## Council receives grandstand update

Lyle Thomas, Director of Recreation and Culture presented a project update to Princeton Town Council at the June 6th regular meeting. The renovation project is at Princeton Fairgrounds and is focused on the grandstand seating area facing the race track and rodeo arena.

The grandstand is roughly 45 years old and has a seating capacity of about 500.

"They are in reasonably good condition for their age however, they are an area we as a Town and the Princeton Exhibition Board need to be sensitive to the condition and safety," Thomas states in his report.

"Good maintenance is key to the lifespan of the grandstand and it

would be very costly to replace them if we let them deteriorate to a point where they were no longer serviceable."

The need to upgrade the grandstand is resulting from the popularity in the multi-use aspect of the fairgrounds which is attracting more and more events. Each of these events depends on grandstand seat-

ing. Following some work initiated by the PXA in 2015, the Town of Princeton has committed a number of additional items to complete the grandstand renovation project.

They include: improving drainage at the front of the grandstands; creating better access and egress as per fire code; providing a safe handicap

viewing area; protecting all beam .....continued on Page 3

One thing you may have noticed about the content in this newspaper over the years is what kinds of things we consider news. Sure, there are accidents and fires but typically we have chosen to focus on other events that go on in and around our community and valley.

In fact this is the Similkameen News Leader as opposed to the Princeton News Leader because the ownership and editorial staff

here has always viewed the entire Similkameen Valley as a single entity. Yes, there are some very distinct differences from one end to the other but we all share so many of the same things. This is why there has always been coverage of Hedley, Keremeos and Cawston in the pages of this newspaper along with Princeton, Tulameen and Coalmont.

When I took over the control of

the day-to-day workings of this publication in early 2004 I also slowly shifted the direction of the content. Dawn and I have had a long history in Princeton with community service and as such have always had a good understanding of the importance of volunteers and other accomplishments and contributions residents make to this region.

While other publications consider a lot of what we write as 'soft news' our philosophy is that that kind of news is as important as the big splashy headlines. As you may have noticed over the months in Saving Downtown Princeton I have continued to point out the importance of the character and culture of the community. The majority of that comes from heartfelt (and often thankless) giving back by residents to try to make our home a better place.

It is also soft news that attracts me as a reporter because it often deals with subject matter that is more

people oriented and social in nature.

That being said, one of the annual events that never get much attention without our presence is the Retirement Long Service Celebration hosted by School District 58 (Nicola-Similkameen). It never runs more than an hour, but gives the School District an opportunity to honour the dedication and contribution teachers and district staff provide to students in the schools in Princeton. They host two events, one here and one in Merritt.

I enjoy seeing the interaction between those being honoured and I have been to enough of these celebrations to know that in many cases the 'no shows' are not entirely avoiding recognition because of political reasons, although that does play a role at times. Often those who do not attend are staying away because they do not wish to be recognized. I still like that the District feels it is an important exercise just the same.

Of all the School District Retirement Long Service Celebrations I have attended the most favourite photo I snapped is the one that appears on the front page of this issue. It was taken during the June 2008 celebration and features retiring (and incredibly popular) teacher Diane Rodewoldt who was recognized for her 33 years of work in the District.

If my memory serves correctly, that was the first year the District presented engraved school bells to the teachers who retired. After the ceremony had ended and many of us were enjoying snacks and socializing Rodewoldt was posing for a photo with her school bell for a fellow teacher. I had to snap one for myself and it ended up on the front page of that issue.

This newspaper has had a long, friendly and close relationship with School District 58. It dates back to when I used to cover the meetings of School Trustees when the .....continued on Page 8

## Council receives park project update

Michael Mazurek, Director of Infrastructure and Parks, presented an update to Princeton Town Council June 6th on the Bridgeview Park project.

The first phase of the project has been completed which included a legal land survey which assisted in identifying the exact property boundaries. That allowed for site preparation including brush removal, leveling, back blading and the location of the "best path route through the park."

Mazurek says the second phase of the project is "progressing well" and includes completion of the primary water service installation. This is to "accommodate future irrigation and a planned drinking fountain."

Paving of the path is expected to

be finished by the end of this month with up to twenty new trees to be added to the grounds. The project is projected to be complete in 2017.

"It is anticipated, based on recent

public comment, that, upon completion, the new Bridgeview Park will become one of the most used and functional developments within the Town of Princeton."

## A Tribute To Fathers

would just as soon go fishing, but they go to the job. They could blow the shift, but they do not want a reputation that they are unreliable. They could blow the shift, but it might mean son Billy doesn't get those new shoes he needs, or daughter Jane might have to wait longer to enter college.

A lot of these men are injured on the job, or risk their health on the job, but they keep going back. They are raising families, and that is their top priority.

Often, the children of these ordinary men do not think of Dad as a hero. Every father has faults, of course, but none of us are perfect. What the youngsters will not understand until they go out to work and raise a family. They will not comprehend the commitment and dedication of these ordinary men to providing for their families.

A young man might ask, "Hey, Dad, how come we have to ride around in this beat up old car?"

Dad's answer should be, "I'm feeding you."

When a father goes out to work, day in and day out, he is providing a roof over the heads of others. He is feeding others and putting clothes on their backs. He is providing an education for others, and entertainment for others, and nobody asks why he is giving all these things to other people.

Each hour he is on the job represents money earned, but it represents more than money. That hour is an hour of his life, and he has given that hour of his life to other people, his wife, his children, and through taxes, to his town, province and nation, but mostly, he is giving it to his children.

Why does he do this?

The simple answer is: he loves them. The true answer is this: he has placed a higher value on his wife and children than on himself. If he is injured on the job, he will go back to it for the same reason. If he must go to war, he will put a higher value on the lives of his family than on his own life.

If you have had a father like this, then you know how much you were valued.

I see all sorts of advertising about what to buy for Dad on Father's Day, but Dad needs something more precious to him than anything you can buy him. He needs the recognition that everything he has done has been appreciated, that his children understand the sacrifices he made by going out to work every day. That recognition, that appreciation, means more than anything you can buy him. The words need to be said, whether in a phone call, a visit, or a special way of making his life easier.

We take a father's work too much for granted, because being a good provider is what being a father is all about, but we should say the words of appreciation when a father does what fathers should do.

I remember standing at the graveside of the burial of one such man and listening to his son say, "I don't know how he did it. He raised five kids, and we never went hungry, we always had a home, we always had what we needed."

Well, I know how he did it. One day at a time, day after day, he went to his job and gave to others the hours of his life, because he valued others more than they knew.

It seems Mother's Day gets a lot more attention than Father's Day. I don't believe this is fair.

Recently, I attended a Celebration of Life for a man who is like millions of other men. He had been a father during his long life, and what was said of him was that he was a hard worker, good-natured, and he would be missed. As I said, he was a man like millions of others.

No history books are written about such men. No great tributes are paid to them, although they are the backbone of our economy. They go out day after day and do a job somewhere, raise a family, and that's their story.

I have known many such men, in my family and the families of others. They are not appreciated enough.

These men go out to the job in bitter winter weather, in the blazing heat of summer, and they put in their shift. A lot of them go to jobs they don't particularly like, but it's a living. They go even though they don't feel like working. Maybe they don't feel up to par, or maybe it's a gorgeous spring day and they

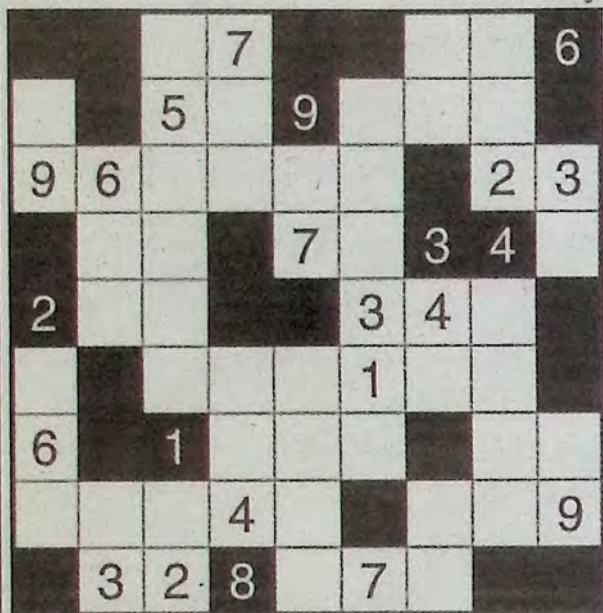

# Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists

## Field Trip with Nicola Valley Naturalists

We chose one of the hottest days of the season (35 degrees!) to go birding with the Nicola Valley naturalists, but what a success it was!! On Sunday, June 5th, 12 Vermilion Forks Field Naturalists

joined 16 members of the Merritt club at Seven Half Diamond Ranch, where we had been given permission by owners Jim and Heather O'Connor to meander.

We spent over three hours roaming the trails and admiring the

scenic landscape, where rolling ranchland is dotted with ponds and marshes.

Led by ornithologist Alan Burger, we observed 46 species of birds, highlights of which were Kildeer, Sora, Eastern Kingbird, Yellow-headed Blackbird, Swainson's Thrush, Cinnamon Teal and Blue-winged Teal. Goslings and ducklings were prevalent, including Mallard, Bufflehead and Barrow's Goldeneye babies. We also spotted a couple of Western Terrestrial Garter Snakes in Batstone Lake, a Columbia Spotted Frog, and numerous Western Toad tadpoles and

'toadlets' (one-year-olds).

Although the day was warm, we found a shady spot by one of the ponds for our lunch break, where the mosquitoes weren't too pesky! Halfway along our walk we were entertained by a group of steers who raced towards us as if expecting food, then galloped away at full speed, perhaps realizing their mistake. A few of us were privileged to have a tour of the main house before we left this spectacular site, and we thank the O'Connors for their gracious hospitality. It was a splendid day!

Our next field trip will be Saturday, June 25th, when local archeologist Brenda Gould will

identify a variety of artifacts at our very own wildlife sanctuary, Swan Lake. We'll meet at Billy's Restaurant parking lot at 8:45 AM with water and snack. Please confirm participation with Mary Masiel at 250-295-7154.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, June 14th, at Riverside Centre, with Wendy Hawkes, Natural Resources Referral Coordinator with the Lower Similkameen Indian Band as our guest speaker. Her topic will be First Nations ancestral burials and the Heritage Conservation Act.

## Buy Yourself A Straw Hat

Researchers at the University of Copenhagen have released a study indicating that most sunscreen products interfere with male fertility by mimicking the female hormone progesterone.

In Mexico, women working out in the sun use avocado oil to keep the skin smooth and nourished.

This product can be purchased at most health stores, and it should be used after exposure to the sun, not during exposure. This is a natural product, containing none of the synthetic ingredients shown to cause health problems.

# Saving Downtown Princeton...

...An Ongoing Series by George Elliott

Since word has spread over the past week or so about the closure of this weekly newspaper there have been a few rumours. I squelched one last week and I'm going to do the same with another one.

This week's rumour is that I sold the Similkameen News Leader to

Black Press. Again, that is not true. I have chosen to just shut the doors and walk away. There has not been discussion of a sale of any kind. The interesting thing about Black Press is that the closure of this paper does have an effect on my competitor. Black Press owns the

printing press that prints each and every newspaper and reading publication from Peachland to Omak and from Rock Creek to Princeton. The loss of the News Leader means they will see a drop in revenue in the neighbourhood of \$32,500 per year - what it cost to print this paper.

We are not the only one to shut down this week, either. Another paper printed at the same location (a monthly based in Summerland) announced last week that they were also ceasing publication.

The small guys can't compete against a giant corporation that is designed to hover just at the breakeven point. David Black said so in MacLean's Magazine in May 2009. He explained his business plan like this: "For every two papers we've got that are making money, we want to have one in the incubator that's losing money so, effectively, that reduces the taxes we pay."

That makes it hard for indepen-

dently-owned newspapers, like the Similkameen News Leader, when it comes to such things as advertising pricing. It's a lot like a small mom and pop ice cream store charging \$3.00 a scoop and the giant Ice Cream World down the street charging half that and giving away additional cones because they aren't in it to make a profit.

So, once again, this newspaper was not sold and we aren't sitting on a bag of money as a result. The reality is that we just can't compete against various forms of advertising that are far cheaper than what we can afford to sell ours at. Nothing more.

All of this talk about running a business at breakeven got me thinking about the proposed aquatic centre project. I know, a bit of an odd segue but follow me here and maybe you'll understand. I think most of us agree that the building of the pool will be easy. There will be tons of funding sources available

through matching grants or any number of infrastructure enhancing grants through Canada 150 and additional government funds. We all pretty much agree that with the donation of land to the Town of Princeton by the Overwaitea Food Group the cost of the project suddenly got a whole lot cheaper.

I'm also pretty sure that most of us agree that what have many Princeton area taxpayers concerned are the ongoing operating costs after the aquatic centre is open for business. There have been documented examples that verify that the annual operating costs of any such facility will prove to be the biggest hurdle any community - big, medium or small - faces after the shine wears off of the new chrome and whatnot.

Here's where I'm going with this: why not combine a few of the amenities residents say they want here with the giant, costly facility in .....continued on Page 16
