofing. I laid tiles, he built kitchen cabinets.

I was born on a farm. I learned early there are three kinds of money. First, there is the money you save by growing or making things for yourself. The second kind of money is the money you save by doing your own repairs. Third, there is cash money, and this is reserved only for the things you cannot produce, build, or repair yourself.

I have watched other people make mistakes about buying things and I will share some of what I have learned. I knew a woman who had a very limited income, but she had a credit card, and used it to buy all kinds of new things, things she did not need. She wanted new furniture and a nice car because "what will people think?" In the meantime, she barely made it from one paycheque to the next, and sometimes skipped paying one utility bill or another. Excessive concern about what others think of what you own means you are spending your

money on other people's opinions.

Early in our marriage, we owned two things that saved us a lot of money. One was a sewing machine. I sewed curtains, baby and kids' clothing, much of my own clothing and often used old clothing to cut down to make kids' clothing. The second thing was a freezer which allowed us to buy in bulk when prices were low, and provided a place to store the fish my husband caught, the wild berries I picked, the game he shot, and the garden produce I grew (I am a gardener).

We always had a budget, and kept track of where our money was going. This is a tremendous way to save money. When you know where your money is spent, you know where you can save. You also know how much you must set aside each month for necessities like food, housing, heat, electricity, and suitable clothing and footwear. We shopped sales and we cut corners, but we always had money for what we needed. A budget helps you decide between what you need and what you would like to have, and starts you thinking whether what you would like to have makes real practical sense.

Up until the time our children were in middle school, if I worked at all outside the home, it was part-time. When I did start working full-time, I took a bag lunch to work just as my husband did. This does not mean we never ate in a restaurant, but we saved those occasions for something special, like birthdays and anniversaries.

When it came to meals, I planned ahead and made everything from scratch. Fast food chains and packaged meals did not feature on our daily menu. There were some things I bought prepared, like a cake mix. It is cheaper to bake from a mix than from scratch, especially when the mixes go on sale. We ate fresh food from our garden in the summer and fall, and I canned or froze as much as I could. I made pickles and relish, jam and jelly. When we lived on the prairies, we went berry picking for wild strawberries, wild raspberries and saskatoons. When we moved to Princeton, wild berries for jelly were Oregon grapes, saskatoons, buckthorn berries, elderberries, and occasionally, huckleberries. Of course, living so close to Keremeos meant a bounty of fruit for canning.

Recently, a friend of mine decided she wanted to sell her apartment and move to a different location which was less noisy. She is on a pension and needed to save money. She bought a cell phone, then shut down her land line, internet service and cable service, sav-

ing herself about \$75 a month. This saved her about \$1,000 a year. She saved on gasoline by walking to the mall, some four blocks, and she became a fanatic about shutting down electric lights not in use. She saved about \$30 a month or around \$360 a year. In two years, she had saved nearly \$3,000, which still was not enough. She continued to save this way for a total of five years, and she has now moved. The moral of this story is this: sometimes you have to make sacrifices to get what you want out of life.

One of the best pieces of advice I have heard is this: when you get your pay, pay yourself first. In other words, put some money in your savings account before you spend any of your pay.

Another way of saving is to save before you buy. Sometimes this isn't possible, such as when my washer broke down. The repairman said it would cost \$350 to put a new motor in it. We told him to go ahead. We did not buy a new washer, because a new motor would make it the equivalent of a new washer. This leads me to a final way of saving money: take care of what you have so it doesn't have to be replaced.

There are some people who struggle from month to month simply because they do not earn enough to meet their expenses. These are often single parents, single pensioners and single persons on disability. This might be a lesson saying "find a partner," but that takes us into a whole other dimension. However, I have known pensioners who moved in together and proved two may not live cheaper than one, but they do live better with two incomes.

Perhaps there are a lot of people who need to take a new look at being in debt and find ways to get out of it by being smarter.

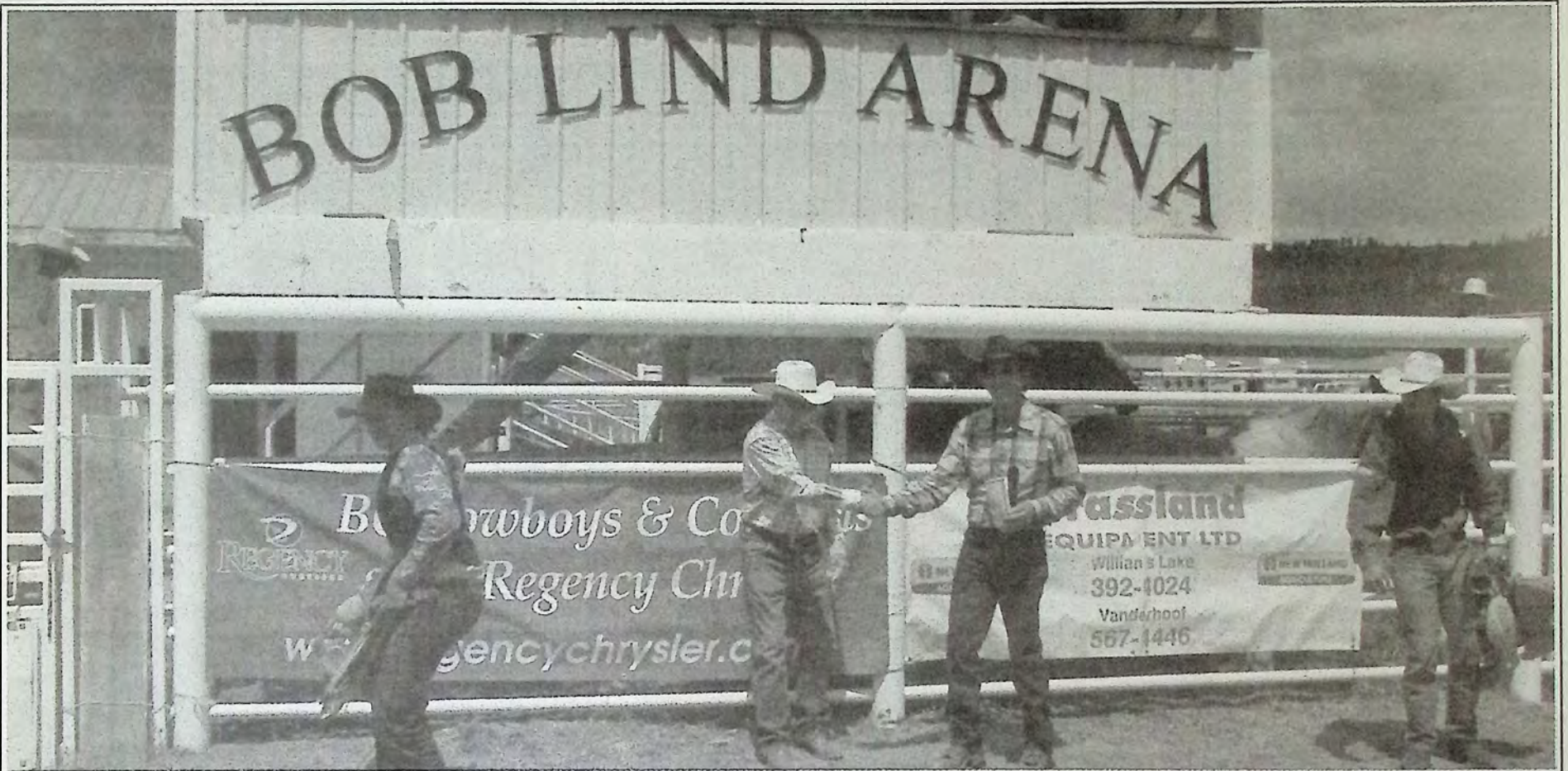

Spring came early to the Similkameen Valley, and the Chopaka Rodeo took place on Easter Sunday, April 5, in warm sunny weather. This first rodeo of the Similkameen had a great turnout.

Two more rodeos took place: the annual Keremeos Rodeo on the May long weekend, and Princeton Rodeo on the third week of June. Both rodeos ran successfully, but could have welcomed more rodeo fans.

The annual Family Fair held at Princeton Secondary School marked its 64th year of raising bursary money for Princeton's graduating class.

Lynn Pelly, former Administrator

of Princeton District Community Services Society, retired happily after 28 years of service.

Lower Similkameen Indian Band hosted a grand opening of their new facility east of Cawston, a combination administration, resource management, health centre and public meeting place. It is one the finest buildings in the Similkameen Valley.

John Ike Koopmans was found guilty in Penticton Court of the murders of Robert Keith Wharton and Rosemary Fox, and the attempted murder of Bradley Martin. The shootings took place in Princeton March 30, 2013. Koopmans was sentenced to life in prison, without parole for 22 years.

Princeton Posse Junior B hockey

team had a new coach, Geoff Goodman, to start the 2014/15 season.

In terms of major media events, Princeton was lucky to avoid all but one in 2015. There were no forest fires locally (much smoke from elsewhere), no floods, no ice jams. What we did have was a landslide that blocked Highway 3 between Hedley and Keremeos. Actually, there was more than one slide in the spring, and then some more rocks fell in the fall. The highway narrowed to two lanes until October, when restorative work was completed.

Autumn weather 2015

Temperatures remained pleasant right through October until the last few days, when unsettled weather moved in.

Rain seemed to be the main theme of November. Unsettled was the key word for the entire month. Temperatures were cool, not reaching daytime highs anywhere near records set in 1975 (21.1), 1987 (15.5), 2014 (17) or 1980 (16.6) for the first week of the month. The second week of November remained cool, with highs just above freezing, again far from records set in other years. The same pattern continued through the third and fourth weeks of November, with November 27 and 28 seeing overnight lows drop to -16.6 to -17.2. The low temperatures were nowhere near records set in 1985, which remains the coldest November on record for the 79 years during which weather records were kept for Princeton.

There was one record low set in 2014, which broke the record for November 30 with -27.

Snowfall in November was minimal, and in sharp contrast to the record snowfall of 2014, when 46.2 cm. fell overnight November 24-25. That snow was very heavy and resulted in a great deal of damage to trees and shrubbery.

The first two weeks of December carried on the trend of moderate temperatures, neither remarkably high nor remarkably low. A small amount of snow fell and most of it melted. Daily highs ranged between 2 and 5, nothing like the week of 1939 when daytime highs were 7+. December 15 in 2013 broke records at 9 degrees, and in 1946 at 11 degrees on December 10.

Snowfall records for this period in December occurred in 1971 and 1958.

Princeton received its first signif-

icant snowfall on December 18, but it was not record-breaking. In 1990, by mid-December, there was a total of 42 cm. of snow on the ground. Probably the least snow was in December 1993, when there was just a skiff of snow on the ground for Christmas Day. Very little snow fell that winter, leading to the terrible drought year of 1994. One of the most unusual Christmas holiday periods was in 1980, when there was about 30 cm on the ground on December 23, and rain began to fall on Christmas Eve, continuing through Boxing Day, when rivers and creeks throughout southern B.C. flooded and highways were closed in many locations, such as the Hope-Princeton Highway, and numerous connector highways in the Fraser Valley, Okanagan Valley and the Thompson region.

.....continued from Page 6 was not as fortunate as Princeton. November weather was hell in the Middle East due to very heavy storms causing flooding in Yemen, Turkey, Israel and Jordan. A rare heavy hail storm in Saudi Arabia created an extraordinary sight: a

river of ice flowing across the desert sand.

Alaska saw some extremely cold weather in late November, but the cold spell lasted just one week.

December was brutal for England and Ireland. One of the worst storms of this century hit northwest England causing flooding and some deaths. In Ireland, the Shannon River rose and flooded due to heavy rain. In Oregon, heavy rains became destructive and 13 counties were declared State of Emergency. In Tillamook, the road and hillside began to slide away in one area. Arizona had unprecedented cold in mid-December. Flagstaff saw an overnight temperature of -17 Celsius, and Phoenix dropped to +9 Celsius. On December 14, half of Turkey was impassable due to heavy snowfall. Alaska saw hurricane force winds blow in from the sea on December 12. Northern China saw some of the earliest snow in decades.

Not all of the news was bad. By the beginning of December, Hudson Bay was 50 percent frozen, and the east Arctic Ocean was closed by ice between Greenland and Baffin Island. The polar bears should find this winter back to normal.

Autumn was very nice, with moderate temperatures, a lot of rain in November (much needed) and a skiff of snow in late November.

Science continues to show us there is a strong connection between our minds and our bodies. How we see ourselves can often shape who we are physically. A person suffering from anorexia looks in the mirror and sees somebody too fat, when in reality there is just skin and bone. An obese person looks in the mirror and sees 'average weight' when in fact the person is grossly overweight. Seeing 'old' to many people actually means 'too old' for many things they used to enjoy.

Age is a matter of perception, but a negative perception will have a negative impact on your health. 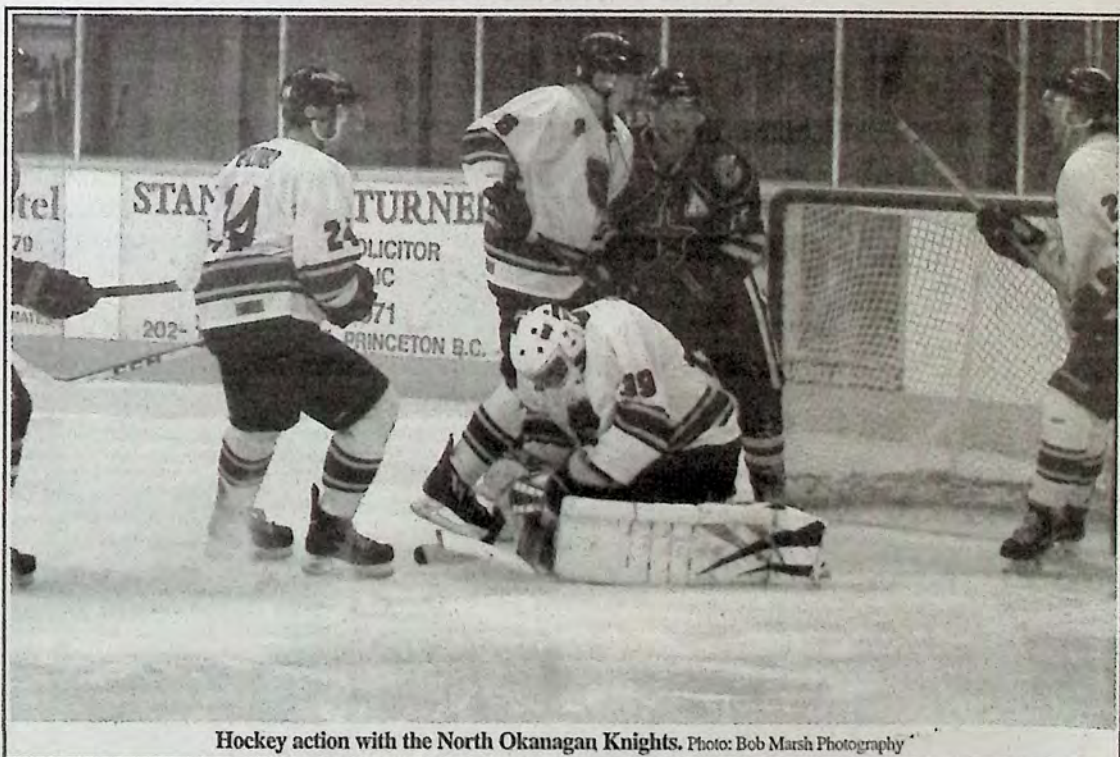

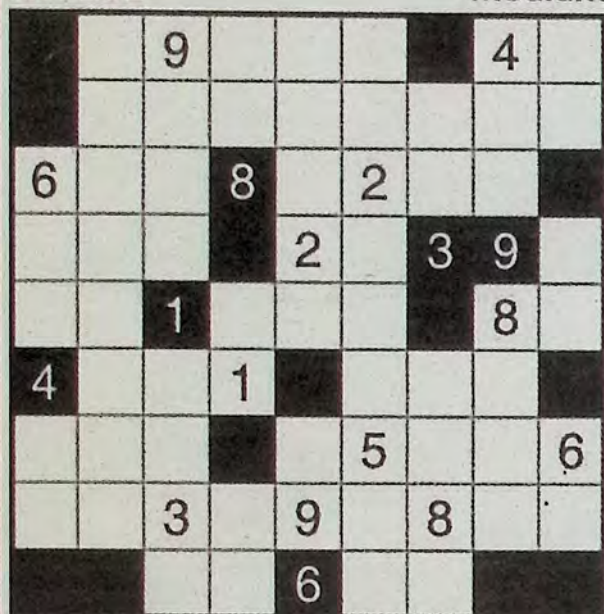

Is the downtown core due for a complete face-lift? A controversial move with the OCP could pave the way to an incredible opportunity for the entire community.*

Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

This week I am going to look a bit deeper into the OCP and the requirements Town Council has put on four properties located along Burton Avenue.

To bring you up to date, a landscape strip, with a design approved by Town Council, is to be placed along the north side of Burton Avenue before OCP and Zoning amendments will be finally adopted by the Town. Conditions placed on the landscape strip include regular maintenance and a year deadline to

have it installed. If the conditions are not met, the amendments are erased.

Think about that for a moment. I see a lot of good things coming from this decision that the Town of Princeton has called a compromise.

Firstly I have to point out I did not attend the public meeting on the amendments, although my wife and I are property owners on that corridor. The Town of Princeton was kind enough to release a transcription from that meeting and I won't

get into it here but you can probably download a copy from the Town of Princeton website. I applaud Council for making this public as it does assist one in figuring out the difference between rumour and fact circulating on the matter.

As a Burton Avenue resident I have stated recently in this column that I knew when I invested in the neighbourhood that it was all industrial in nature long before our home appeared in the area. As a result, I expect some heavy truck traffic, noise and congestion.

I also have to applaud Town Council on their move to try to enhance the area with the suggestion of a landscape strip to sort of break up the two visual zones of industrial and residential (someone called our homes "awful," but that's a whole different story) in a kind of transitional zone.

What I see loud and clear in this entire requirement of a landscape strip is an opportunity.

I see this as actually a tremendous step into the future and on a number of different levels. Firstly, if I owned a landscaping business or a garden centre I would jump all over the landscape strip and submit a design to Town Council that would incorporate touches that would be identified as being Similkameen. I would use rocks, gravel, shrubbery and ornamental grasses that would not only be native to the region but would be something I could sell out of my landscape/gardening centre.

For me, that spells win/win. The Town gets their conditions met and the businesses involved stand a chance at getting something in return. Secondly, I would also use my "winning" landscape design (approved by Town Council) as a tool to push for a contract to design, install and provide materials for additional landscape strips in transitional zones throughout the community.

Thirdly, I would approach some of

the homeowners of the "awful" homes along Burton Avenue (and I include ourselves in that list) with an offer to assist in any way possible to beautify their properties. If homeowners in the area decide to purchase their supplies locally they should also receive a discounted price as part of the beautification program.

Once the Burton Avenue neighbourhood conforms to a new mixed industrial/residential transition look complete with landscaping, new fencing, siding, etc. the movement can stretch into other parts of the community with a particular emphasis on the downtown core.

I think the lifespan of the Edwardian building facade theme has run its course. My fourth opportunity would be to push Town Council (hopefully with the support of the Chamber of Commerce) to change the downtown facade program to something

An Introduction Into Fun With Photography Picture #2 Corn Stalks (refer to Picture #1 Corn Stalks): Enjoying photography includes being able to change and manipulate perspective. Eye-level images are boring because everyone sees them. The humble corn stalk can be given a facelift by crouching and pointing the camera upward. Dark corn stalks against a light sky give contrast of light. The seedy tassels at the top are spindly and are hardly noticeable in the first picture, whereas in the second picture they offer contrast of shape. The delicate tassels have their own backdrop and gain prominence because they are like a crown. The irony of something spindly gaining prominence plays with our subconscious idea of the perfect world (something that doesn't exist). Fortunately in British Columbia there are mountains to offer a subtle background for those who prefer to read more into the picture than the first glance. The encroachment of Pincushion Mountain from the right gives the photo depth, and the absence of a mountain in the left side of the picture once again gives (you guessed it) contrast. The simplicity of the tassels balances the jumble of corn stalks in the bottom of the photo. Don't worry about framing your image dead-centre unless the image is a portrait. Instead, photographs and paintings are more interesting if divided into visual "thirds," horizontally and vertically. Photography is a solitary pursuit: don't expect your acquaintances to go "ga-ga" over a photo you are proud of. Give yourself full credit when you take a picture that you really like. more contemporary. Again, big

opportunity for the businesses that
had to start all of this with a land-

scape strip along the north side of
Burton Avenue.

So when I hear people complain-
ing about the conditions and restric-
tions Town Council has put on these
particular OCP/Zoning Bylaw
amendments I see people missing
the big picture and opportunities
that could have some part in push-

ing Princeton into the future.

Sure, maybe this example is not as
obvious to some but if you take the
time to look at what it can be as an
enhancement rather than viewed as
a penalty or some other negative, it
becomes clear what is really going
on here.

I can't help but think about how

something as simple as a linear
green space has become such an
issue when in actual fact it is meant
to act as a visual, beautification
buffer.

I think Town Council may be on to
something here.

If you agree with me, tell your
elected officials. They need to hear
from you so that they can make
decisions that better reflect the
wishes of the people they represent.
And if I was in the landscaping
business I'd be thinking the Town
had just given me a gift.

How does this save downtown
Princeton?

Improving the look of a neigh-
bourhood makes part of the com-
munity attractive. When we all see
what it does to enhance the value of
our property we all will want in on
the action. The movement will
spread and once the entire commu-
nity gets a face-lift, we will see a
population increase, an increase in
retail and service industry and
much more. People generally want
to live somewhere 'nice' and that
usually means somewhere attrac-
tive. It will take some time but
something as basic as a single land-
scape strip in one neighbourhood
could lead to a full transformation
of our community.
