Well, here we are. The very last issue of the Similkameen News Leader has been published, printed and you are reading it.

I've had a lot of time to think about what I was going to write about in this final issue. I think that is why I chose to 'celebrate' our end with eight weeks of special editions. It allowed me - and many of our readers - the opportunity to slowly get used to the idea that starting next week you won't be reading our paper anymore.

I have a lot I want to say so I will launch right into it.

I have many clients to thank for their support throughout the years. I can't name them all as I'll forget some but there are a few I cannot

miss. I thank Jim and Anna Barnes for being my first-ever advertising clients the first day I started here in 2000. Their ads for Anna's Closet and Hayes Creek Electric were fixtures in the early years of my ownership of the News Leader.

Other stand out clients include Sam Costa (Princeton Light & Power), Ernie Lawrence (Irly Bird) and Lew Smyth (The Source). The last two on that list were 'carry over' clients from my days at the local radio station.

Here's an interesting piece of trivia for you: My very first day of work as Advertising Sales Manager for this paper was July 26, 2000. The date of the final issue of this paper is July 26, 2016. That was something I had discovered only

two weeks ago, so it was far from planned.

I have writers to thank for their contributions. This includes all those who sent contributions from their local clubs, groups and organizations but I would especially like to thank Dawn Johnson and Spencer Coyne for their contributions. I gave both the freedom to say whatever they wanted and rarely stopped them. In fact, I often had no idea what either was going to write about until they sent in their columns.

As you already know, Dawn and I go back many years. Spencer and I do as well and the three of us share the same sense of 'community' and I think that showed often in the product we produced weekly.

I was also blessed to have dedicated writers from the Lower Similkameen including Arlene Arlow and Marty Menzies. Both worked for no pay because they believed in what we were doing here and I am forever grateful for their assistance.

Here's some more trivia for you: the registered company name of my business is Bengel Publishing Inc. The word 'Bengel' comes from my wife's name Brenda Engel. It also stands for "Brenda Engel 'n' George Elliott Limited" so I had an option should my 'first choice' not be accepted when I was incorporating it with the Province of British Columbia.

Another trivia note: The Marmot. For years we had a marmot headshot on the front page masthead. It still exists on top of Pages 4, 6 and 15. The actual photo came from a

open source copyright-free online library. The full body shot of the marmot was actually taken at Phifer's Fountain on Burton Avenue. We have personal connections with that as our home sits on Burton Avenue and I was part of the organizing committee (BEA) that took on the Phifer's Fountain project. I spent many hours on site with others figuring out how to piece it together.

We held a contest at one point to name the marmot and we received some great suggestions but never officially gave him a name. Around our office we have playfully referred to him as 'Paarvo' (our spelling) and it sort of stuck.

I have not put a lot of thought into what will happen once this paper is gone. For some it will be sad, for others, we will very likely not be missed in the slightest. I expect both. However, for Brenda and I it will be very different. On average I spend between 55 and 60 hours a week in the office or running around gathering news and advertising for each issue. Most often that means a work week in the 6 and a half day range.

Only since our announcement that we were closing have I forced myself to take weekends off, although I am still showing up places snapping photos for the next issue. That has been very different for me. I am looking forward to working less hours. I have been writing freelance web content since January 2014 each night and that has added another 25-30 hours of work to my week but has also

opened a door for my next career. I have a number of clients in Australia I have been writing for and many have moved me into ongoing weekly projects knowing about the changes going on in my life with the end of the News Leader.


It will be part of my future along with various other online projects I've been working on but have not had the time to dedicate full time to them. I have already published four eBooks on Amazon and intend to add to that library. I am also going to move into the podcast arena with a series of podcast programs designed to promote existing online products of mine and new ones to come.

Brenda will continue to develop her JamBusters! products and lately we have become 'travelling vendors' which has been enjoyable for both of us. We have had these projects in our lives for the past couple of years and now we will be able to focus on them and turn them into something great.

We have been there when the community mourned together or celebrated. Princeton was never just another stop for us. It was our home. It gave the News Leader something that our competitor could never have, a connection in time and place.

the best. The years I spent as part of the News Leader family have been some best years I have spent in the paper industry and I am happy that I was able to share them with such amazing people. As the News Leader closes its doors and George and Brenda move forward, they have given me one last gift. When we first announced that we were shutting down the Similkameen News Leader I was not sure what to expect. I figured it would be pretty much business as usual as we cycled down to this - our final issue.

What I did not expect was all the kindness shown us from readers, clients and residents. We even picked up some new advertisers along the way without even trying. It has been an interesting eight weeks.

The one thing that had stood out for me from all the comments, e-mails and visits that our closure generated is that we are going to be missed. That was not what I had been expecting. I was pretty sure that we were at that place where you were taking us for granted and whether or not we were still part of your weekly routine, it wasn't all that important.

I have discovered that is not the case. There has been a real sense of sadness that has been shared with us by so many of you. It has been overwhelming to be quite honest with you. There have been days where I started wondering if going out of business was the right thing to do but when I look at it logically, there is no other sensible solution to our situation.

I have never owned my own business before and so I have never had to close one before. It has been an interesting series of lessons for me. When I donated our complete newspaper archives to Princeton Museum last week it hit me. We had become a completed chapter in the history of Princeton.

As I explained to Museum Manager Robin Irwin that the 950-some issues we published over an 18 1/2 year span would become weekly 'snapshots' of life in Princeton and the Similkameen from 1998 to 2016, I always carried one thought in my mind as I 'built' each issue.

How would this week's Princeton look or sound to a historian fifty or one hundred years from now? I wanted the way we told the story of the news and activities we published in each issue to be as accurate as possible. I wanted to project as fair and objective a view of our valley as I could knowing full well that long after this paper is gone - and long after I'm gone - that my version of Princeton would be what would come off the pages of this paper.

I think I have done a reasonably good job of keeping that version as close to the reality described as possible.

Or at least I think I have.

There is a lot of responsibility resting on the shoulders of a newspaper publisher and editor. I don't know how many of them think about what they will be leaving behind. I always had that in my mind. Maybe I could say that was what kept me focused.

My focus now has shifted. We will be taking a short break to clear our heads to make room for our next phase. Brenda and I will take a holiday to de-stress. Then we will clean out our office to make room for new tenants. By September 1st there will be little, if any, evidence that the Similkameen News Leader existed on the main street. In the months to follow, we will soon become a memory.

Except at Princeton Museum where they will keep our chapter of history alive with the rest of Princeton's history. I look forward to visiting it one day to get a sense of what Dawn, Sharon, Brenda, Spencer, Arlene, Marty and I contributed to our town.

So, now it is good bye. Not see you next week, but an actual good bye. It has been a pleasure recording your history to share with the future.

To The Editor;

The horrific fires that ravaged northern Alberta and BC are a huge irony.

Here we have Canada's greatest source of greenhouse gases, Ft. McMurray being stricken by fire. Fires which also add greatly to the greenhouse gas production.

This tragedy for all of the people who have been burned out, is a long predicted outcome of global warming. For about 25 years huge fires in the boreal forests of the world have been one of the stated effects likely to happen.

I would not expect Greenpeace and other environmental organizations to gloat about this but merely to bemoan the fact that they have been almost ignored. Speaking for myself, my trade and hobby are automechanics and classic cars. I certainly do use fossil fuels, this does not leave me blind to the fact that rapid change is urgent. The question should not be how much horsepower, or how fast your car is, but how little emissions are produced.

Hydrogen remains the best answer, the sources of hydrogen

are as vast as the oceans, lakes and rivers, there is a lot of energy potential in a bucket of water. But what then will the oil companies be able to sell you? The next time you start your internal combustion engine, be aware you are creating carbon and are a part of the problem, in a very unsustainable situation.

It is ironic that I grappled with these same problems in the early 1970s while servicing early auto emission equipped vehicles. The emissions have been reduced considerably since then, but the number of vehicles are hugely increased. We succeeded in getting the lead out of gas, also the chloro-carbon out of refrigerants; the new refrigerants are much improved, not perfect. This comparatively small amount of refrigerant has made a difference on the OZONE layer. And yet we have a very NAIVE bunch of deniers that don't believe that 7 BILLION people producing carbon daily are not having an effect on the atmosphere.

Until Hydrogen Fuel cell cars are both available and affordable, Hybrid or electric cars are a good interim way to go. Keep in mind the production of new vehicles creates a very large amount of carbon also.

My Last Hurrah As News Leader Closes

I am pleased the community is getting together to honour George and Brenda and express appreciation for the contributions they have made to our community. They have done what good independent local newspapers are supposed to do: they have not only reported the news, they have published opinion and comment expressing the feelings of local people.

I remember George when he first moved here to be the DJ at our local radio station. His curly hair was down to his shoulders, and he was full of enthusiasm. He joined community activities right away. I have snapshots of George leading a snooshing team his first winter in Princeton.

There is a standing joke between George and me that I was the first woman he went out with after he moved here. We went to Loomis, Washington for the original signing of the Tonasket-Princeton Sister City declaration. It was a dark and stormy night in March, with tumbleweeds blowing across the road, and neither George nor I were sure where we were going. That evening launched the International Pony Express Friendship Ride.

George and I attended Town Council meetings side by side for years. We have attended more Town Council meetings than any member of any Princeton Town Council.

George was a bachelor for many years in Princeton. For a young single man, he took a remarkable interest in community life. Furthermore, he took on a lot of responsibilities as he became more involved in the community. He wrote tourist brochures for the Chamber of Commerce, as well as involving himself in their activities, and later joined Similkameen Country, which is the lower valley's Chamber of Commerce. He served several years as Racing Days Association President and as President of Princeton Exhibition Association. He was Master of Ceremonies for a number of local events.

Eventually, the radio station was purchased and then shut down. I had started the News Leader and was looking for an advertising manager. He was at loose ends and accepted our offer to work for the News Leader. He was damned good at it, pleasing advertisers by presenting them with a proof of their ad the same day, sometimes just an hour later.

When George and Brenda got together, a new phase in his life began. I had the pleasure of attending their wedding which was held at Similkameen Sizzle, the pepper festival in Keremeos, of which George was an active promoter and organizer. They participated in Similkameen Sizzle year after year, part of the success of that event.

When it came time for me to retire and care for my ailing husband, George and Brenda bought the News Leader from me. I was

confident they would remain open to the community and be involved in the community. George became increasingly interested in local history. He is a great supporter of the Museum Society and always gave them plenty of space in the newspaper to tell whatever they were doing. He became interested in the Granite Creek historical group when it formed.

The Posse was a passion of George's and he loved doing the webcasts of local Posse games.

George was always interested in what the Arts Council was doing and tried to participate in whatever was going on but as a busy man, he often left it to me to attend events and give them 'good press.'

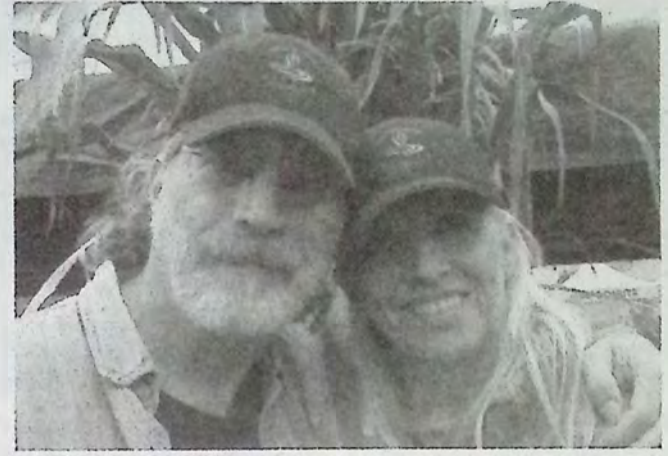
In recent years, Brenda has added her business, JamBusters, to the front end operation of the News Leader. While Brenda has not been so much the public face of the News Leader, she has been actively involved in many aspects of George's interests, particularly in his involvement with the church.

During our many years of working as media people in a small town, George and Brenda saw the ups and downs of the business community, saw businesses come and go, suffered friends passing away. Now the News Leader is passing away, and I am sure a lot of people are going to miss it, because it was a friend to the community.

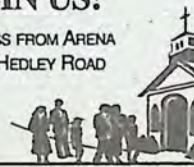

Princeton Traditional Music Festival

Banjos Ring Again at the Traditional Music Festival

This will be the last piece about the Princeton Traditional Music Festival to appear in the Similkameen News Leader. The Music Festival gives a big THANK YOU to George and Brenda for all their years of support. Ever since the first Festival in 2008 the News Leader has published articles that we have submitted in the weeks leading up to each Festival. This free publicity introduced Princeton readers to the Festival and to the music it offered. We will be forever grateful for this support and will sorely miss the News Leader in future years.

One of the most popular sessions at the Princeton Traditional Music

Festival has been the banjo workshop. The banjo is one of those instruments that, when played badly, can be torture to listen to - but when handled by a virtuoso is inspiring. The Traditional Music Festival has been blessed with a collection of world-class banjo players over the years and this workshop provides a high-powered dose of banjo music, enough to last you a whole year.

The banjo is usually associated with country, folk, Irish traditional and bluegrass music. It was also central to African American traditional music before becoming popular in the minstrel shows of the 19th century. Slaves were central to the origins of much American tradi-

tional music and the banjo was part of this phenomenon. The instrument is said to have evolved from an earlier African instrument. Banjos resembling today's instrument with fingerboards and tuning pegs are known from the Caribbean as early as the 17th century. Early, African-influenced banjos were built around a gourd body and a wooden stick neck. These instruments had varying numbers of strings.

Banjos first appeared on the stage in the US in the 1830s and by the 1840s they were popular in British Music Hall performances. Historically, the banjo was played 'claw hammer' style by the slaves who brought their version of the

banjo with them. In old time Appalachian mountain music, there is also a style called two finger up-pick, and a three finger version that Earl Scruggs developed into the famous 'Scruggs' style picking, nationally aired in 1945 on the Grand Ole Opry.

This year's banjo workshop will be hosted by Festival favourite Mike Marker from Bellingham who will be introducing the other participants as well as talking a bit about the his-

tory of the banjo and describing different styles of banjo music. Mike comes with a long history in traditional music having performed at folk clubs in Britain, as a crew member on the sloop 'Clearwater' in New York State and as an artist in residence in Oregon schools. He was an instructor at the Puget Sound Guitar Workshop and has played at many festivals throughout the Cascadia region and beyond.

I am confident regular postings will come and now that you know there is a Town of Princeton Facebook Page I suspect their 'LIKE' count is going to jump...and so it should.

Getting immersed into the digital

age is scary. People can communicate with you in real time. They share and discuss the things you post (and don't post) online. It can be a whirlwind storm of interaction. While that may scare public officials, I sense it will do them more good than harm to embrace the changes and get involved.

As stated in this paper the past couple weeks, if you want to control an image, the best way to get it out there is by using the tools the majority of us are using. In Princeton that means social media.

It was not easy for me to jump into the social media boat, either. However, it has become a valuable tool in promoting this business and I plan to use it to promote my future ventures because I realize the power it possesses. That is, if you truly use that power as a way to enhance the promotion of your business or activity.

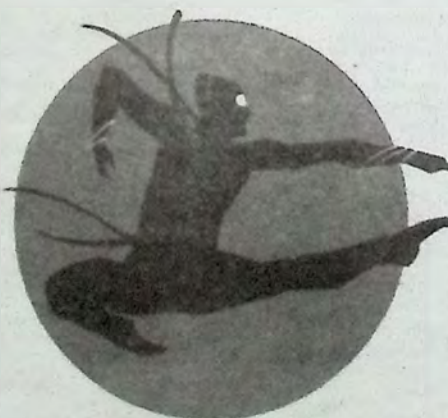

.....continued from Page 14 if that information is correct, good, clean or accurate. Wikipedia is a great example of a resource that I will refer to only if I need to find something else. Because people like you and me can actively edit entries there, I question the accuracy.

Also, as guys like me are hired by online business promoters to write content for their websites, you need to filter the information you find in any of the searches you do. These are good reasons to be cautious and I suspect that may be part of the reason why the Town of Princeton has been slow to jump online.

I don't blame them one bit.

Here's why: Whatever you post online, regardless of what it is, remains accessible in cyberspace forever. That's not a few weeks. It's there forever. For a hint at what that means, visit places like the Wayback Machine to see what they do to stay in business. Whatever you say or post online will end up archived somewhere as either a screenshot or a document file that can be referenced easily.

This also means there is little in the way of regulation for online content as there is for printed con-

tent. This makes the internet a very, very powerful tool in the right hands.

So, as I near the end of this final column, I remind you to watch for all 'Saving Downtown Princeton' columns to show up online in the future and request that you do whatever you can to support your local economy. That is truly where growth comes from in your community.

Before I forget, I have a couple more things to share with you. One of the interesting parts of this owner/publisher gig I've had over the past 12 1/2 years has been how I've sort of 'inherited' stuff from the previous owners (Dawn, Barry and Sharon). One of the more lively parts of their business than transitioned into mine was Paul Gabriel.
