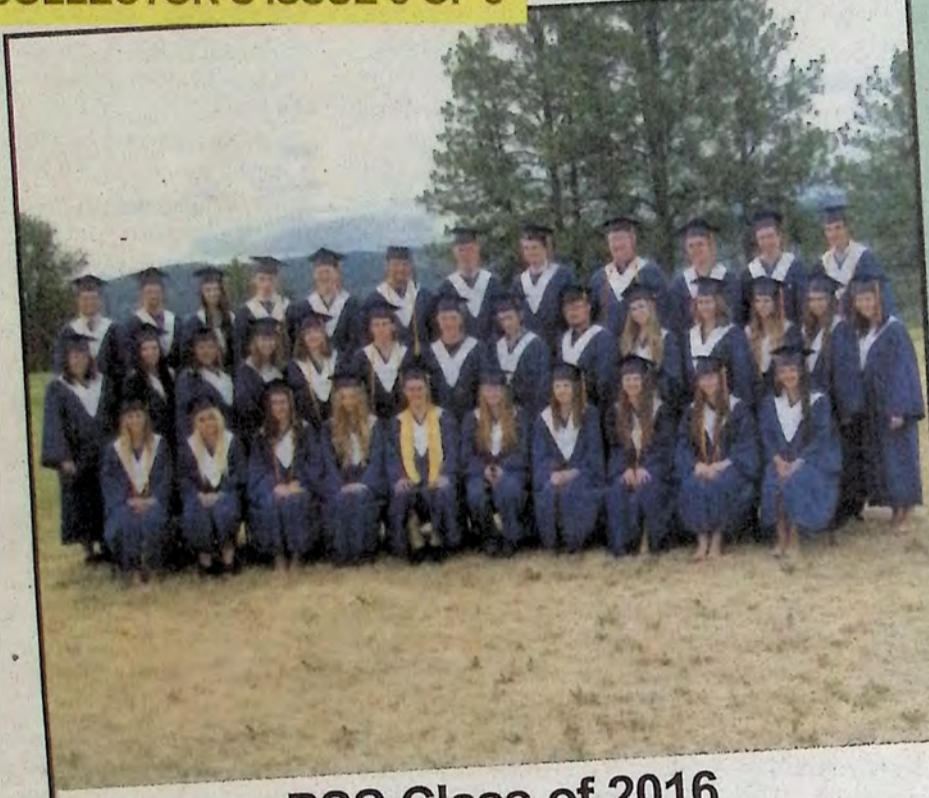

Museum does good things for Princeton

The Princeton Museum is all about bringing people together and connecting them with our heritage. A fine example of this kind of com-

ing together happened on the afternoon on June 26th. It was a beautiful sunny Sunday, not a day you'd expect people to want to sit inside a museum. Surprisingly about 45 people came to the Museum to hear Don Gayton speak about the ecology of wildfires. It was an interested and engaged audience — including a group of firefighters — who made comments and asked lots of questions. Many stayed after the presentation to talk, share stories and to become members of the Museum.

The day before this event Jackie Tegart, our local MLA, visited the Princeton Museum for the first time. She was very impressed by what she saw and plans to return.

Sometimes the Museum connects

people with relatives who are no longer alive. Thanks to the Elks Club, the Museum has a collection of letters written by World War II soldiers from Princeton thanking the Elks for sending cigarettes. Evelyn McCallum, the Museum's Honorary President, has been going through these letters, trying to connect them to living relatives. She phoned the son of one of the soldiers and read him his father's letter. He had never known his father because he was conceived before his parents were even married. When he heard his father's 'voice' from the past he was overcome.

A 77-year old woman was searching for an older half-sister whom she'd only recently found out existed. She tried every avenue she could think of but without success. She knew the woman had lived in Princeton at some time so in desperation she called the Princeton Museum. Museum Board member Lori Weissbach began to search and eventually found the woman's death certificate in Vital Statistics. The searcher was contacted and through the information given to her by Lori was able to connect with the dead

woman's grandchildren, nieces and nephews. She now has a whole other branch of the family to love. All of this just from a phone call to Museum.

The Museum's latest "bringing together" is its connection with local First Nations. During the past school year the Museum has worked with Tim Manuel, the District Aboriginal Resource Teacher, on creating First Nations displays at Princeton's two elementary schools. June 21 was Nation Aboriginal Day. With the collaboration of Barb Parker, the local schools' First Nations Support Worker, the Museum hosted seven elementary school classes on a field trip. Thanks to the Princeton Secondary First Nations Support worker Renee Hartwell there was

Graduation time is not only a special time for Grade 12 students in Princeton - it is also a special time for us here at the Similkameen News Leader.

During the course of an average year we have two 'big' issues. For us, a 'big' issue is one with a lot of advertising and although our Christmas Issue in December is normally the one with the most advertising in a single issue, the Grad Issue is a close second. There are other 'special' issues but the two main ones for us are at Christmas and Grad and they are exactly six months apart.

This newspaper has always presented Grad in our own way focusing on the casual rather than formal

and as a result, each Grad Issue has contained small mini group shots of students rather than headshots. The only exception to this rule occurred when one particular (to be unnamed) Grad Class was far too late on arriving to PSS for group photos.

The morning of graduation starts at 10:00 AM when students are to be on site for formal photos. The official professional photographer hired by the school is there and sets up and takes an outdoor group photo of the class. This is followed by individual photos of each student receiving their diploma in a handshake photo with their Principal.

I am always there by 9:30 AM so

I can coordinate my photos with the official photographer and we work together to achieve our goals. After each student poses for their 'handshake shot' I gather them off to one side of the stage for my mini group shots. Depending on the size of the Grad Class, these shots will have anywhere from five to seven students in them.

I am a creature of habit so I line the students up in alphabetical order - mostly because I don't know them all - so I can properly identify each student later when I put the Grad Section together.

Our mini group shots have been popular over the years as I have a clear direction I give to each group before I take my shots. If they are friends, I instruct them to "get friendly" by putting arms around each other or whatever else they want to do (within reason) for the photo. It doesn't take long to figure out which students are friends and which ones aren't in the photos. Regardless, there has rarely been a time when this system has failed.

I can honestly say that the past four or five Grad classes have been easy to work with and very cooperative and accommodating. There are also times when they will surprise me with a photo that I was not expecting.

Last year was a fine example.

While shooting the mini group shots, then Vice Principal Patrick Kaiser 'photo bombed' one by peeking through the curtain behind the group of Grads in the photo. It was such a great moment that the photo ran as was in the Grad section.

tion.

One of my all-time favourite Grad mini group shots dates back to the Class of 2009. One group of five girls took my "get friendly" suggestion and turned the photo into a celebration of their friendship with hugs and smiles that were clearly the most genuine you could get.

It will be a lasting memory for me about the PSS Grad Issue that I will cherish for many years to come.

As for the actual ceremony, I usually sit up front near the stage for the best vantage point and snap away from my seat. This year I did not stay for the ceremony. For me, it was too emotional a time - the final Grad Class to appear in my newspaper just weeks before we shut down our business - and, quite honestly, I didn't think I could get through it.

That being said, both Brenda and I attended the Grand March downtown at Veterans Square for the first time. Usually when those activities are taking place (and the Grand March is a relatively new addition in recent years) I am holed up in the office working madly to finish the Grad Issue on what normally becomes a full weekend at work.

This year I took the weekend off and chose to put together our annual Grad Issue a week later so I could share with you reflections of mine and past photos of Grad classes we have featured over the years.

Although the Similkameen News Leader has been publishing a weekly paper for just over 19 years, the outdoor group shot of the grad-

uating class was a tradition I started after I took over the day-to-day operation of this business in 2004. At the time, as I've stated before, there were two 'big' issues a year. Those were the only issues we printed with full colour front pages. That was simply because it cost too much for our small, independent newspaper to print colour on a regular basis.

As the Grad Issue featured colour, I started putting the Grad Class group shot on the front page each year. Once costs dropped for colour processing, we were able to print a full colour paper weekly, although colour has mostly been restricted to four pages of each issue - the front, back and centre pages.

As we print our paper at a print shop owned by a company that also owns 50+ community newspapers in British Columbia (and we are not one of them), we don't receive discounts or special pricing of any kind. That is why in the early years, full colour issues of the News Leader were rare.

This year I would like to thank the Graduating Class of 2016 for their kindness towards this newspaper (see page 9) as well as the teaching staff at PSS for their continued support and encouragement (as well as all teachers, principals, staff, etc. at all Princeton schools).

I would also like to extend a huge thank you to the advertisers who always support our Grad Issue. It is entirely because of them that we were able to start making it one of our annual feature issues.

Important Reminder for Owners of Fruit Bearing Trees or Shrubs

Cherry season is well underway. The July heat will again bring out the tree fruit pests. Since 2001, to protect the commercial fruit industry, the RDOS has had a Bylaw in effect to better control pests that attack tree fruits and/or berries in Electoral Areas: 'A', 'B', 'C', 'D', 'F', 'G' and the Town of Oliver.

This Bylaw has recently been updated to include new species and emerging threats. All owners or

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen recognizes the significant value of volunteers, volunteer groups and agencies to the spiritual, educational, social, cultural, and physical well-being of the region. These non-profit organizations have the opportunity to apply for a Property Tax Exemption. The following criteria will determine eligibility. The applicant(s) must:

Qualify for an exemption under the provisions of the Local Government Act, the general authority for property tax exemptions. (Sections 809 and 810); Be in compliance with Regional District policies, plans, bylaws, and regulations (i.e. zoning); Be a non-profit organization; Not be in competition with for-profit business; Provide services or programs that are compatible or complementary to those offered by the Regional District; Provide a service that fulfills some basic need, or otherwise improves the quality of life for residents of the Regional District; Not provide liquor or meal services as their primary function or source of revenue; Not collect rent on a caretaker or other residence located on the property.

Application forms are available online at www.rdos.bc.ca. Or at the RDOS office, 101 Martin Street, Penticton, BC. The deadline for submitting completed application forms including supporting documentation is JULY 31, 2016.

Successful applicants may be asked to publicly acknowledge the exemption. If you require further information, assistance completing your application or wish to view the Property Tax Exemption Policy, please call Michelle Sideroff, Finance Department at 250-490-4227 or email at msideroff@rdos.bc.ca

WHEN DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

Building permits and inspections help ensure that health and safety standards are met for new construction projects. Permits require that construction complies with the BC Building Code, local zoning and servicing bylaws and may be a trigger for environmental assessments.

Before you start a building or renovation project in the RDOS or the municipalities in the region you need to determine what you are allowed to build on your property and if you need a building permit. The zoning of your property identifies what uses are allowed, how large/tall the building is and how far the building is to be located from property lines as well as other conditions. You can look up the zoning bylaw for your property with RDOS Planning department or on our website at www.rdos.bc.ca under Planning. In general, a building permit is needed to:

Construct a new building; Change the occupancy of an existing building (ie. convert a house to an office); Complete an unfinished space, like a basement; Expand or carry out structural alterations or major repairs to an existing building including a deck; Build a garage, shed or other accessory building over 107 sq. ft. (10m²) in area; Demolish or move a building or place a manufactured home; Construct a retaining wall over 4 feet (1.2m) in height; Install a solid fuel burning appliance; Construct a swimming pool; Add or relocate plumbing fixtures

Prior to starting work, contact RDOS Building Inspection for specific permit requirements. Also remember that rewiring and renovations that involve gas or electricity may require permits and inspections from the BC Safety Authority. RDOS Building Inspection 250-490-4205.

Sure, That'll Work

By now you've very likely heard something about an ATV rally. The idea is to more or less fill the downtown core with bumper-to-bumper ATVs with local merchants flinging open their doors welcoming the extra traffic and customers.

Here's the spoiler: when I was first approached to assist with the 'promotion' of this plan, it was explained to me that the whole event was meant to "stick it to Town Hall."

While I openly admit I also may have an axe or two to grind with Town Hall, I have always chosen to use sarcasm rather than malice to get my point across. I am not saying flooding the downtown core with an army of ATVs won't boost the local economy for a little while, but I have to admit there are far better ways to get the attention - and more importantly - the support of Town Council and the rest of the bodies in Town Hall.

I don't buy the argument of "We've tried everything" because forcing the town leaders to circle their wagons is only going to do one thing - piss them off a little bit more. Trust me, I can tell you first hand what that will do for the cause once that line is crossed.

I think we all need to take a step back and look at what we are dealing with here.

The people who occupy the important office space at Town Hall actually control what happens with our community. Town Council has some influence through consultation and thanks to something called the Community Charter and Local Government Act, have tools to use to make change, if everyone agrees that change is required.

Everyone in the Town Hall building responds to logic. Bullying just gets their back up. It also strips away any credibility built up to this point that could have been used as leverage.

So, with this in mind, local business owner/operators are being banned together by ATVers to "stick it to Town Hall" in order to assist just one special interest group? What happens to the credibility earned by the Chamber of Commerce after successfully helping local businesses with the aforementioned bylaw?

I'm not saying I disagree with ATV use in town because I honestly do support that and think Town Council needs to rethink the entire issue. What I disagree with is the method in which the message is being sent because it looks like bully tactics to me.

If you have ever been bullied, then you will know how unfair that is.

bannock cooking in front of the Museum. Oly Bent from the Upper Similkameen Indian Band in Hedley taught hand drumming and everyone learned the "Welcome Song."

The visible activity attracted a lot of visitors to the Museum. Summer Student Bradley Clements built an indigenous artifact exhibit, complete with an indigenous territory map, as well as a scavenger hunt, where pupils located the First Nations artifacts

in the museum. Comments from both pupils and their parents after the event expressed joy and gratitude for this rich cross-cultural experience.

Thanks to Vice President Tip Anderson, the Museum is in the process of building a relationship of strength and understanding with the Upper and Lower Similkameen Indian Bands so that the Museum can better reflect all facets of our history.

The Museum has created a partnership with the Granite Creek

Preservation Society, the group that is revitalizing and taking care of the site of the 1885 gold rush town of Granite Creek just across from Coalmont. The Society meets at the Museum and the two organizations share information, resources and activities.

Thanks to hard work on the part of Robin Irwin, the Museum Manager, there are five students working in the Museum over the summer. There were a total of twelve applicants for these five positions and the Museum wishes they could have hired them all. Working at the Museum this summer will be Isabella Brodie, Bradley Clements, Sam McEwen, Atlanta Neudorf and Chase Rempel.

The Museum is looking forward to a busy summer with expanded opening hours. Looking Back At Princeton

I am one of Princeton's oldtimers. I grew up here, was gone for 15 years, and moved back. My family goes back a few generations in the Princeton area. I have seen a lot of changes in Princeton, most of them in the form of improvements. The Princeton in which I now live is a much more convenient and comfortable place in most ways. We have water and sewer service all over town, for example, and garbage pick-up, and nice school buildings. We have an indoor ice rink and an indoor curling rink and an 18 hole golf course. We have a swimming pool, tennis courts, good ball fields (grass, not cinders) and we have the exhibition grounds.

We do not have as many stores as we had and this is due to the highway and better, faster vehicles. People like to go to the big stores in cities to shop. However, we have more service stations, more (and better) coffee shops, fast food outlets and restaurants, and more motels. We have veterinarians, a Town Hall, laundromats (no dry cleaner now), a big Legion Hall, and we have more than one insurance office and more than one real estate office.

Things always change, but as I

look back on the years I have spent in Princeton, I think the best years for our community were the 1970s and 1980s. We were busy building, the town was expanding, people were out and doing things, and making things happen.

Racing Days was the big event of the year, a celebration. There were horse races, foot races, bike races, a golf tournament and ball games. There was a Lions Club raft race down Tulameen River which was hilarious. One year the water was so low that people on the rafts got off and lifted the rafts off the rocks and carried them to deeper pools. Young women competed to be "Miss Princeton." The Elks Lodge and the Legion hosted Racing Days dances. Princeton Rotary Club sponsored a parade (and still does).

The Elks Lodge and the Lions Club have faded into history, which brings me to one of the biggest changes in Princeton: loss of social connectedness. The community spirit that built the race track, grandstand, barns and buildings at the fairgrounds, the indoor ice rink, Vermilion Court, the ball fields, the parks, the golf course, and the groups who put on the entertainment, is missing. Most groups still in existence struggle to find active members. The many groups who met for coffee so frequently were part of something, planning something, getting out on weekends to do things together, are in short supply these days.

I have talked to many people about why that changed. One of the reasons is the change in the number of people over 65, many of whom are unable to get out and do much, and who do not like going out in the evening. Some people tell me it must be the time people spend on their computers or watching televi-

sion. They say people do not want to go out and do things with other people. Some people say it is Facebook, where people can talk about things with their friends without doing anything with their friends. I do not know if that is why things have changed so much.

Others tell me it is hard to make friends in Princeton. That might be true, but if nobody wants to go out and join a group, how do they make friends? When I moved back here after being away for 15 years, I had no problem making friends. I met the people I worked with, the people my husband worked with, the neighbours, the parents of children whose children went to school with my children. I met people at the bank, the insurance company, the shops and other business people. I joined a couple of women's groups and made friends there, many of them such good friends. I am old now, and too many of the friends I made have passed away, but I still have plenty of friends, because I am out there doing things with people.

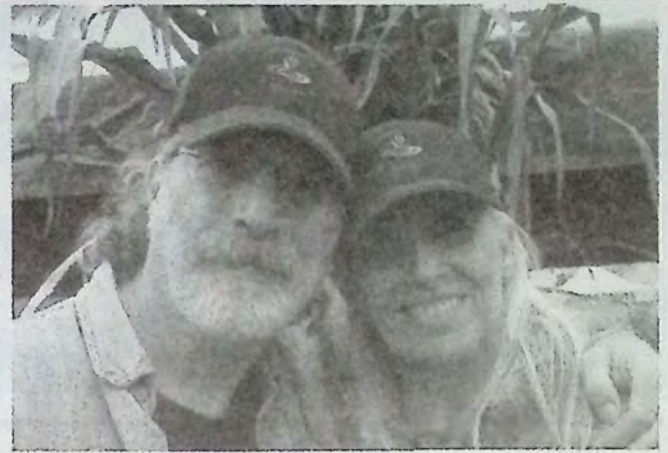
Community spirit means sharing the joys and sorrows of those who live in the same location. It is hard to have community spirit if nobody wants to go out and share time with others living in the same location. I look at Tulameen, a place with wonderful community spirit, and I think how those people in Tulameen are so willing to share their lives with others. Tulameen people, as few as they are, achieve amazing things because they get together, plan, share their efforts, and do things together.

A local resident asked me, "What's happened to Princeton? You can walk down the street at 7:00 PM and there is hardly a soul downtown."

I don't have the answer. Do you?

Six weeks from now the Princeton Traditional Music Festival will be filling downtown Princeton with music and song. The festivities begin with the opening ceremony at 6:00 PM on Friday, August 19th. Right after that is the Festival's annual participatory street dance.

This year the dance will be hosted by Orkestar Slivovica, a high-energy Balkan brass band that has graced the Festival for many years. All dances will be taught and you don't even have to bring a partner.

On Saturday and Sunday, August 20 and 21 there will be music downtown from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM. And it's all free - no admission is charged.

Most of the instrumental music heard at the Festival was traditionally played for dances. That's why, once those fiddles and banjos start up, people tap their feet or get up and move. This year the Festival has five panel sessions featuring a wide variety of instruments.

On Saturday afternoon the 'Irish Session' will fill the stage on Veterans Square. Many of those onstage will never have played together before.

Their love of Irish music brings them together and gives them a shared repertoire of tunes. In this session will be fiddles, banjos, flutes bodhrans, uilleann pipes, guitars, accordions, concertinas and more.

That same afternoon the 'Six Fiddles' session will feature a panel of fiddlers encompassing various styles and traditions.

There are many jokes about banjos, but when played well they are a joy to the ear. The 'Five Banjos' session on Sunday morning features five banjo virtuosos who will delight you with their frailing and finger picking.

The 'Blowing in the Wind' session on Sunday afternoon features instruments that use air to make music. Most often the air is supplied by someone's breath such as woodwind instruments. In this session you will hear several woodwind instruments - clarinet, Irish tin whistle and flute. You will also hear the the tarogato, a Hungarian relative of the clarinet. Some instruments that use air, however, don't require human breath. The uilleann pipes and the shuttle pipes, both of which you'll hear in this session, use air supplied by a bel-

lows that fills the air bag and then squeezed into the chanter. Shuttle pipes, an instrument going back to the 16th century, will be appearing at the Festival for the first time. The name derives from the drones which incorporate a sliding 'shuttle' that raises or lowers the pitch.

If an accordion and a harmonica got married their baby would be a concertina. All three of these instruments are what is known as 'free reed.' The 'reeds' are very small pieces of flat metal that vibrate when air passes over them. These are what make the music in free reed instruments. In a harmonica the air is supplied by the player's breath. With accordions and concertinas the reeds are vibrated by the air forced over them by pushing and pushing the bellows. In all free reed instruments, each reed is in a separate compartment so that individual notes can be played.

In the 'Free Reed' session on Sunday afternoon you will hear piano accordions, button accordions, melodeons (a kind of small button accordion) and a harmonica.

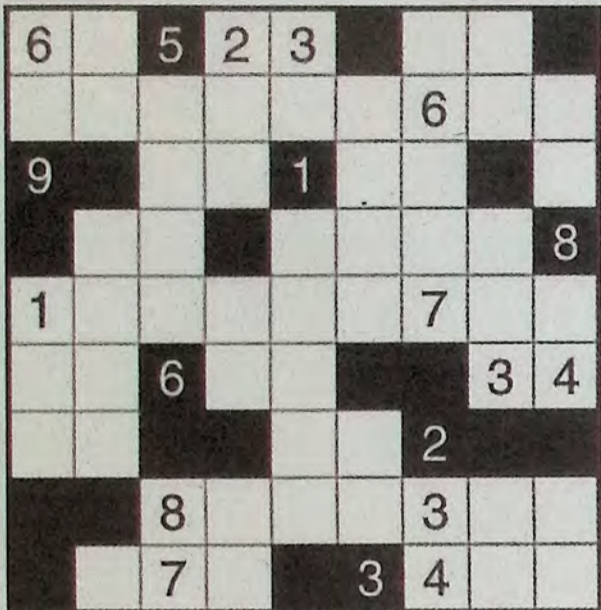

RCMP report suspicious male

Princeton RCMP responded to a report of a suspicious male near a local bank at 9:30 AM on Tuesday, June 16th. He was wearing body armour.

"The suspicious male was observed by unarmoured car staff that were at the bank that morning," explains RCMP Sgt. Mike Savage.

"Once noticed, police were dispatched to the scene. Immediately after being notified by the unarmoured car staff the suspect fled the area in a navy blue Ford Ranger pick up truck."

The man was described to being approximately 35 years of age, wearing dark clothing and dark body armour.

Police conducted a thorough search of the town and surrounding area with assistance from additional officers, a police helicopter and COPS.

"Despite these efforts the suspect vehicle was not located," Sgt. Savage says.

"Police treat these types of calls related to banking institutions as serious. Any area business that has video surveillance and recalls a similar truck that morning is asked to review their video tapes and contact the local detachment."

Crime stats show Princeton is safe

The students in each PSS Grad class are the future of Princeton. Rarely do any of them stay here.

While going through the Similkameen News Leader archives to pull out Grad Issues from years gone by I did notice one significant similarity from one class to another. Very few of the graduates who finish high school in Princeton return.

It makes sense right off the top when you consider that many PSS Grads follow their high school years with post secondary schooling which normally takes them to Kamloops or Kelowna, depending on their professional goals. Others end up further away and while it is not unusual to see a handful of recent graduates in town during summer, very few of them see Princeton as a place to settle, start a family and grow old.

Comparing the 2011 and 2006 census figures we see that Princeton experienced a -2.0-percent growth rate in population. At the time of the 2011 census, Princeton was the only community in the surrounding area to record a reduction in population. Even Keremeos had an increase of population between the five years of those data returns. Possibly the 2016 census will show a slight increase, but that is hard to tell at this time.

What tells the story best is that in 2011 the median age of residents in Princeton was 52.6 years. Although Keremeos saw a 3.2-percent population increase, the median age in that community in 2011 was 60.8 years.

Looking closer by age, 60 to 64-years olds outnumber all other age groups in both Princeton and Keremeos. The age groups with the least population was 20-24 years in Princeton and 30-34 years in Keremeos. Again, keep in mind that these numbers are from 2011.

What does it all mean?

Well, for graduates of Princeton and Keremeos the message is clear. If you intend to become something great, chances are very high you won't be able to do it in your hometown. Even when I was growing up in Kelowna we all talked about getting away to somewhere else to start our lives. At the time, my graduation class had 75 students. That was considered small considering the main school in Kelowna at the time had graduating classes in the high 200s. My school and one other took away a great deal of the pressure in the late 1970s.

However, even though we were also told we were the future of our community, not many of us stuck around to make that come true.

The future of Princeton is not entirely the responsibility of high school graduates, elected officials or resident consumers although they all play a role in pushing the community forward into whatever future becomes the new reality.

Currently, the new reality affecting downtown Princeton and many other small and medium sized downtown cores is the internet, box stores and the ease with which we can travel from one community to another to spend our money. The loyalty that once existed at the trusted corner general store changed many, many years ago with better and more reliable transportation.

The experience of shopping in several local businesses changed with the development of large temperature-controlled buildings housing various shops and services calling shopping malls. The experience of walking from here to there in a mall has been changing with giant box stores that carry every-

thing in a contemporary spin on the general store of bygone years.

The internet changed our shopping habits by allowing us to buy things without leaving our homes and having those items delivered direct to our doors.

The future of any downtown core is faced with these realities which are not attractive to recent graduates considering starting a business unless it's an online business where costs are a fraction of those who have brick and mortar storefronts.

The future, as bleak as it may seem for some of us in business, is still an exciting landscape where someone from our very own high school graduating class may just create the new change that shifts the current reality.

How does this save downtown Princeton?

There is the possibility that one day there will not be a downtown Princeton for shopping or services because we will be able to get everything we need from an online source without stepping into the downtown core. The downtown could become a hub for social activities with an aquatic centre as the central component that all other 'wellness' options are built from.

about how the arena will be the first point of contact for many people who come to Princeton. The pro-

posal covered 'wowing' the public and "contributing to the attractiveness of Princeton." This got me thinking about all the things we have seen council do lately, from their takeover of tourism to taking the arena concession contract back from minor hockey to their attempt to take over the museum. Is this all about crafting an image that a select few in the Halls of Power have for our community? It makes you wonder about the grand scheme that the mayor and council might have for our community.

It does not seem to really be about substance. It's about control, controlling a message and an image that they have but don't seem to be willing to share with the rest of the community. Maybe they are not even sharing it among

all of council, which at this point would not surprise me at all. Take a look at what the town is spending money on right now, \$35,000 on lighting and a paint job at the arena. I agree the arena needs better lighting and has needed it for decades, but is a paint job the most important part of the maintenance that needs to be done up there, right now? 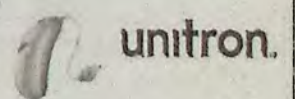
